**QUICK HITS****SOUTH CAROLINA HEADS TO COLLEGE WORLD SERIES FOR NINTH TIME IN SCHOOL HISTORY**

The stage is set for the 2010 College World Series in Omaha, Neb. South Carolina will start off the 2010 CWS facing Oklahoma on Sunday, June 20 with first pitch scheduled for 2 p.m. ET from Johnny Rosenblatt Stadium. The game will be televised live on ESPNHD and ESPN3.com and can also be heard on the Gamecock Radio Network. The Gamecocks and Sooners are part of Bracket Two at the CWS along with Arizona State and Clemson. Bracket One features Florida State, TCU, UCLA and Florida.

The first game on Saturday is scheduled to begin at 2 p.m. (ET) and features the only first time participant TCU (51-12) and Florida St. (47-18). Saturday's second game pits No. 6 national seed UCLA (48-14) against No.3 national seed Florida (47-15), and is scheduled to begin at 7 p.m. (ET)

The doubleheader on Sunday features South Carolina (48-15) vs. Oklahoma (49-16) at 2 p.m. (ET), and Clemson (43-23) squaring off against No. 1 national seed Arizona St. (52-8) at 7 p.m. (ET)

The losers of Saturday's two games will play one another at 4:30 p.m. (ET) on Monday, while Saturday's winners face off at 9 p.m. (ET) Monday. The losers of Sunday's games will play each other at 4:30 p.m. (ET) on Tuesday, while Sunday's winners meet Tuesday at 9 p.m. (ET)

The winners of the two brackets will play best-of-three championship finals, with the first game set for 7:30 p.m. (ET) on Monday, June 28. The second game is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. (ET) on Tuesday, June 29, while the third and deciding game (if necessary) is slated for 7:30 p.m. (ET) on Wednesday, June 30. Every Men's College World Series game will be televised live by ESPN or ESPN2, and all are available in high-definition.

## NCAA SUPER REGIONAL RECAP

**Gamecocks Punch Ticket to Omaha with 10-9 Win over Coastal Carolina**

Christian Walker's two-out three-run homer in the bottom of the eighth inning lifted South Carolina to a 10-9 victory over Coastal Carolina sending the Gamecocks to the school's ninth College World Series in Omaha, Neb. The Gamecocks are 48-15 on the year while Coastal ends its season with a 55-10 record. It was a tight Super Regional with both games decided by a run. This was South Carolina's eighth NCAA Super Regional appearance in the last 11 years. The Gamecocks last reached Omaha in 2004.

A back and forth affair took place on Sunday afternoon at BB&T Coastal Field with the result never determined until the end. With the Gamecocks trailing by a pair of runs, South Carolina mounted a two-out rally against Coastal closer Austin Fleet with a walk to Jackie Bradley Jr. and a double by Adrian Morales. That set the stage for Walker, who after taking a pair of strikes and a ball, launched his seventh home run of the season giving the Gamecocks a one-run lead. With Gamecock reliever Matt Price on the mound, Carolina closed game out as Price retired all three batters he faced including a ground out by Rich Witten to end the game and setting off a dog pile on the mound by the Gamecock players.

Ethan Carter earned the win for Carolina after allowing just one run on two hits in 1.1 innings of relief. Price's perfect ninth inning helped him earn his 10th save of the year. Coastal Carolina reliever Austin Fleet suffered the loss and ends his season with a 6-2 record. He allowed three runs on three hits in 2.1 innings of work with three strikeouts and two walks.

It was a hot, warm afternoon at BB&T Coastal Field with both teams creating numerous scoring chances throughout the game. Rico Noel gave Coastal Carolina a 1-0 lead in the top of the first inning with a solo home run off of Dyson. Noel knocked the first pitch he saw from Carolina starter Sam Dyson over the left field wall for his 12th home run of the year. South Carolina answered though in the bottom half and scored twice to take a 2-1 lead. Evan Marzilli led off with a double to left center. Whit Merrifield followed and knocked a slow roller to shortstop Taylor Motter. On the play, Merrifield reached on an infield single but Motter's throw was low and past first baseman Rich Witten allowing Marzilli to score from second base. With Merrifield on second base, the Gamecocks scored their second run as Jackie Bradley Jr. extended his hitting streak to 16 games with a double over left fielder Chance Gilmore.

CCU regained the lead in the top of the second inning batting around to score four runs and take a 5-2 lead. Taylor Motter tied the game as he stroked a one-out solo homer to left field, his 12th home run of the year. After a double by Daniel Bowman, the Chanticleers regained the lead on Rich Witten's RBI single to left field. That ended the game for Dyson, as the Gamecocks went to the bullpen for right-hander Jose Mata. With one out and Witten still on first base, Scott Woodward was hit by a pitch and Noel walked to load the bases. Tommy La Stella then drove a two-run single to the gap in left center giving the Chanticleers a three-run cushion.

South Carolina fought back and tied the game at 5-5 in the bottom of the third with three runs and took advantage of a pair of Chanticleer errors in the process. All the scoring came with two outs as Morales drew a walk and Christian Walker reached base on third baseman Scott Woodward's fielding error. Adam Matthews delivered for the Gamecocks as he roped a RBI double down the left field line that plated home Morales with Walker also scoring as left fielder Chance Gilmore misplayed the double, also allowing Matthews to reach third base on the fielding error. Carolina then tied it on Kyle Enders' RBI single up the middle.

Coastal regained the lead in the top of the fourth with a single run. With two outs and Rich Witten on second base, the Chanticleers caught their own breaks with a hit by pitch to Rico Noel followed by consecutive walks to Tommy La Stella as well as Jose Iglesias that plated home Witten. That lead was extended in the top of the sixth to 7-5 as Adam Rice led off with a single and with two outs scored on Tommy La Stella's RBI single to right field.

South Carolina answered in the bottom half of the sixth to tie the game at 7-7. Bobby Haney drew a leadoff walk and after Scott Wingo's sacrifice bunt would score on pinch hitter Nick Ebert's RBI base hit to right center. With pinch runner Robert Beary on first base, the Gamecocks caught a break against CCU with the fourth error by the Chanticleers as first baseman Rich Witten could not control a pickoff attempt allowing Beary to reach second. With two outs and runners on the corners, Beary scored as a throwing error by third baseman Scott Woodward allowed the Gamecocks to even the game.

CCU struck again in the top of the seventh inning as Bowman launched a two-out solo home run to left field that gave Coastal an 8-7 lead. They would increase the advantage to 9-7 in the top of the eighth as Scott Woodward reached base with one out, stole second base and after a two-out intentional walk to Tommy La Stella, would score on Jose Iglesias' RBI base hit to left field.

South Carolina finished with a 13-11 advantage in hits. Haney had a perfect day at the plate going 3-for-3 with a run scored. Walker was 2-for-5 with two runs and the big three RBI. Adam Matthews also had two hits. Eight of the nine Gamecock starters tallied at least one hit in the game. Coastal was led by two-hit days from La Stella, Bowman and Witten. La Stella drove in three runs, with Iglesias driving in two as well. Bowman and Witten scored two runs apiece also for Coastal.

**Gamecocks Defeat Coastal Carolina 4-3 in Game 1 of Super Regional**

South Carolina jumped out to an early four-run lead and behind a quality start from right-hander Blake Cooper and an impressive relief outing from right-hander Matt Price held on to a 4-3 victory over Coastal Carolina in game one of the NCAA Myrtle Beach Super Regional. Cooper went seven-plus innings and allowed three runs on six hits with five strikeouts and three walks to improve to 12-1 for the season. Price worked two scoreless innings of relief and struck out three batters with just one walk and one hit allowed to pick up his ninth save of the season. Coastal starter Matt Rein lasted only one-plus inning and allowed four runs, two earned, on two hits with two walks. He is now 7-1 on the year.

With South Carolina leading 4-3 heading into the fifth inning, the game became an intense, emotional affair as both teams pitchers battled to keep each other's offense in check. Coastal loaded the bases with one out in the sixth inning only to see Cooper get out of the jam on a double play ball that deflected off his glove and back to second baseman Scott Wingo who tagged the base at second and threw to first just nabbing Daniel Bowman and keeping the Gamecocks ahead by a run. The next moment of truth came in the eighth inning as Coastal had loaded the bases with no outs. Enter, Gamecock closer Matt Price, who battled, as he struck out Chance Gilmore swinging, got Taylor Motter on a called third strike and ended the frame with getting Bowman to ground out back to him to keep the Chanticleers from tying up the game. Carolina came back in the top half of the ninth on a pair of one-out singles by Jackie Bradley Jr. and Christian Walker. CCU's Austin Fleet kept the Gamecocks off the board as he got Christian Walker to pop out and Jeffery Jones to fly out, keeping the Chanticleers within one run. Coastal looked to make a score in the ninth inning off of Price. With one out, Adam Rice worked Price to a full count and drew a walk to give CCU a base runner. With two outs and Rice still on first base, Rico Noel just got a handle of a Price pitch and beat out an infield single that was down the third base line to put a pair of runners on base for Coastal. Price kept battling though and preserved the Gamecock victory as coaxed Tommy La Stella into a fly out to center field giving the Gamecocks a 4-3 victory.

Carolina had nine hits to Coastal's seven on the afternoon. Bradley was 2-for-3 with a run scored and a RBI and extended his hitting streak to 15 games. Walker also drove in two runs and tallied two hits. Noel and Gilmore had two hits apiece to lead Coastal Carolina.

South Carolina jumped on Coastal early with three runs in the top of the first inning. Whit Merrifield reached base with one out on a throwing error by CCU starting pitcher Matt Rein. On Merrifield's bunt, Rein threw low and first baseman Rich Witten was unable to control the throw to give the Gamecocks a base runner. Rein then struggled with control as he walked Jackie Bradley Jr. and hit Adrian Morales to load the bases with one out. Christian Walker delivered for South Carolina as he smacked a two-run single to left field giving the Gamecocks the lead. After a walk to Adam Matthews loaded the bases a second time, Kyle Enders drove in Morales with a RBI sacrifice fly to right field to put South Carolina ahead 3-0. South Carolina extended the lead to 4-0 in the top of the second inning. Bobby Haney doubled, Scott Wingo was hit by a pitch and Evan Marzilli would walk to load the bases. With one out and the bags full, Jackie Bradley Jr. walked to score Haney. Coastal Carolina reliever Josh Conway got out of the jam though as he struck out Adrian Morales and coaxed Christian Walker into a fly out to center field limiting the Gamecocks to just one run in the frame.

Coastal cut that lead in half in the bottom of the second inning on a two-run homer from Daniel Bowman. After a two-out walk issued to Taylor Motter, the Chanticleers brought the score to within 4-2 as Bowman launched his 14th home run of the season just over the wall in left field. The Chanticleers crept to within a run in the bottom of the fourth on the back of three consecutive hits from Tommy LaStella, Jose Iglesias and Chance Gilmore. Gilmore's RBI bloop single to left field would score La Stella. Cooper worked himself out of a jam though as he got the next three outs, helping the Gamecocks maintain a 4-3 lead.

### NCAA REGIONAL ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

Six Gamecocks were named to the All-Tournament Team for the 2010 NCAA Regional - C Kyle Enders, 3B Adrian Morales, OF Jackie Bradley Jr., OF Evan Marzilli, DH Brady Thomas and P Blake Cooper.

Adrian Morales was the NCAA Regional MVP along with earning All-Tournament Team honors. Morales hit a homer in all three games of the Regional and finished the weekend batting .500 (7-for-14) with five runs scored, and seven RBI as well.

Enders hit a two-run homer for the Gamecocks in the 9-4 win over The Citadel and finished the weekend batting .400 (4-for-10) with two runs scored as well. He caught both Saturday and Sunday's victories.

Bradley homered twice in the NCAA Regional with a game-winning two-run shot in the 9-5 win over Bucknell as well as a key three-run homer in the 10-2 victory over Virginia Tech. He had six RBI in the regional as well.

Marzilli was the team's top hitter over the weekend hitting .600 (6-for-10) with four runs scored as well as a homer and five RBI. His two-run homer helped jumpstart a rally in the 9-5 win over Bucknell. He also had a career-high three hits in the 10-2 win over Virginia Tech.

Thomas played in all three games with a pair of starts at DH as well as one game catching. Thomas scored four runs and had three hits over the weekend. Cooper did not allow an earned run and struck out a career-high 12 batters as South Carolina defeated The Citadel 9-4 in the Gamecocks second game of the regional.

### SOUTH CAROLINA 10 - VIRGINIA TECH 2 RECAP

South Carolina scored six runs in the sixth inning and held Virginia Tech scoreless over the final eight frames to earn a 10-2 victory in the championship game of the NCAA Baseball Columbia Regional on Sunday night at Carolina Stadium.

Jose Mata (7-1) pitched 4.1 innings of superb relief, allowing only two hits while striking out a career-high five batters to pick up the win. Jay Brown got the start for South Carolina and gave up two runs on four hits while striking out and walking one apiece. For Virginia Tech, Mathew Price (7-4) was effective through five innings but ran into big trouble in the sixth as he gave up seven runs on 11 hits while striking out three.

As has been their custom during this regional, South Carolina broke it open in the late innings. It was the eighth on Friday night, the seventh on Saturday, and the sixth in Sunday's game. After first baseman Christian Walker and Enders delivered back-to-back singles, a Bobby Haney fly ball advanced Walker to third and brought up second baseman Scott Wingo with two out. The junior delivered his first RBI in a month as he drove a 2-2 pitch into right field, scoring Walker to give the Gamecocks a 3-2 lead. But they were not done. Marzilli ripped his third hit of the night (a career high) to score Enders, and Wingo came across after Whit Merrifield delivered an RBI single of his own to make it 5-2 and end Price's night on the mound.

But a new pitcher for the Hokies would receive a rude welcome from Bradley as he roped the third pitch he saw over the right-field wall to blow the game wide open, scoring Marzilli and Merrifield to make it 8-2 and energize the Carolina Stadium crowd of 6,233.

South Carolina got big nights at the plate from several sources. Marzilli had a career-high three hits in five at-bats, scoring twice and driving in a run. Walker was also 3-for-5 with an RBI. Enders and Merrifield each had two hits with Merrifield scoring twice and Enders once. Bradley drove in four runs, three of which came on a three-run homer in the sixth that extended his hitting streak to 14 games.

After South Carolina went quietly to start the game, Virginia Tech struck first. A walk to Michael Seaborn brought up Steve Domecus, who launched his 13th home run of the season to give the Hokies an early 2-0 lead. The Hokies would threaten again in the second, but Brown would fight his way through it, then work a perfect third inning to keep the Gamecocks within striking distance.

The Gamecocks got on the board in the fourth when Thomas and Walker both laced doubles, with the latter scoring the former to cut the deficit to 2-1. Walker would advance to third but no farther as the inning ended on a groundout and a strikeout. An inning later, the Gamecocks would add another to tie the score. Wingo was hit by a pitch, and Marzilli singled to center to put two on with no outs for Merrifield. The junior right fielder attempted to bunt, but Price cut down the lead runner at third for the first out. Two pitches later, Price threw a pitch in the dirt that got to the backstop, advancing the runners to second and third. Bradley then hit a deep fly to center that allowed Marzilli to score the tying run.

While Mata kept Virginia Tech at bay, the Gamecocks would tack on two more runs in the seventh and eighth innings. Morales would lead off the seventh inning with a solo shot to left - his third of the regional - to make it 9-2. Then, with two on in the eighth, the Gamecocks scored on a wild play when a potential double-play ball to third got the force out at second, but the Virginia Tech shortstop dropped the ball trying to make the throw to first, allowing Merrifield to score from third and make it 10-2. Mata would then work a scoreless eighth, while Michael Roth shut the door with a perfect ninth.

### SOUTH CAROLINA 9 - THE CITADEL 4 RECAP

Blake Cooper struck out a career-high 12 batters, and South Carolina put together a late-inning rally to defeat cross-state rival The Citadel 9-4 in a winner's bracket game of the NCAA Baseball Columbia Regional on Saturday. The Carolina Stadium crowd of 7,418 was treated to a spectacular pitchers' duel through six innings before the Gamecocks exploded for seven runs over their final three at-bats.

Cooper (11-1) stymied the Bulldog hitters through 7.1 innings, hitting double-digits in strikeouts for the second time in his career and holding the Bulldogs to four runs, none of which were earned, on six hits while walking three. Citadel ace righthander Asher Wojciechowski (12-3) was equally impressive until late in the game, striking out 11 Gamecock hitters in 6.2 innings of work before giving up five runs in the seventh inning to be charged with the loss. Matt Price picked up his eighth save, tossing 1.1 innings of shutout ball to preserve the Carolina win.

Fans for both teams expected a pitcher's duel. And both hurlers delivered on that expectation through the first six innings. Cooper had 10 K's through 4 innings en route to his career-high. Wojciechowski, meanwhile, notched the 300th strikeout of his career in the second inning when he retired Gamecock shortstop Bobby Haney. At 155 strikeouts for the season, the Bulldog righthander leads the nation in that category.

However, offense came in bunches for South Carolina in the late innings. The Gamecocks scored five in the seventh and another two in the ninth to overcome a 4-2 deficit and win in come-from-behind fashion for the second-straight night. And no Gamecock has been more productive at the plate in the postseason than Adrian Morales. The junior went 3-for-4 tonight with a home run and three RBI to go along with an almost identical line from Friday night. For the Columbia Regional, Morales is 6-for-9 with two homers and six RBIs. Brady Thomas, Christian Walker and Kyle Enders each had a pair of hits for the Gamecocks, with Enders hitting his second home run of the season.

The Bulldogs held a 4-2 advantage but South Carolina finally got to Wojciechowski in the seventh inning. The 8-9 hitters, Bobby Haney and Scott Wingo, led off the inning with a pair of singles. Whit Merrifield struck out after two failed bunt attempts, and coach Ray Tanner elected to go with left-handed pinch-hitter Evan Marzilli, who had delivered a two-run home run on Friday night against Bucknell. The freshman came through in a big way, lacing a base hit to right field to plate Haney and Wingo, tying the game at 4-4. Then, with two out, Thomas singled up the middle, moving Marzilli to third. Thomas would then try to force a balk by taking off early from first, but Wojciechowski never flinched as the Carolina catcher took second without a throw. Clearly rattled at that point, a subsequent Wojciechowski pitch slipped out of his hand and sailed to the backstop, allowing Marzilli to score from third to give Carolina a 5-4 lead. Morales delivered an RBI double into the right-field corner, scoring Thomas to make it 6-4 Gamecocks and chasing the Citadel ace from the game. Walker then ripped another double into the gap in left center to bring home Morales, making it 7-4 Gamecocks.

### SOUTH CAROLINA 9 - BUCKNELL 5 RECAP

A five-run rally in the eighth inning, propelled by a pair of home runs from Jackie Bradley, Jr. and Adrian Morales, helped South Carolina overcome a four-run deficit and defeat Bucknell 9-5 in Friday's second game of the NCAA Columbia Regional. The Gamecocks scored eight runs in their final three at-bats.

Bucknell (25-34) led 5-1 heading to the bottom of the sixth, and the Gamecocks appeared to be reeling. But slowly, South Carolina (44-15) chipped away at the Bison lead with two runs in the sixth, another in the seventh, and a five-run explosion in the eighth to secure the victory.

Sophomore Michael Roth (1-1) earned his first win of the season, shutting down Bucknell over the final 3.1 innings, allowing just one runner to reach base (who was thrown out advancing to second on an error) and striking out five of the 10 batters he faced. Sam Dyson got the start for South Carolina, going five-plus innings while allowing four runs - three earned - on four hits while walking two and posting seven strikeouts. For Bucknell, Steve Carlin (3-6) was charged with the loss after giving up five earned runs in one inning of relief. Bison starter Dylan Seeley went 5.2 innings, giving up three runs on nine hits while striking out and walking two apiece.

Offensively, it took the Gamecocks a while to get going, but they got big hits from multiple sources. Morales led the way with a 3-for-5 night, including his three-run homer in the eighth to put the game away. His three RBI tied a season- and career-high for the junior. Evan Marzilli, Whit Merrifield and Adam Matthews had two hits apiece, with Marzilli and Bradley each driving in two runs. Bucknell was led by Andrew Brouse with a 2-for-3 effort while scoring a pair of runs, and four other Bison had one hit apiece.

Trailing 5-1, the Gamecocks would cut the Bison lead in half with another two-out rally in the sixth. A one-out double from Morales set the table, and he stole third as Haney struck out for the second out. After watching the first five pitches of the at-bat to work the count full, Marzilli lined Seeley's 95th pitch over the right-field wall to bring in two runs and reduce the deficit to 5-3. It would be the penultimate pitch for Seeley as Merrifield laid down a perfect bunt to reach first on an infield single to chase the Bucknell righthander from the game. The new pitcher, Ryan Ebner, walked Bradley to put a pair of runners on with two out, but Christian Walker flew out to the warning track in right to end the frame. After a 1-2-3 top of the seventh, the Gamecocks kept the momentum going as a pair of infield bunt singles from Matthews and pinch-hitter Scott Wingo sandwiched around a walk to new catcher Kyle Enders loaded the bases with no outs. After Morales struck out, pinch-hitter Robert Beary lifted a deep fly ball to center field, scoring Matthews on the sacrifice fly. But one run would be all South Carolina could manage as another pinch-hitter, Parker Bangs, struck out to end the inning with Bucknell still leading 5-4. The Carolina offense finally exploded in the eighth inning. Bradley put South Carolina on top for the first time all night with one swing of the bat, launching a home run just over the left-field wall to score Merrifield in the bottom of the eighth, giving the Gamecocks a 6-5 lead. A walk to Matthews and a hit batter for Wingo put runners at first and third with two out. Morales - who made up for the third Gamecock error of the game with a sliding grab and throw to second in the top of the inning - blasted a three-run homer to left to give the Gamecocks a 9-5 lead they would not relinquish as Roth would retire the side in order in the ninth.

### SOUTH CAROLINA & THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

This is Carolina's 26th overall appearance in the NCAA Division I Baseball Tournament. South Carolina has reached nine College World Series as well as eight NCAA Super Regionals. The Gamecocks are one of eight teams from the SEC to make the 2010 NCAA Tournament. South Carolina's 11 consecutive trips to the NCAA Baseball Tournament (2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010) is the longest current streak of the 12 SEC schools. Carolina is one of only eight schools in the nation that has reached the NCAA Regional in the last 11 consecutive years.

**COOP**

South Carolina senior right-hander Blake Cooper earned third-team All-America honors from Collegiate Baseball and was named to the Golden Spikes Award Watch List as well.

Cooper won his 12th game of the year at the NCAA Super Regional in the 4-3 victory over Coastal Carolina. He allowed three runs on six hits in seven-plus innings of work. Cooper also was victorious in the NCAA Regional as he did not allow an earned run and struck out a career-high 12 batters as South Carolina defeated The Citadel 9-4 in the Gamecocks second game of the regional. He is 3-0 in his career in the postseason for the Gamecocks.

Cooper leads the Southeastern Conference in victories with an 12-1 record including seven wins in conference play, tying him for the most conference wins as well. Cooper has pitched a SEC high 118.1 innings. He has 105 strikeouts to 35 walks with opponents hitting just .227 against him and an ERA of 2.81. In SEC games, Cooper pitched a SEC-high 71.2 innings, was fifth in opposing batting average (.231), fifth in earned run average (3.01) and sixth in strikeouts (58).

Blake Cooper's 12 wins on the year gives him 33 now for his career at Carolina and puts him at sixth on the South Carolina career victories list.

**PITCHING STAFF**

South Carolina's pitching staff has a tremendous season and it has shown with the Gamecocks ranking among the best in the conference and in the nation. Heading into the College World Series, the Gamecock pitching staff holds an earned run average of 3.61 with opponents batting just .230 on the year. The Gamecocks have 568 strikeouts to 208 walks allowed as well as 269 runs allowed and 482 hits allowed.

South Carolina also led the Southeastern Conference in SEC games in opposing batting average (.243), hits allowed (238) and is second in earned run average (3.82), strikeouts (244) and runs allowed (134).

**THE PRICE IS RIGHT**

Freshman right-hander Matt Price is among the top relievers in the country and recently earned Freshman All-America honors from Collegiate Baseball. Price showcased his skills at the NCAA Super Regional as he earned a pair of saves vs. Coastal Carolina to help the Gamecocks clinch a spot in Omaha at the College World Series. In the first game, Price came in with the bases loaded and no outs with a one-run lead in the bottom of the eighth inning and struck out a pair of Chanticleer batters and induced the third into a ground out to preserve the one-run lead. He worked through the ninth inning as well to pick up the save. In the clincher, Price retired all three batters he faced in the ninth inning.

Price owns a 3-1 record with a 2.54 ERA in 27 appearances and is among SEC leaders with 10 saves. He has hurled 46 innings and has 68 strikeouts to 18 walks. Opponents are batting just .182 against him. Price also picked up a save in the 9-5 win over The Citadel in the NCAA Regional.

**DYSON**

South Carolina junior right-hander Sam Dyson earned SEC Pitcher of the Week honors following his six-hit complete game shutout as the Gamecocks defeated nationally ranked Arkansas 5-0 clinching a three-game SEC baseball series at Baum Stadium. Dyson had a tremendous outing as he limited the Razorbacks, who came in ranked second in the league in hitting and runs scored, to just six hits and walked only two on the afternoon. He struck out eight batters and went to only three three-ball counts in the game. This was the second time this year that Dyson has earned SEC Pitcher of the Week honors. He also earned the award after he hurled a seven-inning complete game shutout in a win at Georgia on April 25. This is the fourth time this year that a Gamecock pitcher has earned SEC Pitcher of the Week honors.

For the season, Dyson is 5-5 with a 4.35 ERA in 89.0 innings pitched. He has 93 strikeouts and opponents are batting just .2590 against him.

**ALL-SEC HONORS**

Senior right-handed pitcher Blake Cooper earned first-team All-SEC honors and sophomore outfielder Jackie Bradley Jr. and freshman reliever Matt Price received second-team All-SEC accolades highlighting the 2010 SEC Awards for the Gamecocks as announced by the conference office on May 25, 2010. Price, Christian Walker and Evan Marzilli were named to the SEC All-Freshman Team with Bradley and infielder Scott Wingo picking up SEC All-Defensive Team honors.

**JUNIOR**

Jackie Bradley Jr. leads the Gamecocks with a .371 batting average (79-for-213) with 51 runs scored, 11 doubles, a triple, 11 HR and 51 RBI. He also has a .477 on-base percentage and .587 slugging percentage. Bradley was named to the NCAA Regional All-Tournament Team after hitting a pair of homers including a two-run game-winner in the 9-5 win over Bucknell.

Bradley was stellar as well at the SEC Tournament batting 5-for-9 in the two games to lead the Gamecocks at the plate. He leads Carolina with 25 multi-hit games and is second on the team with 12 multi-RBI games. Bradley is in the middle of a career-best 16-game hitting streak as well.

Bradley has been invited to the 2010 USA Baseball Collegiate National Team Trials set for July 5-July 11 at the National Training Complex in Cary, N.C. Bradley will be fighting for a spot on the final 22-man roster that will be selected on Sunday, July 11. The team will then tour across the USA with the summer season culminating on July 30- Aug. 7 at the FISU World University Baseball Championships in Tokyo, Japan.

Several former Gamecocks have played on the Collegiate National Team including most recently, Justin Smoak (2007), who made his Major League Baseball debut this past Friday with the Texas Rangers. In addition to playing for Team USA in 2007, Smoak also played on the 2009 USA Baseball World Cup team that won a gold medal last September at the IBAF World Cup. Smoak earned the 2009 Richard W. "Dick" Case Award recognizing him as USA Baseball's Athlete of the Year. Smoak helped lead Team USA to the gold medal at the 2009 IBAF Baseball World Cup in September in Europe. He set a U.S. World Cup record with nine home runs in the event, and he was named to the All-World Cup Team as well as the event's Most Valuable Player. Smoak finished the tournament with a .291 average, and in addition to pacing the team in home runs; he also topped the club with 22 RBIs and 16 runs scored.

Current Major Leaguers and former Gamecocks Landon Powell (2002) and Adam Everett (1997) also represented the Red, White & Blue on the Collegiate National Team. Everett also was on the 2000 U.S. Olympic Team that won a gold medal at the Sydney Olympic Games. South Carolina head coach Ray Tanner also has association with USA Baseball. He has served five stints with the Red, White & Blue including his latest in 2003 as head coach for the USA National Baseball Team. At the helm of some of the top freshmen and sophomores in the country, Tanner's club finished with a 27-2 record, the best record for a U.S. National Team (.931 winning percentage) and won a silver medal at the 2003 Pan American Games. He was named the U.S. National Coach of the Year for his work that season. Prior to his head coaching stint, Tanner served as an auxiliary coach for the 2000 Olympic Team under Tommy Lasorda that won a gold medal at the XXVII Olympiad in Sydney, Australia. He was also an assistant with the 1995-1996 USA teams under former LSU coach Skip Bertman that culminated in a bronze medal win at the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta, Ga. Tanner also served alongside former Mississippi State coach Ron Polk on Bertman's staff. Tanner's first stint with USA Baseball came as an assistant coach to the national team in the summer of 1993.

**WALKER DELIVERS**

Christian Walker lived for the moment in the NCAA Super Regional as he hit a game-winning three-run homer with two outs in the bottom of the eighth inning in the 10-9 victory over Coastal Carolina. Walker also had a two-run single in the 4-3 win in the opener vs. the Chanticleers.

A SEC All-Freshman selection, Walker owns a .315 batting average (62-for-197) with seven HR and 46 RBI as well. He has 12 doubles and a pair of triples also. He hit .346 in SEC games, the best average among Gamecock players in conference play.

**MORALES - A FIT IN THE GAMECOCK LINEUP**

Adrian Morales earned NCAA Regional MVP along with earning All-Tournament Team honors. Morales hit a homer in all three games of the regional and finished the weekend batting .500 (7-for-14) with five runs scored, and seven RBI as well.

Morales leads Carolina in doubles (15), RBI (52) and multi-RBI games (13). He is hitting .282 (61-for-213) for the season and has started at both third base and second base.

**MARZILLI MAKING HIS MARK**

Freshman outfielder Evan Marzilli has found his way on the field in the last couple of weeks including a pair of starts in the NCAA Super Regional and NCAA Regional. Marzilli had a pair of doubles vs. Coastal Carolina and currently owns a seven-game hitting streak. He was named to the All-Tournament Team at the NCAA Regional and was the team's top hitter that weekend hitting .600 (6-for-10) with four runs scored as well as a homer and five RBI. His two-run homer helped jumpstart a rally in the 9-5 win over Bucknell. He also had a career-high three hits in the 10-2 win over Virginia Tech.

Marzilli, a SEC All-Freshman selection, has played in 56 games with 12 starts. He is hitting .391 (25-for-64) for the season, has scored 23 runs and has a .512 on-base percentage. He is also 5-for-5 in stolen bases.

**ROTH - MAKING AN APPEARANCE**

Another key ingredient of the bullpen has been sophomore left-hander Michael Roth, who has been key in a match-up situation. Roth is among SEC leaders with 33 appearances on the year. He owns a 1.50 ERA in 24.0 innings and has struck out 26 batters. Opponents are batting just .214 against him. He also has three saves.

Roth pitched a perfect 3.1 innings and retired all 10 batters he faced to earn his first win of the year in the 9-5 victory over Bucknell in the NCAA Regional. He also closed out the regional with a perfect inning of relief in the 10-2 win over Virginia Tech.

### BRADY BUNCHES THEM TOGETHER

Senior catcher Brady Thomas homered in the 3-1 loss vs. Auburn at the SEC Tournament and had a key two-run homer in the 5-0 win over Arkansas a few weeks ago. He is batting .322 (38-for-118) on the year. 21 of his 38 hits have been extra base hits (12 doubles, one triple, eight homers).

### THE SWEEP

South Carolina's sweep of Arkansas marked the first series victory over the Razorbacks since a series sweep in Columbia in 2001. It was the Gamecocks first series victory in school history at Arkansas.

### SUPERLATIVES

South Carolina is now 39-4 on the year when it out-hits the opponent and 37-8 when hitting at least one home run. The Gamecocks are also 32-6 on the year when scoring first in the game. Carolina holds a 37-1 advantage when owning a lead entering the seventh inning and 7-3 when the game is tied heading into the seventh. South Carolina is 18-11 in games decided by three runs or less.

### CAROLINA STADIUM RECORD SET

South Carolina set a Carolina Stadium record vs. Winthrop with seven home runs in the 14-6 victory. The two teams combined for 31 hits with the Gamecocks tallying 17 and Winthrop finishing with 14 for the evening. The seven home runs also tied for the second highest total of home runs hit in a game by a South Carolina team coached by Ray Tanner.

### IF YOU BUILD IT - THEY WILL COME

The May 21 game between South Carolina and Florida was the first official sellout in school history as 8,242 fans attended the game at Carolina Stadium.

For the Alabama series, the three-game total attendance of 24,204 was the largest for a weekend series at Carolina Stadium in school history. The previous high was 23,220 vs. Georgia from May 14-16, 2009.

### SOUTH CAROLINA AT THE PLATE

South Carolina is hitting .302 (661-for-2187) as a team on the year with the squad's on-base percentage .396 and slugging percentage at .493 for the season. The Gamecocks have scored 464 runs with 124 doubles, 12 triples, and 90 homers.

### THE DEFENSE

**BANGS TIES A SCHOOL RECORD**

Junior Parker Bangs tied a South Carolina single-game record with three doubles in the 6-4 loss vs. Alabama. In a limited role at the plate, Bangs is batting .271 (16-for-59) with three HR and 18 RBI as well as six doubles.

**CAROLINA STADIUM RECORD SET FOR HITS IN A GAME**

South Carolina pounded out a season-high 25 hits setting a Carolina Stadium record for hits in a game with Kyle Enders driving in a career-high five runs on five hits and Brady Thomas batting 3-for-3 with four RBI as well as the Gamecocks defeated Alabama 20-15 on Sunday afternoon at Carolina Stadium.

The 25 hits were the most in the game by the Gamecocks this year. Eight Gamecock players tallied multi-hit games on Sunday. Enders is the first Gamecock player this year to tally five hits in a game, a career-high for the senior catcher. He also hit his first home run of the season. Thomas' 3-for-3 day at the plate saw him tally his sixth home run of the year and second of the series. He also scored four runs on the afternoon. Whit Merrifield finished 3-for-4 with two runs scored and a RBI. Adam Matthews was 2-for-3 with two RBI with Evan Marzilli also tallying two RBI with his first career home run. Jackie Bradley Jr. was 2-for-3 with a homer, three RBI and three runs scored. Scott Wingo also had two hits as did Christian Walker, who scored three runs. The 25 hits ties for the fifth highest mark in a game by a Gamecock team coached by Ray Tanner.

**SHUT THEM OUT**

The South Carolina pitching staff now has eight shutouts on the year including six in SEC play (4-0 vs. Tennessee, 2-0 at Auburn, 2-0 at Vanderbilt, 5-0 vs. Ole Miss, 5-0 at Georgia, 5-0 at Arkansas).

**WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?**

South Carolina senior right-hander Jay Brown was stellar in the 11-6 win over Florida to earn a win. He allowed just two runs in 6.1 innings of work. Brown also was stellar on the mound and earned SEC Pitcher of the Week after a 2-0 win at Vanderbilt. In his second career SEC start, Brown pitched a season-high 6.1 innings and combined with relievers Michael Roth and Matt Price to face the minimum in the win over nationally ranked Vanderbilt to help the Gamecocks clinch the rubber game of a three-game SEC series.

Brown did not walk a batter and allowed just two singles. He also did not allow a batter to get past second base in the entire outing. It was the third longest outing in Brown's career at Carolina. Brown, Roth and Price finished with a two-hit shutout, the first time since 2005 that Vanderbilt had been shutout at home in an SEC game. The loss was only Vanderbilt's third of the season at home.

Brown is 3-0 on the year and owns a 4.44 ERA in 50.2 innings pitched.

**VERSATILE LINEUP**

Depth has been a key ingredient for the Gamecocks this year. For the season, South Carolina has used 49 different starting lineups in 63 games. In addition, 14 different pitchers have accounted for the 46 victories on the year. Also, 16 position players have been in the starting lineup at least once this season.

**TANNER WINS 1,000TH CAREER GAME**

With the 2-0 win at Vanderbilt, head coach Ray Tanner tallied his 1000th career victory. He is the fourth fastest active coach to tally 1,000 Division I victories in games played (Tanner is 1,023-454-3 in Division I, .692 winning percentage). He is 628-281 in 14 years at South Carolina (.691), currently second highest winning percentage in Southeastern Conference history behind Skip Bertman of LSU.

**TIDBIT FROM VANDERBILT SERIES**

Carolina's pitchers faced a Vanderbilt team that came into the weekend series batting .340 for the season and the Gamecock staff limited the Commodores to 19 hits in three games.

**TAYLOR CLOSES IT DOWN**

Junior right-hander John Taylor has been key out of the bullpen in recent outings. Taylor had six consecutive scoreless outings for the Gamecocks before allowing a run vs. College of Charleston. Taylor earned his second win of the year and did not allow an earned run in 2.1 innings with three strikeouts in the 10-4 win at The Citadel. He has a 3.81 ERA in 26.0 innings pitched and 24 appearances.



### THE AUBURN SHUTOUT

Dyson and relievers Michael Roth and Matt Price combined for the 2-0 shutout vs. Auburn. South Carolina's shutout of Auburn was the first time that Auburn has not scored at home in a game since a loss to South Alabama on March 1, 2005 (a span of 166 games).

### THE ONE-HITTER

The 4-0 victory over Tennessee saw four Gamecock pitchers limit the Volunteers to one bunt hit in the win. The one-hitter was the first by the Gamecocks since Feb. 21, 2009 when Carolina one-hit Duquesne in a 13-0 victory at Carolina Stadium.

### TYLER WEBB EARNS SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK HONORS

South Carolina freshman left-handed pitcher Tyler Webb earned SEC Freshman of the Week after his first SEC start when he earned his first career win in the 4-0 victory over Tennessee. He combined with three Gamecock relievers to limit the Volunteers to one hit on the afternoon and he struck out six batters and tied his season-high with 5.2 innings pitched. He also did not allow a base runner past second base.

Webb is 2-2 for the season with a 4.19 ERA and has 34 strikeouts to 13 walks in 34.1 innings pitched. Opposing hitters are hitting just .228 against him.

### FLUOR FIELD REWIND

In the 15-0 win vs. Furman at Fluor Field, sophomore left-hander Nolan Belcher hurled six scoreless innings to pick up his second win of the season. Belcher allowed just four hits in six innings of work and tallied six strikeouts with just one walk allowed. He combined with Patrick Sullivan, John Taylor and Jordan Propst for the shutout victory. South Carolina is now 5-0 in all-time games played at Fluor Field with four victories vs. Furman (2006, 2008, 2009, 2010) and one win over Clemson (2010).

### STRIKE THEM OUT - CAROLINA TIES SINGLE GAME RECORD

South Carolina pitchers Jimmy Revan, Matt Price and Parker Bangs combined to strike out 18 batters to tie a school single-game record in the 7-3 win over Valparaiso. The Carolina pitching staff was in command for most the afternoon on its way to the victory over the Crusaders. Price earned the win in relief of Revan with four scoreless innings and just one hit allowed while striking out eight and walking one. Bangs closed the game out striking out the side to preserve the win in his one inning of relief. Revan had seven strikeouts to two walks in four innings as the starter. The strikeout total of 18 is the seventh time in school history that the Gamecocks have reached the mark. The last time was on March 18, 2006 when six Gamecock pitchers totaled 18 in a win at Auburn.

### DOUBLE TROUBLE

Carolina had 18 hits in the win vs. Presbyterian. The 18 hits included eight doubles and a pair of homers. The eight doubles tied for the fourth highest mark by a team coached by Ray Tanner in South Carolina history.

### LONDON POWELL NAMED TO COLLEGE WORLD SERIES LEGENDS TEAM

Former Gamecock catcher Landon Powell earned one of 28 spots on the College World Series Legends team, the NCAA announced on Thursday. A three-time participant in the CWS, Powell twice was named to the CWS All-Tournament Team, in 2002 and 2004. He had nine hits, six RBI and a home run as the Gamecocks played in the 2002 CWS Championship Game. A 2004 All-American and two-time All-SEC catcher, Powell plays for the Oakland A's currently.

The NCAA and College World Series, Inc., put together this team as part of the commemoration of the final Series in Omaha's Johnny Rosenblatt Stadium.

The 28 members of the Legends Team, pared down from an original list of 95 nominees, were selected after more than 100,000 votes were cast by college baseball fans, college baseball writers and Division I head baseball coaches. The members of the Legends Team are former student-athletes and coaches who had the best CWS performances throughout the 60 years the event has been played at Rosenblatt Stadium.

Voting for the team was based solely on the former student-athletes' performance when they were competing in the NCAA College World Series, and not for any regular season or post-collegiate performances.

Mississippi State's Will Clark was the leading vote getter with more than 3,000 votes. Dave Winfield of Minnesota was the second leading vote getter with just under 3,000 votes.

The 28 CWS Legends Team members will be invited to attend the final College World Series at Rosenblatt Stadium as guests of the NCAA. The members will be formally honored on-field during the CWS Opening Ceremonies on June 18, and invited to attend the first day of CWS competition on June 19. Mock baseball cards of each member featuring their collegiate photos will be posted on [NCAA.com/cws](http://NCAA.com/cws).

A committee of select individuals from the National Baseball Writers Association, the Omaha World-Herald and NCAA staff was created to compose the original list of 95 nominees. This list included every former student-athlete who was voted onto a previous CWS anniversary team (25th, 50th and all-decade teams), as well as individuals who played in CWS in the last 14 years.

The utility players were determined by the oversight committee after the fan voting was completed. They represent those student-athletes who deserved recognition but did not garner enough votes at a particular position.

Now entering his 14th year as head coach at the University of South Carolina, Ray Tanner continues to lead the Gamecock baseball program to unprecedented heights with his commitment to excellence. The dean of the SEC coaches, over the last decade Tanner has established one of the premier programs in all of college baseball with milestones and accomplishments piling up each season.

Atop the list are three consecutive trips to the College World Series from 2002-2004. Included in those journeys to Omaha were a national runner-up finish in 2002, a victory over SEC champion LSU in 2003 and three straight wins over perennial powers LSU, Miami (Fla.) and Cal State Fullerton in 2004.

Under Tanner's leadership, South Carolina owns the longest current streak of NCAA Regional appearances among the 12 SEC schools with 10 straight trips to the tournament dating back to the 2000 season. In that span, Carolina has seven NCAA Super Regional appearances (2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2006, 2007). South Carolina is one of only seven schools in the nation to make at least seven NCAA Super Regionals in the last 10 years and one of only eight schools in the country to have reached the NCAA Regionals every season in this decade. The program's 10-year total record of 468-201 is the fourth highest win total among NCAA Division I schools. South Carolina has 10 consecutive seasons of 40 or more wins.

The Gamecocks have also collected championships in the Southeastern Conference with regular season titles in 2000 and 2002 along with a SEC Tournament crown in 2004. Tanner's last 10 teams have featured 19 All-America performers including 2008 consensus first-team All-America first baseman Justin Smoak and shortstop Reese Havens.

Tanner and South Carolina returned to the Top 25 in 2009 with a squad that finished the year 40-23 with a 17-13 mark in the SEC for second place in the Eastern Division. The Gamecocks finished in second place in the NCAA Greenville (N.C.) Regional. Having to replace several top players from the year before, the Gamecocks showcased new talent that included Jackie Bradley Jr., a consensus Freshman All-America selection, as well as second-team All-SEC first baseman Nick Ebert, who was among the nation's leaders in home runs with 23. Carolina also had several players drafted including sixth round selection Justin Dalles to the Baltimore Orioles and 13th round pick DeAngelo Mack to the New York Yankees. Left-handed pitcher Alex Farotto also was drafted by the Chicago White Sox and signed a professional contract. Mack, Dalles, Ebert and junior shortstop Bobby Haney earned All-SEC accolades with Bradley and left-handed pitcher Nolan Belcher named to the SEC All-Freshman team.

Tanner will be in his 23rd year as a collegiate head coach. Tanner's career record is 975-439-3 (.689) with a 580-266 (.686) mark at South Carolina. The .686 winning percentage is third highest in SEC history. He became the fourth fastest active coach to reach the 800-win plateau in the 2005 season. He has averaged over 44 wins a season and is currently the eighth winningest active coach in Division I college baseball by winning percentage.

Tanner has also gained valuable experience at an international level in his association with USA Baseball. He has served five stints with Red, White & Blue including his latest in 2003 as head coach for the USA National Baseball Team. At the helm of some of the top freshmen and sophomores in the country, Tanner's club finished with a 27-2 record, the best record for a U.S. National Team (.931 winning percentage) and won a silver medal at the 2003 Pan American Games. He was named the U.S. National Coach of the Year for his work that season. Prior to his head coaching stint, Tanner served as an auxiliary coach for the 2000 Olympic Team under Tommy Lasorda that won a gold medal at the XXVII Olympiad in Sydney, Australia. He was also an as-

sistant with the 1995-1996 USA teams under former LSU coach Skip Bertman that culminated in a bronze medal win at the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta, Ga. Tanner also served alongside former Mississippi State coach Ron Polk on Bertman's staff. Tanner's first stint with USA Baseball came as an assistant coach to the national team in the summer of 1993.

Tanner was named the South Carolina head coach June 14, 1996 after nine successful seasons at North Carolina State.

The 1997 Gamecocks compiled a 33-24 record in Tanner's initial season and qualified for the Southeastern Conference post-season tournament. The 1997 team produced a first-team All-America player in designated hitter Ryan Bordenick. Bordenick and pitcher Brett Jodie were named to the All-SEC team and shortstop Adam Everett was chosen to play with the USA National Team. Bordenick and catcher Rob Streicher were named All-South.

The 1998 team was ranked among the top 20 in the nation, compiled a 44-18 record and earned a bid to the NCAA playoffs with Tanner earning SEC Coach of the Year. Pitcher Kip Bouknight, outfielder Mike Curry and shortstop Adam Everett were named first-team All-SEC. Bouknight, Everett, Curry and Bordenick picked up All-America recognition and pitcher Peter Bauer was named Freshman All-America.

The 1999 team won South Carolina's first Southeastern Conference Eastern Division championship and finished with a 35-23 record. It produced a first-team All-SEC designated hitter Tim Angiolini with shortstop Brian Roberts making the second-team. Roberts led the NCAA in stolen bases with a school record 67 and also earned All-America recognition. Four players from the 1999 squad signed professional contracts.

Tanner's 2000 South Carolina team won the Southeastern Conference championship, a regional championship, advanced to a super regional and finished with a 56-10 record. The 2000 team was ranked first in the final Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) compiled by the NCAA and among the top ten in the three national final polls. *Baseball America* ranked the Gamecocks fourth, *Baseball Weekly* eighth and *Collegiate Baseball* ninth. In addition, Tanner was named National Coach of the Year as well as SEC Coach of the Year for a second time. Pitcher Kip Bouknight, 2000



consensus All-America, won the Golden Spikes Award for the nation's top amateur baseball player and finished the year with a 17-1 record. Bouknight and pitcher Scott Barber were first-team selections on the 2000 All-SEC squad and pitcher Peter Bauer, outfielder Nate Janowicz and shortstop Drew Meyer were on the All-SEC second-team.

His 2001 Gamecocks finished with a 49-20 record, won a regional and advanced to a super regional finishing in the top 15 in the national final polls. Carolina was 12th in the *Baseball America* poll, 13th in *Baseball Weekly* and 15th by *Collegiate Baseball*. The 2001 Gamecocks battled through the loser's bracket to win a second straight regional championship but lost a 3-2 heartbreaker to Stanford in the third and deciding super regional game at Palo Alto, Calif. Tanner's 2001 squad produced two All-America players in pitcher Lee Gronkiewicz, the nation's leader in saves, and catcher Tim Whittaker, who was also a semi-finalist for the Johnny Bench Award. Outfielder Garris Gonce, Gronkiewicz and outfielder Marcus McBeth were All-SEC.

In 2002, Tanner and his Gamecocks made it to Omaha and stayed 12 days to finish as National Runner-up. It was the first trip for Tanner and culminated in a national championship showdown between South Carolina and Texas. The Gamecocks won their second SEC championship in three years, Tanner was named 2002 American Baseball Coaches Association South Region Coach of the Year and South Carolina was ranked as the number two team in the nation in all of the final polls. The final 2002 record was 57-18, topping the school record of 56 wins set two years earlier. The 2002 team won four games in the SEC Tournament after winning the official conference title with a 21-8 record in conference games. The Gamecocks then defeated Virginia Commonwealth and North Carolina twice to advance to the super regional for the third year in a row. The Gamecocks won two of three from defending national champion Miami (Fla.) to advance to the College World Series in Omaha. It took a five run ninth inning rally to defeat the Hurricanes in the deciding game. After being shut out 11-0 by Georgia Tech to open the 2002 World Series, Tanner's team fought back. Carolina defeated home state favorite Nebraska 10-8, Georgia Tech, 9-5, and Palmetto State archrival Clemson twice, 12-5 and 10-2, before losing the title game to Texas 12-6. It was South Carolina's third second place finish in Omaha. The Gamecocks

were also runners-up in 1975 under coach Bobby Richardson and in 1977 under coach June Raines.

Three of Tanner's players, first baseman Yaron Peters, pitcher Blake Taylor and shortstop Drew Meyer earned All-American honors. Peters was the SEC Player of the Year, and Taylor led the nation in saves with 21. Meyer was a first round pick, the 10th overall choice in 2002 and the third consecutive Gamecock shortstop to be drafted in the first round.

South Carolina returned to the College World Series in 2003 and notched one win, an 11-10 slugfest over fellow SEC member LSU wrapped around a pair of losses to CWS runner-up Stanford. The final record in 2003 was 45-22 and in the final national polls the Gamecocks were ranked sixth by *Collegiate Baseball*, seventh by *Baseball Weekly* and 10th by *Baseball America*.

To get to Omaha a second straight time South Carolina won its fourth SEC Eastern Division championship, a fourth consecutive NCAA regional championship and a second consecutive super regional.

The 2003 Gamecocks swept the Atlanta regional tournament hosted by Georgia Tech with a win over East Carolina and two over Stetson and then swept two super regional games against North Carolina at Sarge Frye Field. Two of Tanner's 2003 players, pitcher David Marchbanks and third baseman Brian Buscher, earned All-America recognition. Marchbanks was also SEC Pitcher of the Year and he, Buscher and Landon Powell were named All-SEC. Seven 2003 Gamecocks were drafted and three others signed as free agents.

South Carolina made its third straight trip to Omaha in 2004 when the Gamecocks finished with a 53-17 record and in the process set or tied 20 school records. Four of Tanner's players earned All-America honors in 2004, catcher Landon Powell and pitchers Chad Blackwell, Matt Campbell and Aaron Rawl. Powell and Blackwell also earned All-SEC honors along with Brendan Winn. Six Gamecocks were drafted and signed professional baseball contracts in the 2004 season including Powell and Campbell, who were selected in the first round of the MLB draft, the first time in history that two Carolina players were taken in the first round. Carolina finished the year ranked third in the country in all three national polls.

South Carolina had another successful season in 2005 that saw the Gamecocks earn a spot in the NCAA Atlanta Regional. Carolina finished 41-23 and reached the final game of the NCAA Regional. Senior first baseman Steve Pearce earned All-American honors and was named NCBWA District IV Player of the Year. Junior shortstop Steven Tolleson joined Pearce on the All-SEC team. Pearce, Davy Gregg, Aaron Rawl and Zac McCamie all signed professional baseball contracts at the end of the season. The Gamecocks finished the season ranked 21st by Sports Weekly and 25th by Baseball America.

Carolina earned another trip to the postseason in 2006 and won the NCAA Charlottesville Regional before falling one win shy of a trip to Omaha and the College World Series by winning the first game of the NCAA Super Regional in Athens. Despite a young team, Tanner molded together a group that saw four players earn All-SEC honors including first-team outfielder Michael Campbell and second-team honorees Robbie Grinestaff (designated hitter), Reese Havens (shortstop) and Wynn Pelzer (relief pitcher). In addition to freshman Reese Havens earning All-SEC accolades, first baseman Justin Smoak, outfielder Andrew Crisp and starting pitcher Mike Cisco were named to the SEC All-Freshman team. The seven Gamecocks honored were the most players from an individual school to be recognized by the conference coaches in 2006. Smoak and Crisp also received national recognition with Freshman All-America honors. Carolina finished 2006 ranked 12th by *Collegiate Baseball* as well as 13th by *Baseball America* and 15th in the *Sports Weekly/ABCA* coaches' poll.

South Carolina recorded its eighth consecutive 40-plus win season in 2007 and achieved a ranking as high as No. 1 in the nation during the year. Carolina earned a trip to the postseason and won the NCAA Columbia (S.C.) Regional before falling one win shy of a trip to Omaha and the College World Series by winning one game in the NCAA Super Regional in Chapel Hill.

The 2007 team featured two All-America players in first baseman Justin Smoak and designated hitter Phil Disher. Disher would also earn first-team All-SEC honors along with second baseman Travis Jones. Smoak picked up a second-team All-SEC selection along with third baseman James Darnell. *Baseball America* and the *USA Today/ESPN coaches'* poll ranked South Carolina at No. 10 at the end of the season with the Gamecocks also coming in at No. 11 in *Collegiate Baseball's* final rankings.

South Carolina recorded its ninth consecutive 40-plus win season in 2008 and earned a trip to the postseason and the NCAA Raleigh Regional, where the Gamecocks finished in second place. The 2008 squad featured Smoak and Havens, who along with All-America honors, were selected in the first round of the MLB Draft. Smoak was the 11th overall pick to the Texas Rangers with Havens drafted 22nd overall to the New York Mets. The Gamecocks finished with seven players drafted. Smoak and

Havens also earned All-SEC accolades along with third baseman James Darnell and designated hitter Phil Disher. Smoak was a first-team choice with Darnell, Disher and Havens named to the second-team.

Before arriving to Columbia as head coach of the Gamecocks, Tanner led his alma mater NC State to seven appearances in the NCAA postseason tournament and ranked second for most wins in school history. He was the 1990 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year and in 1993 was named Atlantic Region Coach of the Year when his team won 49 games.

While he was head coach a NC State for nine seasons, Tanner was affiliated with the Wolfpack baseball program for more than 20 years. He came to the Raleigh campus in the fall of 1976 as a player following an outstanding career at South Johnston High School in Four Oaks, N.C. A four-year starter at shortstop and third base, he earned All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors his senior season and still ranks among the Wolfpack's all-time leaders in several categories.

Following his playing career, Tanner served as an assistant for NC State coach Sam Esposito, overseeing recruiting efforts and coaching third base.

When Esposito retired, Tanner moved up at the age of 28, becoming one of the youngest head baseball coaches in the nation. During his tenure as an assistant, the Wolfpack reached the NCAA Tournament twice. He had additional duties as assistant to the athletics director and as assistant athletics director in charge of game operations.

Tanner has a Bachelor of Science degree in recreational administration from NC State (1980) and master's of public affairs, public administration (1983).

Born Donald Ray Tanner Jr., March 25, 1958 in Smithfield, N.C., Tanner grew up in Benson, N.C. He is married to the former Karen Donald, a native of Charleston, S.C. A University of South Carolina graduate, she was formerly head women's athletic trainer at NC State. During the summer of 1997 she served as trainer for Charlotte in the Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA). She is the former director of athletics and director of sports medicine at Columbia College.

They have two daughters, Bridgette Grace ("Gracie") and Margaret Pearl ("Maggie") and one son, Joseph Luke ("Luke").

## What a blast: Walker's homer sends USC to College World Series

### Tanner: 'If you see one, crush it'

**Update: Blake Cooper okay to pitch in CWS.**

Christian Walker stepped to the plate in the eighth inning with two on and two outs and the South Carolina baseball trailing Coastal Carolina by two.

One big swing later, the baseball was in transit over the BB&T Coastal Field left-field bleachers on the way to 21st Avenue, and the Gamecocks were on their way to Omaha for the ninth College World Series trip in school history courtesy of a 10-9 victory.

The freshman first baseman admitted a home run was in the back of his mind as he got ready to hit late Sunday afternoon. The same went for everyone in the park wearing garnet, including USC coach Ray Tanner as he gave Walker a piece of advice.

"Everyone was thinking that. He said, 'If you see one, crush it,'" Walker said.

That he did.

"That was definitely one of the better jogs I've taken in my life," Walker said. "I was just making sure I touched all the bases."

With his seventh home run of the season, he propelled the Gamecocks (48-15) to their first College World Series visit since 2004. In the process, he crushed the hopes of the No. 4 national seed Chanticleers (55-10), who came up short in successive Super Regional games while seeking their first trip to Omaha.

"I have utmost respect for coach Gilmore and his team. It's certainly one of the better teams we played the entire season, and we play in a great conference," Tanner said. "We were very fortunate. We just kept fighting, and they kept fighting. We were just one run better two days in a row."

USC showed the most fight at the end. After Whit Merrifield grounded into a double play in the eighth to leave the bases empty and with USC trailing 9-7, Jackie Bradley started the winning rally by drawing a full-count walk from Coastal reliever Austin Fleet (6-2).

Adrian Morales followed by ripping a first-pitch fastball for a double into left that put runners on second and third.

Tanner had some words of advice for Morales before his plate appearance as well.

"I said, 'Adrian, you've got to have a quality at-bat here. We can't hit a three-run homer if you're not on base. Get on base and let's see what happens here,'" Tanner said.

What happened was Walker's first homer since May 12. He told the media he hit a fastball not long after Coastal coach Gary Gilmore had said the pitch from Fleet was a hanging slider. Walker smiled and said it looked like a fastball.

The homer capped a high-scoring affair that became a battle of the bullpens. USC starter Sam Dyson didn't survive

the second inning, and Coastal starter Cody Wheeler didn't make it out of the fourth. The Gamecocks used seven pitchers, with freshman Ethan Carter getting the win after pitching the top of the eighth. Matt Price retired three Chants in a row in the ninth to claim his second consecutive save and 10th of the season.

Along the way, the Gamecocks came back from deficits of 5-2, 7-5 and 9-7, leads that Coastal built behind homers from Rico Noel, Taylor Motter and Daniel Bowman.

Bradley said the best word to describe this USC team is resilient.

"You've got to find a way to minimize certain types of situations, and we were able to do that in the end," he said. "Sometimes our pitchers aren't going to be on for us, and we've got to win a game 9-8 or 15-14. It doesn't matter. You've got to get it done."

Morales said it helped that the Gamecocks had won Game 1.

"They were on their heels. We weren't," he said. "It seemed like we played a little more relaxed and were able to get the job done." Coastal, meanwhile, was left to deal with a demoralizing defeat.

"Omaha has never been as far away as it feels this minute," Gilmore said.

Added second baseman Tommy La Stella: "We thought we had the game won. "To lose it in that fashion is devastating."

Tanner credited a deep, veteran team that finds different contributors every game. Senior Nick Ebert, who has not played much lately, came off the bench to line an RBI single in the sixth to cut the lead to 7-6.

"You talk about really putting the team first. This group has been able to do that," Tanner said. "They fight to the final out, and it was a classic finish for us today."

USC won its first Super Regional on the road after losses in 2001, '06 and '07, but it had more than its fair share of fans among the sellout crowds of 6,599 both days at the beach. Returning to the College World Series brought Tanner some relief from the pressure that goes with the program's expectations.

"We went three years in a row (2002-04), and it's only 2010. It's been six years, but a lot of people think it's been 25 years," Tanner said. "I get reminded of that quite often. I try to keep it in perspective."

Bradley can't wait for the experience of playing at Rosenblatt Stadium in Omaha for the first time.

"People say you can't explain it," he said, "and you really can't."

## Price's magic act: USC on cusp of CWS berth

### Reliever helps Gamecocks escape from no-outs, bases-loaded jam

MYRTLE BEACH | With the first game of the Super Regional on the line, South Carolina closer Matt Price walked onto the field from the bullpen. With no outs in the eighth inning and a Coastal Carolina player standing on each base as the Gamecocks were clinging to a one-run lead, Price went to work.

Fifteen pitches later, Price had a strikeout, a strikeout and a comebacker to hand his team the parachute it desperately needed save itself from a potential free fall. In the process, the Gamecocks held on for a 4-3 victory against the Chanticleers on Saturday afternoon at BB&T Coastal Field to move within one victory of their first College World Series appearance in six years.

"The situation we put Matt Price in, you really have to be Houdini to get out if that," USC coach Ray Tanner said. "He's been pretty good for us through the season, and he's been pretty special some other times, too. He was really special again today."

USC (47-15) will play Coastal Carolina (55-9) at 1 p.m. today in the second game of the best-of-three series, with the Chanticleers needing to win to force a decisive game Monday. USC right-hander Sam Dyson (5-5) will face Coastal left-hander Cody Wheeler (12-0).

Coastal loaded the bases on a hit off starter Blake Cooper and walks by relievers Jose Mata and Michael Roth to start the eighth.

"From a managing-the-game standpoint, you're just trying to keep the game in check, whether they tie it up or go up by one or two," Tanner said. "You're hoping to minimize the damage there. You're not thinking you're going to get what happened today. That was an incredible performance."

Price, a redshirt freshman from Sumter who also pitched around a walk and infield hit in the final inning, earned his ninth — and biggest — save of the season..

"You know the bases are loaded when you go in, but you can't think about that," said Price, who has struck out 67 batters in 45 innings this season. "You've just got to go right after the hitter."

Coastal coach Gary Gilmore was disappointed Chance Gilmore, Taylor Motter and Daniel Bowman couldn't make something happen in the eighth. But he praised Price's for showing him a 93 mph fastball and hard slider.

"Obviously, the scouting report we had on Mr. Price was definitely not the Mr. Price I saw today," Gilmore said. "That fellow is pretty good. Not that the scouting report wasn't good, but I can tell you one thing: He was throwing a lot harder than I anticipated him to be throwing."

USC scored three runs off Coastal starter Matt Rein (7-1) in the first inning on one hit, a two-run single by Christian Walker. Kyle Enders added a sacrifice fly. The Gamecocks added a run in the second inning when Jackie Bradley drew a bases-loaded walk off reliever Josh Conway.

But that would be it, and USC would have to rely on its pitching and defense — as it has much of the season — to finish out the win.

Cooper (12-1) threw seven solid innings, allowing three runs on six hits, which included Bowman's two-run homer in the second and Gilmore's bloop RBI single in the fourth.

"I've got to give credit to their guys. I see why they're batting .320, .330. Their guys battle with two strikes and don't swing at many bad pitches," Cooper said. "I made one bad pitch to him (Bowman), and he hit it out. As a starting pitcher, you can't let that faze you. You just want to continue to stay strong throughout the game."

Gilmore had nothing but praise for Cooper.

"That kid has an unbelievable feel for off-speed (pitches) and command of the strike zone," Gilmore said. "I see why that young man wins all the time. I knew, for us, hits were going to come at a premium. You look at every time he pitches, and it's hard to get two and three hits in an inning off him. He's so doggone good at changing speeds and moving the ball around."

It also helped that Cooper's infielders made plays behind him, including second baseman Scott Wingo's rally-killing double play in the sixth, when the Chants had the bases loaded with one out. Bowman hit a grounder that glanced off Cooper and rolled toward Wingo at second, where he stepped back onto the bag and threw off-balance to first to complete the double play.

Wingo said the team knows what it must do when it's struggling to score.

"We just bear down and try to make good pitches and play good defense," he said.

Gilmore said his team didn't get the breaks it got last weekend when it came back to defeat College of Charleston in the regional.

"Today you look at how the ball ricocheted and bounced, and it was just their day today," he said.

## Gamecocks' season full of special moments

THE SOUTH CAROLINA baseball team started on the road to Omaha four months ago with a season-opening victory against Duquesne at Carolina Stadium and reached its destination with Sunday's Super Regional win over Coastal Carolina in Myrtle Beach.

Along the way, the Gamecocks encountered a few speed bumps early — the East Carolina and Clemson series — and a couple of more late — the Florida series and SEC tournament — but for much of the ride, they rolled steadily on cruise control.

Coach Ray Tanner's team proved a model of consistency, backed by outstanding pitching, stellar defense and timely hitting in compiling a 48-15 record. Only five teams in school history have won more games, and this team's travels aren't complete.

So let's look back at USC's travelogue and revisit the top 10 highlights of a trek that covered seven states across the Southeast, working backwards chronologically.

### **Christian Walker's shot heard 'round the Grand Strand, June 13, Myrtle Beach**

With two outs and two on and the Gamecocks trailing by two runs in the eighth inning of Game 2 of the Super Regional against Coastal Carolina, Walker blasts a three-run homer to propel USC to a 10-9 win and the program's ninth College World Series appearance.

### **Matt Price saves the season, June 12, Myrtle Beach**

Clinging to a 4-3 lead in the eighth inning in Game 1 of the Super Regional, USC calls on Price to halt a rally by Coastal, which had loaded the bases with no outs. Price mows down the Chants with two strikeouts and a comebacker to preserve the lead and put the Gamecocks in the driver's seat. The redshirt freshman leads the team with 10 saves.

### **Jackie Bradley's fence scraper jump-starts NCAA tournament run, June 4, Columbia**

USC trails 5-4 in the eighth inning against Bucknell in the first game of the NCAA regional at Carolina Stadium when Bradley hits a high fly ball that scrapes the back of the left-field fence for a two-run homer to give the Gamecocks their first lead on the way to a 9-5 win. The sophomore outfielder and best all-around player leads the Gamecocks with a .371 average.

### **Whit Merrifield sweeps past the Razorbacks, May 16, Fayetteville, Ark**

The junior outfielder hits two home runs, including the two-run game-winner, in a 5-3 victory against Arkansas to complete a sweep that shows the rest of the SEC the Gamecocks are for real. Merrifield leads the team in homers (12) and stolen bases (12).

### **Brady Thomas walks off against the Tide, April 30, Columbia**

The senior catcher and designated hitter with a knack for delivering big hits drills a two-run, walkoff homer in the 11th inning for a 9-7 victory against Alabama. The left-handed-hitting Thomas, who has a .322 average and eight homers, hits his way into a key role on a team that relies on a number of valuable contributors off the bench.

### **Blake Cooper coops up the Rebels, April 16, Columbia**

In a much-hyped showdown with Ole Miss left-hander and first-round MLB pick Drew Pomeranz, Cooper tosses a

four-hitter in a 5-0 victory. The senior right-hander leads the pitching staff with a 12-1 record and has a 2.81 ERA.

**Jay Brown schools Vanderbilt, April 10, Nashville, Tenn.**

The USC graduate and team co-captain, back for a sixth season due to an injury-plagued career, hurls 6 1/3 scoreless innings in a 2-0 victory against Vanderbilt to give the Gamecocks an important road-series win.

**Sam Dyson holds those Tigers, March 27, Auburn, Ala.**

Facing Auburn, the SEC's top-hitting team, Dyson shows why he would be drafted for the third time a couple of weeks later with seven scoreless innings. Dyson walked none and struck out nine in a 2-0 victory that clinches USC's first road-series win of the conference season.

**Adrian Morales introduces himself to USC fans, March 9, Columbia**

In a 12-4 midweek victory against Valparaiso, the junior-college transfer sends the first signal that he'll be a significant contributor with two hits and three RBIs. Filling a void at third base, he leads the team with 52 RBIs and provides leadership. That Valpo win was part of USC's 14-0 mark against midweek opponents.

**USC dukes it out to start the season, Feb. 19-21, Columbia**

With a sweep of Duquesne by a combined score of 28-9, led by Jeffery Jones' three homers and 10 RBIs in the series, the Gamecocks show the first glimpse of a deep bench and even deeper pitching staff that would help carry them all season. They use 15 pitchers in the three games.

## The Price is Right

Gamecocks hold off Chanticleers, one victory from Omaha

MYRTLE BEACH -- Pitching and defense got South Carolina here. And it saved the Gamecocks on Saturday.

Despite failing to score after the second and getting into all sorts of late-inning jams, South Carolina somehow managed to hang on for a 4-3 victory against Coastal Carolina in the first game of this best-of-three NCAA super regional at sold-out BB&T Coastal Field.

"When that thing ended," USC coach Ray Tanner said, "that's just a response of 'wow.' It was just an incredible game."

South Carolina (47-15) is now one win away from Omaha, in what would be the school's first trip to the College World Series since 2004. The program has been eight times, previously.

Coastal Carolina (55-9) has to win two games in two days to avoid elimination, but it had to win three in two days last weekend to survive the College of Charleston in the regional. This is familiar territory for the Chanticleers, who will throw left-hander Cody Wheeler (12-0, 3.59

ERA) at 1 p.m. today (TV: ESPN).

The Gamecocks will counter with right-hander Sam Dyson (5-5, 4.00). If he's on, and that's something of a coin flip, Dyson's stuff is infinitely better than those middling numbers.

South Carolina continued Saturday its season-long flirtation with danger, but the Gamecocks are getting good at this survival game.

They were 1 for 10 with runners in scoring position after Christian Walker's two-run single in the first.

That was nothing, though, compared to the mess Matt Price got out of in the eighth inning.

After consecutive walks by relievers Michael Roth and Jose Mata loaded the bases with none out -- and the score 4-3 -- the Gamecocks turned to their closer to save them.

Price got two strikeouts -- No. 5 hitter Chance Gilmore swinging, No. 6 hitter Taylor Motter looking -- and a groundout on a comebacker.

With the bases loaded and zero outs, the Chants couldn't even get one run home.

Price wouldn't let them.

"He really has to be Houdini to get out of that," Tanner said. "From a managing-the-game aspect, you're just trying to keep the game in check. ... You don't get crazy and say you're going to leave the bases loaded. That's tough to do."

The Chanticleers had the tying run on second against Price in the ninth, but Coastal Carolina's best hitter, second baseman Tommy La Stella, flied out to center field to end the game.

Even after the game, Coastal Carolina coach Gary Gilmore still seemed befuddled by what Price had done.

"There in the eighth," he said, "I really thought we'd put the ball in play."

He said, again and again, that the scouting report Coastal Carolina had on the redshirt freshman from Sumter did not match what he saw.

"I don't have a radar gun, but it was a lot more than I was expecting," Gilmore said. "Heck, he did a great job."

It induced a heavy sigh of relief for many in the stands, but for the Gamecocks, it sort of felt typical.

Close wins, with pitching and defense carrying the team, has become the calling card of this club.

"We've done it all year," Tanner said. "We've won some close games because of our pitching and defense. You look at some box scores and we leave nine out there, or 12 out there, and we

only win by a run or two. There's been a lot of those. We've been in them before."

Starter Blake Cooper allowed three runs on six hits in seven tough innings. Cooper, himself, needed some magic to avoid danger in the sixth.

With the bases loaded, right fielder Daniel Bowman hit a sharp grounder up the middle that glanced off Cooper's glove and went directly to Scott Wingo at second base.

Wingo stepped on second and, as he was falling, threw a strike to first base to complete a dramatic 1-4-3 double play and keep South Carolina ahead by a single run.

Bowman had homered earlier in the game off Cooper to provide Coastal Carolina's first two runs.

"I felt like I hit the ball hard," Bowman said. "Of all the places it could've gone, it went to second base."

The magic from the Charleston games, which included a walk-off home run Sunday night and an even wilder finish in 10 innings Monday, seemed to have worn off for the Chants by Saturday.

"Today, you watch the way the ball ricocheted and bounced, and it was their day," Gilmore said. "We've got to suck it up and come back (today)."

Coastal Carolina is in search of its first College World Series appearances, having reached the supers in 2005 and 2008.

The Gamecocks were last in this position in 2007, when they lost the deciding third game at North Carolina. The previous year, at Georgia, South Carolina won the opening game but then dropped the next two.

## USC beach-bound to face Coastal in Supers

The University of South Carolina's baseball players are no different than anybody else across the state in early June. They're headed to the beach.

The Gamecocks will face Coastal Carolina in a Super Regional series that begins Saturday.

USC, which won its NCAA regional at Carolina Stadium Sunday night, learned Monday the destination of their Super Regional. With No. 4 national seed Coastal Carolina defeating the College of Charleston 11-10 in its regional championship game, the Chanticleers will serve as the host team for the best-of-three series against USC this weekend.

On Monday night the team learned the games will be played at noon Saturday, 1 p.m. Sunday and - if necessary - 1 or 7 p.m. Monday.

The series will be played at BB&T Coastal Field in Myrtle Beach, home to the Pelicans, a Single-A affiliate of the Atlanta Braves. The stadium seats 5,200, with a standing-room-only capacity of 6,600.

South Carolina (46-15) is making its eighth Super Regional appearance since the NCAA began using this format in 1999. This will be the second appearance for Coastal (55-8) in a Super Regional and its first as a host.

The Gamecocks have made 26 NCAA tournament appearances, with eight trips to the College World Series, in their history, while the Chanticleers have made 10 NCAA appearances. The two teams have played 15 times dating back to 1976. USC, which leads the all-time series 10-5, won the last meeting in 2002.

All games in the eight Super Regionals will be shown live on ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU or ESPN3.

## Morris: USC takes care of its business

WINNING THE Columbia Regional over the weekend was all about taking care of business for the South Carolina baseball team.

“When we came back from the (SEC) tournament, that was the only thing I had on my mind,” coach Ray Tanner said. “We’ve got to get back to who we are.”

For one splendid weekend at Carolina Stadium, USC looked like USC, not the imposter that dropped a regular-season ending series to Florida and bombed out in two games at the SEC tournament.

Just as it did throughout most of the regular season, USC beat the teams it was supposed to beat in sweeping the regional in three games. The Gamecocks did it with solid pitching and defense, timely hitting and the kind of power they have displayed all season in the friendly confines of home.

“Our guys did a terrific job,” Tanner said. “We played about as good as we can.”

Of course, the reward for an outstanding regular season and second-place finish in the SEC was a host site for the regional tournament. It also meant squaring off over a three-day period against teams that, quite frankly, are not top-level SEC-caliber.

So it came as no surprise that USC performed the way it performed. Paramount in that play was a return to working opposing pitchers by going deep into counts, scattering hits all over the field and bringing runners home with timely line drives, bloop, high choppers . . . basically anything that worked.

Void of big innings at the end of the regular season and into the SEC tournament, USC broke out of its collective slump with a five-run eighth inning in the opening win against Bucknell, a five-run seventh inning in the second-round win against The Citadel and a decisive six-run sixth inning in Sunday’s championship win against Virginia Tech.

“Double digits every single game in hits, I think we’re pretty much over it,” centerfielder Jackie Bradley said of USC’s slump-busting hit totals of 14, 14 and 14 in the three games and run totals of nine, nine and 10.

The additional benefit to hosting a regional is that USC sends out a power-laden lineup when it plays at Carolina Stadium. Evan Marzilli, Bradley and Adrian Morales all homered against Bucknell. Morales and Kyle Enders did the same against The Citadel, and Bradley and Morales followed against Virginia Tech.

With seven home runs in the regional, USC has 69 home runs at Carolina Stadium this season, 20 on the road.

The other mix to USC’s successful formula was solid pitching, including an outstanding start from Mr. Old Reliable, Blake Cooper, and a couple of sterling efforts out of a bullpen that has been top-notch all season.

Cooper did not allow an earned run over 7 1/3 innings against The Citadel. Left-handed reliever Michael Roth was perfect over 3 1/3 innings with five strikeouts against Bucknell. Then Jose Mata was sensational in allowing two harmless singles over 4 1/3 innings against Virginia Tech.

Finally, there was the defense. USC committed five errors for the tournament, but three of those came in the opener against Bucknell when Tanner sacrificed defense for hitting and had players out of position all over the field.

The signature play of the weekend for the defense came Sunday in the eighth inning when third baseman Morales dived head long to spear a ground ball, leaped to his feet and fired the ball to second base for a force out.

Morales' play drew a standing ovation from the crowd. It was one of many times over the weekend that the highly partisan USC faithful saluted their Gamecocks. Interestingly enough, though, the USC team hardly seemed in a celebratory mood after it got the final out on Sunday.

After consecutive seasons of falling short in the regional round, USC fans might have expected more than just hand shakes and back slaps as the players gathered on the Carolina Stadium pitcher's mound.

College baseball's traditional dogpile was nowhere to be found.

"It wasn't by my design," Tanner said of the subdued celebration. "I think it was the players' design. I think there's enough perspective in our dugout that, yes, we're very happy, but it's not dogpile time."

The message was clear. By winning the regional, USC merely took the first step toward accomplishing its ultimate goal. Two wins next weekend — whether at Carolina Stadium or in Myrtle Beach — and there is certain to be a dogpile on the pitcher's mound.

Only then will USC be headed to Omaha for the College World Series.

## Morris: USC's new style brings big results

Ray Tanner refutes rumors that had him managing throughout most of his USC career from a rocking chair in the dugout. He says there is no truth to talk that he submitted the lineup card before each game, then leaned back and waited for his team's offense to produce three-run homers.

Tanner will tell you, though, there is more managing going on with this South Carolina baseball team. That's because USC is playing a small-ball style longtime fans are not accustomed to seeing.

Tanner has preached to each of his teams over a 23-year career to play with a sense of urgency and heightened awareness. This team has forced Tanner to practice what he preaches.

"As a manager, I tell myself, 'Don't take a pitch off. Don't relax on a single pitch,' because there is a sense of urgency," Tanner says. "There are a lot of buttons that could be pushed or have to be pushed, and decisions that have to be made."

Tanner gleefully admits this new approach is different from any team he has coached, either at North Carolina State or USC. Previously accustomed to littering the field with designated hitters, Tanner has opted to play defense over hitting. That goes hand-in-hand with having a deep and talented pitching staff.

Beyond that, USC is beginning to reap the benefits of a change in hitting philosophy that assistant coach Chad Holbrook brought with him two years ago from North Carolina. Instead of sending batters to the plate who swing out of their shoes, USC fields a lineup that settles comfortably in the batter's box while attempting to hit to the opposite field, advance runners, work the count in their favor, take walks and seldom strike out.

Look no further than USC's 32-8 record entering the weekend as a gauge to how the change has played out. This is a team that has transformed from the Oakland A's "Bash Brothers" style of the late 1980s to the club's "Moneyball" approach in the 2000s.

Just about any statistic bears out that hypothesis. USC is second in the SEC in both ERA and fielding percentage. It is fourth in on-base percentage, second in walks and second with the fewest strikeouts.

USC's home run total is down, but hardly nonexistent; its 48 long balls project to 84 by season's end. That would be the fourth-lowest total for any team under Tanner, but still ranks fourth in the SEC.

More telling is that USC is hitting behind runners and - gasp! - bunting runners into scoring position. USC has 39 sacrifice bunts, the first time any Tanner-coached team has ever led the SEC in that category.

This alteration in style came somewhat by accident, somewhat by design.

Prior to the season, Tanner believed this team would be much like his others. He figured Nick Ebert might improve on his 23 home runs of a season ago, but the first baseman slumped early and has not regained his power stroke. Tanner also figured Jackie Bradley and Whit Merrifield might improve on their 11 home runs apiece, but the two have 11 combined.

Going in, Tanner also was willing to sacrifice defense by starting long-ball hitting freshman Christian Walker at third base. When Walker started slowly, Tanner refocused on defense and inserted junior college transfer Adrian Morales, who provides solid defense and - as a bonus - leads the team in RBIs.

Tanner even experimented a few games with Scott Wingo providing more offense at shortstop, then recognized that slick-fielding, yet light-hitting, Bobby Haney was needed at shortstop behind a pitching staff that has proven to be the team's cornerstone. In previous years, Tanner might even have shifted Merrifield from outfield to shortstop to infuse more offense into the lineup.

With so many options, Tanner says he and his coaching staff spend an inordinate amount of time agonizing over whose name will appear on the lineup card each game. Additionally, with a staff that goes 12 deep, Tanner says he and pitching coach Mark Calvi are constantly talking in the dugout.

"We've had more dialogue in the dugout this year than in any year past because he's running the game, and at the same time I'm in his ear trying to be prepared for what's coming," Tanner says of Calvi.

While many of Tanner's teams over the years have been long on pitching, not since his 1990 N.C. State club walked more times (313) than it struck out (298) has one been as disciplined at the plate as this one. This team has 242 walks and hit batsmen compared to 232 strikeouts.

Holbrook says that is because everyone on the squad has bought into his philosophy of valuing every at-bat. It is a thought process he initiated almost immediately upon arriving in Columbia.

Holbrook remembers the first USC scrimmage of 2009 when he instructed every hitter to watch fastballs and "sit" on breaking balls. It was the opposite approach to what USC hitters had been taught, when they often swung and missed at breaking balls forever in search of the fastball to take out of the park.

"There are more ways to skin a cat, but it was just a different type of thinking and a different thought process than they were used to," Holbrook recalls. "That was probably the equivalent of a coach walking up to the Los Angeles Lakers and saying, 'We're not going to push the ball up and down the court, we're going to walk the ball.'"

Holbrook might as well have removed Tanner's rocking chair from the dugout that day.

## Second chance a hit for Thomas

### After failing to come through earlier in the clutch, catcher knocks game-winning homer

Brady Thomas pinch-hit for Kyle Enders in the ninth inning and failed to get a sacrifice bunt down to advance a runner in a tie game.

Given a second chance in the 11th, the senior from Anderson delivered a walk-off, two-run home run, and No. 7 South Carolina escaped with a 9-7 victory against Alabama in front of 8,145 fans Friday night at Carolina Stadium.

"I had a blunder out there with that bunt, and I was hoping to do something positive," Thomas said. "You always want to be that last guy up there to get the chance to win the game. Fortunately, I was able to go up there and get a good swing."

Thomas drilled the 3-2 pitch from Alabama reliever Nathan Kilcrease over the South Carolina bullpen in right-center-field. Thomas pulled a hanging slider into the alley.

Kilcrease came into the game leading the SEC with a 1.44 ERA. It was his second loss of the season, with the other setback coming in a 6-5 loss to LSU in 14 innings in which he also allowed a walk-off home run.

South Carolina (33-8, 15-4) was one out from winning in the ninth when the Crimson Tide (27-16, 8-11) got a three-run home run from Josh Rutledge.

He lifted Matt Price's pitch just over the wall in right field to force extra innings.

Jackie Bradley allowed USC to get to the 10th inning when he threw out Ross Wilson at third to end the ninth.

Bradley also had a key play in the eighth that possibly saved a run. He went deep in the gap in right-center to haul down a fly ball by Jon Kelton and swiftly threw back to first to double off Clay Jones. Jones thought for certain the ball was going to fall into the gap, but Bradley was able to get a solid jump.

Key defensive plays were a theme for USC. In the fifth inning, second baseman Scott Wingo went behind the bag to knock down a ball by David Kinard and he came up throwing to the plate to nail Rutledge, who was trying to score from second, for the final out.

Bradley found his power as well. He supplied a three-run triple in the second and a solo home run in the fourth. He finished 3-for-5 and was a double shy of hitting for the cycle.

The defense was needed to back the pitching of Blake Cooper. The senior right-hander allowed a season-high 11 hits and tied his season high by allowing four runs.

Cooper didn't have his best stuff, but he lasted 6 1/3 innings and didn't factor in the decision.

It was the first time he didn't earn the win on a Friday night since his first SEC game against Tennessee seven weeks ago.

## Carolina to take on sister school

USC looks to stay hot, build on strong SEC start against USC-Upstate in midweek clash

Since its conception, South Carolina has been to 25 NCAA Tournament appearances, eight College World Series appearances, and has become widely considered one of the top baseball programs in the country.

One thing it hadn't done, however, was win more than four consecutive conference series to start a season.

It has now.

Taking two out of three from Ole Miss over the weekend, Carolina secured the strongest start in program history, notching its fifth straight SEC series victory in as many attempts.

"We've won some close ones," USC coach Ray Tanner said. "Certainly we'd like to have gotten the sweep, but looking at the big picture, we've done okay."

Hoping to keep the hot streak intact, the No. 10 Gamecocks (28-7, 11-3) will look for another strong performance when they faceoff with USC Upstate (13-28, 3-14) in a midweek, non-conference matchup this evening.

Much of Carolina's success in recent games has come from offensive production, and of the numerous hot bats in the lineup right now, none may be hotter than Scott Wingo's. In four games last week, the junior infielder went 5-13 with three home runs and five RBI, including a solo shot in Sunday's game that put the Gamecocks on the board and improved his season total to a team-high of eight.

"We thought we were a pretty good team coming into the season," Wingo said. "I didn't really

have a set record in mind, but I knew we could be pretty good.”

Junior outfielder Whit Merrifield has continued to excel on the offensive side as well, entering tonight’s game with a .342 batting average, seven home runs, and 24 RBI.

With four hits in the weekend series against the Rebels, he has now hit safely in 34 of 36 games this season and currently sits at No. 15 on Carolina’s career hits list.

“We felt pretty good at the plate. (Ole Miss pitcher David Goforth) had a great couple innings. He was throwing good stuff up there,” Merrifield said following Sunday’s game. “But we adjusted and started hitting some balls hard. Some fell, some didn’t, but that’s baseball.”

Freshman pitcher Colby Holmes is slated to make his fourth start of the season. Despite struggling in his last outing against the Citadel, the Conway native enters the game with a 2-0 record and 21 strikeouts on the year.

He’ll be challenged with beating freshman Gaither Bumgardner, who’s scheduled to make the start for USC Upstate. A Fort Lawn native, Bumgardner comes in at 0-4 with an 8.10 ERA and 25 strikeouts.

## Milestone win for USC coach

Ray Tanner grabs 1,000th career triumph Sunday in Nashville

USC coach Ray Tanner got his 1,000th victory as a college head coach Sunday as the Gamecocks took two out of three games from Vanderbilt in Nashville, led by a masterful pitching performance in the rubber game by senior Jay Brown.

“I’m grateful to be where I am,” Tanner said. “I think I have one of the better jobs in the country and I’m just a part of a team. Like I said before, I’ve never made any pitches, I’ve never gotten any hits, I’ve never made any plays. I’m just proud to be part of this program.” No. 11 Carolina (25-7, 9-3) won its fourth straight SEC series for the first time in school history after beating the No. 20 Commodores (26-8, 6-6) with stellar pitching in the victories on Friday and Sunday.

The Gamecocks were able to clinch the series, along with Tanner’s historic milestone, with a fine performance from Brown, who pitched 6.1 scoreless innings in the 2-0 Carolina victory. The shutout was the fifth that USC has pitched this season, and the third for Carolina in SEC play. Brown gave credit for his pitching to his defense.

“Jay Brown, I’ll always remember getting 1,000 when he pitched and I’m honored that he was the guy that went out there,” Tanner said. “He figured in with [Michael] Roth and [Matt] Price in a tough game today.”

Brown was equally elated.

“It was a special game for me. I tried to pound the zone early, and let them put it in play,” Brown said. “The defense really looked good out there and was able to get some key outs for us.”

Junior outfielder Whit Merrifield paced USC at the plate on Sunday, going two-for-three, including a leadoff home run on the first pitch of the game that put Carolina up 1-0. Merrifield has now hit safely in 31 of 32 games this season and extended his current hitting streak to 19 games with his first-inning home run.

The Gamecocks managed only four hits on the day off of VU pitching, but one of those hits came at an especially important time. Junior third baseman Adrian Morales doubled in Matthew Beary with 2 outs, giving Carolina an important insurance run that put the Gamecocks up 2-0.

## Ebert leads USC defeat of Charleston

First baseman's home run keys win over Cougars

College of Charleston freshman Jake Zokan's homecoming was far from what he'd have liked. South Carolina's bats made sure of that.

Playing in his first collegiate game in Columbia, the former Spring Valley Viking was chased after two and two-thirds innings after giving up four runs as the No. 8 Gamecocks (23-6) overcame a late comeback attempt to earn a 6-3 victory over the Cougars (23-8).

With the win, Carolina improved its series record against College of Charleston to 42-5.

"This is one of the better teams we've played. They were dangerous," USC coach Ray Tanner said.

"We were very fortunate to be able to win tonight."

The offensive barrage was sparked by first baseman Nick Ebert. Coming into the game hitting .242, the senior went 2-for-3 with three RBI and two runs scored.

"I never lost confidence in myself, not for a second," Ebert said. "I knew what I could do and my coaches and teammates knew what I could do too. It was just a matter of when."

After a two-out single and an error put junior designated hitter Parker Bangs on second, Ebert ripped a 2-0 pitch down the left field line for a double, driving in Bangs and putting the Gamecocks on the board.

One batter later, sophomore outfielder Adam Matthews sent a 3-2 pitch up the middle to drive in Ebert and gave Carolina a 2-0 lead.

Ebert's big night continued in the third. With two outs and junior outfielder Whit Merrifield on second, the senior sent a 3-0 pitch sailing over the left field, notching his third home run of the season and putting the Gamecocks up 4-0.

"He's looking a lot better. I'm sure he feels better about himself," Tanner said. "He's had some quality at bats and he's fought hard to get back to where he is."

With a third-inning single, Merrifield extended his hitting streak to 16 games and increased his career hit total, aiming for a spot in the top ten in program history.

"It's special. It's something I kind of looked at coming in because I wanted to make my mark here," Merrifield said. "It feels really good to be listed among those names. Hopefully I can keep going."

Freshman Colby Holmes earned the win, going five innings and allowing two earned runs.

"I knew they could hit. I played with a bunch of these guys over the summer," Holmes said. "I just went out there and did what I could to help the team win."

The Conway native got into a jam early, allowing the first two batters he faced to reach base. He managed to escape it, however, retiring the next three hitters to shut down the rally. Holmes faced a similar situation in the second, allowing a first-pitch double to second baseman Baker Knox. After a sacrifice fly advanced Knox to third, Holmes forced first baseman Greg Blake to ground out to short and struck out right fielder Thomas Brittle.

"Colby wiggled out of a couple situations," Tanner said. "I knew it was going to be tough with seven lefties in their lineup. But he battled through it and did a nice job."

From there, Holmes was nearly perfect until the sixth, when a solo home run from center fielder Cole Rakar made it 6-1. After the next two batters walked and singled, Tanner decided to go to his bullpen.

College of Charleston managed to bring around one more run but was foiled with the bases loaded when sophomore Steven Neff forced

A solo home run from third baseman Matt Leeds in the eighth cut the lead to three, but sophomore Michael Roth managed to hold the Cougars from there and was able to preserve the 6-3 victory.

## USC has plenty of faith in this Christian

### Freshman Walker eager to prove he deserves his spot in the starting lineup

If anyone needs a sign of how much USC baseball coach Ray Tanner believes in freshman third baseman Christian Walker, they simply need to check the opening-day lineup card.

Friday afternoon against Duquesne, Tanner plans to write Walker's name in the No. 3 spot in the batting order, a place usually reserved for a team's best hitter.

Even if outfielder Jackie Bradley was healthy and first baseman Nick Ebert was academically eligible, Walker still might have been slotted there. After fall practice - during which the 6-foot, 210-pounder from Limerick, Pa., showcased his capacity to hit line drives all over Carolina Stadium - Tanner was sold not just on Walker's power but on the approach he has taken to facing better pitching.

"I continue to be impressed with his ability to hit. There's no way to know what kind of year he'll have, but I believe he can contribute in a big way offensively," Tanner said. "Christian certainly has power, but he's not just going to be a power hitter. He's a good hitter who will hit home runs."

Tanner knew he had the makings of a good hitter when Walker - who at Kennedy-Kenrick High played for Tom Sergio, a former player of Tanner's at N.C. State - verbally committed to USC after his sophomore season. Walker went on to prove as much. By the time he finished high school, PG Crosschecker had him rated the No. 88 prep prospect in the nation.

The right-handed-hitting Walker flashed his talent a year ago during the International Power Showcase Home Run Derby at Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg, Fla., where 70 high school hitters from the United States and nine other countries competed. Using both wood and metal bats, he hit a total of 19 home runs to win the event, besting players such as Sports Illustrated cover boy Bryce Harper and Dante Bichette Jr., son of the former major leaguer.

"That was an unbelievable experience," Walker said.

He hopes to have the same sort of experience in his opening series for the Gamecocks, which will take place in front of 10 family members who traveled to Columbia. But while some freshmen might be nervous about being inserted into the starting lineup of a perennial SEC power, Walker's confidence doesn't allow it.

"A lot of people talked to me about being nervous. I told them it was more about being anxious to get out on the field and get the season started," Walker said. "I'm very pleased. I knew I could do it."

Tanner did, too.

"Certainly you start with his talent level. Is he good enough? Absolutely," Tanner said. "But he also has shown both poise and composure in the way he handles instruction and adversity."

He has encountered both as he has made the adjustment to playing third base at the collegiate level, where the speed of the game is much faster. With Tanner serving as infield coach, Walker has heard plenty about what he needs to do to get better.

"He's had to endure the wrath of the head coach coaching him," Tanner said. "From a coaching standpoint, I'll

never hesitate to challenge him. He's very mature, and he doesn't need to be molly-coddled. He's handled it well, but he needs to continue to make strides defensively."

Walker realizes where his focus needs to be to keep his starting spot.

"Obviously, there's room for improvement," he said. "My defense hasn't been where I wanted it to be, but I'm working hard on it every day."

Tanner mentions Justin Smoak from a comparative point when talking about Walker. And the last time the coach spoke so highly of a freshman was a year ago when he raved about Jackie Bradley, who went on to earn consensus freshman All-America honors.

Walker understands the spotlight will be on him, but he's not going to get caught up in trying to produce the big numbers of those predecessors.

"There always is that pressure in the back of your head," he said. "But I don't want to set goals too high. I don't want to try to live up to somebody else. I'd rather set my own pace and do what I know how to do."

He also knew that he wanted to play at USC. During the fourth round of last summer's Major League Baseball draft, the Boston Red Sox called to see if he would agree to an offer, but it wasn't enough for him to change his commitment. The White Sox made a run at him in the 37th round to no avail either. Eventually, the Los Angeles Dodgers used their 49th-round pick on him, but Walker was set on playing college baseball.

Today he's thrilled to be playing in a facility like Carolina Stadium - which he called "unbelievable" - and he's more pleased to be surrounded by the level of talent on the USC roster. He's not sure exactly what to expect, but he's looking to be a big part of a big season.

"We're always really good here," he said. "I haven't seen all the competition in the SEC yet, but I think we have a good chance of going pretty far."

How far the Gamecocks go might come down to their new No. 3 hitter.

## USC baseball team eyes return to CWS

Team opens play Friday at home vs. Duquesne

As Ray Tanner begins his 14th season as the University of South Carolina's baseball coach, he is ready to end the Gamecocks' College World Series drought.

USC not made a trip to the championship series in Omaha, Neb., since 2004.

"Last year, when I was in this position, there was some anxiety based on the experience factor we had on the field," Tanner said. "The expectations aren't any different from year to year. But there is a lot more experience on the field right now than there was a year ago. We're excited about that."

The Gamecocks finished 2009 with a 40-23 record and in second place in the East Division of the Southeastern Conference. USC was within one inning of advancing to a NCAA Super Regional, but East Carolina rallied to win the regional championship game in Greenville, N.C.

The team will have to deal with the loss of sophomore center fielder Jackie Bradley Jr., who will miss at least a month after breaking his right hand. The Gamecocks also open without power hitting first baseman Nick Ebert, who is awaiting word from the NCAA on an eligibility issue.

There remains reason for optimism, however. Scott Wingo, a junior who played at Mauldin High School, and senior Bobby Haney return at second base and shortstop, respectively. They struggled at the plate last season but displayed signs of improvement during fall practice.

"I definitely don't plan on hitting .196 this year, that's for sure," Wingo said, referring to his batting average last season. "I realize I am not going to be a home run hitter, so I have adjusted my swing and I have been making better contact."

If Ebert isn't cleared for this weekend's season-opening series against Duquesne at Carolina Stadium, senior Jeffery Jones likely would start at first base. Freshman Christian Walker, the likely starter at third, may be able to fill some of the void at the plate.

"He's got a lot of power," said Ebert, the team's leading home run hitter in 2009. "He has hit some monster shots."

Kyle Enders, a fifth-year senior who played at Riverside High, will start at catcher and receive the opportunity to call many of the pitches, something few USC catchers have been allowed to do during Tanner's tenure.

"I think I know the pitching staff pretty well," Enders said. "I will work closely with (pitching) coach (Mark) Calvi to make sure we are on the same page."

Freshman Tyler Webb joins Sam Dyson, Nolan Belcher and Blake Cooper as candidates for the weekend rotation. The freshman from Nassawadox, Va. has been impressive and could challenge Belcher to be the third weekend starter. Junior college transfer John Taylor is prepared to take over as closer.

While Bradley is out, senior Whit Merrifield will move from left to center field. Sophomore Adam Matthews starts in right, and either junior Robert Beary or freshman Evan Marzilli takes over in left.

## Gamecocks making a new pitch

### USC believes it has the right mix of hurlers to reverse a recent trend: breakdowns by their pitching staff at crucial times

South Carolina pitching coach Mark Calvi's early appraisal of this season's staff involves a reference to the stunning end of last season, when the Gamecocks blew a 9-6 lead in the ninth inning to East Carolina in the championship game of an NCAA regional.

"We have some guys this year that, if we had them last year, we would have won that game," Calvi said. "John Taylor is one of those guys."

That extra-inning loss to the Pirates not only kept USC from advancing to a Super Regional, it kept a magnifying glass on one of the program's problems over the past four seasons - a lack of pitching depth, especially in the bullpen. No USC reliever has compiled more than seven saves in each of the past four seasons.

As the Gamecocks open the season Friday against Duquesne at Carolina Stadium, they appear to have the kind of depth - highlighted by veterans Blake Cooper, Jay Brown and Sam Dyson as well as newcomers Taylor, a junior-college transfer, and freshman Tyler Webb - who will make a difference

"Not only will we have more options, but we'll have more quality in those options," Calvi said.

The East Carolina loss was especially painful, given that USC had a 6-0 lead heading into the fifth inning. And it brought back bad memories of the 2007 Super Regional against UNC, when the Gamecocks blew a 6-0 lead in Game 1 and a 4-0 lead in the deciding Game 3. In Game 2 of the 2006 Super Regional against Georgia, a 4-0 lead slipped away along with a chance to go to Omaha.

"One of our missions as we recruit has been to bring in a stronger bullpen, because that's where we've lost some games," Calvi said. "I realize where the hole in the dam has been. It's not being able to hold a lead. And it's not just a matter of putting a thumb in it, but fixing it."

Part of the fix involves getting stronger performances from the starters. Last season's team ERA of 5.07 was the highest since 1997, coach Ray Tanner's first season at USC. The last time the team had an ERA under 3.50 came in 2004, when Gamecocks made their most recent trip to the College World Series.

But the pitchers like what they've seen during fall practice and workouts over the past month. Among them is Brown, an expected starter after posting a 3-0 record with a team-leading 3.35 ERA last season.

"We do have a deep pitching staff," said Brown, who picked up an additional season after being granted a medical hardship by the NCAA. "We've got older guys who, as coach Tanner says, have some stripes on their sleeves, and we've got some younger guys coming in who can play key roles on this staff. There's a whole list of people who I feel confident can get us through games, whether they're staring or coming out of the bullpen."

Brown believes there is going to be a battle to earn quality innings, something that can help the team over the long haul.

"Everybody is competing because everybody wants to do well," he said. "We're all looking at it as an opportunity to make the team better. It's good the competition is there."

Dyson, the ace right-hander, will be brought along slowly as he returns from offseason elbow surgery. That might allow Cooper, a senior righty with 21 career wins as the Sunday starter, to become more of a go-to guy.

"A lot of guys don't give Blake Cooper enough credit," Calvi said. "He can dominate a team when he's on. He can be as good as anybody."

Cooper, who dropped 20 pounds in the offseason, sees something with this staff that he hasn't seen the previous three seasons.

"The difference for us is we'll have some guys who'll go out there and throw strikes and have confidence in themselves," he said.

The Gamecocks have a solid mix of old and young as well as lefties and righties in the starting rotation and in the bullpen. Webb and sophomore left-handers Nolan Belcher, Steven Neff and Jimmy Revan will vie for the other starting slots. Taylor heads a bullpen that includes junior right-hander Parker Bangs, sophomore left-hander Michael Roth, freshman right-hander Ethan Carter and junior-college right-hander Jose Mata.

Calvi, who is entering his sixth season as USC's pitching coach, is confident they will hold up to the pressures of SEC baseball and NCAA postseason play.

"It's been banged into their heads that they need to be good every day," he said. "They need to be who they are and be consistent. Whether the score is 8-7 or 2-1, they've got to do what they have to do to win."

## Adam Matthews' potent combo of power and speed

### Outfielder Adam Matthews has an ample supply of both power and speed, making him a 'freak' of an athlete

While watching Adam Matthews play baseball, it can be difficult to determine the most impressive thing about his game.

Power or speed? South Carolina's sophomore outfielder has provided plenty of both.

Look at the massive homers — one to the top of the left-field bleachers and one to dead center in Carolina Stadium — he hit in consecutive games against Florida, and you think it's his power.

But then you watch him drop a bunt down the first-base line against the Gators and run past every fielder converging on the ball, and you think it's his speed.

Then you remember the NCAA regional against East Carolina last season, when he blasted a pair of homers in a win over the Pirates, and you're back to power.

Yet you still can't get out of your mind his inside-the-park home run against Arkansas as a freshman, when he hit a ball off the left-field wall and ran around the bases so quickly that it seemed he was crossing home plate before the ball was picked up. So it must be the speed, right?

"God has blessed me, for sure, and I want to continue to use it and be productive with my power and my speed," the soft-spoken Matthews said.

The powerfully built 6-foot-1, 190-pounder looks like the kind of player who can pound a baseball. But it's the foot speed — he has been clocked at 6.36 in the 60-yard dash — that comes as the surprise.

"From an athletic standpoint, he's in the elite category, of all the kids I've coached. There's no question about that," USC assistant coach Chad Holbrook said. "He has all the tools."

A raw talent as an all-state player at White Knoll High in Lexington, Matthews showed up at USC brimming with potential. He didn't break into the regular lineup until the last part of his freshman season, but he played well enough down the stretch — hitting .290 with five homers and 17 RBIs — to position himself as a starter entering this season.

He hasn't disappointed. Heading into regional play, Matthews is batting .317, fourth-best on the team, with 11 doubles, seven home runs and 29 RBIs.

"My focus was to go out and play my game," Matthews said. "I know what I'm capable of doing. I'm not going to let obstacles get in my way."

He understood he needed to cut down on his strikeouts, use his speed more by putting the ball in play, use the whole field at the plate and continue to work on his defense. Holbrook notes that he has done all of these things, especially working on his bunting to take advantage of what opposing defenses give him.

But he has not taken advantage of his speed in the base-stealing department, with four stolen bases in six attempts. This summer he's headed to the Cape Cod League to play for Cotuit manager Mike Roberts, the former UNC coach and father of former USC and current Baltimore Orioles standout Brian Roberts, a superb base-stealer.

"Coach Tanner wanted me to play for him for that reason," Matthews said.

Matthews, who struggled last summer in Maine, has learned it's not always possible to win matchups solely with his athleticism. He used that disappointment to fuel him this season.

"Baseball is a game of failure," Holbrook said. "He's doing a better job this season of handling the tough moments."

He didn't have many tough times at White Knoll, where his younger brother, Mark, a rising senior outfielder, played on a Class 4A state championship team this season.

"We've been quite busy. It's baseball only for us," said Pam Matthews, Adam's mom. "Our neighbors here thought about putting a 'For Sale' sign in our yard. We're never at home. But it's been a good year, busy but definitely exciting."

Exciting is the best way to describe Matthews' play for the Gamecocks.

"He's the biggest freak of an athlete I've played with, football, basketball and baseball," junior outfielder Whit Merrifield said. "He can hit balls over the batter's eye (in center), and he runs like a deer. It's unbelievable some of the things he can do."

That Matthews finally has begun to harness his talent, as exhibited during his eight-hit series against Florida, has the coaches eager to see where he can go from here.

"He has made a really big jump. He's certainly more polished than he was at this time last year," Holbrook said. "Next year he'll be more polished."

If he continues to add polish, expect pro scouts to line up to see him. But for now he is staying focused on making a long postseason run with the Gamecocks (43-15), who begin NCAA regional play against Bucknell on Friday.

"I love playing with these guys and what we've accomplished so far," Matthews said. "We want to keep winning and make it to Omaha."

If they're going to get there, they'll need some of his power and speed.

## Morris: Cooper not flashy, but he wins

### As scouts watch opposing ace, USC star does his thing

No fewer than 11 major-league scouts cocked their radar guns behind home plate Saturday night at Carolina Stadium. To a man, the scouts were there to record every pitch thrown by Asher Wojciechowski, The Citadel's junior wonderboy whose mid-90s fastball will make him a high draft pick this week.

Wojciechowski did not disappoint. He struck out 11 South Carolina batters and was virtually untouchable until his gas gauge dipped to near empty as the sixth inning flipped to the seventh.

Before Wojciechowski threw his 132nd and final pitch, USC had touched the fire-balling right-hander for seven runs on nine hits. The numbers clearly belied Wojciechowski's performance. He lived up to his billing until USC batters wore him out by consistently working him deep into counts.

More importantly, Wojciechowski became another of college baseball's big-gun pitchers who fell to the mule of USC's pitching staff, Blake Cooper.

Cooper does not have the flash of a Wojciechowski, just as his stuff paled in comparison to Vanderbilt's Sonny Gray, Mississippi's Drew Pomeranz and Drew Smyly of Arkansas.

"You've got to be impressed with what he's done. He's the underdog," USC coach Ray Tanner said. "He's pitched against the big guys, the guys who supposedly have the great futures. He's the guy who hopes to get drafted somewhere and gets a chance to play pro ball."

Just as he did in all of those previous three matchups, Cooper notched another victory on his belt that counts 11 for the season. He won again in the same manner he always wins.

The guy defines workmanlike.

He labored through 7 1/3 innings, scattered six Citadel hits, permitted four runs — none of which was earned — walked three and struck out a career-high 12. At no point did Cooper look unhittable. Few Citadel batters looked foolish swinging at his slants.

What Cooper did was keep The Citadel off-balance. He threw curveballs when hitters were expecting fastballs. He threw sliders when fastballs were expected. He mixed in an occasional changeup. His fastball, which seldom reached 90 mph, zipped by hitters at the most opportune of times.

"He's a four-pitch guy," Tanner said. "People know that, so they have to respect that, and it makes it more difficult to bunch a lot of hits against him."

Cooper worked up and down in the strike zone. He worked in and out. He may never pitch a day of professional baseball, but he proved again Saturday night that he is one of the finest pitchers in college baseball.

"His slider is so tight, and obviously with the success he's had the slider's been so tight our guys just couldn't pick it up," said Fred Jordan, The Citadel's coach. "We tried to adjust as well as we could. He did to us what he's done to 11 other opponents. He just kind of carved us up."

Jordan said The Citadel "wobbled" Cooper in the fifth inning when Bryan Altman stroked a line drive over the left field wall for a three-run homer. That gave The Citadel a 4-2 lead and Cooper appeared to be on the ropes.

Instead, Cooper bounced back and allowed only one harmless single. When he followed that single with a walk with

one out in the eighth inning, Cooper was done for the night. He threw 118 pitches, only a handful of which were hit solid by The Citadel batters.

The win was the 32nd of Cooper's four-year career, placing him sixth on USC's all-time list. With a run to the College World Series, Cooper could climb to third in wins.

Years from now, Cooper's name will not likely be mentioned in the same vein as Kip Bouknight or Tim Lewis or Earl Bass, three of the Gamecocks' all-time greats. But to those who saw him pitch Saturday night, he will be remembered as a pitcher who simply would not lose.

It is the way he has pitched through most of his career, and certainly in each of his 16 starts this season. And, as has happened following each of his home appearances, Cooper departed to a chorus of "Cooooooooooooop" from USC fans. It has become as much a signature call for Cooper as that tight slider that continues to slip past opposing batters.

## Notebook: Marzilli making his mark

### Freshman comes through in the clutch in late innings

Evan Marzilli probably has made a case to see more playing time for the remainder of the postseason.

The true freshman from Cranston, Rhode Island made his ninth start of the season in the regional opener against Bucknell on Friday night and went 2-for-3. His sixth inning two-run home run ignited the Gamecocks' rally from 5-1 down. USC scored six runs after Marzilli's home run but he was pulled for a pinch-hitter in the seventh inning.

That wasn't enough to earn the start against The Citadel, but he came through in the clutch again. Adam Matthews struck out twice in three plate appearances, so with two runners on and one out in the seventh inning, South Carolina coach Ray Tanner turned to the left-handed hitting Marzilli to face Bulldogs ace Asher Wojciechowski.

Wojciechowski balked Bobby Haney and Scott Wingo to second and third during the at-bat and Marzilli worked it to a full count before delivering a breaking ball to centerfield for a two-run single.

In a seven at bat stretch, Marzilli has five hits with a home run and four RBI.

### Blessing from rain

Virginia Tech coach Pete Hughes was visibly upset when the Hokies elimination game against Bucknell was halted because of inclement weather for nearly two hours in the second inning.

He felt like he had wasted starter Mathew Price after the sophomore threw one inning before rain halted play for 104 minutes. Hughes decided against bringing Price back after the long delay and turned to three seldom-used relievers in the 16-7 victory.

But Price has shown the ability to bounce back quickly. He threw three innings against Georgia Tech on a Saturday before rain stopped play. He was able to come back the next day and throw four more innings to earn the victory.

But Hughes said he would be cautious with his decision.

"I'm going to see how he feels (Sunday)," Hughes said. "I'll never, ever run a kid out there if there is any soreness or anything. We'll wake up and see how his arm feels and I will tell you we will err on the side of caution."

Price threw 17 pitches in bottom of the first inning and said he probably would be eager to get back out there.

"I know every pitcher is dying to get out there and I'm no exception," Price said. "I'm definitely dying to get back out there but it's going to be up to coach to see what he feels is best for the team."

### Rating the facility

You can mark down Bucknell catcher B.J. LaRosa as one person who came away from this weekend impressed with the two-year old Carolina Stadium.

Since Bucknell was the designated home team, they were able to go the weight room and sit out the rain delay. Virginia Tech retreated to their bus and watched NCAA Regional games in the delay.

"I think that is the nicest facility I've ever been in," LaRosa said of the USC weight room.

### Dueling K's

Asher Wojciechowski took the Division I lead for strikeouts on the season with 11 against the Gamecocks. Drew Pomeranz of Mississippi and Chris Sale of Florida Gulf Coast were tied for the lead with 146 apiece but Wojciechowski took the lead with a second inning strike out of Bobby Haney.

The junior right-hander that is expected to be a first or supplemental round pick in the major league draft also leads the country in innings pitched with 125 2/3.

Blake Cooper matched Wojciechowski on the strikeout side with a career-high 12 strikeouts. That was a season-high by a USC pitcher this year.

Virginia Tech won its first NCAA Tournament game since 1999 with the victory over Bucknell. ## Morris: For Whit Merrifield, father knows best

Bill Merrifield's All-American baseball career at Wake Forest fell short of every college player's dream. He never played in the College World Series, although his ensuing professional career ended in Omaha.

Merrifield entered the visitor's dugout at Omaha's Rosenblatt Stadium in late summer of 1988 with a set of X-rays in his hands. A broken foot had sidelined Merrifield. With a pregnant wife, Kissy, at home, Merrifield's professional baseball career was at a crossroad.

"I'm done," Merrifield told Toby Harrah, Oklahoma City's manager in the Class AAA American Association. "I want to be a parent, a father and a husband. I don't want to just ride around the country anymore."

Twenty-one years later, the reason for Merrifield's retirement from the sport he so dearly loved aims to present him with the ultimate Father's Day present . . . a return trip to Omaha. It would bring full circle a father-son bond formed through baseball and fulfilled each day Whit Merrifield puts on a South Carolina uniform.

"He's never been to the College World Series," Whit says of his father. "He wants to go, but he doesn't want to go as bad as I want to go. It will be a nice treat for him, for us to get to Omaha."

Bill Merrifield took a six-year hiatus from baseball upon retiring from the pro game. Not until Whit began playing T-ball did Dad return to the game, and he has been his son's personal coach and hitting instructor since.

Dad has not missed one of Whit's games this USC season. Every right turn to the dugout following an out has led Whit to spotting Dad in the stands.

"He'll make a motion to me to do something," Whit says. "Move your hands back, stay behind the ball. It's scary how much he knows. He knows my swing better than I do."

At summer camps between his high school seasons, Whit called Dad to report his daily at-bats.

"I flew out to right twice on lazy fly balls," Whit recalls telling his dad on occasion.

"Your elbow is probably coming up, so put it back down and you'll hit that line drive to right field," Dad would respond.

Invariably, the next day's report would include a couple of line drives to right field.

"I hate it when I'm right," became the traditional refrain from Dad. "I hate it when I'm right."

Merrifield has been right about his son's play all along, from the Little League fields in Advance, N.C., to the high school diamond at Davie County High in Mocksville, N.C., to his three-year career at USC.

Unlike many college players, Merrifield was not a budding superstar from the get-go. His lack of size — he finally hit triple digits on the scale in the eighth grade — prevented Whit from standing out from the crowd on any baseball field. It kept him mostly on the bench next to his dad, the coach, on an 11-and-under AAU team.

"If you don't start for your dad, you're not very good," Bill says of Whit, who constantly heard from his dad to learn the game's fundamentals until he "grew into his body."

Whit's growth spurt came between the seventh and eighth grades, when he shot up from 5-foot-4 to 5-10. Then he "ballooned" to 160 pounds by his freshman year of high school.

That's when he experienced the defining moment of his playing career. He was the game's most-undersized

catcher in middle school, mostly because no other kid was tough enough to get behind the plate. Then, in ninth grade, he tried out for the JV team at second base.

"I think I made the varsity," Bill recalls his son saying during the ride home from the final tryouts.

"What do you mean, you think you made the varsity?"

"Well, I couldn't understand what the coach said."

The coach was Mike Herndon, who says he recognized in Whit a player whose skills far exceeded many of the seniors on his Davie County High team.

The following day, Whit showed up for the opening JV game of the season.

"Coach, my jersey's not here," Whit recalls telling Herndon.

"That's because you're on the varsity team, and the bus is about to leave."

Merrifield made the bus, started at second base and batted ninth. Davie County opened against Alexander Central High, which started all-state pitcher Matt Payne, who was on his way to N.C. State.

Payne retired the first eight Davie County batters before Merrifield lined the first pitch he saw for a single to right field. In his next at-bat, Merrifield doubled down the right-field line. His were Davie County's only two hits of the game.

Herndon immediately marveled at Merrifield's baseball mentality. He maintains no other Davie County player in his 13 years has ever matched Merrifield's baseball IQ. That was on full display during Merrifield's junior year, when Davie County faced Northwest Guilford in the third round of the state playoffs.

A couple of Merrifield miscues aided a Northwest Guilford rally that tied the game at 5 in the top of the seventh inning. Determined to atone for his errors and win the game, Merrifield led off the bottom of the inning with a single, stole second, stole third and scored when the throw from the catcher bounded off his helmet into the stands.

"We always talked about how smart a player he was," Herndon says, "and that was one instance where he really used his head."

Prior to his senior year, Merrifield attended a camp at USC and played AAU baseball. He caught the attention of Ray Tanner, USC's coach, during one game played in 100-degree heat. Tanner says while other players were wilting in the sun, Merrifield beat out bunt singles and stole five bases.

Tanner liked Merrifield before he saw him play. Tanner was an assistant coach at N.C. State when Bill Merrifield twice earned ACC Player of the Year honors as a shortstop at Wake Forest.

"When I heard, hey, Bill Merrifield's got a son, my first impulse was, 'We've got to get him,' " Tanner says. "His dad played with tremendous intensity. . . . It was a high level of intensity, but passionately, not stressfully. I loved his approach."

Tanner also believes in good gene pools, and Whit is the son of a pair of outstanding athletes. His mother, Kissy, was a five-time South Carolina state singles champion in tennis while growing up in Florence. She was an all-region performer at Wake Forest.

It took some time to persuade Kissy and her parents that USC was the right place for Whit to play baseball. Louis and Gladys Hite raised their daughter to be a Clemson fan. Whit was reared a Wake Forest and ACC fan. He grew up helping his dad, an executive with ISP Sports in Winston-Salem, with promotions at Wake Forest football and basketball games.

Over a meal at a California Dreaming restaurant, Merrifield committed to Tanner and USC. Then he made the dreaded phone call to his grandparents.

"Are you sure? Is it too late to de-commit?" Whit recalls Louis Hite saying. "If you de-commit, if you change your mind, I'll pay your full education, the rest of your scholarship to Clemson."

Three years later, his entire family has converted to being USC fans, and Merrifield has become one of the top all-around players in school history. Should he return for his senior season, Merrifield likely will set school records for hits and runs scored in a career.

What distinguishes Merrifield is his ability to do everything well, both at the plate and in the field. According to Allan Simpson of Perfectgame.com, professional scouts like that all of Merrifield's five tools are average to above-average. Because he does not have one tool that projects to being major-league caliber, Merrifield likely will go between the seventh and 10th rounds of next week's Major League Baseball draft, according to Simpson.

If so, Merrifield is not likely to receive the kind of signing bonus that will move him into professional baseball. A senior season would allow Merrifield and his father the chance to continue their pre-game ritual. Before every game's first pitch, the two always meet near the USC dugout, exchange handshakes and hugs befitting a pair of best friends.

The exchange usually includes one last hitting tip from dad to son following Whit's batting practice. For now, the two hope their custom continues for a couple of more weeks and they can do the same at Rosenblatt Stadium in Omaha.

Father's Day is June 20, the second day of the College World Series.
