Junior Year (2007-08)

Named to the All-SEC second team by both the league's coaches and the Associated Press, and to the All-Defensive Team ... earned a spot on the SEC Winter Sports Academic Honor Roll ... led the Gamecocks and ranked fourth in the SEC with 8.9 rebounds per game ... was second on the team and 19th in the league at 10.9 ppg ... was the team's leading scorer seven times and the leading rebounder in 22 games ... reached double figures in points in 21 games and recorded eight double-doubles ... blocked 55 shots, the third-highest season total in school history, to move into fourth place in program history in career blocks ... snagged a team-high eight rebounds in the WNIT second-round loss at NC State ... tied her career high with eight field goals en route to 18 points and added nine rebounds in just 23 minutes against North Carolina A&T in the first round of the WNIT ... just missed a double-double with nine points and a team-high nine rebounds against Florida in the SEC Tournament ... pulled down a team-high seven rebounds against No. 20 Georgia ... grabbed a game-high 11 rebounds, including a critical offensive board in the final 10 seconds, to go with nine points at Florida ... tied for team-high honors with 12 points on 6-of-12 shooting and snagged a game-high eight rebounds, seven in the second half, against Mississippi State ... paced the team at Auburn with 17 points and nine rebounds in just 27 minutes ... picked up double-digit rebounds for the third-straight game with 10 boards at Vanderbilt ... broke a 33-year-old school record with 26 rebounds, including a school-record 17 on the defensive end, against Arkansas, which also tied her for the most by an SEC player since the league began sponsoring women's basketball in 1982-83 ... went on to record a double-double against the Lady Razorbacks, adding a team-high 18 points on 7-of-10 shooting ... was the lone Gamecock to shine at No. 8 LSU with 15 points and 11 rebounds ... netted 10 points on 5-of-9 shooting to go with seven rebounds and five steals against No. 2 Tennessee ... collected her sixth double-double of the season with 12 rebounds, including a career-high eight on the offensive end, and 11 points against Savannah State, adding five steals and three blocks ... narrowly missed a double-double against UNC Asheville with a team-high 12 rebounds and eight points to go with a team-high five assists and five blocked shots ... added a career-high six steals and a career-high tying five blocks to her 10-point, 12-rebound effort at Clemson ... netted 12 points and grabbed six rebounds while handing out four assists, blocking four shots and swiping four steals against Alabama A&M ... shot a perfect 3-of-3 for nine points at No. 2 UConn ... narrowly missed a triple-double with a career-high eight assists, 13 rebounds and 12 points against Jackson State ... posted her second double-double in as many games with 11 points and 11 rebounds against Charleston Southern ... pulled down a career-high 13 rebounds and added 11 points for her second double-double of the season against UNC Wilmington ... sank a career-high eight shots against Penn State en route to a team-high 17 points and grabbed eight rebounds ... scored a career-high 21 points against Saint Francis (Pa.), going 7-of-8 from the free throw line, and completed the double-double with 12 rebounds.

Sophomore Year (2006-07)

Participated in USA Basketball's 2007 U-21/Pan Am National Team trials in May ... named to the SEC Winter Sports Academic Honor Roll ... set a season-high with seven offensive rebounds against Hofstra in the third round of the WNIT ... matched a Colonial Center record with five blocked shots in win over Auburn, including a crucial block late in the game that helped seal the victory ... collected nine rebounds and blocked two shots against No. 7 LSU ... also scored seven points, grabbed seven rebounds, recorded four steals and blocked a shot in that game ... scored eight points on 4-of-5 shooting and grabbed five rebounds at No. 24 Mississippi ... netted nine points in SEC wins over both Alabama and Kentucky ... blocked three shots against Mercer ... enjoyed the best game of her career when she scored 17 points, grabbed 11 rebounds, dished out two assists, blocked two shots and recorded two steals in the win over in-state rival Clemson ... matched her then-career high with 18 points against North Carolina A&T, adding three blocked shots ... set a new career high with five assists in the season-opening win over East Tennessee State.

Freshman Year (2005-06)

Earned a tryout for the USA Basketball U20 National Team during the summer of 2006 ... earned a spot on the SEC All-Freshman Team ... scored a career-high 18 points and grabbed five rebounds in only 24 minutes of action against Kentucky, then came back to score 18 more points and grab nine rebounds in win at Florida ... netted

11 points and grabbed nine boards in win at Alabama ... was SEC Player of the Week and SEC Freshman of the Week after posting consecutive double-doubles against Savannah State and Bethune-Cookman, becoming the first Gamecock since 2003 to be named SEC Player of the Week ... scored 17 points and grabbed 10 rebounds in only 18 minutes against Savannah State ... added 11 points and four blocked shots against Ohio ... scored 11 points in only 21 minutes in upset of No. 14 Minnesota ... tallied eight points, grabbed nine rebounds, blocked two shots and recorded five steals in 38 minutes against No. 18 Texas at the Junkanoo Jam ... posted a game-high 17 points and collect nine rebounds against Winthrop ... notched a double-double in her first collegiate game with 11 points and 12 rebounds against High Point.

Played on the varsity team of coach Dorothy Fortune for five seasons, winning four state championships and five conference titles in her career ... earned Class AA player of the year honors her junior and senior seasons and was a two-time SCBCA AA All-State selection (2003, 2004) ... scored 16 points, grabbed 12 rebounds and blocked eight shots in the state championship game her senior year ... selected as the No. 31 senior in the nation by *All-Star Girls Report*, as well as being tabbed as the 28th-best by *Roundball Journal* ... ranked as a top-100 player by the *Blue*

Star Index and was ranked as high as the fourth-best post player in the nation ... earned All-South honors from the *Orlando Sentinel* in 2004 and 2005 after earning honorable mention recognition in 2003 ... tabbed as a Player of the Week honoree by WLTX-TV as a senior ... recorded 24.2 points, 14.6 rebounds, 7.2 blocked shots and 3.2 steals per game as a junior ... was an honorable mention selection to the 2004 *Street & Smith's* All-America team ... named adidas Top Ten Camp Upperclass All-Star in both 2003 and 2004 ... attended the McDonald's All-American camp during the winter of 2004 ... graduated as class salutatorian and was voted Miss Lee Central by her classmates ... served as president of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes at Lee Central and the vice president of the senior class ... was a member of the Beta Club, National Honor Society and National High School Honor Roll.

Junior Year (2007-08)

Earned a spot on the SEC Winter Sports Academic Honor Roll ... was named to the SEC Community Service Team ... finished third on the team with 10.4 ppg ... netted nine points in the WNIT second-round game at NC State ... hit 11-of-13 from the field, including 3-of-3 from long range, to net 25 points in just 29 minutes against North Carolina A&T in the first round of the WNIT ... nearly recorded her first career double-double with 12 points and a career-high nine rebounds, including four on the offensive end, at Kentucky ... led the team with 11 points against No. 20 Georgia ... kicked in eight points at Florida ... scored a team-high 14 points against Mississippi, matching her career highs in free throws made and attempted ... netted 15 points and grabbed six rebounds against Arkansas ... matched Ilona Burgrova's 12 points and six rebounds against Florida to tie for team-high honors in both categories ... scored nine points and handed out three assists against Kentucky ... picked up her second-straight 18-point game with 5-of-10 shooting against Savannah State ... had her most productive game since returning from a foot injury, scoring a team-high 18 points on 9-of-15 shooting against UNC Asheville ... handed out four assists to go with 10 points at Clemson ... hit 5-of-8 from the field for 12 points and swiped a career-high four steals against Alabama A&M ... returned to the lineup at No. 2 UConn after missing all or most of the previous five games with a foot injury, scoring seven points and leading the team with a career-high seven rebounds ... scored 11 points against Penn State ... set a career-high with 27 points on 10-of-19 shooting, including 5-of-7 from 3-point range, against Virginia ... opened the season with a 17-point outing against Saint Francis (Pa.), shooting 8-of-16 from the field and handing out four assists.

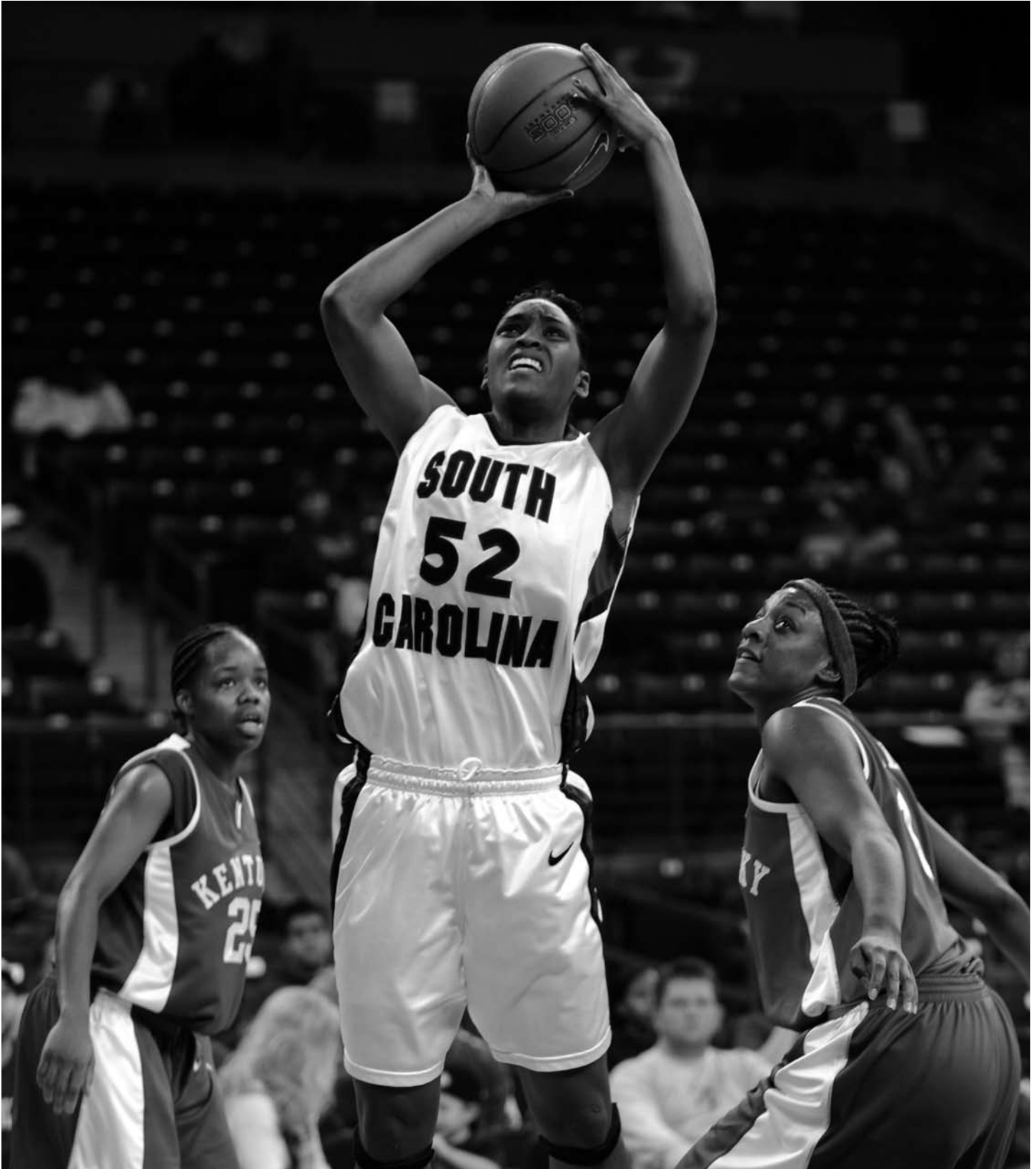

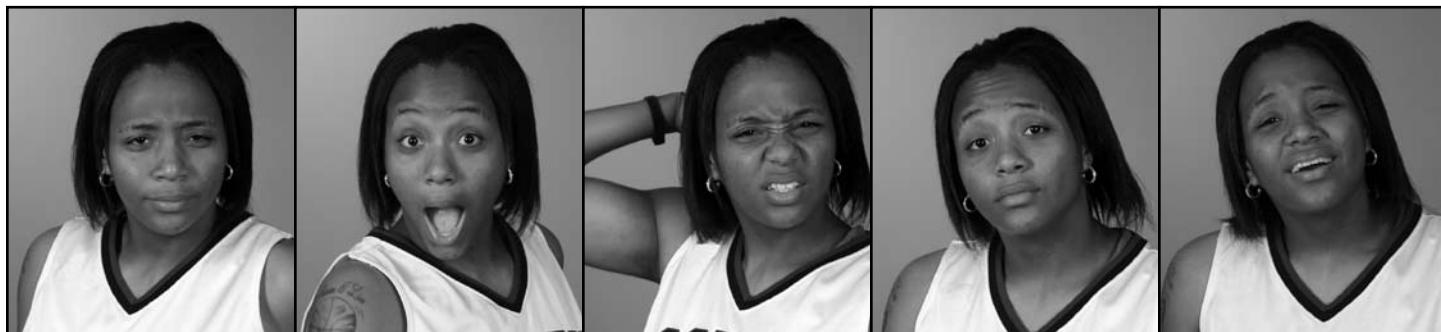
