
2009 UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH CAROLINA PRO DAY PLAYER BIOGRAPHIES



2008: Saw most of his action on special teams... played in 10 games... only appeared in the backfield for one play against Tennessee... credited with four tackles.... spent most of his Carolina career on the defensive side of the ball.

2007: Saw most of his action on special teams, playing in 10-of-12 games... suffered a right knee sprain in the opening game win over Louisiana-Lafayette and did not play against either Georgia or South Carolina State... returned to active duty against LSU... credited with four solo tackles, including two stops versus Clemson.

2006: Began the season at linebacker, moved to safety, then returned to an outside linebacker position... started the regular season's final two games (Middle Tennessee and Clemson) at linebacker... also used on special teams... credited with 22 tackles, including 17 solo stops... had a pair of sacks... logged a season-high five tackles against MTSU... recovered a fumble and forced one fumble.

2005: Began the season in the secondary, but was moved to the outside linebacker position... true freshman who played in all 12 games, figuring in on nine tackles, including five solo stops... had a season-high four stops in the bowl game against Missouri and registered three tackles in the Auburn game.

HIGH SCHOOL: Graduated from Buford (Ga.) High in 2005... helped his team to a 58-2 record and four state championship appearances, including three titles for Coach Dexter Wood... his team won 47 straight games... ran for 820 yards and eight TDs in 2004... also totaled 79 tackles with four interceptions as a senior... named first-team all-county and second-team all-state... received the Senior Captain Award... was on the state champion 4x100m relay team.

PERSONAL: Yvan Loic Banag was born in Paris, France, on December 23, 1986... came to the United States as an eighth-grader... pursuing a degree in hotel, restaurant and tourism management... named pronounced ee-VON ben-AG.

2008: Middle linebacker who earned second-team All-SEC honors by the league's coaches... ranked third on the squad with 65 tackles, including 5.0 tackles for loss... matched Emanuel Cook's seven tackles to pace the team against Georgia... had 2.0 tackles for loss including a sack against the Bulldogs... had eight tackles including one for loss at Ole Miss... led the team with eight tackles in the win at Kentucky... credited with a half-sack in the win over Tennessee... forced a fumble at Florida and

at Clemson... finished the season strong with nine tackles at Clemson then a season-high 11 stops against lowa, including 10 solos, in the Outback Bowl... also had an interception in the bowl game... credited with 193 tackles during his Carolina career, including 142 solo stops... made 30 career starts... selected to play in the East-West Shrine Game and was a participant at the NFL Combine in Indianapolis... has a twin brother, Casper, who completed his Carolina eligibility in 2007 and signed a free agent contract with the Carolina Panthers.

2007: Was the only Gamecock named preseason first-team All-SEC by both the SEC coaches and the media and was named to the preseason watch lists for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Lombardi Award, Butkus Award and for the Walter Camp Player of the Year Award... finished the season with 21 tackles, including 15 solo stops, in four games... led the team with eight tackles, including seven solo stops in the season opener against Louisiana-Lafayette, despite playing with a sprained left ankle... recorded his first career interception at Georgia on the game's final play, sealing the 16-12 win for the Gamecocks... had his second interception in as many games when he picked off a pass against South Carolina State... suffered a season-ending right knee injury in the loss at LSU... underwent surgery on Sept. 26.

2006: Arrived in Columbia in January and went through spring drills... started all 13 games... team's leading tackler with 107 total stops, over twice as many as any other player on the squad... an amazing 79 percent of those (85 of 107) were solo stops... ranked fourth in the league and 55th in the country in tackles, averaging 8.2 per game... led the team and was sixth in the league with 14.5 tackles for loss, tops among SEC linebackers... also recorded 5.0 sacks... led the team in tackles in eight of 13 games, including a career-high 13 (11 solos) against Florida... also had 11 stops against Mississippi State and Houston.

2004-05: Attended Georgia Military College in Milledgeville, Ga., where he was coached by Bert Williams... was a preseason first-team All-America linebacker who earned second-team postseason All-America accolades... recognized as the team's MVP both as a freshman and sophomore... came from the same program that produced former Gamecocks Brandon Isaac and Joel Reaves.

HIGH SCHOOL: Graduated from Thomson (Ga.) High School where he was coached by Luther Welch... was a first-team all-area and all-state selection.

PERSONAL: Jasper Jerrell Brinkley was born July 12, 1985... majoring in African-American studies... enjoys playing basketball and baseball.

2007: Joined the squad as a walk-on... worked with the scout team.


2005-06: Attended USC but was not on the football team.

2008: Strong safety who earned second-team All-SEC honors by the SEC Coaches, the Associated Press, *Phil Steele's* and *Rivals.com...* led the defense in tackles with 87, 12 more than any other player on the squad... his 7.2 tackles per game ranked in a tie for ninth in the SEC... 62 of his 87 stops (71 percent) were solo tackles... the 62 solo tackles were just one off the SEC lead... led the team in tackles six times... logged a career-high 14 tackles in the win over Ole Miss... it was the most tackles in a game by a Gamecock since Ricardo Hurley logged 14 against Clemson in 2004... also recorded double figures in tackles versus LSU (11), at Vanderbilt (10) and against Wofford (10)... recovered a fumble and returned it 52 yards in the Ole Miss contest... one of 13 players named to the Thorpe semifinal list... played in 33 games over three seasons, making 26 starts with 226 total tackles, including 179 unassisted stops... participated in the NFL Combine in Indianapolis.

2007: Named second-team All-SEC by the SEC coaches, the Associated Press, *Ri*vals.com and Phil Steele's... also named to the CollegeFootballNews.com first-team All-Sophomore squad... sidelined at the start of the season with an appendectomy, missing the season opener, but returned just two weeks after the operation to play against Georgia... despite missing one game and most of a second, led the team with 92 tackles, including 77 solos... had at least seven tackles in each of the last 10 games, including a career-high 11 versus both LSU and Vanderbilt, totaling 89 tackles in that stretch... was sixth in the SEC averaging 8.4 tackles per game... tied for the team lead with three interceptions... led the team with seven tackles, all solo stops, against South Carolina State... had seven solo stops against Mississippi State, including 2.0 tackles for loss and his first career sack... posted a game-high nine tackles, all solo stops, in the win over No. 8 Kentucky... had his first two career interceptions, led the team with nine tackles, including two tackles for loss, and a sack at North Carolina... logged 10 tackles, including eight solo stops, against Tennessee... had nine tackles, a sack, an interception and forced a fumble versus Clemson... shared Most Improved Safety honors in the spring with Brandon Isaac.

2006: Earned Freshman All-SEC honors by both the league's coaches and the *Sporting News...* tied for third on the team in tackles with 47, including 40 solo stops, despite playing only 10 games... recorded five tackles for loss... started five games including the first three contests and the Liberty Bowl game vs. Houston... also started at Florida... was the only true freshman to start the season opener at Mississippi State... suffered a left knee sprain against Wofford, which caused him to miss the next three games (FAU, Auburn and Kentucky)... returned for the Vanderbilt game where he logged six solo tackles... forced one fumble which helped turn the game at Clemson... had a season-high nine tackles versus Wofford and seven stops against Arkansas.

HIGH SCHOOL: Graduated from Palm Beach Gardens High where he was coached by Kevin Fleury... rushed for 2,027 yards and 27 touchdowns as a senior... recognized as the *South Florida Sun-Sentinel* Player of the Year for large schools... led his team to the Class 6A state title as a senior, marking the first state championship in school history... ran for 373 yards and five TDs in a game against Atlantic and busted a 99-yard run vs. Lake Worth in the playoffs... rushed for 243 yards and four scores in the state title game... ranked as the No. 21 safety in the country by *Rivals.com*, who also tabbed him as the No. 51 player in the state of Florida, regardless of position... a three-star prospect by *Rivals.com*... winner of the Palm Beach Post Character Counts Award... recognized as the Lou Groza Award Palm Beach County Player of the Year.

PERSONAL: Emanuel Cook was born Jan. 20, 1988... majoring in retailing... turned down NC State, Minnesota, Arizona State and Ole Miss to sign with Carolina.

2008: Tight end who earned first-team All-SEC recognition by the league's coaches and second-team accolades by the Associated Press, *Phil Steele's* and *Rivals.com...* named as one of eight semifinalists for the Mackey Award, given to the nation's top tight end... second on the team with 37 receptions and with 573 receiving yards while leading the team with a 15.5 yards per reception average... had the two longest receptions of the season by a Gamecock – a 66-yard touchdown pass against Arkansas and a 63-yard reception at Ole Miss... also scored in the season-opener against NC State, a 13-yard reception, and in the Outback Bowl versus lowa on a 10-yard reception... had a career-best day at Vanderbilt when he caught eight passes for 111 yards... caught three passes for 68 yards against Georgia... caught five passes for 74 yards against LSU... caught two passes for 82 yards in the win over Arkansas... played in 37 games during his career, making 15 starts... had 73 career receptions for 1,107 yards and seven scores... participated in the NFL Combine in Indianapolis.

2007: Came into the fall listed as a wide receiver but was moved to tight end... played in all 12 games, making three starts (South Carolina State, North Carolina and Tennessee)... was third on the squad with 30 receptions for 421 yards (second on the team), an average of 14.0 yards per catch, the highest average for any player with more than two receptions... logged three touchdown receptions — at North Carolina, at Arkansas and against Florida... had 13 of his 30 catches in a three-game stretch against Tennessee, Arkansas and Florida... had four receptions for a season-high 66 yards in the win over Mississippi State... caught five passes for 55 yards against Tennessee... given the Weight Room Effort Award for the offense following spring drills.

2006: Split the season between tight end and wide receiver as a redshirt freshman... saw action in 12 games... caught six passes for 113 yards, an average of 18.8 yards per catch... made his first collegiate start against Wofford, getting the nod at tight end... was moved back to wide receiver the following week... caught his first career touchdown pass — a 25-yarder from Syvelle Newton — against Auburn... caught two passes for 41 yards against Middle Tennessee... named the Most Improved Tight End during spring drills.

2005: Redshirted as a true freshman.

HIGH SCHOOL: Graduated from North Gwinnett High School in 2005 where he played receiver and free safety for Coach Kyle Richardson... caught 32 passes for 800 yards and 10 touchdowns as a senior... was a first-team All-Conference, All-State and Super 11 Team selection by *The Atlanta Journal Constitution...* rated the 24th-best

player in the state of Georgia and the 40th-best wide receiver in the country by *Rivals. com.*.. also played basketball and was regarded as one of the top players in the state.

PERSONAL: Jared Alan Cook was born April 7, 1987... pursuing a degree in retailing... brother, Jason Cook, plays football at Ole Miss.

2008: Tailback who rushed for a team-leading 573 yards on a career-high 163 carries... had more than twice as many carries as any other player on the squad and accounted for 47 percent of the rushing yards... rushed for 101 yards and a touchdown in the season-opening win over NC State... included was a 50-yard burst, the longest rush of his career... rushed for 80 yards on 18 carries against Vanderbilt... carried 19 times for a team-leading 73 yards at Ole Miss... carried a career-high 26 times in the win over Tennessee... it was the most carries for a Gamecock since Demetris Summers carried 27 times against UT in 2003... appeared in 48 games over the past four seasons, making 25 starts... carried the ball 523 times for 2,231 yards, an average of 4.3 yards per carry... ranks 12th on the all-time Carolina career rushing list, eighth with 19 career rushing TDs and was the eighth player in school history to log 500+ rushing attempts.

2007: Carried 114 times for 518 yards and five touchdowns... averaged 4.5 yards per carry... rushed for a team-high 94 yards in the season opener against Louisiana-Lafayette... rushed for 102 yards in the win over South Carolina State, his third career 100-yard rushing game... also had the first receiving touchdown of his career in that contest... tied the school record with three rushing touchdowns against Mississippi State... combined for 35 carries in back-to-back games against Mississippi State (18) and Kentucky (17), then logged just 35 carries through the final six contests... sat out the spring after undergoing right knee surgery.

2006: Played in 12 of 13 games, making five starts... was second on the team with 100 carries for 474 yards, averaging 4.7 yards per carry... logged six rushing touch-downs... caught 11 passes for 94 yards... missed the first several days of fall camp with an infection in his left foot... gained just 36 yards through the first three games before breaking loose for 92 yards and a TD in the win over FAU... best game of the season came when he carried 16 times for 94 yards and two touchdowns at Florida... missed the Middle Tennessee game... returned for the Clemson game and rushed a dozen times for 69 yards and two scores... carried 14 times for 72 yards in the Liberty Bowl win over Houston, including a season-long 25-yard burst... four of his six TDs came in his last three games... earned the Outstanding Running Back Award and was the Joe Morrison Award winner as the offensive player of the spring.

2005: Made nine starts as a true freshman... was the team's leading rusher with 146 carries for 666 yards and five TDs... logged his first 100-yard rushing game in the regular-season finale against Clemson with a 111-yard effort, then topped that with a career-best 125 yards and two scores in the Independence Bowl against Missouri... gained 413 yards over the final four games after logging 253 yards in the first eight contests... caught 15 passes for 136 yards, including a 64-yard reception in the season opener versus UCF... made his first start at Georgia... scored his first touchdown and the Gamecocks' first rushing touchdown of the season against Alabama in the third game... rushed for 89 yards in the win at Arkansas, including a season-best 37-yard tote... carried a season-high 22 times for 88 yards and two TDs against Florida.

HIGH SCHOOL: Graduated from Columbia's Glenforest High School in 2005 but played his high school football for Columbia High... coached by Kemper Amick... totaled 5,517 career rushing yards and scored 68 touchdowns during his career... rushed for 2,226 yards and 27 TDs as a senior and 2,127 yards and 20 scores as a junior... regarded as the top running back prospect in the state and the 11th-best running back in the nation by *Scout.com...* rated the 22nd-best running back and the 67th prospect overall in the nation by *Rivals.com...* rated the third best player in the state by *SuperPrep...* was a four-year starter on the basketball team.

2008: Fifth-year defensive lineman who added depth in the middle of the defensive line... promising career was hampered by knee injuries, which has limited his play this season... appeared in 10 of 13 games... played in 45 games making 14 starts during his Carolina career.


