2006-07 (JUNIOR): Recorded an overall record of 13-13 in singles matches and went 7-8 in duals ... Posted a 4-5 mark in SEC contests ... Held a 2-2 slate at the fourth singles position, was 3-5 at No. 5 singles and earned a 2-1 record at six ... Played doubles with Laura Ganzer, Miranda Gutierrez and Natasa Vuckovic ... The bulk of her matches were played with Ganzer, as the two were 12-7 as partners ... McGavock was 12-9 overall and 4-7 in duals, which included a 3-4 ledger in SEC play ... Made her third appearance in a row on the SEC Academic Honor Roll ... Had a rough start to the fall with four consecutive losses but responded with a six-match winning streak ... Won the B-2 flight at the Southern Intercollegiate Championships, dropping just seven games in four matches and winning every second set by a 6-0 score ... Was a semifinalist at the SEC Fall Coaches Classic after defeating Auburn's Jil Hasternath 6-4, 6-2 in the round of 16 and Caroline Winebrenner of Kentucky 6-0, 6-1 in the quarters ... Lost in three sets to Lara Fakhoury from Georgia in the semifinals ... Won her singles match against Georgia's Kelley Hyndman at the No. 5 slot by a count of 6-4, 6-2 ... Her most critical win of the season came against Kentucky in the Gamecocks' last home match of the season ... Upended Jessica Giuggioli 6-7(5), 6-0, 6-4 on court five to give Carolina a 4-3 victory and a bye in the first round of the SEC Tournament ... In doubles, McGavock and Ganzer won the B-1 flight at the Southern Intercollegiate Championships ... The following weekend, the tandem claimed the B flight of the SEC Fall Coaches Classic by downing teams from Alabama, Georgia and Vanderbilt ... Won 8-6 in the title match against Sveke/Ulery from Vandy.

2005-06 (SOPHOMORE): Was the Gamecocks' most consistent performer in the spring, as she led the team in dual-match victories with a 16-5 record ... Went 21-10 overall ... Played all the singles positions except the top two ... The majority of her matches were played at No. 5 singles, where McGavock was 12-3 ... Had a 15-15 slate in doubles play, which included a 12-11 record in duals ... Was used nearly equally at all three doubles slots, playing nine at No. 1 doubles, eight at the second spot and six at three doubles ... Won her first six contests in duals after going 0-4 at a January tournament in Las Vegas ... Also won nine of her first 10 in dual matches with the one loss coming in three sets ... Defeated Mimi Renaudin of Ole Miss by scores of 4-6, 6-3, 6-4 to help the Gamecocks to a 4-3 victory over the Rebels ...

McGavock was 6-4 overall in SEC matches ... Registered a 6-4, 4-6, 6-2 triumph over Vanderbilt's Caroline Ferrell ... Gave the Gamecocks their one point in a first-round NCAA loss to Wake Forest by downing Sierra Poske 6-1, 6-1 at No. 5 singles ... Finished the fall with an impressive 5-1 record ... Competed only in the USTA and Southern Intercollegiate tournaments ... Won four matches at the Southern Intercollegiate to win her flight ... Made the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the second straight year.

2004-05 (FRESHMAN): Was a significant contributor for South Carolina as a freshman, going 19-8 in singles and 15-10 in doubles ... Had a successful fall season where she went 10-5 and won her flight at the SEC Fall Coaches Classic ... Defeated Audrey Bordeleau from Arkansas in the final 4-6, 6-4, 6-3 ... Had to win three of the four matches at the event in three sets ... Stepped into the starting lineup midway through the dual-match season and went 8-2 playing primarily at No. 6 singles ... In her first dual match against Alabama, McGavock upended Andrea Brenes at the No. 6 slot 6-2, 5-7, 7-5 to help South Carolina earn a 4-3 victory ... Snagged one of the Gamecocks' two points at Tennessee, as McGavock defeated Ghizela Schutte in three sets ... Went on to win four more matches in a row after the UT contest to extend her unbeaten streak to six ... Beat Nebraska's Katie Garcia 6-3, 6-3 in the first round of NCAA play to help the Gamecocks win their 12th opening-round match in a row ... Played doubles with Grace Blakely, Miranda Gutierrez, Fallon Koon and Magda Wojdylo ... Named to the SEC Freshmen Academic Honor Roll ... Was a Dean's List member for the fall and spring semesters.

HIGH SCHOOL: Was ranked No. 6 in Florida as a junior in the 18s ... Also ranked among the top 50 in the country in the 18s ... Did not play high school tennis.

PERSONAL: Pursuing a degree in corporate finance and marketing, and a minor in women's studies ... 2006-07 (SOPHOMORE): Followed up her outstanding freshman season with an equally impressive sophomore campaign ... Earned recognition on the All-SEC First Team, making her just the second Gamecock in school history to achieve first-team status ... Ended the season with a national singles ranking of 53rd and was as high as No. 39 ... Ranked No. 7 in the ITA Southeast Region for singles ... Her doubles play with partner Ana Marija Zubori earned a national billing of 18th at one point during the spring ... The duo finished the year ranked No. 40 ... Competed in the NCAA Singles Championship for the second year in a row ... Lost to Tracy Lin from UCLA in the first round 7-6(4), 6-2 ... Players she defeated during the season who held a national ranking in the final listing included Fani Chifchieva of Auburn (16), Ela Kaluder of Arkansas (38), Martina Banikova of Mississippi State (43), Ilona Somers of Ole Miss (46), Kellie Schmitt of Marshall (73), Ashley Joelson of UCLA (112) and Laura Gioia of Furman (116) ... A member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll for a second consecutive year ... Compiled a 17-16 overall record in singles matches and was 13-9 playing exclusively at the No. 1 singles position for dual matches ... Her record in SEC matches was 6-5 ... In doubles, Schofield was 19-14 and 11-10 in duals with all but one match coming at the top slot ... Bothered by injuries during the fall that limited her playing time ... Still performed well in doubles with Zubori, as the tandem claimed the A-1 flight at the Southern Intercollegiate Championships ... The two reached the final of the A flight at the SEC Fall Coaches Classic after defeating teams from Florida, Kentucky and Vanderbilt ... Suffered an 8-6 setback to Georgia's Y. Hyndman/Ivanov in the championship match ... Later defeated the Bulldog team in the spring 8-3 when the UGA duo was ranked No. 15 ... Came back to win her first four singles matches in the spring, three of which came in straight sets ... Won seven of her first nine matches to begin the dual season ... Scored two big wins against Marshall, first in doubles against Kever/Schmitt, who were ranked 27th at the time, and then in singles 6-4, 6-2 against then-No. 28 Schmitt ... Nearly defeated Megan Falcon from LSU on the road when Falcon was ranked No. 2 in the country ... Lost the match 6-7, 7-6, 6-1 to Falcon, who also finished the season ranked second ... Also fell in close matches with Blakeley Griffith of Tennessee and Amanda Fish of Vanderbilt in April ... Schofield was defeated 7-5 in the third against Griffith and dropped a 10-7 super tiebreaker to Fish ... Had a winning streak of seven matches during the spring in doubles with Zubori and won 11 of 12 after losing the first match of the spring.

2005-06 (FRESHMAN): Had one of the best freshman years in South Carolina history ... Named second-team All-SEC ... Also tabbed SEC Co-Freshman of the Year, becoming the first Carolina player to earn the accolade from the Southeastern Conference ... Became the second Gamecock to win the ITA Southeast Region Rookie of the Year award ... Won the Gamecocks' 2006 MVP award as well ... Was an at-large selection for the NCAA Singles Championship in Stanford, Calif., to become just the second South Carolina freshman to make the field ... Finished the year ranked No. 54 in the nation in singles ... Stayed among the top 70 in singles the entire spring, reaching a high of 46th in late February ... Lost back-to-back matches in singles just one time the entire season ... Went 25-11 overall and 14-7 in duals while playing exclusively at the No. 1 singles position ... Held a 5-6 mark in SEC matches ... In doubles, Schofield registered a 19-17 slate, tying her with fellow freshman Natasa Vuckovic for the team lead in victories ... Played every doubles match during the spring season at the top slot as well ... Defeated four ranked players in the spring ... The first was Frederica van Adrichem from Clemson, who was 41st at the time ... Within a week during April, Schofield beat players ranked No. 12 and No. 15 at the time of the match ... The first was Robin Stephenson of Alabama, who lost in straight sets ... The second was Vanderbilt's Amanda Fish ... Defeated Kseniia Tokarieva from Mississippi in the first round of the SEC Tournament to help the Gamecocks win 4-1 after losing the doubles point ... Tokarieva was the player with which Schofield shared SEC Freshman of the Year honors ... Finished the fall at 10-2 with a couple of tournament crowns ... Her first was the Southern Intercollegiate Championships ... Schofield's last tourney championship was at the SEC Fall Coaches Classic by downing teammate Vuckovic in the final in three sets ... Played doubles with Laura Ganzer, Megan McGavock and Vuckovic ... Was 10-11 in dual matches for doubles play ... Made the SEC Freshmen Academic Honor Roll, as well as the Athletics Director's Honor Roll for the fall and spring semesters.

HIGH SCHOOL: Attended American Heritage Boca Delray High School ... Ranked No. 1 in Florida in the girls' 16s and finished No. 2 in the nation ... Won the state championship at her high school during her junior season and the team finished second in her senior season ... During her junior year of high school, she won the Best Newcomer of the Year award and the team MVP as a senior ... Finished second at the girls' 16s National Clay Courts and second at the girls' 18s Bush Florida Open tournament.

2006-07 (SOPHOMORE): Honored as a member of the All-SEC Second Team for a second consecutive year ... Along with Ana Marija Zubori, Vuckovic was named the team's MVP ... Recorded a 23-6 overall record in singles and went 20-10 in doubles contests with Christyn Lucas being her primary partner ... Ranked No. 93 in the nation to begin the fall season ... Ranked as high as No. 57 in doubles during the spring with Lucas ... Ended the year being ranked No. 30 in the ITA Southeast Region ... Vuckovic and Lucas were 13th in the regional rankings for doubles ... Her 79.3 percent winning percentage in singles was the 11th highest mark in school history for one season ... Became almost a guaranteed point in singles for the Gamecocks during the spring thanks to her 19-3 record that led the team in dual matches ... Had a stellar 9-1 record in SEC matches, going 4-1 at No. 3 singles and 5-0 at the fourth position ... Vuckovic was also perfect overall at No. 4 singles with an 8-0 record ... Held a 16-6 mark in duals for doubles contests and was 7-3 against the SEC ... She and Lucas were 13-4 at No. 2 doubles and 7-1 versus conference foes at the spot ... They opened the spring with six straight wins and later won nine in a row to cap a run of 15 wins in 16 attempts ... Had a quiet fall with a 4-3 singles record ... Her highlight was making the title match of the A-2 singles flight at the Southern Intercollegiate Championships ... After Vuckovic dropped her first singles match of the spring, she responded with five straight wins ... Following a loss to Estefania Balda of Clemson, Vuckovic ripped off 11 straight victories that all came in straight sets ... A heartbreaking three-set loss to Kentucky's Sarah Woestmann stopped her streak ... During her 11-match unbeaten stretch, Vuckovic notched a 7-5, 6-3 win against Darya Ivanov from Georgia, who was ranked No. 42 in the nation at the time ... Her 6-2, 7-5 triumph over Samantha Orlin of Tennessee at No. 4 singles helped key a 4-2 South Carolina win that marked the Gamecocks' first win in Knoxville, Tenn., since 1993 ... Won another critical match at LSU over Nicole Kantor 6-4, 7-5 on court three in a 4-3 Carolina victory ... Following the LSU match and her 6-1, 6-0 win versus Audrey Bordeleau from Arkansas, Vuckovic was tabbed SEC Player of the Week ... It marked the second year in a row Vuckovic won the award ... Scored another win against a highly regarded opponent in Catherine Newman of Vanderbilt in April ... Posted a 5-7, 6-2, 6-4 win against Newman, ranked No. 38 at the time, playing No. 3 singles ... Also teamed with Lucas to upend Newman and Taka Bertrand in doubles at the second position by a score of 8-5 ... The Commodore duo held a ranking of 51st at the time ... Ended the year on a three-match winning streak with triumphs over Newman, Connor Vogel of Tennessee and Lenore Lazaroiu from Wichita State.

2005-06 (FRESHMAN): Earned second-team All-SEC honors and garnered SEC Player of the Week recognition once ... Led the team in singles victories with a 26-15 record ... Tied for second with fellow freshman Gira Schofield in dual-match wins after a 14-7 slate ... Played No. 2 singles for most of the spring, going 11-7 and 6-5 in SEC contests ... Held a national singles ranking for the majority of the spring season as well, going as high as No. 62 in January and February ... Reached the final of three fall tournaments, including the SEC Fall Coaches Classic and the Southern Intercollegiate Championships ... Defeated a pair of ranked opponents at the fall SEC event in Nina Suvak of Florida and Taka Bertrand from Vanderbilt ... Vuckovic won in three sets both times ... Upended one ranked player in the spring by downing Arizona State's Sabrina Capannolo 6-3, 6-1 at a tournament in Las Vegas ... Won her first six matches in duals ... One of her victories came against Clemson's Maria Brito by a 7-6(5), 1-6, 6-3 count to help South Carolina win 4-3 after losing the doubles point ... Had a five-match winning streak in March as well that included victories over players from Tennessee, Winthrop, LSU, Arkansas and Auburn ... Won a key match against Ilona Somers from Mississippi in the first round of the SEC Tournament ... The Gamecocks lost the doubles point, but Vuckovic's triumph helped lift them to a 4-1 win ... Tied for the team lead in doubles wins thanks to a 19-17 mark ... Went 10-10 in duals and split time playing at one and two doubles ... Played a large portion of the season with Schofield, going 13-11 overall and 5-7 at the No. 1 slot in dual matches ... Her six victories in doubles during SEC play was the best on the squad ... Vuckovic and Schofield defeated one ranked doubles tandem during the season in Somers/Tomatis of Ole Miss, who were No. 41 at the time.

HIGH SCHOOL: Five-time champion of the former Serbia & Montenegro ... Best finish in the ITF junior national rankings was 73rd ... Played in the Wimbledon and French Open under-18 tournaments ... Finished the season ranked No. 1 in her country for the under-16 and -18 age divisions ... Played on national teams at all age levels.

2006-07 (FRESHMAN): Her 31 victories in singles matches tied for fifth on the Gamecocks' single-season top 10 list and was the most in one year by a player since 1990 ... Zubori's 83.8 percent winning percentage placed seventh on the school's all-time single-season list ... With 52 overall victories between singles and doubles, Zubori's total tied for ninth-most in one season at Carolina ... Earned a spot on the All-SEC Second Team and was named team MVP along with Natasa Vuckovic ... Had a 13-3 fall that was followed by an 18-3 record in dual matches ... Finished second on the team in dual victories ... Went 13-2 at No. 2 singles and owned an overall SEC mark of 8-3 ... Went 15-1 in regional matches and finished with a ranking of No. 19 in the ITA Southeast Region ... Cracked the national rankings for the first time in April at 83rd ... Ended the spring ranked No. 108 ... In doubles, Zubori was 21-12 and 11-9 playing the top position with Gira Schofield as her partner ... The duo entered the rankings in February and stayed there the rest of the season, reaching a high of 18th in late March before ending 40th ... For the Southeast Region, Zubori and Schofield were ranked No. 10 at season's end ... A member of the SEC Freshmen Academic Honor Roll ... Won the first seven matches of her career in the fall and 11 of her first 12 overall ... Took home the flight 3 title at the Furman Fall Classic and reached the final of the USTA National Tennis Center Invitational's A flight ... Also crowned champion of the A-1 flight at the Southern Intercollegiate Championships ... Began the dual-match campaign with a string of eight consecutive victories and won 13 of her first 14 ... During the eight straight wins, Zubori won all the matches in straight sets and claimed 38 games in a row at one point ... Her 6-2, 5-7, 6-4 win over Caitlin Whoriskey of Tennessee at No. 3 singles helped the Gamecocks defeat the Lady Vols in Knoxville, Tenn., for the first time since 1993 ... Won another critical match at LSU by scores of 3-6, 6-4, 6-1 versus Mykala Hedberg at the second singles position, as Carolina beat the Tigers 4-3 ... Defeated Kentucky's Kim Coventry 6-3, 6-3 in another 4-3 victory for South Carolina that gave the Gamecocks a bye in the first round of the SEC Tournament ... Coventry was ranked as high as 15th during her college career ... Zubori's 6-3, 6-4 win against Megan Alexander of Florida marked the first of her career over a top-25 foe, as Alexander was 20th at the time ... Finished the season riding a three-match unbeaten streak against players from Florida, Tennessee and Wichita State ... Reached the final of the A flight doubles at the SEC Fall Coaches Classic after winning three matches with Schofield ... During the spring, they defeated Kever/Schmitt from Marshall 8-3, a tandem ranked No. 27 at the time ... Followed a week and a half later with an 8-3 triumph over then-No. 15 Y. Hyndman/Ivanov of Georgia ... Zubori/Schofield had a winning streak of seven matches during the spring and won 11 of 12 after losing the first match of the spring.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS YEAR AFTER YEAR

The Gamecock women's tennis team enjoyed another successful year in the classroom with six of its seven members being named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll following the 2007 season. South Carolina had six honorees in 2006 as well and nine in both the 2004 and 2005 seasons.

Since South Carolina first competed in the SEC in the 1991-92 academic year, 43 women's tennis players have lettered for the Gamecocks. Thirty-four of those 43 Gamecocks have appeared on the SEC Academic Honor Roll. That means 79.1 percent of Carolina's women's tennis players have qualified for the list since 1991-92.

To qualify for the SEC Academic Honor Roll, each student-athlete must 1) have a GPA of 3.00 for either the preceding academic year or have a cumulative GPA of 3.00 or above at the nominating institution; 2) be on scholarship, a letterwinner or have participated on a varsity team for two years if non-scholarship; 3) have completed 24 semester hours of non-remedial credit at the nominating institution; and 4) have been a member of the varsity team for the sport's entire NCAA Championship segment.
