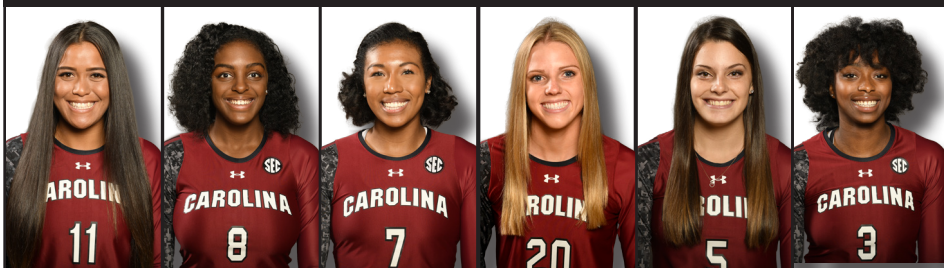

NOTEWORTHY

SCOUTING KENTUCKY

The Wildcats entered the AVCA Top 25 the Monday after its match against South Carolina on Oct. 2, and the team has been on a hot streak for almost the last two months. Along with three wins over top-25 schools, Kentucky is riding a SEC-best 12-match winning streak entering Friday night. Leah Edmond is a strong contender for not only freshman of the year honors, but also conference player of the year, as the pin is averaging 4.10 kills per set with a .277 hitting percentage. The Gamecocks were able to limit her to just 13 kills and nine errors in the first meeting, but were hit hard by the UK middles - Kaz Brown and Emily Franklin - who combined for 21 kills and just six errors. Though South Carolina held the advantage in blocks in the first meeting, Kentucky ranks among the best in the country with 2.78 blocks per set and is holding opponents to a .158 hitting percentage.

WEEK FOUR (TEXAS A&M/LSU) NOTABLES

- The Gamecocks had one of their best passing performances of the season at LSU, putting up 71 digs in the match. Four different players eclipsed double-digit digs, led by Megan Kirkland's 20. It was the second-highest total of the season, behind only the 75-dig performance over five sets against Georgia Southern.
- The win at LSU snapped a five-game losing streak for Carolina in the series. The last time the Gamecocks won in Baton Rouge, current assistant coach Shonda Cole was in her freshman season.
- Koko Atoa-Williams popped up a season-high 14 digs, and added 14 kills for her second double-double of the season against the Tigers. She now has 16 for her career, ranking her 21st in program history.
- Aubrey Ezell had her best game of the conference season as well at LSU, finishing with 34 assists and 14 digs. She now has five double-doubles this season and 23 for her career, tied for the 14th most in program history.
- The Carolina middle hitters were effective all afternoon against LSU, as Jacqy Angermiller and Alicia Starr combined for 12 kills and just two errors. Starr also added eight blocks.
- Joely Cabrera finished with 11 digs at LSU, tied for a season high with the season opener at Charleston.
- Abreia Epps finished with six kills and a .364 hitting percentage at Texas A&M after entering the match in the second set. It was her most efficient night hitting in the conference season.
- Dessaa Legros' .353 hitting percentage against the Aggies was also her best of the conference season. She now has five matches this season with five or more kills and a hitting percentage above .350.
- The Aggies finished the match with a sideout percentage of 75 percent, compared to 39 percent for Carolina.

QUOTABLE: HEAD COACH SCOTT SWANSON

On Koko Atoa-Williams' 14 kill, 14 dig performance at LSU

"She (Koko) helped herself out, because she passed great today. She was giving our setters good balls inside the 10-foot line and they were able to set a tempo ball out to her, where the defense was expecting us to set it back to our right sides. We did a good job with our decision-making and we set Koko at the right times. Even when she didn't have a great set she kept it in the court, toiled the block or tipped it somewhere. She's a savvy veteran senior out on the court, she knows how to play the game really well and she stayed really mentally tough today."

TO BE THE BEST, YOU HAVE TO BEAT THE BEST

The Gamecocks face one of the toughest conference schedules of any team in the SEC, with an 18-game slate that features two matches apiece against the top four teams in the conference - Florida, Kentucky, Missouri and Texas A&M. In the first month of the season, the Gamecocks' eight scheduled opponents currently have a combined conference record of 40-19. No other team in the conference plays each of the top four twice this season.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE THE TROUBLE

Despite playing in a new 6-2 offensive system that keeps her solely in the back row, sophomore Aubrey Ezell is still finding ways to keep her double-double totals rising. After leading the SEC in the category last season (with 18), Ezell has five so far this season to push her up to 14th in school history for career double-doubles. She currently ranks 14th in the SEC for the category. Not far behind her on the career list is Koko Atoa-Williams, who has two this season and 16 for her career - one away from cracking the top 20.

A 'FRESH' PERSPECTIVE

The team has received a big lift from a trio of freshman at key positions this season:

- Mikayla Shields leads the team with 2.91 kills per set, and his hitting an impressive .323 for the season despite hitting from the outside. So far this season, she has nine matches with double-digit kills and has hit over .500 seven times, and also earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors to go with tournament MVP recognition at the College of Charleston Invite and the Gamecock Invite.
- Courtney Koehler has stepped in as a setter in the team's 6-2 offense and is averaging 4.43 assists and 1.35 digs per set while playing in every set so far this season, ending as the team's top assister in six matches. On top of her setting skills, she has been a clutch server, with 10 aces and the team's best serve percentage (eight errors in 240 attempts).
- Alicia Starr had to earn her spot in the starting lineup mid-season, after being trained at an entirely different position than she played in club and high school. In her nine matches since moving into a starting role, she is averaging 1.26 kills and 1.31 blocks per set and is hitting .390. She has already made her mark on the program record books as well, as her four solo blocks vs. Davidson are the second-most in the program's rally-scoring era (since 2001) and her 11 blocks vs. Kentucky are tied for the second-most in a four set match since 2001.

WHEN THE GAMECOCKS WIN...

- The team is out-hitting the opposition .303-.172, and have yet to lose this season when out-hitting opponents in a match (13-0).
- The opposition averages 1.20 aces per set, compared to 1.47 for Carolina. The Gamecocks are 8-0 when finishing a match with more aces.
- The Gamecocks average 2.59 blocks per set and have 34 solo blocks, compared to just 1.35 for opponents.
- Freshman Mikayla Shields hits .368 in wins, compared to .157 in losses. Her kills per set dips from 3.26 in wins to 1.88 in losses.

WHEN THE GAMECOCKS LOSE...

- The offense is hitting just .145 in losses with three fewer kills per set on average, and the defense is allowing opponents to hit .290. None of Carolina's four top attack leaders are hitting above .175 through the team's five losses.
- Serve reception has been the biggest x-factor in losses, as the Gamecocks are allowing 1.94 aces per set to opponents in the four matches, but only average 0.76 aces while holding serve.
- Opponents passing success weight heavily in matches lost by Carolina. In the five losses, Gamecocks opponents are averaging almost three digs more per set (15.12 to 12.43) and has a serve-reception percentage of .956.
- Four of South Carolina's five losses have come after dropping the first set.

COLE NAMED TO GAMECOCKS HOF

Current South Carolina assistant head coach Shonda Cole was inducted into the South Carolina Athletics Hall of Fame class of 2016 on Friday, Oct. 21. She is the third woman from the program to make the Hall of Fame, joining Ashley Edlund-Heidtke (inducted in 2010) and Heather Larkin (inducted in 2012). Cole was the first Gamecock volleyball player to earn All-America honors, and was also a three-time All-SEC honoree. Cole still holds the program's career record for points per set, kills per set, and attacks. After an equally successful professional career, which included a stint with the U.S. national team, Cole has returned to her alma mater and is in her second season as a full-time assistant.

STANDING ROOM ONLY

It was a special atmosphere in the Carolina Volleyball Center on Sept. 4, as a crowd of 2,041 came out for the Gamecocks' match against Clemson. Against Tennessee, the team drew a crowd of 1,819 (second-most in program history). Of the top 10 home crowds on record, eight have come under head coach Scott Swanson and three have come this season alone. Currently, the Gamecocks rank 40th nationally in average attendance this season (1,185), despite the fact that two matches were rescheduled due to weather and three other matches went directly against home football games.

- Mother swam at St. John's University
- Three cousins played in Division I for softball, diving and volleyball
- Uncle is Frank Viola, a MLB veteran, Cy Young winner, and three-time All-Star

COURTNEY KOEHLER

- Her brother played football at Presbyterian College
- Older sister Kerstin played volleyball at College of Charleston

DESSAA LEGROS

- Her twin sister Annayka currently plays volleyball at Coastal Carolina

EMMA LOCK

- Her uncle, Andy Lock, played football at Missouri. Currently, her cousin Drew is the Tigers' starting quarterback

MIKAYLA SHIELDS

- Her parents were track and field stars at the University of Pittsburgh.
- Her mother, Najuma, still holds the school record in the high jump, pentathlon and heptathlon. She competed for Guyana at the 1992 Olympics
- Her father, Brett, ran on the program's fastest Sprint Medley Relay team

ALICIA STARR

- Her father, Brett, played football, basketball and track at Oregon State
- Her mother, Julie, was a gymnast for the University of Vermont
- Sister Brianna is currently a senior on the UMKC volleyball team

JESSE TURNER

- Her mother, Lesli, played volleyball at Pepperdine
- Her father, Rob, played football at Eastern Michigan
- Her uncle, Roman Fortin, played in the NFL for three different teams

ALL-TIME RECORDS

- South Carolina holds a 781-605 (.563) all-time record, dating back to 1973.
- The Gamecocks joined the SEC for volleyball in 1991, and have an all-time conference record of 175-230 (.431).
- In matches in the Carolina Volleyball Center, Carolina 181-97 (.655).
- With 88 career wins, head coach Scott Swanson ranks third in program history for wins. Kim Hudson (1993-2004) is the program's wins leader, with 226.

GAMECOCKS FALL SHORT IN SUNDAY MATCH WITH KENTUCKY

COLUMBIA, S.C. — The South Carolina volleyball team gave SEC leader Kentucky (11-4, 4-0 SEC) all it could handle Sunday afternoon, but fell 3-1 in another exciting match at the Carolina Volleyball Center. The Gamecocks saw season-best performances from a number of players, but missed a key opportunity in the third set to drop them to 13-2 overall, 1-2 in the SEC.

1st Set: The Gamecocks took a while to get a feel for Kentucky's defense, and the Wildcats built a commanding 19-10 lead while holding Carolina to a negative team hitting percentage. Though Kentucky closed out the set win, the Gamecocks found some momentum late in the set behind the blocking of Alicia Starr and carried it through the rest of the afternoon. Starr had six total blocks in the set (two solo), and four of those came during Carolina's late run. After trailing 19-10, the home side cut it all the way down to 23-21 after Starr's final block of the set, but the early deficit was too much to overcome.

2nd Set: The late momentum gained carried into the second game, and behind the big swings of Dessaa Legros the Gamecocks would even the match at 1-1. A pair of early kills gave Carolina the lead, and Kentucky would never get back ahead. Carrying a 15-13 lead out of the media timeout, the Gamecocks converted four straight kills (three from Legros, one from Jacqy Angermiller) to push the lead up to 18-14. Tough service from Courtney Koehler put the game away, as the freshman served the team to a 5-0 run that made it 24-16 and the Cats fell 25-17 to even the match going into halftime. Legros hit .667 with six kills on nine swings in the set to lead the offense.

3rd Set: Coming out of the break, the Gamecocks stayed hot and built another early advantage in the pivotal third set. Another big run behind Koehler's serve, this time a 7-0 burst, gave Carolina an 11-7 lead early and the home side carried at least a two-point lead for most of the set before the offense stalled out. Leading 23-16, the Gamecocks yielded an 8-1 lead to allow Kentucky to tie the set up at 24-all. South Carolina served for the set seven times, but could not put away the point when it needed to. The Gamecocks appeared to have another set point opportunity out of a 30-all tie, but lost a key instant replay review that turned a 31-30 advantage into a 31-30 deficit and the Wildcats clinched the game on the very next possession.

4th Set: Needing to bounce back to extend the match, the Gamecocks instead found themselves in an early 4-0 hole to begin the fourth set. Though they were able to trim the lead down to one on four different occasions, the Gamecocks could not get back ahead of Kentucky and hit just -.061 in the game to drop the 3-1 decision.

STAT OF THE MATCH

Freshman middle blocker Alicia Starr finished the match with 11 blocks (two solo, nine assists), tied for the second-most in a four-set match by a Gamecock in the rally-scoring era (2001-present). She joins Darian Dozier as the only two Gamecocks with 11 total blocks over four sets in the last decade.

NOTABLE

- Dessaa Legros' 19 kills tied for the most by any Gamecock so far this season.
- Thanks to 11 blocks from freshman Alicia Starr, South Carolina finished with 15 as a team. That is tied for the most so far this season.
- Freshman setter Courtney Koehler passed out a season-best 25 assists to go with nine digs and an ace.
- The 62 combined points in the third set were the most for Carolina since beating Georgia 32-30 on Nov. 23, 2014 in Athens.
- Kentucky has now taken the last eight matches in the all-time series. South Carolina's win in the second set was the team's third set taken overall during the streak.

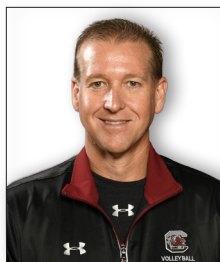

SCOTT SWANSON

Head Coach || Sixth Year at South Carolina

- Third in program history for career wins
- Coached seven NCAA tournament teams (Arizona State 1999, 2000, Minnesota 2006-10)
- Part of staff that coached eight All-Americans
- Recruited three top-10 classes to Minnesota

The 11th head coach in Gamecock Volleyball history, Scott Swanson has his sights set on a successful 2016 season as he enters year six in Columbia. The Gamecocks will bring an exciting balance of veterans and talented youngsters into the season, with the aim of building off 2015's 13-18 campaign.

The Gamecocks faced a season of different adversities in 2015, coming from untimely injuries and a roster featuring six freshmen who all were asked to fill important roles. The team bonded through the rigors of the season, and picked up impressive wins over Tennessee, Ole Miss, and a season sweep of Arkansas. Swanson moved into third in program history for wins in a career after winning his 72nd game at South Carolina on Oct. 25.

Individually, freshman Aubrey Ezell finished with perhaps one of the best debut seasons ever by a Gamecock, finishing the season with the second-most assists ever in the program's rally-scoring era and a spot on the SEC All-Freshman Team.

It would not just be the freshmen who would surprise, the team also saw breakout seasons from Dessaa Legros and Sarah Blomgren. Senior Darian Dozier capped her career in style, moving up to third in program history for career blocks and entered the top ten in hitting percentage as well. Off the court, the team volunteered over 1100 for community service, the most of any team at South Carolina.

In 2014, the Gamecocks posted a 17-14 record, which included seven SEC wins, the program's most since 2008. Libero Mikaela Christiaansen set the program record for most digs in a single season with 535, while middle blocker Darian Dozier set single-season rally scoring era school records for total blocks (141) and block assists (127). The Gamecocks also turned in another strong year in the classroom, as a league-best 12 players made the SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll.

During the 2013 season, outside hitter Juliette Thévenin became just the second Gamecock in school history to earn AVCA All-America honors as she was named honorable mention All-American. Thévenin was also a first-team AVCA All-Southeast Region and All-SEC selection as she left the program ranked in the top 10 in six career categories.

Swanson guided the Gamecocks to an 18-14 record in 2012, the program's second winning season in the last decade. South Carolina got off to a program-best 13-0 start and improved its hitting percentage for a second straight season, ranking second in the SEC with a percentage of .255, an improvement of 29 points from the previous year. Outside hitter Juliette Thévenin garnered second-team All-SEC honors after she ranked second in SEC play with 4.40 kills per set and 4.81 points per set, becoming the first Gamecock since 2008 to receive an All-SEC award.

In Swanson's first season, the Gamecocks went 14-16 and improved its offensive efficiency and its backline defense under his guidance. The team led the SEC with a 16.78 digs average, the best mark in four years for the Gamecocks, and hit .226, a 45-point improvement from the 2011 season.

Swanson's teams have also proved themselves in the classroom, earning the Team Academic Award from the American Volleyball Coaches Association in 2011-12, 2012-13 and 2013-14. In his first five seasons, 49 student-athletes have earned a spot on the SEC Academic honor roll, including eight of the nine eligible players from 2015. The team also claimed the department's Life Skills Team of the Year award in 2011-12, honoring the group for its academic achievements, personal development and work in the community.

Prior to his current head coaching job, Swanson spent five years on the sidelines for the Golden Gophers, helping the team to five-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and a 125-46 record. Three times, Minnesota finished second in the Big Ten behind perennial power Penn State. The 2009 team advanced to the national semifinals in the NCAA Tournament.

During his tenure in Minneapolis, five Golden Gophers earned All-America accolades, including 2009 first-team middle blocker and 2012 US National Team pool member Lauren Gibbemeyer. Swanson also led the Gophers' recruiting efforts, posting three top-10 recruiting classes according to PrepVolleyball.com. The 2009 group earned top honors from the outlet.

In the summer of 2009, Swanson spent time with USA Volleyball's A-2 Junior National Team, and he coached the USA Red team to a second-place showing in the 2008 USA Adult Open Championships.

Swanson brings in four years of head coaching experience to Columbia after his tenure at the University of Texas-El Paso. With a 50-61 career record, Swanson had the team on the brink of the NCAA Tournament in 2005, when the Miners went 21-10. Three player earned all-conference honors under Swanson's tutelage, including honorable mention All-American Kari Stacy. He also inked a high school All-American and saw his team improve in the classroom to a department-best 3.2 GPA in 2005.

Prior to UTEP, Swanson spent six years at his alma mater, Arizona State. He helped the team to two NCAA Tournament appearances during his time in Tempe and coached one second-team All-American and two Pac-10 All-Freshman Team players. Two of his Sun Devil players garnered Academic All-America certificates as well.

Swanson started his coaching career at Mountain View (Ariz.) High School, working as an assistant with the varsity team and leading his junior varsity group to a 17-1 record. As a head coach with the Arizona East Valley Juniors club, he led a 16-1s team to a national runner-up finish and earned Cactus Region Coach of the Year honors. He also served as head coach at Camelback High School before landing the job with Arizona State, where he also played club volleyball.

A graduate of ASU, Swanson is married to the former Erin Meier. The couple has two daughters, Rylee Sue and Haylen Rae.
