

TE + 6-6 + 242 + JR. + 2L Pinewood, S.C. (Scott's Branch/Fork Union)



Third-year tight end who should be even more of a factor in the Gamecock offense... named the "Most Improved" tight end in the spring of 2014, the second-straight year he's earned that distinction... listed as the No. 2 tight end behind Rory Anderson, but a spring injury to Anderson could give Adams more opportunities this fall... owns 17 career receptions for 277 yards, a 16.3-yard average, with three touchdowns in 22 games... has one career start.

2013: Tight end who played in all 13 games, making one start... caught 13 passes for 187 yards, a 14.4-yard clip, with a pair of scores... suffered an ankle injury in preseason camp which limited him early in the season... made the start and hauled in a career-long 44-yard reception at UCF... caught two passes for 50 yards against Kentucky... caught three passes for 48 yards at Missouri... scored on a four-yard catch against Mississippi State... caught three passes including a touchdown in the Capital One Bowl win over Wisconsin... a member of the SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll... shared "Most Improved" tight end honors during the spring with Rory Anderson.

2012: True freshman tight end... earned SEC All-Freshman accolades by the league's coaches... caught four passes for 90 yards and a touchdown in nine games... averaged 22.5 yards per reception... one of three true freshmen to play in the season opener at Vanderbilt... caught his first pass, a 33-yarder from Seth Strickland, in the win over UAB... logged a 12-yard reception at Florida... caught his first touchdown pass, a 29-yarder against Arkansas, for the game's first points.

PREP SCHOOL: Attended Fork Union (Va.) Military Academy in the fall of 2011... coached by John Shuman... was a four-star prospect by Rivals. com, Scout.com and 247Sports.com, and a three-star talent by ESPN.com.

HIGH SCHOOL: Played quarterback, tight end, linebacker, defensive end and punter in football and was a power forward on the basketball team at Scott's Branch High School in Summerton, S.C., graduating in 2011... led the Eagles to the 1A Division II state title as a senior... coached by Leonard Johnson... in two years at quarterback he threw for 689 yards and 12 touchdowns in the run-dominated offense... also caught 21 passes for 581 yards and eight scores in his career... logged 96 tackles with five interceptions and a sack as a junior on the defensive side of the ball... caught three touchdown passes as a tight end in the Shrine Bowl of the Carolinas... was the first player from his high school to play in the Shrine Bowl... also played in the Offense-Defense All-American Bowl in Myrtle Beach... the Eagles were the 2008 1A Division II state champions and the 2009 state runners-up... also played basketball, averaging 19 points and 13 rebounds as a junior... given a three-star ranking, considered the state's 10th-best player and rated as the 17th-best tight end in the country according to Rivals.com... given three stars and considered the nation's 30th-best high school tight end by Scout.com... a four-star recruit

by 247Sports.com... named to PrepStar's All-Atlantic Region class... decided to attend South Carolina over Clemson.

Senior tight end who is an All-SEC candidate in his senior campaign... suffered a torn right triceps muscle late in spring drills and could miss some time this fall after undergoing surgery in April... has played in 38 games over the past three seasons making 13 starts... owns 39 career receptions for 694 yards, an average of 17.8 yards per catch... has scored eight touchdowns.

2013: "Busta" played in 12 of 13 games, starting nine, including the last seven in the regular season... caught 17 passes for 235 yards, an average of 13.8 yards per catch... did not find the end zone in 2013 after logging eight scores in his first two campaigns... suffered a hamstring injury in preseason camp, causing him to miss the season opener versus North Carolina... caught a pair of passes for 34 yards in the win at UCF... caught three passes for 38 yards in the win at Missouri... caught three passes for a game-high 69 yards against Florida... caught passes in nine straight contests before being shutout over the final three games... shared "Most Improved" tight end honors during the spring with Jerell Adams.



Sophomore who looks to see more regular action in 2014... moved from an inside linebacker position to Spur during the 2013 campaign... listed third on the depth chart at that position entering the fall.

2013: True freshman linebacker... played in all 12 regular season games, mostly on special teams, making seven tackles... did not see action in the bowl win vs. Wisconsin... collected three of his seven stops including his only tackle for loss in the win over Coastal Carolina... had two tackles vs. Mississippi State.

Senior wide receiver who is regarded as the fastest player on the squad... considered one of the top four receivers on the squad heading into the fall... missed much of the spring while rehabbing from knee surgery... has 48 career receptions for 957 yards with seven touchdowns... has one 100-yard receiving game and seven career receptions of 40-plus yards... a two-time CoSIDA Academic All-District selection who also served as a captain on the track & field squad... was unable to compete in the 2014 indoor track season but ran in the outdoor campaign.

2013: Played in 12 games, making 10 starts... did not appear in the bowl win over Wisconsin after injuring his right knee in practice prior to the game... third on the squad with 33 catches and second with 575 receiving yards... averaged 17.4 yards per catch with four touchdowns... recovered a fumble on punt coverage in the season opening win over North Carolina... caught a career-high five passes for 74 yards in the win at UCF... matched that career high with five catches the following week against Kentucky, this time for a then-career-best 98 yards, including a 62-yard TD reception... caught a 45-yard TD pass in the win at Arkansas... had his best game as a Gamecock, catching four passes for a career-high 121 yards at Tennessee, including a 76-yard TD reception... hauled in four passes for 76 yards at Missouri... had a six-yard TD reception against Mississippi State... caught four passes for 55 yards in the win over Florida... best times during the indoor track season in 2013 were 6.66 in the 60-meter dash, 21.41 in the 200 and 47.91 in the 400 meters... named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District team... a member of the SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll.
