#### **Gamecocks Head to NCAA Championship**

South Carolina finds itself among the top 30 teams in the nation this week at the 2009 NCAA Men's Golf Championship, which is being held at Inverness Club in Toledo, Ohio. The Gamecocks are back in the championship round for the third time in four years having also made the final 30 in 2006 and 2007. The Gamecocks advanced to the championship by placing second in the NCAA Southeast Regional at RedTail Golf Club in Sorrento, Fla., with a total score of 829 (-23), tied with Georgia and Arizona.

#### South Carolina's NCAA Championship Lineup

The five competitors for the Gamecocks in the NCAA Championship will be junior **George Bryan IV** (Chapin, S.C.), senior **Mark Silvers III** (Savannah, Ga.), freshman **Wesley Bryan** (Chapin, S.C.), junior **Patrick Rada** (Anderson, S.C.) and freshman **Sam Braver** (Roswell, Ga.), the same group that competed at both the SEC Championship and the NCAA Regional.

It will be the second championship appearance for both George Bryan IV and Silvers while Wesley Bryan, Rada and Braver will all be making their initial NCAA appearances. Silvers tied for 22nd and G. Bryan was tied for 42nd at the 2007 NCAA Championship at Golden Horseshoe Golf Club in Williamsburg, Va.; the other three competitors that week were Warren Thomas, Mark Anderson and Florian Fritsch.

Both Bryan brothers and Silvers have played in all 11 events thus far in 2008-09, Rada has played nine times and Braver will be making his sixth start for South Carolina.

#### **NCAA Championship Field Breakdown**

The Gamecocks have faced 23 of the other 29 teams in this regional, compiling a 23-30-1 record in those tournaments. South Carolina is .500 or better against 11 of those 23 teams -- Alabama (2-2), Chattanooga (1-1), Duke (1-0), Florida (3-1), Illinois (1-1), Iowa (2-0), Ohio State (1-0), Tennessee (2-1), Texas Tech (1-1), UCF (2-2), Virginia (2-1) and Wake Forest (2-1). Twelve teams have held the upper hand over the Gamecocks - Arizona, Arkansas, Georgia, Georgia Tech, Oklahoma State, Southern Cal, Stanford, Texas, Texas A&M, UCLA and Washington. This season, the Gamecocks have not faced Arizona State, Michigan, Northwestern, Oregon, San Diego or TCU.

#### Silver(s) Star

Senior Mark Silvers III didn't want the final round of the NCAA Southeast Regional to be his last one as a Gamecock. So he made the most of it, firing a personal-record 64 (-7) to lead the Gamecocks to a second-place finish and an NCAA Championship berth. Silvers' 64 was the best score by a South Carolina golfer in 10 years, dating back to Kyle Thompson's 63 in the 1999 NCAA West Regional. It was only the fifth sub-65 round in school history, as well.

The senior from Savannah, Ga., has gone low in the postseason before. His previous low score in collegiate competition was a 66 in the second round of the 2007 NCAA Championship.

Silvers is also getting it done in the classroom. A major in finance, Silvers carries a 3.909 GPA and was recently named the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and to CoSIDA's Academic All-District Second Team.





#### **NCAA Championship Format**

The 2009 NCAA Championship will be much different from any other competition these 30 teams have seen this season and resembles some sort of hybrid between U.S. Amateur and Ryder Cup competition. All 30 teams will play 54 holes of medal play - 18 holes each on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday - after which the individual national champion will be declared. The field will then be cut to the top eight teams, which will be placed in a single-elimination bracket for match play to determine the team national champion. The #1 seed will play the #8 seed (and so forth) in five singles matches, and the first team to win three matches will advance to the next round. All four quarterfinals and both semifinal matches will be played on Friday, and the national championship match will take place on Saturday.

#### **NCAA Southeast Regional Recap**

Senior Mark Silvers III fired a personal-best 64 (-7) to lead South Carolina to a team round of 269 (-15) and a tie for second place at RedTail Golf Club, earning a berth into the NCAA Championship.

It was a record-setting day across the board for South Carolina. The team score of 269 ties for the second-best in school history, equaling their second-round total at the 2007 NCAA West Regional in Tempe, Ariz., and is only two shots behind the school-record total of 267 from the 1999 Red River Classic. In addition, the total 54-hole team score of 829 (-23) is the third-lowest in school history, also behind the same two aforementioned tournaments.

Led by Silvers, the whole team put on a charge down the back nine. Over the final nine holes of the tournament, the Gamecocks were a collective 12-under as they carded 15 birdies against one double-bogey and one bogey.

**George Bryan IV** didn't card as many birdies as Silvers, but his round was impressive nonetheless. He carded four straight pars before a bogey at the fifth, but then played the final 13 holes error-free for a 67 (-4). A birdie at No. 8 started a strong run that included an unbelievable up-and-down for par at the 10th hole. He then birdied 12 and 13, then made another at the 15th and one more at the 17th to finish the day at 4-under. For the tournament, he finished 5-under and tied for 14th place.

The younger Bryan brother, **Wesley Bryan**, had a mostly clean scorecard with only a bogey at the seventh hole on the wrong side of par. He fired a 68 (-3) to finish the tournament tied for 14th place at 5-under. Bryan birdied the fifth and ninth to make the turn at 1-under, then saw a 15-foot putt for eagle at the 12th just slide by. He would still make birdie there, then card four straight pars before a birdie at the 17th.

Freshman **Sam Braver**, the low scorer for South Carolina on Friday, had his second straight round under par with a 70 (-1) that included three birdies and two bogeys. And junior Patrick Rada overcame two double-bogeys to shoot 73 (+2) as he notched four birdies on the back nine. All five South Carolina players made birdie at the par-5 17th hole.

Tournament host UCF never checked up for three days, running away with the tournament title by 11 strokes with a three-day total of 818 (-34). The Gamecocks finished tied with Georgia and Arizona at 829 (-23), and lowa closed strong on the final day to earn the fifth and final bid to the NCAA Championship.

Arizona's Tarquin McManus was the individual medalist at 198 (-15), holding off a late charge from UCF's Brad Schneider who shot 63 in the final round to finish at 200 (-13). The Knights' Blayne Barber went even lower on Saturday with a 62 (-9) to finish at 11-under. Charlotte's Corey Nagy finished fourth and earned the individual berth to the NCAA Championship at 9-under.

#### All-SEC Awards Announced

South Carolina senior golfer **Mark Silvers III** was named the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year for men's golf, the league announced on April 27. Silvers joined junior **George Bryan IV** on the All-SEC Second Team, and **Wesley Bryan** was named to the All-Freshman team.

Silvers, a three-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll, carries a 3.909 grade point average while majoring in finance. In addition, he was named a Cleveland Golf All-America Scholar in 2008. Through 10 events this season, the senior is second on the team (min. 10 rounds played) with a 72.83 stroke average. His best finish came at the General Jim Hackler Invitational where he tied for third place with a 291 (+3). His low round came at the NCAA Southeast Regional where he shot a personal-best final-round 64 (-7).

George Bryan IV earned his second All-SEC honor in three years, adding a second-team selection to his first-team honor a year ago. The junior from Chapin, S.C., carries a 72.61 stroke average through 11 events with a low score of 65 at the Hootie at Bulls Bay Intercollegiate. Bryan has five top-10 finishes on the year, including a pair of runner-up showings at the Schenkel E-Z-Go Invitational (also a Carolina team victory) and the Hootie at Bulls Bay. He finished fourth at both the Rees Jones and the Cavalier Classic, and took a seventh-place finish at the Mason Rudolph Intercollegiate.

Wesley Bryan made an immediate impact on South Carolina golf as a freshman as he is third on the team with a 73.09 stroke average, earning a spot on the SEC All-Freshman team. Also a native of Chapin, Wesley Bryan tied with teammate Paul Woodbury for medalist honors at the Rees Jones Intercollegiate at 218 (+2), helping the Gamecocks to the team title. Bryan's last two events have been his best since the Rees Jones victory as he earned a tie for 10th place at the SEC Championship and a 14th-place tie at the Cavalier Classic.

#### Once...Twice...Thrice...Four Times a Champion

For the first time in school history, a South Carolina men's team captured four tournament titles during the 2008-09 regular season. The first win came in the second tournament of the year as the Gamecocks won the Mason Rudolph Intercollegiate in Franklin, Tenn., Sept. 26-28. After a shaky outing in rough conditions at the Isleworth Intercollegiate, the Gamecocks ran away with the Rees Jones Intercollegiate title Nov.

3-4 in Daufuskie Island, S.C. The Gamecocks then earned their biggest win of the season in taking down a strong field at the Schenkel E-Z-Go Invitational in Statesboro, Ga., March 20-22. Following a fourth-place showing at the SEC Championship, the Gamecocks won the weather-shortened Cavalier Classic in Charlottesville, Va.

Since joining the SEC in 1992, South Carolina has now won 14 team titles, including the 2007 NCAA West Regional.

#### **Individually Incredible**

So far this season, the Gamecocks have combined to grab 14 top-10 individual finishes in tournament play, including a twosome that tied for a tournament title. Freshman **Wesley Bryan** and sophomore **Paul Woodbury** shared the tournament title at the Rees Jones Intercollegiate, giving South Carolina its first individual title since **George Bryan IV** won the 2008 Schenkel E-Z-Go Invitational.

#### GB4 - The Man, The Myth, The Legend

Junior **George Bryan IV** has been mostly brilliant for South Carolina this season, turning in five top-10 finishes including a pair of runner-up showings. At one point, the native of Chapin had posted five straight rounds under par, including four straight in the 60s. He had the best 54 holes of his career and the second-best tournament in Carolina annals with his 69-67-65=201 (-12) at the Hootie at Bulls Bay to grab his second straight runner-up finish. Bryan finished the regular season ranked 13th in the SEC with a 72.96 stroke average through 28 rounds of play. For his efforts, he was named to the All-SEC Second Team.

#### **Youth Movement**

Some of the best play for South Carolina has come from its freshmen, namely **Wesley Bryan**. The younger brother of Gamecock junior George, Wesley Bryan has made a name for himself with one tournament victory this year, a tie for 10th at the SEC Championship, a T-14 at the Cavalier Classic and another top-20 finish at the General Hackler Invitational. Perhaps his biggest contribution came when he shook off a rough opening round to fire a pair of 69s on Saturday and Sunday at the Mason Rudolph Intercollegiate, leading South Carolina to a team title.

Fellow freshman **Sam Braver** has turned in a couple of nice efforts as well. Earning a spot for the Schenkel E-Z-Go, Braver was brilliant in his first collegiate outing with a 71-74-71=216 (E) to pick up an 11th-place finish and help the Gamecocks to the team title. Braver also competed and provided strong rounds at the Hootie at Bulls Bay and the U.S. Collegiate Championships, then shot his final two rounds under par at the NCAA Southeast Regional.

#### Last Time Here - 2007 NCAA Championship

South Carolina finished in a tie for 11th place at the 2007 NCAA Championships at the Golden Horseshoe Golf Club's Gold Course (Par 70 - 6,803 yards). The Gamecocks fired a final round 287 (+7) to finish the tournament with final score of 16-over-par 1136. Stanford won the team crown with an 11-under-par 1109 to capture the title by 12 strokes over runner-up Georgia. Southern California's Jamie Lovemark was the individual champion with a nine-under-par 271 after posting a final round six-under-par 64.

The 11th-place finish was the highest for the Gamecocks at the NCAA meet since the 1998 squad also placed 11th. It matched that squad for the second-best finish in school history behind only the 1988 team that finished in a tie for eighth place among 30 schools at the Championships held that year in Thousand Oaks, Calif.

Sophomore **Mark Silvers** (Savannah, Ga.) shot a final round two-under-par 68 to finish with a four-day total of one-over-par 281 to pace the Gamecocks individually with a tie for 22nd place. He had three birdies and one bogey in the final round.

Freshman **George Bryan IV** (Chapin, S.C.) had his toughest day of the tournament, carding an eight-over-par 78 to finish with a 286 to tie for 42nd place overall.

Juniors **Mark Anderson** (Beaufort, S.C.) and **Warren Thomas** (Columbia, S.C.) each tied for 57th place individually with final scores of 290. Both golfers shot a final round four-over-par 74.

Sophomore Florian Fritsch (Munich, Germany) posted a final round one-over-par 71 to finish in a tie for 68th place with a four-day total of 293.
