

South Carolina Women's Golf

Season Preview

South Carolina returns a veteran team in 2007-08 while adding a pair of talented freshmen. The Gamecocks will need someone to replace Jenna Pearson, who led the team in four the team's eight spring events, but the staff is confident the team can improve in its fall campaign.

With four seniors on the roster, the Gamecocks are awash with experienced players, giving the team flexibility at every tournament. Seven of the nine players on the roster played in at least three fall events with just three appearing in all five.

Even with the glut of upperclassmen, it may be the young who lead this season as sophomore **Bénédicte Toumpsin** was the top scorer in the fall. Her 73.67 average is nearly two strokes better than last season's mark, and she was the team's top finisher in all four tournaments and was the only player not to lose a match at the NGCA Match Play Championship.

A player the coaches believe has a future in the LPGA, Toumpsin has a solid allaround game. That first college victory has been elusive for the sophomore, but once she hits that mark, confidence should deliver many more.

Toumpsin turned in the best freshman season in Gamecock golf history in 2006-07. She picked up in the fall right where she left off at the NCAA East Regional, where she posted the fourth-lowest postseason 54-hole score in school history (217). Toumpsin opened the fall by tying her career low with a three-round score of 215 (71-73-71) to finish fourth at the Cougar Classic.

The next four players on the fall stroke average chart were within one stroke of each other. Senior **Blythe Worley** set the pace for that pack at 75.75, more than one shot better than last season's average. She has incredible focus and is an outstanding ball striker, which should generate a good season for the talented senior.

After recording a career-best 218 (72-72-74) at the NCAA East Regional last season, Worley opened the fall with confidence. She was the only Gamecock other than Toumpsin to produce a win at the NGCA Match Play Championship as she dispatched Morgan Grantham of New Mexico in the second round. Carding a careerbest 70 in the final round of the Lady Tar Heel Invitational, Worley tied Toumpsin for team-high honors at the event.



Senior Blythe Worley

Playing in three tournaments, senior **Camila Mori** proved to be as steady this fall as she was last season with a 76.00 average, third-best on the team. She finished second on the team at the UA-Ann Rhoads Intercollegiate, shooting a season-low 72 in the final round to move into 25th place. In addition to her simple love for the game, Mori has a work ethic and the fundamentals to chase her dream of playing professionally after this season.

2007 NGCA All-America Scholar **Whitney Simons** kicked off her senior season with a career-best 70 in the first round of the Cougar Classic and went to be a solid contributor in three other events. Her 76.56 fall average was more than one stroke better than last season's mark. Simons is successfull based on her philosophy of taking a simple, solid approach to making birdies. Her fluid, effortless swing belies her power and length.

Freshman **Erika Holmen** leapt right into her college career as one of the three players to participate in all five fall events. Showing flashes of brilliance among her occasional inexperience, she posted a 76.67 average and was the team's second-best finisher at the Mason Rudolph Women's Championship. Holmen joined the Gamecocks as the 18th ranked player in the Swedish Golf Federation and a member of the Junior Elite Team of Gothenburg. With that international experience, Holmen bring a seasoned golf game to the program. She is solid in every aspect of the game and should produce consistent, competitive finishes.

Sophomore **Taylor Barrett** played in six events last season and participated in three events this fall. A 14th-place finish at the Auburn Derby Invitational highlighted her freshman campaign, and she just missed her career-best 54-hole total with a 233 at the season-opening Cougar Classic this fall. With a great putter and a highly-competitive attitude, Barrett can be a consistent contributor.

Rounding out the fall participants was senior **Laura Raffo**, who played in Lady Tar Heel Invitational and in the second round of the NGCA Match Play Championship. Her career-best finish was a 28th-place showing at the 2005 Chrysler Challenge, where she opened with a career-low 73. A true scrapper on the course with one of the best wedge games around, Raffo simply finds a way to get the ball in the hole regardless of the circumstances.

Junior **Meredith Taylor** is still looking for her first tournament appearance as a Gamecock after injuries kept her off the course the last two seasons. Another player with a love of the game that overshadows her lack of experiences, Taylor is long off the tee and is primed to take a step forward this season.

Despite not playing in the fall, freshman **Elizabeth Freeman** has the credentials to become a solid player at Carolina. She helped Westside High School to back-to-back regional championships and finished her career ranked as the No. 2 player in South Carolina. A four-time all-state and all-region selection, Freeman was the 2006 Class 4A state champion and was named South Carolina Women's Coaches Association 4A Player of the Year in 2006 as well. Freeman has talent and has enjoyed success at the state level and will benefit from the experience of being around the level players on her team.

After missing a spot in the NCAA Championship by just four strokes last season, the Gamecocks started the 2007-08 season with a bang. Carolina finished sixth at the Cougar Classic, shooting a season-best 291 in the first round. Individual players continued put together solid performances through the rest of the season in tournaments that were stacked with elite level teams.

The Gamecocks look to build on those individual performances to find the right combination for team success. The Gamecocks finished fourth in the Southeastern Conference Championship last season, marking the fourth time in seven years Carolina has posted a top-four finish. The depth of experienced players and the talent of the newcomers should only add to that legacy.
