TODAY'S GAME

South Carolina begins a two-game road swing when it travels to face Georgia on Tuesday night at Stegeman Coliseum. The Gamecocks and Bulldogs met three times last season, with Carolina winning both regular-season matchups before the Bulldogs collected a win over South Carolina in the SEC Tournament Quarterfinals. The Gamecocks are in search of their seventh SEC win of the season, which would mark the most league victories for Carolina since the 2009 campaign.

GAME STORYLINES

- South Carolina is in its 108th season of varsity basketball in 2015-16.
- Carolina is led by fourth-year head coach Frank Martin. Alongside him are associate head coach Matt Figger, assistant coaches Perry Clark and Lamont Evans and director of men's hoops operations, Andy Assaley.
- South Carolina is back in the Associated Press' Top 25 Poll this week, checking in at No. 25, while Carolina is No. 23 in the USA Today/Coaches Top 25 Poll. The Gamecocks have been receiving votes or have been ranked for the past 10 weeks in the Coaches Poll, rising to as high as 15th, and also for 10 straight weeks in the AP poll.
- Senior forward Michael Carrera tallied his third-straight 20-point game and his second-straight double-double to lead Carolina in a 78-64 home win vs. Alabama, evening the season series between the two schools. Carrera also pulled down a game high 11 rebounds. Rookie forward Chris Silva added 12 points and three blocks in the first start of his college career, and junior guard Sindarius Thornwell scored 14 with seven rebounds. The Gamecocks didn't shoot well, hitting only 36.7 percent from the field, but Carolina committed just 11 turnovers which Alabama converted into just four points.
- The Gamecocks will play three of their next five games on the road, beginning with Tuesday's game at Georgia.
- South Carolina posted a 64-58 win in last season's game at Stegeman Coliseum vs. the Bulldogs.

A SOUTH CAROLINA WIN WOULD ...

- Be Carolina's 20th win of the season, marking the first 20-win season since the 2008-09 Game-cocks went 21-10 on the year. It would mark just the 16th 20-win campaign in Gamecock history.
- Be the Gamecocks' seventh SEC win of the season, also the most since the 2009 squad won 10 games in league play.
- Michael Carrera has hit the 20-point mark in three-straight games (22 at Tennessee, 34 vs. Miss State, 20 vs. Alabama), making him the first Gamecock to score at least 20 points in three-straight games since Devan Downey hit the mark in three consecutive games late in the 2009-10 campaign.
- Carrera also has two-straight double-doubles, the first time a Gamecock has had back-to-back double-doubles since Sam Muldrow had 15 points and 11 rebounds vs. SC State on Jan. 4, 2011, and then followed with a triple-double with 16 points, 14 rebounds and 10 blocks in an OT win vs. Vanderbilt on Jan. 8, 2011. Carrera is the first Gamecock to have back-to-back double-doubles in league play since Dominique Archie had 17 points and 11 rebounds vs. LSU on Jan. 14, 2009, and then 19 points and 12 rebounds vs. Tennessee on Jan. 17.
- South Carolina responded after just its second loss of the season with a solid performance at home versus Mississippi State on Tuesday. Led by a career night from senior forward Michael Carrera, who tallied a career high 34 points, and matched a career high with 15 rebounds, Carolina earned the 84-74 win. Junior guard Sindarius Thornwell was also in double-figures at 15 points on the night, while junior guard Duane Notice added 13 points, and senior forward Mindaugas Kacinas pulled down 10 rebounds.
- Carrera became the first Carolina player since the Gamecocks joined the SEC to score at least 30 points and collect 10 rebounds in a game.
- South Carolina is 28th in the most recent NCAA RPI (Feb. 1).
- In the most updated NCAA stats (games through Jan. 31), South Carolina ranks in the top 20 in field goal percentage defense (13th), rebound margin (10th), free throw attempts (3rd), free throws made (7th), and total rebounds per game (5th).
- The Gamecocks are in their 25th season of competition in the Southeastern Conference in 2016. Carolina owns a 150-248 (.376) all-time record in SEC play.
- Frank Martin owns a 71-73 (.493) all-time record in conference games.
- Despite a season high 22 points from senior forward Michael Carrera, the Gamecocks suffered a 78-69 loss on the road at Tennessee on Jan. 23. Carolina dominated the paint, out-scoring

- the Vols 40-14 in the lane, but UT converted 17 Gamecock turnovers into 24 points to earn the home win. Junior guard Duane Notice (14) and freshman forward Chris Silva (11) also scored in double-figures for Carolina in the loss.
- Carolina clinched its seventh win away from Columbia on Jan. 19, pulling off an overtime, come-back win at Ole Miss. Four Gamecocks were in double figures, led by senior forward Michael Carrera's 19 with 12 of those coming in the second half and five in overtime. Carolina trailed by 11 with 4:13 remaining in regulation, and held the Rebels scoreless the remainder of the way to force overtime.
- Senior forward Laimonas Chatkevicius recorded the fourth double-double of his career at Ole Miss with 17 points and 10 rebounds.
- Carolina returns eight letterwinners, including four starters from last season's squad.
- PJ Dozier was named to the 2015 McDonald's All-American squad, earning the start in the contest. Dozier is the fourth McDonald's All-American in Gamecock history, the others include PJ's uncle, Terry Dozier, South Carolina's all-time leading scorer BJ McKie and Rolando Howell.

SCOUTING GEORGIA

The Bulldogs are led by head coach Mark Fox in his seventh season in Athens. Four Bulldog players average double-figure points, led by junior guard J.J. Frazier's 16.5 points per game. He also paces the team in league games with 17.4 per outing, which ranks tied for eighth in the league. Sophomore forward Yante Maten adds 15.7 per outing (overall games), with a team high 7.6 rebounds per game. The Bulldogs average 70.8 points per game this season, and are holding opponents to just 38.5 percent from the field, which ranks 14th nationally. UGA's 5.3 blocked shots per game rank fifth in the league and 28th nationally as well. In league play, Georgia has two wins vs. Missouri, a home win vs. Tennessee and an overtime home win vs. Arkansas. UGA is 10-3 in games played at Stegeman Coliseum this season.

UP NEXT

South Carolina continues its road swing at No. 8/8 Texas A&M on Saturday. The Aggies won last season's meeting between the two schools, 62-52 in Columbia. Saturday's contest is just the fifth all-time between the two schools and the third in College Station. Game time for the matchup is set for 4 p.m. ET on ESPNU. Mike Morgan (play-by-play) and Chris Spatola (analyst) will have the call.

CARRERA MAKES GAMECOCK HISTORY VERSUS MISSISSIPPI STATE

Senior forward Michael Carrera averaged 27.0 points and 13.0 rebounds when he made Gamecock history last week, posting the first 30-point, 10-rebound game for Carolina since the Gamecocks joined the SEC with a career high 34 points and matching a career high with 15 rebounds in the win vs. Mississippi State. Carrera was 10-of-16 from the floor in the game, which included a pair of 3s, while he was also 12-of-15 from the free throw line. Čarrera also blocked a season high three shots. The win vs. the Bulldogs gave Carolina 18 for the season the most since the 2008-09 campaign when the Gamecocks won 21 games. Carrera followed with another team-leading performance in the win vs. Alabama, posting his second-straight double-double and his third-straight 20-point game. He posted another fantastic effort from the charity stripe, hitting 12-of-14 attempts, while he also dished three assists and collected two steals in the win. Down by as many as 14 with 10 minutes remaining in the second half, Alabama pulled to within six with just over four minutes remaining, but Carrera responded, hitting a crucial 3 on the next Carolina possession to push the Gamecock lead back to nine with four minutes remaining. Carrera was a perfect 6-of-6 from the charity stripe in the final five minutes of the win vs. the Crimson Tide.

GAMECOCK DEFENSE

Gamecock opponents average just 67.7 points per game this season against the Carolina defense, which also forces an average of 15.6 turnovers per game, and collects 7.2 steals per game. - 22 Junior guard Sindarius Thornwell matched his season high with 22 points in the Carolina win vs. Missouri. He also hit 22 in the road win to open league play at Auburn.

MARTIN EARNS MID-SEASON HONOR

South Carolina head men's basketball coach Frank Martin is the recipient of the Jim Phelan Award Mid-Season Honors, as announced by College Insider in January. The Phelan Award is presented annually to the top coach in Division I men's basketball. The award is named in honor of Jim Phelan who coached his entire career at Mount Saint Mary's University. He led the Mountaineers to the 1962 NCAA Men's Division II Basketball Championship.

ALABAMA GAME NOTES

- Now 6-2 in league play, the Gamecocks matched their SEC win total from all of last season. The 19 wins are the most since getting to 21 in 2008-09.
- With 12 straight wins at Colonial Life Arena this season, the team has its longest home win streak since the 1997-98 group won 13 straight.
- The Gamecocks attempted 46 free throws for the game, the fourth time this season with 40 or more attempts in a game .
- With the win, Carolina has won four straight at home in the series (dating back to 2010). The team's 78 points were the most in a game against the Tide since 2009.
- Alabama scored just four points off 11 Carolina turnovers, the lowest by an opponent this season since Drexel had two points off turnovers on Dec. 15.
- Over the last three games, Michael Carrera is averaging 23.8 points and 10.8 points per game
- After pulling down 50 rebounds tonight, the Gamecocks finished with 50 rebounds in back-to-back games and now have reached the mark four times this season. The high for all of last season was 49.

MISSISSIPPI STATE GAME NOTES

- With the win, South Carolina now has won three straight against Mississippi State, the longest streak since winning three between February 2006 and January 2007.
- Michael Carrera is the first Gamecock to score 30 or more points in a game since Brenton Williams on Jan. 25, 2014. He is also the first player to record 15 rebounds in a game since Lakeem Jackson on Nov. 25, 2012.
- Tonight was Carrera's 10 career double-double, fourth of the season. All four have come in the last 10 games; during that stretch he is averaging 11.5 points and 7.2 rebounds per game.
- The Gamecocks are now 11-0 at home this season, matching the most home wins since 2010-11.

TENNESSEE GAME NOTES

- Tennessee is now 16-1 over the last 17 meetings, dating back to 2008.
- The Gamecocks enjoyed a 40-14 advantage in points in the paint and 29-14 in bench scoring.
- Chris Silva had his best game in SEC play Saturday, finishing with 11 points, five rebounds and a career-high three steals.
- Michael Carrera moved past 900 career points in the loss, and now needs just 81 more points to join Sindarius Thornwell in the 1,000- point club this season.

KACINAS EARNS SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior Mindaugas Kacinas was named the SEC Player of the Week on Monday, Nov. 30, his second-career weekly honor, after earning Freshman of the Week honors in 2012. The forward from Klaipeda, Lithuania, averaged 13.0 points and 7.0 rebounds per game the previous week in helping to lead the Gamecocks to two victories vs. Tulsa and Lipscomb, extending their win streak to six games to start the season. Kacinas scored 11 points and pulled down eight rebounds en route to a place on the Paradise Jam All-Tournament Team when the Gamecocks defeated previously unbeaten Tulsa and he provided 15 points, hitting 7-of-10 attempts from the floor, while also pulling down six rebounds in the win vs. Lipscomb.

KACINAS SHINES AT PARADISE JAM

Senior forward Mindaugas Kacinas put together one of the best stretches of his career in the Garnet and Black in three games at the U.S. Virgin Islands Paradise Jam. Kacinas paced the Gamecocks with a career high 23 points in the opening-round win vs. DePaul, hitting career marks with 10 makes on 15 attempts at the free throw line. He followed with an 18-point, 5-rebound effort in the win vs. Hofstra, hitting 9-of-10 from the floor. He concluded tournament action as one of five Gamecocks in double figures with 11 and eight rebounds in the championship win vs. Tulsa. For the event, he averaged a team high 17.3 points per game.

CHATKEVICIUS' CAREER NIGHT

Senior forward Laimonas Chatkevicius was the star of Carolina's 84-66 win vs. Oral Roberts on Nov. 16, posting his first-career 20-point effort en route to a career best 27 points. He hit career marks with nine made field goals on 14 attempts, while also pulling down six rebounds. Chatkevicius has steadily improved his numbers during his time in the Garnet and Black. He averaged 4.4 and 4.8 points, respectively, as a freshman and sophomore, before nearly doubling that mark with 8.6 points and 5.2 rebounds per game last season.

KACINAS NOMINATED FOR NABC GOOD WORKS TEAM

Senior forward Mindaugas Kacinas is one of 257 nominees for the NABC Good Works Team, an award which shines a spotlight on student-athletes who have shown dedication to service in their communities. Kacinas has been involved in numerous community service projects during his time at South Carolina. He has visited Transitions, a shelter in Columbia that helps prepare meals for the homeless, assisted Ronald McDonald House with household chores as well as baking and making care packages for the families. He has participated in several food drives and basketball clinics and been involved with the Special Olympics on numerous occasions, running drills, helping with a basketball tournament and playing games with the Special Olympics athletes. Kacinas has spent time reading to children at local elementary schools, participated in the Make-A-Wish Foundation and joined his teammates for two consecutive years in projects for the "8K in 8 Days" campaign. Most recently, the team contributed to the community following the historic flooding in Columbia, visiting a local Red Cross Shelter to help make care packages for families in need.

THORNWELL NAMED TO PRESEASON SQUAD

The Southeastern Conference unveiled its 12th annual men's basketball coaches preseason All-SEC teams prior to the start of the season, and it was announced that Carolina junior guard Sindarius Thornwell was named to the second team. It marks the second-straight season that Thornwell has garnered second-team preseason honors from the coaches. Thornwell scored 11.1 points per game last season, while he also pulled down a career high 4.9 rebounds and collected 1.3 steals per game.

SEC PRESEASON POLL

The SEC released its preseason poll for the upcoming 2016 league campaign prior to the start of the season. and it was announced that the Gamecocks were predicted to finish seventh by a panel of both SEC and national media members. It was the highest predicted finish for Carolina since the league combined its East and West Divisions into one beginning with the 2012 league season. The media predicted Kentucky to win the SEC in 2016, followed by Vanderbilt, Texas A&M, LSU, Georgia, Florida and the Gamecocks.

SEC TOURNAMENT

The SEC Men's Basketball Tournament returns to Bridgestone Arena in Nashville in 2016. It will be the sixth time that the arena has served as the host of the SEC Tournament, having also hosted in 2001, 2006, 2010, 2013 and 2015. Also the home of the NHL's Nashville Predators, Bridgestone Arena has the distinction of being one of the busiest venues in the Unites States over the past decade and a half, hosting more than 18 million guests during that time. Seating capacity is approximately 19,395 for basketball games. The winner of the 13-game tournament receives the SEC's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. The tournament seeds are determined by the 18-game conference schedule during the regular season. Teams are seeded 1-14 based on their regular season conference finish.

NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULE

The Gamecocks finished the 2015-16 non-conference schedule with an undefeated record at 13-0. Carolina's non-conference slate featured five teams picked in the top half of their respective league preseason polls, including Hofstra, who was picked to win the Colonial Athletic Association. The lineup also featured three teams that had their conference preseason player of the year in Jeff Short (Norfolk State/MEAC), Obi Emgegano (Oral Roberts/Summit League) and Juan'ya Green (Hofstra/CAA). Tulsa, Lipscomb and Western Carolina also had players selected to their conference preseason team of the year.

KEITA SIGNS WITH GAMECOCKS

South Carolina head men's basketball coach Frank Martin announced the signing of Sedee Keita (F – 6-9 – 215 – Philadelphia, Pa. – 22ft Basketball Academy (Greenville, S.C.)) to a National Letter of Intent during the fall signing period to join the Carolina basketball team. Keita will join the Gamecocks for the 2016-17 campaign and will have four years of eligibility beginning next fall.

LAST TIME VS. GEORGIA

GEORGIA 74, SOUTH CAROLINA 62 MARCH 13, 2015/NASHVILLE TENN.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Despite another gutsy effort, a shorthanded Carolina men's basketball team fell in the quarterfinal round of the SEC tournament Friday night, losing to Georgia 74-62. In a final score that belied the drama of the night, the third-seeded Bulldogs outscored the Gamecocks by 12 over the final five minutes of regulation to squash the upset attempt. Duane Notice led all scorers with 20, including 16 in the second half.

The team now sits at 17-16, while Georgia improves to 21-10 overall.

Playing in its first game of the tournament, the Bulldogs showed fresh legs early on in the game, and took the early lead. Carolina tied the score at 14 with 12:16 still to play, but were outscored 15-5 in the ensuing six minutes of action. Georgia held an advantage in every major statistic in the first half, hitting 50 percent of its shots to go with a sizable rebounding margin.

Marcus Thornton would lead all scorers with 10 points in the half. Carolina saw all eight rotation player score at least two points, but struggled from the field and made just 9-of-26 shots in the first 20 minutes (34.6 percent). Michael Carrera pitched in four points and four rebounds, and was one of four different players to reach the scoring mark for the Garnet and Black.

The second half started on a much different note. A jumper from Marcus Thornton gave Georgia as 12-point lead, its biggest of the game, but a lengthy cold streak and a healthy dose of Notice would get the Gamecocks back into contention.

The sophomore guard was on fire in the opening six minutes, hitting three straight 3-pointers and a pair of field goals. After going down by 12, Carolina went on an 18-7 run in just six minutes and took its first lead of the night on a jumper by Laimonas Chatkevicius with 11:40 still to go.

Georgia was able to keep up with the blistering half from Notice, but not from the field. It made nine free throws in just over nine minutes to start the half, helping to overcome a nine-minute stretch without a field goal before a 3 by Nemanja Djurisic put the Dawgs ahead 50-47.

The combination of tired legs and growing foul trouble would slow the comeback attempt, as Carrera joined Sindarius Thornwell with four fouls with seven minutes to go. The two were forced to risk it on the court, and Thornwell was able to keep the Bulldogs from pulling away again thanks to a pair of free throws and a three-point play two possessions later to tie the game back up at 57 with five minutes to go.

Carolina was never able to retake the lead, and after a Notice layup to make it a 63-60 deficit with 2:25 to play, the Gamecocks finished 0-of-6 from the field and 2-of-4 from the free throw line for the rest of the game. Georgia finished with a 7-0 run in the last 41 seconds of regulation to pull away for the win.

College Head Coach Kansas State, 2007-12 South Carolina, 2012-present Frank Martin was named the head men's basketball coach at the University of South Carolina on March 27, 2012, becoming the 32nd head coach in the history of the South Carolina program, which enters its 108th season as a varsity sport in 2015-16. Martin owns a 162-108 (.600) overall record as a head coach, entering his ninth season overall, and fourth season at South Carolina.

During his first season (2012-13) in Columbia, Martin led his squad to a 14-18 record, which included a 4-14 mark in SEC contests. The Garnet and Black captured the Hoops For Hope Classic tournament crown after posting a 4-0 record competing in the event with home victories over Milwaukee and Rider, before defeating Missouri State in overtime, and UALR in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico, over the Thanksgiving holiday. Freshman forward Michael Carrera was honored after the conclusion of the regular season with selection to the 2013 SEC All-Freshman Team, as voted on by the league's head coaches. During the spring of 2013, the Gamecock coaching staff signed seven freshmen, while welcoming Villanova transfer Ty Johnson to the team, a recruiting class which ranked No. 23 in the nation according to ESPN.com.

Martin's second season (2013-14) leading the Gamecocks saw the squad win four of its final six games of the year, including two games in the SEC Tournament, marking the first Tournament wins for the Gamecocks since the 2008 campaign. Martin and his staff put together a non-conference schedule that challenged his team to prepare for the rigors of the SEC campaign. The Gamecocks posted several quality victories, including a win versus Saint Mary's at the Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic in December, and home victories versus Alabama, Vanderbilt and No. 17 Kentucky to name a few.

Martin tutored his second SEC All-Freshman Team honoree in as many seasons, as rookie guard Sindarius Thornwell led all freshmen in the SEC in league games in points (15.6) and assists (4.0) to earn a spot on the postseason team. Thornwell also gar-

nered three SEC Freshman of the Week awards, and was named the Feb. 18 Wayman Tisdale National Freshman of the Week.

South Carolina put together a 9-3 non-conference record in 2014-15, entering SEC play receiving votes in both the Coaches and AP Top 25 polls for the first time since 2006 and 2009, respectively. Martin led his Gamecocks to a thrilling upset win over No. 9/9 Iowa State at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, N.Y., on Jan. 3, marking Carolina's first win over a top-10 opponent since the 2009-10 campaign. The Gamecocks ranked as high as fourth in the nation in opponent field goal percentage during the season, and finished the campaign holding opponents to just 38.7 percent from the field, which ranked 13th nationally. Sophomore guards Duane Notice and Sindarius Thornwell each picked up an SEC Player of the Week honor during the campaign, and for the second-straight season, the Gamecocks won four of their final six games and won two contests in the SEC Tournament, advancing to the quarterfinal round.

Carolina posted a final record of 17-16 for the 2014-15 campaign, which marked the first winning season for the squad since the 2008-09 season, while Carolina's six SEC wins marked the highest since 2010 as well. Martin also announced during the summer, that his team had completed its fifth-straight semester with a cumulative team GPA of 3.0 or above in the spring. For its classroom achievements, South Carolina was honored with the NABC's Team Academic Excellence Award, the only SEC team to be named to the list. Individually, three Gamecocks were named to the NABC Honors Court, in juniors Laimonas Chatkevicius and Mindaugas Kacinas, and senior, Austin Constable, who was on his second Honors Court list. South Carolina saw 12 student-athletes named to the SEC Winter Academic, and the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Rolls for the year.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - The South Carolina men's basketball team held its lone exhibition game of the 2015-16 season on Sunday at Colonial Life Arena, posting a 71-43 win over Allen University. The Gamecocks jumped out to an early 17-4 lead thanks to a strong defensive effort, which held Allen scoreless for the first 5:59 of the contest. The Gamecocks held a 36-21 advantage at the break, stretching the lead to 20 in the second half on their way to the win.

At halftime of the contest, both teams remained on the court and the nine victims of the Emanuel AME Church shooting and their families were honored in a ceremony at mid-court. Nine people were killed during a Bible study session at the Emanuel AME Church in Charleston on June 17, 2015.

Carolina jumped on the Yellow Jackets early, scoring the game's first 12 points capped off by an Eric Cobb layup. Allen, however, wouldn't go away, and a 3-pointer by Latroy Strong cut the lead to 27-19 with 6:03 to go in the half. The Gamecocks would regroup and close the half on a 9-2 run, holding Allen scoreless for the final 3:54 to establish their lead at the break.

A four-point play by junior guard Sindarius Thornwell early in the second half pushed the lead to 20 and the Gamecocks never looked back. South Carolina forced 21 Allen turnovers and held the Yellow Jackets to 27.1 percent from the floor. Carolina also dominated the boards 69-28, with three Gamecocks pulling down double-figure rebounds, led by Cobb's 14.

Thornwell led all scorers with 17 points on 6-of-9 shooting, including 3-of-6 from 3-point range, while senior forward Laimonas Chatkevicius notched a double-double with 12 points and 13 rebounds. Cobb added eight points and Marcus Stroman dished out five assists to lead the team.

GAME 1 - CAROLINA 84, NORFOLK STATE 69 NOV. 14. 2015/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - The South Carolina men's basketball team grinded out a win in the opener to the 2015-16 season Saturday night, taking an 84-69 win over Norfolk State. It was the first game of the U.S. Virgin Islands Paradise Jam tournament, which will continue for Carolina in the Virgin Islands on Nov. 20 against DePaul. Four players scored in double figures for the Garnet and Black, with Sindarius Thornwell and Duane Notice leading the way with 14 points apiece.

Both teams started slow from the field, missing the first eight shots combined before PJ Dozier broke the seal with a mid-range jumper in the paint. Carolina would hit its next three shots and carried a 9-2 lead into the first media timeout.

Duane Notice came in off the bench and helped to extend the early advantage, connecting on his first three attempts from 3-point range with a four-point play mixed in for good measure. His third 3 made would bring the lead up to 16-4, as the junior tallied 12 points in his first six minutes

For as fast of a start the offense got off to, Carolina's patented tough defense was just as good early in the game. Norfolk State would not score for the first four minutes of action, and shot just 27 percent from the field over the first ten minutes.

The Spartans were able to narrow the deficit down the stretch thanks in part to a Gamecock field goal drought, but not enough to keep the home side from taking a 40-34 lead into the halftime break.

The Gamecocks were able to hold the lead despite just three made field goals in the final 11 minutes of the half. Free throws would carry Carolina through the lull, with the team hitting 16 from the charity stripe. Norfolk was able to chip away thanks to a late burst from 3; of the team's final five field goals made, four came from 3-point range.

The offense picked up out of the break to put Carolina back up by double digits, with Dozier and Sindarius Thornwell hitting 3s on back-to-back possessions. The Gamecocks hit 5-of-6 field goals through the opening four minutes of the second half to extend the lead to 52-41. Norfolk State would find equal success shooting the ball, however, and kept within striking distance with a 4-for-4 start on field goals.

A switch to zone by the Spartans, mixed with a full-court press, slowed the overall pace of the game down considerably, but a fast-break alley-oop from Dozier to Chris Silva woke up the crowd at Colonial Life Arena. Norfolk State continued to rely on the deep ball to cut into its deficit, making four 3s in its first eight field goals overall in the first ten minutes of the half; the fourth to make it a 61-56 game in Carolina's favor.

Carolina held the Spartans at an arm's length for much of the half, but were able to use a 7-0 run starting at the eight-minute mark to provide the cushion it would need to cruise to the win. The visitors, plagued by foul troubles all night, were particularly stung by the loss of guard Jeff Short, who averaged 19 points per game last season but fouled out with five minutes to play. In his absence, the visitors made just two of their final 12 attempts from the field as Carolina pulled away down the stretch.

GAME 2 - CAROLINA 84, ORAL ROBERTS66 NOV. 16. 2015/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - Headed up by a career night from senior Laimonas Chatkevicius, the South Carolina men's basketball team battered and bruised its way to an 84-66 win over Oral Roberts (1-1) Monday night. Four Gamecocks would score in double figures as the team went inside early and often to take down the Golden Eagles and move to 2-0 this season.

A thorough crashing of the boards would make the difference for the Gamecocks early, as both teams struggled from the field. The home side would gain 10 of their first 14 points on second-chance opportunities through the first 10 minutes of the game and would take a modest lead.

The opposing defenses would continue to be the star attraction of the half, with the Gamecocks' physical man-to-man countered by Oral Roberts' sagging zone. The Eagles went through almost four minutes between its first and second field goals of the game, and over five minutes between the third and fourth field goals made. Carolina would have to wait 13 minutes before being able to keep the ORU zone honest with a 3-pointer, Duane Notice broke through with a make with 7:11 to play.

Oral Roberts scored on seven straight possessions to break out of the slow start and took a 28-21 lead into the final four minutes of the opening half. South Carolina would counter with a run of its own, using 3s from Duane Notice and Sindarius Thornwell to start a 12-2 run over the final three minutes of play. Carolina carried a 33-30 lead into halftime.

Both sides would come out of the break with a revised scheme on offense, and it paid off. The two would make 8-of-14 shots in the first four minutes. Behind their senior guard Obi Emegano, the Eagles would tie the game up at 38-all, but Carolina reeled off a 19-4 run over the next five minutes to take a firm grip on the lead, 57-42.

The game-defining run was fueled by an inside-outside scoring combination of Chatkevicius and Notice; the two scored 15 of the team's first 24 points of the second half. Notice continued to excel in the sixth man role, scoring 18 points for the game, and Chatkevicius was just as effective, albeit from shorter range. The senior forward went for a career-high 27 points for the night, 19 in the final 20 minutes.

The Eagles were unable to recover from the run, due in large part to not being able to find varied options on offense. Emegano would ultimately account for 31 points -- the next-highest scorer for the visitors chipped in just 12 and no other player had more than six. An eight-minute scoring drought for him mid-way through the period would be a factor in Carolina's big run.

The Gamecocks would see the lead grow to 19, 67-48, and held a double-digit advantage for the remainder of the game. The interior depth of the Garnet and Black would be too much to bear for Oral Roberts, with Chatkevicius, Mindaugas Kacinas Michael Carrera and Eric Cobb pouring in 33 second-half points in the post.

GAME 3 - CAROLINA 76, DEPAUL 61 NOV. 20, 2015/ST. THOMAS, USVI

ST THOMAS, USVI - Behind a career high 23 points from senior forward Mindaugas Kacinas, the South Carolina men's basketball team (3-0) posted a 76-61 victory over DePaul (1-2) in the opening round of the U.S. Virgin Islands Paradise Jam in St. Thomas on Friday night. Kacinas posted his first-career 20-point outing, behind a 10-of-15 effort from the free throw line and a 6-of-13 mark from the floor. The Gamecocks played solid defensively against the Blue Demons, holding DePaul to 36.5 percent from the floor, including 21.4 percent from 3-point range.

South Carolina jumped out to a 9-3 lead on a lay-in from junior guard Sindarius Thornwell and pushed the advantage to 16-9 on a two-handed dunk from classmate Duane Notice. Carolina (4-0) would see all five of its starters score 12 points or more, and the interior offense was a strong point all night long.

Despite the 10:30 p.m. local time tip, the offenses would be wide-awake early on. The Gamecocks enjoyed a 6-of-10 start overall from the field, but The Pride (3-1) countered with four 3s in the first five minutes to take a 14-13 lead into the first media timeout. A 13-2 run for Carolina in the ensuing four minutes of action would open the game up to 26-16. Facing a size disadvantage, Hofstra would settle for 3s but would not be able to maintain its hot start. A four-minute scoring drought starting from the 14:27 mark would help dig the early hole.

Hofstra would not go quietly, rediscovering its range to hang in down the stretch in the first half. Guard Juan'ya Green connected on five of his first six 3-point attempts and accounted for 19 of the team's first 32 points through the first 15 minutes of action. His fifth 3 brought the Gamecock lead down to six, 38-32. The lead would get all the way down to two, 41-39, but the Gamecocks scored the final five points of the half to take the 46-39 advantage into the break.

Mindaugas Kacinas would stay keyed in offensively, scoring 14 points in the first half to lead Carolina. Green would finish with 22 points for Hofstra. The Pride bombed in 18 3-point attempts in the first 20 minutes, hitting on eight. That long-distance commitment would hurt them inside, as the Gamecocks enjoyed a plus-10 rebounding margin and a 20-6 advantage in points in the paint.

During the halfitime break, the lights in the UVI Sports & Fitness Center would malfunction due to a power surge, but the referees determined enough light was on the court to resume the game. Neither team would seem to mind, connecting on three shots apiece in the first three minutes of action. A pair of 3s from Ameen Tanksley would keep the first-half narrative alive for Hofstra, who attempted just five two-point field goals in the first eight minutes of the second half.

Hofstra would hit its sixth 3 of the first nine minutes of action to take just its second lead of the game at 65-64. The Pride would start 6-of-9, but a Duane Notice 3 would give Carolina the lead back. Despite the shower of 3s, Carolina weathered the storm with an efficient offense that saw contributions from all over the lineup. PJ Dozier would have his best game yet as a Gamecock, scoring seven of his season-best 12 points in the second half, including a perfect 3-3 from the field in the half. The freshman added nine rebounds as well.

A 3 from Brian Bernardi cut Carolina's lead to 74-72 with seven minutes to play, but a 3 from Dozier and back-to-back scoring possessions from Chris Silva would help the Gamecocks extend back out to an 83-72 lead. It would ultimately be a 12-0 run for Carolina, as Hofstra would go 4:22 without a point to see its upset attempt wilt down the stretch. The Pride would kick up the pressure in the final two minutes of regulation, but a pair of dunks from Michael Carrera out of press-breaks would keep the game well out of reach.

GAME 5 - CAROLINA 83, TULSA 75 NOV. 23, 2015/ST. THOMAS USVI

ST THOMAS, USVI - The South Carolina men's basketball team will be coming home with a new addition to the trophy case Tuesday, after winning the 2015 Paradise Jam in convincing fashion Monday with a 83-75 win over Tulsa (4-1). Five Gamecocks would reach double figures, and a fast start would play a big role in moving the team's record now to 5-0. Sindarius Thornwell was named the tournament's MVP, and Mindaugas Kacinas would join him as an All-Tournament honoree.

The offense showed no hangover from a semifinal game the night before that featured 178 combined points. The Gamecocks started the game out on a 12-2 run in the first three minutes of play, punctuated by a 3 from Sindarius Thornwell. Tulsa cut the lead to 12-8, but Carolina went off again with another 17-4 run from there to go up 29-12 through the first 12 minutes of the game. The fast start was thanks in part to an 11-of-16 start from the field for Carolina, including all four 3-point attempts.

A veteran Tulsa team would not panic, though, and were able to chip away and got the deficit back down to single digits by the half-time break, 38-29. The Gamecock defense forced eight turnovers in the period and held the Golden Hurricanes to 31 percent from the field (9-of-29). Mindaugas Kacinas and Michael Carrera each had six points and five rebounds, Laimonas Chatkevicius led the team with nine points.

The Gamecocks hit their first four shots coming out of the half-time break and extended the lead back up to 14, 48-34, just three minutes into the half. Tulsa came back strong with a 14-4 run in less than four minutes to set a more tense tone that would carry through the remainder of the game. Tulsa's Shaquille Harrison was the comeback catalyst, scoring 15 of his team-high 20 points in the second half, and the Hurricanes would keep hanging around down the final ten minutes of action. Carolina was able to push the lead back up to ten on three different occasions, but could never pull away like it had in the first half.

After a pair of free throws from Chatkevicius pushed the lead up to 76-66 with three minutes to go, Tulsa would make its final push. James Woodard converted a three-point play with 2:30 to go to make it 76-69, then hit a pair of free throws with 34 seconds to bring it to five, 80-75. That would ultimately be the Hurricane's final points, as the Gamecocks made 3-of-4 free throws after Tulsa fouls to stop the clock, leading to the 83-75 final.

GAME 6 - CAROLINA 92, LIPSCOMB 76 NOV. 27. 2015/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina's men's basketball team would run its record to 6-0 Friday afternoon in its return to the Colonial Life Arena, pulling away from Lipscomb (3-5) by a score of 92-76. The Gamecocks could seemingly not miss from inside, and received doubledigit scoring efforts from six different players.

Lipscomb entered the day with one of the most 3-point-reliant offenses in the country, and it would lean on that strength throughout the first half, ultimately making six in the first half. South Carolina would do what it does best too -- get the ball inside and take advantage of a deep post rotation. The Gamecocks would score 34 points in the paint in the first half, with Mindaugas Kacinas (nine points) and Laimonas Chatkevicius (six points) converting 7-of-8 field goal attempts combined.

The game would be tied at 19-all through the first eight minutes of action, but the Gamecocks were able to get some breathing room behind a 7-0 run in just 36 seconds. A technical foul on the Bisons would be sandwiched by a missed shot and a turnover to enable the run. Carolina would enjoy a two-possession lead for the final 11 minutes of the half, ending on a 6-0 run to take its largest lead of the day before halftime, 51-40.

With the two offenses making 50 percent of their field goals in the half, it would be Carolina's defense that would provide the difference. Turnovers forced by the backcourt players would lead to easy baskets in transition; four different Gamecock guards recorded two steals apiece in the first half and Lipscomb would ultimately turn the ball over 15 time in the 20-minute period. Those turnovers would directly lead to 16 points, 12 coming out of the fast break.

The Bisons made their first four field goals out of the intermission, and after a three-point play from Eli Pepper the visitors would cut the deficit to 62-57. The Gamecocks would hit the gas pedal again to keep a comfortable pace, taking a 9-0 run in the following three minutes to take their biggest lead so far. Lipscomb missed nine straight shots during Carolina's run, and finished the game 9-of-36 from the field after 4-of-4 start.

A pass-first mentality continued to serve the Gamecocks in the second half, the team recorded assists on nine of the first ten field goals made after a first half where 14 of 23 field goals came with assists as well. Carolina's lead would grow as large as 20 with five minutes to go, with a barrage from all over the court offensively. Six different players would score in double figures for the Gamecocks on the afternoon, led again by Chatkevicius (with 17). Lipscomb went scoreless for the final three minutes of regulation and finished the half shooting 32.5 percent compared to Carolina's 53.8.

GAME 7 - CAROLINA 76, WESTERN CAROLINA 53 NOV. 30. 2015/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - The South Carolina men's basketball team used a tough interior defense to locked down its most emphatic win of the 2015-16 season Monday night, beating Western Carolina (2-4) 76-53. Mindaugas Kacinas went for a double-double to help the Gamecocks move to 7-0 for the season despite a slow start, they are now one win off matching their best start in 12 vears.

The Gamecocks committed six turnovers in just over a three-minute stretch to open the game, limiting them to just six points total through the first six minutes of the opening half. Three of Western Carolina's first four field goals made came from 3-point range, and the visitors took a 13-12 lead into the under-12 media timeout. Carolina would ultimately turn the ball over 14 times in the first half, but allowed WCU to score just six points off them.

Western Carolina would extend its lead out to five, 20-15, but the Gamecocks stole back some valuable momentum before the under-eight timeout thanks to a 3 from Michael Carrera and a lay-in from Eric Cobb to tie it back up at 20-all. In all, the Catamounts committed turnovers on four straight possessions after taking their five-point lead, letting the Gamecocks quickly tie the game back up.

That 5-0 spurt before the timeout would stretch way out to 19-0 over seven minutes, but it would be a slow build as the Gamecocks hit just 5-of-14 field goals in the run. Much of the damage would be done at the free throw line, where Carolina made seven. The Catamounts would miss seven straight field goal attempts and committed six turnovers before a 3 from Deriece Parks broke the ice. Carrera would be a bright spot offensively for Carolina, scoring all nine of his first-half points in this span.

The Gamecocks carried a 37-28 lead into halftime, holding Western Carolina to 29 percent from the floor. Most of the damage from the visitors would be from beyond the arc, as they would make six 3s. On two-point field goals alone, WCU made just 3-of-15 attempts in the first half.

In keeping with a blueprint that has worked throughout the first month of the season, a bruising interior defense coupled with an efficient offense through the paint would help South Carolina run away and hide from any threatening second-half runs by Western Carolina. The Gamecocks would commit just two turnovers through the first 15 minutes of the second half, while forcing seven from the opposition.

A big reason for the Gamecocks pulling away in the final 20 minutes would be their effectiveness in converting turnovers into points. Despite forcing 10 turnovers in the first half, Carolina scored just four points off the extra possessions. In the second half, 10 more turnovers from WCU would be used to

Offensively, seven different players would record a field goal in the second half. Kacinas paced the team with nine second-half points to finish with a game-high 20; the reigning SEC Player of the Week chipped in ten rebounds as well for his second double-double of the season. The team was able to work in all seven of its newcomers in the final five minutes, with Jamall Gregory recording his first points and John Ragin his first minutes as Gamecocks. The Catamounts would be held in check from inside the arc again in the second half, converting just 5-of-20 two-point attempts. Joining Kacinas in double figures for the night were Carrera (16) and Sindarius Thornwell (10).

GAME 8 - CAROLINA 81, USF 63 DEC 5, 2015/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - The South Carolina men's basketball program matched its best start in 12 years thanks to a dominant first-half effort Saturday afternoon against South Florida (2-7). The Gamecocks won 81-63 behind a season-high 19 points from Michael Carrera, surviving a bumpy second half to move to 8-0 this season.

Despite matching up with perhaps their most physical opponent of the season to date, the Gamecocks went to their bread and butter early, slashing to the basket to take a 16-2 lead just five minutes into the game, forcing a timeout. Of those 16 points, 12 would come in the paint and six came off the fast break. South Carolina shot 78 percent to USF's 14, and had a 7-1 advantage in rebounds leading up to the USF timeout.

Carolina would not relent after the timeout, extending the run all the way out to 24-2 before USF broke a seven-minute scoring drought with a basket at the 12:03 mark of the first half. The Bulls made a switch to a 2-3 zone defense and would find more success at slowing down the drives, but would not find as easy of a solution on offense and didn't reach double digits until the 8:45 mark.

On the back of an 8-0 run to end the first half, the Gamecocks went into the break with their largest lead of the afternoon at 53-22. Carolina would see three different players reach double figures in scoring, led by 13 from Sindarius Thornwell. As a team, the Garnet and Black shot 61 percent from the field (20-33) and scored 19 points off 12 USF turnovers

The lead would expand to 36, 61-25, but the Bulls would respond with a 17-2 run over the next four minutes thanks to a 1-of-7 field goal slump from Carolina. The key for USF would be rebounding, as it enjoyed a 20-7 margin on the boards that allowed it to out-score Carolina by 13 points through the first 12 minutes of the second half.

The first-half domination by the Gamecocks would be too much to recover from for USF, despite a complete turnaround of fortunes. The Bulls could get no closer than 13, with the Gamecocks leaning on nine second-half points from Carrera to hold down the fort. The defense held USF without a field goal for the final 4:09 of the game to secure the team's fourth straight win by 15 points or more.

GAME 9 - CAROLINA 79, DREXEL 54 DEC. 15, 2015/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - The South Carolina men's basketball team is 9-0 for the first time in 44 years, after a big second half carried it to a 79-54 win over Drexel (1-7) Tuesday night. Freshman PJ Dozier led the team with 16 points, and the team poured in 47 second-half points to put away a game that was tight throughout the first half.

The Gamecocks' 6-2 lead to start the game was soon slowed by fouls and turnovers, most notably two offensive fouls on Laimonas Chatkevicius in just three minutes of action. The Dragons took over a 9-6 lead after four minutes of action after using a 7-0 run in a span of just under two minutes and would carry the lead for the most of the next 10 minutes of play. The lead was helped in large part by a 3-of-3 start from 3-point range and a 50 percent field goal percentage in the first nine minutes of play.

Chris Silva helped keep the fans at Colonial Life Arena excited, first with a big block to deny a fast-break dunk, then later with a dunk of his own to cut the deficit to 17-15. Drexel would build its largest lead at 21-15, but Carolina earned the lead back down the stretch thanks to a lockdown at both ends of the court.

Immediately after going down by six, the Gamecocks went on an 11-0 run in the next three minutes to flip the scoreboard with a 26-21 advantage. It was punctuated by a 3-pointer from Chatkevicius, forcing Drexel into a timeout with 5:18 to go. For those remaining five minutes, the two teams combined for just a 3-of-13 effort from the floor and the Gamecocks were able to hold on for a 32-28 lead at halftime.

After a 6-of-12 start from the field, Drexel converted just 3-of-14 (21 percent) the rest of the way but still hit four 3s to keep within striking distance. Most of Carolina's damage would be done at the line, the Gamecocks attempted just two fewer free throws than field goals in the first half, thanks in large part to 14 fouls called on the Dragons. PJ Dozier alone would convert 9-of-13 at the charity stripe to lead the team in scoring at 13.

The Gamecocks scored nine points in the final 5:18 of the 1st half, but needed just the first 63 seconds of the second half to score another nine and take control of the game. Extra passes on the team's first two possessions led to wide-open 3s from Mindaugas Kacinas and Sindarius Thornwell, and Dozier converted a three-point play on the very next possession to force a timeout.

Faced with its largest deficit of the game at 43-28, Drexel continued a cold streak that plagued it in in the final 10 minutes of the first half. The visitors went without a made field goal for the first five minutes of the second half, missing on its first 10 attempts and also coming up empty on three free throw tries.

The Dragons would get on the board with a basket at the 14:40 mark, but foul trouble up and down the lineup kept them from from putting out a consistent rotation on the floor. Despite facing a Drexel full-court press for most of the half, the Gamecocks seemed to be unfazed and passed their way to a number of easy transition baskets and soon found themselves ahead by 20, 61-41, with eight minutes still to play.

The lead would peak at 25 on the game's final basket, a TeMarcus Blanton 3-pointer. All told, the Gamecocks shot 67 percent in the second half and spread the wealth on offense. Seven different players would score five points or more, led by six apiece from Blanton, Chatkevicius and Thornwell.

GAME 10 - CAROLINA 65, CLEMSON 59 DEC. 18, 2015/GREENVILLE, S.C.

GREENVILLE, S.C. - It was a game fitting of a historic rivalry, as the Gamecock men's basketball team held off Clemson (7-4) Friday night in their first true road game of the season, 65-59. The win helped Carolina improve to 10-0, its best start since 1933-34, but it would take all 40 minutes for it to be decided.

Early nerves would lead to a slow start for the rivals, a Clemson 6-0 run helped it take a 10-7 lead six minutes in, with the Gamecocks struggling from the field with a 3-of-11 start.

Carolina got its first two-possession lead on the back of a personal 5-0 run by Mindaugas Kacinas, helping plant the seed for what would become a momentum-changing stretch for the visitors. He broke a 14-all tie with a three-point play, then following with a layup on the next possession to make it a 19-14 game with nine minutes to play in the half after the Tigers had gone up 13-9 just three minutes earlier.

A pair of 3-pointer from Michael Carrera extended the total run out to 16-1, forced a Clemson timeout and got the Gamecock-laden crowd at Bon Secours Wellness Arena in an uproar. In total, the Gamecocks would stretch the run out to 24-1 behind eight-straight made field goals, which compounded the Tiger's drought of 12-straight misses.

The highlight of the run would undoubtedly be Sindarius Thornwell's three-point play off a dunk that shook loose the dust from the arena's rafters. The run would last over eight minutes in total and helped Carolina take a 41-25 lead at halftime.

Clemson would hit just 5-of-18 two-point field goals and were out-scored 18-6 in the paint for the half, and the Gamecocks also enjoyed a ten-rebound advantage through the first 20 minutes. Eric Cobb would play big minutes off the bench with Carrera and Chris Silva in foul trouble early; the freshman led the team with four rebounds in the half.

The Tigers came out with comeback on their mind in the second half, and used a 7-0 run to cut into single digits before a 3-pointer from Duane Notice put the score at 48-36 at the first media timeout. Notice's 3s would be key for helping Carolina overcome a Clemson zone that was successfully stagnating the offense for the majority of the second half.

Despite relying heavily on 3-pointers to try and cut into the deficit, it would actually be Clemson's post scorers that made the difference as it continued to claw back into the game. Through the first 14 minutes of the second half, Clemson hit 6-of-8 two-pointers compared to just 4-of-11 on 3s. Baskets on four-straight possessions would get the Tigers within four, 57-53, with six minutes still to play.

Kacinas would snap a three-minute scoring drought for Carolina on a high-low pass from Laimonas Chatkevicius into the heart of the Clemson 2-3 zone, sending the Gamecocks into the final media timeout with a 59-55 lead. That would score held tight for over four minutes, with Carolina still vexed by Clemson's zone, and the Tigers unable to score against the Gamecock's physical man-to-man.

Coming down to the final 90 seconds of regulation, it would be the free throw line that the rivalry game would be decided. Each side missed the front end of a 1-and-1 at the line, but a turnover off an errant pass forced Clemson to foul and put Carrera at line to try and add critical points to the tenuous lead.

The senior swished both attempts, bringing an end to 4:04 minutes without a point from either team and gave Carolina a 61-55 lead with 22 seconds to play. A forced-up 3 by the Tigers would be rebounded by PJ Dozier, who added two more free throws and iced away the game.

GAME 11 - CAROLINA 75, ST. JOHN'S 61 DEC. 22. 2015/UNCASVILLE. CONN.

UNCASVILLE, CT. - The South Carolina Gamecock men's basketball team ran its season record to 11-0 Tuesday night, defeating St. John's 75-61. The game was played at Mohegan Sun Arena as part of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame Shootout. Led by a season-best performance from Duane Notice, the Gamecocks overcame an early deficit to earn their first win ever against the Red Storm (7-6).

St. John's would shoot its way out to an early lead, and held it for most of the first ten minutes of the game. The early advantage would grow to six, 13-7, before the Gamecocks clicked into tempo on offense. A 5-of-7 stretch from the 13:44 mark until 9:25 would turn that six-point deficit into Carolina's first lead of the day, 20-18. Duane Notice accounted for seven of the team's first 16 points and finished with 14 in the first half on a perfect 5-of-5 performance from the floor.

Carolina's defense would also find its feet for a key stretch, holding St. John's without a made basket for 6:28, allowing the Gamecocks to reel off a 15-1 run and take their biggest lead so far at 31-19. The Johnnies came off the mat for six-straight baskets following the cold spell and got into single digits before the buzzer at 40-34. Despite a 3-of-10 success rate from 3-point range, St. John's more than made up for it with an 11-of-16 clip from inside.

The hot streak to end the first half would not carry over for the Red Storm, as a pair of early turnovers pushed Carolina's lead back into the double digits and forced a timeout just a minute into the half. The lead would get no closer than eight points for the Gamecocks, who slowly would pull permanently into a double-digit lead for the final nine minutes of the game.

Michael Carrera would lead the way down the stretch, scoring eight points with seven rebounds in his 15 minutes of action in the second half. Laimonas Charkevicius added seven second-half points to push him into double figures for the game, his first game with 10 or more points since Nov. 27 against Lipscomb. Behind 14 second-half turnovers forced and 20 points in the paint, South Carolina would push the lead up to 18 before settling on the final margin.

GAME 12 - CAROLINA 78, FRANCIS MARION 56 DEC. 30, 2015/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - The South Carolina men's basketball team took the court at Colonial Life Arena for the first time in over two weeks, hosting Francis Marion Wednesday night. The Gamecocks shook off some early rust and ran off to a 78-56 win against the Patriots. Chris Silva led the team with a season-high 13 points and all 15 members of the team would see action in the win. It is Carolina's 12th-straight win, matching its longest win streak since the 1996-97 campaign.

Carolina connected on just one of its first six shots from the floor, but both teams would struggle offensively in the opening eight minutes of action. A 3-pointer from Francis Marion cut South Carolina's lead to just three 12-9, at the 11:15 mark of the first half, but the visitors missed their next seven field goal attempts. The Gamecocks would heat up down the home stretch of the half, scoring 21 of their 38 total points in the final 6:18, shooting 7-of-9 as a team in that span.

Chris Silva and Duane Notice scored 10 points apiece to lead the team, with Silva providing a pair of highlight-reel slam dunks in the process. Eight different players scored for the Gamecocks in the first half. The Patriots finished just 6-of-30 from the field in the half, but were able to force South Carolina into 10 turnovers and recorded seven offensive rebounds to counter a slow half offensively.

The home side pushed the lead up to 25 early on in the second half, 53-28, and held on to a 20-point advantage for the remainder of the game. The lead would allow head coach Frank Martin to look to his talented reserves to get some valuable playing time. Ten players would come off the bench for the team and nine of them scored at least two points. Despite relying almost exclusively on its freshmen, the South Carolina offense put up 40 points in the second half to seal the big win.

GAME 13 - CAROLINA 86, MEMPHIS 76 JAN. 2. 2016/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - The #24/20 South Carolina Gamecocks earned another signature win Saturday night, opening 2016 with a thrilling 86-76 win over Memphis (9-4). Sindarius Thornwell scored a season-high 18 points and Michael Carrera went for his second double-double in the last three games to lead Carolina to 13-0, its longest win streak since 1969-70. In a game that featured 17 ties and 13 different lead changes, senior leadership and depth proved to be the difference for the home side.

The game was emotionally charged from the first minute of action, but it translated into a reckless game that effected both teams. Nine combined fouls were called in the first three minutes of the game, putting a pair of starters on the bench for the Gamecocks with PJ Dozier and Laimonas Chatkevicius. Carolina would hold an early 9-7 lead thanks to a Chris Silva three-point play, but Memphis would soon answer back.

A 7-0 run from the visitors staked them to their largest lead of the night at 14-9 with 13:48 to play. A Duane Notice 3-pointer would soon tie the game back up at 16-all, but Carolina missed some extra opportunities to take a firm advantage and the lead bounced back and forth for the final ten minutes of the half. A 9-0 run for the Gamecocks in the final four minutes would push their lead as high as six, 39-33, but the Tigers tied it up for halftime on a last-second 3 from Ricky Tarrant.

Neither side was able to adjust to the physicality during the run of play, leading to a carousel of shooters at the free throw line all night. In total, the two teams combined for 68 fouls and 99 free throws in the game. Michael Carrera led the team through the first 20 minutes with 12 points and five rebounds, highlighted by a pair of 3s to fire up an already-stoked crowd of 13,035 at Colonial Life Arena. As a team, though, South Carolina shot just 33 percent from the floor.

The offenses remained chilly from the floor as the second half got underway, but Memphis would warm up just enough to grab an early 50-46 lead. The Gamecocks started just 3-of-15 from the floor through the first eight minutes, compounded by four missed free throws in that same stretch. Carolina was able to tie up the game back up, and would take a 61-59 lead after a pair of free throws by Notice, but neither team would enjoy much of any breathing room as the half wore on.

Memphis' offense would not extend past the free throw line for most of the final 20 minutes, as it shot just 23 percent from the floor in the second half but did make 16-of-19 at the line. The Tigers went over nine minutes without a field goal until a goaltending call gave them a make with 5:35 to go. By then, though, Carolina had built up a two-possession lead at 70-63 and started to wear into the opposition's depth with fouls.

In all, five Tigers would foul out and the Gamecocks were able to salt away the game with free throws. A pair of made attempts by Duane Notice with 11 seconds to play gave the Garnet and Black its largest lead of the game, the final margin of 86-76, and also set a new program record for both free throws made and attempted, with 46 and 63, respectively. The win closes out the team's first undefeated non-conference schedule since the 1933-34 team.

GAME 14 - CAROLINA 81, AUBURN 69 JAN. 5, 2016/AUBURN ARENA

AUBURN, ALA. - An active defense in the first half would prove to be the difference as the #22/20 South Carolina Gamecocks opened the SEC season with a road win at Auburn Tuesday night, 81-69. Sindarius Thornwell kept a hot hand, leading the team with 22 points while Laimonas Chatkevicius added his first double-double of the season with 12 points and 10 rebounds.

The Tigers (7-6, 1-1 SEC) held an early advantage, but the Gamecocks (14-0, 1-0) soon found success getting into the passing lanes and went off on a 12-0 run to take an 18-9 lead six minutes in. In that stretch, Auburn turned the ball over four times and missed a pair of shots, while Thornwell took advantage by scoring seven of those 12 points on his own. He would finish the half with 13 points thanks to a trio of 3-pointers, he and Duane Notice combined to connect on 6-of-9 3s in the half.

South Carolina's defense would harass Auburn relentlessly, forcing 15 turnovers in the first half that led to 23 of the Gamecocks' 43 points. The visitors took a 43-30 lead into the break, the lowest first-half scoring output from the Tigers this season.

Both sides kept sending it in from 3 to start the half, hitting three apiece in the first three minutes of the second half. Auburn made a concerted effort to limit turnovers, committing just six in the final 20 minutes, but the Gamecocks would turn to a high efficiency half-court offense to hold off any rallies.

Auburn could get no closer than six in the second half, as South Carolina shot 55 percent from the field and 79 percent at the free throw line. For the game the Garnet and Black shot an even 50 percent, the fifth time overall this season.

A lead that grew as large as 18 in the first half was whittled down to six, 63-57, with 7:30 to play but the Gamecocks responded with a 7-0 to push it back to double figures for the rest of the game. Chatkevicius put an exclamation mark on the modest but crucial run with a three-point play on a thunderous dunk in transition.

Head coach Frank Martin leaned on his veterans for the second half, giving his juniors and seniors 83 of the 100 possible minutes of playing time. Sophomore Marcus Stroman would play like a vet in the second half, finding success as distributor and slasher for the offense. He made it to the line, hitting all six free throw attempts, and added a layup in his 12 second-half minutes. For the second game in a row, free throws late in the game sealed the win — South Carolina hit 7-of-8 in the final 3:36 to push the lead out of reach.

GAME 15 - CAROLINA 69, VANDERBILT 65 JAN. 9, 2016/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - The #22/20 South Carolina Gamecocks are 2-0 to start the SEC season for the first time since 2010, but had to overcome its biggest test of the season Saturday afternoon against Vanderbilt (8-7, 0-3 SEC). The team had to erase an eight-point deficit in the second half, but Sindarius Thornwell led the way again and hit a major career milestone while guiding the team to a 69-65 win over the Commodores.

Vanderbilt took hold of the lead in its first possession and would hold on for the first 28 minutes of action, starting the game on an 8-0 burst. After weathering the initial blow, the Gamecocks (15-0, 2-0 SEC) would play the Commodores even for the rest of the first half, never letting the lead grow into double figures.

Mindaugas Kacinas led the team with 10 points in the first half, which helped to counter a 13-point performance from Vandy's Riley LaChance. South Carolina had a number of chances to take the lead over the final five minutes of the first half, but weren't able to string together enough stops and scores to get over the hump. Both sides would shoot nearly identical percentages, but Vanderbilt's 5-2 advantage in made 3-pointers helped give it a 38-35 halftime lead.

A quick 5-0 start out of the break from Vanderbilt put the comeback hopes on hold for Carolina, but the Gamecocks turned up the heat on defense and continued to chip away at the deficit. Their efforts would pay off with a jumper by Laimonas Chatkevicius that tied the game at 49 with 11:31 to go in regulation, followed by a jumper on the ensuing possession from PJ Dozier that gave the team its first lead of the day.

The 'Dores would go ice cold from the field just six minutes into the second half, hitting just one field goal in 17 attempts in a stretch that spanned from the 14:08 mark until making two of four in the final 40 seconds when the game was already out of reach. South Carolina countered with an 8-of-18 success rate in that same period to take control, pushing its lead as high as seven in the final minutes of the game.

The Gamecocks looked to Sindarius Thornwell to lead them to victory, and the veteran guard would do that and more. With his first points of the second half, coming on a jumper at 12:51 on the clock, the junior passed 1,000 career points, becoming the 42nd player in program history to reach the milestone. He would not rest on that achievement, scoring a team-high 11 points in the half including a critical period in the final three minutes where he scored seven straight points on his own to keep the Carolina lead at two possessions.

Thornwell's final two points would give the home side a 67-61 lead with just 36 seconds to play, and the Gamecocks were able to hold off any counter attacks and secure just the second win over Vanderbilt in the last eight meetings

GAME 16 - ALABAMA 73, CAROLINA 50 JAN. 13, 2016/TUSCALOOSA, ALA.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. - The No. 19/15 South Carolina men's basketball team suffered its first loss of the season Wednesday night at Alabama, 73-50. The Gamecocks fell behind early and saw their 15-game season-opening win streak come to an end. The Crimson Tide improves to 10-5 and 1-2 in conference action. Michael Carrera led the team with 14 points and 10 rebounds, his second double-double in the last four games.

It would be the Gamecocks (15-1, 2-1 SEC) versus Riley Norris for the first 10 minutes of the game, as Alabama's sophomore forward connected on his first five attempts from 3-point range. The South Carolina offense would not be able to answer the hot start, and Norris' fifth 3 of the half pushed Alabama's early advantage to 19-4 at the 11:39 mark.

The Gamecocks started just 2-of-12 from the field, but a stretch of six baskets in nine attempts gave the offense a brief jolt. The Tide rolled into halftime with a 35-22 lead, Laimonas Chatkevicius and Mindaugas Kacinas led the Gamecocks with six points apiece and combined to shoot 5-of-9. As a team, South Carolina connected on just 8-of-26 shots in the opening frame.

The offense was held without a field goal for the final three minutes of the first half, and that trend carried into the second half. The Gamecocks missed their first 12 attempts out of the break, and went without a point until a three-point play from Duane Notice with 11:51 left to play in regulation. In the time between Carolina's field goals, Alabama extended the lead up to 48-22.

Notice's field goal broke the seal for the Gamecock offense, who scored six straight baskets in a five-minute stretch, but it came too late. Freshman guard Jamall Gregory spurred an 8-0 run with six minutes left, hitting a 3 and converting a threepoint play over the span of three possessions, but Alabama's lead would be too much to overcome.

GAME 17 - CAROLINA 81, MISSOURI 72 JAN. 16, 2016/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - The No. 19/15 South Carolina men's basketball team wasted no time getting back on the winning track, beating Missouri 81-72 Saturday afternoon. The win moves the Gamecocks to 16-1, 3-1 in the SEC, while Missouri drops back to 8-9, 1-3. Key runs to bookend the first half would be the difference as the two teams dueled for all 40 minutes. Sindarius Thornwell recorded his 11th career 20-point game to lead the offense.

Behind a supportive home crowd of 15,389, the Gamecocks found their confidence early on and ran out to an 8-0 lead in the first four minutes of action. Missouri coughed the ball up five times and missed its first four shots before finally getting on the board with 16:14 to play.

The Tigers closed back to three, 11-8, but Thornwell took control and led the Gamecocks on a 12-2 run over the next three minutes to push the team to its largest lead of the half at 23-10. The junior, fresh off receiving a game ball in recognition of scoring his 1,000th career point against Vanderbilt, scored eight points from the field during the run.

Missouri went over three minutes without a point at the midway point in the period, allowing Carolina to hold a double-digit lead until the Tigers made a run of their own. A 10-0 burst from the visitors cut the lead to just three, 27-24, with 6:22 to play, but Thornwell made sure they would get no closer. After hitting a midrange jumper to break a two-minute scoring drought, Thornwell then found Duane Notice on an extra pass that pushed the lead back to six.

The Tiger offense warmed up as the half came to a close, making 8-of-11 field goals over the final eight minutes and cutting the lead all the way down to one, 35-34, with two minutes to play. The Gamecocks closed out the period on a 6-0 run to go into halftime up 41-34, with four coming from PJ Dozier. The freshman guard scored nine points total in the half, and Thornwell led all scorers with 13.

The quick run to end the half would prove to be crucial, as the second half developed into a shootout between the two teams. Missouri's Wes Clark, who suffered a season-ending injury against the Gamecocks last season, had a career day in his return to Columbia. The junior guard went for 26 points in the game, 13 coming in the second half. He and teammate Ryan Rosberg (12 points, 6-of-6 on field goals) powered the Mizzou offense in the second half, but Thornwell and Mindaugas Kacinas would play them to a draw and helped Carolina maintain its two-possession lead.

The two sides had nearly identical stat lines for the half, with Missouri's five extra 3-pointers made countered by Carolina's 11 extra conversions at the free throw line. The Gamecock's struggles from 3-point range carried over from Wednesday's game at Alabama, but they made up for it with aggressive rebounding and an efficient interior offense. Despite finishing just 3-of-21 from 3, the Gamecocks shot 60 percent on two-point field goals in the game.

A three-point play from Kacinas with 1:09 to play pushed Carolina's lead back into double digits at 75-64, enough to hold off a late barrage of 3s from Missouri. Kacinas finished with a team-high 10 points in the second half on 4-of-5 shooting.

GAME 18 - CAROLINA 77, OLE MISS 74 (OT) JAN. 19. 2016/OXFORD, MISS.

OXFORD, MISS. - The No. 24/18 South Carolina Gamecocks would lead for just two minutes total in regulation Tuesday night at Ole Miss, but still managed to force overtime and won a critical SEC road game, 77-74. Despite facing a double-figure deficit for most of the second half, the Gamecocks rallied late to force the extra period and leaned on their seniors to finish off the comeback.

Laimonas Chatkevicius posted a double-double with 17 points and 10 rebounds, and Michael Carrera scored five of his team-high 19 points in overtime to lead the Gamecocks. With the win, the team moves to 17-1 for the season and 4-1 in the SEC. Ole Miss is now 12-6, 2-4 in conference play.

It would take a stretch for the offense to find its foot at the start of the game, as it started just 1-of-9 from the field. After that, though, the Gamecock verted 5-of-6 to take a 13-12 lead with 12 to play. Neither team could find space on the scoreboard early, but six quick points off back-to-back possessions gave Ole Miss a two-possession cushion it used to carry the lead for the final eight minutes of action.

The Rebels spaced out the Carolina defense, who were paying careful attention to Stefan Moody -- the SEC's leading scorer -- and kept the defense running. Carolina would get within four, 25-21, with five minutes to play, but Ole Miss' sixth and seventh 3s of the period pushed the lead to 39-29 by halftime.

Forward Anthony Perez would lead all scorers with 12 points on 4-of-4 shooting from 3 to power the Rebels, who shot 43 percent as a team. The Gamecocks were powered by Mindaugas Kacinas and his eight points and five rebounds, but made just one 3 in the opening half.

South Carolina ran out of the locker room with a hot start to the first half, whit-

tling the deficit all the way down to three at 44-41 just four minutes in. Ole Miss called a timeout to regroup, and ran back ahead thanks to the efforts of Marcanvis Hymon. He would score seven of the team's next ten points, and the home side pushed back ahead to 54-43 just four minutes after Carolina's big run.

The Gamecocks were unable to string together scores and stops for most of the final 20 minutes, but were able to catch their breath when Moody suffered an apparent hamstring injury and had to leave the game with five minutes left to play. Without their senior leader, the Rebels went without a point for the final four minutes of regulation.

Seeing daylight, Carolina ran off an 11-0 run in that same stretch, and would find themselves tied at 66 with just a 45 seconds to play. Moody would re-enter the game and found Perez in the corner for a 3, but he would miss his first attempt of the day and Carolina had the final possession of the period. Duane No-tice drove the lane with six seconds to play for a contested layup, but his attempt rolled off the right side the game would go to overtime.

Off the tip in overtime, the Gamecocks would be assertive and earned the early 70-68 lead behind a 3-pointer from Duane Notice. The lead would grow to four after a pair of free throws from Jamall Gregory, but the Rebs went for four straight to tie the game at 72 with just 53 seconds remaining.

As Gamecock fans have come to expect after four years, it would be an effort play from Michael Carrera that ultimately put a pin on the comeback. He connected on a tough three-point play on the team's very next possession, collecting a jumbled pass in the key, drawing contact on a fade-away jumper and making the shot. The senior then leapt up to collect a blocked 3-pointer on the Ole Miss end and made the next two free throws to make it a two-possession game with 10 seconds left and ice the improbable win.

GAME 19 - TENNESSEE 78, CAROLINA 69 JAN. 23, 2016/KNOXVILLE, TENN.

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. - A career day from Tennessee's Kevin Punter would be too much to overcome for the No. 24/18 South Carolina Gamecocks, who fell to the Vols 78-69 Saturday afternoon. Michael Carrera scored a season-high 22 points but was countered by Punter's career-high 36, 27 that came in the second half alone. Carolina falls back to 17-2 overall and 4-2 in the SEC. Tennessee is 10-9, 3-4 in conference play.

Chris Silva paced the team early on, scoring six of the team's first 10 points and pulling down four of its first eight rebounds. Both teams needed time early to adjust to the physicality of the game, and two would combine for just eight field goals in the first eight minutes of action. Tennessee took advantage of 12-straight missed field goals for the Gamecocks and built its widest margin of the half with a 19-11 with seven minutes remaining in the period.

Despite the lack of scoring from the Gamecocks, Tennessee would not be able to take full advantage. It would only outscore Carolina 9-1 in the eight minutes between field goals, and would only stake itself out to the eight-point lead before PJ Dozier broke the spell with a layup at the 6:27 mark. The basket would open things up for the team, as it led to a 7-0 run that got the Gamecocks back in the mix in the final five minutes of action.

The Vols tried to pull away one last time before the break, but three more points from Silva and a 3-pointer by Michael Carrera made it a 29-28 UT lead at halftime. Silva would finish with nine points and five rebounds in the half, but ten turnovers and a 33 percent success rate from the floor kept the Gamecocks from taking the lead at any point in the first 20 minutes.

A pair of 3s from the Volunteers opened the second half and forced an early South Carolina timeout. The Gamecocks rallied back behind three-point plays inside from Laimonas Chatkevicius and Carrera, but Tennessee hit its third and fourth 3s of the first four minutes to carry a 43-36 lead into the first media timeout. In total, the home side converted its first seven attempts from 3 in the second half to push the lead into double digits with nine minutes to play (58-47).

Kevin Punter, the conference's second-leading scorer, paced Tennessee in the second half. He accounted for 14 of the team's first 29 points, all coming in just 10 minutes of playing time for the senior. After back-toback baskets from Carolina cut the UT down to 58-53, the Vols took advantage of mental mistakes and scored nine straight points in just over two minutes to push the lead back into double digits with five minutes

South Carolina rallied back within six, 68-62, with 2:24 still remaining, but Punter would convert ten straight free throws over the next two minutes to put any shot at back-to-back comebacks to rest for Carolina.

GAME 20 - CAROLINA 84, MISS. STATE 74 JAN. 26, 2016/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - Senior Michael Carrera put on a sublime performance Tuesday night, scoring a career-high 34 points to go with 15 rebounds as the Gamecocks held off Mississippi State, 84-74. His 20 second-half points helped to stave off a pair of comeback attempts by the Bulldogs (8-11, 1-6 SEC) and pushed the Gamecocks up to 18-2 (5-2 SEC), the program's best 20-game start to a season since 2003-04 and the most total wins in a season since 2008-09.

With his eye-popping stat line, Carrera became the first Gamecock to reach at least 30 points with 15 rebounds in a game since the team joined the SEC in 1992. The two offenses struggled from the field over the first five minutes, combining to hit just three of its first 18 attempts from the floor. A four-minute span without a point from the Bulldogs helped South Carolina erase a 5-1 deficit and take a 7-5 lead at the first media timeout. The lead would grow to 20-9 after Mississippi State turned the ball over six times and scored just two points from the 13:50 until the

A quick 7-0 answer from the visitors would bring a timeout from Carolina's bench just over a minute later, with the lead cut to 20-16. The Bulldogs appeared poised to grab all the momentum after a big 3-pointer and three-point play off a highlightreel dunk from Quinndary Weatherspoon cut Carolina's lead to just 25-22. The Gamecocks would play answer back with the exact same combo, getting a 3 from Duane Notice followed immediately by a three-point play from PJ Dozier to cool off MSU

The Gamecocks would hold on to a comfortable two-possession lead for the final four minutes of play. Carrera sent the 12,764 fans in attendance into the halftime break happy after a buzzer-beating jumper to stake the team to a 43-34 lead at intermission. Carolina's thorough domination of the boards played a key factor in the half, as its 26-12 advantage in rebounds led to just five second-chance points and 10 points in the paint for Mississippi State.

Out of the break, the Bulldogs were forced into an early timeout after a 5-1 start for Carolina, highlighted by a wide-open 3 from Carrera. Fouls bogged both teams early in the period - both sides were in the bonus with more than 12 minutes to play and Notice, Dozier and Chris Silva were each saddled with four fouls before ten minutes had passed in the period.

Mississippi State was able to work itself back into contention thanks to hot shooting from 3-point range, and used a 12-2 run in less than four minutes to bring the deficit to two, 55-53, with ten minutes to go. Carrera would be a one-man momentum killer, converting an unbelievable three-possession span that kept the encroaching Bulldogs at bay. He blocked a shot on one end, hit a contested 3 in transition on the other, added a layup on the next possession and capped the run off with a three-point play on the possession after that.

The senior's efforts pushed Carolina's lead back to 65-57, but MSU's Malik New-

man was ready to counter on the other end. The freshman hit 4-of-6 3s in the second half alone and kept the Bulldogs snapping at Carolina's heels. As a team, the visitors made 8-of-15 3s in the second half but just 4-of-20 two-point field goals, a

fact that hurt them down the stretch when the 3s stopped falling.

After a Mississippi State dunk with 4:40 to go made it just a 73-69 lead for Carolina, the combo of Carrera and Notice at the free throw line and a cold snap from the field put the Bulldogs away for good. Following the dunk, MSU went 2-of-10 shooting the rest of the way and the Gamecock lead swelled back into double digits and stayed there for the final margin.

GAME 21 - CAROLINA 78, ALABAMA 64 JAN. 30, 2016/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - The RV/22 South Carolina men's basketball team earned a hard-fought win over Alabama (11-9, 2-6 SEC) Saturday night, winning 78-64. Michael Carrera's second-straight game with a double-double led the way, with Sindarius Thornwell and Chris Silva joining him in double figures. Now at 19-2, 6-2 in conference play, the Gamecocks have their highest win total for a season in seven years.

The upswell of emotion from the sold-out Colonial Life Arena personified the Gamecocks' energy from the opening tip. The Garnet and Black were flying around on both ends of the court, and built a 12-5 lead early behind a 5-of-7 start from the field in the first three minutes. A pair of Alabama turnovers fed into the opening salvo, the first led to a 3 in the corner from Mindaugas Kacinas and the second would be a picked-off inbounds pass from Kacinas that scored a layup and a foul.

The Tide were able to slow down the pace and erased the early advantage. The Gamecocks were finding looks from the field, but made just one field goal in an eight-minute stretch and missed six free throws in that same span. Alabama would tie things up at 15-all with 13 minutes still to play, and after a grinding five-minute stretch after that it would takes first lead at 20-19.

The visitor's lead would last just 19 seconds thanks to an immediate answer from Michael Carrera. A 3 from the senior sparked an 11-2 Gamecocks run that put them back ahead 30-22 heading into the final four minutes of the period. A 3 off a bank shot from Sindarius Thornwell with 37 seconds left to play gave Carolina its largest lead of the night, 35-26, heading into the break. Thornwell would lead all scorers in the half with 10 points, and his five rebounds also led the way. Carolina's defense held Alabama to just 7-of-28 from the floor in the half, including four different stretches where the Tide missed at least four straight shots.

A basket from Chris Silva to start the half gave Carolina its first double-digit lead of the game, but Alabama would soon bring it back to a five with 14:24 to play. A 14-5 run after that, keyed by a Duane Notice 3, would put the early comeback attempt on the back burner and staked Carolina to a 59-45 lead just four minutes later.

In a game that was physical from the tip, both offenses had slow nights, but foul troubles for Alabama would grind down its depth and give the Gamecocks 46 shots at the line (27 in the second half). It would also force the Tide defense to commit to a zone look, which would be punished over a key stretch by Carolina. Laimonas Chatkevicius and Mindaugas Kacinas worked the highlow post game for baskets on three-straight possessions, and a 3 from Carrera would force the visitors to move back to man-to-man.

Retin Obasohan did everything he could to keep his side in contention, scoring ten-straight points for the Tide in a three minute span. It would not be enough, as the rest of his team shot just 32 percent (9-of 28) in the second half. He picked up his fifth foul off a technical with a minute to go, becoming the fourth 'Bama player to be disqualified, and the Gamecocks salted the game away at the foul line.




