#### **CAROLINA QUICK HITS**

- South Carolina is in its 104th season of basketball.
- The Gamecocks are led by fourth-year head coach Darrin Horn.
- South Carolina began play in the Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational in Columbia with a 64-63 loss to Tennessee State on Sunday followed by a 61-57 victory over Mississippi Valley State on Tuesday.
- Senior forward Malik Cooke paced the Gamecocks with 18 points against the Delta Devils, including a stellar 10-of-12 mark from the free throw line. Both his free throws made and attempted were career highs for the Charlotte, N.C., native.
- South Carolina rallied from an 11-point deficit with 6:36 to go against MVSU, out-scoring the Delta Devils 22-7 over the final minutes for the win. The Gamecocks converted on six

MVSU turnovers for 12 points down the stretch, using solid half-court pressure to force the giveaways.

- South Carolina sophomore guard Eric Smith tallied a career high 18 points in just 18 minutes vs. Tennessee State. The Mullins, S.C., native hit 6-of-10 from the floor, including a stellar 5-of-7 from 3-point range. Smith's previous career high was nine points. Smith earned the first start of his career on Tuesday vs. MVSU.
- Friday's contest vs. UNC marks the third in a stretch of four games in seven days.
- Friday's contest against the Tar Heels marks the ninth time the Gamecocks will play the AP No. 1 in its history, and the second time in the last three seasons. The last time South Carolina faced the top-ranked team the Gamecocks earned a thrilling 68-62 victory over Kentucky at Colonial Life Arena on Jan. 26, 2010, for their first win over a No. 1. The Gamecocks have played UNC when the Tar Heels have been ranked as the AP No. 1 three previous times, all during the 1957 calendar year.
- South Carolina is 281-403 (.410) all-time against current schools in the ACC. The last Gamecock victory over an ACC opponent came in a 64-60 win over Clemson on Dec. 5, 2010. Carolina's last loss to an ACC opponent came in an 85-70 loss vs. Boston College on Jan. 1, 2011.
- South Carolina is 79-30 (.724) all-time in the month of November. Carolina went 4-1 last season during the month.
- South Carolina earned a 75-50 victory over Western Carolina in the season opener on Nov. 11. Freshman forward Anthony Gill paced Carolina with 14 points, while sophomore guard Brenton Williams impressed, scoring 13 points on 5-of-8 shooting from the floor, while collecting five steals.
- Carolina's 12 3-point field goal attempts versus Western Carolina rank as the second-fewest in the Darrin Horn era. The Gamecocks have attempted just 12 on six occassions, with the previous time in a 74-61 win over Delaware State on Dec. 1, 2010. Under Horn, the fewest attempts by Carolina in a game is 10, which has happened three times.

#### **INTERVIEW POLICIES**

#### A SOUTH CAROLINA WIN WOULD ...

- Be the first over the Tar Heels since the 1990 season
- Be its first on a neutral court since a 69-66 victory over USF on Nov. 20, 2009 competing in the Charleston Classic
- Be South Carolina's first over an ACC school since earning a 64-60 win vs. Clemson on Dec. 5, 2010

#### BY THE NUMBERS

- 14 Led by his 8-of-10 performance from the free throw line in the second half, senior forward Malik Cooke posted 14 points in leading Carolina in the second half against MVSU. Cooke also collected two crucial steals late in the contest. His first with 4:37 remaning in the game, which resulted in a made jumper to pull Carolina within six at 50-44; and his second with 1:04 remaining, which resulted in two made free throws, which pushed the Carolina lead to 58-53 with under a minute remaining.
- 10 Malik Cooke's 10 made free throws vs. MVSU marked the first time a Gamecock recorded double-digits from the line since Devan Downey tallied 11 on Feb. 10, 2010, vs. Florida in Columbia.
- 16 Freshman shooting guard Damien Leonard tallied a season high 16 points against MVSU. The freshman from Greenville, S.C., hit four 3s in the game against the Delta Devils, including three in the first 6:55 of the contest.
- 3 R-freshman forward Carlton Geathers has played quality minutes in all four games this season. The Georgetown, S.C., native blocked three shots against MVSU to bring his total to five for the season. He also pulled down three rebounds, right at his per game average.

#### SCOUTING NORTH CAROLINA

The Tar Heels enter Friday's contest as the top-ranked team in the nation, sporting a 4-0 record on the season

... The Tar Heels have been ranked as the AP No. 1, 108 times in their history ... UNC will play four of its first six games on the road this season, with its two home games thus far also coming against Tennessee State and MVSU ... Sophomore forward Harrison Barnes paces the team with 17.0 points per game, while junior forward John Henson pulls down a team-best 10.8 rebounds per game ... Sophomore guard Kendall Marshall is among national leaders with 10.8 assists per game ... Marshall dished a season high 15 assists in a road contest at UNC Asheville last week ... Roy Williams is in his ninth season as the head coach in Chapel Hill and his 24th overall.

#### **NORTH CAROLINA SERIES**

North Carolina holds a 57-21 edge in the all-time series with the Gamecocks. The two former Southern Conference and ACC rivals are meeting for the first time since the 1996-97 campaign. The last six meetings in the series have been at a neutral site. North Carolina holds a 20-7 advantage in neutral site matchups.

South Carolina's last win in the series came in a 76-74 win competing at the Tournament of Champions in Charlotte, N.C. South Carolina overcame a 14-point deficit in the second half to upset the 4th-ranked Tar Heels. Barry Manning tied the contest on a 3 with under a minute remaining, and Michael Glover connected on a layup with seven seconds left on the clock to seal the victory.

In the last meeting between the two schools, a 13-0 North Carolina run early in the second half erased a Gamecock lead (41-36 at halftime), in the title game of the Harris Teeter Pepsi Challenge, held in Charlotte, N.C. South Carolina was able to pull within one late in the second half on back-to-back 3s by BJ McKie and Arthur Carlisle, however, UNC responded by scoring eight straight en route to the victory.

#### LAST TIME VS. NO. 1

For the first time in school history, South Carolina defeated a top-ranked opponent when the Gamecocks earned a 68-62 win over No. 1 Kentucky on Jan. 26, 2011. The Gamecocks had lost their seven previous meetings against No. 1 teams. Then-senior Devan Downey notched his sixthstraight game with 20 points or more, as he finished the night with 30 points, including a 10-of-11 performance from the free-throw line. Downey connected on a 3-point play midway through the second half to put the Gamecocks ahead in the contest, and senior Brandis Raley-Ross connected on two free throws with under a minute remaining to seal the win.

Gamecock trends under Darrin Horn ...

- South Carolina is 20-9 when collecting at least 10 steals in a contest.
- South Carolina collected 11 steals in its season-opening win over Western Carolina. The Gamecocks used solid half-court defense to collect seven steals over MVSU on Tuesday.
- The Gamecocks are 21-11 when blocking at least seven shots in a game.
- The Gamecocks average 5.3 blocks per game this season; Carolina blocked a season high seven shots vs. Tennessee State and against Mississippi Valley State.
- South Carolina is 39-14 when holding its opponents under 45% shooting from the field.
- South Carolina has held its opponents under 45% shooting from the field in all four contests thus far in 2011-12
- Carolina is 29-8 when out-rebounding its opponent.
- The Gamecocks have out-rebounded all of their opponents this season, including a 36-30 mark vs. MVSU.

#### **HEAD COACH DARRIN HORN**

■ Darrin Horn is in his fourth season in Columbia with a career record of 163-92, including a 52-44 mark at South Carolina. Darrin Horn-led teams are 78-48 all-time in league play. Horn led Carolina to a 10-6 record in SEC action during his first year in Columbia, a 6-10 mark in his second and one of the youngest teams in the nation to a 5-11 mark in 2011. Horn led Carolina to one of the most celebrated seasons of its 19-year participation in the SEC during the 2009 campaign, as the squad captured the 2009 SEC Eastern Division Co-Championship and won double-digit league games for the first time since the 1998 campaign. His 2010 squad earned upset wins over No. 1 Kentucky and No. 13/19 Vanderbilt.

#### **INJURY UPDAT**

South Carolina sophomore guard Brenton Williams suffered a left knee sprain early in the first half vs. Tennessee State last Sunday. Williams will miss 2-4 weeks from the time of the injury.

#### **UP NEXT FOR CAROLINA**

South Carolina will play either Southern California or UNLV in Saturday's matchup, continuing play in the Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational. The Gamecocks have played Southern California three previous times, with the Trojans holding a 2-1 advantage in the series. The last meeting saw Southern Cal collect an 85-75 victory in Columbia. South Carolina and UNLV have met six times, with the Gamecocks holding a 5-1 upperhand in the series. The last meeting between the two schools came in 2005 competing in the postseason NIT. South Carolina earned a 77-66 victory over the Rebels in the second round and went on to win the first of two-straight NIT championships.

#### NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULE

Contests against at least five teams that competed in the 2011 NCAA Tournament highlight the 2011-12 South Carolina men's basketball non-conference schedule. South Carolina will host 11 non-conference contests at Colonial Life Arena, including one exhibition, the first two rounds of the Las Vegas Invitational, Providence in the Big East/SEC Challenge and Big Ten powerhouse Ohio State. The Gamecocks will face at least six teams that compiled 18 or more wins last season, including North Carolina, Southern California or UNLV, Clemson, Ohio State and Wofford, which all advanced to the NCAA Tournament. South Carolina is slated to face five BCS schools during the coming non-conference portion of the schedule.

#### **GARNET AND BLACK WELCOME THREE NEWCOMERS**

South Carolina signed freshmen Anthony Gill (Fr. - F - 6-8 - 235 - Charlotte, N.C. - Charlotte Christian School) and Damien Leonard (Fr. - G - 6-4 - 192 - Greenville, S.C. - J.L. Mann) and junior college transfer Brenton Williams (So. - G - 5-11 - 172 - Kissimmee, Fla. - Osceola/Santa Fe College) to join the squad for the 2011-12 season.

#### HORN VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

■ Following South Carolina's loss at No. 22/22 Kentucky on Feb. 19, 2011, South Carolina head coach Darrin Horn holds a 7-17 overall record in his career against ranked opponents. Horn is 6-13 in games against ranked opponents at the helm of the Gamecock program. His victory over Drake and loss to UCLA both came during Western Kentucky's Sweet 16 run in the NCAA Tournament during the 2007-08 season.

#### **2012 SEC TOURNAMENT**

The 2012 SEC Tournament returns to New Orleans, La., next spring, marking the third time the city has hosted the event. It will be the first time the tournament will be held at the New Orleans Arena. The SEC Basketball Tournament semifinals and championship game will be televised nationally on ABC, while the first two rounds of the event will be televised on the SEC Network.

#### 2011 BIG EAST/SEC CHALLENGE

The University of South Carolina men's basketball team will host Providence in the Big East/SEC Challenge on Thursday, Dec. 1, 2011 at Colonial Life Arena in Columbia. The Gamecocks and Friars have met seven previous times with Providence holding a 4-3 edge in the series. Every game of the series has been played in the month of December. South Carolina won the most recent matchup between the two schools, a 68-67 road win on Dec. 6, 2007.

#### SEC DIVISIONAL PLAY

Starting with the 2011-12 season, this year marks the first time there will not be an East/ West Division champion since the conference split into two divisions in 1992. The regular season standings will be listed from one through 12. This season the schedule will still reflect the divisions of years past, as South Carolina will still play the five schools who were also in the East - Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Tennessee and Vanderbilt - twice, while playing the former West schools - Alabama, Arkansas, Auburn, LSU, Ole Miss and Mississippi State - once during the regular season.

### GAMECOCKS IN EXHIBITION PLAY

South Carolina played 10 of its 11 elligible players in a 69-59 win over Kentucky Wesleyan on Nov. 3 in exhibition play. Only sophomore guard Bruce Ellington, who will return to the hoops team following the Gamecock football season, didn't play. In his first action on the court for Carolina, freshman forward Anthony Gill posted a game-high 14 points. Junior forward/guard Lakeem Jackson took the reigns as the point guard for the opening tip. He dished six assists, tallied four points and collected five rebounds. Also standing out in the contest was sophomore forward Damontre Harris with five blocks, and sophomore forward RJ Slawson with 10 points and a team-high nine rebounds.

#### HAUGHTON SIGNS WITH GAMECOCKS

South Carolina head men's basketball coach Darrin Horn announced on Nov. 9 the signing of Tyrone Haughton to a National Letter of Intent to attend South Carolina and join the men's basketball squad beginning with the 2012-13 season. Below is his bio information:

### GAME 1 - SOUTH CAROLINA, 75, WESTERN CAROLINA 50 **COLUMBIA, S.C. - NOV. 11, 2011**

COLUMBIA, S.C. - Freshman Anthony Gill and sophomore Brenton Williams scored 14 and 13 points, respectively, to lead the South Carolina men's basketball team to a season-opening 75-50 victory over Western Carolina on Friday night at Colonial Life Arena.

Gill was 6-of-7 from the floor, including 1-for-1 from 3-point range, while Williams was 5-for-8 on the night. Williams also led a solid defensive effort, collecting five of the Gamecocks' 11 steals. Senior Malik Cooke added 10 points and seven rebounds, and junior Lakeem Jackson filled the stat sheet with five points, five assists. 10 rebounds and three steals.

With the win, the Gamecocks (1-0) claim their 11th straight season opener, including a 4-0 mark under head coach Darrin Horn

South Carolina dominated nearly every statistical category as it shot 50.8 percent from the floor (30-of-59) and held the Catamounts to 36.2 percent shooting (17-of-47). The Gamecocks also held a decisive advantage in points in the paint (46-18), second chance points (20-9), bench points (38-16) and points off turnovers (22-15) and they controlled the boards with a 37-29 edge, including 18 offensive boards.

The Gamecocks used their defensive pressure to break an 8-8 tie early on with an 8-0 run, including six straight points off turnovers. Williams made a transition layup off a steal by Brian Richardson to cap the run and give South Carolina a 16-8 lead at the 10:40 mark.

Western Carolina (0-1) scrapped back with back-to-back 3-pointers and a dunk by Brandon Boggs to knot the game at 16-16, but South Carolina scored the next nine points to build a lead it would not relinquish. Williams gave the Gamecocks their biggest lead of the half at 33-22 by converting a layup off a steal by Jackson, one of five South Carolina had in the half. Williams, who paced the Gamecocks with 11 points in the half, sank a pair of free throws with less than a minute remaining to give South Carolina a 35-25 advantage heading into the locker room.

The Gamecocks outscored Western Carolina 40-25 in the second half as they held the Catamounts to just 32 percent shooting. Gill drained a 3-pointer at the 17:00 mark to give South Carolina a 43-29 lead. After Boggs knocked down a jumper to trim the Gamecocks' lead to 43-33 with 15:06 remaining, South Carolina outscored Western Carolina 26-10 over the next 10 minutes to pull away for the win.

Sophomore Eric Smith chipped in a career-high nine points and four assists for the Gamecocks

Trey Sumler and Harouna Mutombo netted 11 points apiece to lead Western Carolina.

## GAME 3 - SOUTH CAROLINA 63, TENNESSEE STATE 64 **COLUMBIA, S.C. - NOV. 20, 2011**

COLUMBIA, S.C. - The South Carolina Gamecocks (1-2) suffered a 64-63 defeat against Tennessee State (2-2) on Sunday night at Colonial Life Arena competing in the Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational. Sophomore guard Eric Smith led the Gamecocks with 18 points, doubling a career high.

Tennessee State started a run as the game passed the 10-minute mark and held a 15-9 lead with just over eight minutes left in the opening half. Carolina gained new life 30 seconds later after senior Malik Cooke poked the ball free from a Tiger guard and Lakeem Jackson collected the loose ball to take it down the floor and slam home a two-handed dunk.

Tennessee State's Robert Covington would hit a 3 at the other end, but Cooke would follow with a free throw and Damien Leonard hit a 3 from the corner to pull the Gamecocks to within three points of the Tigers with 5:31 left in the stanza. Following the under-four minute media timeout, Tennessee State's Jordan Cyphers buried two 3s and added three free throws, as the Tigers took a 33-19 lead into the locker room at halftime.

Sonhomore forward Damontre Harris would convert a three-point play and Smith would hit a pair of 3s from the left wing to bring the Garnet and Black scratching back in the second half. With 10:07 left, Smith drove to the hole and dished a pass to RJ Slawson who finished the possession with a layup to near the score at 49-38.

The Tigers took a timeout to halt the momentum, but the Gamecocks' run wasn't over, as right off the break solid defense set up Cooke for a mid-range jumper followed by a 3 from the wing to pull within six points of the Tiger lead with 8:46 remaining.

Following the under-eight minute media timeout, Carolina pressed the Tigers off the break and Slawson came up with a steal at mid-court to set up a deep 3 from Smith at the top of the key to pull the Gamecocks to within two points with 7:20 left on the clock.

With 3:17 remaining, Tennessee State's Wil Peters hit a 3 to push the lead to 63-56 Tigers, but Smith would respond with two more 3s to pull the lead back to two with 1:19 remaining in the contest.

A steal by Leonard gave the ball to Carolina with under a minute left. Slawson would be fouled under the basket with a chance to tie, as the score stood at 64-62 with seven seconds remaining. Slawson would hit one of the two attempts from the line, and the Tigers would miss the front end of a bonus shot from the line at the other end, but Tennessee State held on to earn the 64-63 win

The Gamecocks held the advantage in the paint, outscoring the Tigers 24-14 and holding the rebounding advantage

Smith posted a career high with 18 points, while Jackson would add 12, and Cooke and Slawson contributed 10 apiece

## GAME 3 - SOUTH CAROLINA 661, MISS VALLEY STATE 57 COLUMBIA, S.C. - NOV. 22, 2011

COLUMBIA, S.C. - The South Carolina Gamecocks (2-2) rallied for a 61-57 victory over Mississippi Valley State (0-4) on Tuesday night at Colonial Life Arena competing in the second game of the Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational. Senior forward Malik Cooke led the Gamecocks with 18 points, and freshman guard Damien Leonard scored a career-high 16 points for the Gamecocks. Freshman forward Anthony Gill corralled a game-leading seven rebounds, and redshirt freshman Carlton Geathers blocked a career high three shots.

Mississippi Valley State was led by junior guard Terrance Joyner with 22 points and senior forward Falando Jones who tallied 11 points in the contest. The Delta Devil's senior guard Cor-J Cox pulled down a game-leading seven rebounds. Senior center Paul Crosby and freshman guard Luca Pajkovic added six boards for MVSU.

After giving up the first basket to Mississippi Valley State, the Gamecocks went on a 23-7 run to start the game. Leonard led the charge during the Gamecocks' surge with 12 points on a 4-of-5 performance from behind the arc. The run gave the Gamecocks a 14-point lead, their largest of the game, at the 8:16 mark in the first half.

Mississippi Valley State found a rhythm and went on a run of their own. The Delta Devils outscored the Gamecocks 14 to 5 over the last 6:59 of the first half to pull within four points at the break. Geathers blocked Amos Studivant's jumper in the lane that would have tied the game at 28. Cooke was fouled on the subsequent rebound and knocked down two free throws with 21 seconds left in the half to give the Gamecocks a 30-26 advantage at the break.

Mississippi Valley State took the lead early coming out of the locker room on back-to-back transition layups to begin the second half by Kevin Burwell and Terrance Joyner. Joyner drew sophomore forward Damontre Harris' third foul and converted a three-point play that gave the Delta Devils a 31-30 lead, their first lead of the game since the opening basket.

South Carolina, who had begun to chip away at the MVSU lead since the 6:36 mark in the second half, then began a feverish comeback that was ignited by the Gamecocks defense. Sophomore forward R.J. A third consecutive steal, this time on an inbounds pass created a Leonard fast break layup to cut the MVSU lead to one at 52-53.

Gill drew a charge on Crosby to give the Gamecocks a chance to take the lead. Slawson drained a jumper with just 2:00 minutes remaining to take the lead at 54-53. Cooke put back a Slawson miss to extend the Gamecocks' lead to three Cooke collected a loose ball and hit two free throws to make the score 58-53 with 55.7 to go in the game.

The Delta Devils cut the Gamecocks' lead to one at a score of 58-57 on shots by Cox and freshman guard Brent Arrington with just 24 seconds remaining, but Cooke extended the Gamecock lead to 61-57 on two trips to the line.




