

Furman at South Carolina October 18, 2014

Opening Statement

It feels good to win a ball game. I told our guys to enjoy it, and we'll start getting ready for Auburn on Monday. Furman, they made a few yards on us, they had about 300. I thought our defense played pretty well, in the second half especially, and [Furman] only ended up with 10 points. We had some good fortune – they missed a short field goal and a guy fumbled [in the end zone] after we turned it over twice. We had two fumbles from our quarterback and our receiver that put them [Furman] in position, but I guess it only cost us three points there. Again, we had some good plays here and there and a lot of sorry plays. Our pass protection was as good as I thought it was going to be. You have to give Furman credit; they have some nice pass rushers that came through unexpectedly. It was a good win for us. We tried to get cute there at the end, and we should have just run the ball. We thought we might get a touchdown pass off one of our young quarterbacks, but we couldn't get it off. Overall I'm proud of the team. It wasn't a real pretty game, but we got us a win. The running backs played pretty well. It was a win for us, and we're happy to get it.

On the play of Connor Mitch and Perry Orth

It wasn't all their fault. They did have a chance on some of the plays we had called. We had a screen pass called, and they had a big old blitz coming; we left it on and got sacked. We were trying to throw off the goal line, and we had the second [offensive] line in there. I told Coach [Shawn] Elliot, 'I don't know if we can block because they're going to rush five or six guys,' so we got sacked at the three-yard line.

On the offense

We ran a lot more than we threw. Dylan [Thompson] only threw 22 passes and [Connor Mitch] threw four. We ran a lot more, and that's what we have to do. Heck, everybody knows that. We have to run more than we throw. We still got some big yards on passes. Jerrell Adams had some nice catches. I guess we still got more passing than we did rushing. We still have to pass. Dylan made some good ones, and Jerrell Adams had a couple of big catches in there to get some big yards. Pharoh [Cooper] was sort of quiet today. We have to find some more ways to get him the ball. We keep talking about it, and we're doing a poor job of getting him the ball. We had two pretty good returns called back by stupid penalties on our special team guys. Sometimes they act like they don't care if they get a holding or pushing in the back penalty. I was really disappointed that we can't coach them to play by the rules. Other than that we won the game so let's all be happy for a little while.

On how pleased he was with how the defense played

I think we had some positives. I think they were 1-for-9 on third down, which is something we've had to get better at. I think the biggest thing is that we work all week to make sure we get three turnovers each day in practice and we got three turnovers in this ballgame. That's something we can build on. Of course we don't want to give up 200 yards of rushing. We knew they were going to run the football. The big play, I'll take the blame for that. I called the pressure. They had sent the linebacker and the safety on the inside. So I'll take that as a call.

On coaching from the box rather than the sideline

I will definitely do it against Auburn. I don't like it; I like being on the sideline. But I think this is what's best for the team and I think I can see things better to try and help this group.

On defensive line depth

I think JT [Surratt] had a little hamstring injury. We're dropping like flies, but we play a lot of players. The thing I was telling the guys, we don't have a lot of guys who don't play on defense. It's not like the guys we're putting out there haven't played so we should be able to finish the ballgame.

On what this game does for the team's confidence going into Auburn

Just getting a win is big for us. It doesn't feel too good when you lose, especially when you've lost the last few. On the balance between rushing and passing on offense

We came here to play a game that we love to play and that's what we want to show on the field and just have a good time doing it. I thought we did a good job of that today.

On talking to Perry Orth and Connor Mitch on the sidelines during the game

Absolutely. Those guys practice hard throughout the week and they haven't had the opportunity to play yet. It's awesome for them to get in. And whenever they're off the field or sometimes even during a timeout, I just try to tell them what I see and hopefully help them out because they are great players and they just need to get an opportunity to get on the field a little bit, like everybody.
