## ATHLETICS DIRECTOR - ERIC HYMAN



Regarded as an architect of championship programs, an advocate for academic success and a skilled administrator, Athletics Director Eric Hyman began his duties at South Carolina on July 1, 2005.

Hyman has developed an outstanding reputation as a leader among his peers. He was named the 2003-04 Street and Smith's Business Journal National Athletics Director of the Year and was also selected as the Division I-A West Regional Athletics Director of the Year by the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA). In September 2008, he assumed the duties as President of the Division 1A Athletic Directors' Association.

Hyman has been a featured speaker at numerous conventions, including the NCAA Champions Forum, to speak on diversity issues in athletics, and the American Football Coaches' Association, guiding young assistant coaches on how to become a head coach. He is also a regular presenter at the I-A Athletic Directors Institute.

Under Hyman's leadership, the South Carolina Athletics Department has made tremendous strides in becoming a nationally prominent Division 1-A athletics program with the goal of competing for championships in all sports, while winning the school's first men's national championship in any sport with the baseball team's College World Series title in June 2010. In March, the women's soccer team brought home its first SEC championship, and in May, the women's golf team captured the East Regional title. The football team went to its fifth bowl game, having been eligible for each of the last six seasons, a modern record for consecutive winning seasons. During the 2009-10 school year, nine of the school's 20 intercollegiate programs finished in the top 25 of the nation and nearly every athletic team has competed in postseason play since Hyman's arrival.

His hiring of successful head coaches, like men's basketball coach Darrin Horn and women's basketball coach Dawn Staley, the development of a \$200 million master plan of facilities, and the school's first athletics capital campaign have taken South Carolina athletics to new heights. Hyman has successfully guided the department through a football seat donation initiative, which, along with philanthropic gifts and money guaranteed through the new television agreement, has provided the financial resources to begin bringing the Gamecock facilities up to the standards of their SEC rivals.

Under Hyman's tenure, the Carolina Stadium state-of-the-art baseball facility opened in the spring of 2009, and the Dodie Anderson Academic Enrichment Center opened its doors in February 2010. In addition, the athletic training room, recruiting room, locker room and entryway at Williams-Brice Stadium have all recently received major upgrades. The football coaches' offices are currently being renovated, and a players' lounge has also been added. Men's and women's basketball lockerrooms have been renovated along with the coaches' offices. Major suite renovations are taking place at William-Brice following the successful addition of the Champion Club suites over the past two years. Upon Hyman's arrival the stadium was dressed up with graphics and recognition of record holding players.

Over the next couple of years, Hyman's master plan includes converting the Farmer's Market into a football parking lot and tailgate area for the fans, further improvements to Williams-Brice Stadium, building a coaches' support building, a parking garage and tennis courts, and renovating the softball and track facilities at the new Athletics Village, whose cornerstone building is the new Dodie Anderson Academic Enrichment Center.

In 2008-09, South Carolina football, men's basketball and baseball all finished with a .500 or better league mark for the first time since joining the SEC. In addition, the women's tennis team reached the NCAA Elite Eight, while the men's outdoor track & field team posted a sixth-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Men's basketball tied for the SEC Eastern Division title and baseball went to the regionals.

Off the field, South Carolina student-athletes have combined to surpass the 3.0 grade point average plateau for seven consecutive semesters and are regularly among the leaders in the SEC Academic Honor Roll. In Spring 2009, a record 15 of 17 athletic teams topped the 3.0 standard, with football, men's basketball and men's soccer all achieving their highest team GPAs on record. South Carolina APR scores have continually improved under Hyman's watch.

Hyman came to South Carolina from TCU, where he served as the athletics director for over seven years. Under his direction, TCU teams recorded 32 conference titles and consistently posted a graduation percentage rate higher than that of the overall student body. Hyman was instrumental in orchestrating TCU's invitation to join Conference USA in July 2001 and spearheading the effort for the Horned Frogs to join the Mountain West Conference in July 2005, moving the program from the Western Athletic Conference it was in when Hyman arrived. During Hyman's tenure, the TCU football team went to six bowl games in seven seasons, boasted a Heisman Trophy candidate in LaDainian Tomlinson and was ranked as high as sixth in the BCS polls; the women's basketball team went to five straight NCAA Tournaments; the baseball team earned back-to-back regional appearances for the first time in school history; and the men's indoor and outdoor track and field and men's tennis teams finished their seasons ranked among the top five in the nation.

As TCU's athletics director, Hyman worked diligently to improve athletic facilities. He helped raise over \$30 million in facility improvements and directed a three-phase building plan that completely renovated the athletic department's facilities.

Prior to his stint in Fort Worth, Hyman was the athletics director at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio, and VMI in Lexington, Va., and Executive Associate Athletics Director at North Carolina State University in Raleigh, N.C., and Associate Athletics Director at Furman University in Greenville, S.C. He also coached football at Furman University for nine years under Art Baker and Dick Sheridan.

Hyman earned a master's degree in educational administration from Furman in 1975. He and his wife, Pauline, together coached the women's basketball team at North Greenville University in Tigerville, S.C., leading the team to national rankings in the '70s.

Hyman graduated from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill where he was an all-ACC football player, on the Dean's list and selected for the Hula Bowl. His wife, Pauline, is a native of North Carolina and also has her undergraduate and graduate degrees from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. She did some post-graduate work at South Carolina in the early '80s. She played and later coached women's college basketball, taught sociology and psychology and served as a college administrator. Pauline developed and taught the NCAA CHAMPS Life Skills course and various seminars for student-athletes at both Miami University and TCU. Since coming to South Carolina, she has taught the Etiquette Seminar in the Gamecocks' CHAMPS Life Skills course and assists with other seminars in preparing the student-athletes for their futures, such as the Dress for Success and Networking and Interviewing seminars.

The Hyman family has a daughter and son-in-law, Corrine and Michael Quast, and a son and daughter-in-law, Ryan and Carolyn Hyman. Corrine is a realtor; Michael is a financial analyst; Ryan is in the property and casualty insurance business; and Carolyn is a lawyer. They all reside in Fort Worth, Texas.

### UNIVERSITY ADMINISTRATION



**UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT  
DR. HARRIS PASTIDES**

Harris Pastides was named the University of South Carolina's 28th president on August 1, 2008, following a decade of service at Carolina as a professor, dean and vice president. He was the first internal candidate to be elected as President of the University of South Carolina in over half a century.

Under Pastides' leadership as Vice President for Research and Health Sciences, research funding and sponsored programs at South Carolina increased 89 percent since 2002, reaching a record \$206 million for fiscal year 2008. Pastides continues to take a leading role in the development of Innovista, the research innovation district he helped design and launch during his tenure.

With Focus Carolina, one of his first major initiatives as University president, Pastides has launched the most comprehensive strategic planning initiative in the University's history. The effort is expected to result in transformational goals that will steer a course for the University's long-term future.

Pastides has identified sustainability, innovation, the University's role in development of a knowledge economy, more access to education for South Carolinians, and stronger cohesion among the University's eight campuses among his major goals. To accomplish those goals, he has solicited ideas from the University community and all South Carolina citizens through Carolina's Ideas, a Web-based virtual suggestion box that is yielding a bounty of good counsel.

Before joining the South Carolina faculty, Pastides was a professor of epidemiology and chairman of the Department of Biostatistics and Epidemiology at the University of Massachusetts at Amherst. He received his master's of public health and his Ph.D. in epidemiology from Yale University.

Harris Pastides and Patricia Moore were married April 27, 1980. They have two children: Katharine, an education specialist at the Getty Villa in Malibu, Calif., and Andrew, an equity stage actor in New York City.



**FACULTY REPRESENTATIVE  
DR. ZACH KELEHEAR**

Zach Kelehear took over the duties as the University of South Carolina's Faculty Athletics Representative on July 1, 2010. Kelehear is a professor in the Department of Educational Leadership and Policies. He has written multiple articles and books on the ideas of artful leadership practice in public schools and business. He currently serves as Director of Curriculum and Graduate Studies for the College of Education as well as Program Coordinator for the Education Administration Program. While at USC, Dr. Kelehear has also served on the Faculty Senate, on the University Athletics Advisory Committee, on the Graduate Council as Chair, as well as several other committees.

Dr. Kelehear provides leadership for multiple national and international professional organizations such as the American Educational Research Association and the Council of Professors of Instructional Leadership. Along with his peer reviewed publications, Kelehear has published in the Journal of Staff Development, American School Board Journal, The School Administrator, Principal Leadership and The Principal. He also serves as editor and/or reviewer for multiple journals and publications.

Over the past 28 years, Kelehear has been a college professor, a personnel director, staff development director, and a teacher and coach in high school and middle school. He also was a college athlete at Furman University where he played football while completing a double major in Latin and History in 1981. He later earned his master's in education from Furman in 1982, then earned his doctorate from N.C. State in 1993.

Dr. Kelehear is married to Dr. Karen Heid, an assistant professor of art education at the University of South Carolina.

## ATHLETICS DEVELOPMENT



The Gamecock Club, established in 1940, provides financial support to the University of South Carolina's 500 student-athletes. This aid is in the form of tuition fees, meal costs, housing costs, medical costs, injury assistance, and other educational needs. Gamecock Club membership is open to all alumni and friends of the University.

More than 12,000 South Carolina fans donate to the athletics department through annual Gamecock Club memberships. There are currently 47 local chapters throughout South Carolina and an additional 12 out-of-state chapters that span from Houston, Texas, to Washington, D.C.

## COMPLIANCE INFORMATION

Dear Alumni, Fans and Friends,

As a University of South Carolina season ticket holder, alumnus, Gamecock Club member or fan, you are, by NCAA definition, a representative of the University of South Carolina's athletics interests. Those who actively support Gamecock Athletics are an integral part of our program. Your support enables our student-athletes to train and prepare in quality facilities, compete for championships in the nation's top conference and pursue a college degree. Your level of support is vital to their overall success.

We value your interest and support, but we must remind you that an inappropriate action on your part can jeopardize the eligibility of a student-athlete, prospect and/or the compliance of the University with Southeastern Conference and NCAA regulations.

The NCAA has strictly limited the role you, as a Gamecock fan, may assume with regard to prospects and student-athletes. The following information is intended to provide you with a basic understanding of NCAA rules and regulations that you should know as someone who cares about intercollegiate athletics.

### PROSPECTIVE STUDENT-ATHLETES

A prospective student-athlete (prospect) is a student who has:

- Started classes for the ninth grade, or
- Ever received any financial assistance or other benefit

prospective students do not generally receive.

An individual remains a prospect until one of the following occurs (whichever is earlier):

- The individual officially registers and enrolls in a minimum full-time program of studies and attends classes in a regular term of a four-year collegiate institution's regular academic year.

- The individual participates in a regular squad practice or competition at a four-year collegiate institution that occurs before the beginning of any term.

- The individual officially registers, enrolls, and attends classes during the summer prior to initial enrollment and receives athletics aid.

Please remember, a prospect remains a prospect even after signing a National Letter of Intent with South Carolina.

### EXTRA BENEFITS

The NCAA defines an extra benefit as any special arrangement by an institutional employee or a representative of the institution's athletics interests to provide a student-athlete or the student-athlete's relative or friend a benefit not expressly authorized by NCAA legislation.

Specifically prohibited financial aid, benefits and arrangements include, but are not limited to, the following:

- An employment arrangement for a prospect's relatives
- A gift of clothing or equipment
- The cosigning of loans
- Providing loans to a prospect's relatives or friends
- Cash or like items
- Any tangible items, including merchandise

### EMPLOYMENT

Boosters may contact a prospect to discuss a summer job **ONLY** after the prospect has signed a National Letter of Intent to attend the University of South Carolina. In addition, boosters **MAY NOT** employ or arrange employment

of a high school prospective student-athlete until the prospect has completed all classes and graduated from high school.

Enrolled student-athletes are permitted to be employed during the regular academic year as well as during official vacation periods. **PRIOR TO** the student-athlete's employment, they must receive written approval from the Compliance Office and complete the required paperwork.

Student-athletes and/or employers may be asked to provide records related to employment. This information may include, but is not limited to, payroll records, tax documents and benefits statements.

Please note all employers are subject to NCAA regulations and penalties for any violations.

Compliance with NCAA rules is of the highest priority for our athletics program and institution. As a member of the NCAA, University of South Carolina is responsible for the actions of its alumni, supporters and fans. Even the best-intentioned action on your part may be a violation of NCAA rules.

The University of South Carolina appreciates its alumni and friends who strive for the highest level of ethical conduct while supporting the student-athletes' goals for both academic and athletics success.

### MEDIA SERVICES

The 2010-11 edition of the University of South Carolina basketball media guide is a source of information for the news media. Additional information is available upon request. News releases, action and still photographs, video tapes and digital images are also available to accredited members of the news media upon request.

#### MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Credentials are limited to working daily print and electronic media and to others whose duties make necessary access to press row. Photo credentials are issued only to working photographers and cinematographers. Photographers are restricted to the baselines and may use natural light only. Flash units are not allowed.

South Carolina will use the online credentials system. Please go to [www.sportssystem.com/uschoops](http://www.sportssystem.com/uschoops) to register for credentials (photo, press row).

**ALL** credentials will be distributed on game day at the press pass gate on the College Street side of the Colonial Life Arena. A limited number of media parking spaces are available. Media parking passes must be requested at the time of credential requests.

#### INTERVIEW POLICIES

All interview requests must be made in advance to SID Emily Feeney in the South Carolina Media Relations Office. Beginning with the start of practice in October, Feeney will release a weekly coach and player availability schedule to media no later than 9 a.m. each Monday morning during the season.

**Post-Game Interview Policy:** After each home game, the visiting coach will address the media first, followed by South Carolina head coach Darrin Horn and then South Carolina players. (Depending on deadline, this may be altered on a game-by-game basis)

**Road Interview Policy:** Interviews with Coach Horn while on the road will be scheduled according to the home post-game media procedure. No player interviews are allowed until after the game once the team leaves Columbia.

#### HOME GAME SERVICES

**Press Room:** The South Carolina basketball media room is located behind the visitor bench near the locker room cluster at Colonial Life Arena. This room is open only to accredited media with proper credentials.

**Telephones and Internet:** The Media Relations Office furnishes eight telephones in the press room and on press row. There is wireless and high speed data lines in the press room as well. Those phones and data lines are available on a first come, first served basis.

#### FOOD SERVICES

Each credentialed media member will be issued a food coupon that can be used at the concession stands inside Colonial Life Arena.

#### STATISTICAL SERVICES

Complete play-by-play, full halftime and final boxscores and post-game coaches' quotes are provided to the media. Computer monitors are on press row for broadcast and print media locations for immediate updates throughout the game.

#### BROADCASTS

Announce positions for radio and TV broadcasts are at courtside. Under contracted reciprocal agreements, the official designated originating station or network of the visiting team is allowed to originate radio broadcasts without charge. All others will be charged an origination fee.

Stations must contact Liz McMillan of Gamecock Sports Properties at (803) 777-7895 for information.

#### PRESS ROW PASSES

- **DAILY NEWSPAPERS** will be issued a maximum of four (4) season approved press area credentials.
- **WEBSITES** with a national affiliation will be issued a maximum of two (2) season approved press credentials.
- **TELEVISION** stations based in the Columbia area will be issued a maximum of two (2) season approved press area credentials. Television stations based outside of the Columbia area will be issued a maximum of one (1) season approved press area credential.
- **RADIO** stations will be granted one (1) season approved credential per daily radio show. In addition, one (1) credential will be distributed per station for the sports director.

• **Non-affiliated bloggers will not be credentialed.**

All other credential requests, including non-daily newspapers, magazines, out-of-market radio stations, etc. will be issued on a game-by-game, case-by-case and space available basis at the discretion of the media relations director.

**Please note:** Due to the high number of applications, it is not possible to accommodate all requests. No one under 18 years of age will be issued a credential without prior approval of the SID.

#### INTERNET SITES

The University of South Carolina adheres to the SEC policies regarding representatives of websites. The official website of the home and visiting schools will be credentialed. Also, the official online service of the national over-the-air or cable television network that owns broadcast rights to the game will receive credentials. Other websites will not be credentialed unless they meet specifications outlined below:

1. Must be a legal corporate entity that has been in business for at least one full calendar year and has provided coverage of South Carolina or the visiting team for at least one year.
2. Must provide daily coverage of all athletic teams of South Carolina or the visiting team with its own staff of fulltime reporters, photographers and equipment.
3. Must travel to and cover all football away games and all major post-season events.
4. Must provide coverage of all press conferences of all athletic teams at South Carolina or the visiting team.

#### SEC INTERNET REAL TIME POLICY

By acceptance and use of an SEC media credential, the holder agrees to the following conditions for any and all athletic events hosted by the SEC and its member institutions:

1. The SEC and its member institutions grant a media organization a limited license to use certain gathered information on the media organization's own Internet or online site beginning at the start of an athletic event and up

to the conclusion of such event, all subject to the following limitations and conditions:

(a) No more than 10 still photographs may be used for news coverage of the game and other editorial purposes during the event. Such still photographs must be used on a time-delayed basis that is at least five (5) minutes after the happening of the event depicted by the still photograph.

(b) Video tape may only be shown as part of a single, non archived, online "simulcast" of a television station's regularly scheduled news program.

(c) While a game is in progress, the use of textual statistical information is time-delayed and limited in amount (e.g., updates pertaining to score, injuries and national, conference or institutional record-breaking performances, a condensed half-time story) so that an organization's Internet or online game coverage does not undercut the authorized and rights-paying fee organization's rights to play-by-play accounts of the game and/or exclusivity as to such rights.

2. Any proposed media use on an Internet or online sight of the game information that is more detailed and/or more than described above will require separate written authorization by the SEC and/or its member institutions. However, such written authorization will not permit the use of game information in entertainment contexts and will not authorize game coverage that, due to immediacy or detail, constitutes or approaches a play-by-play account of a game.

3. Should any of these conditions be breached, the SEC and/or its member institutions will issue a written warning for the first violation. If this violation occurs during the last game of the institutions' regularly-scheduled season, the media organization may not be credentialed for the SEC Football Championship Game. A second violation of this policy will result in revocation of credentials to cover future football games hosted by the SEC and/or its member institutions.

#### SPOTTERS AND STATISTICIANS

The Media Relations Department can supply radio and television broadcasters with spotters and stat personnel if notified of their needs in advance.

### SOUTH CAROLINA STUDENT-ATHLETE MEDIA INTERVIEW POLICY

All interviews are to be coordinated through the Media Relations Office. This allows the staff to arrange the interview when it best suits the student-athlete's and the reporter's schedules. Please contact the Media Relations Office in advance to make your interview requests. Media are not permitted to contact student-athletes on their own at any time.

All interviews will take place at the designated media interview site for that day as listed in the weekly availability schedule or in the Media Relations Office.

Dormitory, apartment and cell phone numbers for student-athletes will not be provided to the media. Should you need to conduct a telephone interview with a student-athlete, a call will be placed to you from the student-athlete at a mutually agreeable time.

## GAMECOCK RADIO NETWORK

Gamecock Sports Properties, a partnership between the University of South Carolina Athletics Department and two of the country's leaders in the collegiate sports marketing industry, ISP Sports and Learfield Communications, Inc., is the originating medium for radio coverage of the 2010-11 South Carolina basketball games.

Gamecock Sports Properties is responsible for the overall management of the athletic program's corporate partnership effort, which includes producing, selling and distributing the Gamecock Radio Network (live play-by-play and call-in shows) and television programming (pay per view opportunities and coaches shows), print advertising in various athletic department publications, and selected signage in University athletic facilities.

Andy Demetra begins his second season as the play-by-play announcer for Gamecock men's basketball and baseball. Prior to re-joining the Gamecock broadcast team in 2009, Demetra worked for ISP Sports in Winston-Salem, N.C. While at ISP, he did basketball play-by-play for the Big East National Game of the Week and football play-by-play for the ACC National Game of the Week. In addition, he provided play-by-play work in basketball for the University of Pittsburgh, Vanderbilt, Virginia Tech, Villanova, UCF and Furman.

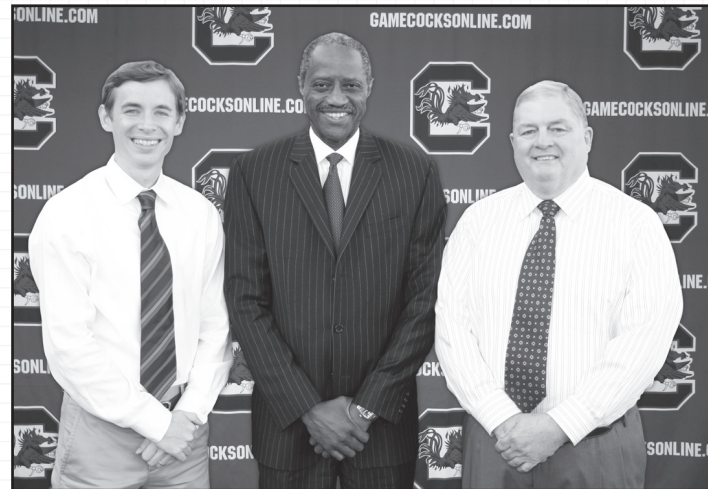
Demetra began his career as the play-by-play voice of South Carolina women's basketball from 2003-06. He was honored as the 2005 and 2006 South Carolina Broadcasters Association Radio Sportscaster of the Year, becoming the youngest recipient of the award in the organization's 60-year history.

Casey Manning, the color analyst for the Gamecock Radio Network, earned a varsity letter for the legendary coach Frank McGuire from 1971-73 (freshmen were not eligible to play varsity basketball) and attended South Carolina from 1969-73. He won the Freshman Academic Award. He was selected to Who's Who in Colleges and Universities and chosen as a South Carolina outstanding senior. He was a member of Carolina's ACC Tournament Championship team in 1970-71, while he was player of the year in South Carolina in 1969 and a high school All-American.

Manning is currently a Circuit Court Judge for the state of South Carolina, having served in that capacity since April 1994. He served as the Assistant Attorney General for the state of South Carolina for five years (1983-88), and was the Chief of Prosecutions from 1988-89. Manning is a member of the American Bar Association and is a past president of the South Carolina Athletic Hall of Fame.

Carroll Senn has served as engineer/producer for the Gamecock Basketball Radio Network since 1981.

Liz McMillan has been General Manager for the Network since 1993 and is the first woman in the SEC to serve in this capacity.

• Throughout the history of men's college basketball, the Southeastern Conference has captured 10 NCAA Championships and four NIT titles, putting the SEC as one of the nation's top basketball conferences.

• Each of the 96 conference games will be televised live as part of the SEC's historic 15-year agreements with CBS Sports and ESPN that began in 2009-10. Almost half of the SEC's league games will be distributed nationally with ESPN or ESPN2 televising 27 contests, ESPNU showing seven and CBS Sports five. The SEC's games on the ESPN family of networks will be exclusively branded as the "SEC on ESPN."

• National coverage of the SEC Basketball Tournament has been expanded with the semifinals and championship game broadcast on ESPN on ABC. The SEC Network will televise the first two rounds of the tournament which this year will be played March 10-13 in Atlanta.

• Every team in the SEC has made at least one NCAA Tournament appearance in the last eight editions of the NCAA Tournament.

• The Southeastern Conference has had at least one team advance to the Sweet 16 in 20 of the last 21 years. The SEC record for most teams advancing to the Sweet 16 is four which was accomplished in 1986 (Alabama, Auburn, Kentucky, LSU) and in 1996 (Arkansas, Georgia, Kentucky, Mississippi State). Eleven of the SEC's 12 members have advanced to the Sweet 16 since 1996.

• Since the 1980-81 season, each of the 12 SEC schools has captured either an SEC divisional, overall or tournament title and 11 different schools have won or shared the SEC Championship since the league's inception in 1933.

• Southeastern Conference coaches have led their teams to 37 conference championships and 25 conference tournament championships while collecting 29 conference coach of the year honors over the course of their head coaching careers.

• The SEC won 71.7 percent (134-53) of its non-conference games in 2009-10. The league has won at least 68 percent of its non-conference games each season since the SEC expanded to 12 teams in 1991-92.

• More than 2.5 million fans have witnessed SEC basketball in each of the last four seasons. The SEC posted the fourth-largest attendance season attendance in league history, totaling 2,518,749 fans for games featuring SEC teams in 2009-10. A record 2,638,852 fans saw SEC basketball in 2008-09 while 2,562,073 were in attendance in 2006-07 and 2,561,545 for the 2007-08 season.

- Colonial Life Arena is the largest arena in the state of South Carolina with 18,000 seats, and the 10-largest on-campus basketball facility in the nation. Located on the beautiful University of South Carolina campus, this one-of-a-kind facility features 41 suites, four entertainment suites, and the Frank McGuire Club, a full-service hospitality room that has a capacity of 300. The state-of-the-art facility also features plush seating, a technologically advanced sound system, a four-sided video scoreboard, and a one-of-a-kind selection of unique concession foods that will delight fans of all ages.
- The Arena has hosted numerous sold out shows, including Barnum and Bailey Circus, Billy Joel, country superstars Kenny Chesney and George Strait, WWE Wrestling, Jamie Foxx and numerous other acts.
- The arena is the largest building ever constructed at the University of South Carolina at 342,000 square feet. It features two spacious, identical locker rooms for the Gamecock men's and women's basketball teams with team meeting rooms, recruiting rooms, coaches locker rooms and a training room facility.
- During the 2008-09 men's basketball season, Colonial Life Arena was sold out twice, including the first sellout crowd for a Gamecock men's basketball game since the 2004 season. The South Carolina athletic campaign "Operation Sellout" encouraged the Gamecock faithful to sellout the arena for Carolina's game against Georgia on Feb. 7, 2009, marking the first sellout in five seasons. During the season, more than 10,000 fans attended a men's basketball contest at Colonial Life Arena 10 times.
- Attendance soared yet again during the 2009-10 campaign, as the Gamecocks had a sellout crowd watch the team defeat No. 1 Kentucky. During the season, more than 10,000 fans attended a contest at the Arena 13 times.

### 2010-11 PRESEASON NOTES

#### CAROLINA QUICK HITS

- South Carolina enters its 103rd season of basketball in 2010-11.
- South Carolina owns an all-time record of 1,273-1,112-1, with its lone tie coming during the 1913-14 season vs. Newberry.
- The Gamecocks are led by third-year head coach Darrin Horn.
- South Carolina will play 13 non-conference contests this season, followed by 16 Southeastern Conference games.
- The 2009-10 Gamecocks concluded their 19th season of competition in the SEC with a 6-10 record. South Carolina owns an overall record of 122-182 all-time in SEC play.
- For the third-consecutive season, South Carolina will open its season with an exhibition contest against Kentucky Wesleyan. The Gamecocks defeated the Panthers 75-55 during the 2008-09 campaign, and earned a 78-55 win over KWU last season.
- Carolina was 11-5 in contests at Colonial Life Arena last season.
- South Carolina head coach Darrin Horn holds a 6-11 career record against ranked opponents, including a 5-7 mark against ranked teams during his time at South Carolina.
- Last season, South Carolina earned its first-ever win over a top-ranked opponent when the Gamecocks earned a victory over then-No. 1 Kentucky.

#### GAMECOCKS RETURN FIVE LETTERWINNERS

- South Carolina returns five letterwinners from its 2009-10 squad, including senior forwards Sam Muldrow and Johndre Jefferson, sophomore guards Ramon Galloway and Stephen Spinella, and sophomore forward Lakeem Jackson. Muldrow is the top returner in terms of points per game (10.4), rebounds (6.2) and blocks (3.1).

#### SOUTH CAROLINA WELCOMES TOP 25 RECRUITING CLASS IN 2010-11

- Gamecock head coach Darrin Horn and his staff signed a highly-touted recruiting class, which begins its first season in Columbia in the fall of 2010. The class, ranked as high as No. 17 by Scout.com, features four native South Carolinians in Bruce Ellington, RJ Slawson, Carlton Geathers and Eric Smith. North Carolina natives Damontre Harris and Brian Richardson complete the class. Below is a breakdown of the student-athlete:

**Ellington:** Consensus four-star prospect... Rated as the No. 56 overall prospect and the No. 12 point guard in the country by Scout.com ... No. 96 overall prospect and No. 24 point guard by Rivals.com ... No. 21 point guard according to ESPN.com

**Geathers:** Averaged 10.0 points and 8.0 rebounds per game as a senior ... Only played two years of organized basketball

**Harris:** Four-star prospect ... Rated as the No. 53 overall prospect and the No. 12 center in the country according to Scout.com ... No. 64 prospect overall and No. 15 power forward by Rivals.com ... Rated No. 68 overall and No. 6 center according to ESPN.com

**Richardson:** Three-star prospect ... No. 47 shooting guard according to Scout.com ... Averaged 19.0 points, 6.0 rebounds, 6.0 assists and shot 40 percent from beyond the arc as a senior

**Slawson:** A consensus four-star prospect ... Rated No. 92 overall prospect and No. 18 power forward in the country by Scout.com ... No. 117 overall and No. 24 power forward by Rivals.com ... No. 83 overall and No. 19 power forward according to ESPN.com ... Named the South Carolina Boys Gatorade Player of the Year and Region 8 4A Player of the Year

**Smith:** No. 47 point guard according to Scout.com ... Averaged 13.5 points, 2.6 3-point field goals and 3.3 assists per game as a senior

#### HEAD COACH DARRIN HORN

- Darrin Horn enters his third season in Columbia with a career record of 147-74, including a 36-26 mark at South Carolina. Following the 2010 SEC campaign, Darrin Horn-led teams are 73-37 (.664) all-time in league play. Horn led Carolina to a 10-6 record in SEC action during his first year in Columbia and a 6-10 mark in his second. Horn led Carolina to one of the most celebrated seasons during its 18-year participation in the SEC during the 2009 campaign, as the squad captured the 2009 SEC Eastern Division Co-Championship and won double-digit league games for the first time since the 1998 campaign. His 2010 squad earned an upset win over No. 1 Kentucky and No. 13/19 Vanderbilt.

#### MULDROW AIMS FOR BLOCK RECORD

- Senior forward Sam Muldrow is just 78 blocks away from surpassing Brandon Wallace (249) for first place in Gamecock history in career blocks, as Muldrow enters the season with 172 for his career. He ranks second in the record book with 2.15 blocks per game.

#### DID YOU KNOW?

- Just one player on this season's roster, senior Sam Muldrow, has played at South Carolina under Darrin Horn for more than one year. Fellow senior Johndre Jefferson was a junior college transfer prior to last season, redshirt-junior Malik Cooke, who will play his first season in the Garnet and Black after sitting out the 2009-10 campaign due to NCAA transfer rules, will provide some veteran leadership, while sophomores Ramon Galloway, Lakeem Jackson and Stephen Spinella begin their second season under the direction of Horn. Along with six newcomers, junior Murphy Holloway, a walk-on from Ole Miss, will sit this season to due NCAA transfer rules.

#### NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULE

- Contests against four teams that competed in the 2010 NCAA Tournament highlight the 2010-11 South Carolina men's basketball non-conference schedule. Following the 2009-10 campaign that saw South Carolina tackle one of its more challenging schedules in recent years, Horn and his staff aimed for another highly-competitive mark in 2010-11. Carolina will host nine non-conference contests, and will face seven schools that compiled at least 18 wins, including three that tallied at least 25. The Gamecocks will face four BCS schools during the coming non-conference season, including home contests with Clemson and Boston College, and challenging away matchups at Michigan State and Ohio State, marking the first time South Carolina has faced two Big Ten schools in one season since playing both Indiana and Purdue during the 1998-99 campaign.

- Joining Darrin Horn on the sidelines this season is third-year assistant coach Mike Boynton Jr., second-year assistant Neill Berry and Orlando Early, who is in his first season at South Carolina. Former assistant Cypheus Bunton has moved to the director of player development role, while Trey Brown, a former head manager for the Gamecocks, will serve as the graduate assistant.

#### GAMECOCKS IN THE SEC

- South Carolina has collected 16 victories over the course of the last two SEC seasons. It marks the highest total in back-to-back league campaigns since the combination of the 1997 and 1998 seasons (26) and is the third highest total ever in back-to-back SEC seasons (1996+97, 23 wins; 1997+98, 26 wins).
