



2003-04 Season Review



Competing as an individual, Robert Svensson captured the University of Hawaii/Turtle Bay Classic title with a 2-under par 214 on Nov, 4, 2003.



Eirik Johansen earned medalist bonors at the Palmetto Intercollegiate by shooting a 9-under par 204 on March 16, 2004.

2003-04 Season Highlights

- South Carolina posted its first team win of the season at the UH/ Turtle Bay Intercollegiate on the way to tying a single-season school record of three titles. The final two team victories came at the Mercedes-Benz Collegiate and the Palmetto Intercollegiate.
- The Gamecocks also tied a school record for the most individual titles in a single season
 with two. Sophomore Robert Svensson won the UH/ Turtle Bay Intercollegiate by shooting a 2-under par 214 while sophomore Eirik Johansen placed first at the Palmetto Intercollegiate with a 9-under par 204.
- South Carolina finished seventh at the SEC Championship, where junior Alex Hamilton recorded his best finish of the year with a tie for fifth place.
- South Carolina placed 17th at the NCAA East Regional played in New Haven, Conn. with a 16-over par team score of 856.
- Three Gamecocks were named to the All-Southeastern Conference team, a school record for a single year. Eirik Johansen earned first-team honors, while Alex Hamilton and junior Martin Rominger received second-team honors.
- Eirik Johansen was named to the 2004 PING All-Southeast Region team, receiving the honor for the second straight year. He finished the season second on the team with a 72.84 stroke average, but first for South Carolina with six top-10 and eight top-20 finishes.
- Martin Rominger earned a spot on the 2004 PING All-Southeast Region team and was named a Cleveland Golf All-America Scholar. He led the Gamecocks with a stroke average of 72.54 and also posted four top-10 and seven top-20 finishes.
- The Golf Coaches Association of America also named Alex Hamilton and junior Jake Thompson Cleveland Golf All-America Scholars.
- Sophomore West Streib was South Carolina's representative on the conference's first men's golf Good Works Team.
- Eirik Johansen carded a team low-round score of 65 at the Carpet Capital Collegiate, where he placed second overall.

Allen Powers • 1968

In 1968 Powers was named to the All-America team and finished in the NCAA Top Five. A 1968 graduate of USC, Powers won the Carolinas'



Four Ball Tournament four times and captured the S.C. Amateur in 1982. Powers' other collegiate victories included the 1967 South Carolina Intercollegiate and the 1968 Palmetto Intercollegiate.

David Tolley • 1984


Tolley graduated from South Carolina in 1984. He was runner-up in the 1982 U.S. Amateur before losing to Jay Sigel. Tolley gained national



recognition while at South Carolina by playing in the 1983 Masters Tournament. Tolley shot a 77-74 at The Masters, missing the cut by only four shots.

Mike Holland • 1978

A 1978 graduate of USC, Holland earned All-America honors his final season. Holland won the S.C. Amateur in 1976, finished ninth in the



NCAA's in '78 and played five years on the PGA tour. Holland teamed with Vance Heafner to win the Walt Disney Team Championship in 1981, and in 1982, finished second in the St. Jude Memphis Classic.

Fred Wadsworth • 1984

Wadsworth is a 1984 graduate of USC and was named to the '84 All-America squad. As a senior, Fred finished in the top 10 at the NCAA Champion-



ships. He collected victories at the Imperial Lakes Invitational and the South Carolina Invitational. In 1986, Fred joined the PGA Tour and captured the Southern Open Championships.

Steve Liebler • 1980-81

A 1981 graduate, Steve returned to his alma mater as head coach after five years on the professional golf tour. Liebler claimed four top 10 finishes



in his career. He was also a two-time All-American and captured the Eastern Amateur in 1981, while also winning the 1979 Guilford College Intercollegiate Tournament. The Virginia native coached USC to six NCAA Championship tournaments in his tenure.

Rick Williams • 1988

Rick was named to the 1988 All-America and All-Metro squads as well as receiving all-district honors. Williams again earned All-Metro honors



in 1990 by capturing the conference individual title. He finished his collegiate career with a 44th place finish at the 1990 NCAA East Regional Tournament. Williams now is a golf professional in Big Rapids, Michigan.

Webb Heintzelman • 1984

A 1984 graduate of South Carolina, Heintzelman earned All-American honors his senior year. He serves as a teaching professional in the Washing-



ton D.C. area. While playing for the Gamecocks, Webb claimed the 1984 Tar Heel Invitational crown. In the process, Heintzelman established a new course record with a round of 65.

Jeff Hull • 1989

Jeff was a senior on the 1989 Gamecock squad when he received All-America honors and finished 13th in the 1989 NCAA's. Hull was also





Brett Quigley • 1991

A 1991 graduate of USC, Quigley was an Academic All-American, and first team All-Metro performer at USC. He was second in the 1989



Metro Conference Tournament and posted a 72.9 stroke average his senior year. The Barrington, Rhode Island native is currently having a successful professional career.

Eric Ecker • 1998-99

Ecker was named to the Honorable Mention All-America squad in both his sophomore and junior seasons. During his sophomore year he cap-



tured the 1998 SEC Championship with two-day score of eight-under-par. He participated in every South Carolina tournament in his four years at the school and ranked as one of USC's all-time bests in terms of low tournament score and single-round low, and emerged as one of college golf's top players. Ecker is currently playing professionally.

Michael Christie • 1992

After a very successful collegiate career, Christie completed his degree in retailing and participated in the PGA qualifying school. Christie had seven



top 10 finishes in tournament play, including a third-place finish at the 1991 Metro Conference Championship. Christie finished in 52nd place at the 1993 U.S. Open.

Kyle Thompson • 1999-2001



Thompson left USC as the second golfer to be named an All-American three times. He captured individual championships in both the Seminole Classic and the NCAA East Regional, where he set a school record of 63 in the third and final round to capture the title. After winning the 2001 NCAA West Regional, Thompson broke Coal Ruland, such as the champion of the production of the second production o Carl Paulson's school record of most individual titles with five. Thompson is the only golfer in the history of the NCAA to win two different regionals. Thompson is currently playing professionally on the Nationwide Tour.

Carl Paulson • 1993

Graduating in 1994, Paulson compiled four individual medalist honors, more than anyone ever to wear the garnet and black. He was the Metro



Conference Champion in 1991 and was named SEC player of the year in 1993, the first Carolina athlete ever receive such an honor. An honorable mention selection in 1993, Paulson won the 1995 PGA Tour Qualifying School. Paulson is currently playing professionally.

Eirik Johansen • 2003

Johansen shined during his first season as a Gamecock. He led the team in stroke average with 72.53. After his successful campaign that included



seven Top 10 finishes, Johansen earned All-American Honorable Mention honors, as well as First Team All-SEC. He was also named to the All-Region and All-Freshman squads.

David Seawell • 1994-96

David Seawell was named a second team All-American as a sophomore. He won the Carpet Capital Collegiate in 1994 and led the nation in stroke



average at one time. Seawell tied for fourth in the East Regional of the NCAA Championships and qualified as an individual for the NCAA Finals in McKinney, Texas. He qualified for the NCAA Championships in Columbus, Ohio as a junior, en route to honorable mention All-America honors.


