



Mark Berson, the winningest active coach in NCAA Division I, has been at the helm of the South Carolina soccer program since his hiring in 1978 ushered the program to varsity status, a reign that stands at 38 years.

Before coming to Carolina in 1978, Berson went 11-5-0 in one season at The Citadel, putting his overall record entering 2015 at 472-215-68, a .670 winning percentage. In 2006, Berson became the 10th NCAA Division I coach all-time to reach the 400-victory milestone when his Gamecocks defeated UAB, 2-0, in a televised contest at Stone Stadium. Berson entered 2015 with a 461-210-68 record at South Carolina.

In 2015, Berson has received two huge honors. In January, the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) honored him with the Bill Jeffrey Award, given to an individual for outstanding service or achievement in college soocer, at its annual convention. In July, Berson was announced as one of eight selected to join South Carolina Lettermen's Association Hall of Fame, where he joins six of his former players.

Overall, Berson has taken the Gamecocks to 20 NCAA Tournaments, with those teams advancing to at least the second round 11 times. His squads have four quarterfinal and two NCAA College Cup appearances to their credit as well. In 1993, the Gamecocks advanced to the NCAA Championship Game.

Though Carolina has been independent during the majority of the program's tenure, the Gamecocks have captured four conference titles under Berson's leadership. Carolina won the 1993 Metro Conference Championship in one of its two years competing in the conference. The Gamecocks joined Conference USA in 2005 and promptly claimed the league's tournament championship. Carolina also won the C-USA Tournament in 2010 and collected the regular season crown in 2011.

Besides making an impact in collegiate soccer, Berson's presence is also felt in the higher ranks. The Gamecocks are one of only two collegiate programs to have had a player on each of the last four US Men's National World Cup teams. Josh Wolff competed on the US teams in 2002 and 2006 and was also an Olympic team member in 2000. Clint Mathis, a teammate of Wolff during his time at Carolina, also enjoyed a celebrated professional career that spanned 11 seasons in Major League Soccer. Mathis, who retired from professional soccer in 2010, was a member of the 2002 U.S. World Cup squad and helped his MLS team, Real Salt Lake, capture the MLS Cup in 2009. Mathis also graced the cover of Sports Illustrated in May 2002 prior to the World Cup, marking the third Gamecock athlete, in any sport, to be featured on the cover of the prestigious magazine. Former Gamecock goalkeeper Brad Guzan has been on the US roster for the past two FIFA World Cups in 2010 and 2014.

Six times, Berson has been recognized as a coach of the year. Most recently, he was the Conference USA Coach of the Year in 2011 after winning the league's regular-season title. In 1998, Berson earned Independent Coach of the Year honors after leading Carolina to the best record of all Independent schools. Berson has also been honored as the NSCAA South Region Coach of the Year on four occasions (1984, 1985, 1988, 1995).

Berson has been involved in soccer development as a coach, teacher and administrator on many levels. He is a U.S. Soccer National Instructional Staff Coach with an "A" coaching license and has served on the US Soccer National Instructional staff coach since 1989. He has served as State Coach for the South Carolina Youth Soccer Association (SCYSA), working in player development and coaching certification. In 1992, he was inducted into the South Carolina Youth Soccer Association Hall of Fame.

Berson coached the U.S. National U-18 team in the Granatkin/Leningrad Tournament in January 1989. In July 1987, he directed the South team to the gold medal in the U.S. Olympic Festival in Durham, N.C., one year after serving as an assistant coach for the South squad.

A 1971 graduate of Summit (N.J.) High School, Berson attended the University of North Carolina and received

his bachelor of arts degree in journalism in 1975. Berson played on the Tar Heel soccer squad for four years, one as a midfielder and the other three in goal. As a senior, Berson received the UNC Educational Foundation Award and was a member of the Academic ACC Honor Roll. Berson earned his master's of education degree in sport administration from Ohio University in 1977.

Born March 16, 1953, in Hartford, Conn., Berson is married to the former Shauna Hopkins, a South Carolina alum, of Columbia. They have two children, Erin Rhea and Luke William. Erin graduated from South Carolina in 2009, and Luke is currently enrolled at the University of South Carolina in the Moore School of Business.

SOUTH CAROLINA IN ITS 21ST NCAA TOURNAMENT

- This season ranks as the 21st time the Gamecocks made an NCAA Tournament, the most in Conference USA.
- Three other C-USA teams (Charlotte, FIU and Kentucky) also made this year's field.
- Eleven times, the Gamecocks played the NCAA Tournament Round of 16.
- South Carolina is 16-19-2 in the tourney, making two College Cups in 1988 and 1993.
- When playing on the road, the Gamecocks are 4-6.
- This will be the furthest away from home the Gamecocks have played a postseason match. Before this, the 1988 College Cup stood as the longest trip ever, to Bloomington, Ind.
- Seven of the Gamecocks' regular-season opponents made the field. SC went 3-4 in those matches.

GAMECOCKS A LONG WAY FROM HOME THIS WEEKEND

- South Carolina is making the longest trip of any team for a second-round match this year, traveling over 2,500 miles to play at UC Santa Barbara.
- This is the Gamecocks' sixth trip to the West Coast and the first since Sept. 26-28, 2003 when SC played at Washington.
- In the previous five trips, South Carolina is 3-3-4, including a 2-1-3 mark in matchs in California.

SEVEN SOUTH CAROLINA PLAYERS MAKE CONFERENCE USA AWARDS LIST

- Junior Danny Deakin led seven Gamecocks who garnered spots on Conference USA's awards.
- Deakin earned first-team honors after ranking fourth in league matches in goals scored (4).
- On the second team were junior defender Koty Millard and senior forward Kevin Walker.
- Third-team honorees from the Gamecocks were junior defender Ive Burnett and senior forward Jeffrey Torda, and Torda also made the C-USA All-Academic Team.
- Two central defenders Peyton Ericson and Torgeir Nyboe made the C-USA All-Freshman Team.
- The seven honored is the most for a Gamecock squad since eight earned accolades in 2008.

WE SCHEDULE TOP COMPETITION

- According to the NCAA's data on Nov. 9, the Gamecocks have played the toughest non-conference schedule in the country and the sixth-toughest overall.
- South Carolina has faced six RPI top-30 foes, with 11 in the top 50 and 17 in the top 100.
- Of the 17 regular-season matches, 12 came against top-100 RPI teams in the final 2014 report.
- Ten of those ranked in the top 50, five from C-USA (Charlotte, Kentucky, UAB, Old Dominion and New Mexico).
- Four foes made the NSCAA/Continental Tire Preseason Top 25, with five more among those receiving votes.
- Eight of the Gamecocks' opponents made last year's NCAA Tournament.

OFFENSE HIGHLIGHTS FOR THE GAMECOCKS

- Junior Danny Deakin leads South Carolina with 12 goals and has three game-winners.
- Deakin recorded a hat trick and two braces already this season and is the first Gamecock since Sam Arthur in 2008 to tally 10 goals in a season.
- Deakin's three vs. UNC Greensboro on Sept. 8 came almost exactly 14 years after the previous Gamecock hat trick, as Jordan Quinn recorded his on Sept. 9, 2001, against TCU.
- The braces (two-goal matches) came in home wins over No. 8 Elon, scoring both in the second half, and Florida Atlantic, tallying both in the first period.
- Senior Jeffrey Torda has five goals, four of them game-winners, the second getting national recognition.
- His scissor kick goal made the No. 2 spot on ESPN SportsCenter's Top 10 plays for Aug. 31.
- Kevin Walker also has five goals, giving the Gamecocks three 5+ goal scorers for the first time since 2010.
- Junior Koty Millard has a goal and a team-best five assists, tying senior Ryan Arambula in helpers.
- The year 2010 was also the last time the Gamecocks had two players with five assists each.

THE NCAA DIVISION I ACTIVE WINS LEADER: MARK BERSON

- NCAA Division I's active wins leader, Mark Berson is fifth on the Division I wins list and 15th on the all-divisions listing with 483 career victories in 38 years.
- To add to the aforementioned ranking, Berson is tied with Maryland boss Sasho Cirvoski for the most active appearances for a head coach in the NCAA Tournament with 21.
- He has 472 wins at South Carolina as the only head coach in program history, and he had 11 in 1977 at The Citadel.
- He's one of four coaches in NCAA Division I history with 450 wins at one institution.
- Berson coached his 750th collegiate match vs. Kentucky on Oct. 25, 2014, while his 750th South Carolina match came in the 2-1 win over Florida Atlantic on Oct. 9, 2015.
- He's coached 11 players who have captured 13 All-America nods at South Carolina.
- He's also guided at least one player on each of the past four US Men's National Teams in the World Cup (Clint Mathis 2002, Josh Woolf 2002 and 2006, Brad Guzan 2010 and 2014).

GAMECOCKS REPEAT HISTORY WITH UNDEFEATED HOME RECORD

- The Gamecocks posted an undefeated record (8-0-2) at Stone Stadium this season, the second time in program history a team has not lost a home match.
- The previous season that South Carolina went undefeated at home all year was 1993, going 10-0-1.
- That team won the Metro Conference title and played in the NCAA Championship Match.

GAMECOCKS KEEP COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT STREAK ALIVE WITH TWO PICKS

- Senior Jeffrey Torda and junior Ive Burnett gained CoSIDA Academic All-District 4 honors.
- Torda garnered his second selection, while Burnett took home his first.
- The Gamecocks have had at least one honoree in each of the past 10 years and have had multiple students make the list for three consecutive years.
- The two move onto the national ballot. The CoSIDA Academic All-America Teams will be announced on Nov. 24.

GAMECOCKS SERVE COLUMBIA COMMUNITY DURING FLOODS

- Twice in the week after the unprecedented storms caused creeks to swell and lake levees to breach, this Gamecock team stepped out to help.
- On Thurs., Oct. 8 and Sun., Oct. 11, they assisted at centers helping those most affected, spending the first day at Harvest Hope Food Bank and the second at Rosewood Baptist Church.
- Donations were also taken at the Gamecocks' match on Fri., Oct. 9 against Florida Atlantic.
- Relief efforts continue, and the South Carolina athletic department continues to help.
- The University of South Carolina teamed up with local vender School Cuts to sell a T-shirt, with
 proceeds benefiting three non-profits who are assisting with the cleanup.

THREE WEEKS PRODUCE BIG AWARDS FOR GAMECOCKS

- Twice this season, South Carolina has earned three awards in a week for its play.
- After downing No. 8 Elon and No. 7 New Mexico, William Pyle earned C-USA Defensive Player
 of the Week honors and made the Top Drawer Soccer Team of the Week.
- Danny Deakin garnered College Soccer News Team of the Week honors that week as well as on Nov. 2 after his two goals in wins over FIU and No. 13 Old Dominion.
- Deakin claimed C-USA Offensive Player of the Week on Nov. 2 as well, while junior Koty Millard took a spot on the Top Drawer Soccer Team of the Week on Nov. 3.
- Millard claimed the league's Defensive Player of the Week honors on Nov. 9 after helping the Gameccocks shut out No. 11 Coastal Carolina.
- Two Gamecocks made the 2015 Conference USA All-Tournament Team, junior Kurtis Turner and freshman Torgeir Nyboe.

ATTENDANCE OUTSTANDING AT STONE STADIUM

- In the 2015 season opener, 4,325 fans packed the stands for the eighth-largest crowd to watch a men's match in Stone Stadium's history.
- In the Nov. 19 report from the NCAA, South Carolina ranks ninth in average attendance this season, with 2,245 fans counted through 10 home matches.
- Over 1,000 season tickets were sold for Gamecock Soccer in 2015.
- The first two exhibitions of 2015 had over 4,000 students scan in for each, filling the stands.
- The 2014 Gamecocks had the fifth-highest paid attendance average in NCAA Division I at 2,602.
- That 2,602 attendance average is the largest for a season in Stone Stadium history.

- South Carolina brings back 13 letter-winners and 16 members from the squad that made the 2014 Conference USA Tournament Championship Match.
- Ten newcomers join the group: three transfers and seven freshmen.
- The Gamecocks return 47 percent of their goals and 57 percent of their assists from last year.
- Third-team All-Conference USA midfielder Kurtis Turner is the top returning scorer.
- Turner has led the Gamecocks in assists in each of his first two years.
- Junior goalkeeper Marco Velez is also back after playing 87 percent of the minutes in goal and recording three solo shutouts last season.

THE LAST TIME (NCAA 2ND ROUND) - Nov. 21, 2010 DUKE AT SOUTH CAROLINA - STONE STADIUM

Freshman Bradlee Baladez scored with 59 seconds remaining in the first overtime period to give No. 18 South Carolina a 1-0 victory against No. 24 Duke in NCAA Second Round action at Eugene E. Stone III Stadium. With the win, South Carolina (13-6-2) advances to the NCAA Round of 16.

Baladez earned his team-leading fifth game-winning goal at 99:01 with assists by Stephen Morrissey and J.P. Rafferty. Goalkeeper Jimmy Maurer tallied six saves in the match, and Duke's James Belshaw collected four.

The first half of play proved physical, as both teams drew 14 fouls, including two yellow cards each. Maurer made back-to-back point-blank saves 14 minutes into the match on shots by Christopher and Daniel Tweed-Kent.

With 11 minutes remaining, South Carolina was awarded a free kick after a foul by Duke just outside the penalty area. Brettschneider's strike was deflected for a Gamecock corner. Morrissey's corner resulted in a shot by Cates, but the Duke defenders cleared the rebound. Duke nearly scored at the 87-minute mark when Grossman connected on a cross from Christopher Tweed-Kent steps away from the goal, but his attempt missed high.

Duke continued to pressure through the final minutes of regulation, forcing Maurer to make two saves late to send the contest into overtime. Carolina nearly scored at the opening whistle, when Rafferty sent a cross, which deflected off Baladez directly in front of the Duke goal. Maurer collected his sixth save of the match, another excellent

reaction stop with seven minutes left in the first overtime session. Grossman hit a one-time shot towards goal on a pass from Daniel Tweed-Kent, but Maurer made a diving save to his left, which Cates cleared towards midfield.

South Carolina held possession, nearly earning the win on a breakway by Baladez with five minutes remaining in the set. Morrissey split the Blue Devil defense, placing a perfect through ball into the path of Baladez. After out-racing a Blue Devil defender, Baladez sent a bullet towards the far post, but the shot was just wide.

Morrissey and Baladez eventually met up for the game-winning goal. Taking the ball from midfield, Morrissey sent a ball to the wing for Rafferty, and the freshman slotted a perfect ball across the mouth of the goal for Baladez, who one-touched it past Belshaw to send the Stone Stadium crowd into hysterics.

- All four national polls recognized the Gamecocks, with the NSCAA putting the squad 19th in the country on Sept. 29.

- In 2011, the Garnet and Black captured the league's regular-season crown, sharing it with UAB.

- South Carolina's student-athletes have 49 all-league nods, 15 coming on the first team.
- In C-USA outings, South Carolina owns a 44-30-16 (.578) mark.
- On the road, that mark is 21-15-10 (.565). At Stone Stadium, that record is 23-15-6 (.591).
