Gamecocks Travel to NCAA Norman Regional

South Carolina has earned a bid to play in the NCAA Norman Regional. The 54-hole event will be held on May 17-19 at the par-72, 7,387-yard Jimmie Austin OU Golf Club in Norman, Okla..

The Gamecocks received the No. 9 seed and will compete against 13 teams for one of five spots available to the NCAA Championship, which will be held on May 31-June 3 at Riviera Country Club in Los Angeles, Calif.

The Lineup

The Gamecocks are going back to the lineup that sparked a successful run to start the spring. Senior Wesley Bryan, junior Dykes Harbin and the talented freshman trio of Sean Kelly, Will Murphy and Caleb Sturgeon look to get Carolina back to the NCAA Championship for the first time since 2009.

Bryan is the only golfer on the squad with regional experience, but his two previous appearances will be valuable for him to lead the young Gamecock lineup. His best finish was a tie for sixth showing at the NCAA East Regional in 2010 with rounds of 71-66-70=207. Harbin, Kelly, Murphy and Sturgeon have gained valuable experience this spring in leading Carolina.

History at the NCAA Regionals

The selection marks the Gamecocks' 20th NCAA Regional appearance, including their 15th bid in the last 16 years, and they have advanced to the NCAA Championship 16 times, with the last being in 2009. South Carolina owns one regional title as it won the 2007 West Regional and went on to finish tied for 11th at the NCAA Championship. Bryan IV shot rounds of 68-67-69=204 to lead the way with a tie for 10th finish. Carolina also finished runner-up in 1999 and tied for second in 2009.

Last time at the NCAA Regionals - 2010

South Carolina's last regional appearance was at the 2010 East Regional. The Gamecocks finished eighth with a score of 846 (+6), while George Bryan IV (tied for sixth), Wesley Bryan (tied for sixth) and Paul Woodbury (tied for eighth) all finished in the top 10.

Breaking Down the Field

South Carolina will face eight of the nation's top 50 teams according to Golfstat, including top-ranked Texas, No. 12 Georgia Tech, No. 13 Washington, No. 23 Florida State, No. 31 Oklahoma, No. 35 Illinois, No. 36 St. Mary's and No. 48 Middle Tennessee State. San Diego, Arizona, Sacramento State, Indiana/Purdue-Indianapolis and Loyola Chicago round out the field. The Gamecocks have faced five teams from the regional field and have an 0-5-1 head-to-head record against those teams.

Sturgeon Gamers All-SEC Honors

Freshman Caleb Sturgeon was named to the SEC All-Freshman Team after a stellar spring that included a team-high three top-10 finishes. The Laurens, S.C., native was second on the team and 23rd in the SEC with a scoring average of 72.58, which ranks second all-time for a freshman at South Carolina. He was one of the most consistent golfers for the Gamecocks this

season as he played in eight events and finished inside the top-20 on four occasions. He was the top finisher for Carolina in four of the seven events in the spring. His second-round 67 at the Chris Schenkel Invitational tied for the lowest round by a Gamecock this season, while his 54-hole score of 213 at the Palmetto Intercollegiate ranks third on the team.

Young Gamecocks Making Big Impact

South Carolina's freshman trio of Sean Kelly, Will Murphy and Caleb Sturgeon have done big things for the Gamecocks this season, combining for seven top-20 finishes. The freshman class is ranked as the 15th best in the nation according to Golf Stat, with an average score of 73.07.

SEC Championship

South Carolina posted a 293 (+13) in the final round to wrap up play at the 2012 SEC Championship at Sea Island Golf Club. The Gamecocks finished the weekend in 10th place with a three-round total of 871 (+31).

Senior Wesley Bryan carded a 2-over 72 to lead the Gamecocks. The Chapin, S.C., native finished in a tie for 13th with a score of 212 (+2), which is his third career top-20 finish at the SEC Championship.

Freshman Will Murphy turned in the second lowest round for Carolina as he shot a 3-over 73 to finish in a tie for 37th with a score of 218 (+8).

Freshman Caleb Sturgeon and junior Dean Hester each shot a 4-over 74. Sturgeon finished in a tie for 27th with a score of 216 (+6) after tallying two birdies, two bogeys, two double bogeys and 12 pars on Sunday. Hester finished 52nd with a score of 226 (+16). Junior Dykes Harbin shot a 7-over 77 and finished in 53rd with a three-round total of 229 (+19).

River Landing Intercollegiate

South Carolina shot rounds of even-par 288 in the final two rounds of the River Landing Intercollegiate at River Landing Golf Club. The Gamecocks wrapped up the tournament in sixth place with a three-round score of 869 (+5).

Freshman Caleb Sturgeon made a run up the leaderboard to lead Carolina as he fired rounds of 68 (-4) and 71 (-1) to finish in a tie for eighth with a score of 213 (-3). The finish is Sturgeon's third top-10 showing this season, all of which have been in the spring.

Senior Wesley Bryan put together two solid rounds to close out the tournament, carding a 1-under 71 in the second round and a 1-over 73 in the final round. Bryan finished in a tie for 13th with a score of 215 (-1), giving him two straight top-20 finishes and 17 for his career.

Junior Dykes Harbin finished just outside the top 20 in a tie for 25th with a score of 217 (+1). Harbin turned in rounds of 73 (+1) and 71 (-1) on Saturday. Freshman Will Murphy, who battled through day with a back injury, and freshman Sean Kelly each closed out the tournament with rounds of 76 (+4) and 73 (+1). Murphy tied for 48th with a score of 224 (+8),

while Kelly tied for 53rd with a score of 225 (+9).

Augusta State Invitational

Playing in his hometown of Augusta, Ga., junior Dykes Harbin wrapped up one of his best tournaments as a Gamecock with a career-low 4-under 68 in the final round of the Insuperity Augusta State Invitational at Forest Hills Golf Club. Harbin climbed eight spots up the leaderboard to finish in a tie for 12th place with a three-round score of 210 (-6), which is also a career low. As a team, the Gamecocks shot a 1-over 289 to finish in a tie for seventh place with a score of 858 (-6).

The top-20 finish is the fourth of Harbin's career, which have all come this season. Senior Wesley Bryan turned in his third straight round of par or better with an even-par 72 on Sunday, finishing in a tie for 18th with a score of 212 (-4). After recording consecutive rounds of 71 on Saturday, freshman Will Murphy carded a final-round 3-over 75. Murphy closed out the tournament in a tie for 34th with a score of 217 (+1). Freshman Caleb Sturgeon shot a 2-over 74 to finish in a tie for 55th with a score of 220 (+4), while sophomore Blaine Woodruff turned in a 5-over 77 to finish tied for 74th.

Hootie at Bulls Bay

On the most difficult scoring day at the Hootie at Bulls Bay Intercollegiate, South Carolina played its best golf of the tournament, shooting a final-round 296 (+8) at Bulls Bay Golf Club. The Gamecocks climbed three spots to finish in sixth place with a three-round score of 877 (+13). Carolina posted the third lowest round of the day to make the move despite dealing with winds between 20-30 mph for most of the round. Junior Dykes Harbin and freshman Will Murphy each shot a 72 (E), while sophomore Blaine Woodruff and freshman Caleb Sturgeon each recorded a 4-over 76 to lead the way in the windy conditions.

Harbin earned his third top-20 finish of the season by tying for 19th with a three-day total of 219 (+3). Murphy tied for 29th with a score of 223 (+7).

Sturgeon wrapped up the tournament in a tie for 19th with a score of 219 (+3), while Woodruff finished in a tie for 25th with a score of 222 (+6). Senior Wesley Bryan shot an 82 (+10) on the day as he tied for 45th with a score of 227 (+11).

Chris Schenkel Invitational

South Carolina shot a final-round 294 (+6) to finish in eighth place at the Chris Schenkel Invitational. The Gamecocks posted a three-day total of 864 (E) at Forest Heights Country Club, which is their lowest 54-hole score at a par-72 course this season.

Junior Dykes Harbin and senior Wesley Bryan led the way for Carolina with rounds of 71 (-1) and 73 (+1), respectively. Harbin finished the tournament in a tie for 31st with a three-round total of 217 (+1). Bryan produced one birdie, two bogeys and 15 pars to end the tournament in a tie for 21st with a score of 215 (-1).

Freshman Caleb Sturgeon also tied for 21st after posting a 3-over 75. Freshmen Will Murphy and Sean Kelly carded rounds of 78 (+6) and 75 (+3), respectively, to tie for 48th with a score of 221 (+5). Sophomore Blaine Woodruff, who played as an individual, also finished in a tie for 48th after shooting a 2-over 74.

Palmetto Intercollegiate

South Carolina shot a final-round 293 (+13) at the Palmetto Golf Club to wrap up the Palmetto Intercollegiate in third place. The Gamecocks finished the tournament with a three-round score of 863 (+23) to claim their fourth-straight top-five finish and third top-three showing in their last four events. South Carolina accomplished the feat with its youngest lineup of the season, which included three freshmen, one junior and one senior.

One of the young Gamecocks played extremely well for the second-straight week to earn the first top-five finish of his career. Freshman Caleb Sturgeon posted a final-round 72 (+2) to wrap up the event in fourth place with a three-round score of 213 (+3). Senior Wesley Bryan also finished inside the top 10 as he shot a 3-over 73 to tie for seventh with a score of 215 (+5), giving him 11 top-10 showings for his career.

Freshman Will Murphy finished just outside the top 10 as he tied for 11th with a score of 216 (+6) after carding a 2-over 72 on Tuesday. Junior Dykes Harbin and freshman Sean Kelly each shot a 76 (+6) on the day to tie for 35th and 40th, respectively.

Seahawk Invitational

South Carolina senior Wesley Bryan fired a final-round 70 (-2) to claim medalist honors at the Seahawk Invitational at the Country Club of Landfall. As a team, the Gamecocks shot a 4-under 284 to finish in third place with a score of 875 (+11).

Bryan became the first Gamecock to win a regular season tournament since Paul Woodbury captured the Seminole Intercollegiate on March 14, 2010. The win is the second of his career and his fourth career top-five finish.

Freshman Sean Kelly played a key role in moving Carolina up the leaderboard with a career-low 68 (-4). Kelly's three-round total of 219 (+3) was good enough for 12th place. Freshman Caleb Sturgeon, who played the tournament as an individual, posted a 73 (+1) to finished in a tie for seventh with a score of 215 (-1).

Freshman Will Murphy turned in an even-par 72 to wrap up play in a tie for 21st with a three-round score of 223 (+7). Junior Dykes Harbin and sophomore Blaine Woodruff each shot a final-round 74 for the Gamecocks. Harbin finished tied for 24th with a score of 224 (+8), while Woodruff placed 42nd with a score of 231 (+15).

Bridgestone Collegiate

South Carolina posted a final-round 301 (+13) to finish in fifth place at the Bridgestone Golf Collegiate at Forest Oaks Country Club. The Gamecocks, who entered the day on top of the leaderboard, ended the tournament with a two-round score of 592 (+16), which was 10 strokes back of tournament champion Iowa State (582).

Senior Wesley Bryan and junior Dykes Harbin were Carolina's top finishers as they tied for 15th with two-round scores of 147 (+3). Bryan carded a 75 (+3) on Sunday, while Harbin turned in a 4-over 76.

Freshman Sean Kelly posted the lowest round of the day for the Gamecocks with a 1-over 73 and ended the tournament tied for 34th with a score of 150 (+6).

Freshman Will Murphy shot a 79 (+8) on Sunday to tie for 34th with a score of 150 (+6) in his first career appearance, while sophomore Blaine Woodruff carded a 5-over 77 to tie for 72nd with a score of 156 (+12).

Rees Jones Invitational

The South Carolina men's golf team posted a final-round 300 (+12) at the Rees Jones Signature Course at Haig Point Club to finish in second at the Rees Jones Invitational. The Gamecocks wrapped up the event with a three-round score of 898 (+34).

South Carolina came up just short of winning their third title in four years at the event, finishing four strokes behind champion Kennesaw State.

Freshman Sean Kelly produced the best round of the day for the Gamecocks as he fired a final-round 70 (-2) to claim third place with a score of 220 (+4). Junior Dykes Harbin turned in a 77 (+5) to give the Gamecocks a second top-10 finisher as he closed out the event with a three-round score of 222 (+6) to tie for seventh. Sophomore Blaine Woodruff carded a 76 (+4) to tie for 26th with a score of 229 (+13).

After two stellar rounds to open his Gamecock career, freshman Caleb Sturgeon struggled on Tuesday, turning in an 81(+9) to fall back to a tie for 33rd. Junior Dean Hester recorded his lowest round of the tournament with a 77 (+5) to tie for 57th with a 241 (+25). Junior Clint Tolleson, who played the event as an individual, posted a final-round 81 (+9) and finished tied for 53rd with a score of 239 (+23).

Mason Rudolph Championship

South Carolina freshman Sean Kelly posted a 1-under 70 to lead the Gamecocks in the final round of the Mason Rudolph Championship at the Vanderbilt Legends Club South Course. South Carolina shot a final-round 288 (+4) to finish the tournament in 11th place with a three-round score of 877 (+25).

Kelly wrapped up the tournament in a tie for 31st. Sophomores Blaine Woodruff and Caulder Moore also had solid rounds for the Gamecocks with a pair of 1-over 72s. Woodruff finished in a tie for 55th, while Moore tied for 51st.

Junior Dykes Harbin was the second-highest finisher for the Gamecocks, claiming a tie for 34th after a final-round 75 (+4). Senior Wesley Bryan wrapped up the event in a tie for 39th after carding a 74 (+3).

Carpet Capital Collegiate

South Carolina recorded a final-round 300 (+12) and tied for 11th place to wrap up play at the Carpet Capital Collegiate at The Farm Golf Club to open the 2011-12 season. The Gamecocks finished the week with a team total of 890 (+26).

Junior Dykes Harbin proved to be the most consistent Gamecock during the weekend as he posted a final-round 72 (E) to finish the tournament in a tie for 21st with rounds of 73-73-72=218 (+2).

Sophomore Blaine Woodruff improved his score for the third straight day with a 1-over 73 as he finished in a tie for 35th with rounds of 76-74-73=223 (+7).

After posting the Gamecocks' tournament low with a 3-under 69 in the second round, senior Wesley Bryan was unable to carry that momentum into the final round with a 6-over 78 to wrap up the tournament in a tie for 42nd with rounds of 78-69-78=225 (+9).

Sophomore Caulder Moore made the turn at even par but fell back on the back nine with four bogeys and a double bogey as he turned in a 77 (+5) for the round, while sophomore Logan Harrell posted an 82 (+10) for the Gamecocks.

A highly successful collegiate golfer, former tour professional and accomplished instructor, Bill McDonald was named South Carolina head men's golf coach in the summer of 2007 after one season as the Gamecocks' associate head coach. During the 2006-07 season under then-head coach Puggy Blackmon, McDonald helped South Carolina to its

first NCAA Regional title and its best showing in the NCAA Championship since 1998.

"I have wanted to coach college golf for many years, and it is a dream come true to have that opportunity at the University of South Carolina," McDonald said. "I feel so fortunate that I have my long-time mentor and coach, Puggy Blackmon, to call on and continue to learn from. Puggy has taught me to dream big and to always strive for greatness. I truly enjoy the process of working with college golfers and seeing them mature in all areas of their lives gives me a tremendous amount of satisfaction. I feel like my experiences playing the game at a high level and teaching it as well have helped me communicate with our players during my time here."

"Having coached and worked with Bill for over 20 years, I am excited that Bill is heading up our men's program," Blackmon said. "His background as a player and teacher coupled with his enthusiasm, knowledge and competitiveness should make him one of the nation's premier coaches in a short period of time. We share a common vision and commitment to bringing an NCAA Championship to South Carolina."

McDonald opened his first season as a head coach with a bang as the Gamecocks tied for first at the season-opening Carpet Capital Collegiate and took fourth at the Callaway Golf Match Play event to close the Fall 2007 campaign. South Carolina went on to finish in the top four in five of its six spring events, including a second-place showing at the SEC

It was the Gamecocks' first top-five finish at the conference event since 2003 and the highest placing by the program since the 1998 squad also took second place.

His second season at the helm proved to be an even-bigger success. The Gamecocks tied a school record by winning four tournament titles - Mason Rudolph Invitational, Rees Jones Intercollegiate, Schenkel E-Z-Go Invitational, Cavalier Classic - and returned to the NCAA Championship at Inverness Club in Toledo, Ohio. A tie for second at the NCAA Southeast Regional in Sorrento, Fla., propelled the Gamecocks to the national tournament for the third time in four years.

Coming to the University was actually a return to Columbia for McDonald. He began his teaching career as the director of instruction at the University Club (now Cobblestone Park) from 1996 to 1998. McDonald left Columbia to get back to his home state as an instructor at The Atlanta Golf Center in Norcross, Ga. until 2000. During his final year in that position, he helped design and build the City Club Golf Academy, a driving range and golf academy on a land fill near downtown Atlanta, then was the director of instruction at the facility until 2003. McDonald left that venture for another start-up organization as he was a founding partner and instructor at the Atlanta-based company Accelerized Golf. In 2006, he was named director of instruction at Cartersville Country Club, where he remained until joining the Gamecock staff.

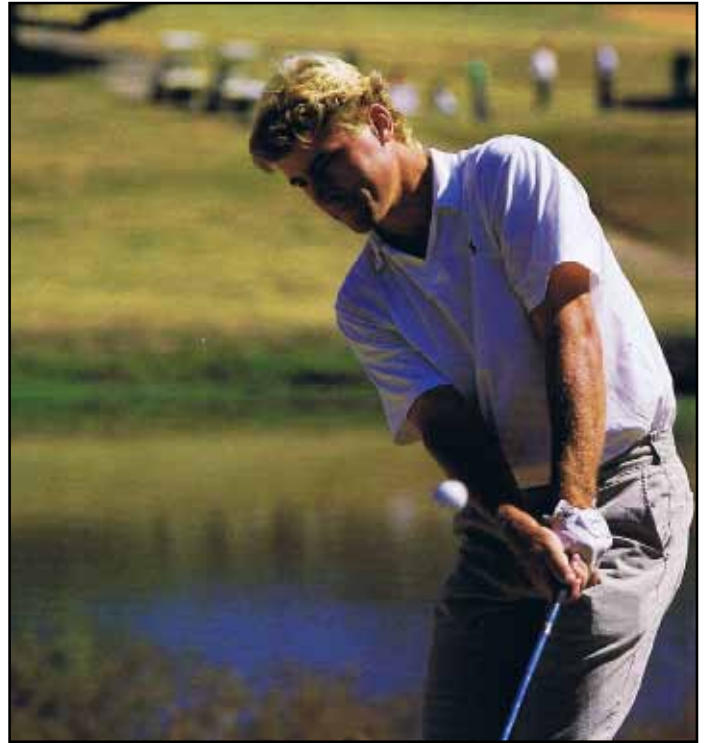
During his 10 years of teaching, McDonald was well-known around the Southeast for his ability to develop junior golfers into college players. He coached more than 50 girls and boys that went on to receive college scholarships. In 2005, McDonald was a featured instructor on The Golf Channel's "Your Game Night."

McDonald got his coaching start as an assistant to Blackmon at Georgia Tech in 1994-95. That season the Yellow Jackets, who finished second in the ACC Tournament, qualified for their seventh-straight NCAA Regional and advanced to the NCAA Championship in Columbus, Ohio. McDonald's focus with the team, which featured winner of the Fred Haskins and Jack Nicklaus Awards Stewart Cink, was on recruiting, physical conditioning and helping to develop the team's depth. McDonald helped recruit and sign Carlton Forrester, who went on to become an All-American.

McDonald played his college golf for Blackmon at Georgia Tech (1985-88) where he was the runner-up at the 1988 NCAA Championship and a two-time All-American (1985, 1988). As a senior in 1988, his second-place finish helped the Yellow Jackets to seventh in the team standings, then the highest finish in school history. McDonald went on to compete professionally from 1989 to 1994, playing in South Africa and Canada and several PGA Tour and Nationwide Tour events.

Still an active player, McDonald has competed in three PGA Professional National Championships (2003, 2004, 2006) and won the Big Oak Putter Classic in 2006. In addition, he has been a top-10 player in the Georgia PGA Section for the last five years.

McDonald, who earned his bachelor of science in industrial management in 1989, was inducted into the Georgia Tech Sports Hall of Fame in 1995. He has been a member of the Professional Golfers' Association of America since 2002. McDonald and his wife, Tanya, are the parents of two boys, Trace (5), and Tyler (3).



During a four-year career that began in 1985, McDonald was a two-time All-American at Georgia Tech and, according to PGA pro Scott Verplank, was the "best ball-striker I've ever seen."
