## Gamecocks Make Second Straight Posiseason Trip

2006-07 team known for rebounding, blocked shots prowess; Simms hits 1,000-point mark

The South Carolina women's basketball team posted its second-straight winning season and made its second-consecutive trip to the Women's NIT in 200607, finishing with an 18-15 overall record and a 6-8 mark in Southeastern Conference play.

## 2006-07 In A Nutshell

Carolina finished eighth in the final SEC standings then went on to beat Auburn in the first round of the SEC Tournament before falling to SEC regular-season champion Tennessee in the second round.

The Gamecocks earned a first-round bye in the WNIT, blew out America East Conference regular-season champ Hartford by an 81-40 margin in the second round, then saw their season end with a 64-59 defeat at the hands of Hofstra in the third round.

## South Carolina From A Distance

Experience, height and depth were the three prongs of South Carolina's attack in 2006-07. The Gamecocks entered the season as the most experienced team in the nation in terms of game experience as the 13-player active roster boasted seven seniors, a redshirt junior and a pair of true juniors.

A total of seven different South Carolina players stood six feet or taller. The Gamecocks were the second-tallest team in the SEC, behind Auburn, and the 14thtallest team in the nation.

No Gamecock player averaged a double-figure scoring total, but seven Carolina players scored between 5.8 and 9.8 points per game.

## Narrow Miss Of An NCAA Tournament Bid

South Carolina was recognized as a bubble team for the NCAA Tournament by ESPN.com's Charlie Creme, who listed the Gamecocks as one of the top five teams left out of the Big Dance in his final NCAA Tournament bracket projection.

South Carolina was ranked No. 65 in the last version of the NCAA's RPI prior to the Tournament, which included games through March 5. The Gamecocks faced the nation's No. 35 schedule, according to the final Collegerpi.com strength of schedule rankings.

Carolina was in the discussion for a spot in the NCAA Tournament field thanks partly to the fact that the Gamecocks were one of only 18 teams in the nation to pick up a pair of wins over top-50 opposition since Feb. 15, as Carolina knocked off Auburn on Feb. 15, then came back to beat the Tigers again in the first round of the SEC Tournament on March 1.

Carolina split its last 10 games of the season but only lost to elite teams down the stretch, as the Gamecocks didn't lose a game to anyone ranked below No. 12 nationally since January 21.

South Carolina looked to become the fifth SEC team admitted into the NCAA Tournament field with a sub-. 500 record in conference play, as 2001 Arkansas, 2000 Vanderbilt and 1999 Florida all had 6-8 SEC records and got in, and 1997 Auburn compiled a 5-7 SEC mark to earn a spot in the Big Dance.

The SEC had the top conference RPI of any league in the nation, but it wasn't enough to sway the selection committee in Carolina's favor.

## Team Accomplishments

The Gamecocks earned a berth into the 2007 Women's NIT, marking the fourth time in the last six years that South Carolina played in the postseason.

With two wins over teams with RPIs in the top 50 coming out of conference tournament play, South Carolina had more quality wins than 23 teams that were
included into the NCAA Tournament field.
Carolina set new single-season school records for blocked shots (199), offensive rebounds (592), defensive rebounds (863) and rebounding margin (+8.5).

The Gamecocks pounded in-state rival Clemson by an 80-48 margin on Nov. 20, marking the second-straight year that Carolina has beaten Clemson by more than 30 points.

Carolina's 31-point bludgeoning of Clemson marked the third-most lopsided win in the 52-game series history.

South Carolina slammed Alabama by a 95-35 score on Jan. 14, marking the most lopsided victory for the Gamecocks against an SEC opponent since joining the leage in 1991-92. Carolina recorded 22 steals and forced the Crimson Tide into 34 turnovers. The Gamecocks held Alabama without a point for a span of 10 minutes and 39 seconds midway through the first half and spilling over into the beginning of the second half. The 60-point win over Alabama was the largest blowout since Carolina wiped out Bethune-Cookman by an 87-26 score in 2005.

The Gamecocks held No. 7 LSU to a season-low total of 49 points.
South Carolina established a new Colonial Center record by scoring 117 points in a 117-63 win over North Carolina A\&T on Nov. 17.

Carolina's 117 points against North Carolina A\&T tied for the fourth-most points scored in school history and were the most since the Gamecocks scored 117 points against East Tennessee State in 2000.

The South Carolina bench outscored North Carolina A\&T's bench 81-7

## Individual Accomplishments

Senior guard Lauren Simms became the 26th member of South Carolina's 1,000-point club with a baseline jumper in the second half of Carolina's game against LSU on Feb. 4. In reaching the 1,000-point mark, Simms became the sixth Columbia native to score 1,000 points with the hometown Gamecocks, joining Brantley Southers (1,982 points, 1981-86), Martha Parker (1,728 points, 1985-89), Shaunzinski Gortman (1,367 points, 1998-2002), Lisa Diaz (1,249 points, 1986-90) and Marsi McAlister (1,160 points, 1981-85)

Tennessee State in the Gamecocks' season opener on Nov. 12, scoring a game-high 23 points, 19 of which came in the second half. Johnson was the difference in the game, going on a 13-0 run by herself at a key moment of the second half to take a 62-51 Gamecock lead and blow it open to a 75-51 advantage in a span of only two minutes and 15 seconds to put the game out of reach. Johnson added six rebounds and five steals in the contest.

Senior forward Iva Sliskovic was recognized as SEC Player of the Week for her efforts against High Point and South Carolina State Dec. 20 and 23, respectively. Sliskovic turned in the most impressive performance of her career when she posted a triple-double in the Gamecocks' $87-49$ win over High Point, scoring 18 points, grabbing 15 rebounds and dishing out 10 assists. She came back to score 15 points, grab seven rebounds, dish out two assists and make four steals in only 22 minutes of action in Carolina's $85-42$ win over South Carolina State. Sliskovic averaged 16.5 points, 11.0 rebounds and 6.0 assists for the week and converted on 14-of-19 field goal attempts (.737).

Forward Lakesha Tolliver set a new single-season school record with 60 blocked shots. The previous record was 58, set by Teresa Geter in 2000-01.

Freshman forward Kellindra Zackery scored 28 points and grabbed 11 rebounds against North Carolina A\&T on Nov. 17 in only her third game on the collegiate level. Her 28 points ranked as the fourth-highest single-game scoring total by a freshman in school history.

Senior guard Stacy Booker set a season high with 27 points in the Gamecocks' 70-61 win over Auburn. Booker matched her career high with five 3-pointers made in that contest and scored the final nine points of the game to lift the Gamecocks to victory when the score was tied at 61.

Senior guard Lea Fabbri dished out 11 assists with only one turnover against North Carolina A\&T to set a new career high assist total. Her output tied for the fifth-highest singlegame assist total in school history.

Sophomore forward Demetress Adams posted the fourth double-double of her career when she scored 17 points and grabbed 11 rebounds against Clemson on Nov. 20.

Demetress Adams set a career high and matched a Colonial Center record with five blocked shots in the Gamecocks' win over Auburn.

Junior center Ilona Burgrova set a career high and matched a Colonial Center record with five blocked shots in the Gamecocks' 79-51 win over Florida.

Iva Sliskovic earned All-Tournament accolades at the South Carolina Thanksgiving Classic after averaging 11.5 points and 3.0 rebounds per game in contests against Mercer and La.-Lafayette. Sliskovic scored 16 points and grabbed five rebounds against the Regin' Cajuns in the championship game.

Sophomore guard Brionna Dickerson earned a spot on the SEC Community Service Team for her work in the Columbia area.

Junior forward Lakesha Tolliver blocked five shots at Mississippi State on Jan. 21 to match a career high and come just one block shy of matching the single-game school record.

Lauren Sims turned in 20-point scoring games at Georgia (25 points), Arkansas (23 points) and at Mississippi State (20 points).

Senior guard Channel Harris graduated in August with a degree in finance and a minor in psychology. She graduated cum laude.

Senior forward Larissa Kulcsar participated in graduation ceremonies on Dec. 18, earning a degree in international business. South Carolina has the No. 1-ranked international business major in the country.

## Season Recap

Carolina whipped arch-rival Clemson, 80-48 on Nov. 20, marking the secondstraight year in which the Gamecocks beat the Tigers by more than 30 points. The 31-point margin marked the third-most lopsided win in the 52-game series history.

The Gamecocks limited Mercer to 30 points in a $77-30$ victory in the first round of the South Carolina Thanksgiving Classic. Mercer's 30 points marked the thirdlowest total allowed by the Gamecocks in school history.

Forward Iva Sliskovic earned All-Tournament honors at the South Carolina Thanksgiving Classic after scoring 16 points and grabbing five rebounds in the championship game against La.-Lafayette.

December (5-1 record): Wins over Fordham, High Point, South Carolina State, Samford and UNC Wilmington; loss to No. 3 Oklahoma

Carolina's five December wins came by an average of 32.2 points per game.
Forward Iva Sliskovic was recognized as the SEC Player of the Week after posting a triple-double with 18 points, 15 rebounds and 10 assists in the Gamecocks' win over High Point.

Guard Lauren Simms posted her first career double-double with 14 points and 10 assists in Carolina's win over South Carolina State.
: No. 3 Oklahoma left the Colonial Center with a 78-51 win over the Gamecocks. The Sooners started both the first and the second halves with substantial runs that had Carolina playing catch-up all game.

January (4-5 record): Wins over Winthrop, Alabama, Florida and Kentucky; losses to Kentucky, No. 10 Stanford, No. 14 Vanderbilt, No. 24 Ole Miss and Mississippi State

The Gamecocks faced Winthrop on New Year's Day, limiting the Eagles to 30 points, which matched the third-lowest scoring total allowed by the Gamecocks in school history.

Carolina picked up its most lopsided SEC victory in school history when it romped to a 95-35 win over Alabama. The Gamecocks held the Crimson Tide scoreless for one span of 10 minutes and 39 seconds during the blowout.

The Gamecocks split a pair of games against Kentucky, with each team picking up a win on its home floor.

Forward Melanie Johnson posted back-to-back double-doubles in a pair of Carolina wins over Florida and Kentucky. Johnson scored 22 points and grabbed 12 rebounds against the Gators and went for 17 points and 12 rebounds against the Wildcats.

February (3-4 record): Wins over Arkansas, Auburn and Mississippi State; Iosses to No. 3 Tennessee, No. 7 LSU, No. 9 Georgia and No. 12 Vanderbilt
: The Gamecocks rallied from significant second-half deficits in two of their three February wins, as Carolina trailed Arkansas by 10 with 10:02 remaining and trailed Mississippi State by nine with with 14:14 remaining.
: Guard Lauren Simms scored her 1,000th career point when she sank a baseline jumper against LSU on Feb. 7.

Simms posted back-to-back 20-point scoring games against Arkansas (23 points) and Georgia (a season-high 25 points).
: Guard Stacy Booker erupted for 27 points in the Gamecocks' win over Auburn, draining five 3-pointers and scoring the final nine points of the game to seal the victory.

March (2-2 record): Wins over Auburn and Hartford; losses to No. 2 Tennessee and Hofstra

Carolina picked up a dramatic 65-63 win over Auburn in the first round of the SEC Tournament after forward Melanie Johnson found center Ilona Burgrova for the game-winning layup with 20 seconds remaining.
: The Gamecocks narrowly missed out on an NCAA Tournament bid, but qualified for the Women's NIT, where they picked up a resounding 81-48 win over Hartford.

Forward Lakesha Tolliver set a new school record when she blocked her 59th shot of the season against Hofstra. Tolliver added another block later in the game to set the new single-season record at 60 .

Carolina's Strong Finish Put It On An Elite List
The Gamecocks were one of only 18 teams in the nation to win a pair of games
over top-50 opposition from Fe. 15 through the end of conference tournament play. The only other teams able to make that claim were Tennessee, Duke, Connecticut, Maryland, Purdue, North Carolina, Vanderbilt, Oklahoma, LSU, Marquette, Rutgers, Texas A\&M, NC State, Iowa State, West Virginia, Oklahoma State and DePaul, all of which were included into the NCAA Tournament field.

## Quality Wins For The Gamecocks

With two wins over teams with RPIs in the top 50 through the end of conference tournament play, South Carolina had more quality wins than 23 teams that were included into the NCAA Tournament field. The Gamecocks added a third win over a top-50 team by routing No. 47 Hartford in the first round of the Women's NIT, 8140.

## SEC Plavers of the Week

A pair of Gamecocks earned SEC Player of the Week honors in 2006-07, giving South Carolina an even 10 all time. Melanie Johnson kicked things off by winning the award the first week of the season, and Iva Sliskovic took the honor in late December. It was the first time either player captured the title.

A preseason second-team All-SEC honoree, Johnson was the first Gamecock to win the award since Demetress Adams was recognized on Dec. 26, 2005.



In receiving the awards, Johnson and Sliskovic joined Shannon Johnson, Annie Lester, Teresa Geter, Shaunzinski Gortman, Kelly Morrone, Cristina Ciocan, Jocelyn Penn and Adams as the only Gamecocks so honored in their careers.

Johnson led South Carolina to a 78-53 victory over East Tennessee State in the Gamecocks' season opener on Nov. 12, scoring a game-high 23 points, 19 of which came in the second half. Johnson was the difference in the game, going on a 13-0 run by herself at a key moment of the second half to take a 62-51 Gamecock lead and blow it open to a $75-51$ advantage in a span of only two minutes and 15 seconds to put the game out of reach. Johnson added six rebounds and five steals in the contest.

Johnson's 23 points against East Tennessee State ranked as the second-highest scoring total of her career and marked her second-consecutive 20-point game, as she scored 21 points against Xavier in the final game of the 2005-06 season.

Sliskovic captured the honor for her efforts against High Point and South Carolina State. Sliskovic turned in the most impressive performance of her career when she posted a triple-double in the Gamecocks' $87-49$ win over High Point on Dec. 20, scoring 18 points, grabbing 15 rebounds and dishing out 10 assists. She came back to score 15 points, grab seven rebounds, dish out two assists and make four steals in only 22 minutes of action in Carolina's $85-42$ win over South Carolina State on Dec. 23. Sliskovic averaged 16.5 points, 11.0 rebounds and 6.0 assists for the week and converted on 14-0f-19 field goal attempts (.737).

A Season For The Record Books
Numerous school records fell in 2006-07, as the Gamecocks established new single-season marks for blocked shots (199), offensive rebounds (592), defensive rebounds (863) and rebounding margin (+8.5).

The Gamecocks blocked 199 shots as a team to surpass the previous school record of 193 set by the 2005-06 Gamecocks. In fact, the top three marks in school history have been set each of the past three years.

In addition, forward Lakesha Tolliver established a new single-season record for blocked shots with 60, surpassing the existing school record of 58 set by Teresa Geter in 2000-01.

The Gamecocks finished 2006-07 with a 15-5 record at home, matching the sin-gle-season school record for home victories set by the Gamecocks of 1979-80 and matched by the Elite Eight team of 2001-02. Carolina's 15 home wins in 2006-07 set a new Colonial Center record, surpassing the previous mark of 14 victories by the Gamecocks of 2002-03.

Speaking of Colonial Center records, both Ilona Burgrova and Demetress Adams matched the facility record for blocked shots in a single game, as Adams rejected five shots against Auburn on Feb. 15 and Burgrova swatted five shots against Florida on Jan. 25.

Simms Joins 1,000-Point Club
Senior guard Lauren Simms became the 26th member of South Carolina's 1,000-point club when she drained a baseline jumper in the second half the LSU game on Jan. 7.
In reaching the 1,000 -point mark, Simms became the sixth Columbia native to score 1,000 points with the hometown Gamecocks, joining Brantley Southers (1,982 points from 1981-86), Martha Parker (1,728 points from 1985-89), Shaunzinski Gortman (1,367 points from 1998-2002), Lisa Diaz (1,249 points from 1986-90) and Marsi McAlister (1,160 points from 1981-85). Of the 26 players currently in the Gamecocks' 1,000-point club, 16 are South Carolina natives.

Simms finished her career with 1,109 career points, a mark that puts her 20th on South Carolina's all-time scoring list.

Carolina Posts Biggest Blowout Over SEC Foe
South Carolina handed Alabama a 95-35 pounding on Jan. 14. The Gamecocks recorded 22 steals and forced the Crimson Tide into 34 turnovers and led by as many as 62 points in the second half. Carolina held Alabama scoreless for a span of 10 minutes and 39 seconds from the middle of the first half through the beginning of the second half.
The win marked the most lopsided ever by the Gamecocks over an SEC opponent and was the biggest Carolina blowout since the Gamecocks wiped out BethuneCookman by an 87-26 margin in 2005-06. The biggest blowout in school history was a 137-34 win over Wheeling College in 1979.

Carolina Bench Dominated The Opposition's
Though bench production is not measured in any conference or national rankings, South Carolina's non-starters certainly ranked as a formidable unit in 2006-07, as the Gamecock bench outscored that of the opposition by an overwhelming 1,086436 margin.

The Gamecock bench outscored its counterpart in alle but four on the season season, with the exceptions being Penn State, NC State, Samford and Tennessee.

Guard Injured Knee, Missed The Entire Season
South Carolina women's basketball player Lauren "Cocoa" Falohun sat out the season after sustaining an injury to her left knee during practice on Oct. 13.

A 5-foot-8 freshman point guard from Atlanta's Pace Academy, Falohun was expected to $\log$ significant minutes during her first year at the collegiate level. A firstteam All-State selection as a senior in high school, Falohun had caught the eye of Gamecock headcoach Susan Walvius as a player who could pressure opposing point guards with strong and physical play.
"It's tough to have this happen, but my role now is to support my teammates and work hard in my rehab to get back next year and continue everything that the team is doing this year," Falohun said after sustaining her injury. "I'm going to work hard and hopefully come back stronger than ever."

## South Carolina 78, East Tenn. St. 53 November 12, 2006 at Colonial Center (Columbia, S.C.)

Melanie Johnson scored 23 points, with 19 of those coming in the second half to lift South Carolina to a $78-53$ win over East Tennessee State at the Colonial Center.

A preseason second-team All-SEC selection, Johnson singlehandedly took control of the game in the second half, going on a 130 run by herself midway through the second half to break the game wide open. Though Johnson did the bulk of the scoring, it was the Gamecocks' pressure defense all over the floor that created many of Johnson's opportunities. Her performance marked the third 20-point game of her career.

Lakesha Tolliver added 15 points and seven rebounds with Iva Sliskovic contributing 13 points.

East Tennessee State hung around in the first half, never trailing by more than eight in the opening stanza, despite trailing the Gamecocks by a wide margin on the boards in the early going. In fact, the Lady Bucs caught and passed Carolina when Siarre Evans scored with 4:16 remaining in the half to give ETSU a $24-23$ lead. The Lady Bucs did not surrender the lead for the remainder of the half, taking a 32-28 advantage into halftime.

East Tennessee State did a good chunk of its damage from the charity stripe and beyond the arc in the first half, knocking down all 10 of its free throw attempts. Michele DeVault drained three of her seven attempts from 3-point range in the first half en route to leading all scorers with 13 points in the opening stanza. Tolliver led the Gamecocks with nine points and four rebounds at the half.

It was more of the same to start the second half, as Brooke Wilhoit's trey at the 17:26 mark extended ETSU's lead to $39-32$. Sliskovic helped narrow the margin with an easy score underneath followed by a pair of free throws to cut the deficit to 39-36. Demetress Adams then scored and was fouled, knocking down the free throw to tie the game at 39 with 14:42 remaining.

The teams traded baskets until South Carolina erupted for an 11-0 run sparked by full-court pressure defense that led to easy opportunities around the basket. The run gave the Gamecocks a $55-45$ lead with 9:46 remaining, setting up Johnson's outburst that iced the game.

Penn State 68, South Carolina 57<br>November 14, 2006 at Bryce Jordan Center (State College, Pa.)

South Carolina could not make up for a cold shooting night against Penn State as the Lady Lions claimed a $68-57$ win at Bryce Jordan Center in University Park, Pa. The Gamecocks hit just 27.8\% from the field in the first half ( $10-0 f-36$ ) and fared no better in the second half at $26 \%$ (7-0f-27).

Lauren Simms scored all 12 of her points in the second half to lead the Gamecocks. Iva Sliskovic also scored in double-digits with 10 points, while freshman Kellindra Zackery netted her first field goals of the season to finish with nine points.

Senior Shannel Harris, playing with a broken shooting hand suffered in Carolina's opening win against East Tennessee State, was perfect from the field ( 2 -for-2) for four points while also contributing four rebounds, one block, one assist and one steal.

South Carolina had trouble shooting from the start, hitting only 3 -of-25 in the first 14 minutes and allowing the Lady Lions jump to an early 12 point lead (25-13). However, the defense by the Gamecocks began to pick up the pace as it forced 12 Penn State turnovers in the middle of an 18-6 South Carolina run that tied the game going into the half.

Any momentum that the Gamecocks carried into the locker room at the half was erased early as the Lady Lions opened the second period on an 10-0 run. Melanie Johnson picked up her fourth personal foul with 14:43 remaining and eventually fouled out of the game after playing just 15 minutes.

The Gamecocks trimmed the deficit to only two points when Sliskovic knocked down a jumper from the top of the key at the 9:10 mark to bring the score to 48-46, but Penn State followed that with a 13-3 run that put the game out of reach.

South Carolina 117, N.C. A\&T 63<br>November 17, 2006 at Colonial Center (Columbia, S.C.)

Five South Carolina players scored in double figures as the Gamecocks cruised to a record 117-63 victory over North Carolina A\&T the Colonial Center. The 117 points scored was a Colonial Center record and the fourth-most points scored in USC women's basketball history.

Freshman Kellindra Zackery anchored a Carolina offense that posted the fifth-highest scoring first half in Carolina history with 12 points and seven rebounds in 10 minutes in the first half. She finished with 28 points and 11 rebounds, the first double-double for a freshman since Demetress Adams hit 12 points and 10 rebounds against Bethune-Cookman in December 2005.

The Gamecocks enjoyed a strong effort from the bench, getting 81 points from their non-starters. Adams contributed 18 points along with three blocks and two steals. Stacy Booker and Iva Sliskovic each posted 11 points with Brionna Dickerson rounding out the doubledigit scorers with 10 points.

It was the defense, however, that broke the game open as the Gamecocks scored 19 points off 17 forced first half Bulldog turnovers. South Carolina only committed one turnover in the opening 20 minutes of the game.

North Carolina A\&T never led in the game, but kept the game close in the opening eight minutes before Carolina limited the Bulldogs to three points over a six minute span. During the run, the Gamecocks outscored the Bulldogs 23-3 en route to a 57-30 halftime lead.

Carolina stayed just as hot in the second half, opening on a 21-5 run, during which Lea Fabbri dished out five assists to put her in double-digits in assists for the first time this season. She finished with a career-high 11 assists, the most since Cristina Ciocan dished out a school-record 18 in 2003 against Florida A\&M. Carolina continued its hot shooting throughout the half, going 24-for-41 for a $58.5 \%$ clip.

The 60 points scored in the second half was the second-highest total for a final period in team history.

The Garnet and Black outscored Clemson, 20-4, including a stretch of 18 unanswered points, for a 25-13 lead at the 11:38 mark.

South Carolina got off to a fast start and never looked back in its 77-30 win over Mercer in the first round of the South Carolina Thanksgiving Classic.

Carolina opened the game with a 20-0 run and held Mercer scoreless until Erin Keller knocked down a pair of free throws at the 10:11 mark. The Gamecocks did not surrender a field goal until the TaShera Lewis knocked down a jumper at the 7:39 mark.

Carolina took a 44-13 lead into the locker room at halftime, holding Mercer to 4-of-22 (18.2\%) and 0-of-7 shooting from 3-point range. The Gamecocks, meanwhile, converted on 17 of their 28 first-half field goal attempts ( $60.7 \%$ ). Mercer's 13 first-half turnovers matched its first-half scoring total.

It was more of the same to start the second half, as the Gamecocks opened the half on a 16-2 run to open a 60-15 lead with 11:23 remaining. Lakesha Tolliver finished with a game-high 13 points with Lauren Simms scoring 12 points and grabbing a season-high six rebounds. Stacy Booker rounded out Carolina's double-figure performers, scoring 10 points and dishing out three assists. Demetress Adams finished with seven points and 10 rebounds.

Carolina forced Mercer into 26 turnovers in the game, marking the fifth time in as many games that the Gamecocks forced the opposition into more than 20 turnovers. The Bears' 30 points ranked as the fewest for a Carolina opponent since the Gamecocks handed Bethune-Cookman an 87-26 beating at the Colonial Center in 2005-06.

South Carolina fell to Louisiana-Lafayette 83-68 in the championship game of the South Carolina Thanksgiving Classic.

Iva Sliskovic led the Gamecocks with 16 points and was the only Gamecock to make the All-Tournament team. Demetress Adams led the team with 10 rebounds before fouling out of the game, while Lea Fabbri contributed 13 points, and Lauren Simms added 11 points and eight rebounds for the Gamecocks. Five players scored in double-digits for the Ragin' Cajuns, with Jeanenne Colbert hitting a game-high 20 points. Tournament MVP Yolanda Jones contributed 18 points, while Sonora Edwards had the game's only double-double with 17 points and 11 rebounds.

Combined with the poorest shooting half of the season by South Carolina, Louisiana-Lafayette lit up the net from beyond the arc to take the early lead. The Ragin' Cajuns hit 7-0f-14 from beyond the arc, including a 2-for-3 effort from Jones, as they marched to a 42-26 lead at the break.

Carolina went the first 4:37 of the game without a field goal, going 0 -for-12 before Lakesha Tolliver broke the drought with a lay-up. The cold streak looked to be over for USC as the Gamecocks then hit four of their next eight shots to tie the game at 11-11. Following the second-consecutive basket by Sliskovic to tie the game, the Ragin' Cajuns went on a 24-6 run - highlighted by a 12-2 rush led by Jones - for a 35-17 lead to put the game out of reach with five minutes remaining in the first half.

Both teams remained relatively constant in the second half. Louisi-ana-Lafayette extended the lead to as many as 21 points before Carolina, led by Fabbri's nine second-half points, trimmed the lead to the final margin.

South Carolina was able to claw back from a 12-point deficit but couldn't make its free throws in the final minutes as North Carolina State pushed back to a $53-41$ win at Reynolds Coliseum.

North Carolina State showed early that its gameplan was to go inside on the Gamecocks as its leading scorer Khadijah Whittington received the first few looks in the paint. However the stifling defense of Iva Sliskovic and Demetress Adams kept the Wolfpack post players ineffective after USC took its first lead 5-3 on a Sliskovic jumper.

Neither team could find its shooting touch in the first half. South Carolina went the first $3: 18$ of the game without a field goal and shot 7-for-34 in the half (20.6\%). North Carolina State fared no better at 6 -for-26 $(23.1 \%)$ in the first half as the team's deadlocked 18-18 at the break.

Sliskovic single-handedly kept USC within reach in the second half as she scored Carolina's first nine points of the half. Her ninth point trimmed the NC State lead to $28-27$ with over 13 minutes to play, but the Wolfpack began to pull away when no other Gamecock scored until Ilona Burgrova's open look with 10:52 remaining cut the lead to 34-29.

North Carolina State took its first double-digit lead of the game (39-29) after making a free throw when Lea Fabbri fouled out of the game. The Wolfpack extended the lead to as many as 12 points before defense helped the Gamecocks push the lead down to five at 46-41 with only 51 seconds remaining. Despite entering the game as the SEC leader in free throw percentage, Lauren Simms only connected on 1-0f-4 free throws in the final minute, and the Wolfpack was able to run away with the game.

## South Carolina 77, Fordham 38 <br> December 3, 2006 at Colonial Center (Columbia, S.C.)

Using its best defensive performance of the season and numerous individual season-best performances, South Carolina routed Fordham 77-38 at the Colonial Center.

Stacy Booker ended a two-game scoring drought with a seasonhigh 19 points, scoring all but three of them in the second half. Sophomore Brionna Dickerson's 10 points tied her career-high, while Iva Sliskovic hit double-digit rebounds for the first time this season with 10 boards. Shannel Harris led the Carolina defensive effort with two blocks to tie her career high.

Sliskovic earned her first defensive rebound of the game with 10:16 remaining in the first half to tie Shaunzinski Gortman for fifth place on the all-time defensive rebounding list with 406 boards. She then claimed sole possession of fifth place with her 407th defensive rebound 54 seconds later.

Lauren Simms helped lead South Carolina to an early 12-5 lead before Fordham junior Beth Troutt hit a trey with 13:34 remaining in the first half. The Gamecocks then used stifling defense to hold the Rams scoreless for the next 9:26 as Carolina went on an 18-0 run to blow the game away. Six players scored during the run, led by Demetress Adams' four points, to give Carolina a 30-11 lead.

The Gamecocks registered 14 steals in the first half, including six during the 18-0 run that put the game out of reach. Carolina played 12 of 13 players on its active roster in the first half with nine scoring in the opening period. Sliskovic and Simms both registered season high numbers in assists and steals in the first half, with Sliskovic getting two of each and Simms recording four assists and two steals. Sliskovic finished the game with three assists and a career-high four steals, while Simms finished with a season-high five steals and a career-high seven assists.

\#3 Oklahoma 78, South Carolina 51 December 7, 2006 at Colonial Center (Columbia, S.C.)

South Carolina dropped a 78-51 decision to No. 3 Oklahoma at the Colonial Center.

Stacy Booker and Melanie Johnson led the Gamecocks with 10 points, with all of Booker's coming in the first half. Oklahoma center Courtney Paris led all scorers with 15 points and 16 rebounds to post the game's only double-double. Despite winning the turnover battle (12-23), the Carolina offense could not match Oklahoma's as the Sooners posted 40 points in the paint and shot $58 \%$ for the game to Carolina's 29\%.

The first half was one of small runs by the Sooners to keep the Gamecocks at bay. Carolina was dealt an early blow when leading scorer Iva Sliskovic picked up her second foul 38 seconds after the opening tip. Oklahoma began to pull away with a 9-2 lead before Melanie Johnson got a steal and pulled up the jumper to end the run. Stacy Booker, retaining the shooting touch she displayed in the previous game against Fordham, brought the Gamecocks within two at 15-13 after hitting her second-consecutive 3-pointer with 12:09 remaining in the half.

Using backdoor cuts and screens, the Sooners responded with two smalls runs - 4-0 and 6-0-to take the first double-digit lead of the game at $26-16$ with $8: 30$ remaining. Working out of its full court press, Carolina used Sliskovic and Ilona Burgrova to double-team Paris for the remainder of the half, keeping the lead at an eight-point differential into the break. The Gamecocks had a few opportunities to cut the lead in the final minute but were held silent after Sliskovic picked up her third foul with 56 seconds remaining in the half.

2006-07 Box Scores/Recaps

South Carolina 87, High Point 49 December 20, 2006 at Colonial Center (Columbia, s.c.)

Iva Sliskovic recorded South Carolina's first triple-double in four years in leading the Gamecocks to a $87-49$ romp over High Point. Sliskovic posted 18 points, 15 rebounds and 10 assists to become the first Gamecock to record the feat since Cristina Ciocan posted 22 points, 10 rebounds and 13 assists against Clemson in 2003.

Sliskovic's 18 points was a season high, and her 10 assists were a career high. It was also her first double-double of the season. Melanie Johnson recorded 17 points and seven rebounds for the Gamecocks, while Lauren Simms scored 12 points. Making her first start of the season, Ilona Burgrova scored a season-high 11 points.

High Point used 3-pointers to keep the game close in the opening minutes before the Gamecocks used a 16-0 run lasting 3:12 to break the game away early. With Carolina leading 8-6, Sliskovic led the rally with a jumper, followed by consecutive fast break baskets from Johnson and Simms. Johnson next connected with her fourth 3-pointer of the season to give Carolina the 18-6 double-digit lead. A free throw by Burgrova and consecutive jumpers from Stacy Booker and Simms pushed the Gamecocks ahead 24-6 before High Point was able to stop its scoring drought with a shot from the top of the key.

The offensive spurts went stagnant over the next five minutes as both teams traded baskets for much of the rest of the half. The lead stayed around 16 points until Johnson began to take over in the final three minutes, scoring Carolina's last 10 points of the half, bringing her first-half total to 16 points on 6-of-8 shooting.

With the first half belonging to Johnson, the second half was Sliskovic's. The senior from Croatia remained on the court for the majority of the half and scored 12 of her 18 points in the second half to help push Carolina's lead into the 30's. The Gamecock lead never went below 26 in the final stanza and increased to as many as 39 when Sliskovic found Simms in the corner for a 3-pointer with 1:38 remaining. Coincidentally, the play gave Sliskovic her 10th assist for the triple-double.

South Carolina 85, S. Carolina St. 42 December 23, 2006 at Colonial Center (Columbia, S.C.)

Five Gamecocks scored in doubles figures as South Carolina ran its 2006-07 record to $7-4$ with an 85-42 victory over South Carolina State. It marked the Gamecocks' third win in their last four games.

Iva Sliskovic led South Carolina in scoring with 15 points, going a perfect 6 -for-6 from the floor, and she totaled seven boards. Lauren Simms had her first career double-double, coming on a season-high 14 points and a career-best 10 assists. Brionna Dickerson established a new career standard with a dozen points, while Lakesha Tolliver equaled that amount for her third double-digit scoring effort of the season. Tolliver went a perfect 8-for-8 from the free-throw line. Kellindra Zackery had 10 points and missed just one of her six attempts from the floor.

South Carolina had its best shooting percentage of the year with a 57.6 percent mark (34-0f-59), while the Bulldogs mustered just a 26.3 figure (15-0f-57).

The Gamecocks raced out to an 18-3 advantage in the first 4:22 of the game, hitting 8-of-9 from the floor. Sliskovic made all three of her attempts during the stretch and led all scorers at halftime with 10 points while adding five rebounds.

South Carolina's early 15-point lead was trimmed to nine over the next $9: 46$ with a 13-9 run by the Bulldogs. Dickerson ended the Gamecocks' 0 -for-8 slump on field goal tries with a jumper at the $5: 13$ mark to put her team ahead 27-16. USC ended the half strong with a 14-4 tear over the final 5:08 to go up 39-20 at the intermission.

The Gamecocks' lead only increased in the second half. Up 58-36 with 10:06 to play, South Carolina outscored the Bulldogs 27-6 the remainder of the period. Tolliver tallied 10 of her 12 points in the game's final 10 minutes

## South Carolina 64, Samford 56 <br> December 28, 2006 at Colonial Center (Columbia, s.C.)

Lauren Simms' 6 -0f-6 effort at the free-throw line in the final 1:02 helped preserve a $64-56$ victory for South Carolina against Samford at the Colonial Center.

Simms led all scorers with 15 points on 4-of-11 shooting and was a perfect 7-of-7 at the charity stripe. She added a career-high eight rebounds and chipped in three assists and two steals as well. Iva Sliskovic hit double figures in the scoring column for the third-straight game with 12 while adding 11 boards for her second double-double in 2006-07. Melanie Johnson was USC's other double-digit scorer with 13.

Carolina held a 12-10 advantage with 11:44 remaining in the first half following a free throw by Demetress Adams. Samford grabbed the lead on the next possession with a three by MaKenzie Spruiell, but the Gamecocks countered with a $7-0$ run in $2: 24$

The Bulldogs were still within three at $24-21$ with $2: 51$ showing on the scoreboard. South Carolina proceeded to go on an 8-0 tear in just 1:33 to go ahead 32-21 with 1:07 to play in the period. The Gamecocks led 32-22 at halftime.

South Carolina extended its winning streak to four games with a 75-42 thrashing of UNC Wilmington.

Four South Carolina players hit double figures in scoring, led by Melanie Johnson's 14. She added 10 rebounds as well for her first double-double of the year and 13th of her career. Ilona Burgrova tallied her first career double-double with 10 points and a career-high 12 rebounds. Stacy Booker had a dozen points for her fifth doublefigure outing of the year, and Brionna Dickerson had a career-high 13 off the bench.

The Gamecocks' size advantage resulted in a 44-18 scoring disparity in the paint. Carolina also rejected 12 Seahawk shots, the sec-ond-most in school history.

South Carolina shot above 50 percent for the fourth time in 200607 , making $30-0 f-57$ for a .526 figure. The Gamecocks limited UNC Wilmington to just 13 field goals and 24.1 percent shooting (13-of54). USC also dominated the glass with a $57-23$ rebounding edge, its best of the season.

The Gamecocks began the contest with eight points in less than three minutes, the first four of which came from Booker. Carolina opened up a double-digit advantage for the first time after Demetress Adams canned a jumper with just over 10 minutes remaining in the stanza, making the score 15-5.

UNC Wilmington was able to close the deficit to seven, 17-10, following a couple of free throws by Sahsha Taylor with 6:42 showing on the clock. USC managed to build its lead back up to as many as 14 with dominant inside play before taking a 31-19 advantage into the locker room. The Gamecocks outscored the Seahawks 26-8 in the paint during the first period.

South Carolina came out with an 18-4 run in just over six minutes to start the second half and essentially seal the victory.

Winthrop's 30 points matched the third lowest point total ever allowed by South Carolina. Dickerson led all scorers on her 8-0f-10 effort, her second-consecutive game in double-figure scoring

Lauren Simms was the only other Gamecock in double figures, finishing with 10 points and five assists in a game where 11 of 13 players scored. Lea Fabbri added eight points and six assists off the bench along with Shannel Harris' season high seven points.

The Gamecocks forced a season-high 29 turnovers, and all five starters registered at least two steals as the Gamecocks finished with 17 on the night.

The South Carolina defense held Winthrop to one field goal in the opening five minutes to push to an early 9-2 lead. The Eagles clawed back to within four points before the Gamecocks held them scoreless in the final 6:37 of the half while going on a 15-0 scoring run. Five different players scored in the run, including Dickerson who added six of her 10 first half points, as Carolina went into the half with a 34-13 lead.

USC opened the second half much the same way it ended the first, using strong defense to build its lead. Averaging 13.8 steals per game as one of the nation's top teams in takeaways, the Gamecocks forced six steals in the opening four minutes of the half.

South Carolina lost a 59-55 decision to Kentucky at Memorial Coliseum in the Southeastern Conference opener for both teams.

After Kentucky got out to a 13-8 lead to start the game, Carolina trimmed the lead to 13-12 after a Brionna Dickerson bucket underneath with 10 minutes remaining. UK regrouped, however, and expanded its lead to 33-17 before the Gamecocks scored the last four points of the first half to go into the locker room down 33-21 at intermission.

Kentucky's Samantha Mahoney led all scorers with 14 points in the first half and finished with a game-high 19 points, and Sarah Elliott added 16 points to the Wildcat effort. After being held scoreless in the previous game against Winthrop, Lakesha Tolliver led the Gamecocks with eight points in the first half, most of which came as a result of back-to-the-basket moves. Her team-high 14 points in the game fell just one point shy of her season high. Stacy Booker added 11 points, and Lauren Simms finished with 10.

The two teams traded buckets for the first 12 minutes of the second half, but the Gamecocks made a push to trim the Wildcat lead to 49-43 after an Ilona Burgrova score with 6:28 remaining. Elliott knocked down a pair of key jumpers from the top of the key to move the Wildcat advantage to $53-43$ with $3: 33$ remaining and put the game out of reach.

A 3-pointer by Booker with 56 seconds left cut the Wildcats' lead to 55-50. After a pair of made free throws by Kentucky's Jenny Pfeiffer, Dickerson sunk a trey from the corner to bring the score to 57-53 with 11 seconds left. Brooke Smith talked to head coach Tara VanDerveer earlier in the day about looking more for her shot. And Smith just plain put on a show with that signature hook shot. She made her first six field-goal attempts on the way to a season-high 28 points, leading No. 10 Stanford to its 10th-straight win with a 69-54 victory over South Carolina.

Candice Wiggins had 15 points, five rebounds and three assists in the Cardinal's first game back in the top 10 since starting the season ranked fourth before losing to BYU on Nov. 13 in their second game.

Smith shot 14-of-17, tying her career high for shots made, and grabbed seven rebounds as the Cardinal extended their longest winning streak since getting 23 in a row two years ago.

Stacy Booker had 17 points with five 3-pointers and seven rebounds in South Carolina's second-straight loss following a five-game winning streak.

Kristen Newlin scored six straight points, and Stanford built a 50-35 lead with 14:45 to play. She finished with eight points, while freshman Jayne Appel came off the bench to add seven points, seven boards, three assists, three blocks and two steals. Fellow freshman JJ Hones had five assists.

Booker cut Stanford's lead to 59-50 on a 3-pointer with 7:20 left, then hit another long jumper the next time down the floor to make it 59-53 before Smith's basket on the other end started an 8-0 Stanford spurt.

Stanford out-rebounded South Carolina 47-36, with four players grabbing seven or more rebounds for the third-straight game.

The Gamecocks forced the Cardinal into 15 turnovers in the first meeting between the schools, but had no answer for Smith and Wiggins.


## \#14 Vanderbilt 67, South Carolina 66 January 11, 2007 at Colonial Center (Columbia, S.C.)

South Carolina led for all but 22.6 seconds against the nation's 14th ranked team but Vanderbilt led when it mattered most, edging past the Gamecocks 67-66 at the Colonial Center.

Leading 66-65 with 39 seconds remaining in the game, the Gamecocks committed three turnovers, and the Commodores took advantage to take the lead in the final seconds of the game. Iva Sliskovic's defensive rebound on two missed free throws by Carla Thomas with 29 seconds remaining seemed to seal the deal for Carolina. However, the Gamecocks turned the ball over once again, and Sliskovic fouled Dee Davis on the next play.

Davis sank both free throws to take the 67-66 lead, giving the Gamecocks a chance to score the final basket, but Lakesha Tolliver's final shot did not fall.

Stacy Booker scored 14 points on 5-0f-12 shooting to lead the Gamecocks, her fourth time in double figures in the last five games. Lauren Simms was Carolina's other double-digit scorer with 11 points. Tolliver added nine points and a season high nine rebounds in her third start of the season. Thomas led all scorers with 26 points for Vanderbilt.

Running out to a 14-5 lead to open the game, the Gamecocks held the high-scoring Vanderbilt offense in check until the Commodores began focusing on the post game and outside shots by Williams. The Commodores twice closed within two points of the Gamecocks in the opening stanza. Both teams struggled late in the half to make defensive stops until the Gamecocks went on a 9-2 run to increase the lead to 36-27. Thomas began to take command of her team in the final two minutes to cut the deficit to 38-31 at the half.

In the opening minutes of the second half, both teams traded points before Carolina again pushed ahead with an 8-0 run to increase its lead to 54-41 with nine minutes left to play in the game. The Commodores relied on full-court pressure to bait the Gamecocks into 27 turnovers, the second-most Carolina giveaways this season. Leading 60-49 with six minutes remaining in the game, the Gamecocks appeared to be in good shape but committed four turnovers in the final 90 seconds to seal their fate.

A 33-3 run over a 14:49 period, including 18-0 to end the first half, Ied South Carolina to a 95-35 rout of Alabama, for the team's largest blowout win ever over an SEC opponent.

Lauren Simms led South Carolina with 12 points, four assists and five steals in the game. Brionna Dickerson added 10 points and a game-high five assists with Melanie Johnson contributing 10 points and three steals in 10 minutes of play. Lakesha Tolliver pulled down a career-high 10 rebounds to go with nine points and tied season-highs of three assists, three blocks and two steals. All 13 players on South Carolina's active roster scored for the first time this season.

South Carolina limited Alabama to four first half field goals, three coming from beyond the arc. The win gave the Gamecocks three consecutive wins against Alabama and victories in seven of the last nine contests.

Leading 7-6 early in the game, the Gamecocks began to run away with the game on an 8-0 run that left the Tide scoreless for 5:39. Alabama later hit two 3-pointers to cut the deficit to 24-14 with $8: 25$ remaining in the first half, but the shots would not fall afterwards as the Gamecocks cruised to an 18-0 run to take a 42-14 lead at the half. The Tide missed 10 field goals in the drought, going into the half on 4-of-24 shooting ( $17 \%$ ) to South Carolina's 15-0f-38 first-half effort (40\%).

Melanie Johnson pulled down her second double-double of the season as South Carolina defeated Florida 79-51 at the Colonial Center. Johnson scored 22 points - 19 in the second half - and a season-high 12 rebounds to lead the Gamecocks.

Iva Sliskovic and Lauren Simms both inched closer to the 1,000-point plateau with Sliskovic scoring 12 points and Simms adding 10. Ilona Burgrova set a new career-high with five blocks, surpassing her previous high of four set in 2005 against Tennessee.

The Gators claimed the opening tip and ensuing basket, but the Gamecock defense took control the rest of the way as Carolina went on a $25-3$ run spanning the next 12 minutes. The Gamecocks held Florida scoreless for a span of eight minutes and five seconds during that run.

A timeout called by Sout Carolina head coach Susan Walvius provided spark to the team, and the Gamecocks raced to an $8-0$ run to increase its lead to $33-12$ with $2: 48$ remaining in the half. The teams went into the half with Carolina enjoying a $35-16$ lead.

Carolina was 16 -of-40 (40 percent) from the field in the first half and limited the Gators at 6 -of-32 ( 18.8 percent) in the opening stanza, including 2-of-21 to start the game. ## South Carolina 66, Kentucky 56 <br> January 28, 2007 a a Colonial Center (Columbia, S.C.)

Melanie Johnson recorded her second consecutive doubledouble and tied her season high with 12 rebounds as South Carolina defeated Kentucky 66-56 at the Colonial Center.

Johnson collected 12 rebounds for the second-consecutive game and scored a team-high 17 points after scoring only two in the first half. Stacy Booker contributed nine points - all coming in the second half - along with six rebounds

South Carolina entered the game No. 6 in the nation in rebounding margin at +10.8 on the season and out-rebounded Kentucky 53-33. The Gamecocks forced 19 turnovers in the game to keep their lead, despite shooting 27 percent ( 10 -of-37) in the first half and 32 percent (20-of-62) overall.

The South Carolina defense came out early and forced a shot clock violation on Kentucky's opening possession. Leading 11-10 with 12:45 remaining in the half, the Gamecocks went on a 10-2 run over the next six minutes to go ahead 21-12, their largest lead of the half. The Wildcats clawed back within reach in the closing minutes with Jennifer Humphrey hitting a free throw with 10 seconds remaining as Carolina went into the half with a 28-26 lead.

The Gamecocks forced 12 first-half turnovers, six coming from steals. Carolina also enjoyed an early rebounding advantage of 24-17 after collecting 15 offensive boards in the first half.

Kentucky took its first lead of the second half, 38-37, but led for the final time, 44-43, on a 3-pointer with 9:09 remaining in the game. The Gamecocks proceeded on a 9-0 run started by a putback and free throw by Johnson. Booker grabbed a defensive rebound on Kentucky's next possession and drove the length of the court to put in a layup between two defenders. A layup by Johnson and two free throws on Carolina's next two possessions capped the run, and the Gamecocks never trailed again.

The Wildcats were able to close within three points at $57-54$, but the Gamecocks outscored Kentucky 9-2 over the final 3:18 to seal the victory.

## \#3 Tennessee 72, South Carolina 36

February 1, 2007 at Thompson-Boling Arena (Knoxville, Tenn.)
South Carolina turned the ball over a season-high 34 times as it fell to No. 3 Tennessee, 72-36, at Thompson-Boling Arena. Tennessee scored 31 points off Carolina's turnovers and improved to 16-0 against the Gamecocks in Knoxville.

Ilona Burgrova led the Gamecocks with eight points, eight rebounds and two blocked shots, and Melanie Johnson added eight points. Tennessee's Candace Parker scored a game-high 13 points and 12 rebounds, despite being limited to two field goals. Parker converted on 8 -of-10 free throws to score in double figures. Shannon Bobbitt also added 13 points with Alberta Auguste contributing 10 points and five steals for Tennessee.

Despite holding the Tennessee offense in check in the opening minutes - allowing only four points in the first five minutes - Carolina's offense was stagnant in the first half as the Lady Vols opened the game on a 16-0 run over the first nine minutes of play. The Gamecocks did not score their first points until Johnson made a layup with 10:10 remaining in the first half to make the score 16-2.

The Gamecocks, who had committed 14 turnovers in each of the past two games, turned the ball over 18 times in the opening half. Carolina managed to hit 29 percent of its shots in the first half (5-of17), while the Lady Vols hit 42 percent (13-of-31) to open the game.

Only three Gamecocks scored in the first half as Burgrova led the team with seven points in the opening half on 3-of-3 shooting. Johnson and Lauren Simms both added two points in the opening stanza.

The Lady Vols increased the lead to 36 points in the second half with the score 61-25 before the Gamecocks put together a 7-0 run in 58 seconds to cut the lead to 62-32 with 3:30 remaining. UT's lead swelled to as many as 38 points, $72-34$, in the final seconds before Demetress Adams made a jump shot with 17 seconds remaining for the final margin.


## \#7 LSU 49, South Carolina 46

February 4, 2007 at Colonial Center (Columbia, S.C.)
Sylvia Fowles had 23 points and 20 rebounds to lift seventhranked LSU to a 49-46 victory over the South Carolina. LSU shot a season-worst 27.6 percent ( 16 -of-58) and was held to its lowest point total of the year.

Fowles made eight of 12 field goals, but her biggest points may have been her final two from the free throw line when the Lady Tigers were up 45-44 with 1:40 to go.

Fowles missed the first of a one-and-one situation, but South Carolina's Lakesha Tolliver was whistled for a lane violation. Given a second chance, Fowles made them both to give the Lady Tigers a 47-44 lead.

Moments later with the lead down to 47-46, Fowles grabbed Stacy Booker's attempt to save the ball from going out of bounds with 25 seconds to go

Still, the Gamecocks had prime opportunities at the end to tie the game.

After LSU's Erica White hit two foul shots, South Carolina got two chances to tie. Lauren Simms' long 3-pointer went around the rim and out with 12.7 seconds left and, when Ashley Thomas missed a pair of free throws for the Lady Tigers, Melanie Johnson hit the top of the backboard on her try as time expired.
"It's disappointing for our kids because they know they're that close," South Carolina head coach Susan Walvius said. "It comes down to a turnover, it comes down to a rebound, it comes down to a stop. It's little things over the course of that game that can add up for you."

Lauren Simms scored a season-high 23 points coming off the bench as South Carolina defeated Arkansas 74-69 at the Bud Walton Arena. The victory was also the first ever for the Gamecocks in Fayetteville as the Lady Razorbacks held an 8-0 advantage at home prior to the contest.

Lakesha Tolliver matched a career high with 19 points to go along with five rebounds. Shannel Harris tied her season high with 10 points and matched her career high with eight rebounds to help lead the Gamecocks.

South Carolina trailed by as many as 10 points in the second half before going on an 11-0 run over 4:55 to take its second lead of the game and claim the win. Trailing 64-59 with $5: 34$ remaining in the game, Simms knocked down a jumper to pull within three. Larissa Kulcsar drew an Arkansas charging foul on the next possession before Tolliver hit a layup to pull within one at 64-63. On Arkansas's next possession, Tolliver stole the ball, and the Gamecocks pushed it up court before turning it over themselves, but Stacy Booker took the ball away from Leslie Howard and hit a layup to take the 65-64 lead with three minutes remaining.

A 3-pointer by Simms and shot by Tolliver increased the lead to 70-64 before the Lady Razorbacks ended the drought with an open layup with 39 seconds remaining. The Gamecocks hit late free throws and held on for the win.

 February 11, 2007 at Stegeman Coliseum (Athens, Ga.)South Carolina's strong second half led by Lauren Simms couldn't make up for its turnover-filled first half as No. 9 Georgia defeated the Gamecocks 81-57 at Stegeman Coliseum. Simms, who set a new season-high at Arkansas, hit a new high for the second-consecutive game with 25 points to lead the Gamecocks.

Georgia responded from an early Carolina lead by going on a 33-4 run in the middle of the first half to put the game out of reach early. The Gamecocks committed 18 turnovers in the first half - 12 coming from Georgia steals - as the Lady Bulldogs recorded 23 first-half points off the turnovers.

Brionna Dickerson added 11 points off the bench for Carolina, nine points during a span of two minutes and 44 seconds early in the second half. Four Georgia players scored in double digits, led by Tasha Humphrey's double-double with 23 points and 11 rebounds.

Georgia's full-court pressure allowed it to grab runs of 19-0 and $14-0$ in the first half as the Lady Bulldogs led $36-8$ with just under six minutes remaining in the half. Simms then went on a 7-0 run herself in a span of 51 seconds after hitting a 3 -pointer and consecutive jumpers off steals by Demetress Adams and Ilona Burgrova. Melanie Johnson hit two free throws to close the margin to 36-17 before Georgia fought back for a 46-21 lead to end the half.

Simms led the Gamecocks with 18 points in a physical second half, but Carolina never pulled within 20 points. Stacy Booker hit a season-high 27 points and scored the final nine points of the game in leading South Carolina to a $70-61$ win over Auburn at the Colonial Center

Booker added three steals and four assists to go with her 27 points off the bench, courtesy of a 9-0f-14 effort from the field. Iva Sliskovic inched closer to the 1,000-point plateau with 13 points and 10 rebounds, her third double-double of the season. Sliskovic now has 963 career points. Sherell Hobbs led the Tigers with a team-high 16 points and six rebounds.

The Gamecocks stifled Auburn over the final 3:07 of the first half, outscoring the Tigers 11-0 to turn a three-point deficit into a 33-25 halftime lead. Booker hit three of her career-high five 3-pointers in the opening stanza as she coasted to 11 points in the first half.

Auburn twice pulled within two points early in the second half before the Gamecocks went on a 15-4 run in a span of four minutes and 48 seconds to increase their lead to double-digits, $57-45$, with 9:31 remaining. ## \#12 Vanderbilt 83, South Carolina 65 February 18, 2007 at Memorial Gym (Nashville, Tenn.)

South Carolina dropped an 83-65 decision at No. 12 Vanderbilt after Commodore guard Caroline Williams hit six 3-pointers at Memorial Gym.

Williams had a career day for Vanderbilt, scoring 26 points on 8-of-10 shooting, including 6-of-8 beyond the arc. Melanie Johnson led the Gamecocks with 14 points and nine rebounds. Stacy Booker and Shannel Harris each added nine points for Carolina in the final road game of the regular season.

Vanderbilt, No. 2 nationally in field goal percentage (50.3) and No. 1 in 3-point percentage (43.0), hit 61 percent of its shots from the field and 53 percent beyond the arc ( $8-0 \mathrm{of}-15$ ). The Commodores also hit 19-of-20 free throws in the game. South Carolina was 23-0f-66 (35\%) from the field and out-rebounded the Commodores $35-30$ with most of the rebounds (24) coming from offensive boards.

Vanderbilt, riding a six-game winning streak, got off to a hot start with a 13-2 run to begin the game. South Carolina struggled with its shots in the early drought, going 1-for-9 with four turnovers while the Commodores hit 5-of-7 shots in the opening run. The Gamecocks never closed within nine points for the rest of the game as Vanderbilt stayed hot from the field, led by Williams who scored 19 points in the opening half on 7-of-8 shooting including a 5-of-6 effort from 3-point range.

The lead swelled to as many as 30 points early in the second half before Carolina rallied with 8-2 and 10-2 runs to cut the deficit to 7655 with $5: 29$ remaining. However the Gamecocks emergence began with too little time left on the clock.

The Gamecocks entered the game No. 11 in the nation in steals per game (12.11) and matched that number while forcing 21 Vanderbilt turnovers.

## South Carolina 72, Miss. St. 66 (OT) <br> February 25, 2007 at Colonial Center (Columbia, S.C.)

Stacy Booker took control in front of 3,466 fans to help South Carolina claim a 72-66 Senior Day victory over Mississippi State at the Colonial Center. The win was Carolina's first overtime victory since an 87-81 triumph over No. 9 Duke in 2001.

Booker led all scorers with 18 points, nine coming in overtime, and also added six rebounds and three assists. Lakesha Tolliver added 17 points, seven rebounds and three blocks, while senior Lauren Simms added 11 points. Demetress Adams recorded five points, nine rebounds and four blocks for the Gamecocks.

Playing in its first overtime game of the season, Carolina never slowed down, scoring the first five points of the extra period to take the lead for good. Booker's 3 -pointer to make the score 62-59 was South Carolina's first lead since $3: 58$ remained in the first half. Mississippi State closed to within two points, 68-66, with 19 seconds remaining in the game, but Booker hit four consecutive free throws to claim the win.

The Gamecocks fell behind 7-0 early in the first half before going on a 14-2 run to claim a 14-9 lead. Carolina forced Mississippi State turnovers on three consecutive possessions, and Tolliver scored eight points during the run to take the lead. The Bulldogs reclaimed the lead, 22-21, in the midst of outscoring Carolina 11-5 to end the half and take a $28-25$ lead heading into the break.

The Bulldogs increased their lead to nine points twice in the early part of the second half, but the Gamecocks chipped the lead to a onepoint differential both times. The teams traded baskets until Simms was fouled on a 3-point attempt with 1:16 remaining. Simms sank all three free throws to cut the Mississippi State lead to 57-56, and Tolliver and Booker's press forced a turnover on the Bulldogs' next possession.

Two free throws by Mississippi State freshman Alexis Rack pushed the score to $59-56$ with 18 seconds remaining, but Carolina's Tolliver was fouled on a 3-point attempt after a timeout. After sinking all three shots to tie the game 59-59, Booker's pressure on Mississippi State's guards forced a turnover with two seconds remaining and the game went into overtime.

South Carolina 65, Auburn 63<br>March 1, 2007 at SEC Tournament-First Round (Duluth, Ga.)

South Carolina overcame an 11-point second-half deficit to defeat Auburn, 65-63, in the opening round of the Southeastern Conference Tournament at the Gwinnett Center in Duluth, Ga.

Auburn's first-team All-SEC performer DeWanna Bonner led all scorers with 21 points, but it was a trio of Gamecocks seniors and a redshirt-junior that turned the game in Carolina's favor. Stacy Booker scored 14 points, Lauren Simms added 11 points, and Melanie Johnson had her fourth double-double of the season with 10 points and 10 rebounds to lead the Gamecocks. Lakesha Tolliver scored 12 points.

Thursday's opening round game saw nine ties and 14 lead changes with the largest lead a 48-37 Auburn advantage in the second half. Despite committing 21 turnovers and shooting 50 percent from the free throw line (8-of-16), the Gamecocks were able to come back for the victory after outrebounding the Tigers 42-31 and shooting 53 percent in the second half.

The first half was back-and-forth throughout, featuring five ties, five lead changes and no lead larger than four points by either team. The two teams combined to shoot 18 -for-58 (31\%) in the opening stanza, but South Carolina held a significant advantage on the boards with a 28-16 rebounding edge.

With the score tied 33-33 with 17:13 remaining in the second half, Auburn rushed to a 14-4 run over the next six minutes and 11 seconds to take the largest lead of the game, 48-37. However, the Gamecocks limited the Tigers to only one field goal over the next five minutes and tied the game, 54-54, on a jumper by Johnson with 6:03 remaining. Auburn again increased its lead to five points, but a 3-pointer by Booker and layup by Tolliver tied the game, followed by a free throw by Burgrova to put the Gamecocks on top 62-61.

Auburn's Keke Carrier hit two free throws with 32 seconds remaining to take a 63-62 lead, but a layup by Burgrova on the other end with 20 seconds remaining gave the Gamecocks the lead for good.

## \#2 Tennessee 81, South Carolina 63 March 2, 2007 at SEC Tournament-Second Round (Duluth, Ga.)

South Carolina suffered an 81-63 defeat to top-seeded Tennessee in the quarterfinals of the Southeastern Conference Tournament played at the Gwinnett Center.

Carolina played tough but couldn't overcome a 16-5 Tennessee run to open the second half after trailing 40-28 at the break. Lakesha Tolliver led the Gamecocks with 13 points, and Melanie Johnson contributed 11 points, six rebounds and five steals. Tennessee's Sidney Spencer led all scorers with 22 points, while Alexis Hornbuckle added 17 points. Candace Parker, the SEC Player of the Year, notched her 18th double-double of the season but was held to 10 points against Carolina, which tied for her second-lowest point total of the season and fourth lowest of her career.

Tennessee used an 11-2 run early in the first half to put the lead into double-digits at 23-10. The Gamecocks responded with a 9-1 run to pull within five points, but the Lady Vols responded with a 12-3 run to hold a 14-point advantage, $36-22$, with $1: 54$ remaining for their biggest lead of the half. South Carolina rattled off six consecutive points over the next minute before the Lady Vols hit two field goals, including a jumper at the buzzer, to head into the half with a 40-28 advantage.

Both teams hit 40 percent of their field goals in the first half and were matched closely in turnovers and rebounds, but the Lady Vols held a 12-4 advantage in second chance points to help keep the dou-ble-digit advantage in the first half. They finished the game with a 20-8 second chance point advantage.

The Lady Vols built the lead to as many as 29 points in the second half. South Carolina guard Brionna Dickerson, who scored all nine of her points in the second half, sparked a 14-4 Carolina rally to bring the score to 71-52, but the Gamecocks never pulled closer than 18 points.

## South Carolina 81, Hartford 40

March 18, 2007 in Women's NIT Second Round (Columbia, S.C.)
South Carolina routed Hartford, 81-40, in the second round of the Women's NIT at the Colonial Center. Melanie Johnson led the Gamecocks with 18 points as South Carolina won its first postseason tournament game since the 2002-03 team advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Lauren Simms added 10 points for the Gamecocks in a game where 12 of 13 eligible players scored for Carolina. Lea Fabbri dished out nine assists for South Carolina, her second-highest total of the season. MaryLynne Schaefer led the Hawks with 15 points on 5 -of-12 shooting, all of which came from 3-point range.

South Carolina converted on $34-0$ - -55 from the field $(61.8 \% \mathrm{t})$, marking the sixth-highest field goal percentage in school history and the highest ever at the Colonial Center. The Gamecocks held a 4232 rebounding edge and dished out 23 assists to Hartford's 11. The Gamecocks held a 29-0 edge in fast break points.

South Carolina came out firing on all cylinders, scoring on six of their first seven possessions and starting the game 6-of-6 from the field to take an early $12-5$ lead. Hartford came within two, 12-10, with 13:54 remaining in the half but was held scoreless over the next eight minutes and 34 seconds as the Gamecocks surged on a 20-0 run, capped by a put back layup by Kellindra Zackery with 5:47 remaining in the half.

Hartford, regular-season champions of the America East Conference, entered the game with the nation's No. 3 scoring defense ( 52.4 ppg ) and No. 13 field goal percentage defense (. 355 percent). The Gamecocks were only the second team to post over 70 points on the Hawks this season.

Junior Lakesha Tolliver continued to close in on the single-season blocked shots list after collecting three blocks against the Hawks, all in a 60 -second span midway through the first half. Tolliver has 57 blocks on the year, second to Teresa Geter's 58 rejections in the 200001 season.

## Hofstra 64, South Carolina 59

March 21, 2007 in Women's NIT Third Round (Columbia, S.C.)

South Carolina fell to Hofstra, 64-59, in the third round of the Women's NIT at the Colonial Center. Though it handily out-rebounded Hofstra, 51-38, South Carolina could not overcome 20 turnovers and 33.8 percent shooting from the field. The Gamecocks had chances to close the gap, but were unable to make enough plays down the stretch to steal a win.

The opening half was a back and forth affair with the lead changing hands five times. Hofstra took the lead during a Gamecock scoring drought that lasted more than five minutes. With Carolina struggling from the field, hitting just 9-of-32 shots, a modest 9-3 run by the Pride was enough for a 27-23 lead at halftime.

Behind a continued physical defensive effort, Hofstra maintained its lead for the remainder of the game. The Pride held on to its advantage through the first 10 minutes of the second half and peaked the lead at seven with 10:37 to play. The Gamecocks finally tied the game at 48 on a made basket from Lakesha Tolliver with $8: 23$ remaining, but The Pride went up 50-48 at the 7:50 mark and after another 50-50 tie, Carolina was left playing catch up the rest of the way.

Lauren Simms led South Carolina in scoring by knocking down 12 points. She also grabbed seven boards in her final game. Tolliver joined Simms in double figures with 10 points and eight rebounds.

With three first-half blocks, Tolliver broke the South Carolina single-season record. Tolliver's 60 blocks moved her ahead of Teresa Geter's mark of 58 , which was set in 2000-01. Carolina blocked eight shots and also set a new team single-season record. The Gamecocks' 199 blocks surpassed the 2005-06 team's 193.

Lizanne Murphy paced Hofstra with 18 points on 7-0f-12 shooting and Vanessa Gidden added 17 and six rebounds.
