The Basics

The No. 23 South Carolina women's golf team competes as the eighth seed at the 2006 NCAA Women's Golf East Regional Championship played May 11-13 at Bryan Park Golf Course in Browns Summit, N.C. The Gamecocks earned their eighth consecutive NCAA Regional bid and are making their 11th trip to the postseason in 12 years under head coach Kristi Coggins.

The NCAA Regional Championships are divided into three regions (East, Central and West) with 21 teams plus the three top individuals who play for schools that did not qualify as a team competing in each region. The top eight teams at regionals plus the top two individuals advance to the NCAA Championships played May 23-26 in Columbus Ohio

The Gamecocks will play a familiar course at the East Regional, as Carolina competed at the Bryan National Collegiate March 31-April 2, finishing seventh in an 18-team field comprised of 16 teams that earned NCAA Regional berths this year. Of the seven teams seeded ahead of Carolina in this year's East Regional, the Gamecocks have gone head-to-head against six in various tournaments this spring, finishing ahead of five of the teams at least once.

Carolina is one of eight ranked teams competing in the East Regional and joins six other Southeastern Conference schools competing in the East. All tolled, 10 SEC schools earned NCAA Regional berths this year.

Simons Recognized As SEC's Best

South Carolina women's golf standout **Whitney Simons** was recognized as the 2006 Southeastern Conference Women's Golf Scholar-Athlete of the Year. A sophomore from Aiken, S.C. (Aiken HS), Simons has appeared on South Carolina's President's List (perfect 4.0 grade-point average) every semester she has been enrolled in school. Simons triple majors in international business, marketing and finance and is a Spanish minor. Making her GPA more impressive is the fact that the international business school at South Carolina is the top-ranked school in the nation. Simons is the first Gamecock ever to earn SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year honors.

On the course, Simons is ranked as a top-100 player nationally. She is currently ranked 92nd in the nation in the latest Golfweek rankings and her 75.74 stroke average heading into the NCAA Regionals gives her the lowest stroke average of any player on the South Carolina roster. Simons tied for 16th at the 2006 SEC Championship and has posted two top-10 finishes and five top-20 finishes in 2005-06, highlighted by a team-best sixth-place finish at the Chrysler Challenge, where her 75-71-79=225 led the Gamecocks to the tournament championship.

Battle Earns Highest USC Honor

Senior **Erica Battle** earned the highest honor a South Carolina student-athlete can achieve from the athletic department when she was presented with the President's Award at USC's All-Sports Banquet on April 24.

The President's Award is awarded to an individual who displays extraordinary talents in the areas of athletics, scholarship, leadership and service. Battle has exemplified all areas very strongly throughout her career. She sports a career-best 76.22 stroke average heading into the NCAA Regional Championship and has posted three top-20 finishes this year. The Irmo, S.C. native will graduate Magna Cum Laude with a double major in marketing and management in the Moore School of Business, with a minor in Hotel, Restaurant, Tourism Management. Battle was also named to the Dean's List or President's List every semester of her college career. Her community service efforts include a long list of activities. Named to the SEC Good Works Team, she volunteers for the Children's Hospital, Harvest Hope Food Bank and the Ronald McDonald House, among others. Her most notable community service effort is probably the "Golfing for God Ministry", a youth organization she founded in the Columbia area while in college. A weekly volunteer to a local youth mentoring program, Battle is a member of CHOICES TEAM (Student-Athletes for Healthy Choices Concerning Alcohol) and of Fellowship Christian Athletes.

Last Time Out - SEC Championship

The South Carolina women's golf team finished eighth at the 2006 SEC Championship played in Nashville, Tenn., with a 310-293-300=903 (+39), 28 strokes behind tournament winner Auburn.

Jenna Pearson starred for the Gamecocks on Sunday, shooting an even-par 72, which enabled her to finish in a tie for seventh place on the final individual leader board with a 75-74-72=221 (+5), 10 strokes behind individual medalist **Maria Martinez** from Auburn. Pearson's performance marked the lowest 54-hole score of any Gamecock player this Spring and was the third-lowest 54-hole total of her career. In finishing seventh, Pearson became the 10th Carolina player ever to finish in the top 10 at the SEC Championship and the first since **Kristy McPherson** finished third in 2003. Pearson finished ahead of five of the nation's top 28 players who competed in the field.

Sophomore **Whitney Simons** was also very productive for South Carolina throughout the SEC Championship, finishing in a tie for 16th with a 75-73-75=223 (+7). Though still an underclassman, Simons has demonstrated a knack for success when the stakes are high, as she finished 12th at last year's SEC Championship and knocked in a hole-in-one at last year's NCAA East Regional.

Senior **Erica Battle** finished in a tie for 35th with a 79-73-78=230 (+14). She overcame a rocky start to shoot par on eight of her last nine holes, with the one exception a double-bogey on the course's parfive fourth hole. Sophomore **Blythe Worley** finished in a tie for 41st with an 84-73-75=232 (+16), with sophomore **Laura Raffo** tying for 53rd with an 81-81-78=240 (+24).

Carolina At The 2005 NCAA East Regional Championship

The Gamecocks narrowly missed qualifying for the NCAA Championship last year, as 12th-seeded Carolina finished ninth at the NCAA East Regional, with only the top eight teams advancing.

2006 Lady Gamecock Classic March 10-12, 2006 University Club (Blythewood, S.C.)

Blythewood, S.C. - Auburn won the 2006 Lady Gamecock Classic team championship with a three-round score of 304-278-297=879. Auburn's Maria Martinez emerged as the individual medalist, carding a five-under-par 73-68-70=211 to finish five strokes ahead of Florida State's Caroline Westrup for the title. Her three-round score of 211 established a new Lady Gamecock Classic record, breaking the existing record of 212, held jointly by Furman's Kristel Morgue d'Alque and North Carolina's Kelly McCall.

South Carolina finished eighth with a three-round score of 314-297-

Auburn's path to the title was bolstered by a phenomenal showing in Saturday's second round, as the Tigers' 10-under-par score of 278 Saturday not only marked a tournament record and was the second-lowest score in Auburn history, but it catapulted the Tigers into the lead and allowed Auburn to keep the field at arm's length without being challenged in Sunday's final round. As for Martinez, she topped the individual leader board entering Sunday's final round and never relinquished her lead. The highest-ranked player in the field, Martinez came into the tournament as the No. 3-rated player in the country, according to the most recent GolfWeek rankings and did not bogey any hole on Saturday or Sunday.

The host Gamecocks were led by Erica Battle, whose 79-72-74=225 placed her in a tie for 13th on the individual leader board. The senior from Irmo overcame a slow start to shoot even par for her last 16 holes, highlighted by birdies on No. 13, No. 16 and No. 18. Sophomore Whitney Simons also posted a top-20 finish for the Gamecocks with a 77-72-78=227 to finish tied for 20th on the individual leader board. Playing in her final Lady Gamecock Classic, senior Laura McCaslin carded an 81-78-73=232. Her final-round performance was her best of the weekend, as she kept her scorecard clean with 15 pars. She birdied her final hole of the day.

Junior Jenna Pearson and sophomore Camila Mori rounded out the South Carolina effort, as Pearson finished with a 78-75-81=234 and Mori came in with an 80-78-78=236. Competing as individuals with their scores not counting toward the team's total, sophomore Blythe Worley finished in a tie for 36th on the individual leader board with a 79-76-77=232 and sophomore Laura Raffo finished in a tie for 47th with an 80-77-81=238.

KRISTI COGGINS

In her 12th year at the helm of the South Carolina women's golf program, Kristi Coggins has directed the Gamecocks to 10 trips to the post-season as a team, highlighted by eight NCAA Championship appearances and an SEC title in 2002. For her efforts, Coggins was honored as the 2002 SEC Coach of the Year.

In addition to the team's success during the Coggins era, three of her players have qualified for the NCAA Championships as individuals.

With a cumulative grade point average of 3.752 for the 2004-05 academic year, Coggins' team was recognized as the inaugural recipient of the National Golf Coaches Association All-Scholar Team G.P.A. Award.

Under Coggins, academic excellence has become a staple of the Gamecock women's golf program. The women's golf team finished the 2004 fall semester with a 3.671 overall GPA, which marked the highest team GPA since the Carolina athletic department began charting the figure on team-by-team basis in 1996, then turned in a combined 3.832 GPA in the spring semester to shatter the record it had just set.

Recognized by her peers as one of the top coaches in the country, Coggins was named as the head coach at South Carolina on July 8, 1994.

In her 21st year of collegiate coaching, Coggins believes that you can only improve if you play the best teams on a consistent basis. Her Gamecock teams see the best week-in and week-out in the highly-competitive SEC. In fact, Carolina played one of the top-five most challenging schedules of any team in the country in 2004-05, according to the Golfweek/Sagarin ratings. That tough competition has translated into postseason appearances for Coggins' teams during her entire career, as she has led 14 of her teams to postseason action, including nine to the NCAA Championships.

Coggins has coached 12 individuals over the years who have gone on to professional golfing careers, including Kris Tschetter, Ellie Gibson, Siew Ai Lim and Clarissa Childs, who are currently on the Ladies Professional Golf Association (LPGA) Tour. Her list of "Who's Who" could soon be extended by two as 2003 SEC Player of the Year Kristy McPherson and 2004 Dinah Shore Trophy winner Adrienne Gautreaux are both close to earning spots on the Tour. All totalled, Coggins has tutored six All-Americans and 11 different individuals who have garnered 20 All-SEC and All-Southwest Conference honors.

Coggins' 2004-05 squad set a school academic record in the fall semester, 2004 with a combined 3.671 grade-point average, then bettered that mark with a combined 3.832 grade point average in the spring semester, 2005. More than half of the student-athletes on the 2004-05 roster earned a spot on the President's List (perfect 4.0 GPA for a semester). Never before has any team in the South Carolina athletic department combined for such academic success.

In 2004, Gautreaux was awarded the prestigious Dinah Shore Trophy, presented by the LPGA Foundation. The Trophy honors a female collegiate golfer based on her outstanding achievements in academics, natural leadership style, dedicated community service work and extraordinary golf ability.

Emphasizing the total student-athlete concept in her coaching career,19 individuals she has coached have earned Academic All-America honors — including 13 at South Carolina — while the graduation rate of Coggins' teams has been 100 percent. Adrienne Gautreaux was named a CoSIDA first-team Academic All-American in 2004.

Kristy McPherson earned her third All-American honor in 2003 and was named as the 2003 SEC Player of the Year. In 1995, Siew Ai Lim was also named as the SEC's best golfer under Coggins' watchful eye.

"Everything is in place here at South Carolina for us to be successful," says Coggins. "Our facilities, the academic excellence and our administration's support. It is all geared towards our success. The attitude is directed towards the student-athletes here and that has been a key to our success in attracting quality student-athletes and seeing them through to solid accomplishments on the course and in the classroom."

In 2002, South Carolina accomplished something never before done in USC's women's or men's golf history: win a Southeastern Conference title. In fact, the women's golf team is one of five Gamecock teams with an SEC title to its credit. South Carolina broke both the school and conference scoring record in capturing the crown while one of Coggins' players, Kristy McPherson, captured her second-straight individual title.

In 2001, the Gamecocks put together a solid late-season run, finished third in the SEC Championships, sixth in the NCAA Regional and qualified for the NCAA Championship. In 1999, after South Carolina's consistent top five finishes and a 14th-place showing at the NCAA Championships, Coggins was recognized as the SEC Coach of the Year, her second such coach of the year honor.

Coggins led USC to its highest ranking ever --seventh -- near the end of the 1995 season and a ninth-place finish at the NCAA Championship, marking a school best. South Carolina finished in the top five in nine tournaments during Coggins' first year after accomplishing the feat only twice the previous season.

Coming to South Carolina following nine highly-successful seasons at Texas Christian, Coggins took over a program which had finished in the lower division of the Southwest Conference in 1985, and proceeded to guide the Lady Frogs to nine consecutive upper-division finishes in the SWC. Coggins led TCU to three runner-up finishes in the Southwest Conference Championships (1988, 1989, 1993), with the squad finishing third place or better in all but one season.

Coggins led Texas Christian to five NCAA appearances, with three of her squads advancing to the NCAA finals. Her 1989 team ranked as high as third in the nation at midseason, earning Coggins Southwest Conference Coach of the Year honors. All of Coggins' TCU squads finished the season ranked 26th or better in the nation.

Coggins received her bachelor of science degree in recreational administration from Southwest Texas State University in 1984. Prior to taking the head coaching post at TCU, Coggins was a teaching professional at Brookhaven Country Club in Dallas, Texas, from 1984-86.

Coggins is currently the secretary for the National Golf Coaches Association after serving as Director At-Large in 2003-04. She has served on the NCAA Regional Advisory Committee for Women's Golf and was appointed to the NGCA Awards Committee for four years. She and her husband, Buck, were married June 8, 1997. They have three children: Daniel, 20, and twins Charlie and Melanie, 14. The family also has two chocolate labs, Sunny and Cache
