PUGGY BLACKWON

Head Coach > 12th Season at South Carolina > 24th Season Overall

Puggy Blackmon, who was inducted to the Golf Coaches' Association of America Hall of Fame in 2005, is in his 12th season at the helm of the South Carolina men's golf program.

Throughout his II-year stint at South Carolina, Blackmon has continued to build his already impressive resume. USC has advanced to the NCAA Regionals every year since Blackmon began his career at South Carolina, and of those II regional berths, the Gamecocks have competed in seven NCAA finals.

South Carolina golf has won eight team tournament titles in Blackmon's tenure and captured 11 individual titles, including five from All-American Kyle Thompson under Blackmon's guidance. Five golfers have earned nine All-America honors as well.

On Blackmon's watch, II Gamecock golfers have collected I7 All-SEC first or second team honors. Blackmon has also coached two SEC Freshmen of the Year (Mark Anderson, 2005 and Eric Ecker, 1998) and an SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year (West Streib, 2005).

The Gamecocks are coming off another strong season in 2005-06 which included a trip to the NCAA Championship and another team title. Carolina won the Bank of Tennessee Intercollegiate behind top-five performances from freshman Florian Fritsch (second) and senior Eirik Johansen (fourth). Both Johansen and Fritsch were named to the all-SEC team and Johansen capped his career with a second honorable mention All-America nod.

In 2005, under Blackmon's guidance, Gamecock freshman Mark Anderson placed first at both the Southern Highlands Collegiate Championship and the Schenkel E-Z-Go Invitational and went on to earn Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Year honors. Anderson was also named to the All-SEC first team, the Golf Coaches' Association of America All-Freshman team and a third-team All-American. Senior West Streib was also honored as the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year for men's golf in 2005.

In 2004, Blackmon's team captured three tournament titles, including an incredible 28-shot win at the Mercedes-Benz Collegiate Championship. USC also finished first at the Palmetto Collegiate and Hawaii-Turtle Bay. Eirik Johansen (first team), Alex Hamilton (second team) and Martin Rominger (second team) earned

All-SEC recognition. Rominger and Hamilton, along with Jake Thompson, were selected Cleveland Golf All-America Scholars. In 2003, Johansen earned several prestigious awards. He was named Honorable Mention All-America, first-team All-SEC, as well as being named to the All-Region and All-Freshman squad.

The Gamecocks have spent a considerable amount of time in the national polls, including a No. 3 national ranking in 1999 and fourth in 2000.

Blackmon's players have excelled academically as well. The men's golf team has posted the highest team grade point average of any of the school's men's programs for three consecutive semesters in the spring of 2005, fall of 2005 and spring of 2006. Former Gamecock Lars Cederqvist was named a 2000 Academic All-American as a senior after maintaining a 4.0 in mechanical engineering throughout his collegiate career. Seven different golfers have earned nine GCAA All-America Scholar honors while 35 players have been named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

"It has always been my goal to win the national championship and I believe that can be accomplished at South Carolina," Blackmon said upon his hiring. "The facilities and support of the people are unbelievable. The University Club is an outstanding facility and is a terrific asset to the golf program. South Carolina always has been a tremendous golf state and the people of Carolina may be the most loyal in the country."

In addition to serving as the head men's golf coach at South Carolina, Blackmon maintains a close relationship with several of his former players and

current PGA Tour Champions. His close friendship with tour star, David Duval, is widely recognized. In addition to Duval, Blackmon also remains a confidant for 2000 PGA Tour Rookie of the Year, Michael Clark II.

Before coming to Carolina, Blackmon coached Georgia Tech to five Atlantic Coast Conference Championships, I I-consecutive NCAA Championship appearances and 34 team tournament titles. Blackmon was named head coach of the Gamecock program on June 5, 1995, and the highly-successful head coach made an immediate impact on the Gamecock program.

During his 12-year tenure at Georgia Tech, Blackmon built the Yellow Jacket program into one of the most successful and dominant in all of college golf. His teams' II-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament were matched only by six other schools in college golf. Blackmon's 1993 Tech squad finished runner-up at the NCAAs and he led the Rambling Wreck to five top-seven national finishes. His Georgia Tech teams either won or finished second in the ACC Championship nine times in his tenure.

A four-time ACC Coach of the Year (1984, 1985, 1992, 1993), three of Blackmon's former golfers finished second at the NCAA Championships and his players at South Carolina and Georgia Tech have won 31 individual tournament crowns. Blackmon has coached 30 All-Americans at Tech and Carolina and two national players of the year in the 1990s at Tech. Duval, a four-time All-American, was the 1993 National Player of the Year, while Stewart Cink, one of the brightest young stars in the professional ranks, was named the 1995 National Player of the Year.

Blackmon now has coached 30 All-SEC or All-ACC performers in his tenure, while five of those individuals -- Bob McDonnell (1985), David Duval (1991, 1993), Mikko Rantanen (1994) and Eric Ecker (1998) -- were conference medalists. The Yellow Jackets won the ACC team title in 1985, 1991, 1992, 1993 and 1994, while Carolina was runner up by one stroke at the SEC's in 1998 -- USC's best finish ever. In addition, Blackmon has coached his teams at 42 tournament titles and maintains a streak of 22-straight postseason appearances (through 2006) at Carolina and Georgia Tech.

Blackmon has also proven to be an effective fund raiser. At Carolina, Blackmon has introduced creative ways to raise money for the Gamecock golf programs, including the sales of Cock N' Fire cabernet. The wine includes an endorsement and label that pictures South Carolina head football coach Steve Spurrier. It is distributed by the Ben Arnold Beverage throughout the state of South Carolina. Proceeds have totaled more than \$165,000 in 2005 and 2006. Blackmon also spearheaded the efforts which led to the endowment of his team's scholarships at Georgia Tech.

Born William Dempsey Blackmon III on Dec. 9, 1950 in Beaufort, S.C., he is a 1969 graduate of Ridgeland High School. Blackmon played collegiately at Carson-Newman College, where he received his Bachelor of Arts degree in business administration in

1973. He was chosen one of the Outstanding College Athletes of America in 1971 and 1973. After receiving his Master of Science degree in economics from Clemson in 1977, Blackmon worked for six years in the golf resort operations and development field in Florida.

Blackmon has proven to be a top recruiter at both the national and international levels. He has successfully recruited at least one American Junior Golf Association All-America player each of the past 13 years. Blackmon also excels as being a teaching coach, having been a PGA professional and junior golf activist since 1973. He was instrumental in developing the Jacksonville (Fla.) and Atlanta Junior Golf Associations. Throughout his career, he has been involved in junior golf on the local, national and international levels.

Blackmon and his wife, Gail, also a Ridgeland native, have three children: a daughter, Ashley, and two sons, Jordan and Tate. Ashley, who is married to Jared Jones, is a graduate of the Medical University of South Carolina. Jordan is a senior at USC, and Tate, is junior at Blythewood High School.

BILL MGDONAGD

Associate Head Coach > First Season at South Carolina

A highly successful collegiate golfer, former tour professional and accomplished instructor, Bill Mc-Donald joined the University of South Carolina men's golf staff as associate head coach on Sept. I, 2006.

"Having known Bill since his junior golf days and following his development over the years, I can't imagine having anyone more qualified to assist us in reaching our ultimate goals at USC," Blackmon said. "I feel that he will evolve into one of the best coaches in the country."

"I want to thank Eric Hyman and Coach Puggy Blackmon for giving me such a wonderful opportunity to join the staff of the Gamecock Golf program," McDonald said. "I am honored to be a part of such a great University and I look forward to serving the most loyal and passionate fans in the country."

McDonald returns to Columbia for a second time after serving as the Director of Instruction at the University Club from 1996-1998. Most recently, he has worked as the Director of Instruction at Cartersville Country Club (2006) and has been involved with Atlanta-based company Accelerized Golf as a founding partner and instructor from 2003-2006. He has previously served as Director of Instruction at City Club Golf Academy in Atlanta (2000-2003).

McDonald played collegiately for Blackmon at Georgia Tech (1985-88) where he was the runner-up at the 1988 NCAA Championship and a two-time All-American (1985 and 1988). He earned his bachelor of science degree in industrial management from Tech in 1989 and after competing professionally for the next five years in South Africa, Canada and several PGA Tour and Nationwide Tour events, McDonald returned to his alma mater to serve as an assistant coach to Blackmon in 1994-95.

In 2005, McDonald was a featured instructor on The Golf Channel's "Your Game Night." He has competed in three PGA Professional National Championships (2003, 2004, 2006) and won the Big Oak Putter Classic in 2006. In addition, McDonald has been a top-10 player in the Georgia PGA Section for the last five years.

McDonald is a member of the Georgia Tech Sports Hall of Fame and the Professional Golfers' Association of America (since 2002). He and his wife, Tanya, are the parents of two boys, Trace (4), and Tyler (2).



MICHAEL BURGIN

Director of Golf Operations > Fourth Season at South Carolina

Michael Burcin is in his third season as a full-time member of the South Carolina men's golf staff. Burcin was as an assistant coach for the last two seasons (2004-2006) and served as a volunteer assistant during the spring of 2004. With the addition of Bill McDonald to the staff, Burcin takes over as the Director of Golf Operations.

Upon joining the Carolina staff, Burcin was put in charge of recruiting, creating a club for former Gamecock Lettermen and all day-to-day activities. The group of lettermen, known as The Players Club, has over sixty members and is growing. While Burcin has been the liaison for the academic

staff, the Gamecocks have achieved at least a 3.3 grade point average in each semester, and combined for a new record this past fall of 3.543. In addition to coaching, Burin's other duties include arranging all travel, scheduling and serving as the liaison to the strength and conditioning and compliance offices.

Before coming to South Carolina, Burcin spent seven years in the golf business as a golf professional in Lancaster, Pa. Burcin's last stop in Pennsyvlania was developing an indoor teaching program at a retail golf store in Lancaster. While in Lancaster, Burcin kept an active playing schedule of section and chapter PGA events.

Originally from Salina, Kan, Burcin graduated from Lampeter-Strasburg High School in Lampeter, Pa., where he was a 10-time letterman in three sports.

A member of the Golf Coaches Association of America, Burcin and his wife, Dr. Michelle Burcin, who was a standout swimmer at the University of Cincinnati, reside in Columbia.

Kevin O'Connell is in his second year as executive associate athletics director at the University of South Carolina.

O'Connell serves as the sport administrator for baseball, men's basketball, men's and women's soccer and men's and women's

golf. He also oversees the Gamecock athletics marketing and promotions, media relations, facilities and ticket operations, and serves as the department's liaison with Gamecock Sports Properties (Learfield and ISP Sports), Action Sports Media and Global Spectrum, the management company for the Colonial Center.

O'Connell came to South Carolina after spending six years at TCU as the Associate Athletics Director of External Operations. He was responsible for the Frogs' marketing and promotions, the TCU Sports Network, media relations, ticket operations, the community outreach program and served as the primary liaison with ESPN Regional Television. Additionally, he oversaw the TCU men's and women's golf, men's and women's swimming & diving and men's and women's track & field programs.

During O'Connell's tenure in Fort Worth, the Horned Frogs showed attendance growth in nearly every sport. TCU posted three of the top six football season attendance totals in school history. The women's basketball program boasted the topranked home season attendance figure in Conference USA four straight years and was ranked 32nd nationally in 2004-2005 with an average attendance of 3,462. TCU baseball averaged its highest attendance in school history during the 2005 campaign.
