#### CAROLINA QUICK HITS

- South Carolina is in its 104th season of basketball.
- The Gamecocks are led by fourth-year head coach Darrin Horn.
- South Carolina's contest vs. Presbyterian marks its first in the last nine days due to a break for final exams. The Gamecocks will play three games vs. PC, vs. No. 2/2 Ohio State and vs. SE Louisiana prior to the holiday break.
- Sophomore guard Bruce Ellington posted the winning point on two clutch free throws with 13.0 seconds on the clock, and R-senior forward Malik Cooke sealed the win with a pair of free throws with 6.7 on the clock in a 58-55 victory at Clemson on Dec. 4. Sophomore guard Eric Smith also sank a crucial jumper with 25.9 on the clock to propel the Gamecocks to their first win at Clemson since the 2003 campaign.
- Sophomore point guard Bruce Ellington made his return to the practice court with the Gamecock hoops team on Nov. 28. Ellington is also a member of the Gamecock football team. To date, Ellington has scored two touchdowns this season, including a 49-yard reception for a score vs. Clemson on Dec. 4. He posted six points in his first game back with the men's basketball team vs. Providence on Dec. 1.
- Freshman forward Anthony Gill ranks among leaders in the SEC in field goal percentage (56.8%) and sophomore guard Eric Smith ranks among league leaders in 3-point field goal percentage (48.3%).
- In games it has won this season, South Carolina holds a +10.7 scoring margin over its opponents. To compare, in games in has lost, Gamecock opponents score 8.6 more points per game.
- The Gamecocks have out-rebounded their opponent in six of eight contests this season
- South Carolina is 279-266 (.511) all-time in the month of December. South Carolina earned a 4-2 mark last season during the month.
- Following Tuesday's matchup vs. Presbyterian, South Carolina will host No. 2/2 Ohio State on Saturday in a nationally-televised contest on ESPN. Game time is set for Noon.
- South Carolina's contest vs. Ohio State will mark the second top-five opponent for Carolina this season, as the Game-cocks played then-No.1 North Carolina on Nov. 25 in the Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational.

- 13-8 South Carolina out-scored Clemson 13-8 over the final five minutes of the contest on Dec. 4 to earn the victory. That number included a perfect 4-of-4 effort from the free throw line, with both Ellington and Cooke hitting two attempts with under 30 seconds remaining.
- 5 Sophomore forward Damontre Harris matched his career high with five blocks against Clemson, including four in the second half.
- 20+ South Carolina has used very balanced minutes throughout the season thus far, with eight Gamecocks averaging 20 or more minutes per game, with just Malik Cooke averaging above the 30-minute mark at 30.5 minuter per game.

#### **INTERVIEW POLICIES**

All interview requests must be made in advance to SID Emily Feeney in the South Carolina Media Relations Office. Beginning with the start of practice in October, Feeney will release a weekly coach and player availability schedule to media no later than 9 a.m. each Monday morning during the season.

Post-Game Interview Policy: After each home game, the visiting coach will address the media first, followed by South Carolina head coach Darrin Horn and then South Carolina players. (Depending on deadline and during non-conference season, this may be altered on a game-by-game basis)

#### A SOUTH CAROLINA WIN WOULD ...

• Be Carolina's first over a Big South opponent since a Dec. 23, 2008 victory against PC, which is also the Gamecocks' last meeting against a Big South Conference school.

#### PRESBYTERIAN SERIES

South Carolina owns a 30-7 upperhand in the all-time series with Presbyterian, including a 21-4 mark in games played in Columbia. Tuesday's meeting against PC marks just the second between the two schools since the 1947 campaign. The Gamecocks and Blue Hose met consistently from 1917-47, before meeting again in 2008 after nearly 60 years. The Gamecocks won the 2008 meeting 75-56. Below is a breakdown of the last 10 meetings:

#### **SCOUTING PC**

Led by long-time head coach Gregg Nibert, PC enters Tuesday's contest with a 4-4 overall record, including a 1-1 mark in Big South play after most recently earning a 72-64 victory over Radford ... The Blue Hose also suffered a 59-56 loss to Winthrop in league play ... The squad is paced by R-Sr. Al'Lonzo Coleman with 15.0 points and 7.9 rebounds per game ... Coleman and R-Sr. guard Josh Johnson led the Blue Hose during the 2008 meeting against the Gamecocks with 13 points each ... Junior guard Khalid Mutakabbir also contributes double-digits for PC, averaging 14.8 points per game ... PC ranks fourth in the Big South in scoring defense (68.0) and second in free throw percentage (71.4).

#### TREND SETTING

Gamecock trends under Darrin Horn ...

- South Carolina is 20-9 when collecting at least 10 steals in a contest.
- South Carolina collected 11 steals in its season-opening win over Western Carolina. The Gamecocks used solid half-court defense to collect seven steals over MVSU on Nov. 22.
- The Gamecocks are 21-13 when blocking at least seven shots in a game.
- The Gamecocks average 5.5 blocks per game this season; Carolina blocked a season high seven shots vs. Tennessee State, Mississippi Valley State, UNC and Providence
- South Carolina is 40-14 when holding its opponents under 45% shooting from the field.
- South Carolina has held its opponents under 45% shooting from the field in five of eight contests thus far in 2011-12, including holding Clemson to just 38.0% (19-50).

- Carolina is 29-10 when out-rebounding its opponent.
- The Gamecocks have out-rebounded six of eight opponents this season, including a 43-35 mark vs. UNC. Only Southern Cal collected more rebounds than the Gamecocks, winning the battle of the boards by a 28-18 margin, whilke both South Carolina and Clemson collected 33 rebounds.

#### **SEASON NOTABLES**

- Behind freshman forward Anthony Gill's 14-point performance, the Gamecocks earned a 69-59 victory over D-II powerhouse Kentucky Wesleyan in the lone exhibition of the season on Nov. 3. Senior forward Malik Cooke chipped in 11 points and sophomore forward RJ Slawson added 10, while collecting a team-best nine rebounds.
- South Carolina earned a 75-50 victory over Western Carolina in the season opener on Nov. 11. Freshman forward Anthony Gill paced Carolina with 14 points, while sophomore guard Brenton Williams impressed, scoring 13 points on 5-of-8 shooting from the floor, while collecting five steals.
- South Carolina first-year players (Gill, Leonard, Williams, Geathers) accounted for 36 points vs. Western Carolina on Nov. 11. Gill paced the group with 14 points.
- Carolina's 12 3-point field goal attempts versus Western Carolina rank as the second-fewest in the Darrin Horn era. The Gamecocks have attempted just 12 on six occassions, with the previous time in a 74-61 win over Delaware State on Dec. 1, 2010. Under Horn, the fewest attempts by Carolina in a game is 10, which has happened three times.
- South Carolina sophomore guard Eric Smith tallied a career high 18 points in just 18 minutes vs. Tennessee State on Nov. 20. The Mullins, S.C., native hit 6-of-10 from the floor, including a stellar 5-of-7 from 3-point range. Smith's previous career high was nine points.
- Senior forward Malik Cooke paced the Gamecocks with 18 points against Mississippi Valley State on Nov. 22, including a stellar 10-of-12 mark from the free throw line. Both his free throws made and attempted were career highs for the Charlotte, N.C., native.
- South Carolina rallied from an 11-point deficit with 6:36 to go against MVSU, out-scoring the Delta Devils 22-7 over the final minutes for the win. The Gamecocks converted on six MVSU turnovers for 12 points down the stretch, using solid half-court pressure to force the giveaways.
- South Carolina concluded play in the Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational with a 63-60 loss to Southern California last Saturday. Sophomore forward Damontre Harris led the Gamecocks with a career high 15 points in the contest.
- Sophomore forward RJ Slawson had a career night against top-ranked North Carolina on Nov. 25, posting career highs with 13 points, 14 rebounds and four blocks. It was the most rebounds in a game for South Carolina since Sam Muldrow collected 14 vs. Vanderbilt on Jan. 8, 2011.

Darrin Horn is in his fourth season in Columbia with a career record of 164-95, including a 53-47 mark at South Carolina. Darrin Horn-led teams are 78-48 all-time in league play. Horn led Carolina to a 10-6 record in SEC action during his first year in Columbia, a 6-10 mark in his second and one of the youngest teams in the nation to a 5-11 mark in 2011. Horn led Carolina to one of the most celebrated seasons of its 19-year participation in the SEC during the 2009 campaign, as the squad captured the 2009 SEC Eastern Division Co-Championship and won double-digit league games for the first time since the 1998 campaign. His 2010 squad earned upset wins over No. 1 Kentucky and No. 13/19 Vanderbilt.

South Carolina sophomore guard Brenton Williams is available to play vs. Presbyterian after missing the last several weeks with a left knee sprain.

#### NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULE

Contests against at least five teams that competed in the 2011 NCAA Tournament highlight the 2011-12 South Carolina men's basketball non-conference schedule. South Carolina will host 11 non-conference contests at Colonial Life Arena, including one exhibition, the first two rounds of the Las Vegas Invitational, Providence in the Big East/SEC Challenge and Big Ten powerhouse Ohio State. The Gamecocks will face at least six teams that compiled 18 or more wins last season, including North Carolina, Southern California or UNLV, Clemson, Ohio State and Wofford, which all advanced to the NCAA Tournament. South Carolina is slated to face five BCS schools during the coming non-conference portion of the schedule.

#### **2012 SEC TOURNAMENT**

The 2012 SEC Tournament returns to New Orleans, La., next spring, marking the third time the city has hosted the event. It will be the first time the tournament will be held at the New Orleans Arena. This season the schedule will still reflect the divisions of years past, as South Carolina will still play the five schools who were also in the East - Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Tennessee and Vanderbilt - twice, while playing the former West schools - Alabama, Arkansas, Auburn, LSU, Ole Miss and Mississippi State - once during the regular season.

# GAME 1 - SOUTH CAROLINA, 75, WESTERN CAROLINA 50 COLUMBIA, S.C. - NOV. 11, 2011

**COLUMBIA, S.C.** - Freshman Anthony Gill and sophomore Brenton Williams scored 14 and 13 points, respectively, to lead the South Carolina men's basketball team to a season-opening 75-50 victory over Western Carolina on Friday night at Colonial Life Arena.

Gill was 6-of-7 from the floor, including 1-for-1 from 3-point range, while Williams was 5-for-8 on the night. Williams also led a solid defensive effort, collecting five of the Gamecocks' 11 steals. Senior Malik Cooke added 10 points and seven rebounds, and junior Lakeem Jackson filled the stat sheet with five points, five assists, 10 rebounds and three steals.

With the win, the Gamecocks (1-0) claim their 11th straight season opener, including a 4-0 mark under head coach Darrin Horn.

South Carolina dominated nearly every statistical category as it shot 50.8 percent from the floor (30-of-59) and held the Catamounts to 36.2 percent shooting (17-of-47). The Gamecocks also held a decisive advantage in points in the paint (46-18), second chance points (20-9), bench points (38-16) and points off turnovers (22-15) and they controlled the boards with a 37-29 edge, including 18 offensive boards.

The Gamecocks used their defensive pressure to break an 8-8 tie early on with an 8-0 run, including six straight points off turnovers. Williams made a transition layup off a steal by Brian Richardson to cap the run and give South Carolina a 16-8 lead at the 10:40 mark.

Western Carolina (0-1) scrapped back with back-to-back 3-pointers and a dunk by Brandon Boggs to knot the game at 16-16, but South Carolina scored the next nine points to build a lead it would not relinquish. Williams gave the Gamecocks their biggest lead of the half at 33-22 by converting a layup off a steal by Jackson, one of five South Carolina had in the half. Williams, who paced the Gamecocks with 11 points in the half, sank a pair of free throws with less than a minute remaining to give South Carolina a 35-25 advantage heading into the locker room.

The Gamecocks outscored Western Carolina 40-25 in the second half as they held the Catamounts to just 32 percent shooting. Gill drained a 3-pointer at the 17:00 mark to give South Carolina a 43-29 lead. After Boggs knocked down a jumper to trim the Gamecocks' lead to 43-33 with 15:06 remaining, South Carolina outscored Western Carolina 26-10 over the next 10 minutes to pull away for the win.

Sophomore Eric Smith chipped in a career-high nine points and four assists for the Gamecocks.

Trey Sumler and Harouna Mutombo netted 11 points apiece to lead Western Carolina.

# GAME 3 - SOUTH CAROLINA 63, TENNESSEE STATE 64 COLUMBIA, S.C. - NOV. 20, 2011

COLUMBIA, S.C. - The South Carolina Gamecocks (1-2) suffered a 64-63 defeat against Tennessee State (2-2) on Sunday night at Colonial Life Arena competing in the Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational. Sophomore guard Eric Smith led the Gamecocks with 18 points, doubling a career high.

Tennessee State started a run as the game passed the 10-minute mark and held a 15-9 lead with just over eight minutes left in the opening half. Carolina gained new life 30 seconds later after senior Malik Cooke poked the ball free from a Tiger guard and Lakeem Jackson collected the loose ball to take it down the floor and slam home a two-handed dunk.

Tennessee State's Robert Covington would hit a 3 at the other end, but Cooke would follow with a free throw and Damien Leonard hit a 3 from the corner to pull the Gamecocks to within three points of the Tigers with 5:31 left in the stanza. Following the under-four minute media timeout, Tennessee State's Jordan Cyphers buried two 3s and added three free throws, as the Tigers took a 33-19 lead into the locker room at halftime.

Sonhomore forward Damontre Harris would convert a three-point play and Smith would hit a pair of 3s from the left wing to bring the Garnet and Black scratching back in the second half. With 10:07 left, Smith drove to the hole and dished a pass to RJ Slawson who finished the possession with a layup to near the score at 49-38.

The Tigers took a timeout to halt the momentum, but the Gamecocks' run wasn't over, as right off the break solid defense set up Cooke for a mid-range jumper followed by a 3 from the wing to pull within six points of the Tiger lead with 8:46 remaining.

A steal by Leonard gave the ball to Carolina with under a minute left. Slawson would be fouled under the basket with a chance to tie, as the score stood at 64-62 with seven seconds remaining. Slawson would hit one of the two attempts from the line, and the Tigers would miss the front end of a bonus shot from the line at the other end, but Tennessee State held on to earn the 64-63 win.

The Gamecocks held the advantage in the paint, outscoring the Tigers 24-14 and holding the rebounding advantage

Smith posted a career high with 18 points, while Jackson would add 12, and Cooke and Slawson contributed 10 apiece.

# GAME 4 - SOUTH CAROLINA 61, MISS VALLEY STATE 57 COLUMBIA, S.C. - NOV. 22, 2011

COLUMBIA, S.C. - The South Carolina Gamecocks (2-2) rallied for a 61-57 victory over Mississippi Valley State (0-4) on Tuesday night at Colonial Life Arena competing in the second game of the Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational. Senior forward Malik Cooke led the Gamecocks with 18 points, and freshman guard Damien Leonard scored a career-high 16 points for the Gamecocks. Freshman forward Anthony Gill corralled a game-leading seven rebounds, and redshirt freshman Carlton Geathers blocked a career high three shots.

Mississippi Valley State was led by junior guard Terrance Joyner with 22 points and senior forward Falando Jones who tallied 11 points in the contest. The Delta Devil's senior guard Cor-J Cox pulled down a game-leading seven rebounds. Senior center Paul Crosby and freshman guard Luca Pajkovic added six boards for MVSU.

After giving up the first basket to Mississippi Valley State, the Gamecocks went on a 23-7 run to start the game. Leonard led the charge during the Gamecocks' surge with 12 points on a 4-of-5 performance from behind the arc. The run gave the Gamecocks a 14-point lead, their largest of the game, at the 8:16 mark in the first half.

Mississippi Valley State found a rhythm and went on a run of their own. The Delta Devils outscored the Gamecocks 14 to 5 over the last 6:59 of the first half to pull within four points at the break. Geathers blocked Amos Studivant's jumper in the lane that would have tied the game at 28. Cooke was fouled on the subsequent rebound and knocked down two free throws with 21 seconds left in the half to give the Gamecocks a 30-26 advantage at the break.

Mississippi Valley State took the lead early coming out of the locker room on back-to-back transition layups to begin the second half by Kevin Burwell and Terrance Joyner. Joyner drew sophomore forward Damontre Harris' third foul and converted a three-point play that gave the Delta Devils a 31-30 lead, their first lead of the game since the opening basket.

South Carolina, who had begun to chip away at the MVSU lead since the 6:36 mark in the second half, then began a feverish comeback that was ignited by the Gamecocks defense. Sophomore forward R.J. Slawson stole the ball at midcourt due to the South Carolina press. Sophomore guard Eric Smith drained a three-pointer, which was assisted by Slawson on a crosscourt pass, to cut the lead to five at 48-53 with 3:19 remaining. South Carolina continued to apply the press and forced another turnover, which resulted in two Leonard free throws to bring the Gamecocks to within three. A third consecutive steal, this time on an inbounds pass created a Leonard fast break layup to cut the MVSU lead to one at 52-53.

Gill drew a charge on Crosby to give the Gamecocks a chance to take the lead. Slawson drained a jumper with just 2:00 minutes remaining to take the lead at 54-53. Cooke put back a Slawson miss to extend the Gamecocks' lead to three Cooke collected a loose ball and hit two free throws to make the score 58-53 with 55.7 to go in the game.

The Delta Devils cut the Gamecocks' lead to one at a score of 58-57 on shots by Cox and freshman guard Brent Arrington with just 24 seconds remaining, but Cooke extended the Gamecock lead to 61-57 on two trips to the line.

## GAME 8 - SOUTH CAROLINA 58, CLEMSON 55

CLEMSON, S.C. - DEC. 4, 2011

CLEMSON, S.C. - Malik Cooke hit two free throws with 6.7 seconds remaining to seal a 58-55 South Carolina victory over Clemson on Sunday at Littlejohn Coliseum. The Gamecocks improve to 3-5 on the year, while Clemson falls to 4-3. The victory was South Carolina's first at Clemson since the 2003 campaign, while it was Carolina's second straight victory over the Tigers.

Sophomore forward Damontre Harris contributed 10 points, six rebounds and a career-high five blocks to pace the Gamecocks, and Cooke sealed the win with two free throws in the final seven seconds en route to six points, eight rebounds and four steals in the game. In just his second game back with the basketball team, sophomore guard Bruce Ellington contributed nine points, including two key free throws with 13 seconds

Both teams traded baskets to start the contest before Clemson extended its lead to 22-16 with 8:31 remaining in the opening half. Sophomore guard Eric Smith responded for Carolina with a driving layup, but Clemson's Andre Young connected on a 3 for a 25-18 Tiger advantage with 5:44 on the clock.

Both team's had their offensive chances the remainder of the half. Young hit a layup, and a 3 by Tanner Smith pushed the Tiger lead to 35-25 with just seconds remaining before halftime, but Ellington stepped to the 3-point line and hit a jumper with 1.9 seconds on the clock to pull the Gamecocks within seven at the break, 35-28.

Both teams started slow on the offensive end to open the second half. Junior forward Lakeem Jackson hit a bank shot with 18:42 on the clock and Cooke connected on a jumper 30 seconds later, as the Tiger lead was just three points at the 16-minute mark.

A putback by Harris with 4:36 on the clock knotted the score at 47-47, before a layup by freshman forward Anthony Gill with just over three minutes remaining gave the Gamecocks a 49-47 advantage.

Clemson responded to tie the score at 49 before Gill gave the Gamecocks a 52-49 advantage on a 3 from the wing with 1:19 on the clock.

Clemson's Devin Booker made two free throws to pull within one at 52-51 with 58.1 on the clock, before Smith hit a crucial shot for the Gamecocks, connecting on a jumper assisted by Ellington with 25.9 seconds remaining, pushing the Carolina advantage to 54-51.

Ellington and Cooke both connected on free throw opportunities down the stretch, and Clemson's Smith was unable to tie the score on three free throw attempts, as the Gamecock earned the 58-55 victory.






