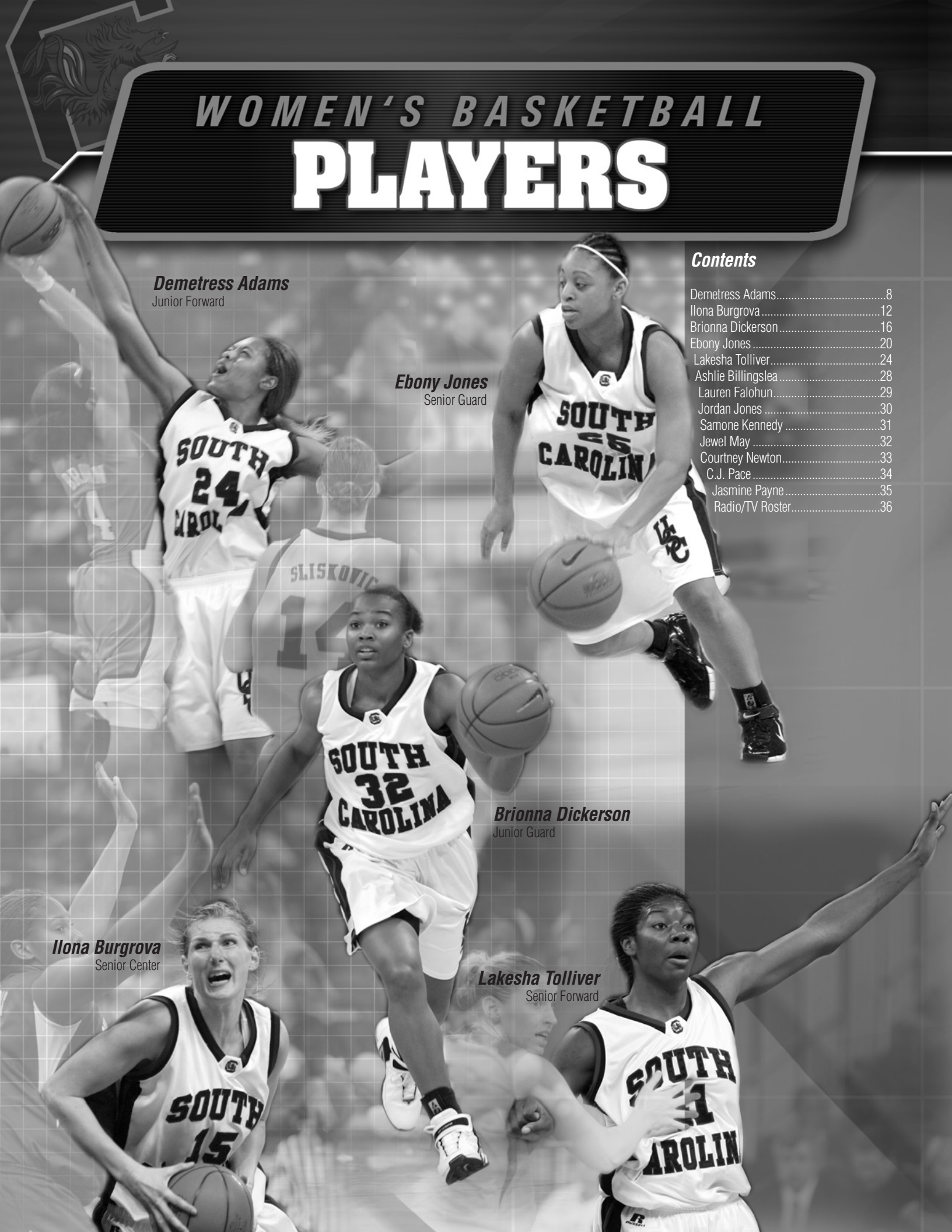

Sophomore Year (2006-07)

Earned a spot on the SEC Winter Sports Academic Honor Roll ... Matched a Colonial Center record with five blocked shots in Carolina's win over Auburn, including a crucial block late in the game that helped seal the victory ... Enjoyed the best game of her career when she scored 17 points, grabbed 11 rebounds, dished out two assists, blocked two shots and recorded two steals in the Gamecocks' 80-48 win over in-state rival Clemson ... Matched a career high with 18 points scored against North Carolina A&T, adding three blocked shots as well ... Set a new career high with five assists in the Gamecocks' season-opening win over East Tennessee State ... Collected nine rebounds and blocked two shots against LSU ... Also scored seven points, grabbed seven rebounds, recorded four steals and blocked a shot in that game ... Blocked three shots against Mercer ... Scored eight points on 4-of-5 shooting and grabbed five rebounds at Ole Miss ... Scored nine points in SEC wins over both Alabama and Kentucky ... Set a season-high with seven offensive rebounds against Hofstra in the third round of the Women's NIT.

Freshman Year (2005-06)

Earned a tryout for the USA U20 National Team during the summer of 2006 ... Freshman All-SEC honoree earned SEC Player of the Week and SEC Freshman of the Week honors after posting consecutive double-doubles against Savannah State and Bethune-Cookman ... In doing so, she became the first Gamecock since Jocelyn Penn in 2003 to be named SEC Player of the Week ... Scored a career-high 18 points and grabbed five rebounds in only

24 minutes of action against Kentucky, then came back to score 18 more points and grab nine rebounds in Carolina's win over Florida in Gainesville ... Notched a double-double in her first collegiate game with 11 points and 12 rebounds against High Point ... Came back to score a game-high 17 points and collect nine rebounds against Winthrop ... Scored 17 points and grabbed 10 rebounds in only 18 minutes of action against Savannah State ... Scored eight points, grabbed nine rebounds, blocked two shots and recorded five steals in 38 minutes played against No. 18 Texas at the Junkanoo Jam ... Scored 11 points in only 21 minutes of action in Carolina's upset win over No. 14 Minnesota ... Scored 11 points and blocked a career-high four shots against Ohio ... Scored 11 points and grabbed nine boards in USC's win at Alabama.

Scored 16 points, grabbed 12 rebounds and blocked eight shots in the title game her senior year ... Averaged 24.2 points, 14.6 rebounds, 7.2 blocked shots and 3.2 steals per game for Lee Central as a junior ... Played varsity basketball since eighth grade ... Earned a spot on the SEC Winter Sports Academic Honor Roll ... Turned in the first double-double performance of her career when she scored 10 points and grabbed 12 rebounds at UNC Wilmington ... Her five blocks in Carolina's win over Florida set a new career high and matched a Colonial Center record ... Established a season high with 11 points against High Point, collecting seven rebounds ... Turned in one of her better performances against LSU, scoring eight points, grabbing five rebounds, dishing out two assists, making two steals and blocking a shot while going toe-to-toe with Tigers star Sylvia Fowles ... Hauled in eight rebounds against South Carolina State ... Grabbed seven boards at Ole Miss ... Set a new career high with four assists against South Carolina State ... Scored seven points, grabbed two rebounds, dished out two assists, made two steals and blocked a shot in only 13 minutes of play against North Carolina A&T ... Set a new career high with three steals against No. 3 Oklahoma, then matched that total with three steals against Winthrop ... Earned her first starting nod of the season against High Point ... Scored eight points and grabbed five rebounds in only 10 minutes against Alabama.

Sophomore Year (2005-06)

Earned a spot on the SEC Winter Sports Academic Honor Roll ... Posted a career day in the Gamecocks' win over Western Carolina, setting or matching career highs with 17 points, nine rebounds and three assists in only 21 minutes of action ... Was a key player in Carolina's win at Mississippi State, scoring 11 points, grabbing nine rebounds, blocking three shots and making several free throws late in the game to seal the win ... Turned in a productive effort against Vanderbilt, scoring 15 points, grabbing six rebounds and blocking two shots against the Commodores ... Scored 13 points and grabbed six rebounds against Bethune-Cookman ... Scored eight points and came up with two steals in the Gamecocks' season-opening win over High Point ...
