## A Tale of Two Seasons for Gamecocks in 2007-08

# South Carolina soared early, stumbled at the New Year but landed in WNIT for third-straight year 


#### Abstract

An 11-4 non-conference record raised expectations heading into SEC play, but injuries and inexperience hampered the Gamecocks as SEC play began. The team battled through the hard times, though, and earned a postseason berth for the fifth time in the last seven seasons.


## Adams Aces Final Exams

Junior Demetress Adams earned a collection of SEC honors in 2007-08, including second-team all-conference nods from both the coaches and the Associated Press. Additionally, she earned a spot on the league's All-Defensive Team.

Adams finished the season fourth in the SEC with 8.9 rebounds per game and was 19th in the league at 10.9 points per game. Her 55 blocked shots were the third-highest season total in school history, and she was 10th in the league with 2.03 steals per game.

## A Child Shall Lead Them

When times got tough during the season, the Gamecocks turned to their veterans - seniors Ilona Burgrova, Lakesha Toliver and Ebony Jones and junior Demetress Adams. But, when the season wrapped up, it was a freshman sitting atop the scoring chart.

Freshman Jordan Jones led the team with a 13.1 points per game mark to rank ninth in the SEC. It was the fourth-best scoring average by a freshman in school history. Jones did her damage at the 3-point line, from which she shot 39.9 percent (97-243) to rank third in the SEC, 31st in the nation and eighth in school history. She led the SEC and ranked third in the country with 3.03 3-pointers made per game. She is second in school history in both 3-point field goals made (97) and attempted (243) - both are freshman class records. Her 39.9 percent accuracy is the third-highest by a Gamecock freshman, stitting behind Karen Middleton's 43.4 percent (75-173) and Heather Godfrey's 40.6 percent (43-106).

## Glass Ceiling?

Junior Demetress Adams grabbed a school-record 26 rebounds against Arkansas on Feb. 3, breaking Denise Nanney's 33 -year-old record of 24. The first Gamecock since 1993 to bring down 20 or more rebounds in a game, Adams tied Mississippi State's Sophie Ratliff's 26 against Shorter in 1988 as the most by an SEC player since the league began officially sponsoring women's basketball in 1982-83. It was the most by a player in an SEC vs. SEC game.

Of Adams' 26 boards, a school-record 17 came on the defensive end. Among her record-breaking rebounds was the 500th of her career. It was also the highest rebound total of any player in the NCAA during the season. She finished the year ranked 48th in the nation with a 8.9 rebounding average.

## Dropping Dimes

Freshman Samone Kennedy battled the entire season for playing time at point guard, but when she was on the floor there was no question that the offense would go. The speedster handed out 106 assists in 31 games, the third-most by a South Carolina freshman in school history. Her 3.42 assists per game average put her in seventh place in the SEC, and she was in the league's top 10 with a 1.31-to-1
assist-to-turnover ratio as well. Playing just 18.8 minutes per game, Kennedy handed out an assist every 5.5 minutes she was on the floor

With 10 assists at Florida on Feb. 24, she became the first Gamecock freshman in more than 20 years to post double-digit helpers, collecting her first career doubledouble by adding 10 points to her state line. The top four freshman performances in school history are held by Martha Parker, who dished the record 14 against Charlotte on Jan. 18, 1986. Parker posted three other double-digit assist games, the last coming against Central Florida on Feb. 17, 1986, when she collected 11.

## It's a Block Party!

South Carolina finished the season ranked 20th in the nation and second in the SEC at 4.88 blocked shots per game. The team's 156 blocks in 2007-08 were the fourth-most in school history. The defensive effort was anchored in the paint by senior Lakesa Tolliver and junior Demetress Adams.

Already the school-record holder for blocks in a season with 60 in 2006-07, Tolliver became the single-game record holder with seven swats against UNC Wilmington on Dec. 1. She completed her trifecta of blocked shot records by becoming the South Carolina career record holder with five blocks against Charleston Southern on Dec. 4 and went on to finish her career with 177 blocks, 29 more than the previous record holder, Michelle Murray (1989-93)

Adams has one more year to move her teammate off the top step, though, as she sits in fourth place with 119 blocks after swatting away 55 shots in 2007-08.

## Postseason Pop

South Carolina made the most of its Women's NIT bid with an offensive explotion in the first round against North Carolina A\&T. The Gamecocks' 102 points were the third-most by a women's team at Colonial Center, and the team's 58.9 percent field goal shooting was the third-highest in facility history. With 123 -pointers the team tied that arena record as well.

Freshman Jordan Jones led the barrage, hitting nine 3-pointers in the outing to tie the school record and set a new WNIT record. With 31 points she became just the third freshman in South Carolina history to eclipse the 30-point plateau. Her 17 3-point attempts were a Colonial Center record and the second-most in school history.

The team's long-range accuracy did not stop at the door of the Colonial Center, however. The Gamecocks packed their jump shots for their second-round game at NC State as well, hitting 66.7 percent from behind the arc (8-12) to tie for fifth on the program's single-game field goal percentage chart. Jones stood out again as she hit 77.8 percent from 3 -point range (7-9) to post the third-best 3 -point shooting percentage by a freshman in school history.

## Czech, Please!

Often the unsung hero of the team, senior Ilona Burgrova may have been the most steady Gamecock of the season. Quickly amassing 9.3 points and 6.2 rebounds per game, the Czech Republic native enjoyed a career year in her final trip around the SEC. She was 17th in the SEC in rebounding and scored in double figures in 15 of the last 26 games. She led the team in rebounding eight times and recorded seven games of double-digit boards. Burgrova collected her lone double-double of the season against the toughest of foes, Tennessee, recording 16 points and 13 rebounds in 33 minutes on the court. She finished her career ranked third in school history in career blocked shots (133) and eighth in career games played (123).

## 20/20 Vision

Against North Carolina A\&T on March 21, Jordan Jones and Brionna Dickerson became the first Gamecock duo to score 20 or more points each since Lauren Simms and Stacy Booker netted 25 and 28 points, respectively, against Clemson on Dec. 3, 2004. Both Jones and Dickerson hit 11 field goals with Jones leading the team with 31 points and Dickerson following behind at 25 .

## Eight Was Enough

Despite a 4-10 record in SEC play and a disappointing loss in the first round of the SEC Tournament, the WNIT selection committee believed South Carolina's last eight regular-season games were enough to show that it could have fared much better this season if the injury bug had not bitten so often. The Gamecocks were 4-4 in their last eight regular-season games, including wins over Mississippi, Florida and Kentucky - all teams ranked ahead of them in the SEC standings. After losing the projected starting point guard (Ashlie Billingslea) before the season and the resulting starting point guard (Courtney Newton) five games into the season, South Carolina suffered through a five-game stretch without Brionna Dickerson, who was averaging 15.5 points at the time, due to a foot injury. The final, and perhaps most damaging, blow came when the Gamecocks started the SEC slate withouth senior forward Lakesha Tolliver, who then missed seven games with exertional headaches. Tolliver's first game back after getting in some practice time was a South Carolina win over Arkansas, the team's first victory since beginning league play.

## Carolina Basketball Class of 2008 Senior Salute

The South Carolina women's basketball program said its final on-court goodbyes to three seniors after their respective careers ended in 2007-08. A closer look at the Gamecock Women's Basketball Class of 2008:

## Prime Time Players

South Carolina played four team ranked in the top 10 in the nation during 2007-08. While the Gamecocks lost all four contests, senior Ilona Burgrova and junior Demetress Adams showed they can match up with the best. The duo accounted for 87 of the team's 187 points ( 46.5 percent) against the top-10 foes with each including a double-double among her accompllishments. Burgrova, who netted 15 or more points in two of the contests, scored 11.5 points per game on 58.6 percent shooting against the four top-10 teams. Adams averaged 10.3 points and 7.0 rebounds in the outings.

## The Game on the Line

As a team, South Carolina struggled from the free-throw line in 2007-08, hitting just 67.7 percent (392-579) of its attempts to rank sixth in the SEC. But, when the game was on the line (quite literally), the Gamecocks were able to sink them, hitting 73.2 percent in the last five minutes, including 77.8 percent in the final two minutes of games. The five regular starters (Jordan Jones, Demetress Adams, Brionna Dickerson, Ilona Burgrova and Lakesha Tolliver) missed just 11 free throws in 55 attempts in a game's final two minutes and hit 72-of-97 (74.2 percent) at the under five-minute mark. Overall, that starting group hit just 69.8 percent (289-414) for the season.

## 50 First Dates - Well, Really Six

There were six first-time opponents on the Gamecocks' non-conference schedule in 2007-08. South Carolina posted a 4-2 record against the group with wins over Saint Francis (Pa.), Buffalo, Jackson State and Alabama A\&M. Illinois and No. 2 Connecticut were the only teams in the collection to hand the Gamecocks a los.

## Season Recap

## It Was the Best of Times...

South Carolina opened the 2007-08 campaign with a bang, scoring a 93-33 victory over Saint Francis (Pa.). It was the third-largest margin of victory for the Gamecocks at Colonial Center. Junior Demetress Adams and freshman Jordan Jones definitively announced their intention to shape college basketball scene in 2007-08. Adams scored a career-high 21 points on 7-of-11 shooting and picked up the first of her eight double-doubles on the season with a game-high 12 rebounds. Jones earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors for her 15-point, 4-of-6 3-point shooting debut.

In a show of the team's balance, two different players led the Gamecocks to a much more narrow victory in the next outing against Virginia. Senior Lakesha Tolliver and junior Brionna Dickerson paced their hometown team to a 66-64 victory. Dickerson poured in points in the first half, finishing with a career-high 27 on 5-of-7 3-point shooting, while Tolliver provided the necessary late-game heroics with a clutch jumper in the lane after the Gamecocks rallied from 14 points down in the final 6:35 of the game.

After dispatching a scrappy Buffalo team 66-54, South Carolina again found itself in a nail-biter, this time with Penn State. With an eight-point lead at halftime, the Lady Lions opened a 33-27 lead behind a string of offensive fouls called on the Gamecocks, which helped Adams to the bench with foul trouble. The absence of South Carolina's standout junior forward sparked another surge that saw Penn State go up by 10. While aggressive defense and the inside game whittled away at the deficit, Jones hit a 3 -point to tie things up, and Dickerson drained a 14 -foot jumper from the right side to turn the 12-point deficit into a two-point lead with 3:38 remaining. The frenetic pace took its toll, however, and the Lady Lions rattled home 10 unanswered points to secure their 70-63 victory.

South Carolina suffered a second-straight loss to a Big Ten team, falling to Illinois in the first round of the FIU Thanksgiving Classic. Bigger than the loss on

the scoreboard, however, was that of freshman point guard Courtney Newton. The converted shooting guard was just establishing her rhythm at the point when the knee injury derailed her progress. She battled to return to the team in time for SEC play to begin but was forced to have surgery to end her season.

The Gamecocks rebounded with an 82-66 win over host Florida International in the consolation game of the tournament, thus beginning a four-game win streak. A 72-60 win over UNC Wilmington back at Colonial Center came behind a strong a start and a furious finish. With the game on the line in the final four minutes, South Carolina turned up the defensive pressure, including a school-record seven blocked shots for Tolliver, and crashed the boards to spur a 12-0 surge that sealed the win.

South Carolina was clicking on all cylinders in a 72-26 victory over Charleston Southern. Burgrova and Jones each posted career-high points while the defense held the Lady Bucs to just 16.7 percent shooting with 26 points tying the school record for fewest points by a South Carolina opponent. It was a complete effort as Tolliver added five blocked shots to become the program's career record holder and Adams collected her second double-double in as many games.

Following an almost equally lopsided 82-49 win over Jackson State, the Gamecocks headed to No. 2 Connecticut. In the hostile environs of Gampel Pavilion, the young Gamecocks struggled to stay composed in a 97-37 defeat.

South Carolina licked its wounds with an 88-41 win over Alabama A\&M then drubbed archrival Clemson 64-43 on the road just before the holiday break. The effort against the Tigers was balanced with eight of the nine players who entered the game scoring, including four starters who reached double figures.

The Gamecocks dropped a $95-63$ decision at No. 9 Oklahoma to close out 2008 to fall to 9-4 on the season. While the game was on the ledger as a loss, there were bright spots as three Gamecocks reached double-figure points and the defense limited reigning player of the year Courtney Paris to just 10 points, narrowly extending her streak of games in double figures.

South Carolina wrapped up its non-conference schedule with wins over UNC Asheville and Savannah State at Colonial Center. On the opposite end of the Oklahoma spectrum, the games went down as wins but provided tough losses heading into the SEC slate. Tolliver missed all of the Savannah State game as doctors diagnosed her exertional headaches, which would end up keeping her completely off the basketball court for nearly a month. Then, in the waning moments of the game, Jones suffered a bruised knee that left her questionable for the SEC opener just four days hence.

## It Was the Worst of Times.

South Carolina opened its SEC campaign at Alabama, a team the Gamecocks had beaten 95-35 the previous season for their largest win over an SEC opponent in school history. But, not at full strength due to the injuries, South Carolina was off kilter from the opening tip. The Crimson Tide shot the lights out while the Gamecocks struggled to find offense with Jones not starting and Adams forced to the bench with early foul trouble. South Carolina battled throughout and narrowed its deficit to three points at the 12:43 mark but Alabama would not be denied its first SEC victory in two seasons and scrapped out a 65-54 win

The setback was further compounded by a visit from defending national champion Tennessee three days later. The second-ranked Lady Vols took no pity on the floundering Gamecocks and picked up a 71-48 victory in front of a season-best crowd of 7,841 at Colonial Center. Ironically, the Gamecocks both out-shot and out-rebounded Tennessee in the game after shooting 50 percent in the second half, during which they matched the Lady Vols basket for basket.

Like the SEC opener, the next game at Mississippi required a comeback. The Gamecocks trailed by 12 at the half but got the deficit down to three with 1:35 left in the game. With momentum on its side, South Carolina appeared poised to end its skid when a lack of focus at the free throw line cost the Gamecocks in a 74-61 loss.

The inattention to detail plagued South Carolina in its next outing against Kentucky, a 66-62 loss despite narrowing the gap to one with 1:45 to play and to three with 16 seconds remaining. The bright spot of the night was the emergence of freshman forward Jewel May who netted 10 points to help Adams solidify interior
play in the continued absence of Tolliver.
A second-straight home game did not cure the ills of the Gamecocks, and South Carolina narrowly missed victory again in a 60-57 loss to Florida. After rallying from a 17-point deficit early in the second half, the Gamecocks had two looks to tie or go ahead with 10 seconds left then saw Jones' potentially game-tying 3-pointer sail through the net but be waved off as time had expired just ahead of her shot.

It was difficult to see at the time, but a trip to No. 8 LSU started South Carolina's turnaround. Despite falling to the eventual SEC Player of the Year Sylvia Fowles and the Tigers 67-37, the Gamecocks got a boost with the return of Tolliver, albeit without much preparation. Additionally, Adams thrived against the vaunted frontcourt of the Lady Tigers, picking up a double-double with 15 points on 6-of-11 shooting and 11 rebounds.

It was just the start for Adams who put the team on her back in a recordbreaking 59-50 win over Arkansas to end the six-game losing streak. Adams single-handedly matched Arkansas' rebound total with 26 , the most ever in an SEC regular-season conference game. She was also the high scorer in the game with 18 points on 7-of-10 shooting and handed out a team-high four assists.

And Then It Was a New Season
With the relief of their first conference win of the season and a 12-10 overall record, the Gamecocks looked at their remaining schedule and knew they still had a chance to play in the postseason. A 78-48 loss at Vanderbilt was not the start South Carolina had hoped for, but the team rebounded with a 71-62 win over Mississippi behind nine second-half points from senior Ebony Jones and 10-of-12 accuracy from the free throw line in the waning moments to wrap up a second-straight home victory.

A tough 83-72 loss at Auburn, which was decided largely at the free throw line where the Tigers hit 29-of-38, and a nail-biting 58-54 defeat to Mississippi State, which came down to clutch rebounding in the final moments, left the Gamecocks with a difficult road ahead to stay at .500 and postseason eligible. South Carolina would have to get things done on the road, where the Gamecocks had picked up just two wins in 10 tries on the season. Then again, the team had proven it could bounce back both within games and overall in the season. It was simply one more obstacle in the path to a goal.

The Gamecocks went to Florida with revenge on their minds after the Gators' narrow victory in Columbia and repaid the favor in a 69-65 win in Gainesville, the team's first SEC road win of the season. Aggressive defense and solid free throw shooting down the stretch staved off a Florida rally, and Adams helped seal the victory with a critical offensive rebound and two free throws in the final 10 seconds.

The defense was solid against No. 20 Georgia, but the Bulldogs held the Gamecock offense in check for a 41-55 victory in the final regular-season home game for Burgrova, Ebony Jones and Tolliver. South Carolina needed a win in its final game to assure itself of a .500 record, and the Gamecocks were headed to Kentucky, who, like Florida, had narrowly escaped Columbia with a win during South Carolina's early skid.

In her final SEC regular-season contest, Tolliver shined with a double-double (21 points, 12 rebounds) but it was Jordan Jones' personal seven-point run late in the second half that sealed the 65-57 win over the Wildcats at Rupp Arena. Defense was the recipe early as South Carolina held Kentucky to just 13.6 percent shooting and 19 points to take a 14-point lead into half time. The tables turned in the second half with the Wildcats ratcheting up the defensive pressure. When Kentucky closed within three at the three-minute mark, Jones put the Gamecocks on her back and willed them to the needed victory.

The win put South Carolina into the SEC Tournament as the 10th seed, matching them up against Florida for a third time in the season. The Gators appeared more motivated from the opening tipoff and cruised to a 71-57 victory at the Sommet Center in Nashville.

Still, the late season recovery was enough for the Women's NIT selection committee to give the Gamecocks a home game in the first round of the tournament. South Carolina wasted little time in dispatching North Carolina A\&T behind the

prolific shooting of Jordan Jones and the dead-eye accuracy of Dickerson, who combined for 56 of the Gamecocks' points in the 102-74 victory.

The win sent South Carolina to NC State where the hot-shooting continued. The Gamecocks took a 37-23 lead into halttime as Jones continued to light it up from outside, hitting 5-of-6 3-pointers in the opening 20 minutes. In fact, the Gamecocks Ied for all but 2:45 in the game, but it was the final moments as the Wolfpack scored six points in a four-second span to wrest the victory away from South Carolina.

In Closing
The game at NC State proved to be the final South Carolina contest for head coach Susan Walvius and her staff. Walvius stepped away from the program with a $165-160$ record over 11 seasons. She helped the Gamecocks to two NCAA Tournaments and three Women's NITs in that span, but managed just a 47-93 record in SEC play where the Gamecocks finished in the top half of the league just three times during her tenure.

With five players in double figures, including four who set career highs, South Carolina overwhelmed Saint Francis (Pa.) 93-33 in the season opener at the Colonial Center. Junior Demetress Adams led all scorers with 21 points on 7-of-11 shooting, while junior Brionna Dickerson celebrated her 21st birthday with a career-high 17 points on 8-of-16 shooting.

The Gamecocks wasted little time in getting the offense going as freshman Jordan Jones drained a 3-pointer from the right wing 17 seconds into the contest. Adams hit a lay-up off a feed from Jones 30 seconds later, and the Gamecocks never looked back. Carolina built a double-digit lead on a transition lay-up from C.J. Pace to go up 19-9 at the $10: 23$ mark and never let the Red Flash get any closer. Saint Francis managed just six more points in the half, while the Gamecocks continued to hit shots for a 47-15 lead at the break.

After blistering the nets with a 56.3 field goal percentage in the first half, the Gamecocks cooled off only slightly to hit 50 percent in the second half. Jones netted all 15 of her points in the first half, while Adams piled on in the second, tallying 16 of her 21 atter the break. She completed her double-double with 12 rebounds. Dickerson capped the scoring with a jumper in the lane to set her career high of 17 points.

Joining Adams, Dickerson and Jones in double-figure points were freshman Samone Kennedy and senior Lakesha Tolliver. Kennedy opened her college career with 13 points, hitting 5-0f-6 from the field while handing out three assists and swiping three steals. Tolliver posted a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds and doubled her career high with six steals.

South Carolina 66, Virginia 64
November 15, 2007 at Colonial Center (Columbia, S.c.)
Junior Brionna Dickerson poured in points in the first half, and senior Lakesha Tolliver hit the game-winning jumper with one second remaining in South Carolina's 66-64 win over Virginia. Dickerson netted a career-high 27 points, including 17 in the first 13 minutes. Tolliver's shot helped the Gamecocks rally from 14 points down with 6:35 in the game.

The lead changed five times through four ties and neither team opened more than a five-point lead in the first half. Dickerson did the damage for the Gamecocks, hitting all six of her shots in the first 13 minutes of the game, including five 3-pointers.

The momentum that started late in the first half stayed with Virginia early in the second. As they shut down Dickerson, the Cavaliers built a 16-point lead with 6:46 remaining. The Gamecocks' upperclassmen were not ready to give up on victory, however. A pair of lay-ups from Tolliver sandwiched a bucket from Demetress Adams, narrowing the lead to 10 at the 5:23 mark. Dickerson's back-to-back jumpers sliced the lead to eight with $3: 21$ remaining.

The Gamecocks ramped up the defense and rebounding down the stretch. Adams came up with a steal and found Samone Kennedy streaking down the court for a lay-in to pull within six at 55-61 with 2:47 on the clock.

With just over two minutes left, Dickerson put the team on her back again, dribbling around a series of defenders on the right sideline, tiptoeing the baseline and sinking a lay-up on the opposite side of the rim for a 57-61 margin. The Cavaliers were one and done on the other end as Dickerson snatched a defensive rebound, snaked through traffic again and found Jordan Jones spotted up behind the arc at the left elbow. The sniper buried the shot to pull the Gamecocks within one.

Virginia's Aisha Mohammed missed the front end of a 1-and-1 and an inside shot after the offensive rebound. Dickerson's mid-range jumper at the free-throw line gave South Carolina its first lead since the waning moments of the first half. Off a Lyndra Littles offensive rebound, Sharnee Zoll drained a three, but Dickerson answered with a pair of free throws to knot the game with 37 ticks on the clock.

When Tolliver blocked a shot to earn the final possession, Carolina ran the final play for its senior, who capped her eight-point night with a clutch jumper in the lane.

Dickerson's 27 points led all scorers, and Ilona Burgrova's 10 boards were a game high as well.

South Carolina 66, Buffalo 54
November 17, 2007 at Colonial Center (Columbia, S.C.)
A quartet of double-digit scorers guided South Carolina to a 66-54 victory over Buffalo. Freshman Courtney Newton poured in a gamehigh 17 points, including 10 in the first half when a pair of runs helped the Gamecocks wrest control from a scrappy Buffalo squad. Senior Lakesha Tolliver and junior Demetress Adams netted 13 and 14 points, respectively, securing the interior for the Gamecocks.

The first half got off to a slow start for the Gamecocks, and Buffalo's aggressive defense helped it to a 5-3 lead. A Tolliver three-point play got Carolina back within one at 6-7, and Brionna Dickerson drained a three to give the Gamecocks a 9-7 lead, which they would not relinquish.

After Buffalo's Heather Turner hit one of two free throws to narrow the Carolina lead to three, Newton started the first of two first-half runs. Her short jumper and subsequent 3-pointer from the left elbow started an 11-4 spurt that saw the Gamecocks go up by 11 points at 23-12 with 7:28 left in the half.

The Bulls charged back to within four in the next three trips down the floor, including Dayna Smith's 3-pointer with 4:24 in the period. Tolliver and Newton ended the streak as Tolliver drained two free throws, and Newton drilled another 3-pointer. Jordan Jones made it a 10-point margin with her first 3-pointer of the game with 2:29 left.

The margin hovered around double digits early in the second half until Jamie Schieber went on a personal six-point run to bring the Bulls within six at 47-41 at the 12:30 mark. This time Tolliver had the answer with a pair of free throws and a fast-break lay-up after a Samone Kennedy steal, putting the lead back into double digits with a tick under 10 minutes to play. ## Penn State 70, South Carolina 63 <br> November 20, 2007 at Colonial Center (Columbia, S.C.)

South Carolina staged a furious comeback in the second half but could not hold off Penn State down the stretch, falling to the Lady Lions 70-63. A 12-point deficit became a two-point lead over an eight-minute span before Penn State broke a $54-54$ tie at the 3:38 mark and scored 10 unanswered points for a $64-54$ advantage with $1: 25$ remaining.

After holding an eight-point lead at the break, the Lady Lions opened the second half quickly, capitalizing on a string of offensive fouls called on Carolina to open a 33-27 lead. Senior Ilona Burgrova finally got the Gamecocks on the board with a lay-up off a high-low from Lakesha Tolliver. Brionna Dickerson brought Carolina within six when she fought through the lane to stick back her own rebound. Courtney Newton made it a 31-37 game on a mid-range jumper with 16:40 remaining. Within striking distance, the Gamecocks suffered a setback when Demetress Adams was forced to the bench with four fouls, sparking another Penn State surge. The Lady Lions took advantage, extending their lead to $31-41$, reaching double digits for the first time all night with solid rebounding and baskets in transition.

With a tick under 12 minutes remaining, Carolina brought Adams back and immediately felt the difference. The pace of the game picked up, as did the Gamecocks' effort on the glass, and Carolina was within eight with 10:12 on the clock thanks to a Dickerson 14-foot jumper from the left side. After a Dickerson steal, the speedy Samone Kennedy to tracked down the pass for a lay-up and a 39-45 margin.

Tolliver hit a free throw, and Dickerson drained a jumper just beyond the free throw line to pull Carolina to $42-47$ with $7: 45$ left. On the next trip down the floor, Tolliver hit a jump hook, and Burgrova hit a short jumper on the left baseline for a 46-47 game.

Janessa Wolff stopped the bleeding for Penn State only to see Jordan Jones hit a 3-pointer to knot the game at 49-49. Another Penn State turnover led to Dickerson's 14 -footer from the right side, giving Carolina its first lead since the opening bucket. The teams traded baskets over the next two minutes until Dickerson's free throw knotted the game at 54 with $3: 38$ remaining. The frenetic pace of the Carolina defense caught up with the Gamecocks, though, and the Lady Lions returned to their transition game to regain the lead and extend it to double digits at the 1:25 mark.

South Carolina suffered a 91-58 loss to Illinois in the second game of the Florida International Thanksgiving Tournament. The Gamecocks fell behind early against a pressure Illini defense that forced 24 turnovers, which led to 34 Illinois points. Junior Demetress Adams led the Gamecocks with 14 points, while freshman Jordan Jones contributed 13 , all but two of which came in the second half.

The first half offered a series of difficulties for the Gamecocks from starting the offense late in the shot clock due to pressure defense to getting out-rebounded 20-12 to Courtney Newton suffering a left knee injury midway through the period. The lone bright spot came with the energy of Jasmine Payne off the bench. After the Gamecocks went scoreless for a five minute stretch from the 12 minute mark, Payne came in with just under seven minutes left and mounted a nearly one-woman rally. Her athleticism on the defensive end keyed a pair of steals and her back-to-back buckets provided the closest consecutive scores for the Gamecocks all night.

Senior Lakesha Tolliver and freshman Jordan Jones posted career-high points to guide South Carolina to an 82-66 victory over Florida International in the consolation game of the FIU Thanksgiving Classic. Tolliver's 21 points, which came on 9-of-15 shooting in just 24 minutes, held the Gamecocks steady during an up-and-down game that saw the teams whistled for 52 fouls and shoot 70 free throws. Behind a strong start and furious finish, South Carolina topped a scrappy UNC Wilmington team 72-60. The Gamecocks opened the game with a 9-0 run only to see the Seahawks claw their way back in. But, when the game was on the line in the final four minutes, defense and rebounding came alive to spur a 12-0 surge that sealed the victory. Senior Lakesha Tolliver provided defense around the basket as she swatted away a school record seven shots on the night.

The Seahawks suffered through missed shots early as the Gamecocks started aggressively, especially on defense. On UNCW's second trip down the floor, Tolliver swatted away three straight shots. Trailing by nine at the 15:36 mark, the Seahawks started their comeback with four straight points from SahshaTaylor. Tolliver's layup ended the run, but UNCW picked right back up and narrowed the margin to three.

An Ilona Burgrova layup and a Tolliver jumper pushed the margin back to seven, setting up Brittany Blackwell's personal 6-0 run, which Taylor capped with a short jumper to give the Seahawks their first lead of the game at 25-24 with 4:08 in the half. The Gamecocks again went inside for the answer with Demetress Adams and Tolliver scoring the next four points for a one-point halftime lead.

The first 15 minutes of the second half saw the game tied seven times as neither team could wrest control. The Gamecocks went up by four or more points four times only to see the Seahawks recover. After Blackwell hit a layup in transition to tie the score at 53-53 with 4:36 to go, the Gamecock defense clamped down.

Jordan Jones hit a three at the top of the arc behind a solid screen from Burgrova. Tolliver answered Treasure Johnson's layup with a long jumper for a 58-55 Gamecock lead. Quick interior passing led to Burgrova's layup with 2:38 on the clock for a $60-55$ margin, and free throws from Adams, Tolliver and freshman Samone Kennedy over the next 90 seconds extended the lead to 12 with just over a minute left.

Five Gamecocks ended the night in double-digit points, led by Tolliver's 18. Jones added 13, Adams and Jasmine Payne netted 11 each, and Burgrova rounded out the effort with 10. Adams collected her second double-double of the season with a career-high 13 rebounds, including five on the offensive end, and also handed out a team-high five assists.

## South Carolina 72, Chas. Sthrn. 26

December 4, 2007 at Colonial Center (Columbia, S.C.)

Senior Ilona Burgrova and freshman Jordan Jones paired up in career nights for both to lead South Carolina past Charleston Southern 72-26. The Gamecocks used aggressive, trapping defense to limit the Lady Bucs to just 16.7 percent shooting and 26 points, tying the school record for fewest points by a Carolina opponent. On the other end, Burgrova matched her career high with 17 points on 8-of-9 shooting, while Jones poured in a game-high 19 points, including four 3-pointers. Senior Lakesha Tolliver swatted away five shots to become South Carolina's career leader in blocked shots, and junior Demetress Adams posted her second double-double in as many games with 11 points and 11 rebounds.

Shots would not fall for either team early as it took more than two minutes for either team to crack the scoreboard. Once the Gamecocks got going, however, they did not look back. Jones opened a 9-0 run with a lay-up off a steal and capped it with a 3-pointer. The Lady Bucs finally got on the board on Cindee Wright's jumper at the 14:43 mark. South Carolina went on a 10-2 run to open a 15-point lead with 9:13 on the clock. Tolliver's block of Crystal Robinson at 2:30 was the 149th of her career, putting her in sole possession of the school record. Jones capped the half with a deep 3-pointer with the shot clock winding down, giving the Gamecocks a 35-12 advantage.

South Carolina's lead ballooned to 36 with a 13-0 run that kicked off the second half. The Gamecocks' interior did much of the damage with Adams and Burgrova combining for 10 of those points.

Tolliver matched Adams' 11 rebounds for game-high honors, while freshman Samone Kennedy handed out a season-high six assists. Adams added two assists and four steals to the effort.

South Carolina 82, Jackson St. 49 December 7, 2007 at Colonial Center (Columbia, S.C.)

With five players in double-figure points, South Carolina topped Jackson State 82-49. Junior Demetress Adams was two assists away from a triple-double as she posted her third-straight double-double with 12 points and 13 rebounds while handing out a career-high eight assists. The Gamecocks got a late spark from senior Ebony Jones, who buried three of her four 3-pointers over a three-minute span.

The Tigers challenged the Gamecocks early, collecting offensive rebounds for second-chance points early in the first half to counteract the 3 -point barrage from Jordan Jones. After Adams put the Gamecocks up two on a pair of free throws with 12:24 on the clock, the Tigers cut the deficit to 13-14 just 12 seconds later.

South Carolina kicked off a 14-5 run with a 15 -foot jumper from Lakesha Tolliver and a short jumper in the lane from Jasmine Payne after Samone Kennedy picked one of her game-high five steals. Easley brought the Tigers back within three points, but Carolina continued its spurt, which was capped by Payne's lay-up, stretching the lead to double digits at 28-18 with 4:12 in the half. The lead continued to expand as the Gamecock defense forced two more turnovers and did not allow an offensive rebound down the stretch.

The Gamecock lead got as high as 29 at 55-26 when Jewel May sank a pair of free throws with 14:32 on the clock. The Tigers clawed back behind defensive pressure that forced Carolina into six straight turnovers, all but one of which led to a bucket on the other end. JSU's LaSharee Christian went on a personal 8-0 run in a 60 -second span, and Brittney Dowdy brought the Tigers' deficit under 20 on a put back at the 11:01 mark.

The Gamecocks quickly regained their composure and scored 13 of the game's next 15 points, keyed by the Ebony Jones 3-pointers, to get their lead back to 68-38 with 6:47 left to go.

Jordan Jones' 20 points set a new career high and led all scorers. Senior Ilona Burgrova and Ebony Jones matched Adams' 12 points, and Tolliver rounded out the double-digit scorers with 10 points. South Carolina shot a season-best 60.8 percent from the field, the secondhighest field goal percentage in Colonial Center history.

South Carolina suffered a $97-39$ setback at No. 2 Connecticut as the Huskies held the Gamecocks to 21 percent shooting. Senior Ilona Burgrova was the lone Gamecock to steady the ship as she tallied 11 points, including nine of the team's 20 in the second half. The Huskies forced South Carolina into 23 turnovers, which they converted into 35 points.

The Huskies jumped out to an 8-0 lead until Burgrova ended the Gamecock drought with a bucket from the right block. UConn continued to work in transition as the Gamecock offense struggled in the half-court until senior Ebony Jones hit back-to-back 3-pointers to narrow the gap to 20-12 with $9: 41$ to go in the half. It would be three minutes until South Carolina found the scoreboard again with Demetress Adams hitting a pair of free throws. She continued to work in the lane, collecting the Gamecocks' next two baskets. The Huskies' offense was simply more efficient in the half, capitalizing on 14 Gamecock turnovers and dominating on the glass, out-rebounding Carolina 33-17 before the break.

The second half got off to a promising start with a lay-up for Lakesha Tolliver, but the Huskies rattled off the next 14 points, which extended the lead to $57-21$ with 16:49 to go. When South Carolina got the ball in the post, Burgrova was able to make the Huskies pay, netting five points in a one-minute span on a traditional three-point play and a tough lay-up on the ensuing possession.

Junior Brionna Dickerson returned to the lineup for South Carolina, scoring seven points and pulling down a team-high seven rebounds in 36 minutes. Adams, who fouled out with 10:52 left in the second half, finished the game with nine points on 3 -of-3 shooting and five rebounds

The Huskies shot 48.1 percent and handed South Carolina its largest loss in school history.

Freshman Jordan Jones matched her career high with 20 points as South Carolina screeched past Alabama A\&M 88-41. The Gamecocks had four players in double figures and shot 51.6 percent from the field, including 50 percent from 3-point range. Jones hit a career-high six 3-pointers, one shy of the Colonial Center record.

The Bulldogs came out firing as Katrich Williams hit a 3 -pointer seven seconds into the game. Junior Brionna Dickerson opened her hot-shooting night with a 10-foot jumper on the right baseline, then gave the Gamecocks the lead with a 3-pointer from the left elbow. Senior Ilona Burgrova drove the lane to hit a tough lay-up and converted the ensuing free throw for an 8-4 lead. The Bulldogs narrowed the gap to 9-7 on a Rebekkah Barnes 3-pointer, and Williams made it a one-point game with a free throw at the 14:00 mark

Senior Ebony Jones started a 10-2 run with a 3-pointer from the left baseline and added another a minute later. Freshman Jasmine Payne closed the spurt with a tough put back for a 19-10 lead with 11:40 on the clock. The Bulldogs mounted a rally behind a spate of Carolina turnovers, narrowing the gap to three points on Sade Lett's baseline jumper. A 20-3 Gamecock run, kicked off by the first of Jordan Jones' 3 -pointers, closed the half and gave Carolina a 41-21 lead.

The second half opened just as strongly for the Gamecocks as the first had finished. South Carolina yielded just a single point to the Bulldogs for the first seven minutes of the period while rattling off 19 points of their own. ## South Carolina 64, Clemson 43

December 22, 2007 at Littlejohn Coliseum (Clemson, S.C.)
South Carolina used solid defense and efficient offense to post a $64-43$ victory over Clemson. The Gamecocks forced 13 first-half turnovers to build a sizeable lead at halftime as they recorded their thirdstraight lop-sided victory over their arch rival. Freshman Jordan Jones led the offense with16 points, while Demetress Adams picked up a double-double with 10 points and 12 rebounds to go along with six steals and five blocks.

Offense was at a premium early, as both teams suffered through early turnovers.The Gamecocks were first to snap out of the early malaise, scoring 13 of the game's first 15 points with each starter scoring at least once. Jones opened things with a 3-pointer, and Ilona Burgrova put Carolina up 5-0 with a hook shot. Brionna Dickerson and Adams stuck back offensive rebounds, and Burgrova connected on a lay-up off a highlow feed. Lakesha Tolliver closed the run with a short jumper at the 11:06 mark.

The Tigers narrowed the gap to $15-10$ behind a pair of 3-pointers from Kirstyn Wright and a bucket from Whitney Hood. Behind a stalwart defensive effort, the Gamecocks answered with a 9-0 run to push the margin up to 26-10. Again it was Jones the sparked the rally with a deep 3-pointer from the left elbow. Adams followed with a traditional three-point play as she powered up a shot under the basket and sank the ensuing free throw. Jones found Burgrova on a quick strike pass up the right sideline for a lay-up, and Jones capped the spurt with another 3-pointer. Wright ended the surge with a 3 -point bucket with $5: 18$ left to bring the Tigers to 13-26. South Carolina out-scored Clemson 10-4 down the stretch to take a 36-17 lead into halttime.

The second half brought more of the same with the Gamecocks scoring 11 of the first 18 points to open a 49-24 lead midway through the half.

South Carolina shot 48.1 percent from the field, including 50 percent in the second half, while holding the Tigers to just 23.2 percent for the game. Four Gamecocks reached double figures as Jones netted a gamehigh 16 points on 6 -of-11 shooting, including 4 -of-8 from 3 -point range. Adams, Burgrova and Dickerson each scored 10.

## No. 9 Oklahoma 95, South Carolina 63 December 30, 2007 at Lloyd Noble Center (Norman, Okla.)

Despite three players in double figures, South Carolina suffered a 95-63 defeat at No. 9 Oklahoma. Freshman Jordan Jones netted a team-high 18 points, and senior Ilona Burgrova added 15, all but two of which came in the second half, to lead the Gamecocks. The Sooners out-rebounded the Gamecocks 58-26, including 25 offensive boards to just six for South Carolina.

The first half was played in a series of spurts as the Sooners took advantage of their second looks, turning 17 offensive rebounds into 19 second-chance points in the half. Oklahoma put together a 12-6 run to open a 21-12 margin. The spurt came largely on the back of Nyeshia Stevenson, who hit three mid-range jumpers. A second OU surge of 16-6 pushed the lead to 21 at the 4:05 mark before the Gamecocks put together a brief rally of their own. South Carolina closed the half on a 9-4 run started by a pair of free throws from Jewel May. Jones hit a long 3-pointer from the right wing, then sank two of three free throws on her ensuing 3-point attempt to pull the Gamecocks back to 27-43. Lakesha Tolliver put back her own miss for a 29-43 margin with 1:05 on the clock. OU's Courtney Paris hit a tough bucket underneath for a 45-29 halftime score.

In the second half, the OU lead ballooned to 31 points with $13: 37$ left, but the Gamecocks refused to go away and put together 16-0 run over the next three minutes, narrowing the deficit to 68-53. Burgrova opened the spurt with seven straight points as she battled underneath. Jones added a 3-pointer in transition, and Tolliver hit a layup off a steal by Samone Kennedy. Bugrova hit another hook, and Jones added a pair of free throws before the Sooners ended the spurt with a pair of free throw from Danielle Robinson at the 9:58 mark.

A jumper at the top of the key from Demetress Adams brought the Gamecocks back within 15 before the Sooners took advantage of quick shots and back-to-back turnovers to rebuild their lead to 24 points with 7:44 remaining. Tolliver sank a pair of free throws for a 79-57 deficit, but the Gamecocks could not regain the momentum and would get no closer.

## South Carolina 80, UNC Asheville 52 January 3, 2008 at Colonial Center (Columbia, s.C.)

South Carolina saw 10 of 12 players find the scoring column in a well-balanced 80-52 victory over UNC Asheville. The Gamecocks used a $26-4$ run over a six-minute stretch of the first half to shed a pesky Bulldog team. South Carolina shot 48.6 percent from the field, including 40 percent from 3-point range, while holding UNCA to just 25 percent shooting and 17 points below its season average.

Senior Ebony Jones got the offense started early for South Carolina with back-to-back 3-pointers. Asheville narrowed the gap to four points at 9-5 on a driving lay-up from Chioma Okoli at the 14:29 mark. After a short 6-1 burst keyed by consecutive put-backs from Demetress Adams pushed the lead to 15-6, UNCA's Stacy Shepard drained a short jumper to get the deficit back to seven. From there, the Gamecocks scored 12 straight points to start the decisive 26-4 run.

The surge opened with an Ilona Burgrova lay-up and built on back-to-back mid-range jumpers from Brionna Dickerson. Samone Kennedy shredded the defense and hit a driving lay-up, and Jordan Jones drained a long jumper just inside the 3-point line. Burgrova capped the string of 12 unanswered points with a long jumpshot at the top of the arc for a 27-8 Gamecock lead.

Asheville's Ana Baker ended the string with a pair of free throws with 9:00 left in the half, but the Gamecocks went right back to work. Kennedy netted a mid-range jumper, Ebony Jones scored in transition, and C.J. Pace buried a 3 -pointer from the right side. The Bulldogs cut it to 34-12 on a mid-range jump shot from Kiana Rainey, but it was a brief interruption to Pace's personal eight-point surge. Freshman Jewel May closed the rally with a tough lay-up in transition for a 41-12 Gamecock lead with 6:13 on the clock.

South Carolina scored 80 points despite neither of its top two scorers reaching double figures. Dickerson led all scorers with 18 points, while Pace turned in a career-best 15. Both Adams and Burgrova narrowly missed double-doubles. Adams snagged a game-high 12 rebounds to go with eight points, five assists and five blocked shots, while Burgrova snatched 10 rebounds and netted nine points.

South Carolina 86, Savannah St. 47 January 6, 2008 at Colonial Center (Columbia, S.C.)

South Carolina junior Brionna Dickerson scored nine straight points in a 90 -second span to spearhead an $86-47$ victory over Savannah State. The Tigers battled the Gamecocks early, trailing just 18-22, before Dickerson sparked the Gamecocks on offense while the Carolina defense yielded just two points over the final seven minutes of the first half.

Neither team found points easily early on with the Gamecocks cracking the scoreboard first when a pair of offensive rebounds led to Demetress Adams' put-back a minute into the contest. SSU's Lashara Smith sank a pair of free throws to tie things up, and the Tigers took a 3-point lead on an Antoinette Williams free throw and a short jumper off the drive from Patrice Robinson. Ilona Burgrova hit a layup off an in-bound play to cut the lead to one, and Dickerson put back her own miss for a 6-5 Gamecock lead with 15:16 on the clock.

After trailing by two at the $8: 23$ mark, C.J. Pace and Jordan Jones started the half's closing 21-4 run, but it was Dickerson's burst that clawed into the Tigers. She began her spurt with a 3-pointer from the right wing, then sank a pair of free throws before draining another three from the right wing in transition. After Burgrova blocked Smith's shot on the other end, Dickerson snagged the rebound and pulled up for a mid-range jumper and a 32-18 lead with 4:06 left in the half. While the Tigers were one-and-done on their end for the rest of the half, the Gamecocks continued to clean up their offensive glass, pulling down 10 boards that led to 12 second-change points in the period.

South Carolina warmed up from 3-point range in the second half and took advantage of its opportunities at the free-throw line, hitting 20 -of-26 from the stripe, to out-score the Tigers by 20 points in the final 20 minutes.

Four Gamecocks reached double figures in scoring, led by Dickerson's 18. Jones added 16, while Jewel May netted a seasonbest 14 in just 18 minutes of play. Adams posted her sixth doubledouble of the season with 11 points and 12 rebounds, including eight on the offensive end, and Burgrova snagged 10 rebounds as well.

## Alabama 65, South Carolina 54 <br> January 10, 2008 at Coleman Coliseum (Tuscaloosa, Ala.)

South Carolina suffered a 65-54 defeat to Alabama in the SEC opener for both teams. Poor shooting in the first half led to an early deficit, but the Gamecocks battled back to within eight at the break. A second-half surge brought the deficit to three before the midway point of the period, but another Alabama rally left the Gamecocks trailing by double digits again. Senior Ilona Burgrova was the leading scorer for South Carolina with 13 points, but the Gamecocks lost the battle of the boards 29-35.

Alabama jumped out to a 26-9 lead as the Gamecocks struggled to find their offense. The Crimson Tide hit 11 of its first 16 shots, including three 3-pointers, and out-rebounded Carolina 12-6 over the 12-minute stretch. The Tide's cause was helped when Demetress Adams was forced to the bench with her second foul of the half.

The Gamecock felt Adams' absence on offense and on the glass, allowing the Tide to go on a 9-0 run. The lead grew to 26-9 with 8:40 on the clock.

South Carolina was forced to bring Adams back in the game, and things turned around almost immediately. The Gamecock inside game began cranking out points, while the defense generated four steals on Alabama's next four possessions. Ilona Burgova and Adams combined for the next eight points as the Crimson Tide's lead shrank to 28-19 with a tick over three minutes left in the half. Both teams went cold over the final stretch as Alabama took a 28 -21 lead into halttime.

Out of the break, Alabama pushed its lead out to $33-23$ before Jordan Jones hit her first 3-pointer of the game two minutes into the half. Camilla Blands made it a nine-point game with a lay-up, but the Gamecocks came right back. Samone Kennedy drove the lane for a lay-up, and Jones drained another triple in transition, cutting the Gamecocks' deficit to $31-35$ with $16: 56$ left in the game. A third Jones 3 -pointer, this one from the right side, cut the margin to three at the 12:43 mark.

A series of Gamecock miscues yielded a four-minute scoring drought, allowing Alabama to push its lead back to 13 points at 51-38 as Tamara Williams and Chandler combined for 10 points in the spurt. The Crimson Tide held the Gamecocks back down the stretch with solid defense of the 3-point line and just enough free-throw shooting.

## No. 2 Tennessee 71, South Carolina 47 January 13, 2008 at Colonial Center (Columbia, S.C.)

South Carolina played No. 2 Tennessee even in the second half, but it was not enough to avoid a 71-48 defeat. In front of the fourthlargest crowd in Carolina women's basketball history, the Gamecocks out-rebounded the Lady Vols 41-33 and out-shot their opponent 41.7 percent to 40 percent. A spate of turnovers in the first half, however, put South Carolina in a hole from which it could not recover against the nation's second-ranked team. Senior Ilona Burgrova battled the Tennessee interior and emerged with her first double-double of the season, including a career-high 13 rebounds to go with 16 points.

The Lady Vols took off to a 9-0 lead as the Gamecocks looked to slow the tempo of the game early. Brionna Dickerson ended the drought with a mid-range jumper off the dribble. Five minutes into the game, Jordan Jones cut the deficit to 5-9 with a 3-pointer with one second left of the shot clock. UT went on an 8-0 run, spurred by four South Carolina turnovers, to take a 17-5 lead with 11:36 on the clock. Burgrova ended the surge with a lay-up off a drive down the right side of the lane, but it was the last time the Gamecocks would be within 10 points of the Lady Vols.

Trailing $37-14$ at the half, the Gamecock ramped things up in the second half, matching Tennessee basket for basket. More aggressive defense, fewer turnovers and 50 percent shooting by the Gamecocks kept the intensity level up and the crowd into the game. Burgrova did a lion's share of the work, scoring 11 of her 16 points in the second half. After not generating a steal in the first half, the Gamecocks swiped eight in the second period, including five from Demetress Adams who effectively played the passing lanes around UT star Candace Parker.

South Carolina out-scored Tennessee in the paint 28-26, but the Lady Vols turned 30 Carolina turnovers into 41 points. Four Lady Vols finished in double figures with Shannon Bobbitt's 20 points, which included 4 -of-6 from 3 -point range, leading the way. Parker added 15, while Nicky Anosike and Angie Bjorklund netted 12 and 10, respectively.
Burgrova's 16 points came on 6-of-7 shooting and 4-of-6 accuracy from the free-throw line. Adams finished with 10 points on 5-of-9 shooting and a team-high seven rebounds. Samone Kennedy handed out five assists, four of which came in the final 20 minutes.

## Mississippi 74, South Carolina 61

January 20, 2008 at Tad Smith Coliseum (Oxford, Miss.)
South Carolina staged a furious rally midway through the second half, but could not overcome a 12-point halftime deficit in a 74-61 loss at Mississippi. The Gamecocks cut their deficit to three points with 1:35 left and looked to have the momentum to completely the rally. The Lady Rebels took advantage of the spread defense to hit a crucial 3-pointer and hit free throws down the stretch to stave off the Gamecocks.

The Gamecocks were the early aggressors with freshman Jordan Jones draining a long three from the right elbow right off the bat. But an 11-0 run gave gave the Lady Rebels a 17-13 lead at the midway point of the period. Jewel May hit a free throw and Ebony Jones sank a 3-pointer from the right sideline to knot the game at 17-17 with 8:32 on the clock. A litany of Gamecock turnovers delivered a three-minute scoring drought, during which the Lady Rebels tacked on eight straight points to take a 27-19 lead. South Carolina turned up the defensive pressure, but could not overcome the deficit and went in the half trailing 27-39.

The Ole Miss lead hovered around 12 points until the Gamecocks made another spurt with eight minutes remaining. Trailing 47-61, the defense held the Lady Rebels scoreless over the ensuing three minutes. Jones cranked things up with a long jumper, and Ilona Burgrova hit a running across the lane. Demetress Adams made it an eight-point game with a basket underneath with 5:37 left. Forrest ended the surge with a mid-range jumper, which May answered for a 55-63 game with a tick under five minutes left.

Shantell Black hit one of two free throws to push the lead back to nine, but the Gamecocks were not done. Jones and Brionna Dickerson hit back-to-back jump shots, and Dickerson added two free throws to cut the margin back to 64-61 with 1:35 on the clock. With the Gamecocks pressuring every pass, the Lady Rebels got Elizabeth Robertson free for a 3-pointer on the right wing, which she drained to put Ole Miss up 67-61 with just under 90 seconds left. The Lady Rebels sealed the win by hitting free throws down the stretch.

Jones led the South Carolina offense with 18 points, including four 3-pointers, while Adams added 13 on 4 -of-5 shooting. Adams and Burgrova tied for team-high honors with seven rebounds, while Samone Kennedy handed out six assists.

## Kentucky 66, South Carolina 62 January 24, 2008 at Colonial Center (Columbia, S.c.)

Kentucky used a 14-3 run in the second half and took advantage of South Carolina's mental mistakes down the stretch to pick up a 66-62 victory over the Gamecocks. South Carolina dropped its fourth-straight league game despite just four turnovers in the second half and a 40-37 rebounding edge in the game. The Gamecocks rallied from an 11-point deficit with 10:54 left and closed within one with just under two minutes remaining but saw Kentucky battle down the stretch.

The first half was a back-and-forth affair that saw Kentucky take a 26-23 lead into the break.

Early free throws helped the Gamecocks in the second half as Demetress Adams hit a pair to open the stanza and Ilona Burgrova sank a pair to stop a spurt by the Wildcats. Brionna Dickerson fed Burgrova from the high post for a layup to knot the game at $34-34$ with 14:46 remaining.

Back in a dogfight, the Wildcats rolled off a 14-3 run in just over three minutes. Trailing 39-50 with 11:09 on the clock, South Carolina looked for a spurt of its own and got things going by feeding the post. Adams and freshman Jewel May combined for the Gamecocks' next eight points while the defense yielded just three points on the other end. May's free throws with 8:41 on the clock narrowed the gap to 53-49 at the $8: 41$ mark. During the surge, Burgrova picked up her fourth foul, however, and a key rebounder for Carolina was sent to the bench.

After Amber Smith pushed the Kentucky lead back to nine with a pair of free throws, South Carolina surged back with the next eight points which began with a Jones 3 -pointer and ended in a 59-60 deficit on Dickerson's putback with 1:45 left. Kentucky tried to help the Gamecocks with shaky free-throw shooting down the stretch as Smith and Chelsea Chowning hit just 1-of-4 from the stripe, but the Wildcats picked up rebounds on both final misses to push their lead back to $65-59$ with 24 seconds left. Dickerson hit a 3-pointer with 16 seconds left to give the Gamecocks final hope, but Kentucy was able to hold on for the win.

Jones led the Gamecocks with 16 points, including 3-of-6 from 3 -point range, while Burgrova added 15. Adams narrowly missed her seventh double-double of the season with 11 points and nine rebounds.

## Florida 60, South Carolina 57 <br> January 27, 2008 at Colonial Center (Columbia, S.C.)

Three times South Carolina watched game-winning or tying shots fall short in a 60-57 loss to Florida. After rallying back from a 17-point deficit early in the second half, the Gamecocks had two looks to tie or go ahead with 10 seconds left, then saw Jordan Jones' potentially game-tying 3-pointer sail through the net but only just after time had expired.
For Florida, Sharielle Smith did the damage early, scoring seven straight points in a 90 -second span during an early $18-4$ surge. With 14 turnovers and 21.9 percent shooting in the first half, the Gamecocks trailed 33-20 at the break.

In the second half, the Gamecocks got the inside-out game working and reeled off 13 straight points to cut the deficit to four at $33-37$ with 14:20 left.

South Carolina's shooting had improved, but the Gators' had not cooled off, and Florida pushed its lead back to nine as Marshae Dotson scored three straight layups, with the last two coming off Carolina turnovers. After a two-minute scoring drought by both teams, Jordan Jones' 3-pointer from the right wing started a seven-point run for the Gamecocks, capped by a Dickerson lay-up to pull within one at 52-53 with $4: 25$ remaining
With just under a minute remaining, Ebony Jones buried a 3-pointer from the right sideline for a one-possession game. Jasmine Payne, who had come in when Burgrova joined Demetress Adams on the bench with five fouls apiece, forced a turnover with 35 seconds left, giving the Gamecocks another opportunity to tie or take the lead.

Ebony Jones' 3-pointer from the right sideline hit the rim. She chased down her rebound and put up a 10 -foot jumper, which rimmed out into the hands of Dotson, who hit just one of her free throws to leave the Gamecocks a three-point deficit and eight seconds to play. Aggressive defense forced Dickerson to drive up the right sideline and inside the 3-point line before she got a clear look for a teammate. She kicked the ball back to Jordan Jones two steps behind the 3-point line, but she could not get off the shot in time

## No. 8 LSU 67, South Carolina 37 <br> January 31, 2008 at Maravich Center (Baton Rouge, La.)

South Carolina battled early but saw No. 8 LSU go on an 18-0 run early in the second half and cruise to a 67-37 victory. Junior forward Demetress Adams led the Gamecocks with 17 points and 11 rebounds. The Lady Tigers shot 45.5 percent from the field with Sylvia Fowles and Quianna Chaney leading the way with 14 points apiece.

The Gamecocks battled the Lady Tigers early in the first half, holding a $6-4$ lead at the first media timeout and trailing just 10-8 at the second. After Jordan Jones tied the game with a deep jumper from the left side, the Gamecocks suffered a three-minute scoring drought, during which LSU tacked on eight unanswered points for an 18-10 lead with just under eight minutes remaining. Lakesha Tolliver ended the surge with a pair of free throws, but another scoreless four minutes saw the Gamecocks' deficit grow to 16 points at 12-28. The Lady Tigers used a 3-point barrage to compound a series of Gamecock turnovers during the spurt.

Brionna Dickerson hit a long jumper from the top of the arc and Adams cut the margin to 12 with a layup off a feed from Ilona Burgrova in the high post. LSUs Sylvia Fowles banged home a layup from the right block before Jewel May closed the half with a pair of power layups of her own to pull the Gamecocks within 11 at 31-20 at the break.

The second half started slowly for South Carolina as the Lady Tigers steadily built a 27 -point lead using dribble penetration to knife through the defense and steady 3 -point shooting. After Tolliver's mid-range jumper from the right baseline made it a 26 - 40 game with 16:11 left in the period, LSU put together an 18-0 run as the Lady Tigers could not miss from the field while the Gamecocks could not hit a bucket over the five-minute stretch.

South Carolina struggled shooting, hitting just 35.6 percent from the field, and did not make a 3 -pointer in the game. Adams was the only player in double figures, and the Gamecocks lost a game in which she posted a double-double for the first time in her career.

## South Carolina 71, Mississippi 62 February 10, 2008 at Colonial Center (Columbia, S.C.)

Senior Ebony Jones matched her career high of 12 points, nine of which came in the second half, to lead South Carolina past Mississippi 71-62. The Gamecocks struggled shooting in the first half, but turned it on to hit 43.3 percent in the second half en route to out-scoring the Lady Rebels 44-35 after the break.

The first half was nip-and-tuck as both teams surged ahead by at least five points but could not wrest control of the game. The Lady Rebels benefited from 40 percent shooting and 12 points from Shawn Goff, while the Gamecocks got offense from a variety of sources.

After going into halftime tied, the Lady Rebels controlled but could not shake the Gamecocks early in the second period, taking three-point leads four different times. The last came on a long Carla Bartee jump shot at the right elbow at $9: 57$. Freshman Jewel May hit a layup on the secondary break to cut the margin to 47-48, and Jones put back an offensive rebound to give the Gamecocks at 49-48 lead at the 7:28 mark.

Back-to-back turnovers by Ole Miss left the door open for a bigger South Carolina lead, and Brionna Dickerson pushed it to 51-48 on a runner on the right baseline. Shantell Black's 3 -pointer at the top of the arc just 20 second later erased the lead, however. Black hit a pair of free throws to put the Lady Rebels back on top 53-51 with 4:55 left in the game.

Jones spotted up for a three at the left baseline to spark an 8-0 run. After Ilona Burgrova drew a charge, Jones added another triple from the left wing, and Burgrova nailed a hook for a $61-55$ margin with 3:08 left to play. From there, the game came down to free throw shooting, which the Gamecocks executed with precision, hitting 10-of-12 from the charity stripe in the final 2:25.

Four Gamecocks ended the game in double figures with Dickerson leading the way at 14 points. Jordan Jones matched Ebony Jones' 12 points, and Lakesha Tolliver added 10, including 8 -of- 9 from the free throw line. Burgrova snagged a game-high 10 rebounds and just missed a double-double with eight points.

## Auburn 83, South Carolina 72 February 17, 2008 at Beard-Eaves Memorial (Auburn, Ala.)

South Carolina dropped an 83-72 outing at Auburn, as the Tigers capitalized on a spate of Gamecock fouls to hit 29-0f-38 from the free throw line. Demetress Adams netted a season-high 17 points for South Carolina, all but four of which came in the second half.

The teams battled back and forth through most of the first half before Auburn surged to a 29-18 lead with just under five minutes to play, courtesy of an 8-0 run over a three-minute span. Ebony Jones ended the run with a 3 -pointer at the right wing, and, following an Auburn jumper, the Gamecocks went on a 6-0 run to narrow the gap to 27-31 with two minutes remaining. Adams did a bulk of the damage with a free throw to kick things off and a steal at half court, which she drove home for a layup to pull the Gamecocks within four. Jordan Greenleaf stemmed the tide with a shot-clock beating 3-point from the right wing, which Jordan Jones answered with her first 3-pointer of the game for a 30-34 South Carolina deficit.

With the Gamecocks trailing 37-33 at the half, Lakesha Tolliver opened the second half with a post move that pulled South Carolina within two right out of the block. Back-to-back buckets pushed the Tigers up seven at 16:44, when Adams and Jordan Jones combined to bring the Gamecocks back to 41-44 with 15:18 on the clock. The Tigers took advantage of fouls and missed shots to put together a 9-2 run and expand their lead to 53-43.

Adams and Jordan Jones were consistent for the Gamecocks, but the Tigers continued to ride the free-throw shooting of Bonner and maintained a nine-point edge with 7:39 left in the half. The steady trips to the stripe not only added points for the Tigers, but it forced Adams, Jones and Tolliver all to the bench with four fouls apiece.

Ilona Burgrova took up the offensive banner for the Gamecocks, scoring seven straight points to pull South Carolina within seven 63-70 with $3: 19$ left in the game. It was as close at the Gamecocks would get, however, as Auburn took advantage of 24 trips to the free-throw line, hitting 19 of those shots to collect the victory.

The Gamecocks out-shot the Tigers 49.2 percent to 45.3 percent, but took just 15 free throws to Auburn's 38 attempts in the game. Adams led the offense with 17 points on 7-of-11 shooting and grabbed a teamhigh nine rebounds. Jordan Jones and Burgrova joined her in doublefigure points with 12 and 10 points, respectively.

Miss State 58, South Carolina 54
February 21, 2008 at Colonial Center (Columbia, S.C.)

South Carolina suffered a $58-54$ loss to Mississippi State. The Gamecocks out-rebounded the Lady Bulldogs 41-32, but could not collect the extra possessions during crucial moments late in the game. Junior Demetress Adams and freshman Jordan Jones tied for team-high honors with 12 points each, while Adams pulled down a team-high eight rebounds, seven of which came in the second half.

The first half saw the Lady Bulldogs jump out to a 12-point lead behind sniper-like marksmanship from Alexis Rack, who hit three straight 3-pointers. Mississippi State led throughout the period, but Ilona Burgrova sent South Carolina to the locker room down just 28-32 with a mid-range jumper in the final minute.

The Gamecocks erased the deficit quickly in the second half as Jones drained a 3-pointer from the top of the arc, and Lakesha Tolliver hit a runner in the lane to put South Carolina on top for the first time 33-32. A Toll liver layup pushed the lead to three points and ended a two-minute scoring drought by both teams.

The game yo-yoed back and forth over the next seven minutes as the teams traded one-point leads. The Gamecocks broke the Lady Bulldogs' press to find Tolliver for a layup, but it was the last lead South Carolina would hold as Richard went on a one-woman 7-0 run to put her team up 52-48 at 4:34.

With both teams playing aggressive defense, offense was difficult to come by in the final minutes. Burgrova hit another free throw, and Brionna Dickerson sank a mid-range jumper off the dribble to get the Gamecocks within one. Ebony Jones finished off the rally with a 3-pointer from the left wing to put Carolina back in front $54-52$ with 2:21 to play. Porter knotted the game with a floater in the lane, then put the Lady Bulldogs up with a jumper from the free throw line extended.

Under a minute, the Gamecocks' rebounding woes came back to haunt them as the defense forced an awkward shot from Richard late in the shot clock. But Tysheka Grimes snagged the elusive rebound, allowing Richard to hit a runner in the lane with 12.2 seconds remaining. Trailing by four, the Gamecocks set up a play for either of the Jones'. Ebony got open on the left side, but her 3-pointer sailed long. Jordan collected the rebound on the opposite side of the floor, but the Lady Bulldogs were there to smother her defensively and not allow a shot.

South Carolina battled to a 69-65 victory over Florida using aggressive defense and solid free throw shooting down the stretch to pick up their first road SEC win of the season. Demetress Adams helped seal the victory with a critical offensive rebound and two free throws in the final 10 seconds and finished just short of her ninth double-double of the season with nine points and 11 rebounds. Freshman Samone Kennedy did collect a double-double with 10 points and 10 assists.

For the first time since SEC play began, the Gamecocks took a lead into halftime, but it took a big rally to get there. South Carolina pushed its lead up to 10 , scoring the first six points of the second half before Florida's Sha Brooks hit a pair of free throws to end the quick spurt. The lead got up to 12 on Kennedy's fast break layup, but the Gators narrowed it back to six at 50-56, taking advantage of both Demestress Adams and Ilona Burgrova going to the bench with four fouls each. Free throws helped Florida keep pace when shots wouldn't fall, and Depree Bowden capped the run with a driving layup with 8:17 on the clock.

The teams traded five-point surges, beginning with the Gamecocks' run to go up 61-50 with $6: 28$ in the game. Florida came right back with back-to-back buckets, including a 3 -pointer from Bowden to bring the Gators back within six just a minute later. Adams' layup made it a 63-55 game, but Brooks hit another 3-pointer from the right baseline to pull Florida within five. Back-to-back turnovers led to a pair of Gator layups and the Gamecocks' lead was down to 63-62 with 2:19 left to play.

After a pair of free throws from Brionna Dickerson, the Gators twice had a chance to back within one, but the Gamecock defense stepped up both times. On Burgrova's fifth foul, Dotson hit just one of two free throws for a 65-63 Gamecock lead. The Gators looked to make a defensive stand on Carolina's next possession, but saw Adams pull down her 11th rebound of the game on Dickerson's missed jump shot. With 10.3 on the clock, the junior forward hit both free throws. Brooks drove for a layup on the other end, and the Gators sent Kennedy to the line with 3.1 seconds left. The freshman rattled the first one home and sent the second one through smoothly to seal the Gamecocks' victory.

## VISITOR: South Carolina 69



In its final home game of the season, South Carolina came out strong but could not sustain the pressure in a 55-41 loss to No. 20 Georgia. The Gamecocks held a lead through the first six minutes of the game before a 13-0 run spanning four minutes gave the Lady Bulldogs an advantage they would not relinquish. Defensively, South Carolina held Georgia 15 points below its season average, but the Gamecocks hit just 30.4 percent from the field themselves to take the loss.

With the adrenaline of Senior Night coursing through the team, South Carolina's defensive pressure was immediate. Freshman Jordan Jones put the Gamecocks on the board first with a transition layup off senior Lakesha Tolliver's steal. Megan Darrah knotted things up with a pull-up jumper, which Brionna Dickerson answered with a jumper at the free throw line. After the Lady Bulldogs tied things up again, senior Ilona Burgrova was alone on the right block for a layup, and Tolliver made it an 8-4 lead with a pair of free throws at the 14:42 mark of the first half.

South Carolina 65, Kentucky 57 March 2, 2008 at Rupp Arena (Lexington, Ky.)

South Carolina senior Lakesha Tolliver recorded a doubledouble, but it was freshman Jordan Jones' seven-point run late in the second half that sealed a 65-57 win over Kentucky. Tolliver matched her career high with 21 points and snagged a career-best 12 rebounds. Kentucky fell behind early with 13.6 percent shooting in the first half before rallying to pull within three with three minutes left in the contest.

In a first half dominated by good Gamecock defense, Kentucky kept pace early thanks to a wealth of Gamecock fouls, which led to 20 free throws in the half. South Carolina on the other hand, hit 13 field goals, including three from 3-point range. Still the South Carolina interior was in foul trouble as Ilona Burgrova had three, Demetress Adams collected two, and freshman Jewel May actually fouled out before halftime.

The Gamecocks led 9-0 just two minutes into the contest before Kentucky hit a pair of free throws to get on the board at the 15:47 mark. Eleia Roddy hit UK's first field goal at the 13:27 mark. Appropriately, it was followed by a free throw that narrowed the deficit to 11-5. The Gamecocks opened a 13 -point margin with 5:57 left in the period as Brionna Dickerson opened the spurt with a put back, and Jones hit back-to-back 3-pointers. Tolliver capped the run with an offensive rebound and bucket, and the Gamecocks took a 31-19 lead into the break.

In the second half, the Wildcats turned the tables, holding the Gamecocks scoreless for 5:30 in the middle of the period. South Carolina held a $46-34$ advantage at the 10:46 mark but did not get another point on the board until Ashlie Billingslea hit a pair of free throws at 5:19. In the meantime, the Wildcats had put up 10 points, largely with dribble penetration, to cut their deficit to 44-48.

When the Wildcats closed within 52-49, Jones put the Gamecocks on her back with a personal 7-0 run. She sank a pair of free throws, drilled a 3-pointer from the right baseline, and finished a layup following a steal at midcourt to put the Gamecocks up by 10 with $1: 29$ left in the game.

## Florida 71, South Carolina 57 <br> March 6, 2008 at SEC Tourn. First Round (Nashville, Tenn.)

Cold shooting in the first half was South Carolina's undoing in a 71-57 loss to Florida in the first round of the SEC Tournament at the Sommet Center. While the Gators hit 6-of-15 from 3-point range in the first 20 minutes, the Gamecocks managed just 19.2 percent accuracy from the field in that period. The 17-point halftime deficit was too much to overcome, although South Carolina outscored Florida 40-37 in the half and improved its shooting to 45 percent.

The first half was an offensive struggle for the Gamecocks, who hit just 5-0f-26 from the field, while the Gators poured in 34 points, thanks in large part to 19 points from Depree Bowden. With turnovers and minimal offensive rebounding, the Gamecocks put just three points on the board over the final nine minutes of the half, yielding to the Gators a 34-17 lead by halftime.

The Gamecocks got on track offensively in the second half by stepping up the defensive pressure. South Carolina narrowed its deficit to 11 points with 12:21 left in the game, forcing a series of Gator turnovers and crashing the boards. Demetress Adams battled underneath three times for a put back, and Samone Kennedy swiped a steal and drove for a layup. After Bowden drove the left side of the lane for a layup to end a three-minute scoring drought for the Gators, South Carolina rattled off the next six points. Adams hit a layup from the left side, Kennedy finished another drive to the basket, and Ilona Burgrova made it a 31-42 deficit with a layup from the left block off a feed from Ebony Jones.

With just under 12 minutes remaining, the Gators answered with an 11-2 run to push their lead back to 20 at 53-33, going back to dribble penetration to get a series of layups. The Gamecocks had one more surge in them, going on a 12-2 run beginning at the 2:34 mark, but they ran out of game to finish the rally.

Burgrova led the team with 12 points, while Adams was a point and rebound shy of a double-double with nine points and a game-high nine rebounds. Kennedy handed out five assists to go with six points as well.

## South Carolina 102, N.C. A\&T 74 March 21, 2008 in Women's NIT First Round (Columbia, S.C.)

En route to a career-high 31 points, South Carolina freshman Jordan Jones broke the WNIT record and tied the school record with nine 3-pointers as the Gamecocks overpowered North Carolina A\&T 102-74 in the first round of the WNIT. After pushing the halttime lead up to 10 points, South Carolina took command of the game with a 23-2 start in the first six minutes of the second period.
N.C. A\&T jumped out to an eight-point lead right out of the gate, forcing the Gamecocks into three turnovers in their first five possessions. Brionna Dickerson, who scored 25 points in the game, stopped the bleeding with the Gamecocks' first 3 -pointer of the night to cut the deficit to 14-9. Demetress Adams hit back-to-back buckets to give South Carolina its first lead of the night, and a layup from Samone Kennedy made it a 19-16 Gamecock advantage with 12:34 left in the half.

As the Aggies continued to miss shots, the Gamecock lead quickly grew to double digits, reaching 13 points on Adams' steal and driving layup with 7:19 to go in the period. But N.C. A\&T was not done. A Gamecock turnover led to a jumper, which kicked off the 16-6 comeback for the Aggies, who forced four straight turnovers and netted the next seven points to get within 38-32 at the 2:53 mark. Jones buried another 3 -pointer from the right wing, but N.C. A\&T drew within three at 41-38.
With Jones now firing with the hot hand, the Gamecocks kicked the offense back into gear. A 3-pointer from the right sideline got the lead back to six, and Kennedy pushed it to eight with a runner in the lane. Jones capped the Gamecocks' highest-scoring half of the season with a mid-range jumper to send her team into the locker room up 48-38.

South Carolina opened the second half on a tear, and a 10-point lead grew to 31 in the first six minutes. The Gamecocks went on to score 54 points in the half and cruise to a 28-point victory.
Jones' 31 points are the most by a Gamecock freshman since Schonna Banner netted 37 against Cincinnati on Jan. 9, 1987. Her nine 3-pointers tied Shannon Johnson's school-record outing against Arizona State on Dec. 20, 1995, and topped the WNIT record of eight set by Jenny Lingor of Missouri State against lowa in 2005.

## NC State 72, South Carolina 69

March 24, 2008 in WNIT Second Round (Raleigh, N.C.)

South Carolina dropped a heartbreaking 72-69 decision at North Carolina State in the second round of the WNIT. The Gamecocks led for all but 2:45, but it was a six-point Wolfpack spurt in a four-second span late in the game that was South Carolina's undoing. The Wolfpack built their comeback on the glass, out-rebounding the Gamecocks 27-15 in the second half, including 16 offensive boards.

The Gamecocks took a 37-23 lead into halftime thanks to a defensive effort that held the Wolfpack to just 27.6 percent shooting. The tide turned in the second half as the Wolfpack came out the aggressors and held the Gamecocks scoreless over the first five minutes of the period. By that point, the 14-point lead had eroded to five points as Shayla Fields netted five points to pull the Wolfpack within $32-37$. The Gamecocks fought their way back to a 13 -point lead with a 10-2 run on the back of Demetress Adams, Ilona Burgrova and Lakesha Tolliver.

With the home fans growing restless, N.C. State had another surge, using second chance points to whittle the lead back down to five at 43-48. Jordan Jones answered with a 3-pointer, and Brionna Dickerson's layup made it a 10-point margin once again. Field drained a 3-pointer from the left baseline, and Lucy Ellison's layup from the left block pulled N.C. State back within five. After a Gamecock miss on the other end, the Wolfpack grabbed a pair of offensive rebounds before Sharnise Beal made it a three-point game with a layup underneath.

Again it was Jones that went back to work for the Gamecocks, hitting a layup, two free throws and a 3 -pointer. With the Gamecocks' lead hovering around four points for the next two minutes, neither team could wrest control of the outing. The Wolfpack made its decisive move following a 30-second time out with 2:31 to go. Nikitta Gartrell buried a 3-pointer from the right sideline to make it a 63-64 game. Whittington stole the Gamecocks' ensuing inbound pass right under the basket, hit a layup and was fouled. Converting the free throw, the Wolfpack took the lead scoring six points in a seven-second span.

The Gamecocks fought to reclaim the game, and Dickerson's 3 -pointer with two seconds left had them within a possession, but the Wolfpack was able to sink enough free throws to hold on to the win.
