Season in Review

Highlights Include Guardians Classic Title; NCAA Tournament Appearance

Picked to finish last in the Southeastern Conference, South Carolina had the last laugh last year when the Gamecocks started off the season winning the Guardians Classic and then went on to post a 23-11 record with an SEC Tournament semi-final appearance and an NCAA Tournament berth. The season also featured a four-week stay in the top 25 nationally.

Led by senior captain Mike Boynton, Jr. throughout the year, USC won four straight games to win the Guardians Classic in Kansas City to start the season, including wins over Missouri Valley Tournament runner-up Southwest Missouri State and NCAA Tournament participant Richmond. Tarence Kinsey was named the MVP of both the Columbia Regional and the Championship rounds. In addition, Carlos Powell was named to the All-Tournament team.

USC rolled off eight straight wins to start the season, including a 76-61 whipping of Clemson on the road. With its fourth win in a row over the Tigers, Boynton left USC 4-0 vs. CU – a feat not matched since 1971-72. Dropping a 71-

61 loss at Temple, USC rolled off five more wins, including a crucial 58-55 win over NCAA Tournament team N.C. State.

The Gamecocks began the SEC schedule with a 13-1 record against non-conference competition – their best start since the 1969-70 team started the season 18-1. Its 12 wins prior to January 1st were the most by any Gamecock team ever.

A close loss at home to Florida (65-62) on a last-minute shot led to five straight SEC wins, including critical wins on the road at Georgia and Vanderbilt. USC dropped a 79-68 game at Ole Miss before grabbing a 90-82 overtime win over NCAA Tournament Elite Eight participant Alabama. The two teams combined to score the most points ever in the Colonial Center.

A one point loss at Kentucky, with a last-second look, USC took it to overtime against Mississippi State just a few nights later falling 79-75. But true to the Gamecock way, NCAA Sweet 16 participant Vanderbilt was USC's next victim, an 82-75 win, on Valentine's Day. USC then dropped games at Arkansas and

Florida before sailing home to rough up Georgia for the second time in as many tries – this time 63-47. It was the third series sweep over Georgia since the 'Cocks joined the SEC in 1991. But USC lost forward Rolando Howell for the season with a broken hand in the win over the 'Dawgs.

USC welcomed a school and state record 18,000 for senior night against Kentucky. USC said goodbye to Mike Boynton, Jr., Kerbrell Brown, Sheldon Everett, Ivan Howell, Rolando Howell and manager Hall Beard. But even actress Ashley Judd on the sidelines couldn't help pump up the Gamecocks and its fans as USC fell 85-65.

USC went to the SEC Tournament with its NCAA Tournament hopes on the Gamecocks' minds. USC rattled off wins over Arkansas, 91-81, and then LSU, 85-64, to play Kentucky for the third time in 2004. The third time did not prove to be a charm as USC fell 78-63 to the Wildcats. After his stellar play, which included five three-pointers against Arkansas and six treys against LSU, Boynton was named to the SEC All-Tournament. In addition to his barrage of three-pointers, Boynton was 17-19 from the charity stripe against the Razorbacks.

Brandon Wallace received the perfect gift for his 19th birthday at Coach Odom's house – an NCAA Tournament at-large bid. The Gamecocks played Memphis in Kansas City in a defensive battle, with the Tigers coming out on top 59-43.

Boynton established a new career games played record with 125. Carlos Powell was named to the All-SEC third team, Renaldo Balkman was named to the All-SEC Freshmen team and John Chappell was named an All-District Academic All-American. Boynton, in addition to being named the USC Male Athlete of the Year, was tabbed as the SEC Male Community Service Post-Graduate Scholarship winner. Finally, Odom was named the 2004 SEC Coach of the Year, becoming only the second coach in the history of the SEC and the ACC to be named Coach of the Year in both leagues.

REVIEW

Carlos Powell started off this season just like last season, collecting a double-double (12 points, career-high 16 rebounds) as South Carolina beat Gardner-Webb 83-74 in the first round of the Guardians Classic. It was the first-ever meeting between the two programs.

Down 42-36 at the half, USC came back to win the game against a Gardner Webb team that will be playing Division I for just the second year this season. USC was just 1-13 when trailing at the half last season. Mike Boynton's 3-pointer with 5:33 left in the second half gave South Carolina the lead for good. South Carolina hit 12 of 26 three-pointers, including eight of 15 in the second half. Gardner-Webb was just 4-of-24 from the three point line.

Doing something they never did last year, USC had six in double-figures, including Tarence Kinsey, who had 14 points and nine rebounds. Also scoring in double figures were Tre Kelley (11), Josh Gonner (14), Kerbrell Brown (11), Boynton (11) and Powell (12).

Playing Idaho for just the second time, USC came away with a 76-66 win to advance to the semi-finals of the Guardians Classic in Kansas City, Mo. Sophomore Tarence Kinsey had a career night as he scored a career-high 21 points with seven rebounds. Junior Carlos Powell added 19 points and six rebounds in the game that pushed USC to 2-0.

Forcing a school-record 30 turnovers and tying another school record with 20 steals of its own, USC defeated Navy 73-40 to move to 3-0. It was the two school's second meeting (first: Navy won 43-22 2/14/25).

South Carolina held an opponent to the fewest points since falling to Maryland 31-30 in overtime in 1971. Eight of the 13 Gamecocks who saw playing time had at least one steal.

Senior Mike Boynton led all scorers with 15 points. Sophomore Tarence Kinsey continued his fine play as he had 14 points and five rebounds. Kinsey scored just 43 points all of last season and this season has already scored 49.

The Gamecocks saw three other players score in double figures: Carlos Powell had 11, Josh Gonner had 10 and Renaldo Balkman scored in double figures for the first time in his career with 10.

The Midshipmen were trailing 15-13 with just under 14 minutes to go in the first half when things went south. USC led 36-22 at the half. Navy only scored 18 points in the entire second half. All told, USC scored 40 of its 73 points off turnovers.

Winning its fourth game in a row against Clemson, USC defeated the Tigers 76-61 in Tiger Town behind the sharp-shooting of Carlos Powell, who scored a career-high 23 points.

With the fourth win in a row, Mike Boynton will graduate 4-0 against the Tigers — a feat not matched since 1971-72.

Powell also added a season-high six steals. He has scored in double figures every game this season. Josh Gonner (13), Tarence Kinsey (11) and Kerbrell Brown (10) all finished in double figures, but it was the leadership of Mike Boynton, Jr. that helped the Gamecocks win the game. Boynton scored nine points, playing 38 minutes with flu-like symptoms.

Clemson led early, 9-5 at the 15:44 mark in the first half. The two teams went back and forth in the first half, with Clemson taking a 31-28 lead with 1:08 in the half. USC cut it to one at 40.9 seconds, but the Tigers went to the locker-room with a 33-30 lead.

With the largest crowd of the year on hand, South Carolina fought to the very end, but fell short, dropping a 62-62 contest to No. 14 Florida in the two team's SEC opener.

Josh Gonner scored 18 points and grabbed three boards to lead the Gamecock effort. Carlos Powell, who has scored in double figures every game this campaign, scored 12 points tying a team-high with seven rebounds and a block.

USC had just nine turnovers to Florida's 17, but the Gators shot 42.9% to USC's 38.1%. USC shot only 17.2% from beyond the arc, hitting just five of 29 shots.

It was a battle from the gun, with the two teams knotting it up eight times. USC took a 29-27 lead the lockerroom. At the 4:50 mark David Lee scored to put the Gators ahead for good, 59-57.

Renaldo Balkman's driving layup with 39 seconds left got USC within 63-62. But UF's Anthony Roberson hit two free throws with 18 seconds to go and South Carolina missed two tries at tying the game.

Josh Gonner front-rimmed a fade-away 3-pointer with 8 seconds left and Michael Boynton also missed a 3 and Florida hung on for its fifth straight victory overall and sixth in a row over the Gamecocks.

Posting the largest margin of victory in Athens ever and its largest victory against Georgia since 1962, USC came away from Athens with an 84-63 win over Georgia. It was the largest margin of victory for USC in an SEC game since Carolina defeated Vanderbilt 66-43 on Feb. 16, 2002.

USC had six players in double figures for the second time this season (first was vs. Gardner Webb). Kerbrell Brown led all scorers with 18 points, shooting 7 of 8 from the field, including a perfect 3 of 3 from beyond the three-point line. In double figures as well were: Mike Boynton, Jr. (10), Josh Gonner (13), Rolando Howell (11), Powell (13) and Balkman (12). Powell has scored in double figures every game this season.

Howell, who led all Gamecocks' with six rebounds, made his first start of the season in place of Powell. Powell and Balkman were tardy to the team's pre-game meal earlier in the day and therefore did not play their first normal rotation.

Georgia's lone highlight of the day seemed to be the first play of the game when Chris Daniels had a break-away slam dunk in the first seconds of the game. It was pretty much all USC after that.

The Gamecocks shot a season-high 54.5% with the 'Dawgs shooting just 39.6%. The 'Dawgs kept the game from being a blow-out by shooting 84.6% at the line, hitting 22-26 of their free throws, including Daniels who was 12-13.

USC took a 42-28 lead to the lockerroom. USC played everyone it brought, including Jon Land who had a steal and a rebound at the end of the game. Land was redshirted last year after suffering on-going issues with his knee.

In front of the largest crowd to ever see a basketball game in the state of South Carolina, the Gamecock basketball team defeated Tennessee 85-64 - it's largest margin of victory at home against an SEC team since USC defeated Alabama on Feb. 19, 2000 (also 21 points, 82-61). It is the best start in conference play since the 96-97 team opened 4-0.

It was Coach Odom's 50th win as a Gamecock. He now is 50-33 at Carolina. The only USC coach to reach the 50 win mark faster was Frank Johnson in 1974, needing only 79 games.

Josh Gonner set career highs in points (24, previous 19), field goals made (10, previous 8), and field goal percentage (.769, previous .667). Carlos Powell continued his double figures steak this year, scoring 12 points with a game-high seven rebounds and seven assists (tying his career high). Brandon Wallace continued to impress Gamecock fans with three blocks and Renaldo Balkman had two rim-shaking slam dunks to lead the team with 12 total this season.

USC led from start to finish, with Tennessee only coming as close as nine in the opening minutes. The Gamecocks made 64.7% (11-17) of its 3-point attempts, which is the highest percentage during Odom's tenure at USC. The 63.6% was the best shooting percentage during Odom's tenure as well - with USC hitting 35 of 55 of their field goals.

Carlos Powell hit a key three late to help No. 25 Carolina over LSU 61-55. That one three might have been the most important attempt of the day, but either way - it was the only three of the day for USC (1-23).

The crowd of 17,927 was the largest crowd to ever see a basketball game in the state of South Carolina. The win marks the second best start for USC in SEC play after five games. The best start came in 1996-97 when Carolina went 5-0. That season USC won the SEC title.

Powell scored in double figures for the 20th straight game, scoring 12 points with four rebounds and four steals. Rolando Howell played the most minutes of the year, 27, in probably his best effort of the year. Howell scored 12 points, seven rebounds and collected two assists and a steal. Also scoring in double figures was Josh Gonner (10) and Renaldo Balkman (11).

USC shot just 38.2% due to the fact it shot 4.3% from the three point line. LSU shot 39.1%. LSU turned the ball over 23 times to USC's nine times with USC stealing the ball 14 times.

USC led 29-21 with 2:42 to go in the first half before LSU closed out the first half with a 7-0 run. LSU took a 34-31 lead on a 15-2 run. The score was tied 34 all at 14:08 before LSU took a 41-36 lead at 12:43. Renaldo Balkman hit a jump shot and was fouled, scoring one free throw to make it 43-42 LSU at 9:41 to cap a 6-0 Gamecock run.

USC went up 47-45 with seven minutes to play, with the two teams going back and forth, knotting it up t 50 with two minutes to play. Carlos Powell hit the key three to put USC up 53-52 at 1:33.

With 22 seconds to go, a double technical was called against Mike Boynton, Rolando Howell and another LSU player. USC held on for the win.

South Carolina won its fifth straight SEC game, defeating Vanderbilt on the road 57-55 to hand the 'Dores their first loss of the season at home. The 18-2 start matches USC Head Coach Dave Odom's best start ever as a head coach (1996-97, Wake Forest).

USC shot just 38.2%, but the 'Dores shooting was also dismal as they shot 35.4%, including 23.8% from beyond the arc. USC shot a perfect 11 of 11 from the charity stripe.

USC was led by Josh Gonner, who scored 17 points with three rebounds and five steals. Carlos Powell scored 10 points, keeping his streak of scoring in double figures alive at 21 games (including every game this season). Tre Kelley added a game-high five assists and Rolando Howell was 6-6 from the free throw line, scoring eight points with a team-high eight rebounds.

The game featured four ties and 10 lead changes. South Carolina's largest lead of the game was six at the 11:37 mark in the second half.

USC went to the lockerroom down 32-28, but came of the lockerroom and put together a 14-6 run prior to Vandy going on a 7-0 run of its own.

Josh Gonner stole the ball and made a basket to make it 55-53 USC with less than 30 seconds left. A Vandy dunk by Matt Freije knotted the score at 55-55 with 9.2 seconds left to play.

USC was on fire in the OT period, putting up a 12-0 before the Tide were able to score. USC outscored the Tide 19-11 in the OT period.

No. 25 USC gave up a season-high five dunks to host-Arkansas - dropping an 82-66 game in Fayetteville. It snapped USC's two-game winning streak against the Hogs.

Tre' Kelley led the Gamecocks in scoring for the first time in his career, finishing the game with 18 points. It was also a career high for Kelley. Mike Boynton, Jr. was the only other Gamecock in double figures - tallying 11 points, including three three-pointers. Freshman Renaldo Balkman, coming off the bench, had career highs in assists with four and in steals, also with four. Rolando Howell, who had had two straight double-doubles, scored no points and had only two rebounds in 21 minutes.

Both teams played sloppy in the first half, with USC turning the ball over 10 times to Arkansas' 11. USC shot 34.6% in the first half to Arkansas' 34.5%.

Arkansas shot a season-best 65.4% in the second half (for both a USC opponent and its team). The Hogs had four players in double figures. USC shot 40.4% and were just 11 of 17 from the free throw line (64.7%).

While Arkansas won by 16 points, USC pulled within six at the 1:58 mark on a Carlos Powell jump-shot; and were also within six at 1:18 when Kelley hit one of his three three-pointers on the day.

Tied at 53 with 3:48 to play, USC couldn't hold on, letting Florida close out the game on a 16-5 run, dropping a 69-58 game at Gainesville. With the win, Florida sweeps its third straight series against USC and gave coach Billy Donovan his 200th career win as a head coach.

Rolando Howell picked up his third double-double in four games, collecting 22 points and 10 boards. He was the only Gamecock in double figures and five slam dunks - a season high for any Gamecock in a game the past two years.

USC shot 40.0% to UF's 47.9%. USC was just 9 of 17 from the free throw line (52.9%) while Florida shot 17 of 21 (81.0%).

The two teams went to the lockerroom with Florida holding a one point edge, 29-28. USC had trailed by 10 at one point in the first half (23-13, 8:48), but USC battled back with a 4-0 run and then a 5-2 run.

The two teams battled back and forth in the second half, with the lead changing hands eight times. USC went up 43-38 but then Florida mounted its comeback. Combined with USC's inability to make a basket in more than seven minutes (13:46 - 6:51), Florida went on a 10-0 run to take control of the game.

Tied at 53-all with 3:48 to play, it looked like it would be a fight to the finish. But UF closed out the game with a 16-5 run, including a 14-2 run at one point.

The two teams knotted it up at 38 at the 15:45 mark and that was all she wrote for Georgia. South Carolina went on an 8-0 run to take a 46-39 lead at the 11:08 mark. With USC up 48-44, the Gamecocks went on a 14-0 run as well.

Playing in front of the largest crowd to ever see a basketball game in the state of South Carolina, 18,000 fans jammed into The Colonial Center for the last regular season home game of the year. No. 9 Kentucky handed Carolina its worst loss the season, 84-65. Kentucky led from start to finish, shooting 51.7% to USC's own 36.5%.

USC averaged 17,088 fans over an eight game SEC schedule. All told, 204,760 fans came through the turnstiles in 2003-04.

One bright spot: USC was 12 of 14 from the free throw line with Carlos Powell (2-2), Tre' Kelley (3-3) and Brandon Wallace (2-2) all making all their free throws.

USC said goodbye to six seniors, including manager Hall Beard: Sheldon Everett, Ivan Howell, Kerbrell Brown, Rolando Howell and Mike Boynton, Jr. All four seniors started the game plus Powell, with Ivan Howell and Everett starting their first career game.

USC was led by Carlos Powell, who finished the game in double figures for the first time since Mississippi State (2/11/04), scored a team-high 15 points with nine rebounds. He also made his first three-pointer since the overtime loss to MSU.

Brandon Wallace scored a career-high 13 points, adding four rebounds, three steals and a block. Boynton, Jr. tied his career high with seven rebounds, scoring six points.

UK shot 13 three-pointers to USC's own seven. They also won the battle of the boards with 40 rebounds to USC's 34.

Kentucky went to the lockerroom with a 38-24 lead. At one point in the second half UK went on a 15-0 run and led the Gamecock by 29 points a few times. USC matched that with a 26-10 run but just couldn't seem to get over the hump.

South Carolina stopped its brief losing streak, thanks mostly to Mike Boynton. The lefty guard scored a career-high 32 points - including five 3-pointers - and the Gamecocks may have solidified their postseason plans by beating Arkansas 91-81 in the first round.

Boynton's previous best was 21 earlier in the season against South Carolina State. In this one, he made 17-of-19 free throws, and the Gamecocks were 39-of-50 as a team.

Josh Gonner had 18 points and Tarence Kinsey added 14 and a career-high 11 rebounds for South Carolina (22-9), which lost its final two games of the regular season and four of its last five.

They took the lead for good barely three minutes into the game on a 3 by Gonner and Boynton added two more to start a 17-2 run. The Razorbacks (12-16) never got closer than eight the rest of the way.

A 3-pointer by Arkansas' Jones brought them within 13 with 8:36 left in the game, but Kinsey responded with a three-point play on a putback. The 6-foot-6 guard followed up his 10-point effort in the previous game against Tennessee - his first one in double figures since Jan. 17 - and hit his first 3 in four games to help stop a brief Arkansas rally early in the second half.

The Razorbacks closed to 39-22 with two consecutive baskets after the break, forcing a timeout by South Carolina coach Dave Odom. He drew up a play in the huddle that his team ran perfectly, with Kinsey using a solid screen by Carlos Powell and swishing a jumper from beyond the arc. On the next possession for the Gamecocks, Kinsey twice kept it alive with offensive rebounds.

Later, another 3-pointer by Boynton and a free throw by Kerbell Brown - his only point of the game - pushed the lead to 24, and South Carolina cruised from there. Arkansas didn't help by missing three straight shots and making three turnovers.

Mike Boynton made sure South Carolina kept its NCAA tournament hopes alive. Boynton scored 18 points, hitting all six of his field goals from beyond the 3-point line, to lead the

Gamecocks to an 85-64 win over LSU in the quarterfinal round of the Southeastern Conference Tournament.

Tarence Kinsey, who hit a 5-foot runner and the ensuing free throw for a 72-58 lead with 4:08 remaining, joined Josh Gonner in scoring 14 points for South Carolina, which hit 12-of-21 shots from beyond the 3-point arc.

LSU had a 15-point lead midway through the first half, but the Tigers couldn't contain South Carolina in the paint. The Gamecocks had lost three of four before beating Arkansas 91-81 on Thursday, but Boynton scored all five of his field goals on 3-pointers against the Razorbacks, too.

Carlos Powell led South Carolina with seven rebounds and five assists. Renaldo Balkman had 11 points to lead the Gamecocks in outscoring LSU 24-13 from the bench.

LSU shot just 32 percent (8-of-25) in the second half as Gonner gave South Carolina its first double-digit lead with a 3-pointer from the right side of the key with 8:35 remaining. The Tigers were just 3-of-15 on 3-point attempts in the second half.

The Gamecocks improved to 16-1 when scoring 70 or more points. South Carolina trailed 40-39 at halftime, but the Gamecocks went to 2-13 when trailing at intermission.
