A highly successful collegiate golfer, former tour professional and accomplished instructor, Bill McDonald was named South Carolina head men's golf coach in the summer of 2007 after one season as the Gamecocks' associate head coach. During the 2006-07 season under then-head coach Puggy Blackmon, McDonald helped South Carolina to its first NCAA

Regional title and its best showing in the NCAA Championship since 1998.

"I have wanted to coach college golf for many years, and it is a dream come true to have that opportunity at the University of South Carolina," McDonald said. "I feel so fortunate that I have my long-time mentor and coach, Puggy Blackmon, to call on and continue to learn from. Puggy has taught me to dream big and to always strive for greatness. I truly enjoy the process of working with college golfers and seeing them mature in all areas of their lives gives me a tremendous amount of satisfaction. I feel like my experiences playing the game at a high level and teaching it as well have helped me communicate with our players during my time here."

"Having coached and worked with Bill for over 20 years, I am excited that Bill is heading up our men's program," Blackmon said. "His background as a player and teacher coupled with his enthusiasm, knowledge and competitiveness should make him one of the nation's premier coaches in a short period of time. We share a common vision and commitment to bringing an NCAA Championship to South Carolina."

McDonald opened his first season as a head coach with a bang as the Gamecocks tied for first at the season-opening Carpet Capital Collegiate and took fourth at the Callaway Golf Match Play event to close the Fall 2007 campaign. South Carolina went on to finish in the top four in five of its six spring events, including a second-place

showing at the SEC Championship. It was the Gamecocks' first top-five finish at the conference event since 2003 and the highest placing by the program since the 1998 squad also took second place.

His second season at the helm proved to be an even-bigger success. The Gamecocks tied a school record by winning four tournament titles - Mason Rudolph Invitational, Rees Jones Intercollegiate, Schenkel E-Z-Go Invitational, Cavalier Classic - and returned to the NCAA Championship at Inverness Club in Toledo, Ohio. A tie for second at the NCAA Southeast Regional in Sorrento, Fla., propelled the Gamecocks to the national tournament for the third time in four years.

Coming to the University was actually a return to Columbia for McDonald. He began his teaching career as the director of instruction at the University Club (now Cobblestone Park) from 1996 to 1998. McDonald left Columbia to get back to his home state as an instructor at The Atlanta Golf Center in Norcross, Ga. until 2000. During his final year in that position, he helped design and build the City Club Golf Academy, a driving range and golf academy on a land fill near downtown Atlanta, then was the director of instruction at the facility until 2003. McDonald left that venture for another start-up organization as he was a founding partner and instructor at the Atlanta-based company Accelerized Golf. In 2006, he was named director of instruction at Cartersville Country Club, where he remained until joining the Gamecock staff.

During his 10 years of teaching, McDonald was well-known around the Southeast for his ability to develop junior golfers into college players. He coached more than 50 girls and boys that went on to receive college scholarships. In 2005, McDonald was a featured instructor on The Golf Channel's "Your Game Night."

McDonald got his coaching start as an assistant to Blackmon at Georgia Tech in 1994-95. That season the Yellow Jackets, who finished second in the ACC Tournament, qualified for their seventh-straight NCAA Regional and advanced to the NCAA Championship in Columbus, Ohio. McDonald's focus with the team, which featured winner of the Fred Haskins and Jack Nicklaus Awards Stewart Cink, was on recruiting, physical conditioning and helping to develop the team's depth. McDonald helped recruit and sign Carlton Forrester, who went on to become an All-American.

McDonald played his college golf for Blackmon at Georgia Tech (1985-88) where he was the runner-up at the 1988 NCAA Championship and a two-time All-American (1985, 1988). As a senior in 1988, his second-place finish helped the Yellow Jackets to seventh in the team standings, then the highest finish in school history. McDonald went on to compete professionally from 1989 to 1994, playing in South Africa and Canada and several PGA Tour and Nationwide Tour events.

Still an active player, McDonald has competed in three PGA Professional National Championships (2003, 2004, 2006) and won the Big Oak Putter Classic in 2006. In addition, he has been a top-10 player in the Georgia PGA Section for the last five years.

McDonald, who earned his bachelor of science in industrial management in 1989, was inducted into the Georgia Tech Sports Hall of Fame in 1995. He has been a member of the Professional Golfers' Association of America since 2002. McDonald and his wife, Tanya, are the parents of two boys, Trace (5), and Tyler (3).



During a four-year career that began in 1985, McDonald was a two-time All-American at Georgia Tech and, according to PGA pro Scott Verplank, was the "best ball-striker I've ever seen."

Puggy Blackmon

Director of Golf :: Carson-Newman, 1973 :: 16th year at South Carolina

After 12 seasons at the helm of the South Carolina men's golf program, Puggy Blackmon was named director of golf in July 2007. Blackmon, who was inducted to the Golf Coaches' Association of America Hall of Fame in 2005 and the Georgia Tech Hall of Fame in 2008, is now the unifying presence for Carolina golf, sharing his wealth of knowledge with both the men's and women's teams. His experience building both successful teams and players will help both teams continue to improve and compete at a national level. Since the 2008-09 season, Blackmon has spent the bulk of his time as an assistant coach for the women's team, implementing a short-game program that led the Gamecocks to their first NCAA Regional title in 2010.

As a head coach at South Carolina and Georgia Tech, Blackmon steered his teams to 23 straight trips to NCAA postseason, including all 12 seasons he coached the Gamecocks. At South Carolina, eight of his 12 NCAA Regional berths resulted in NCAA Championship appearances. South Carolina golf won nine team tournament titles in Blackmon's tenure, including the 2007 NCAA West Regional. The Gamecocks have spent a considerable amount of time in the national polls, including a No. 3 national ranking in 1999 and fourth in 2000.

Under Blackmon's tutelage, Gamecocks captured 11 individual titles, including five from All-American Kyle Thompson. Six golfers earned 10 All-America honors, and 11 Gamecocks were named to 17 All-Southeastern Conference first or second teams. Blackmon also coached two SEC Freshmen of the Year (Mark Anderson, 2005 and Eric Ecker, 1998) and an SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year (West Streib, 2005).

In Blackmon's final season at the helm of the men's program, the team celebrated with a victory at the 2007 NCAA West Regional, during which the team's total of 820 shattered the school record for a 54-hole tournament by 25 strokes. In arguably the most important event of the season, Blackmon's golfers posted just two scores over par among the 15 rounds played. George Bryan IV led the way en route to PING All-Southeast Region and honorable mention All-America honors at season's end.

Blackmon's players excelled academically as well. The men's golf team posted the highest team grade point average of any of the school's men's programs for three consecutive semesters in the spring of 2005, fall of 2005 and spring of 2006. Former Gamecock Lars Cederqvist was named a 2000 CoSIDA Academic All-American as a senior after maintaining a 4.0 in mechanical engineering throughout his collegiate career. Eight different golfers have earned 10 GCAA All-America Scholar honors while 40 players have been named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

In addition to serving as director of golf at South Carolina, Blackmon serves as swing coach for PGA Tour players David Duval and Kyle Thompson.

Before coming to Carolina on June 5, 1995, Blackmon coached Georgia Tech to five Atlantic Coast Conference Championships, 11-consecutive NCAA Championship appearances and 34 team tournament titles.

During his 12-year tenure at Georgia Tech, Blackmon built the Yellow Jacket program into one of the most successful and dominant in college golf. At that time, only six other college golf programs had matched his program's 11 straight trips to the NCAA Tournament. Blackmon's Tech squad finished runner-up at the 1993 NCAA Championship, and he led the Ramblin' Wreck to five top-seven national finishes. His Georgia Tech teams either won or finished second in the ACC Championship nine times.

A four-time ACC Coach of the Year (1984, 1985, 1992, 1993), three of Blackmon's former golfers finished second at the NCAA Championships, and his players at South Carolina and Georgia Tech combined for 31 individual tournament crowns. Blackmon coached 31 All-Americans at Tech and Carolina and two national players of the year in the 1990s at Tech. Duval, a four-time All-American, was the 1993 National Player of the Year, while Stewart Cink, the 2009 British Open Champion, was named the 1995 National Player of the Year.

Blackmon has coached 30 All-SEC or All-ACC performers in his tenure, while five of those individuals -- Bob McDonnell (1985), David Duval (1991, 1993), Mikko Rantanen (1994) and Eric Ecker (1998) -- were conference medalists. The Yellow Jackets won the ACC team title in 1985, 1991, 1992, 1993 and 1994, while Carolina was runner up by one stroke at the 1998 SEC Championship -- USC's best finish ever. In addition, Blackmon coached his teams to 43 tournament titles and finished his coaching career with a streak of 23 straight postseason appearances at Carolina and Georgia Tech.

Blackmon has also proven to be an effective fundraiser, which is a role he has expanded as director of golf. At Carolina, Blackmon has orchestrated and raised funds for the Wardle Golf House, South Carolina's state-of-the-art teaching facility, and a complete renovation of the on-campus short-game facility. His creation of "Cock N' Fire" and "Head Ball Coach" wines have raised over \$250,000 for the purchase of a conversion van and two mini-vans for the team's travel. Blackmon also spearheaded the efforts that raised \$1.2 million for endowment of his team's scholarships at Georgia Tech.

Born William Dempsey Blackmon III on Dec. 9, 1950, in Beaufort, S.C., he is a 1969 graduate of Ridgeland High School. Blackmon played collegiately at Carson-Newman College, where he received his bachelor of arts in business administration in 1973. He was chosen one of the Outstanding College Athletes of America in 1971 and 1973. After receiving his master of science in economics from Clemson in 1977, Blackmon worked for six years in the golf resort operations and development field in Florida.

Blackmon and his wife, Gail, also a Ridgeland native, have three children: a daughter, Ashley, and two sons, Jordan and Tate. Ashley, a South Carolina and Medical School at South Carolina graduate, is a physician in Columbia and is married to Jared Jones; the couple has a daughter, Bailey Gail. Jordan is a USC graduate and pursuing a film career in California, and Tate is a current student at Midlands Tech.

Michael Burcin

Assistant Coach :: 7th year at South Carolina

Michael Burcin became an assistant coach for both the men's and women's golf teams for the 2007-08 season after serving on Puggy Blackmon's men's golf staff for the previous three seasons, including two as an assistant coach. He returns to the men's golf staff full-time for the 2010-11 season.

In addition to assisting coaches with day-to-day coaching duties, Burcin's primary role is to implement and coordinate a recruiting program conducive to winning championships. He also monitors the strength and conditioning programs for both sports as well as overseeing the continued development of The Players Club, which is made up of former men's and women's golf letterwinners.

"It is a tremendous opportunity to work with both programs," Burcin said. "Our women's program is in a position to join the men as a national power. I had the pleasure of spending two years learning from Hall of Fame coach Puggy Blackmon, and I absorbed all I could about recruiting and how to work with players. With what I've already learned in recruiting for the men's team, I look forward to working with the women's program and helping to make both programs fixtures on the national scene."

The winner of the 2010 Golf Coaches Association of America's Jan Strickland Assistant Coach of the Year award, given to the top men's golf assistant coach, Burcin helped the men's team to a school-record four tournament titles and a berth in the NCAA Championship in 2008-09. The women's side advanced to the 2008 NCAA Championship, the first appearance by the Gamecocks since 2003.

"During the past few years, Michael has stepped in and handled a lot of different roles and responsibilities efficiently," director of golf Puggy Blackmon said. "He is

anxious to learn and has been an integral part of our success. Michael is quickly evolving as one of the top assistants in the country."

Burcin joined the Carolina men's golf staff as a volunteer assistant in Fall 2004 and was made a full-time assistant in Spring 2005. His responsibilities included recruiting, managing a club for former Gamecock Lettermen and the day-to-day activities of the program.

Upon the arrival of men's golf associate head coach Bill McDonald, Burcin assumed the position of director of golf operations for the 2006-07 season. In that role, he coordinated team travel, ordered and monitored the inventory of team equipment and served as the liaison to the strength and conditioning and compliance offices.

Burcin is the men's golf liaison for the academic staff, and the team has achieved at least a 3.3 grade point average in each semester and combined for a new record of 3.543 in the Fall 2006. In addition to coaching, Burin's other duties included arranging all travel, scheduling and serving as the liaison to the strength and conditioning and compliance offices.

Before coming to South Carolina, Burcin spent seven years as a golf professional in Lancaster, Pa. His last stop in Pennsylvania involved developing an indoor teaching program at a retail golf store in Lancaster. While in Lancaster, Burcin kept an active playing schedule of section and chapter PGA events.

Originally from Salina, Kan., Burcin graduated from Lampeter-Strasburg High School in Lampeter, Pa., where he was a 10-time letterman in three sports.

A member of the Golf Coaches Association of America, Burcin and his wife, Dr. Michelle Burcin, who was a standout swimmer at the University of Cincinnati, reside in Columbia.

ROCKY FACE, Ga. – South Carolina fired its best round of the three-day Carpet Capital Collegiate on Sunday, but dropped two spots to fifth place as the Gamecocks wrapped up their first tournament of the 2009-10 season. South Carolina, ranked 15th in the preseason coaches' poll, shot 289 (+1) in the final round at The Farm Golf Club near Dalton, Ga., and finished at 872 (+8) for the week.

Patrick Rada, a senior from Anderson, S.C., turned in his second straight round of 2-under 70 to tie for 11th place, earning a tie for 11th place at 215 (-1) for the week. He would bogey the first hole in his final round, but would not card another over his final 17 holes while adding birdies at Nos. 8, 11 and 15 to finish at 2-under for the day, 1-under for the tournament. It marks the best finish for Rada since his tie for ninth place at the Mason Rudolph Invitational last season.

Paul Woodbury, who was 4-under for the week coming into today, ran into big trouble on holes 10 and 11, making double-bogey on both to finish with a 4-over 76. He would finish at even-par 216 for the tournament and tied for 14th place, a vast improvement from his 83rd-place showing a year ago.

George and Wesley Bryan both had their best rounds of the week with matching scores of even-par 72. Wesley was up-and-down on the day with four birdies, two bogeys and a double-bogey, and George had a similar round with four birdies and four bogeys. The brothers from Chapin, S.C., finished tied for 29th place at 221 (+5).

Tolleson, making his first collegiate appearance, had his best round of the week Sunday with a 75 (+3). He finished tied for 47th.

FRANKLIN, Tenn. – South Carolina's 10th-ranked men's golf fired a final-round 282 (-2) to finish at 556 (-12) and tied with Middle Tennessee State for first place at the rain-shortened Mason Rudolph Intercollegiate, but fell to the Blue Raiders in a sudden-death playoff for the tournament title. Senior Patrick Rada led the team for the second straight week, turning in a career-best performance to tie for second place overall at the Vanderbilt Legends Club.

Rada shot rounds of 67-69=136 (-6) to finish in a tie for second place overall, a career-best showing for the Carolina senior. After a birdie at the second hole, he went bogey-double bogey on the next two holes to get to 2-over. But from there on, he was nearly flawless. A birdie at No. 7 made him 1-over at the turn, and then he countered a bogey at the 11th by making birdie on four of his last five holes to get to 2-under for the day. It marks the best 36-hole total of Rada's career and the first time he has ever posted consecutive rounds in the 60s.

Redshirt freshman Clint Tolleson was especially impressive, tying for 10th place in just his second collegiate event after rounds of 68-71=139 (-3). Like Rada, Tolleson had trouble in the early-going with a bogey at the first and a double at the fifth. But he would remain bogey-free the rest of the day, carding birdies at the eighth, 11th and 18th to shoot 34 on the back nine and finish at even par for the day and 3-under for the tournament.

Tolleson was one of three Gamecocks to post even-par rounds on the day. George Bryan IV made the turn at 1-under with two birdies and a bogey on the front nine, then carded two bogeys and a birdie on the back to shoot 71. Paired with his 69 on Friday, Bryan IV finished at 2-under for the week, tied for 16th place.

The event was shortened to 36 holes after heavy rains forced the cancellation of Saturday's second round. The teams played 18 holes on Sunday.

FRANKLIN, Tenn. — South Carolina's men's golf team sprinted away from the rest of the field at the Rees Jones Intercollegiate, winning by an unprecedented 37 shots to claim the top spot in the event for the second straight year. Seniors Paul Woodbury and George Bryan IV tied for individual medalist honors at 2-under, and two of the remaining three Gamecocks finished in the tournament's top 10.

With the victory, South Carolina has now claimed at least a share of first place in six of its last 14 tournaments (dating back to the 2008 Mason Rudolph Intercollegiate) more than any other SEC school in that time span.

It almost seemed like a repeat of last year's Rees Jones Intercollegiate. In that event, Woodbury shared the individual title with Wesley Bryan and the Gamecocks ran away with the title, winning by 21 strokes. This time, it was older brother George Bryan IV turning in a round of 69 (-3) to make up a three-shot deficit on his teammate to earn a share of the championship. Woodbury finished the day at even par and turned in rounds of 74-68-72=214 to equal Bryan at 2-under for the week.

The showdown between the two Gamecock seniors came down to the final hole. Bryan got off to a hot start with a bogey-free front nine that included birdies at holes 5, 8 and 9 to make the turn at 3-under. Woodbury, meanwhile, made the turn at 1-under for the day, still clinging to a one-stroke lead. Both Gamecocks would bogey the 11th hole, but then Woodbury's birdie at the 12th increased his lead to two shots. Bryan would birdie the 15th to pull within one shot of Woodbury, then would take the lead after Woodbury made double-bogey at the par-4 16th. However, Woodbury would recover with a birdie at the 17th to pull back even with Bryan, and both players made par at the 18th.

It marks the second medalist finishes for both players. Bryan's previous win came at the 2008 Schenkel E-Z-Go Invitational, while both of Woodbury's victories have come at the Rees Jones.

WINDERMERE, Fla. — Senior George Bryan IV and sophomore Wesley Bryan earned top-10 individual finishes at the Isleworth Collegiate Invitational, leading South Carolina's men's golf team to an overall sixth-place showing, their best ever at the prestigious event at Isleworth Country Club.

The Gamecocks shot 295 (+7) on Tuesday to finish at 898 (+34), 14 strokes better than their performance in the same event last year. The sixth-place showing was also significantly higher than the 2008 event, when South Carolina finished 16th in the 18-team field. Carolina's round on Tuesday was the second-best of the day, only three shots behind Georgia's 292 (+4).

George Bryan IV turned in his second straight top-10 finish, shooting 70 (-2) on Friday to jump up to fifth place at 218 (+2) for the tournament. The native of Chapin had one of only four rounds under par on the day, carding only one bogey in his final 18 holes to go along with three birdies. It was the ninth top-5 finish of Bryan's career, moving him into a tie for third place in school history with Eirik Johansen.

Wesley Bryan shot 74 (+2) on Friday to move up two spots to a tie for seventh place, giving the Gamecocks multiple top-10 finishers for the third time in four fall events. Bryan had a mostly consistent round with two birdies and two bogeys, marred only by a double-bogey at the ninth hole. It marks the fourth top-10 finish of Bryan's career.

Also closing strong for South Carolina was senior Paul Woodbury. The native of Lake City improved by six strokes in his final round, posting a 73 (+1). Woodbury made the turn at 2-over after an opening birdie followed by three bogeys, but then made up ground on the back nine with two birdies against only one bogey.

WILMINGTON, N.C. – With inclement weather moving through eastern North Carolina on Tuesday morning, the final round of the Seahawk Intercollegiate was canceled, giving No. 7 South Carolina a runner-up finish at the weather-shortened event. The Gamecocks shot 588 (+12) in the first 36 holes Monday at the Country Club of Landfall's Nicklaus Course to take the second spot behind tournament champion Augusta State.

Sophomore Wesley Bryan was the top finisher for the Gamecocks, shooting 73-71=144 (E) and finishing in a tie for sixth place. TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – Senior Paul Woodbury earned South Carolina's second individual medal of the 2009-10 season while the Gamecocks came up one stroke short of host Florida State in a wild finish at the Seminole Intercollegiate on Sunday.

Woodbury won a four-hole playoff to defeat Florida State senior Seath Lauer to claim the tournament title after the pair tied at 212 (-1) through 54 holes. After playing the par-4, 427-yard 18th hole three times without a winner, Woodbury carded a par on his fourth try to outduel the Seminole senior captain for the tournament victory at Southwood Golf Course.

Woodbury began the day in a tie for seventh place at 1-over, but posted a 33-36=69 (-2) in the final round to move up to a first-place tie. He was solid throughout the day, battling heavy winds to card three straight birdies on the sixth, seventh and eighth holes to make the turn at 3-under, then had only one blemish on his card with a bogey at the 13th. It was the lowest 54-hole score in the Lake City, S.C., senior's career, and he will add this tournament medal to a pair of first-place ties at the 2008 and 2009 Rees Jones Intercollegiate events.

South Carolina posted a 289 (+5) for the second straight day to finish at 866 (+14), good enough for a solid second-place finish. But it ended up being much closer than previously thought. One of Florida State's top players signed an incorrect scorecard and was disqualified, forcing the Seminoles to take its highest score of the day - a 78 that otherwise would have been dropped. The resulting nine-stroke swing shrank the margin from 10 strokes to just one as the Seminoles barely held on for the tournament title at 865 (+13).

STATESBORO, Ga. – South Carolina shot its best team round of the week on Sunday, but the Gamecocks were unable to move up the leaderboard as they finished 10th at the Schenkel E-Z-GO Invitational. The Gamecocks shot 292 (+4) on Sunday to post a three-day total of 878 (+14).

George Bryan IV and Paul Woodbury tied for 15th place individually at 217 (+1) for the week. Bryan IV had the team's low round Sunday with a 71 (-1) while Woodbury posted a 73 (+1). Bryan IV went 35-36 on the day with two birdies and a bogey on his front nine, then made bogey at the first (his 10th) to drop back to even. He would respond with an even-par back nine to finish at 1-under for the day.

Bryan, after tying the then-course record with a 64 (-7) in Monday's second round, had an up-and-down round on Tuesday that finished at 1-under 70. He didn't have a par until the seventh hole after a four-birdie, two-bogey start, and a couple of tough breaks on the ninth hole gave him a bogey to drop to 1-under at the turn. He would also bogey the 11th to drop to even, but it would be his last of the day as a birdie at the short par-4 16th pushed him to 1-under. His total score of 209 (-4) was the second-best of his collegiate career and earned him a seventh-place finish, his fourth top-10 of the season.

Senior Paul Woodbury had the strongest round of the day on Tuesday, carding a 2-under-par 69 to move up to a tie for 32nd place. He was consistent throughout the round, including back-to-back birdies at nine and 10, and he drained a 35-footer for birdie at the 18th to close his week. George Bryan IV closed with a 73 (+2) to tie with Woodbury at 32nd place, and Clint Tolleson shot 77 (+6) on the final day.

AUGUSTA, Ga. – South Carolina seniors George Bryan IV and Paul Woodbury tied for third place at the Administaff Augusta State Invitational on Sunday, leading the 17th-ranked Gamecocks to a second-place team finish with a sizzling 833 (-31) at Forest Hills Golf Club.

The Gamecocks shot 281 (-7) on the final day to get to an incredible 31-under-par for the tournament, but amazingly still finished 16 shots behind tournament host and third-ranked Augusta State, who shot 817 (-47) for the week. South Carolina's score of 833 was the fourth-lowest in school history after Carolina posted a school-best 18-hole score of 266 (-22) in Saturday's second round.

All five players in the Gamecock lineup finished at par or better for the week, led by Bryan IV and Woodbury at 206 (-10). Bryan posted rounds of 72-65-69 for the week to turn in his best score of the season by eight shots and earning his third top-five showing in 2009-10. Bryan had just one bogey on the day and carded four birdies to record his second straight round in the 60s. Woodbury broke par for the fifth consecutive round, going 69-67-70 for the week with a four-birdie, two-bogey effort - including a stretch of three straight birdies to start his back nine - on Sunday.

Wesley Bryan followed up his 65 on Saturday with a 71 (-1) on Sunday, finishing at 208 (-8) for the week and tied for ninth place. It marks the sophomore's sixth top-10 finish of the season. Bryan made the turn at 2-under after birdying the sixth, seventh and ninth holes, then dropped back to 1-under after bogey at the lengthy par-4 11th. He would then sandwich a pair of bogeys between birdies at 14 and 17 to stay at 1-under for the day and at par or better for all three rounds of the tournament. Freshman Clint Tolleson finished under par for the week at 214 (-2), tied for 28th place after an even-par round of 72 Sunday. Senior Patrick Rada improved by a stroke each day of the tournament, shooting 71 (-1) Sunday to finish at even par for the week; an eagle at the 17th got him under par for the day.

ST. SIMONS ISLAND, Ga. – South Carolina senior golfer George Bryan IV tied for the individual SEC Championship on Sunday after posting a three-day total of 204 (-6), but fell in the second hole of a sudden-death playoff to Georgia's Russell Henley. The Gamecocks shot 864 (+24) as a team and finished in ninth place overall.

Bryan IV held a three-shot lead at one point during his round as he was 7-under for the tournament through 17 holes in his final round. A bogey at the 18th hole dropped him to 2-under for the day, 6-under for the week. Meanwhile, Henley put together a bogey-free round of 67 (-3) after starting the day tied for third place, one shot back of Bryan IV and Alabama's Hunter Hamrick. He was 1-under for the day after 13 holes, about the time Bryan was heading up the 18th fairway. But back-to-back birdies at 14 and 15 got Henley to 6-under and a tie for the lead, necessitating the playoff.

It was the second time since South Carolina joined the Southeastern Conference in 1992 that the Gamecocks had an individual earn at least a share of medalist honors. Eric Ecker was the SEC medalist at the 1998 championship.

The rest of the team, however, did not fare as well as Bryan IV. Senior Paul Woodbury was the next-highest finisher at 215 (+5) to tie for 18th place in his first SEC Championship appearance. In Sunday's round, Woodbury made the turn at even par after one bogey and one birdie on the front nine, then stood 1-over after 14 following a pair of bogeys and a birdie shortly after the turn. A double bogey at the 16th, however, dropped him to 3-over for the day.

Wesley Bryan also made the turn at even par for the day, but five bogeys on the back nine left him with a 75 (+5) in his final round, 220 (+10) for the tournament and in a tie for 38th place. Patrick Rada shot 78 (+8) in the final round to finish at 229 (+19) for the week, and Clint Tolleson struggled to an 85 (+15) on Sunday to finish at 235 (+25) overall.

Georgia won the team title for the second straight year, posting a three-day total of 844 (+4) to hold off last-day charges from Florida and Ole Miss, which both finished at 849 (+9) and posted rounds of 3-under on the day. Arkansas fell to fourth at 853 (+13).

Following Henley and Bryan IV, Mississippi's Jonathan Randolph took third place at 206 (-4) after being the only player in the field to post three rounds in the 60s. Alabama's Hunter Hamrick and LSU's Andrew Loupe tied for fourth place at 207 (-3).

NEW HAVEN, Conn. – South Carolina stormed back to contention in the final round of the 2010 NCAA East Regional but fell four strokes short of fifth place and an NCAA Championship team berth at the Course at Yale University on Saturday.

The Gamecocks fired a 276 (-4) on the final round as a team, led by seniors George Bryan IV (-4) and Paul Woodbury (-3). The elder Bryan spread five birdies out over his last 14 holes, including back-to-back at the turn on holes one and two. Woodbury scored the only eagle on the weekend for a Gamecock on No. 16 and stood at three-under on the course's back nine. He balanced two bogeys with two birdies on the front nine to close out the day with a 67.

Sophomore Wesley Bryan ended the day at 71 (+1), while freshman Clint Tolleson closed the team scoring at 72 (+2). Bryan played brilliantly through 17 holes, with birdies at 14, 16, one, five and seven before ending the day with his 71 after a nine on the par-three ninth. Tolleson got his 72 with birdies on one and five while posting double bogeys on 15 and seven. Senior Patrick Rada shot an 86 in the final round.

The Bryans finished tied for sixth at three-under 207 for the weekend, while Woodbury was among eight people tied for eighth at two-under 208. It's the first time in program history that three student-athletes finished a regional event in the top 10. The Bryans both improved on their tie for 14th in last year's southeast regional in Sorrento, Fla., while Woodbury was playing in his first NCAA Regional. Rhys Enoch of East Tennessee State tied with Penn State's T.J. Howe at seven-under 203 on the weekend for medalist honors, while Enoch claimed the individual berth in the NCAA Championships.

South Carolina finishes 44-under-par to set course record en route to program's first regional title

GREENVILLE, N.C. — Behind a record-breaking performance, the South Carolina men's golf team claimed a two-stroke victory over UCLA to win the 2007 NCAA West Regional at Karsten Golf Course (Par 72, 7,057 yards) in Tempe, Ariz. The Gamecocks recorded a three-round score of 820 to finish 44 strokes under par and set a course record.

"The guys were focused all week and nothing fazed them," South Carolina associate head coach Bill McDonald said. "I kept talking about winning the tournament, not so much advancing (to the NCAA finals). I wanted them to taste victory. I felt like we were good enough to win earlier in the season. We had some opportunities and didn't get it done. I am proud of the effort they gave."

South Carolina entered the final round one stroke behind regional leader and No. 4 UCLA. The Gamecocks shot 10-under par (278) as a team Saturday to beat the Bruins, who were seven under (281). No. 10 Southern California and No. 18 Arizona State, the regional host, shared third place with a final score of 824 (-40). Fellow Southeastern Conference team Vanderbilt caught fire on Saturday, finishing the third round at 21 under to surge into fifth place.

It was the first regional title for the Gamecocks, who reached the top 10 in three of the previous four NCAA Regionals. In 1999, South Carolina fell just shy of the East Regional title, finishing second in Barrington, R.I., despite Kyle Thompson's individual victory at the event.

The Gamecocks, who entered the tournament as the No. 11 seed, held a slight lead on UCLA for most of the final day, and freshman George Bryan IV's strong finish secured the win. The last player on the course for South Carolina, Bryan eagled No. 17 and sank a 40-foot putt for birdie on No. 18. The Chapin, S.C., product tied for 10th individually with a three-day total of 68-67-69=204 (-12). His tournament total of 204 tied him for fourth place in school history for a three-round individual score and was the best individual performance ever by a Gamecock in regional play. Bryan's 10th-place finish was the best by a Carolina golfer since Thompson won the 2001 NCAA West Regional in Corvallis, Ore.

Sophomore Florian Fritsch and junior Mark Anderson tied for 16th on the individual leader board after posting three-day totals of 206 (-10), which tied for the eighth-best three-round effort in school history. Anderson closed with a 70 (-2) on the final 18 holes, while Fritsch carded a 71 (-1) Saturday.

Sophomore Mark Silvers III fired a final round 69, and junior Warren Thomas posted a 70 on the final 18 holes. Silvers and Thomas both tied for 43rd with a three-day total score of 211 (-5).

"I noticed early on that both teams (South Carolina and UCLA) seemed tight," McDonald said. "It really helped us that Mark Silvers got off to such a good start. He made a couple of birdies early and made the turn at 32 (four under par). I think when our

guys started to see the board and that we had a lead, that really helped. We got a burst of energy on the back nine knowing we had a chance to win.

As a team, South Carolina opened with a round of 273 on Thursday before shooting 269 on Friday. Those scores are among the five lowest rounds in school history. The team victory was the first for South Carolina since capturing the title at the 2005 Bank of Tennessee Intercollegiate (Oct. 15-16). In 2007, the Gamecocks' previous best performance was fourth place on three occasions.

"I told the team in a meeting a little while ago that this will mean more to them as the years go by," McDonald said of winning the title. "It will really mean a lot. To me, it gives our program validity. Instead of just talking about what we want to do, we went out and did it. It will really help from a recruiting and coaching standpoint. The more they win, the more they will believe and expect to play this way. That will develop tradition and have a long-lasting effect."

Mark Anderson

2005 - Third Team • 2008 - Honorable Mention

Mark Anderson put All-American bookends on his career, earning GCAA PING All-America honorable mention status as a senior after picking up third-team honors from the organization as a freshman. In his final season in the Garnet and Black, Anderson turned in seven top-20 finishes, reaching the status in six of the seven tournaments in the spring, to grab a spot on the All-SEC first team for the second time in his career. As a freshman, he also earned first-team all-conference honors and was named the league's Freshman of the Year.

George Bryan IV

2007, 2009 - Honorable Mention • 2010 - Third Team

George Bryan IV joins David Seawell (1994-96) and Kyle Thompson (1999-2001) as the only three-time All-Americans in South Carolina annals. He earned a selection to the PING All-America Third Team in 2010 after being named an Honorable Mention selection in 2007 and 2009. Bryan wrapped up his career this season as one of the most prolific golfers in South Carolina history. His career scoring average of 72.37 stands atop the record books, as does his average of 71.35 for the 2009-10 season. Ranked 39th in the nation in the final Golfweek/Sagarin release, he tied for medalist honors twice during his senior season - including the SEC Championship - falling in playoffs on both occasions. The native of Chapin, S.C., earned four top-five finishes and eight top-20 showings in 11 events this season. For his career, he posted 17 career top-10 finishes in 46 tournaments, ranking fourth in school history.



Michael Christie

1992 - Honorable Mention

Michael Christie was an all-SEC selection and an honorable mention All-American in 1992. He had seven top-10 finishes in tournament play, including a third-place finish at the 1991 Metro Conference Championship. After a successful collegiate career, Christie completed his degree in retailing and participated in the PGA qualifying school.

Eric Ecker

1998, 1999 - Honorable Mention

Eric Ecker was named honorable mention All-America in both his sophomore and junior seasons. As a sophomore he captured the 1998 SEC Championship with a two-day score of eight-under. He participated in every South Carolina tournament in his four years at the school and ranked as one of USC's all-time bests in terms of low tournament score and single-round low.





Webb Heintzelman

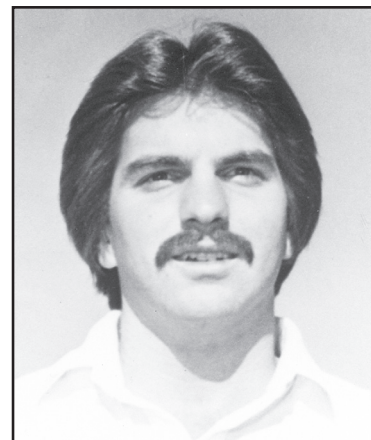
1984 - Honorable Mention

A 1984 graduate of South Carolina, Webb Heintzelman earned All-American honors his senior year. While playing for the Gamecocks, Heintzelman claimed the 1984 Tar Heel Invitational crown and established a new course record with a round of 65.

A 1978 graduate, Mike Holland earned All-America honors his final season. Holland won the S.C. Amateur in 1976, finished ninth in the NCAAs in 1978 and played five years on the PGA Tour. Holland teamed with Vance Heafner to win the Walt Disney Team Championship in 1981, and, in 1982, finished second in the St. Jude Memphis Classic.



Jeff Hull

1989 - Honorable Mention

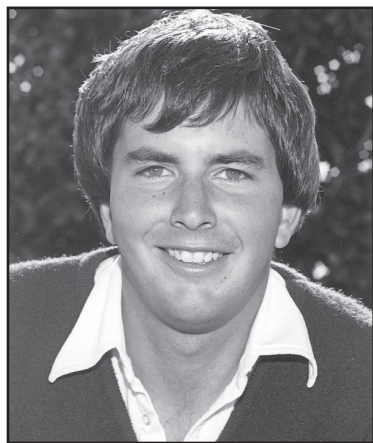

Eirik Johansen

Steve Liebler

1980, 1981 - Honorable Mention

A 1981 graduate, Steve Liebler was a two-time All-American in 1980 and 1981. Liebler claimed four top-10 finishes during his career. He captured the Eastern Amateur in 1981 and won the 1979 Guilford College Intercollegiate Tournament. After five years on the professional golf tour, he returned to his alma mater as head coach. The Virginia native coached USC to six NCAA Championship tournaments in his tenure.

Carl Paulson

1993 - Honorable Mention

Carl Paulson earned All-America honors in 1993. As a Gamecock, Paulson compiled four individual medalist honors, more than anyone ever to wear the garnet and black. He was the Metro Conference Champion in 1991 and was named SEC Player of the Year in 1993. Paulson won the 1995 PGA Tour Qualifying School. Paulson is currently playing professionally.



Allen Powers

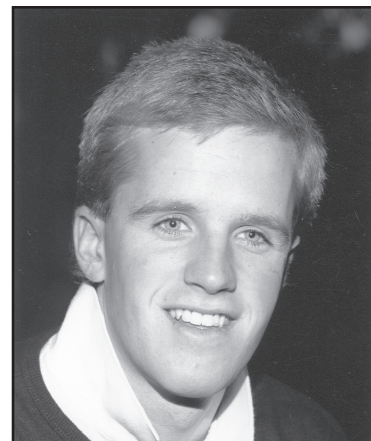
1968 - Honorable Mention

In 1968, Allen Powers was named to the All-America team and finished in the NCAA top five. A 1968 graduate of USC, Powers won the Carolinas' Four-Ball Tournament four times and captured the S.C. Amateur in 1982. Powers' other collegiate victories included the 1967 South Carolina Intercollegiate and the 1968 Palmetto Intercollegiate.

Brett Quigley

1991 - Honorable Mention

A 1991 graduate, Quigley earned honorable mention All-America honors in his senior season. Quigley also garnered Academic All-America laurels and made first team All-Metro Conference that season. He was second in the 1989 Metro Conference Tournament and posted a 72.9 stroke average his senior year. The Barrington, R.I., native is currently having a successful professional career, including a top-20 finish on the PGA's money list in 2006.





David Seawell

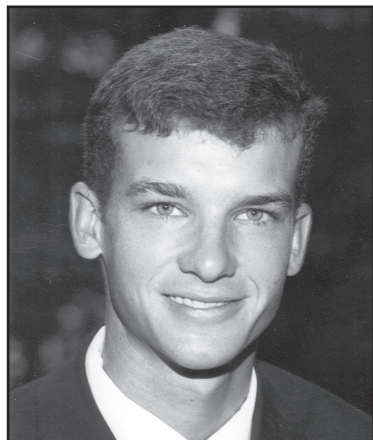
1994 - Second Team • 1995, 1996 - Honorable Mention

David Seawell was named second-team All-America as a sophomore. He won the Carpet Capital Collegiate in 1994 and led the nation in stroke average at one time. Seawell tied for fourth in the NCAA East Regional and qualified as an individual for the NCAA Finals. He qualified for the NCAA Championships in Columbus, Ohio, as a junior, en route to honorable mention All-America honors.

Mark Silvers III

He fired a final-round 64 to vault the Gamecocks up the leaderboard and into the NCAA Championship. Silvers was also named the 2009 SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year.



Kyle Thompson

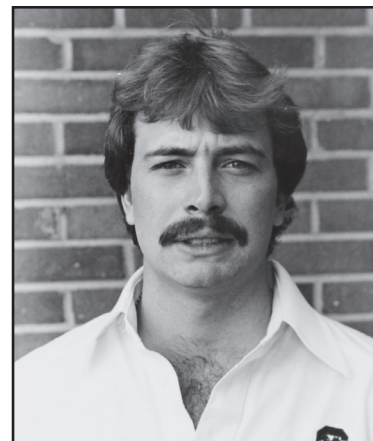
1999 - Second Team • 2000, 2001 - Honorable Mention

Kyle Thompson was named an All-American three times (1999, 2000, 2001). In 1999, he captured individual championships in both the Seminole Classic and the NCAA East Regional, where he set a school record of 63 in the final round. After winning the 2001 NCAA West Regional, Thompson broke Carl Paulson's school record for most individual titles with five. He is the only golfer in the history of the NCAA to win two different regionals. Thompson earned his PGA Tour card for 2008.

David Tolley

David Tolley earned All-America honors in 1984 and graduated from South Carolina the same year. Tolley gained national recognition while at South Carolina by playing in the 1983 Masters Tournament. Tolley shot a 77-74 at The Masters, missing the cut by only four shots. He was runner-up in the 1982 U.S. Amateur before losing to Jay Sigel.





Fred Wadsworth

1984 - Second Team

Fred Wadsworth was named to the 1984 All-America squad. As a senior, Wadsworth placed ninth at the NCAA Championships. He collected victories at the Imperial Lakes Invitational and the South Carolina Invitational. In 1986, Wadsworth joined the PGA Tour and captured the Southern Open Championship. He was the last Monday qualifier to win on the PGA Tour for 24 years until Arjun Atwal captured the 2010 Wyndham Championship.

Rick Williams

1990 - Honorable Mention

Rick Williams was named to the 1988 All-America and All-Metro squads. Williams earned All-Metro honors again in 1990 by capturing the conference individual title. He finished his collegiate career with a 44th-place showing at the 1990 NCAA East Regional.

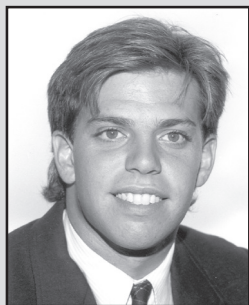

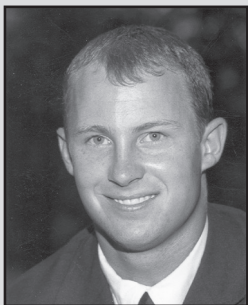

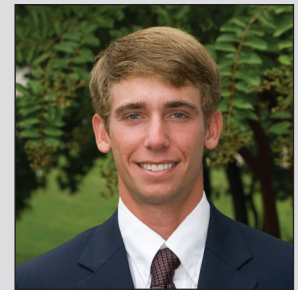
