

2005: Teamed with Rodney Martin to form a dynamic sprint duo... competed in the 60 and 200 meters during the indoor season... won the USC Invitational 60 meters with a time of 6.78 seconds... placed ninth in the SEC Indoor Championships in the 60 (6.78) and was 10th in the 200 (21.37)... competed in both events at the Last Chance meet, running a season-best 6.77 to finish second in the 60 and a 21.52 to win the 200... ran both the 100 and 200 meter dashes during the outdoor campaign... won the Tennessee Sea Ray Relays 100 meter dash with a time of 10.30... competed in both events at the SEC Outdoor Championships... placed sixth in the 100 at the SEC meet with a time of 10.42 and was ninth in the 200 with a time of 20.84... also ran the second leg on the 4x100 meter relay at the SEC's helping the team to a season-best 39.66 clocking... ran a personal best 100-meter dash at the NCAA East Regional meet in the prelims with a time of 10.19 seconds... also ran his personal best in the 200 meters at the East Regional, clocking a 20.58 in the prelims before finishing fifth in the finals... had the fourth fastest time in the 100-meter prelims of the NCAA meet with a 10.33 clocking... won his semi-final heat, breaking the tape in 10.41 seconds to earn a spot in the finals... placed ninth in the 100-meter finals with a time of 10.48 seconds, earning an All-America certificate... also competed in the 200 meters at the NCAA Outdoor Championships, reaching the semi-final round... competed in the USATF outdoor meet in late June, raaching the semi-finals in both the 100 and 200 meter dashes.

2003-04: Competed for Kansas City (Kan.) Community College... was the Junior College national runner-up in the 200 meters with a time of 20.95... coached by Al Hobson... top marks were 6.77 and 21.67 indoors and 10.42 and 20.95 outdoors... also considered LSU, TCU, Florida and Tennessee before signing with the Gamecocks.

HIGH SCHOOL: Graduated from Lasalle High School in South Bend, Ind... lettered in track, basketball, and football... was a three-time state champion... best marks were 10.37w in the 100 and 21.11w in the 200... coached by Johnnie Johnson.

Jonathan Fortenberry Sprints Sr./Sr. 6-1 Marietta, Georgia (Marietta)

SIX-TIME ALL-AMERICAN

Six-time All-American sprinter returns for his senior season... missed the 2005 campaign with injuries... had a great fall and looks to have regained the form he displayed early in his collegiate career... figures to be a regular on both relays... was the 2003 USTCA Southeast Indoor

co-Athlete of the Year, a two-time SEC champion and was an NCAA champion... also a 2002 World Junior gold and silver medalist.

2005: Was unable to compete as he worked his way back from a severe Achilles' injury.

2004: Redshirted due to an Achilles' injury.

2003: Named co-Southeast Region Athlete of the Year (with teammate Otukile Lekote) for the indoor season by United States Track Coaches Association... opened the indoor season with first-place finish in the 400m at George Mason Early Invitational... established a school record with time of 46.19 en route to first-place finish in the 400m at SEC Four-Way Meet... topped 400m field at Florida Invitational... took second in the 400m at the Meet of Champions in New York... finished second in the 400m at the SEC Indoor Championships with a mark of 46.38 after pacing the field during preliminaries... made a late charge on anchor leg to lead 4x400m relay team with Kenneth Ferguson, Otukile Lekote and Otis Harris to the SEC Championship... placed fourth at the NCAA Indoor Championships in the 400 and helped lead the 4x400 team to a third-place finish and school-record time of 3:05.10 while collecting two All-America honors... outdoor season was plagued with injuries... won the 400m dash at the Weems Baskin Sprint Relays... finished eighth in the 400m dash at the SEC Quad Meet... finished second in his heat at the SEC Championships in the 400m dash qualifying him for the finals, but did not run in finals due to injury... ran the anchor leg of the 4x400m relay team that finished third at the NCAA East Regional with a time of 3:07.26... won his heat of the 400m dash at the NCAA East Regional then went on to place fifth in the finals despite competing injured... qualified for NCAA Outdoor Championships and competed in 400m preliminaries, but did not advance due to injury... qualifier for the U.S. Outdoor Championships.

2002: During the indoor season, finished second in the 400m dash at the UNC Early Invitational and was on the winning 4x400m relay team at the same meet... finished second in the 400m dash at the Five Way SEC Meet... finished eighth in the 400m dash at the SEC Championships and ran a leg on the bronze medal-winning 4x400m relay... ran on USC's 4x400m relay that finished third at the NCAA Indoor Championships, clocking a 3:05.90 to break the school record to earn his first All-America certificate... outdoors, finished third in the 400m dash at the Four Way SEC Meet and at the Georgia Tech Invitational... finished second in the 400m dash at the Florida Relays and at the Spec Town

Relays... finished fifth in the 400m dash at the Sea Ray Relays... was on the winning Sprint Medley Relay at Penn Relays - combining with Thomas Lewis, Otukile Lekote and James Law to win the race with a time of 3:06.25... placed sixth in the 400m dash at the SEC Championships... ran the anchor leg of the 4x400m relay that won the SEC title, breaking a nine-year old SEC record at 3:02.81... ran the anchor leg of the NCAA Champion 4x400m relay – crushing the field with a 44.4 split where he wore his jersey backward for 'good luck'... team ran a 3:02.16 to shatter the school record they broke earlier in the season ... finished ninth in the 400m dash at the NCAA Championships and collected another All-America honor... moved to No. 3 on USC's all-time 400m list, posting a career-best 45.67 at the NCAA meet... finished second in the 400m dash at the USATF Outdoor Junior Championships... qualified for the World Junior Championships in the 400m dash and as a member of the USA's 4x400m relay... finished third in the 400m at the Canada vs. USA dual meet... won the silver medal in the 400m at the World Junior Championships in Jamaica... ran the anchor leg of the USA's gold-medal winning 4x400m relay.

HIGH SCHOOL: Graduated from Marietta High in Marietta, Ga... was a two-time high school All-American... named the Georgia Track Athlete of the Year in 2001... was the national champion at the Junior Olympics in the 4x400m relay with an anchor leg split of 45 flat with the team running a 3:09.1... was a four-year Cobb All-County Track member... was the 1999 Golden South champion in the 800 meters and was a four-time Georgia state champion... led his team to the state title in 2000 and 2001... named the *Marietta Daily Journal* Athlete of the Year and the *Atlanta Journal Constitution* Athlete of the Year in 2001... was the Georgia Dome Indoor champ in the 400m and 800m in 2000 and 2001... 2001 Meet of Champions in Mobile, Ala. 400m champ and record holder in the 400m... was the 1999 Junior Olympic National Champion in the 800 meters... high school team set the national record in the Swedish medley with a time of 1:25.


2005: Focused on the 60-meter hurdles during the indoor season during his freshman campaign... posted his first win at the Clemson Invitational with a time of 7.81 seconds... finished fourth in the 60m hurdles at the Meet of Champions and came back with a third place finish at the USC Invitational... ran a 7.75 in the prelims at the SEC Championships to earn a trip to the finals, where he finished third, breaking the tape in 7.77 seconds... won the Last Chance Meet with a time of 7.83 seconds... ran a 7.73 60m hurdles in the prelims of the NCAA Indoor Championships to earn a spot in the national finals... took the bronze medal and earned his first All-American certificate with a season-best time of 7.70 seconds... ran both the 110-meter and 400-meter hurdles during the outdoor season... finished second in the 110m hurdles at the Penn Relays with a time of 13.76 seconds and was third in the 400m hurdles with a time of 51.57 seconds... turned in a time of 13.73 in the 110m hurdles at the NCAA East Regional meet... qualified for the NCAA Outdoor Championships in the 110m hurdles... had the sixth fastest time (13.79) in the prelims and the third fastest time in the semis (13.68) to earn a spot in the finals... garnered his second All-American certificate with a personal-best time of 13.50 in the finals to take the bronze medal behind Florida's Josh Walker (13.39) and Ole Miss's Antwon Hicks (13.42).






