### FOR STARTERS

The University of South Carolina baseball team makes its 13th trip to the NCAA Super Regionals this weekend, as the Gamecocks will face No. 5 Arkansas in the Fayetteville Super Regional. The bestof-three series starts on Saturday, June 9 at 6:30 p.m. EDT (5:30 p.m. CDT). The series continues on Sunday, June 10 at 3 p.m. EDT (2 p.m. CDT). The if necessary third game will take place on Monday, June 11 at 7 p.m. EDT (6 p.m. CDT).

Saturday's game will be televised on ESPN2 while Sunday and Monday's contests will be on ESPN with Dave Neal, Ben McDonald and Chris Burke on the call. Every game will be on the IMG Gamecock Radio Network with Derek Scott and Tommy Moody on the call.

The Gamecocks swept through the Greenville Regional this past weekend, defeating Ohio State, host East Carolina and UNC Wilmington to advance to Super Regional action.

### SCOUTING ARKANSAS

The Razorbacks also went 3-0 in their home regional, defeating Oral Roberts (10-2), Southern Miss (10-2) and Dallas Baptist (3-2). Kacey Murphy, Jared Gates, Carson Shaddy, Casey Martin, Heston Kjerstad and Dominic Fletcher all made the Fayetteville Regional All-Tournament team. In the championship game against Dallas Baptist, Gates was 2-for-2 with two runs scored while Jake Reindl pitched seven innings of relief, striking out four to earn the win. Kjerstad, the SEC Freshman of the Year, leads the Razorbacks with a .344 average, 14 doubles and 13 home runs. Blaine Knight, Saturday's starting pitcher, is a perfect 11-0 with a 2.74 ERA.

### SERIES VS. ARKANSAS

Arkansas leads the overall series with South Carolina 40-32, with four of those meetings occurring during the College World Series. The two teams played each other this season in a three-game series in Fayetteville and once in the SEC Tournament. Carlos Cortes' two-run home run in the fifth inning was the difference in a 3-2 win over Arkansas on April 12. Eddy Demurias picked up the save in that win, striking out three in 2.1 innings pitched. After Friday's game was postponed due to rain, the two teams played a pair of seven-inning contests, with Arkansas coming out on top 2-0 and 3-0. The Razorbacks won, 13-8, in the SEC Tournament on May 23 as LT Tolbert had four hits and drove in five runs.

### SUPER REGIONAL HISTORY

South Carolina has a 17-13 overall record in Super Regional play, winning the best-of-three series in 2002, 2003, 2004, 2010, 2011 and 2012. The last time the Gamecocks were in a Super Regional was in 2016, when they lost a pair of home games to Oklahoma State. The last time the Gamecocks were on the road for Super Regionals was in 2013 at Chapel Hill, N.C., falling in three games to North Carolina. ### GAMECOCKS WIN GREENVILLE REGIONAL

South Carolina went 3-0 in the Greenville Regional, defeating Ohio State (8-3), East Carolina (4-2) and UNC Wilmington (8-4) to move on to the Fayetteville Super Regional. Danny Blair was named the Greenville Regional Most Valuable Player, as his three-run home run in the seventh inning against Ohio State gave the Gamecocks a 3-2 lead. Cody Morris pitched a career-high 7.1 innings in the win over East Carolina, while Eddy Demurias earned a win against Ohio State and pitched three innings of relief in the championship game against UNC Wilmington. Blair was joined on the All-Tournament team by Morris, LT Tolbert, Justin Row and Carlos Cortes.

### BLAIR THE HERO OF THE REGIONAL

Danny Blair came into the Ohio State game as a defensive replacement, but became way more than that on his way to being named Most Valuable Player of the Greenville Regional. Blair belted a three-run home run in the seventh inning to give Carolina a 3-2 lead on its way to an 8-3 win. The next night against East Carolina, Blair had three hits and he capped the week with a pair of runs scored in the UNC Wilmington win. Blair moved his average up to .245 on the season.

### MORRIS DELIVERS IN ECU WIN

Cody Morris earned the win on Saturday, June 2 against East Carolina, pitching a career high 7.1 innings with seven strikeouts while allowing just five hits and two runs scored. Morris has been lights out his last three appearances, earning two wins with an 0.84 ERA and 24 strikeouts in 21.1 innings pitched.

### TOLBERT NAMED TO SEC ALL-TOURNA-MENT TEAM

LT Tolbert was named to the All-SEC Tournament team after hitting .538 (7-for-13) with a double, triple, home run, three runs scored and five RBI in Carolina's three tournament games. He had career-highs of four hits and five RBI in the game against Arkansas (May 23) and tripled and scored the game-tying run against LSU (May 24) that sent the game to extra innings. Tolbert opened the tournament with a pair of hits and a run scored in the 4-2 win over Missouri (May 22).

### GAMECOCKS WIN FIFTH STRAIGHT SEC SERIES

South Carolina picked up its fifth straight SEC series win, taking 2-of-3 games at Texas A&M on May 17-19. It is the first time the Gamecocks have won five straight conference series since 2012.

### MORRIS NAMED SEC PITCHER OF THE WEEK (MAY 14)

Cody Morris earned SEC Pitcher of the Week honors after his performance against Missouri on May 13. Morris tied his career high with 10 strikeouts in a career-best seven innings of work as the Gamecocks defeated the Tigers, 1-0, on a walk-off home run in the bottom of the ninth on Sunday. Morris was dominant after the first inning as he did not allow a runner in scoring position after that inning. Morris had a strikeout in all seven innings he pitched and lowered his ERA to 4.22. He has 69 strikeouts in 64 innings pitched to go along with six wins.

#### **GLOVE WORK**

The Gamecocks are currently fielding .982, good for seventh in the country and second in the SEC. Carolina has committed just 40 errors on the year and no individual has more than seven errors this season. Hunter Taylor has thrown out 21 base runners trying to steal this season.

### CARLOS WALKS IT OFF VS. MISSOURI

Carlos Cortes belted a solo home run on the first pitch he saw in the ninth, breaking a scoreless tie and giving the Gamecocks the 1-0 win over Missouri Sunday, May 13. It was Cortes' 14th home run of the season and Carolina's second walk-off win of the campaign. It also was Carolina's first 1-0 win since a 2014 victory over Brown on March 9.

#### COMEBACK KIDS

South Carolina came back from deficits in four conference games in a three-week span, including twice at Vanderbilt (April 27-29). Carolina was down 6-0 in the fifth inning to LSU on April 22 but rallied for an 8-6 win by scoring eight runs from the sixth through eighth frames. In Friday's win at Vandy, Carolina was down 7-0 after three inning, but scored twice in the fifth and six in the sixth to earn the 8-7 win. Then on Sunday at Vandy, Carolina came back from 4-0 and 9-6 deficits, scoring seven runs in the final three frames.

### **OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION VS. OLE MISS**

The Gamecocks belted out 42 hits and scored 29 runs in the three-game series vs. Ole Miss (May 4-6). Carolina scored 13 runs on Friday and came back with 11 on Saturday, marking the first time Ole Miss had given up double-digit runs on back-to-back days since the end of the 2010 season. The Gamecocks had 15 hits on Friday, with Justin Row going 4-for-4 on his birthday.

### BULLPEN COMES UP BIG AT VANDY

The South Carolina bullpen had a big hand in taking the series at Vanderbilt April 27-29. TJ Shook pitched 3.1 hitless innings on Friday, striking out five to earn the win. In fact, the bullpen held Vandy hitless for 6.1 frames on Friday. On Sunday, Graham Lawson recorded the final six outs in a 10-9 win. Lawson picked up his first win of the year while Eddy Demurias had a pair of strikeouts in four innings of relief.

#### GAMECOCKS BREAK OUT THE BROOMS AGAINST LSU

South Carolina outscored No. 19 LSU 30-10 and hit .355 with 13 extra-base hits in a threegame sweep April 20-22. Carolina earned its first-ever sweep over LSU in Columbia and third sweep overall. The Gamecocks swept the Tigers in back-to-back years in 2005 and 2006 in Baton Rouge. Logan Chapman helped the Gamecocks to an 11-0 win on Friday, striking out six in 6.2 innings pitched. TJ Hopkins also had a big week, hitting .467 with six RBI in his return to action from injury. Carolina picked up its third shutout of the season in Friday's win. In fact, Carolina held LSU without a run for the first 16.1 innings of the series. It was Carolina's third series sweep in 2018 and second in conference play (Tennessee on March 29-31).

### CHAPMAN NAMED SEC CO-FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK (APRIL 23)

Logan Chapman was named the Southeastern Conference's Baseball Co-Freshman of the Week, it was announced Monday afternoon (April 23). Chapman helped the Gamecocks to a sweep of No. 19 LSU this past weekend. Chapman, who made his second career SEC start, shut out the Tigers on Friday night in an 11-0 win, striking out six and allowing just two hits, one that got out of the infield, with six strikeouts and a pair of walks. He set a career-high with 6.2 innings pitched and tied a career high with the six punchouts. After hitting the first batter of the game, Chapman settled down to retire the next seven batters.

### **ROW STEPPING UP IN SEC PLAY**

Senior Justin Row leads the Gamecocks with a .357 batting average in conference play and he stepped up big in the 8-6 win over LSU on April 22. Row made a brilliant play in the field for the third out of the first inning. He then tied the game at six in the seventh frame with a two-run home run. Row has 35 hits in SEC play with nine doubles, two home runs, nine RBI and a .510 slugging percentage.

### SC IN THE SEC LEADERS

Adam Hill is second in the SEC in opponent's batting average (.191) and is tied for seventh in strikeouts with 98. Jacob Olson is tied for second in the league with 20 doubles. TJ Hopkins is tied for seventh in the conference with 14 stolen bases, while LT Tolbert is tied for fourth with four triples. Eddy Demurias is tied for fourth with 29 appearances on the mound. Madison Stokes is eighth in the league with a .587 slugging percentage. In SEC play, Justin Row is fourth with a .357 batting average.

### HILL NAMED A NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK

South Carolina junior pitcher Adam Hill has been named a National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball, the publication announced this afternoon (Monday, March 5). Hill earns a national award after being named SEC Pitcher of the Week last Monday.

Hill, a righty from Anderson, S.C., was magnificent for a second straight week, helping South Carolina to a 3-2 win over Clemson on Friday night. Hill struck out 14 batters in a no-decision, giving up two runs and two hits with two walks. It was Hill's second straight 14-strikeout performance, which ties his career-high and also tied his Founders Park record. Hill struck out seven consecutive batters from the first through third innings. That tied a school record which he shares with Alex Farotto (3/25/2007 vs. Mississippi State) and George Beam (3/4/1972 vs. N.C. State). Hill earned the Tom Price Award after Sunday's game against Clemson. The award is given to South Carolina's Most Valuable Player in the series.

#### HOPKINS, WILLIAMS STEP UP IN CLEMSON THRILLER

A pair of upperclassmen gave Carolina the offense it needed in a 3-2 win over Clemson on Friday night (March 2) at Founders Park. With the Gamecocks trailing 2-1 in the bottom of the eighth, fifthyear senior Matt Williams stepped up in a pinch hitting role and belted his fourth career home run in the South Carolina bullpen, tying the game at two. Then in the ninth, Jonah Bride walked and moved to third on a failed pickoff attempt. Hopkins brought pinch runner Danny Blair home with a sacrifice fly for the walk-off win.

### HILL NAMED SEC PITCHER OF THE WEEK (FEB. 26)

South Carolina junior pitcher Adam Hill has been named the Southeastern Conference Pitcher of the Week, the conference office announced Feb. 26.

Hill was downright dominant in a 7-0 win over Charleston Southern on Friday night. The junior righty set a Founders Park record with 14 strikeouts while not allowing a hit, walk or run to pick up his 11th career win as a Gamecock. He broke the old Founders Park record of 13 punchouts, set by Sam Dyson in 2009. The only base runner to reach off Hill was via a fielding error in the sixth inning. Hill had 100 pitches on the night and had two or more strikeouts in six of the seven frames.

This is Hill's second career honor from the SEC. He was named SEC Freshman of the Week on March 14, 2016, after wins over Wofford and Charleston Southern.

### CORTES NAMED BASEBALL AMERICA PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

South Carolina sophomore outfielder Carlos Cortes was named to the Baseball America Preseason All-America third team, the publication announced Jan. 29.

Cortes has been ranked the No. 35 best collegiate prospect for the 2018 MLB Draft by Baseball America. The publication also rated Cortes the No. 25 best prospect in the Cape Cod League last summer. This is the second straight year that a Gamecock has earned Preseason All-America honors by Baseball America. Last year, Wil Crowe was a third-team selection.

### **BRAG FACTS**

South Carolina won the NCAA Division I Baseball Championship in 2010 and 2011 at the College World Series. South Carolina has made 11 College World Series appearances including six times in the last 16 years. In those 11 appearances, the Gamecocks are 32-20 for a .615 winning percentage, that is sixth-best among winning percentage leaders in CWS history. South Carolina is one of five schools in the nation to have reached at least 12 NCAA Super Regionals since 2000. In addition, the Gamecocks own the second-highest win total in Division I baseball since 2000 (826-357 record) and tied for the second-most conference wins since 2000 (321-215 record). South Carolina has ranked among the top five in the nation in total attendance for seven consecutive years including a mark of 258,407 last year. South Carolina averaged a total of 7,177 fans at Founders Park in the 2017 season.

# **#17 MARK KINGSTON** Head Coach 1st season at south carolina - 9th season as head coach North Carolina (1995)

**Mark Kingston** was named the head baseball coach at the University of South Carolina on June 30, 2017. He became the 30th head coach in the history of Gamecock Baseball.

Kingston came to Carolina following a three-year stint as the head coach at USF. He compiled a 100-78-1 record while in Tampa, helping the Bulls to a pair of NCAA Regional appearances. Kingston owns a career mark of 309-204-1 in eight seasons as a head coach, including five at Illinois State,

with four NCAA appearances in that nine-year span. He earned his 300th win as a college head coach on May 4, 2018 in a victory over Ole Miss.

Kingston has helped lead 12 teams to NCAA Tournament berths as an assistant and head coach -- with five of those teams appearing in the NCAA Super Regionals, two participating in the College World Series and one winning a national championship. As a player at the University of North Carolina, Kingston was part of the 1989 Tar Heels squad that won an Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season title and advanced to the College World Series. He also helped UNC win the ACC Tournament and advance to the NCAA Regionals in 1990. As an assistant coach, Kingston helped the Miami Hurricanes capture the 2001 College World Series as the No. 1 overall seed. His 21-year collegiate coaching career also includes stops at Tulane, where he helped guide the Green Wave to the 2005 College World Series, and Purdue.

Kingston guided USF to a 42-19 mark in 2017, the first time since 1996 that the team had reached the 40-win mark. Under Kingston's leadership, the Bulls earned their second trip to the NCAA Tournament in three years. USF won 19-straight games from Feb. 19 - March 22, the second-longest streak in program history. During that streak, USF defeated then No. 3 Florida State in Tallahassee, its first victory against FSU since 1989. On May 9, the Bulls defeated then-No. 5 Florida in Gainesville. It marked the first time in program history that the Bulls beat both FSU and Florida on the road in the same season. The victories were just USF's second and third wins over top-five teams in program history. Kingston reached the 100-win mark at the helm of the program in the Gainesville Regional opener with a 9-1 win over Bethune-Cookman, making him the second-fastest coach in program history to reach 100 victories.

Kingston's Bulls dominated on the mound in 2017, posting a 3.24 team ERA and allowing 7.64 hits per nine innings, both in the top-10 nationally. The pitchers led the country with 10.1 strikeouts per nine innings and set a program record with 620 strikeouts. Offensively, shortstop Kevin Merrell set an American Athletic Conference record with a .384 average, the third-straight year he led the Bulls in hitting. Merrell was named an All-American by four separate publications and was named to the AAC First Team for a second-straight year. He was one of five Bulls named to All-American Athletic Conference teams, the most since 2009. Merrell was drafted by the Oakland Athletics with the 33rd overall pick in the MLB Amateur Draft, becoming the third-highest drafted player in program history. Overall, four USF players were selected in the draft, as Phoenix Sanders went in the in the 10th round to the Tampa Bay Rays, Joe Cavallaro was taken in the 24th round by the New York Mets and Ryan Valdes was selected in the 33rd round by the Pittsburgh Pirates.

In 2016, the Bulls recorded 517 strikeouts, logging back-to-back seasons of over 500 strikeouts for the first time in school history. Merrell posted a team-high .320 batting average and a first-team all-conference selection in the AAC. Pitcher Brandon Lawson also notched over 100 strikeouts on his way to a second-team all-conference honor. The Bulls won two series against ranked teams (No. 25 Michigan State, at No. 22 East Carolina), and had three players drafted - pitcher Tommy Eveld (ninth round, Arizona), pitcher Brandon Lawson (13th round, Tampa Bay), and outfielder Luke Maglich (34th round, Philadelphia).

Kingston made an immediate impact at USF in 2015, leading the Bulls to an NCAA Regional for the first time since 2002. Kingston and his staff increased the Bulls' 2014 win total by seven and earned the team's first NCAA Tournament win in 13 years. Coach Kingston's guidance helped produce four players who were drafted by Major League Baseball clubs, including pitcher Jimmy Herget (sixth round, Cincinnati), pitcher Tommy Peterson (12th round, Washington), infielder Kyle Teaf (30th round, Tampa Bay), and pitcher Casey Mulholland (37th round, Dodgers). Merrell was recognized as a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American, and catcher Levi Borders was named to the Johnny Bench Watch list and was a unanimous selection on The American's First Team. Herget was also named to The American's First Team, and Peterson earned second-team honors. Merrell, first baseman Buddy Putnum, and Teaf were also named to the NCAA Gainesville Regional All-Tournament team.

Kingston came to USF with a long track record as a top-level recruiter and a producer of offensively explosive teams. He spent 2010-2014 as the head coach at Illinois State University, where he led the Redbirds to two MVC regular season championships and one conference tournament title while twice breaking the program's season wins record. He won more than 30 games in each of his five seasons at ISU, a program-record string that included a season-record 39 wins in 2013. He reached the MVC Tournament championship game three times and compiled an overall record of 173-102 (.629 winning percentage). Kingston was twice named a "Rising College Coach" by Kendall Rogers of Perfect Game USA during a five-year tenure at Illinois State (2010-2014) in which he earned MVC Coach of the Year honors in 2010 and 2013 and helped 18 Redbirds earn First-Team all-MVC honors. Two of his players were named MVC

Player or Pitcher of the Year and eight were selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Kingston led ISU to rapid success, as the Redbirds ranked second in conference wins (64) from 2010-14 while posting two first-place finishes and no worse than a fourth-place conclusion in the MVC. His overall winning percentage of .629 and average of 35 wins per season were a strong improvement over previous seasons. ISU's average RPI rating of 69.50 from 2010-13 ranked fifth among all northern Division I programs and Kingston's recruiting classes contained 15 players ranked in the Top-20 in the state of Illinois by Prep Baseball Report, more than any other university.

He took over the ISU program after serving one season as the team's associate head coach and promptly posted the most successful first-year head coaching stint in program history. Kingston led the 2010 Redbirds to their first-ever share of the MVC regular-season title, their first MVC Tournament title since 1994 and their first NCAA Tournament victory since 1976. ISU's 32-24 record was the most wins for the Redbirds since 1999.

In 2011, Kingston guided the team to a then-record season win total (36-18), including a marquee victory at Miami (Fla.), and placed seven players on the All-MVC team. The following year (2012) ISU went 33-19 and posted a 10-game win-streak, the program's longest since 1984. Closer Kenny Long was selected by the Houston Astros in the 22nd round of the MLB First-Year Player Draft, marking three-consecutive seasons in which a Redbird was selected in the MLB draft.

In 2013, Kingston guided ISU to a program-best 39 wins (39-19), posted a school-record 12-game winning streak, won the MVC outright for the first time in school history and set a Valley-record with eight first-team All-MVC selections. Offensively, ISU paced the MVC in batting average, on-base percentage, slugging percentage and home runs and the pitching staff fired a program-record 13 complete games, including 10 shutouts.

Prior to his stint at ISU, Kingston was part of 500 wins (500-279-2) in 13 seasons as an assistant coach and was widely respected as one of the top assistants in the nation. He spent the previous seven years at Tulane University, serving as recruiting coordinator throughout his tenure and as associate head coach the final five seasons with the responsibility of overseeing recruiting, coaching hitters and developing catchers and infielders.

At Tulane, Kingston's recruiting and coaching efforts helped the Green Wave to six postseason appearances, two NCAA Super Regionals and a berth in the 2005 College World Series. The 2005 Green Wave team was seeded as the top team overall while also receiving the top academic honor in Omaha. Tulane averaged nearly 42 wins per season with Kingston on staff.

Kingston recruited or coached seven players who became All-Americans at Tulane, including James Jurries (2002) and Michael Aubrey (2003). The Green Wave sluggers became the first hitters in 18 years to hit .400 for the season and both earned Conference USA Player of the Year recognition. Aubrey was selected by the Cleveland Indians 11th overall in 2003, the highest Tulane player ever taken in the draft.

Prior to Tulane, Kingston spent two years at Miami (Fla.), where he helped the Hurricanes capture the 2001 College World Series as the No. 1 overall seed. While at Miami, the Hurricanes finished with top-five school single-season marks in batting average, runs scored and slugging percentage, and led the nation with 228 stolen bases in 2001. In the run to the 2001 national title, the 'Canes had an NCAA-best 17-0 run to end the season and set a College World Series record with 12.3 runs per game while hitting .373 as a team in Omaha.

Kingston spent one year as an assistant at Illinois State, helping the 1999 Redbirds set then-school records for wins in a season (35), runs scored, RBI, doubles, hits and walks, while finishing second in school history in home runs, total bases and batting average.

Kingston began his coaching career with two seasons at Purdue, helping the Boilermakers post three of the top-seven batting averages in school history and place five position players on the All-Big Ten team after not posting any the year before his arrival.

A 1995 graduate of North Carolina with a degree in communications, Kingston was part of the 1989 Tar Heels squad that won an Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season title and advanced to the College World Series. He also helped the team win the ACC Tournament and advance to NCAA Regionals in 1990 as a sophomore. Kingston received the Trippe Bourne "Most Dedicated Player" Award for his outstanding work ethic and leadership during his junior campaign, and was named a team captain his senior season.

Drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers out of North Carolina in 1992, the Northern Virginia native played professionally for five seasons with Milwaukee and the Chicago Cubs organizations.

Kingston attended Potomac High School (Virginia), where he developed into a Collegiate Baseball Top-50 Prospect and was drafted by the New York Yankees after leading his team to the 1988 state championship. In 2006, Kingston was inducted into the Potomac Hall of Fame.

Kingston and his wife, the former Letitia Kelly, have three children, Kailyn Grace, Cameron James and Kathryn Patricia. He also wrote and produced two instructional videos for Championship Productions, "Keys to Consistent Hitting" and "Catching Drills and Fundamentals." He also was the only assistant coach chosen to write a chapter in "The Baseball Drill Book" produced by the American Baseball Coaches Association.

### **KINGSTON'S COACHING HISTORY**


