HISTORY OF THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

A pioneer in the integration of higher education and athletic competition, the Southeastern Conference stands ready to advance intercollegiate athletics into the 21st century.

Since its formation in 1933, the SEC achieved both stature and stability by designating governing/voting power to the presidents of the member institutions. They have determined the policies of the conference and through the years this involvement has been the principal source of strength in the evolution of the SEC.

Throughout its 69-year history, the SEC has provided leadership on the vital issues facing intercollegiate competition. In 1993, the member institutions adopted The principles of Gender Equity. Committed to increasing the quantity and quality of women's athletic opportunities, each school will provide at least two more women's intercollegiate programs than the number of men's.

Faced with the task of conference realignment after competing with 10 members since 1966, the SEC welcomed the University of Arkansas on Aug. 1, 1990, and the University of South Carolina on Sept. 25, 1990. Joining charter members Alabama, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, LSU, Missisippi, Mississippi State, Tennessee and Vanderbilt, on July 1, 1991, Arkansas and South Carolina became the first schools added in conference history.

Fully incorporated into conference competition by 1992, Arkansas and South Carolina participated in SEC championships for all sports except football during the 1991-92 academic year. The SEC was again at the forefront, introducing football, basketball and baseball divisional play and the nation's first ever Division I football championship game.

SEC schools began athletic competition with one another almost 100 years ago as members of the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Association. Seven institutions (Alabama, Auburn, Georgia, Georgia Tech, North Carolina, Sewanee and Vanderbilt) attended the SIAA organizational meeting of faculty representatives, called by Dr. William L. Dudley of Vanderbilt, in Atlanta Dec. 22, 1894.

Student teams from the schools began meeting in various sports with little pattern to their contests. The American adaptation of the English game rugby, called "football" was drifting down from the East and Midwest. Southerners were quickly attracted to this sport formalized in 1869.

The first football game in the Southeast was played April 9, 1880, on the ground now called Old Stoll Field at the University of Kentucky. Kentucky A & M (now UK) organized a team and in November 1881, played Transylvania College in a three-game series. By 1885 11 current SEC members were playing football.

Basketball moved quickly to the South as Vanderbilt was playing at the Nashville YMCA in 1893, just two years after Dr. James Naismith originated the game at Springfield (Mass.) College.

Track was organized on a conference level at the 1885 SIAA meeting presided over by President Dudley who served until his death in 1914. The first championship meet was held at Vanderbilt May 15, 1896. By 1900 eight of the 13 charter SEC members were participating.

The seven-member SIAA expanded to 19 institutions in 1895, and by 1920 there were 30 members. The larger schools reorganized as the Southern Conference at a meeting in Gainesville, Fla, Dec. 12-13, 1920. Professor S.V. Sanford of Georgia called the meeting and served as the first president. Charter members of the Southern Conference included: Alabama, Auburn, Clemson, Georgia, Georgia Tech, Kentucky, LSU, Mercer, Mississippi State, Nashville, North Carolina, Sewanee, Southwestern Presbyterian, Tennessee, Texas, Tulane and Vanderbilt and by 1920 there were 30 members.

Despite an original limit of 16, the membership grew to 23 by 1928. In 1922 Florida, LSU, Ole Miss, South Carolina, Tulane, Vanderbilt and VMI joined, while Sewanee and Duke became members in 1923 and 1928 respectively. At one time or another the SIAA and the SC included most of the Southern colleges from Virginia to Texas.

The 13 members west and south of the Appalachian Mountains reorganized as the Southeastern Conference at the annual SC meeting of Dec. 8-9, 1932 in Knoxville. The 10 coast members remained in the Southern Conference. Dr. Frank L. McVey of Kentucky was elected president of the new conference whose charter members were: Alabama, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Georgia Tech, Kentucky, LSU, Mississippi State, Ole Miss, Sewanee, Tennessee, Tulane and Vanderbilt.

(Sewanee withdrew Dec. 13, 1940, Georgia Tech on June 1, 1964 and Tulane on June 1, 1966). McVey held an informal meeting of the school presidents in Birmingham, Ala. on Feb. 16, 1933, then the first full meeting in Atlanta, Feb. 27.

The office of the commissioner was formed in 1940 in Jackson due to the great amount of detail work developing, especially in recruiting and eligibility. Former Mississippi Governor Martin S. Conner took office as commissioner Aug. 21, 1940. Conner later became ill and the secretary of the conference, Dean N.W. Dougherty of Tennessee, served as acting commissioner during the fall of 1946.

The office moved to Birmingham with the appointing of Bernie H. Moore as the second full-time commissioner on Feb. 21, 1948. Moore, a former LSU coach, guided the SEC to national respect in his 18-year tenure.

A.M. (Tonto) Coleman succeeded Moore upon his retirement April 1, 1966. The Alabama native, who was reared in Texas and experienced in athletic coaching and administration, served six and a half years.

Dr. H. Boyd McWhorter, then Dean of Arts and Sciences at Georgia and secretary of the league since 1967, accepted the position upon the retirement of Coleman, Aug. 1, 1972. Under his direction, the SEC grew substantially. In McWhorter's first year, the SEC distributed \$1.57 million in revenue to the member institutions. In his final year and 14 years later, the league distributed \$15 million to its members.

Dr. Harvey W. Schiller, an Air Force colonel and faculty chair at the U.S. Air Force Academy, followed McWhorter upon retirement, taking office Sept. 15, 1986. Under his guidance the SEC established itself as a leader in the areas of athletic scholarship and marketing.

Roy F. Kramer succeeded Schiller on Jan. 10, 1990. Kramer who has served on numerous NCAA committees, joined the league office after spending 12 years as athletic director at Vanderbilt. Kramer was instrumental in the continued growth of the conference through television contracts and bowl agreements. The SEC distributed approximately \$68.5 million to its member institutions following the 1998-99 season, thanks in large part to Kramer's vision and leadership.

Michael L. Slive, Commissioner of Conference USA, was named the seventh commissioner of the Southeastern Conference on July 2, 2002. Slive was the first-ever Commissioner of Conference USA when the league was formed on April 24, 1995. He was also Commissioner of the Great Midwest Conference when that league was formed in 1991. Slive was selected by the chief executive officers of the 12 Southeastern Conference institutions.

The first SEC champions were crowned in 1933 in baseball, basketball, football and outdoor track and field. The league's inaugural championship event was a basketball tournament in Atlanta Feb. 24-28, 1933. Records show the first men's team title for cross country was awarded in 1935 while golf and swimming and diving were added in 1937. The league later began hosting championships in tennis (1953) and indoor track and field (1957).

The SEC currently regulates nine men's sports and 11 women's sports. Men - baseball, basektball, football, golf, swimming, and diving, tennis, and track and field (cross country, indoor and outdoor). Women - basketball, golf, gymnastics, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, tennis, track and field (cross country, indoor and outdoor) and volleyball.

A Look Back at 2004

The Southeastern Conference, with its storied 72-year history of athletic achievements and academic excellence, has built perhaps the greatest tradition of intercollegiate competition of any league in the country since its inception in 1933.

The 2003-04 academic year was another season to remember for the SEC as conference teams captured six national titles and nine national runnerup finishes. In the last 15 years, the SEC won 100 national team championships for an average of more than six per year. LSU won the conference's first three NCAA titles of the year in men and women's indoor track and football. Auburn won both the men and women's swimming & diving titles and Arkansas won the men's outdoor track and field championships. Georgia finished first among Southeastern Conference schools and fifth overall in the Sears Trophy final standings.

Overall, the SEC finished in the top two in 10 of its 20 sponsored sports and in the top five in 15 of the 20 sports. Seven SEC teams participated in football postseason bowls with LSU winning the BCS Championship game. Six men's and seven women's basketball teams were invited to the NCAA Tournament with LSU and Tennessee advancing to the Women's Final Four. An NCAA record nine teams advanced to postseason play in baseball with four teams advancing to the College World Series (Arkansas, Georgia, LSU, South Carolina). With 170 teams, over eight per sport, advancing to NCAA postseason competition, the SEC continued to solidify its place as the nation's premier conference.

In addition to the six team championships, 81 SEC student-athletes garnered individual national championships, while 498 individuals were awarded with first-team All-America honors. Student-athletes around the league continued to excel in the classroom as well with 1,954 earning recognition on the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

On the national all-sport level, the SEC placed seven teams in the top 30 of the Sears/NACDA Director's Cup rankings. Georgia led the league with a fifthh-place finish. Florida placed sixth, while LSU was 11th, Tennessee finished 14th, Auburn 23rd, Arkansas 27th and Vanderbilt 28th to round out the league's top 30 finishes. 10 of the SEC's 12 schools finished in the top 50 of the Sears Cup Standings. Alabama (41) and Kentucky (45) also made the top 50.

In college baseball, the SEC posted another landmark season as the conference had an NCAA record-high nine teams earn selection to NCAA postseason play. South Carolina, LSU, Georgia and Arkansas advanced to the College World Series. Twelve of the 15 games played in Omaha in 2004 involved a team from the SEC. An SEC squad has now appeared in the College World Series 19 of the last 20 years. South Carolina won the SEC tournament title over Vanderbilt. Georgia and Arkansas captured the SEC regular-season title with a 19-11 conference record.

The Southeastern Conference boasts ten former National Players of the Year, nine Baseball America Coach of the Year and seven Collegiate Baseball Coach of the Year honors. 114 studentablets have been named first-team All-America, seven of which came in 2004.

In 2004, 31 former SEC players were listed on MLB opening day 25-man rosters, wile 43 were taken in the 2004 MLB Amateur Draft, four in the first round. Vanderbilt LHP Jeremy Sowers was the highest SEC player taken, when he was chosen sixth by the Cleveland Indians. With those four selections, the SEC has now had a first round selection in each year since 991 and 53 total in the first round during that time.

The 2004 SEC Baseball Tournament, held in Birmingham, Ala. drew 75,259 fans, despite inclement weather, second-higest in the country.
