South Carolina Notables

- South Carolina is in its 44th season of women's basketball tonight and its 10th under the tutelage of head coach Dawn Staley. The reigning national champion Gamecocks have won four straight SEC regular-season titles, three consecutive SEC Tournament crowns and played in five of the last six NCAA Sweet 16s.
- In the Gamecocks' 72-52 win over #14/16 Duke Sunday, the team illustrated its power to execute a game plan to perfection. Among the best performances not immediately evident in the box score were the defensive efforts of junior Doniyah Clincy and freshman Bianca Jackson. The pair led the charge against one of the highest-scoring backcourt combinations in the country. Duke's high-scoring duo entered the game averaging 36.5 points but managed just 21 against the Gamecocks, including just one 3-pointer. Staley was especially happy with the performance of Jackson against the more veteran senior Rebecca Greenwell, who scored just eight points after coming into the game averaging 16.9.
- The Gamecocks' starting frontcourt seems to have found established its chemistry in recent games as Alexis Jennings and A'ja Wilson have learned to marry their strengths into a combination opponents struggle to manage. The two have combined to score at least half of the Gamecocks' points in four of the last five games. In three games against ranked opponents this season, Jennings and Wilson combine to average 43.0 points, which is 51.5 percent of the team's 83.7 average in those games.
- South Carolina's aggression on offense routinely puts opponents on their heels, sending the Gamecocks to the free throw line at one of the best paces in the nation. South Carolina is third in the country in both free throws made (149) and attempted (216). Wilson and Jennings account for 54.2 percent (117) of those attempts.
- After a rough patch in the turnover department, sophomore point guard Tyasha Harris has been sharper in the last three outings, including two against ranked opponents. In the eight-day stretch she committed just five turnovers against 20 assists.

Scouting the Cougars

The College of Charleston is 2-5 on the season with wins over Lipscomb and Coastal Carolina. Senior forward Tanisha Brown leads the Cougars with 16.0 points and 7.4 rebounds per game, but three other Cougars average double-figure points – Shiclasia Brown (11.1) and Darien Huff (10.1).

Head coach Candice M. Jackson is in her fourth season leading the Cougars with a 27-71 overall record.

Holding Home Court

The Gamecocks are 426-155 all-time on their home court, including a 184-60 mark in Colonial Life Arena. South Carolina is 119-27 at home during the Dawn Staley era and has lost just twice in its last 71 home games, including undefeated home seasons in 2013-14 and 2014-15. The Gamecocks have won 33 of their last

Ranked Readings

Under head coach Dawn Staley, South Carolina is 52-46 against nationally ranked opponents, although that record is skewed by the early seasons of her tenure as the Gamecocks are 37-7 versus ranked foes since the start of the 2014-15 campaign. South Carolina is 17-5 against top-10 opponents during that time.

Staley's Gamecocks are 19-18 against ranked opponents in Colonial Life Arena after winning 15 of the last 16 such contests dating back to the start of 2013-14.

Staying Power

South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley is in her 10th season at the helm after guiding the Gamecocks into the postseason seven times in her first nine seasons in Columbia, including the 2017 National Championship and five other Sweet 16 berths.

With a .714 (401-161) winning percentage over her 18 seasons as a head coach, Staley is 23rd among active NCAA Div. I head coaches with at least 10 years of experience and is the best among SEC head coaches.

Staley is the third-longest tenured coach currently in the SEC, and her 10.8 league wins per season is best among the group. During the Gamecocks' current four-year run as SEC champion, the program averaged 14.8 conference wins per season.

Rankings Review

South Carolina is ranked fifth in this week's Associated Press Poll, making it the 73rd consecutive week the Gamecocks have ranked among the nation's top 10 teams. Dawn Staley's team is one of just three teams to have stayed among the nation's top 10 every week since the start of the 2014-15 season (62 weeks).

In that 62 weeks, South Carolina has spent 55 of them in the top five, trailing UConn's 62 such weeks and leading Notre Dame's 50 top-five entries.

Tough Road Ahead

South Carolina's 2017-18 schedule includes 12 games against teams either ranked in this week's AP and/or USA Today Coaches Poll or ranked at the time of their game.

So far, the Gamecocks are 2-1 in those games – topping then-#15/13 Maryland and then-#14/16 Duke while falling to then-#6/6 Notre Dame. Only one non-conference game remains against a currently ranked opponent – No. 1/1 Connecticut on Feb. 1.

Including the Gamecocks at #5/6, the SEC boasts six teams in this week's rankings – Mississippi State (6/3), Tennessee (11/13), Missouri (17/18), Kentucky (20/22) and Texas A&M (21/21). South Carolina will play Tennessee, Kentucky and Missouri twice this season.

Drive for Five

The Gamecocks enter the 2017-18 season as the four-time reigning SEC regular-season champion, becoming just the second program to win four straight titles. South Carolina joined Tennessee, which claimed its fourth straight in 2001 en route to the league-record seven consecutive titles (1999-2004).

All-Around A'ja

Few players in the country are more versatile than

South Carolina senior forward A'ja Wilson. Averaging 23.8 points, 11.1 rebounds and 3.0 blocks, she ranks fourth, 19th and 12th in the nation in those categories, respectively, making her one of two players in the nation to be in the top 50 of all three categories (Lexi Klabo, North Dakota).

Wilson is one of three players ranked among the nation's top 25 scorers and rebounders (Megan Gustafson, Iowa; Tanaya Atkinson, Temple). Only five players in the country are among the top 50 entries in both categories.

Unquestionably the team's "go-to" player at crunch time, Wilson strikes the on-court balance of being star and teammate with her court vision and unselfishness. She is the team's top scorer for the third-straight season, but never at the expense of the best shot on the floor. This season, as more rebounding has been needed, she has answered the call as well.

Wilson has also responded to her head coach's challenge to expand her skill set, working hard in the off-season on ball-handling to allow her to rebound and immediately start the fast break and even run the offense from the point guard position at times. The growth in her game helps both the Gamecocks, as opponents will have a more difficult time locating her for double-teaming, and Wilson's preparedness for the next step in her basketball career.

Blocking Scheme

South Carolina ranks 16th in the nation with 5.9 blocked shots per game, which is best in the SEC. While the Gamecocks have been atop this category over the last few seasons, the formula this season is slightly different.

Instead of being dominated by two Gamecocks, eight different members of the team have recorded at least one blocked shot this season.

Senior forward A'ja Wilson leads the way with 3.0 blocks per game, which rank her third in the SEC and

They're Free, Take Two!

Built around an inside presence for the last three seasons, South Carolina retains its annual spot among the top teams in free throws made and attempted this season.

The Gamecocks are third in the nation in both free throws made (149) and attempted (216). In made free throws, they are behind Stetson (158) and Tennessee (152). In attempts, South Carolina trails Georgia Tech (222) and Tennessee (221).

Sophomore Surge

Preseason All-SEC Second-Team selection Tyasha Harris is looking for a sophomore surge, not a slump, in her second season with the Gamecocks. Challenged by her head coach to expand her game now that "the novelty has worn off," Harris aims at blending more of the scoring prowess she showed in high school (23.5 ppg) with the unselfish court vision she displayed last season when she

was 14th in the SEC with 3.2 assists per game.

So far so good for Harris' goals. She averages 9.4 points and is fourth in the league in assists at 5.2 per game. Against #15/13 Maryland (Nov. 13), she narrowly missed her first career double-double with career highs in points (20) and assists (9). Six games later, she accomplished the feat, handing out 10 assists and scoring 10 points against Western Carolina (Nov. 30).

Harris is the first Gamecock to post a double-double with assists since Samone Kennedy posted 10 points and 10 assists at Florida on Feb. 24, 2008. She became the first Gamecock to hand out 10 or more assists since Tina Roy hit that mark on Dec. 14, 2014.

Harris has also stepped up her game defensively, ranking second the SEC with 2.8 steals per game. She has swiped four or more in three of the last five games, including her career-high six against Western Carolina (Nov. 30).

Land of the Three

Senior transfer Lindsey Spann brings solid experience and leadership to the Gamecocks' young roster, but the biggest impact the 1,000-point scorer from Penn State

will have will likely be from 3-point range.

Claiming eighth place on the Lady Lions' career made 3s list, the 5-foot-6 guard is off to a quick start from long range, leading the SEC in 3-point field goal percentage (.550) and ranking second in the league in made 3s per gam (3.1). Those numbers rank sixth and 32nd in the nation, respectively.

The Gamecocks have also benefitted from her unselfishness as Spann is willing to move the ball to find the best shot for the offense, not necessarily herself. She is also not glued to the 3-point line, shooting 55.0 percent overall, which ranks eighth in the SEC. She is second on the team at 13.6 points per game (22nd in the SEC) and has scored in double figures in six of the seven games she has played this season.

Just Jennings

Junior transfer Alexis Jennings has strengthened the Gamecocks' frontcourt, providing a steady, physical presence in the lane. After averaging 8.9 points and 5.4 rebounds in her two seasons at Kentucky, the powerful post has elevated her play this season.

Jennings is third in the SEC in field goal percentage (.644), 26th in scoring (13.0 ppg) and 17th in rebounding (7.0 rpg). Both her scoring and rebounding have been on display versus ranked opponents, against which she averages 15.0 points and 9.7 rebounds. Both her double-doubles so far this season have come against top-15 foes in #15/13 Maryland (Nov. 13, 12 pts/13 rebs) and #14/16 Duke (Dec. 3, 21 pts/10 rebs).

Jennings has four other double-figure scoring games this season, including a 25-point outing against St. John's (Nov. 25).

Utility Player

After two seasons coming off the bench, junior guard Doniyah Cliney has an established role in the starting lineup, and the spotlight has only amplified how much more she is prepared to contribute. Staley has marked her as a "stat stuffer" because her versatility and athleticism allow her to impact the game in so many ways. Any single number may not jump off the box score, but she will contribute to nearly all of them.

So far this season, Cliney averages 8.4 points, 4.0 rebounds, 2.9 assists and 1.6 steals. She has three double-figure scoring games and five games of three or more assists. Defensively, she takes the assignment of the opponent's top guard.

Steady Start

The daughter of two NCAA Div. I basketball coaches, freshman guard Bianca Jackson has shown all the poise and development attributed to such progeny. With that approach, the first-year guard has earned 24.7 minutes per game on the court early in her college career and assumed the starting position open with the injury to Lindsey Spann.

Jackson got her head coach's attention because of her ability to deliver solid play and contribute what the team needs when it is needed. She opened her career against her mother's team, Alabama State, with eight points, six rebounds, three assists and two blocks. Jackson was steady in a hostile environment at #15/13 Maryland (Nov. 13) and handed out seven assists in the rivalry game at Clemson (Nov. 16). In her first career start, she was equally balanced with seven points, four rebounds and three assists against just one turnover. Against #14/16 Duke, she embraced the role of stopper against the Blue Devils' high-scoring 3-point shooter Rebecca Greenwell,

With a career-high 34 points against No. 6/6 Notre Dame (Nov. 26) following a 32-point outing at No. 15/13 Maryland (Nov. 13), A'ja Wilson became the first Gamecock to record three 30-point games against nationally ranked opponents. The most recent outing against the Fighting Irish broke her tie with Shannon Johnson, who is the only other Gamecock to record more than one such game against ranked opponents.

With just 10 such games in program history, Wilson and Kaela Davis each recorded one last season, the first new additions to the list since Feb. 15, 2006. Those two games along with Wilson's first entry this season are the only road games on the list. Davis' 37-point showing at No. 7/6 Ohio State is the highest-scoring game against a ranked opponent in program history.

Great Gamecock Fans

With over 10,000 season-ticket holders for the third-straight season, South Carolina continues to lead the nation in average attendance at 12,817 and is the only program drawing at least 10,000 fans per game.

The Gamecocks have posted the highest average attendance in the nation at the end of the last three seasons, averaging at least 12,000 fans in each of those seasons, during which they boast two sellouts of 18,000-seat Colonial Life Arena.

USA Basketball

At least one Gamecock has donned the red, white and blue for USA Basketball in each of the last four summers, and the group has helped six U.S. teams to gold medals in that time. The streak will continue at least the next four years as head coach Dawn Staley was named the Senior National Team head coach for 2017-20 as the U.S. eyes another Olympic gold medal.

Former Gamecock Tiffany Mitchell got the current four-year string started with her FIBA 3x3 World Championship gold in 2014, which A'ja Wilson and Staley matched with a gold in the FIBA U18 Americas Championship. Staley went on to assist on USA Basketball's FIBA World Championship gold-medal team that year. The next summer, Wilson and Staley claimed the 2015 FIBA U19 World Championship gold. In 2016, Alexis Jennings captured bronze in the FIBA 3x3 World Championship, and Tyasha Harris made the first of her two USA Basketball teams, helping win gold in the FIBA U18 Americas Championship and the U19 team to silver in the 2017 FIBA U19 World Cup. Wilson earned a spot on the USA Basketball U23 team in 2017 before an injury kept her out of international competition.

Dawn Staley

Head Coach

10th Season at South Carolina Virginia, 1992

When three-time Olympic gold medalist Dawn Staley took the reins of the University of South Carolina women's basketball program on May 10, 2008, the Gamecocks' stature immediately rose not just in the Southeastern Conference but on the national stage as well. Nine seasons later, Staley delivered on those expectations with the program's first NCAA National Championship in 2017. South Carolina is one of seven programs in the nation to be ranked in every Associated Press Top 25 poll since the start of the 2013-14 season, and the Gamecocks boast six straight 25-win seasons, which include four SEC regular-season championships, three SEC Tournament titles, two NCAA Final Four appearances and three other Sweet 16 seasons, the program's first ever No. 1 national ranking and a school-record 34 wins in 2014-15. Staley's success has united every demographic in the state of South Carolina as the Gamecocks' fan base tripled over a span of three seasons, and three times led the nation in home attendance.

While her coaching career is blossoming, Staley is still recognized for her body of work as one of the most decorated participants in United States women's basketball history. The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame solidified her legacy with her enshrinement as part of the Class of 2013. The Phoenix Club of Philadelphia established the Dawn Staley Award recognizing the nation's top guard in women's Division I basketball in 2013 as well. Staley was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2012 and was one of the final nominees for induction to the U.S. Olympic Hall of Fame the same year. In the summer of 2011, the WNBA recognized her as one of the league's "Top 15," honoring the most influential players in the league's history.

In her 18th season as a head coach, Staley has amassed a 401-161 (.714) record, including her 229-81 (.739) slate in her 10th season at South Carolina. She has led her teams to eight 25-win seasons, a total of 13 postseason appearances and 69 weeks in the Associated Press top 10, including 12 in the No. 1 spot. Also a force in USA Basketball, she was named the U.S. Women's National Team head coach for 2017-20 after leading three other U.S. teams to gold medals – 2015 FIBA U19 World Cup, 2014 FIBA U18 Americas Cup, 2007 Pan Am Games – and serving as an assistant on the Senior National Team 2006-08 and again 2014-16, during which the U.S. claimed gold in the 2014 FIBA World Cup and the 2008 and 2016 Olympic Games.

At the helm of the Gamecocks over the last 10 seasons, Staley has been named National Coach of the Year, a Naismith National Coach of the Year Finalist three times, SEC Coach of the Year three times and BCA Female Coach of the Year. She became the fastest coach to 200 wins in program history, needing just 277 games at South Carolina to do it.

Under Staley's leadership, four Gamecocks have collected eight All-America selections, two have picked up four SEC Player of the Year honors, two have earned SEC Defensive Player of the Year recognition, one has been the SEC 6th Player of the Year and three were named SEC Freshman of the Year. She has coached 10 Gamecocks who earned All-SEC honors 21 times, including 11 first-team selections, and five Gamecocks have been selected in the WNBA Draft, including Alaina Coates who, as the No. 2 pick in 2017, became the highest pick in program history, and three others who earned WNBA All-Rookie Team honors.

On Staley's watch, the Gamecocks are enjoying the most sustained success in program history. After posting back-to-back 25-win seasons in 2011-12 and 2012-13 for the first time in more than 30 years, the 2014-15 team broke the school record with 34 wins. South Carolina won more SEC games than the season before in each of Staley's first seven seasons, culminating in the 2015-16 team recording just the second 16-0 conference record in league history. Staley's 97 SEC wins are more than any other Gamecock coach, accounting for 60.2 percent of the program's total 161 wins over its 26 seasons in the league. She has delivered the only SEC championships in program history, lifting that trophy four times in as many seasons, and she has helped the Gamecocks to six of the program's seven top-four finishes in the SEC. Off the court, Staley's Gamecocks have been active in the community and thriving in the classroom. Every student-athlete who completed her eligibility under Staley at South Carolina has graduated or is on track to graduate, and the team GPA has been over 3.0 for seven of the last eight semesters.
