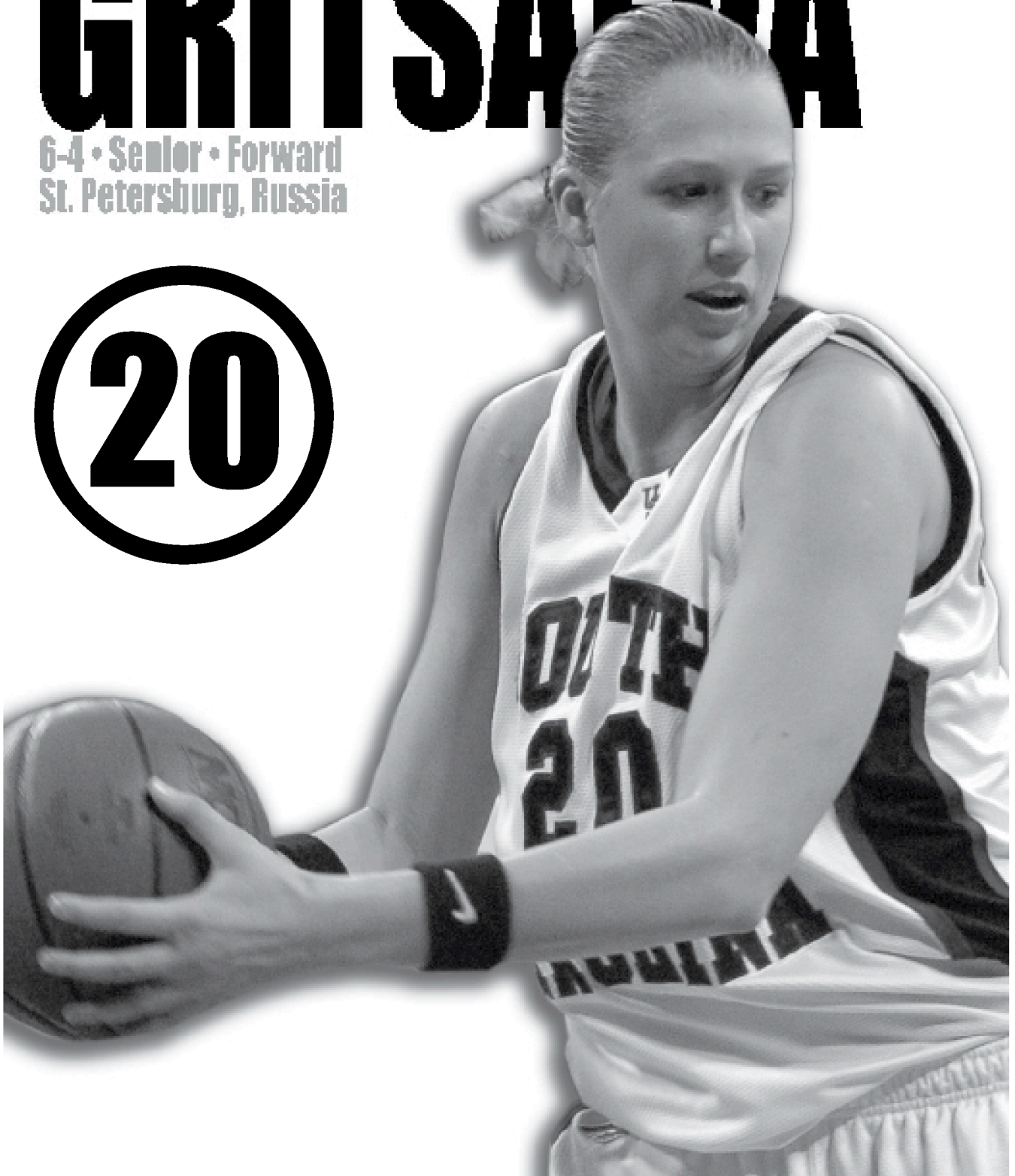

2005-06 (Senior Year)

Converted power forward will likely see most of her action as a small forward in 2005-06 ... Is the only player on the Carolina roster with NCAA Tournament experience, as she was a freshman on the 2002-03 Gamecock squad that went 23-8.

2004-05 (Junior Year)

Earned a spot on the SEC Winter Sports Academic Honor Roll ... Starter in 12 games ... Turned in a solid effort in the Gamecocks' SEC opener against Mississippi State, scoring six points, grabbing a season-high 10 rebounds, dishing out four assists, blocking two shots and recording two steals ... Matched a season-high with 10 rebounds against Ole Miss in the first round of the SEC Tournament, scoring eight points and blocking two shots that games as well ... Logged a season-high 35 minutes against Florida, scoring eight points and grabbing six rebounds ... Was also productive against Florida A&M, as she scored seven points, grabbed nine rebounds (four offensive) and distributed two assists ... Distributed four assists against Jacksonville and S.C. State.

2003-04 (Sophomore Year)

Earned a spot on the SEC Winter Sports Academic Honor Roll ... Battled through several injuries to see action in all 28 games, registering 25 starts ... Averaged 8.7 points, 5.8 rebounds and 1.6 assists per game ... Not afraid to shoot the three, knocking down 11-of-30 attempts from deep (.367 pct.) ... Endured stress fractures in both legs and sustained a sprained shoulder against Vanderbilt late in the season ... Turned in 11 double-figure scoring outings, including a 29-point, 11-rebound, seven-assist performance against Stetson ... Scored 20 points and hauled in 14 rebounds in the season opener against Clemson ... Posted four double-doubles on the year.

2002-03 (Freshman Year)

Saw action in 20 games during her first season at South Carolina and started at Ole Miss in place of injured Jocelyn Penn ... Came to the United States in November but was required by the NCAA to wait until the end of the fall semester to enroll at South Carolina ... Made her debut with the Gamecock women's basketball team on Dec. 18th against Loui-

siana-Lafayette ... Played 19 minutes, scored five points, pulled six boards and passed one assist ... Scored 10 points at Mississippi ... Contributed eight points at Georgia and versus Kentucky ... Nabbed six boards at Georgia and against Louisiana-Lafayette ... Passed four assists against the Ole Miss Rebels in the regular season SEC finale ... Blocked a shot in six games ... Grabbed a steal in seven contests ... Played a career-high 34 minutes at Mississippi.

International/High School

A member of the Russian Junior National Team since 2000 ... Traveled with the team to Turkey and Moscow over the summer ... In the Challenge Round of the 2001 European Championships for Cadets, led her Russian team to a second-place finish as she scored 6.6 points and 4.4 rebounds in the five games ... In the final round, played in eight games and averaged 9.9 points and 6.1 rebounds as the Russian team lost by two points in the championship game ... Helped her Russian Junior Women's team to a second-place finish in the 2002 European Championships where they lost to the eventual champion France by two points ... Career highs include a 49-point performance and a 20-rebound effort ... Graduated from High School #93 in St. Petersburg, Russia.

Junior Year (2005-06)

Talented player figures to be a key part of the Gamecock attack in 2005-06 ... Became South Carolina's top scoring threat at the end of the 2004-05 season when Lauren Simms went down with an injury ... Will get to the rim and is a good rebounder for her size ... Coaching staff says she could be poised to have a breakthrough season.

Sophomore Year (2004-05)

Erupted for 28 points against Clemson, knocking down 5-of-10 attempts from three-point range against the Tigers ... Led USC in its win over Alabama when Lauren Simms went down with a knee injury in the first half, turning in a 19-point, nine-rebound effort in Carolina's win over the Crimson Tide ... With Simms still sidelined against Kentucky, Booker added another 15 points and nine rebounds to lift Carolina to its second SEC win ... Hauled in a career-best 13 rebounds at Arkansas, more than doubling her previous career high of six ... Scored 15 points against No. 1/1 LSU, playing all 40 minutes against the Tigers ... Scored 12 points and grabbed five rebounds (four offensive) at home against Tennessee ... Added 16 points on 4-of-7 shooting from three-point range at Alabama ... Averaged 37.3 minutes played per game over the last six games of the season.

Freshman Year (2003-04)

Saw action in 19 games as a freshman, averaging 2.0 points per game ... Turned in a productive outing at Kentucky, scoring 13 points on 4-of-9 shooting from the field and 3-of-7 shooting from three-point range.

Solid point guard likes to push the ball ... Can knock down the three.

Sophomore Year (2004-05)

Earned a spot on the SEC Winter Sports Academic Honor Roll ... Starter at point guard in 18 games had a breakthrough performance against Clemson on Dec.3, setting career highs with 15 points and 10 assists ... Her 10 assists against Clemson made her the 15th player in school history to dish out 10 or more assists in a game ... Team leader in assists with 72 ... Scored 13 points and dished out five assists against Tennessee on Jan. 27 ... Established career highs in every statistical category against as a sophomore ... Returned to score 11 points in Carolina's win over Alabama in only her second game back.

Came off the bench to see action in 24 contests, averaging 2.2 points, 1.0 rebounds and 0.9 assists in 9.0 minutes per game ... Her six points scored at Tennessee marked a season high ... Dished out a season-high four assists against Appalachian State.

International/High School

Over the summer of 2003, led her Croatian team to a fourth-place finish in the World Championships with eight wins and four losses ... Averaged 13 points, six assists, three steals and two rebounds per game ... Scored 16 points against the United States team in what she considered her best game all year ... By averaging 18 points, 5.1 assists and 2.8 assists in the 12 games, Fabbri was named to the All-Star Team and as the tournament's best point guard ... Graduated from Krizaniceva Gimnazija High School in New Zagreb, Croatia ... Led her team to its first championship in her senior year.
