Onponents/Review

The Southeastern Conference

A pioneer in the integration of higher education and athletic competition, the Southeastern Conference stands ready to advance intercollegiate athletics into the 21st century.

Since its formation in 1933, the SEC has achieved both stature and stability by designating governing/voting power to the presidents of the member institutions. They have determined the policies of the conference and through the years this involvement has been the principal source of strength in the evolution of the SEC.

Throughout its 64-year history, the SEC has provided leadership on the vital issues facing intercollegiate competition. In 1993, the member institutions adopted the Principles of Gender Equity. Committed to increasing the quantity and quality of women's athletic opportunities, each school will provide at least two more women's intercollegiate programs than the number of men's.

Faced with the task of conference realignment after competing with 10 members since 1966, the SEC welcomed the University of Arkansas on Aug. 1, 1990, and the University of South Carolina on Sept. 25, 1990. Joining charter members Alabama, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, LSU, Ole Miss, Mississippi State, Tennessee and Vanderbilt, on July 1, 1991. Arkansas and South Carolina became the first schools added in conference history.

Fully incorporated into conference competition by 1992, Arkansas and South Carolina participated in SEC championships for all sports except football during the 1991-92 academic year. The SEC was again at the forefront, introducing football, basketball and baseball divisional play and the nation's first ever Division I football championship game.

SEC schools began athletic competition with one another almost 100 years ago as members of the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Association. Seven institutions (Alabama, Auburn, Georgia, Georgia Tech, North Carolina, Sewanee and Vanderbilt) attended the SIAA organizational meeting of faculty representatives, called by Dr. William L. Dudley of Vanderbilt, in Atlanta Dec. 22, 1894.

The first SEC champions were crowned in 1933 in baseball, basketball, football

and outdoor track. The league's inaugural championship event was a basketball tournament held Feb. 24-28, 1933 in Atlanta. Records show the first men's title for cross country was awarded in 1935, while golf and swimming were added in 1937. The league later began hosting championships in tennis (1953) and indoor track (1957).

In the 1979-80 academic year, SEC championships for women were recognized in basketball, tennis and volleyball. The following year golf, gymnastics, swimming and track and field were added. The administration of women's athletics officially came under the auspices of the conference office on Sept. 1, 1984.

The SEC currently regulates nine men's sports and 11 women's sports: Men—baseball, basketball, football, golf, swimming, tennis and track (cross-country, indoor and outdoor); Women — basketball, golf, gymnastics, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis, track (cross country, indoor and outdoor) and volleyball.

SECond to None

Over the past few decades, the Southeastern Conference has been a constant force in swimming and diving. In 2005, the SEC claimed both the men's and women's NCAA titles as Auburn won the men's championship with Georgia taking home the women's crown. The Florida women also finished fourth and the Gator men fifth to further the league's claim as the best conference in swimming and diving.

On the men's side, Auburn's national title marked the 36th consecutive season in which the SEC has placed at least one men's team in the top 10. Since 1969, 89 SEC teams have finished in the NCAA's

Also in 2005, all eight programs competed in the NCAA Championships. In addition, 9 individual titles were captured by a SEC team. The SEC now has an alltime total of 120 NCAA individual titles.

On the women's side, the Southeastern Conference had eight teams competing at the NCAA Championships. Georgia won the SEC's eighth NCAA women's title.

Individually, 28 titles were captured in 2005 to take the SEC's total to 174 NCAA individual titles.

In 1982, Florida won the SEC's first NCAA women's swimming title. Since 1982, the Southeastern Conference has placed 59 women's teams in the NCAA top 10.

SEC Men's Swimming and Diving Notes

• The SEC has had eight NCAA Men's

Championships: (1978 by Tennessee, 1983 & 1985 by Florida, 1997, 1999, 2003, 2004 & 2005 by Auburn)

- 2005 also marked the 36th consecutive year that the SEC has had at least one team in the top 10 of the NCAA Championships.
- The SEC has placed a total of 89 teams in the top 10 since 1969.
- · SEC athletes in swimming and diving have captured a total of 129 individual NCAA titles (including relays).
- 107 individuals claimed first-team All-America status from SEC schools in 2005.
- In 2005, all eight SEC teams competed or were represented individually in the NCAA Championships.

SEC Women's Swimming and Diving Notes

- Georgia won the SEC's eighth NCAA title in 2005. Florida won the first in 1982.
- Since 1982, the SEC has placed 59 teams in the NCAA top 10.
- The SEC holds 25 NCAA Championship Meet records, nine of which were short course records set in 2000.
- 174 individual NCAA titles have been captured by SEC athletes (including relays).
- The Southeastern Conference had
- 125 athletes named first-team All-
- America in 2005.
- In 2005, eight of nine SEC teams competed or were represented individually in the NCAA Championships.

Opponents/Review

A determined group of swimmers and divers contributed both in the pool and in the classroom in the 2004-05 season. USC just missed making the top 25 with a 26th place finish at the NCAA Championships and continued to show improvement with several leaders stepping up in the key moments of the season.

Senior diver Andy Bradley capped off a stellar career reaching the finals once more at the NCAA Championships and placing sixth on the three-meter board to earn All-American honors for the fifth time. Bradley will go down as one of the all-time greats in South Carolina history as a two-time national runner-up at the NCAA Championships with second place finishes his sophomore and junior seasons on the one-meter board.

There were also records set in the 2004-05 season as the 800 freestyle relay team of Colby Mack, Dan White, Reid Duff and Tamas Bathazi went 6:31.09, the fastest time in school history at the SEC Championships.

Freshman Dan White not only was an integral component of all three freestyle relay squads but also one of the top scorers for the team at the SEC meet and holder of four top times for the team. White was the leader in the 500, 1000 and 1650 freestyle along with the 200 individual medley. In his first season in the toughest conference in the nation, White finished 15th in both the 500 freestyle and 1650 freestyle at the conference meet. His times in the 200 freestyle and 500 freestyle also provisionally qualified him for the NCAA Championships.

Junior Reid Duff had his second straight season as one of the top sprinters on the squad with time of 20.57 at the SEC's in the 50 freestyle and 45.20 in the 100 free. Duff's highest finish at SEC's was 13th in the 200 freestyle with a personal best time of 1:37.90, putting him among the top 10 in school history in the event.

South Carolina was strongest and most deep again in the 200 freestyle, with five swimmers reaching NCAA "B" standard cut times over the course of the year. Duff, White, Mack, Bathazi and Christian Robledo all hit the provisional qualifying mark.

In his first season, Robledo improved and built on solid dual meet performances that capped off at the SEC's where he secured his season best times in all three freestyle events he competed in (50, 100, 200). Robledo finished the second fastest on the team in both the 50 and the 100.

Junior Justin Kata also continued to be a leader for Carolina in the breaststroke events with a personal best time of 56.75 coming at the SEC Championships, good enough for 16th place. Kata also had the squad's top time in the 200 breaststroke.

Two freshmen newcomers also were welcomed additions to the squad in the backstroke event. Kevin Cargill and Sean Murray each performed at a high level in the backstroke with Cargill leading the way in the 100 back and Murray scoring at SEC's and securing the top time in the 200 back.

In addition to Cargill and Murray, freshman Kyle Cormier also brought a solid work ethic to the pool and added depth at the middle distance and butterfly events. Cormier was second fastest on the team in both the 200 butterfly and 500 freestyle.

One of the the squad's biggest highlights to the 2004-05 season was the team's first dual meet, a 140.5-99.5 win over Clemson.

White gave the Carolina fans a glimpse of what was to come, as he took home three first place finishes in the 500 free, 1000 free and 400 IM. Tamas Bathazi was also on top of his game winning the 200 butterfly and 200 freestyle. Duff, Cargill and Kata also won events and Bradley and Dean Emmerton were in control of the top two spots on both diving boards as Carolina cruised to a victory over the Tigers.

The USC men's squad was solid in the classroom as well as the pool with six members of the team on the SEC Academic Honor Roll as well as three freshmen named to the SEC Freshmen Academic Honor Roll.

Despite the loss of several top swimmers to graduation or injury, the South Carolina women's swimming and diving team came away from the 2004-05 season with much success and with a growing excitement and belief in what the future may hold for the program over the course of the next couple years.

For the second consecutive season, the USC women's swimming and diving team came away with a fifth place finish at the SEC Championships, tying the school's highest place from the previous season.

A young crop of new swimmers were at the head of Carolina's top 5 finish, with 11 events being led by a freshman at the end of the year. With very little experience, Carolina matured throughout the year with bright spots popping every step of the way.

One of the more clear and evident spots, was the one set by Christy Williams, Carolina's top swimmer in 04-05. In her first season of collegiate swimming, Williams came away as one of the most valuable on the team with top times in four events and competed at the NCAA Champsionships. Williams also had USC's highest individual finish, winning the consolation final and taking ninth at the SEC's with a school record time of 1:59.41 in the 200 butterfly, automatically qualifying her for NCAA's. Williams would also score for Carolina at the conference meet in the 100 butterfly and was a member of both the 400 and 800 freestyle relays.

Another freshman who also was up to the task was Heather Roffey, a 2004 Olympian from the Grand Cayman Islands. Roffey was the team's leading swimmer in the distance events and just barely missed out on an NCAA bid in the 1650 freestyle, which she finished at 16:46.30 for 10th place at SEC's. Roffey also scored in the 200 butterfly for Carolina.

The distance freestyle events were among the most improved on the team with Roffey, sophomore Stephanie Margalis and freshmen Mallory Deighan and Lauren Fayssoux all contributing from the 500-1650 freestyle event. Deighan and Fayssoux scored in the mile along with Roffey and Margalis held the team's top time in the 500 freestyle at 4:54.03 at SEC's.

To go along with the improvement of the distance squad was Carolina's continued top performances in the sprint and middle distance freestyle events. The deepest part of the squad, USC once again was among the very best in the conference from the 50-200 freestyle.

Senior Carolynn McHugh went out on a high note for Carolina, as the team's top swimmer in both the 50 and 100 freestyle. McHugh aslo swam on four realys at the SEC's (200 medley, 400 medley, 200 freestyle, 400 freestyle).

Carolina had three scorers at SEC's in the 200 freestyle as well with junior Haley Skaggs, Fayssoux and Margalis putting up points for the Gamecocks. Skaggs finished 13th with a time of 1:49.13, the highest individual finish for USC in the 200 free.

Newcomers Mandee Cregar, Carly Hensel and Kasey Tamkun also provided a boost with each scoring at SEC's in their first season. Cregar placed in both the 100 and 200 breaststroke with Hendle scoring in the 200 breaststroke and 400 IM and Tamkun in the top 16 in the 100 backstroke.

On the diving side, Carolina qualified both Lauren King and Tracey Richardson for the NCAA Championships. King also finaled on both boards at SEC's with a second place finish on the three-meter as winning the three-meter board at the NCAA Zones meet. King would close out her career earning honorable mention All-American with a 16th place finish on the one-meter at the NCAA Championships.

The women's team had a strong showing outside the pool with 10 swimmers and divers named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll The women's team also led all sports at the university with 11 freshmen student-athletes honored on the Freshmen Academic Honor Roll. In addition, diver Holly Hodges was awarded the 2004-05 Southeastern Conference Community Service Post-Graduate Scholarship, marking the second straight year a Carolina student-athlete has earned the honor. Hodges was awarded the \$5000 based on her involvement in the community.


