2007 REVIEW



2007 SEASON REVIEW AND NOTABLES

- The Gamecocks kicked off the 30th season of South Carolina soccer with a thrilling double-overtime victory against archrival Clemson on Aug. 31. Freshman Blake Brettschneider tallied his first career goal in the 109th minute to propel the Gamecocks to the 1-0 victory. Brettschneider earned the Conference USA Offensive Player of the Week award for the effort.

- Carolina next returned to the friendly confines of Stone Stadium on Sept. 4, defeating Presbyterian College, 4-0, in its home opener. Freshman forward Sam Arthur contributed two goals for the Gamecocks, while sophomores Jeff Scannella and Mark Wiltse each contributed one tally for the home team.

- Riding a 2-0 start and a No. 15 national ranking according to NSCAA, as well as top-25 nods in the SoccerTimes.com and CollegeSoccerNews.com polls, Carolina traveled to perennial powerhouse Connecticut for its annual adidas Classic. The Gamecocks suffered a loss to No. 14 Connecticut and No. 15 South Florida at the event.

- Carolina returned to Stone Stadium on Sept. 11, defeating Wofford in a 2-1 overtime contest. Junior Kevan Hawkins tallied his first career goal, helping the Gamecocks improve their record to 3-2 for the year.

- South Carolina continued its three-game homestand, hosting the adidas Gamecock Classic, Sept. 14-16. After having to cancel its opening tournament competition against Longwood due to torrential rain, Carolina defeated Lipscomb, 2-0, during the final day of competition to claim the tournament title. Carolina's freshman goalkeeper Jimmy Maurer was named the tournament's Defensive MVP, while teammates Blake Brettschneider, Spencer Lewis and Mark Wiltse each earned a spot on the All-Tournament squad.

- The Gamecocks faced a tough test in its next opponent, the ninth-ranked Duke Blue Devils on Sept. 19. Despite a brilliant goal off the foot of Sam Arthur, his team-leading fourth of the young season, Duke was able to defeat the Gamecocks by a 2-1 edge.

- Carolina returned to Columbia to host Alabama A&M in a non-conference battle at Stone Stadium on Sept. 23. South Carolina earned a 2-0 win in the match, marking goalkeeper Jimmy Maurer's third shutout of the season. Spencer Lewis tallied his first goal of the year, while Sam Arthur improved his team-leading total to five goals in just eight collegiate games. Arthur earned the AgSouth Athlete of the Week award for his effort.

- The Conference USA season began with South Carolina traveling to Birmingham, Ala., on Sept. 29 to face the Blazers of UAB. Sophomore midfielder Jeff Scannella scored just two minutes into the match and the defense was able to hold the Blazers scoreless the remaining 88 minutes, as South Carolina kicked off its C-USA season with a 1-0 road victory. Maurer was named C-USA Defensive Player of the Week for his play in net, while Scannella earned a spot on the TopDrawerSoccer.com Team of the Week.

- Reclaiming a spot in the national top-25 polls, Carolina traveled to Davidson College on Oct. 3 for a non-conference match against the Wildcats. Battling back from a one-goal deficit in the second half, the Gamecocks rallied to score two goals in the final 11 minutes of the match to steal a 2-1 win, improving their overall record to 7-3 for the year. Sophomore defender Tyler Ruthven tallied his first goal of the season to tie the match, while Jeff Scannella connected on a pass from Blake Brettschneider to score the game winner in the 85th minute.

- The Gamecocks returned to Conference USA action on Oct. 7, defeating Florida International, 3-1, to improve their league record to 2-0. Jeff Scannella scored in his third-consecutive game, while Blake Brettschneider contributed the game winner and junior Brennan Williams netted his first-career tally. Scannella was named C-USA Offensive Player of the Week, while Sam Arthur and Jimmy Maurer were selected to the CollegeSoccerNews.com "Freshmen Making An Impact List."

- With an 8-3 overall record, including a 2-0 mark in C-USA action, South Carolina prepared to host No. 15 Tulsa in a nationally televised contest on CSTV. The Gamecocks had won five of their last six matches, including road victories at UAB, Davidson and FIU. Despite 11 shots from the Carolina offense, Tulsa was able to score the lone goal of the contest in the 54th minute to defeat the Gamecocks 1-0.

- The Gamecocks hit the road once again, traveling to face No. 25 Memphis on Oct. 20 where the teams battled to a 1-1 tie. Blake Brettschneider scored the lone Carolina goal in the 58th minute, his fourth of the season, on an assist from sophomore Schuyler Reardon. Maurer turned in another solid performance in net, collecting two saves, while holding the Tigers to just one goal in the match.

- South Carolina continued Conference USA play on Oct. 24, hosting second-ranked SMU in a nationally televised contest on Fox Soccer Channel. In rainy and wet conditions at Stone Stadium in Columbia, the Gamecocks and Mustangs battled for 45 minutes to a scoreless tie at the half. The match marked a special celebration for South Carolina head coach Mark Berson, as the Gamecock Athletics Department, men's soccer team and alumni presented Berson with a commemorative jersey, bearing his name and the number 30 for his 30 years at the helm of the Carolina program. The second half proved an offensive battle, as SMU scored in the 47th and 81st minutes to take a 2-0 advantage. Carolina pressed the Mustang 18-yard box, and Jeff Scannella connected on a penalty kick in the 89th minute, however, the Mustangs were able to hold on for the 2-1 victory.

- The Gamecocks rebounded with a 3-1 victory over Marshall on Oct. 27, giving coach Berson his 400th career victory as the head coach at South Carolina. Freshmen Mike Lindsay and Will Traynor each netted their first collegiate goals, while Jeff Scannella improved his team-leading total to six goals for the season.

- With a 9-5-1 overall record, including a 3-2-1 mark in Conference USA action, the Gamecocks traveled to UCF for their final regular season road match. Despite a season-high 32 shots, the Gamecocks were unable to score throughout the double-overtime contest and battled

through 110 minutes for a scoreless tie. Goalkeeper Jimmy Maurer collected four saves in his fifth shutout of the season.

- Carolina returned to Stone Stadium for its final home match of the season against Kentucky on Senior Night for its six seniors. Freshman forward Mike Lindsay enjoyed a breakout performance, netting two goals, including the game-winner in the 95th minute. South Carolina concluded its regular season with a 10-5-2 overall record, including a 4-2-2 mark in Conference USA play.

- The Gamecocks earned the No. 4 seed in the Conference USA Tournament and prepared to face fifth-seeded Memphis. The two teams had battled to a 1-1 tie during the regular season.

- Prior to the opening round of play at the C-USA Tournament, the all-conference awards were announced and five Gamecocks combined for eight all-conference awards. Jimmy Maurer became Carolina's third-consecutive C-USA Freshman of the Year award winner and garnered a spot on the All-Conference USA Second Team, while Tyler Ruthven was named the C-USA Newcomer of the year and also garnered Third-Team honors, Jeff Scannella earned All-C-USA First-Team honors and Mark Wiltse was named to the All-Conference USA Third-Team. Blake Brettschneider and Jimmy Maurer were also selected to the All-Freshman squad.

- The C-USA Tournament, held at UAB, proved to be a cold and blustery four-day event. Behind Mike Lindsay's third-consecutive Gamecock goal and Jeff Scannella's team-leading seventh tally of the season, a PK just one minute into the overtime session, South Carolina advanced to the second round of tournament play with a 2-1 overtime win over Memphis.

- No. 1 seed Tulsa proved too strong for the Gamecocks in the tournament's second round, scoring once in the first half and three times in the second half to end South Carolina's season. Mike Lindsay and Mark Wiltse were both named to the all-tournament team following the conclusion of the event.

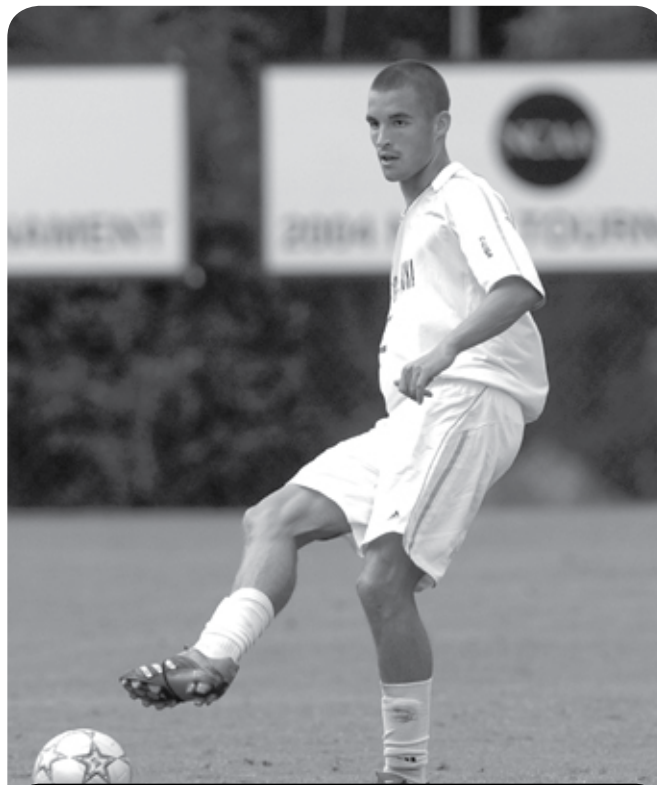
