There are a lot of good things that have come out of this whole thing. For three years, he's (Connolly) been special here. For him to come in here against Clemson, where he had some troubles a year ago, and be able to pitch the way he did today and keep us in the ball game... we're a base hit away a couple times from changing this game. Those guys have great arms. Last 10 or 12 games, we've been averaging 10 or 12 strikeouts a game. We got punched out nine times today. There was a very liberal strike zone out there today, but they striked us out more than we've been doing. A lot of that credit goes to those guys. I thought they pitched very well.

I'm sitting here trying to figure that out. There are moments I think we are close. And there are moments I'm not really sure. It's having all the pieces. Last night, watching the game, they flashed up how many times South Carolina and Clemson have been to Omaha and the two national championships. That's what I'm fighting. We have to make it all work. Two years ago, these kids were a part of that team, and we were so very close. Hopefully we can do that again sometime. Hopefully some of these young kids who are a part of it now, we can build around them and continue to move forward and get back. Every time we come to one of these, it's an opportunity.
