Media Policies

- Per departmental policy, media are not permitted to contact South Carolina student-athletes on their own at any time in any fashion, including social media networks. All media requests for interviews with women's basketball staff and student-athletes must be arranged through Assistant Director of Media Relations Diana Koval via phone (803-777-7977 or 314-369-6050) or email (dkoval@mailbox.sc.edu).
- Following the first official day of practice (Oct. 4), head coach Dawn Staley and selected players will be available following practice once per week leading up to the first game of the season (Nov. 12). The day will be determined by the coaching and media relations staffs and announced at least 24 hours in advance.
- Practice will be open for the final 10 minutes on the day before each weekday game and on the Friday before each Saturday or Sunday game. Head coach
 Dawn Staley and selected players will be available for interviews at the conclusion of practice those days as well. Koval will send out an advisory regarding
 time and location for those sessions.
- Special requests for one-on-one interviews will be considered on an individual basis and will take place during the standard media availability time
 whenever possible. All interviews will take place at a campus location, likely either the practice site or the media relations office. Dormitory, apartment
 and/or cell phone numbers for student-athletes and coaches will not be provided to the media. Should the media need to conduct a telephone interview
 with a student-athlete, a call will be placed by the student-athlete at a mutually agreeable time.
- Postgame interviews will be conducted in the following order in the green room at Colonial Life Arena:
 - Visiting Coach
 - South Carolina Players
 - South Carolina Head Coach Dawn Staley
- All postgame interviews will be conducted in the green room at Colonial Life Arena. NO interviews will take place outside of the green room, including
 in the South Carolina locker room or hallway. Courtside interviews may be granted whenever possible to television stations broadcasting live from the
 arena if the reporter notifies Koval by halftime.
- · Any media member failing to comply with these rules may have his/her media privileges revoked at the discretion of the media relations staff.





Fast-Paced Gamecocks Optimistic About 2010-11

With a revamped lineup, head coach Dawn Staley ramps up the need for speed.

South Carolina looks to continue the momentum of an improved record in 2009-10, but the Gamecocks will have to do it with a restructured roster that will drastically change their style of play. Embracing the indominable spirit of their head coach, the Gamecocks are ready to rise to the challenge.

"Everyone knows we've had big changes in the offseason with transfer and injury," head coach Dawn Staley said. "When you lose that kind of contribution from your team, you've got to gain it in other areas. Something we have not been as strong at in the past is team chemistry, and we've been working on that a lot heading into the season. We've come a long way with it, and I'm looking forward to seeing some of that convert into wins."

Filling the Void

After the transfer of Kelsey Bone and the knee injury of Valerie Nainima, South Carolina will start the 2010-11 campaign without 47.9 percent of its scoring and 31.3 percent of its rebounding from last season's 14-15 team. While losing Nainima, a second-team All-SEC selection who was the team's leading scorer and among the nation's top 3-point shooters in 2009-10, to open the season hurts, the silver lining is that her injury came during the summer, leaving the team and coaching staff plenty of time to prepare for her absence.

"It's going to be a fun season from a coaching standpoint because everything is different," Staley said. "Day to day, you never know what's going to change. We're going to play this season with the players we have, and it will be a true test of dealing with adversity. We're not dwelling on the things we can't control. We can control our attitude, our outlook towards the season and our willingness to compete at a high level every single day."

The players the Gamecocks have are more than capable of heeding Staley's call and her altered game plan. South Carolina's guard-heavy roster features versatility on the perimeter, and, while the pool of post players is limited, the options at hand are well suited to play within the new system.

"From an offensive standpoint, we're going to open up the floor," Staley said. "Our post players aren't going to sit on the block and ask for the ball. They're going to be on the perimeter stretching the defense out. Defensively we're going to play a lot of ways. We're not a team that can play one way, but that's going to end up being beneficial to us."

The Old Guard

Little has changed on the Gamecock backcourt, except for gaining experience. South Carolina boasts nine guards, seven of whom were on last season's roster. Staley likes the depth as much as the versatility of a group that gives defenders more than one type of play to manage.

Prior to Nainima's return, junior La'Keisha Sutton is the team's top returning scorer, averaging 10.4 points during her first two seasons. Her fearlessness in driving to the basket is matched only by her willing acceptance of the challenge to guard an opponent's top offensive player. On top of her ability to drive, Sutton is a career 42.3 percent 3-point shooter, which was built on intelligent shot selection.

Sophomore Ieasia Walker has emerged from a rollercoaster freshman campaign that saw her flash brilliance against the likes of then-No. 9 North Carolina and then-No. 22 Vanderbilt. A true triple threat, Walker can drive, pull up or step back and hit 3-pointers.

Bolstering the long-range effort in Nainima's absence, junior transfer Marah Strickland will make her debut this season after sitting out the 2009-10 campaign following her transfer from Maryland. Among the ACC's top 3-point threats in each of her first two seasons, Strickland brings that sniperlike accuracy and "two steps across half court" range to the SEC.

Senior Samone Kennedy will continue to bring her game-changing skills to the Gamecock lineup as well. In addition to her raw speed, she has continued to improve her shooting and is skilled an quarterbacking an attacking defense that had a variety of top opponents stymied for long stretches last season.

Junior college transfer Markeshia Grant is a point guard in the mold of Staley who will challenge the veterans for playing time. A third-team NJCAA

All-American last season, Grant has great court vision, is an excellent passer and can score on her own as well.

Juniors Courtney Newton and Ebony Wilson, along with sophomore walkon Imani Sellers, add to the backcourt depth. Newton is coming off another injury-shortened season, while Wilson has worked hard in the offseason to improve all facets of her game, hoping to increase her playing time over last season. Both have a warrior-like mentality and a never-waning commitment to improving their games that Staley likes.

Inside Look

Staley is looking for her post players to provide addition by subtraction. After building interior play around a traditional center last year, the Gamecocks will turn that strategy around to take advantage of a more agile and athletic lineup.

Anchoring that lineup will be senior forward Jewel May. Slowed by a series of nagging foot and ankle injuries late last season, she is poised to make an offensive impact in her final year in the Garnet and Black. May started 28 of the team's 29 games last season and will be the most physically imposing member of the frontcourt.

The Gamecocks' breakout player of 2009-10 was a dedicated and fit Charenee Stephens. Playing just the second half of her freshman campaign, Stephens put up 8.4 points and 7.2 rebounds per game as a sophomore. She is the team's leading returning rebounder, and Staley believes she can be a double-double player in a game plan built around facing the basket and a lot of movement on the offensive end.

Sophomore Ashley Bruner struggled at times last season as she transitioned from high school to college play, but she has good rebounding instincts and should find more offensive success in an open floor.

Staley added highly-touted signee Kayla Brewer to the mix for 2010-11, and, while she may by physically overmatched at times, the six-foot freshman has the cerebral presence to be successful. She has the skills to play on the perimeter and is a good fundamental player who Staley is relying on to deliver rebounds as well as frontcourt offense.

At the Buzzer

As Staley enters her third season at South Carolina, she has not as much reloaded her team as refurbished it. The old will appear new for Gamecock fans as an offseason spent focused on conditioning and agility will yield a style of play that is fast-paced and exciting to watch. One thing for certain is that fans and opponents alike will be surprised by what they see on the court each game.
