

## NCAA WOMEN'S SOCCER FIRST ROUND POSTGAME NOTES

South Carolina vs. Davidson - November 13, 2009

## **South Carolina**

South Carolina's win is marks the school's first postseason victory in women's soccer history. This is South Carolina's fourth appearance in the NCAA Tournament (1-2-1).

With the victory, South Carolina improves to 10-0-0 on the year at home at Stone Stadium. The attendance of 3,813 fans is the largest attended home game in South Carolina women's soccer history. The 10 consecutive wins at home is a school record.

Brooke Jacobs scored her second goal of NCAA postseason play with her first half score. She finished with a goal and an assist. Jacobs scored the Gamecocks' first goal in the 2008 NCAA Tournament vs. William & Mary. She also tallied a goal and assist also in that contest.

Kayla Grimsley set a sophomore single-season record for goals with her 13<sup>th</sup> in the season. Angela Austin held the previous record with 12 goals as a sophomore in 1997. Grimsley's two goals ties a single-game career high. She had two goals on Oct. 3, 2008 in a 2-0 victory at Kentucky. Grimsley also moved up to third on the Gamecocks All-Time Scoring List. She has 55 career points and is eight behind Morgan McIntyre (63) for second place.

The shutout for Carolina was the  $14^{th}$  of the season for the team. Goalkeeper Mollie Patton has recorded all 14 shutouts. The team has allowed just two goals on the year at home.

South Carolina head coach Shelley Smith earned her 99<sup>th</sup> victory as head coach of South Carolina. In her ninth season, she holds a 99-65-24 record as coach of the Gamecocks.
