### Maryland 10, South Carolina 1

#### Maryland Notes

- With the win, Maryland improves to 39-21 on the season and advances to the program's first Super Regional.
- The Terrapins are now 4-6 all-time in the NCAA Tournament.
- The win gives Maryland a 26-15 advantage over South Carolina in the all-time series, including a 13-7 mark in Columbia.
- The 10 runs are the second most Maryland has scored against the Gamecocks. The Terrapins scored 11 in an 11-6 win on April 16, 1925.
- The nine-run margin of victory is the largest by Maryland over South Carolina in the series, surpassing its 8-1 win over the Gamecocks on April 13, 1963.
- Maryland improves to 35-0 when taking the lead into the ninth inning.
- The Terrapins are 14-2 in the month of May.



#### South Carolina Notes

- With the loss, South Carolina ends its season with a 44-18 record.
- The Gamecocks do not advance to a Super Regional for the first time since 2009. They went 2-2 in the regional that year in Greenville, N.C.
- The loss also marks the first time South Carolina has lost a regional at home since losing the Atlantic Region Tournament in Columbia in 1976.
- The Gamecocks are now 128-64 all-time in NCAA Tournament games, including a 60-10 mark at home in postseason games. Carolina is 18-2 in postseason games played at Carolina Stadium.
- South Carolina starting pitcher Joel Seddon pitched 5 1/3 innings on Sunday, which was his career-long outing. He also matched a career-high with six strikeouts.
- Tanner English recorded his 21st steal of the season on Sunday, the most since Drew Meyer stole 39 in 2002.
