

# 2007 Season In Review

Coming off the disappointing 2006 season when the Gamecocks had a losing record for the first time in nearly a quarter of a century, expectations were tempered for the 2007 season. But things took off quickly for South Carolina and rose to heights not seen in a decade in the Palmetto State. The Garnet and Black came together and advanced into the Super Regional round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time in program history. Though they eventually fell to Northwestern, the Gamecocks pushed their way back onto the national stage for everyone to see.

The squad opened the year with a seven-game winning streak. The first five came in the Florida Atlantic Miken Tournament in Boca Raton, Fla., as the Gamecocks downed Pittsburgh and

balanced by losses to Memphis and FSU.

The stumble was just momentary though, as the Gamecocks went on a tear. An eight-game winning streak started at the College of Charleston and continued through the first game of the Charlotte doubleheader. In that span, South Carolina swept through its Gamecock Invitational and took doubleheaders from the Cougars and the Camels of Campbell. The skein came to a screeching halt in game two against the 49ers.

However, the schedule was kind to Carolina. There was barely time to be disappointed, as the Gamecocks played the next day in a doubleheader against Pitt. Pitcher **Melissa Hendon** made sure that the Gamecocks would not fall in the first game, as she tossed the program's first perfect game in 10 years, propelling USC to a 1-0 victory. **Kate Pouliot** followed Hendon's brilliance with an almost-matching performance, as she allowed only one run and one hit in the second game.

The sweep of the Panthers was followed by six more wins to put Carolina's record at 23-3, with wins over Coastal Carolina, a three-game sweep over Arkansas and a 2-1 victory over Virginia Tech and the Hokies' All-American hurler, Angela Tincher. But the Hokies turned the tide in game two to take a 5-1 triumph.

North Florida with back-to-back shutouts on the season's first day. Saturday was a little tougher, as Carolina needed extra innings to push past Miami (Ohio) and the host Owls. USC claimed the tourney crown with a second victory over FAU.

Carolina came home to get a victory over Western Carolina before heading south again, this time to Tallahassee for the Florida State University Sunshine State Tournament. Things were a little tougher further north, as Carolina went 2-2 on the weekend. Wins over Kansas and Jacksonville were

The Southeastern Conference schedule makers did not do the Gamecocks any favors from there, as next up were two of the best teams in the conference and, at the time, the top two ranked teams in the land. South Carolina gave both Alabama and Tennessee all they could handle, but in the end, the Crimson Tide would sweep the weekend series, while the Lady Vols captured both games of the doubleheader. The five games saw Carolina lose twice, 1-0, and by two runs in the other three games.

With a six-game losing streak in progress, the Garnet and Black stepped out of conference for a pivotal doubleheader against in-state rival Winthrop. The Eagles garnered a 2-0 win in game one before the Gamecocks bounced back with a 2-0 victory behind Pouliot.

Stopping the losing streak was good, but the Gamecocks badly needed wins to improve their SEC record from its 3-5 state. A series in Starkville against Mississippi State came next, but the results were the same. The Bulldogs got three one-run victories in a row, including an 8-7, eight-inning decision in the final game of the series.

Reeling, Carolina had another tough test ahead down in the bayou. The Gamecocks took the fight to LSU, however, in game one of the three-game set, taking a 2-1 victory over the fifth-ranked Tigers. LSU came back to take the next two games, but the win over the Purple and Gold seemed to bring new life and confidence to the Gamecock dugout.

USC returned home with that newfound spark to take on SEC Eastern Division rival Georgia. The Gamecocks got a sweep over their closest league foe, including a thrilling 1-0, 10-inning victory that ended when **Becky Martinez** singled home **Adele Voigt**. Hendon was named the SEC Pitcher of the Week after getting the "W" in all three games against the Dogs.

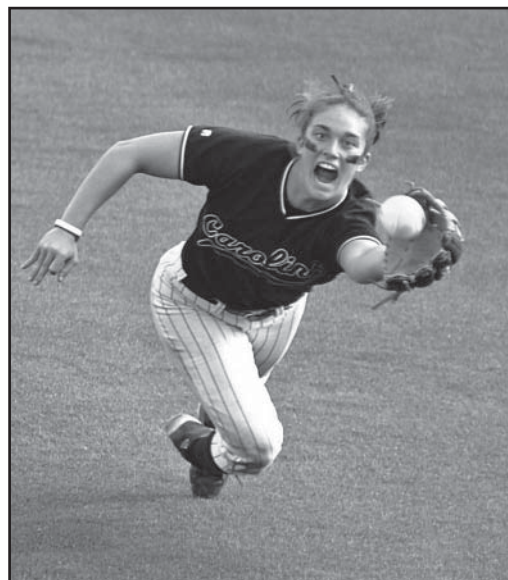
Before continuing SEC action, the Garnet and Black hosted the battle of the Carolinas, as the Tar Heels came to Beckham Field for a single, mid-week game. North Carolina got the 1-0 victory, but that didn't slow the Gamecocks' rise.

South Carolina hosted former USC assistant coach Eileen Schmidt's Kentucky squad. The Gamecocks swept past the Wildcats to even their SEC record at 10-10 with eight games to go.

A mid-week doubleheader against Florida was disappointing to the Gamecock faithful, as the Gators romped past Carolina by a

combined 18-0 in the sweep. A trip to the Alabama plains did not right things for the Garnet and Black, as the Auburn Tigers swept South Carolina.

After not scoring in five consecutive games, the Gamecocks were ready to play at home against Mississippi. It was Alumni and Senior Weekend in Columbia, but the Rebels did not lay down for Carolina. A 1-0 shutout by Ole Miss threatened to put a damper

on all the celebrations, but the Gamecocks would rebound. Back-to-back 1-0, extra-inning triumphs gave Carolina new life before it headed back to Auburn for the SEC Tournament.

The seventh-seeded Gamecocks drew No. 2-seed LSU in the opening round, and Carolina pushed the Tigers to the limit.

The extra-inning affair wrapped up in the 10th when LSU got a sacrifice fly with one down to capture the 2-1 victory. With a shaky 12-16 record in SEC play, head coach Joyce Compton and the Gamecocks came back to Columbia not knowing if there would be another chance in 2007.

The NCAA Softball Selection Committee not only gave Carolina a berth into the 2007 tournament field, they awarded a regional to Columbia as well. However, the Gamecocks were the fourth seed at their home site, as national No. 15-seed North Carolina State, 20th-ranked Oregon and Penn State all received trips to the Palmetto State for the weekend.

The Gamecocks came out ready in game one, stunning the Wolfpack with a 5-2 victory behind a three-run home run from **Jaqueline Wetherbee**. Carolina, in the winner's bracket, next had to face Pac-10 power Oregon on Saturday.

The Ducks would not suffer the same fate as N.C. State. An 8-4 defeat at the hands of Oregon sent the host Gamecocks to the loser's bracket for a rematch against the Wolfpack, with the victor advancing to Championship Sunday.

Down 3-1 in the bottom of the fifth, the Gamecocks had runners at first and third with catcher McKenna Hughes stepping to the plate. Instead of facing Carolina's all-time home run leader, N.C. State elected to intentionally walk her to face Jessica Josker. The San Jancinto, Calif., outfielder made the Wolfpack pay, smacking a three-run double to give the Garnet and Black the lead. Carolina held on from there to advance to the regional's final day.

Needing two victories over No. 20 Oregon for South Carolina's first regional championship since 1997, the Gamecocks came out ready. Josker once again did the damage, getting an RBI single to give USC the lead in the third. **Lindsay Walker** followed that up with a fielder's choice that scored Voigt. That 2-0 lead proved to be enough, as Hendon held the Ducks to one hit the rest of the way to force a second championship game.

In the rubber game, Oregon ran out to a 3-0 lead. Things looked bleak for Carolina. In the sixth, **Lisa Longo** led off with a walk, but she was forced out on a Voigt ground ball. Hughes lined out, bringing up Josker. She singled the other way, moving Voigt to third. Walker followed her with another opposite-field single to bring in Voigt. **Ashton Payne** followed with her fifth triple of the season, bringing in two runs to tie up the game going into the final frame.

The Gamecocks allowed a lead-off runner to the Ducks but kept her on the basepaths to set up the ninth-inning heroics. Hendon reached first on an error, but her presence was eliminated by Wetherbee's fielder's choice. Longo followed with a double, moving pinch-runner **Tori Martin** to third. Oregon got Voigt to ground out, getting to two outs. The Ducks elected to walk Hughes again to face the red-hot Josker, and she made them pay again. The single went to center to bring home Martin and send Carolina to its first Super Regional in program history with a 4-3 victory.

There, Carolina would go up against Northwestern at the Wildcats' home in Evanston, Ill., just outside of Chicago. The Gamecocks enjoyed some time in the Windy City before facing the nation's No. 2 seed.

Nerves may have played a factor in the first game, as Carolina made an uncharacteristic three errors in the 6-1 loss. Walker tried to lead a comeback charge with a seventh-inning homer, but the spark didn't catch. The second game saw Northwestern's Eileen Canney hold Carolina to two hits again to lead the Wildcats to a 3-0 win and a berth in the Women's College World Series.

Despite the setbacks in Evanston, the season was definitely a success for Carolina. The program now looks to capitalize on that momentum and continue climbing back up the ladder nationally and in the Southeastern Conference.
