## Game Notables

- South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley will be recognized before today's tipoff as Dr. Mike Spino of the U.S. Sports Academy presents her with the 2015 C. Vivian Stringer Coaching Award, which is presented to an individual who has experienced outstanding achievement as a coach for female teams while exhibiting a high standard of propriety, imagination and innovation as a character builder in the tradition of great teacher-coaches.
- Both of today's teams return their leading scorer from last season - senior Tiffany Mitchell (14.4 ppg) for the Gamecocks and senior Lucy Mason ( 15.3 ppg ) for the Spartans.
- Both South Carolina and UNCG are led by Virginia Cavaliers separated by a single season with Dawn Staley playing 1989-92 and Wendy Palmer on the 1993-96 teams. Both were twice named ACC Player of the Year (Staley 1991, 1992; Palmer 1995, 1996) and have their jersey numbers retired - \#24 for Staley, \#31 for Palmer. Staley was a three-time All-American, while Palmer has two selections. Staley earned All-ACC honors all four years of her career with Palmer claiming it just three times. Palmer holds the UVa record with 58 career doubledoubles, while Staley recorded the only two triple-doubles in program history. Staley played in three NCAA Final Fours, which Palmer's teams did not reach in her playing career.

## Five-Second Count

South Carolina is enjoying its most successful period in program history. The 2015 Senior Class set a four-year record with 113 wins and a .813 winning percentage. The 2016 Senior Class has a chance top that number, entering the season with a three-year mark of $88-16$, winning 84.6 percent of its contests. Winning consecutive SEC regular-season titles in the last two seasons, South Carolina has not finished outside the SEC's top four in four campaigns.

In the last two seasons, three Gamecocks have earned All-America honors - prior to the 2013-14 season just 12 Gamecocks had captured the title. Seven Gamecocks have earned All-SEC selection in the last two seasons, including three members of the 2015-16 squad.

## UNCG Series Notes

The Gamecocks have a $2-1$ edge in the alltime series with the Spartans with all three games coming in the 1974-75 season. That was the first for program as part of the South Carolina Athletics Department.

## Preseason Poll Pop

For the second-straight season, South Carolina is ranked No. 2 in both the AP and USA Today Coaches Preseason Poll, which is the best preseason rank in program history. The Gamecocks spent the entire 2014-15 season ranked in the top three in the nation, including 12 weeks at No. 1 - the first-ever No. 1 ranking for the program.

## Home Sweet Home

The Gamecocks are riding a 35 -game winning streak at Colonial Life Arena into today's game. South Carolina turned in back-to-back perfect seasons, going 16-0 at home in 2013-14 and 2014-15. The Gamecocks' last loss at Colonial Life Arena was a 50-48 decision to No. 14 Texas A\&M on Feb. 10, 2013.

unprecedented numbers. The Gamecocks have led the nation in average attendance increase in each of the last two seasons and paced the country in average attendance last season at 12,293 . South Carolina played in front of over 10,000 fans 15 times last season with 13 of those coming at Colonial Life Arena. The 17,156 fans that turned out for the Jan. 11 game against Kentucky were just shy of the women's basketball record of 17,712 (vs. Clemson, 11/22/02) at the facility.

Opponents should be ready for more of the same this season as the South Carolina Ticket Office has distributed the full allotment of over 11,000 season tickets. Only single-game, general admission tickets remain available for purchase.

## Offensive Operation

Head coach Dawn Staley is often thought of as a defensive coach, but she has steadily built an efficient offensive team over the last few seasons, culminating in the $2014-15$ squad's 79.5 points per game on 48.4 percent shooting. That group ranked 18th in the nation in scoring and fourth in field goal percentage. Here's a look at the offense's growth over the last five seasons.

## Ranked Readings

South Carolina's 10 wins against ranked foes last season set a new program record, topping the eight wins of the 1979-80 squad. Of those 10 wins, five came against a top-10 foe.

This season, the Gamecocks have 10 games on the schedule against teams ranked in the preseason top 20 , including three against top-10 entries. South Carolina opened the season with a win over No. 6/10 Ohio State.
After posting a 15-8 record against ranked opponents since the start of the 2013-14 season, head coach Dawn Staley has a $26-42$ mark vs. the nation's best teams during her South Carolina tenure, highlighted by a $14-8$ mark when the


Gamecocks carry a better ranking than their opponent into the contest.

## Made by Tiffany's

Senior guard Tiffany Mitchell has worked her way into the annual national player of the year conversations over the last two seasons, and expectations are the same this season for the twotime All-American and reigning back-to-back SEC Player of the Year.

The most significant change in Mitchell's game has been her shot selection and efficiency, which have also lifted her assist numbers. Here's a look at her season-by-season breakdown:

## Hometown Hero

Sophomore forward A'ja Wilson did not disappoint in her first season after being rated the No. 1 recruit in the nation in the 2014 class. The SEC Freshman of the Year and a First-Team All-SEC selection, she became the first Gamecock freshman to earn All-America honors, capturing a spot on the AP's third team. She was the team's second-leading scorer and rebounder and thrived in the brightest spotlight. Wilson led the Gamecocks with 20 points against Notre Dame in the national semifinals, adding nine rebounds, four blocks and two assists in 24 minutes on the floor.

This season, Wilson picked up Preseason AllAmerica honors from Sports Illustrated, Lindy's and ESPN, and head coach Dawn Staley expects to see more shooting range and leadership from her second-year forward. Look for Wilson to
build on her 13.1 points and 6.6 rebounds from last season.

## Double-Double Trouble

Junior center Alaina Coates was a dominant force and big reason South Carolina advanced to its first NCAA Final Four last season. With 17 points and 13 rebounds in the season opener against Ohio State, Coates is already 10th on the program's career double-doubles list with 23, just one shy of matching Aleighsa Welch's 24 in ninth. Ten of those have come in SEC play, which rank her second in program history in that category.

## 2014-15 Rewind

South Carolina is coming off its most successful season, winning a school-record 34 games, earning its first-ever No. 1 national ranking (holding the position for 12 weeks), repeating as SEC regularseason champions and advancing to the NCAA Final Four for the first time. The Gamecocks also won their first SEC Tournament title in their first appearance in the championship game. Scoring 75.9 points per game, South Carolina ranked 18th in the nation in scoring while maintaining its defensive presence at 12th in the nation, allowing just 54.1 points per game. The Gamecocks' .484 field goal percentage was fourth-best in the nation, and they also ranked among the nation's top 10 in scoring margin ( $+21.7,3 \mathrm{rd}$ ), field goal percentage defense (.349, 10th), rebound margin ( $+9.6,10 \mathrm{th}$ ) and blocked shots ( $6.3,7 \mathrm{th}$ ).

## Dawn Staley

# Head Coach 8th Season at South Carolina Virginia, 1992 



When three-time Olympic gold medalist Dawn Staley took the reins of the University of South Carolina women's basketball program on May 10, 2008, the Gamecocks' stature immediately rose not just in the Southeastern Conference but on the national stage as well. Building on a foundation of hard work, defensive effort and a "team first" mentality, South Carolina began to realize those expectations in 2011-12, and the program has continued to thrive. The Gamecocks boast four straight 25 -win seasons, which include two SEC regular-season championships (2014, 2015), an SEC Tournament title (2015), an NCAA Final Four appearance (2015) and two other Sweet 16 seasons (2012, 2014), the program's first ever No. 1 national ranking and a school-record 34 wins in 2014-15. Staley's success has united every demographic in the state of South Carolina as the Gamecocks' fan based has tripled over the last three seasons, leading the nation in home attendance in 2014-15 at 12,293 fans per game and pacing the country in attendance increase in 2013-14 and 2014-15.

While her coaching career is blossoming, Staley is still recognized for her body of work as a one of the most decorated participants in United States women's basketball history. The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame solidified her legacy with her enshrinement into the Hall as part of the Class of 2013. The Phoenix Club of Philadelphia established the Dawn Staley Award recognizing the nation's top guard in women's Division I basketball in 2013 as well. Staley was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2012 and was one of the final nominees for induction to the U.S. Olympic Hall of Fame the same year. In the summer of 2011, the WNBA recognized her as one of the league's "Top 15," honoring the most influential players in the league's history.

In her 16th season as a head coach, Staley has amassed a 328-154 record, including her 156-74 slate in her eighth season at South Carolina. She has led her teams to six 25 -win seasons, a total of 12 postseason appearances (two WNIT) and 34 weeks in the Associated Press top 10, including 12 in the No. 1 spot.

At the helm of the Gamecocks over the last seven seasons, Staley has been named National Coach of the Year (2014, Basketball Times), a Naismith National Coach of the Year Finalist (2014, 2015), SEC Coach of the Year (2014, Coaches and AP; 2015, Coaches) and BCA Female Coach of the Year (2012). She has coached two AllAmericans, 16 All-SEC selections, six SEC All-Freshman team selections, two SEC Player of the Year choices, an SEC Sixth Player of the Year, an SEC Defensive Player of the Year and three SEC Freshman of the Year winners. South Carolina has turned in historic seasons each of the last four, especially standing out among the program's 24 seasons in the SEC, posting 25 wins in 2011-12 and 2012-13, 29 wins in 2013-14 and a school-record 34 victories in 2014-15. The Gamecocks have won more SEC games than the season before in each of Staley's last six seasons, and her 67 SEC victories are more than any other Gamecock coach, accounting for 51.1 percent of the program's total 131 league wins. She has helped the Gamecocks to four of the program's five top-four finishes in the SEC, including the first regular-season championship in 2013-14 and a share of the same title in 2014-15. Her 113 overall wins in the last four seasons mark the most successful four-year stretch in program history. Off the court, Staley's Gamecocks have been active in the community and thriving in the classroom. Every studentathlete who completed her eligibility under Staley at South Carolina has graduated or is on track to graduate, and the team GPA has been over 3.0 for the last six semesters. During the historic 2014-15 season, eight Gamecocks posted at least a 3.0 GPA for the year.
