## 2005-(10 Review



Forward Melanie Johnson earned second-team all-SEC honors in 2005-0b after leading the Gamecocks in scoring and rebounding. Johnson was at her best late in the season averaging 17.5 points and 10.5 rebounds per game during the post-season.

She recorded double-doubles in each of Carolina's last three games and in five of the team's last eight contests.


# TURNING THE CORNER 

Suffocating defense, balanced scoring and a deep rotation were the staples of the 2005-06 women's basketball season, but perhaps the most encouraging aspect of the season is that this core group of Gamecocks -- the same core group that had paid its dues in its first two years playing together -- was able to see the fruits of its labor by getting to the post-season and playing into March. And for more encouraging news: 97 percent of the team's scoring returns in 2006-07.

## 2005-06 Team Accomplishments

$\gg$ South Carolina competed in the post-season, earning a bid to the Women's NIT.
$\gg$ South Carolina led the SEC by placing eight of its women's basketball players on the SEC Winter Sports Academic Honor Roll.
$\gg$ The Gamecocks ranked among the most improved teams from a year ago, as Carolina won nine more games than it did a year ago.
$\gg$ South Carolina limited the opposition to 56.8 points per game, setting a new school record. The previous record was 59.3 points per game, set by the Gamecocks of 2002-03.
$\gg$ South Carolina limited the opposition to 34.7 percent shooting from the field, setting a new school record. The previous record for field goal percentage defense was 36.6 percent, set by this same group of players in 2004-05.
$\gg$ The Gamecocks set a school record with 193 blocked shots, surpassing the 2004-05 previous-record total of 176.
> The Gamecocks claimed road wins over Alabama, Mississippi State, Florida and Auburn in succession, marking the first time that Carolina has won four consecutive SEC road games since joining the conference in 1991-92.
>> Carolina beat No. 14 Minnesota, $79-61$ on Dec. 13, shooting 58.3 percent from the field in the contest.
$\gg$ The Gamecocks drilled in-state rival Clemson, $77-46$.
$\gg$ The Gamecocks set a pair of school records by limiting Bethune-Cookman to only seven points in the first half and 26 points for the game.
$\gg$ The Gamecocks matched a school record by limiting Bethune-Cookman to 14.0 percent shooting from the field ( 8 -of-57).
$\gg$ The Gamecocks limited 11 different opponents to either 30 percent shooting or lower from the field.
>> The Gamecocks tied a school record by blocking 13 shots against Western Carolina.

## 2005-06 Individual Accomplishments

>> Junior forward Melanie Johnson was a second-team all-SEC selection.
$\gg$ Freshman forward Demetress Adams earned a spot on the SEC All-Freshman team.
$\gg$ Freshman Demetress Adams was recognized as the SEC Player of the Week and the SEC Freshman of the Week on Dec. 26,


Demetress Adams posted a double-double in her first game at the collegiate level and went on to earn SEC AII-Freshman honors. becoming one of only nine Gamecocks ever to be selected as the SEC Player of the Week and becoming the first Carolina freshman ever to be named SEC Freshman of the Week.
>> Freshman Demetress Adams posted a double-double in her first game at the collegiate level, scoring 11 points and grabbing 12 rebounds in Carolina's season-opening win over High Point. The freshman also notched double-doubles against Savannah State (17 points, 10 rebounds) and Bethune-Cookman (12 points, 10 rebounds).
>> Junior forward Melanie Johnson erupted for 27 points, 10 rebounds and five assists in leading South Carolina to an 81-63 win over Florida in Gainesville on Feb. 12.
$\gg$ Junior forward Melanie Johnson scored 21 points and grabbed 10 rebounds vs. Xavier in the Women's NIT.
$\gg$ Junior forward Melanie Johnson posted double-doubles in each of Carolina's last three games and in five of the Gamecocks' last eight contests. She averaged 16.3 points and 8.5 rebounds per game in Carolina's last eight games.
>> Junior guard Stacy Booker scored 20 points against Georgia Southern, marking the second time in her career that she has scored 20 or more points in a game.
$\gg$ Junior forward Iva Sliskovic notched her sixth career double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds against then-No. 14 Texas, she then picked up her seventh with 15 points and 10 boards vs. Clemson.

## Month-by-Month

- November (2-3 record) wins vs. High Point and Winthrop, losses to Texas, Purdue, Georgia Southern.
>> Demetress Adams posted a double-double in her first collegiate game (11 points, 12 rebounds vs. High Point)
$\gg$ The Gamecocks traveled to Grand Bahama Island to compete in a loaded field at the Junkanoo Jam. The tournament provided reason for hope, as the Gamecocks played national powers Texas and Purdue tough, fueled by an all-tournament performance from Iva Sliskovic (11.5 points, 6.5 rebounds per game in the two games.) However, despite holding leads late in both games, Carolina fell short in the end and left the tournament without any wins.
$\gg$ In their first game following their gritty showing at the Junkanoo Jam, South Carolina lost a tough game at home to Georgia Southern.


## - December (6-0 record) wins vs. No. 14 Minnesota, Ohio, S.C. State, Savannah State, Bethune-Cookman and Western Carolina.

>> A 79-61 win over No. 14 Minnesota at Colonial Center on Dec. 13 kicks off perfect month. Carolina wins each of its next five games by 28 points or more, including a $57-$ point win over Savannah State on Dec. 19 and a 61-point win over Bethune-Cookman on Dec. 21.
>> Demetress Adams named SEC Player of the Week and SEC Freshman of the Week after posting double-doubles in consecutive games vs. Savannah State and Bethune-Cookman. Adams

averages 14.5 points and 10.0 rebounds per game in the two contests. She and Tennessee's Candace Parker are the only two SEC freshmen to earn SEC Player of the Week honors all season.
$\gg$ The only injury of note came to Adams, who suffered a laceration on her right hand early in the Western Carolina game that required 11 stitches and forced her to wear a bulky and cumbersome bandage on her shooting hand.

- January (3-5 record) wins at Clemson, at Alabama and vs. Arkansas, losses vs. Tennessee, at Kentucky, at LSU, vs. Vanderbilt and vs. Georgia.
$\gg$ January picked up where December left off, with the Gamecocks rolling to a resounding 77-46 win at Clemson. Carolina started the game with a 12-0 run and didn't look back, as the Gamecock bench outscored Clemson's by a 53-7 margin.
$\gg$ Carolina lost its first four SEC games and five of its first six league contests, but scheduling was certainly a factor in the Gamecocks' slow start, as Carolina's first six opponents were Tennessee, Kentucky, LSU, Vanderbilt, Alabama and Georgia. Another factor in Carolina's slow start to SEC play was Adams' injured hand. It wasn't until the Alabama game on Jan. 22 that Adams was able to play without the bandage on her shooting hand.
- February (6-2 record) wins at Mississippi State, at Florida, at Auburn, vs. Ole Miss, vs. Longwood, vs. Mississippi State. Losses to Kentucky and at Vanderbilt.
$\gg$ The Gamecocks entered February with an 11-8 overall record and a 2-5 mark in SEC play, but one of the most encouraging facts for the team was that Carolina had faced all of the elite squads in the league and there were several winnable games remaining on the schedule.
$\gg$ February provided the stage for something that had never been accomplished in school history, as the Gamecocks rattled off four consecutive SEC road wins for the first time ever. Including a road win over Alabama at the end of January, Carolina then went on to claim an exciting 51-46 win over Mississippi State in Starkville that went down to the final moments. A convincing 81-63 win over Florida in Gainesville and a solid $58-46$ win at Auburn ensued and following a Feb. 19 win over Ole Miss in Columbia, South Carolina worked its way into consideration for the NCAA Tournament.
$\gg$ With the stakes raised, the Gamecocks blew out Longwood at home on Feb. 21, then put a cap on their home schedule with a resounding 75-47 win over Mississippi State at the Colonial Center to give themselves a 17-9 overall record and a 7-6 mark in SEC play heading into the regular-season finale at Vanderbilt.
$\gg$ Riding the crest of a five-game winning streak, Carolina entered the Vanderbilt game with the opportunity to finish the SEC season with an 8-6 league record and sole possession of fifth place in the conference standings, either of which would have likely sealed the Gamecocks as an NCAA Tournament team. Things didn't go well in Nashville, however, as the Commodores got out to a 32-17 lead to start the game, then went on to keep the Gamecocks at arm's length the rest of the way en route to an $88-71$ win.
- March (0-2 record) losses to Auburn and Xavier.
>> The month of March was ushered in by good news for the Gamecocks, as junior Melanie Johnson was selected to the second-team all-SEC squad by the league's coaches and Demetress Adams was honored as a member of the SEC All-Freshman team.
$\gg$ South Carolina entered the SEC Tournament as the No. 7 seed and faced No. 10 Auburn in the first round, with the Gamecocks' NCAA hopes still alive. The Tigers, however doused those hopes with a convincing 64-48 win that left Carolina's NCAA hopes solely in the hands of the selection committee.
$\gg$ Selection Monday proved to be a day of disappointment for Carolina, as the Gamecocks were left out of the tournament field despite finishing the SEC season with a 7-7 record, making them only the third SEC team not to get into the NCAA Tournament with a . 500 SEC record and a winning record overall since the field expanded to 64 teams in 1994.
$\gg$ Though an NCAA bid was not in the cards for South Carolina, the Gamecocks did earn a bid to the Women's NIT and traveled to Cincinnati to face Xavier in the first round of the tournament. Carolina led for the majority of the game, but eventually fell in overtime, 70-65, despite 21 points and 10 rebounds from Melanie Johnson. With point guard Lea Fabbri playing at only half strength against the Musketeers after injuring her left shoulder in practice leading up to the game, South Carolina committed a rash of turnovers at a key stretch of the game that gave Xavier all the momentum it needed to keep the Gamecocks within striking distance and eventually win the game.
>> Johnson was the unquestioned star of the team late in the season as the Barnwell native posted double-doubles in each of her final three games and in five of the team's last eight contests.

Melanie Johnson emerged as a star for the Gamecocks in 2005-06, earning second-team all-SEC honors and posting double-doubles in each of Carolina's last three games and in five of the team's last eight contests.

The South Carolina women's basketball team opened its 32nd season of competition with a 71-35 win over High Point at the Colonial Center Friday. The game marked the season-opener for both teams, High Point's 35 points was the fewest ever scored in the Colonial Center.

Juniors Melanie Johnson and Lauren Simms led the way for Carolina, with Johnson scoring 10 points and grabbing six rebounds and Simms scoring 12 points, marking Simms' 28th career double-figure scoring game. Playing in the first game of her collegiate career, freshman Demetress Adams registered a double-double by scoring 11 points and grabbing a game-high 12 rebounds, marking the most rebounds for a freshman since Iva Sliskovic grabbed 14 rebounds against Charlotte in 2003.

The win improved South Carolina's all-time record in season openers to 22-10 and was the Gamecocks' sixth win in nine season openers under head coach Susan Walvius. The win also improved Walvius' record to 50-8 in non-conference games played in Columbia and marked Carolina's eighth consecutive win in a season opener played in Columbia.

The game was never in doubt, as Carolina roared out to a 12-2 start after forcing High Point into six turnovers in the first five minutes of the game. The Gamecocks held the Panthers scoreless for a span of 7:48 in the first half and expanded their lead to 19-2 at the 11:43 mark, then went on to take a 36-17 lead into the locker room at halftime after freshman Brionna Dickerson's jump shot found nothing but net with no time remaining on the clock.

It was more of the same in the second half, as the Gamecocks continually stifled the Panthers' offensive attack. High Point finished the game with a .200 shooting percentage and turned the ball over 24 times. Preseason Big South Player of the Year Katie O'Dell Ied the way for the Panthers with 11 points.

The Gamecocks dominated High Point on the boards, setting a Colonial Center record by hauling in 58 rebounds to the Panthers' 33.

Behind a stellar second-half effort, the South Carolina women's basketball team rolled to a $73-42$ win over Winthrop Sunday afternoon at the Colonial Center. Gamecock freshman Demetress Adams led all scorers with 17 points and grabbed nine rebounds, and Melanie Johnson tallied her seventh career double-double, netting 15 points and pulling down 13 boards to lead Carolina to a 2-0 record. Winthrop fell to 0-2 on the season.
South Carolina exploded for a 22-3 run, fueled by eight points from Adams, to open the second half and put the game out of reach. USC shot 60 percent in the second half and out-rebounded the Eagles, 46-30, in the game.

Adams shot 5-0f-7 from the field and added two assists, three blocks and two steals. She scored in double figures for the second time in her two-game college career, and her 17 points are the most by a true freshman since Lauren Simms had 18 against Kentucky in 2003-04.

Iva Sliskovic joined Adams and Johnson in double-figures with 11 points and added eight rebounds. Sophomore Stacy Booker chipped in with seven points and eight rebounds.

The Gamecocks held a 23-20 lead at halftime, thanks in large part to their ability to get to the free throw line. USC was 10-of-16 from the charity stripe, while Winthrop was just 2-of-2. Johnson led South Carolina in the opening 20 minutes, nearly collecting a double-double with nine points and eight rebounds. Overall, though, the Gamecocks struggled from the field, hitting just six of their 23 shots.

The second half proved to be a different story. The Gamecocks put the Eagles away with that big run and a dominant performance in the paint. After being out-scored 10-8 in the paint in the first half, Carolina finished with a 32-20 advantage in that category. USC held Winthrop to 29.6 percent shooting in the game and forced 25 turnovers.

Today's win extended South Carolina's win streak against teams from the Big South Conference to 18 and improved head coach Susan Walvius' record in non-conference home games to 51-8.

Freshman Erika Arriaran scored 14 points, including the basket that put Texas up for good, and fellow newcomer Ashley Lindsey had a critical block to keep to help the 18th-ranked Longhorns beat South Carolina 59-55 at the Junkanoo Jam on Friday.

The new players got to shine with Texas star Tiffany Jackson on the bench for much of the game in foul trouble. The Longhorns (21) needed somebody to raise to raise their game - and Arriaran and Lindsey did just that down the stretch.

The Gamecocks (2-1) led by as much as seven points early and were still ahead $55-52$ with $4: 26$ to go. Arriaran then hit two straight jumpers to put Texas in front 56-55.

South Carolina had its best chance to retake the lead moments later with Lauren Simms driving the lane for what looked like an uncontested layup. However, Lindsey reached up and got a piece of the shot, protecting Texas' lead. She added a foul shot and Nina Norman had two more in the final 30 seconds to hold off the Gamecocks.

Norman had 13 points for the Longhorns, while Lindsey had eight points, 10 rebounds and five blocks.

Jackson finished with eight points on 4-of-9 shooting. Texas coach Jody Conradt tried everything she could think of to get her best player going, even drawing a technical foul in the second half as she protested to officials on what she thought was an uncalled foul on Jackson.

South Carolina slipped to 2-3 on the season, while the Lady Eagles captured their first win of the season and moved to 1-3.

The Gamecocks had a substantial height advantage at every position on the court, but the Lady Eagles found a way to keep the rebounding margin close with hustle and hard work. Georgia Southern's hustle and desire was the difference in the game. Making the outcome surprising was the fact that Carolina had just come off a pair of narrow defeats at the hands of No. 18 Texas and No. 19 Purdue at the Junkanoo Jam in The Bahamas last week.
Stacy Booker led the way for Carolina with 20 points, including a pair of big three-pointers late in the game to keep Carolina's hopes alive. No other Gamecock player scored in double-figures, but Demetress Adams finished with nine points and 10 rebounds. Guards Tiffany Brown, Fallon Lee and Lee DuBose combined with forward Nicole Newton to score 60 points for Georgia Southern, with Brown finishing with a team-high 17 points.

Turnovers plagued the Gamecocks, who gave the ball away 19 times. Poor shooting from beyond the arc was another concern for the Carolina after converting on only five of 21 attempts from three-point range.

The South Carolina women's basketball team romped to a 79-6 win over No. 14 Minnesota on Tuesday evening at the Colonial Center.

In a total team effort, South Carolina (3-3) shot 58 percent from the field and held Minnesota ( $6-2$ ), who came into the game ranked No. 10 in the nation in field goal percentage offense (.486) to . 395 shooting. The Gamecocks also pressured the Golden Gophers into 23 turnovers, while only committing a season low 12. The Gophers' only loss prior to tonight's game came on the road at then-No. 21 New Mexico, 66-42, on Nov. 30.

The Gamecocks jumped out early and never looked back. Minnesota scored the game's first basket, but South Carolina responded with a 13-0 run. The Gamecocks knocked down six of their first eight shots, while holding the Golden Gophers to just one made basket in their first 10 attempts. South Carolina's hot-shooting continued. The Gamecocks hit 56.3 percent from the field while limiting Minnesota to 28.6 percent in the first half.

Junior Shannel Harris provided an offensive spark for USC, netting a career-high 10 points in the first 20 minutes of the game to lead all scorers. Eight Carolina players cracked the scoring column, and the Gamecocks took good care of the ball, turning it over just three times, while pressuring Minnesota into 12 miscues.

The Gamecocks owned a 39-21 halttime advantage. USC has led at the break in all six of its games this season. Carolina built its lead to as many as 27 points in the second and let Minnesota no closer than 16.

The South Carolina women's basketball team won its fifth straight game with an 87-26 triumph over Bethune-Cookman College on Thursday night at the Colonial Center. The Gamecocks played five games during a nine-day stretch and emerged unscathed, improving their season record to 7-3. Bethune-Cookman fell to 2-5.

Bethune-Cookman's 26 points marked the fewest points ever for a South Carolina opponent. The previous low was 29 by Florida A\&M on Dec. 30, 2001. The Wildcats shot just 14 percent from the field, which tied a USC record.

Four Gamecocks scored in double figures. Melanie Johnson led the charge with a career-high tying 19 points, including a 7 -of-10 effort from the free throw line. She also pulled down six rebounds and picked up five steals. Ilona Burgrova had a career night as well with 13 points. She also grabbed six rebounds. Demetress Adams produced a double-double, scoring 12 points and adding 10 rebounds. Stacy Booker chipped in with 11 points.

South Carolina sprinted to a 10-0 lead in the first half before Bet-hune-Cookman scored its first points of the game on a three-pointer by Carla Winston. From there, USC reeled off 23 straight points before the Wildcats managed another basket to make it 31-5. The Gamecocks took a 42-7 lead into the locker room at the half.

Bethune-Cookman finished the first half 2-of-25 from the field. Including the second half against Savannah State on Monday night, the Gamecocks held their opponents to 4-of-42 (.095) shooting during that stretch. South Carolina connected on 16-0f-31 (.516) attempts from the field. USC out-rebounded Bethune-Cookman, 29-11, pocketed seven steals and hit 9-of-12 free throws. Johnson and Adams both scored nine points to lead Carolina, while Booker chipped in with eight. Shannel Harris set a career high by grabbing six rebounds in the first nine minutes of the game.

The South Carolina women's basketball team defeated Western Carolina, 95-53, Thursday night to record a season point high and extend its win streak to six games. Junior Ilona Burgrova led the Gamecocks with 17 points, a career high, and tied her career high nine rebounds. USC's defense was at its strongest as the Gamecocks also tied the school record of 13 blocks.

Western Carolina had a short-lived lead as the Catamounts jumped ahead 5-0 to start the game but a three-pointer by Lea Fabbri snapped the run to start the Gamecocks' charge. USC eventually took the lead on a short jumper by Lauren Simms and never looked back. South Carolina journeyed on a 12-0 run to post a 19-7 lead before the Catamounts recorded their next basket.

The Gamecocks dominated the first half as they hit 21-of-35, mark ing the third time this season USC has shot 60-percent or better in the first half. The garnet and black starters outscored the Catamounts, 34 18, as Simms led the way with a season-high 13 points in the first half alone. As the Gamecocks recorded a 24 -point halftime lead, USC also received solid play from Iva Sliskovic who went a perfect 4-for-4 with five rebounds in the first half.

The Gamecocks outscored Western Carolina, 46-28, in the second half and held the Catamounts to their second-lowest point total of the season with 53. Juniors Melanie Johnson and Stacy Booker chipped in 15 and 11 points, respectively, to round out USC's double-figure club.

Offensively, USC totaled 30 assists for a season high and tied the season high in three-pointers made with five.

The Gamecocks' 95 points is the most by a Carolina team since the 2003-04 season when USC defeated Florida A\&M, 96-66, in Columbia. This also marks the third straight game USC has recorded at least 80 points

The South Carolina women's basketball team rolled over Clemson 77-46, to capture its seventh straight win on Monday night at Littlejohn Coliseum. The Gamecocks improved to 9-3 on the year heading into Wednesday's game against No. 1 Tennessee in Columbia. Clemson fell to 6-8 with the loss.

South Carolina's defense was dominant, holding the Tigers to just 30 percent shooting. It marked the fifth straight game USC has limited its opponent to 30 percent or less from the field. The Gamecocks knocked down 53.7 percent of their own shots as Iva Sliskovic led the Gamecocks with 15 points on 6-of-8 shooting and grabbed 10 rebounds. The Gamecocks' bench out-scored the Tiger reserves, 53-7, led by Larissa Kulcsar's season-best 14 points, 12 points from Stacy Booker and a career-high 11 points from Lakesha Tolliver.

USC was impressive from the free throw line, nailing 16-of-17 attempts (.941), the fourth-best effort in school history and the best since making 16-of-17 against Vanderbilt on March 2, 2000. The Gamecocks also won the battle of the boards, out-rebounding Clemson, 45-27. Carolina out-scored the Tigers in the paint, 46-20.

South Carolina set the tone out of the gate. The Gamecocks opened the game on a 12-0 scoring spurt, a run that included six points from Sliskovic. Clemson scored its first basket of the game at the 13:45 mark when Tasha Taylor knocked down a 12 -foot jumper

In the second half, Carolina extended its lead to 19 points, 50-31, on a fastbreak lay-up by Booker with 11:37 to play. From there, the Gamecocks went on a 13-4 run to take a 30 -point lead with $6: 26$ to play and essentially put the Tigers away.

Melanie Johnson had a season-high five assists and Lauren Simms pocketed a season-best three steals for Carolina. USC snapped Clemson's two-game win streak in the series.

Despite a season-high 16 points from Lauren Simms, the South Carolina women's basketball team suffered a $66-51$ defeat at the hands of No. 1 Tennessee at the Colonial Center Wednesday.

The Gamecocks hung around in the first half and trailed by only three points at in the early moments of the second half, but a 22-7 Lady Vol run extended their lead to 54-36 at the 6:45 mark and essentially put the game out of reach

Lady Vol center Tye'sha Fluker came off the bench to lead all scorers with 18 points, with Lakesha Tolliver scoring a career-high 11 points in the Gamecock effort. Alexis Hornbuckle finished with 13 points, five rebounds and five assists and Candace Parker added 10 points and nine rebounds to bolster the Tennessee effort.

Spurred by solid defense, Carolina got out to a 10-4 lead to start the game after holding Tennessee scoreless for a span of more than five minutes. The Gamecocks forced Tennessee into committing eight turnovers in the first nine minutes of the game. The Lady Vols responded, however, with a 14-0 run in the next five minutes to take a 23-17 lead. Carolina held Tennessee without a field goal for the rest of the half, with the Lady Vols taking a 25-21 lead into the locker room. Tennessee's 25 first-half points marked a season-low halftime total for the Lady Vols. Lauren Simms led all players with nine points in the first half, with Sidney Spencer pacing a balanced Tennessee attack with six first-half points.

Wednesday's game marked the seventh time in the history of the program that Carolina faced the No. 1 team in the nation, and only the third time that the Gamecocks hosted No. 1 in Columbia.

South Carolina dipped to $9-5$ overall and 0-2 in Southeastern Conference play with the loss, while Kentucky improved to 11-3 and 1-1 in the SEC

Lauren Simms led the way for Carolina with 14 points and a sea-son-high seven rebounds. Sunday's game marked the fourth time in the last six games that the junior from Columbia scored in double figures. Iva Sliskovic added 10 points and six rebounds, with Stacy Booker contributing 10 points to the Gamecock effort.

Kentucky was led by Samantha Mahoney and Carly Ormerod. Mahoney scored 20 points, with Ormerod finishing with 18 points.
Kentucky raced out to a 22-8 lead after Jenny Pfeiffer converted a four-point play at the 11:12 mark and Carly Ormerod followed that up with her second trey of the first half. Three-pointers were the name of the game for Kentucky early on, as five of the Wildcats' first eight field goals came from beyond the arc. The Gamecocks, meanwhile, struggled from the perimeter, converting on only one of nine from three-point range in the first half

After getting off to the fast start, Kentucky led by double-digits for the majority of the contest, but Carolina trimmed the Wildcat lead to $66-58$ with just over two minutes remaining in the contest. Kentucky regrouped, however, and held off the late Gamecock charge to seal the win.

Entering Sunday's game, Carolina had won five of its last eight meetings with the Wildcats overall and had left Lexington victorious in two of its last four trips.

It is no secret that No. 3 LSU is one of the best teams in the country, and the Tigers showed why in claiming a convincing 79-46 win over South Carolina in front of 4,113 fans at the Pete Maravich As sembly Center Thursday night.

With the loss, Carolina dipped to $9-6$ overall and 0-3 in the South eastern Conference, with LSU staying perfect at 14-0 overall and 30 in the SEC. With the win, the Tigers extended their home winning streak to 24 games. LSU's last loss at home came during the 2003-04 season.

Carolina was led in the scoring column by Stacy Booker and Lauren Simms, with Booker going for 15 and Simms adding 13. Reigning National Player of the Year Seimone Augustus and very large running mate Sylvia Fowles led the charge for LSU, with Augustus scoring 22 points and Fowles dominating inside with 15 points and 12 rebounds.

The Tigers went into halftime with a 38 - 24 edge thanks in large part to the fact that they punished the Gamecocks when they turned the ball over in the first half, forcing Carolina to commit 13 turnovers in the first 20 minutes of the game that resulted in a 16-3 LSU advantage in points off turnovers. The Tigers also owned an 11-0 advantage in second-chance points and an 18-4 edge in points in the paint during the first half.

Hot shooting from the perimeter made Simms Carolina's leading scorer in the first half with 10 points. Fowles also grabbed eight rebounds (five offensive) in the first half.

Vanderbilt held the lead from the opening minutes of the game and pushed its advantage to as many as 11 （28－17）in the first half on a basket by Liz Sherwood，the nation＇s field goal percentage leader （．697），with $3: 47$ to play．Melanie Johnson responded for Carolina by scoring six straight points to cut into the gap．The Commodores headed to the locker room with a 32－25 advantage at the half．Vander－ bilt out－scored Carolina in the paint，18－10，and collected 12 second－ chance points to just two for USC．Dee Davis led Vandy with 10 points． Johnson scored eight to lead South Carolina．

The South Carolina women＇s basketball team claimed a 67－48 win over Alabama Sunday at Coleman Coliseum．With the win，South Carolina improved to 10－7 overall and 1－4 in Southeastern Confer－ ence play，with Alabama dipping to $8-10$ overall and 2－3 in the SEC．

A 10－2 Carolina run early in the second half turned a 26－23 Game－ cock lead into a $36-25$ advantage with $14: 11$ remaining．The lead swelled to 54－34 with under seven minutes remaining，as Carolina＇s defense limited Alabama to only 28.3 percent shooting in the game to douse any hopes of a Crimson Tide comeback．Carolina，meanwhile， converted on 16－0f－22 field goals in the second half（ 72.7 percent）．

The Gamecocks took a 22－19 lead into the locker room at half－ time．South Carolina＇s defense was very effective in the first half，as the Gamecocks limited the Crimson Tide to 5－of－26 shooting from the field（19．2 percent）．However，Carolina threw away many of the oppor－ tunities it had to create separation on the scoreboard by committing 12 turnovers in the opening stanza．

Adams led the way for Carolina in the first half，scoring six points and grabbing seven rebounds．Booker added five points for the Game－ cocks，with Nettles and Hill scoring five points apiece for Alabama in the opening 20 minutes．When Booker drained a three－pointer with just under three minutes remaining in the first half，it marked the 12th consecutive game in which the junior has knocked down at least one three－pointer．

The South Carolina women's basketball team claimed a $61-52$ win over Arkansas Sunday at the Colonial Center

With the win, the Gamecocks improved to 11-8 overall and 2-5 in the Southeastern Conference, while Arkansas dipped to 13-7 overall and 5-2 in the SEC.

South Carolina was led by Melanie Johnson, who scored 15 points and grabbed eight rebounds. Johnson's point total Sunday marked her season high against an SEC opponent this year. Demetress Adams added eight points, with Lea Fabbri adding 12. Danielle Allen and Leslie Howard led the way for the Razorbacks, with Allen scoring 12 and Howard adding 13.

Sunday's game featured a stark difference in personnel, as the South Carolina roster is dotted by eight players standing 6-0 or taller, while only one Arkansas player is taller than 6-0. Not surprisingly, the Gamecocks repeatedly went inside to capitalize on its pronounced height advantage. Of Carolina's 61 total points, 46 were scored in the paint. Entering Sunday's contest, the Gamecocks owned a 9-2 record when scoring 30 or more points in the paint.

Shooting 30.5 percent from the field Sunday, Arkansas became the 13th of Carolina's 19 opponents this year to be limited below its season average, as the Hogs came into the game shooting 40.0 percent from the field.

With Carolina going inside as often as it did Sunday, the Gamecocks did not make any three pointers, snapping a streak that dated back to November of 2001 of 136 consecutive games with a threepointer.

Including Sunday's game, Carolina has emerged victorious in four of its last five meetings with Arkansas played in Columbia.

Melanie Johnson scored a game-high 18 points and Ilona Burgrova just missed her first career double-double with 11 points and nine rebounds in leading South Carolina to a 51-46 win over Mississippi State at Humphrey Coliseum Sunday.

With the win, the Gamecocks have now won three of their last four SEC games, their last two conference road games and improved to 12-8 overall and 3-5 in the Southeastern Conference, with the Lady Bulldogs dipping to $6-16$ overall and 1-8 in the league.

Carolina limited Mississippi State to 23.9 percent shooting from the field and blocked 10 shots in the contest.

The Gamecocks created a little bit of separation early in the second half, opening up a 36-27 lead following a Lea Fabbri free throw. However, Amy Reeder breathed life back into the Lady Bulldogs with back to-back three-pointers from the corner to cut the lead to 38-34. The teams traded points before MSU guard Miayorka Johnson knocked down a pair of free throws at the 2:39 mark to cut the Gamecock lead to 44-42.

Mississippi State's Blessing Chekwa went to the free throw line with a chance to tie the game with just over a minute remaining, but she missed both attempts. Melanie Johnson then gave Carolina a fourpoint lead with a layup with 53.8 seconds remaining. A quick response from Robin Porter cut the Carolina advantage to 46-44.

Lauren Simms knocked down a free throw to move the lead to 4744 with 22 seconds remaining before Carolina got a key defensive stand, with Burgrova hauling in the rebound to seal the win. With the Lady Bulldogs forced to foul, Burgrova drained both of her attempts to extend the lead to five points with 11 seconds left and put the game out of reach.

The play of Johnson has often times been a good indicator of South Carolina's success, as the Gamecocks have compiled a 14-3 record during Johnson's career when the Barnwell native scored in double figures.

Kentucky outlasted South Carolina, 75-71, in Southeastern Con ference women's basketball action on Thursday night inside the CoIonial Center. In a game that featured five ties and six lead changes, Samantha Mahoney's pair of free throws with 13 seconds remaining secured the win for the Wildcats. Carolina's record slipped to 12-9 overall and 3-6 in league action while the Wildcats improved to 16-6 in all games and moved above .500 in SEC games to 5-4.

Freshman Demetress Adams poured a season-high 18 points on 7-of-8 shooting from the field and 4-0f-6 shooting from the free throw line to lead the Gamecocks. Adams has hit 22-of-29 field goal attempts in the last five games.

The Gamecocks and Wildcats virtually traded baskets for the first eight minutes of the game before Carolina mustered a $10-4$ run to pull ahead, 21-13, at the $8: 57$ mark. UK battled back, and kept the lead within reach. South Carolina carried a 33-31 lead into the locker room at the half.

USC shot 41.4 percent from the field in the opening 20 minutes and held UK to 34.1 percent. Carolina displayed its shot-blocking ability, returning eight of the Wildcats' attempts. Kentucky grabbed 25 rebounds, more than half of which came from Jennifer Humphrey, who led the `Cats with 13 caroms, including seven on the offensive end of the floor. Humphrey's 13 boards exceeded the Gamecocks' opponenthigh for rebounds in a game this season, set by LSU's Sylvia Fowles on Jan. 12.

Sarah Elliot sparked the Wildcats in the early going of the second half. Elliot scored back-to-back baskets in the paint and sank a free throw, to give her team the lead, $36-33$, for the first time since the game's opening minute. Carolina surged back in front and took a fourpoint lead, 48-44, on a three-pointer by Stacy Booker. UK responded by scoring the game's next 13 points, including seven from Samantha Mahoney, to build a $57-48$ lead, the largest of the game for either team.

The Gamecocks continued to claw back and had a chance to tie the game with 22 seconds remaining, but Stacy Booker's open look from the corner went in-and-out, forcing the Gamecocks to foul. Kentucky made its clutch free throws and left with the win.

A fast-paced game throughout that featured seven ties and 10 lead changes, South Carolina was able to fight through Florida's pressure defense when it counted and did an excellent job on the offensive glass, collecting 17 offensive boards as a team. Every time the Gators appeared poised to make a run in the second half, either Adams, Johnson or Simms seemed to score right back to deflate any hopes of a Florida rally.

Johnson's effort Sunday continued a recent scoring trend on her part, as the Barnwell native scored 15 points vs. Arkansas, 18 points vs. Mississippi State and nine points vs. Kentucky in her three games prior to Sunday's contest.

The first half was played at a frantic pace and featured four ties and eight lead changes. Dickerson gave the Gamecocks a spark off the bench in the opening stanza, as the Columbia native scored all eight of her points in the first half to set a career high. Dickerson was one of three South Carolina natives to star for the Gamecocks in the first half, as both Johnson (Barnwell) and Adams (Bishopville) posted 10 points and five rebounds apiece in the opening 20 minutes.

The Gamecocks actually entered Sunday's game with higher shooting percentages from the field and from three-point range when playing on the road than when playing at the Colonial Center, and those figures held true against the Gators, with the Gamecocks draining 51.7 percent from the field.

The South Carolina women's basketball team claimed a $58-46$ win over Auburn Thursday night at Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum, marking the Gamecocks' fourth straight road win in the Southeastern Conference.
With the win, Carolina improved to 14-9 overall and 5-6 in the SEC, while Auburn dipped to 12-12 overall and 3-8 in the league. The victory also marked the Gamecocks' first win at Auburn since 1994.

In a very slow-paced game littered with fouls, the Gamecocks got key buckets from Shannel Harris in the second half and a back-breaking layup from Ilona Burgrova with 1:33 remaining to put the game out of reach.

Lea Fabbri's hot shooting from three-point range anchored her team-high 13-point effort, with Iva Sliskovic adding 10 points and five rebounds. Only four Auburn players scored in the game, led by Nitasha Brown's 13 points.
Following a strong defensive performance in the first half, Carolina kept the clamps on Auburn in the second half as well, holding the Tigers to a season-low 46 points on a season-low 12-of-42 shooting in the game ( 28.6 percent). The Gamecocks kept Auburn without a field goal for an 8:10 stretch of the second half and were able to overcome the Tigers' height and size advantage, holding a 39-38 edge in rebounds.

Though the Gamecocks were effective on the defensive end of the floor in the first half, limiting Auburn to 33.3 percent shooting from the field, Carolina turnovers on the offensive end hampered the Gamecocks' chances at pulling away, as Carolina gave the ball away 10 times in the first half.

The Gamecocks held Auburn scoreless for a span of five minutes and 45 seconds during the opening stanza, but were not able to capitalize, scoring only four points of their own during the Tigers' scoreless drought. Auburn returned the favor by holding Carolina scoreless for the final $5: 18$ of the first half.

Thursday's match-up pitted two of the tallest teams in the country against each other. Entering the game, Auburn led the country with 7.8 blocked shots per game, with South Carolina ranking third in the nation with 7.1 rejections per contest.

The South Carolina women's basketball team claimed a 77-66 win over Ole Miss in front of 5,227 fans at the Colonial Center Sunday marking the Gamecocks' fitth win in their last six games.

With the win, the Gamecocks improved to 15-9 overall and drew even at $6-6$ in the Southeastern Conference. The Lady Rebels dipped to 14-12 overall and 4-9 in the SEC. With Vanderbilt losing an 81-63 decision to Georgia in Nashville earlier in the day, Carolina moved into a tie for sixth place in the SEC standings with the Commodores.

Junior Melanie Johnson sparked an 11-0 run early in the second half that turned a 38-33 Gamecock advantage to a 49-33 edge. During that deciding span, Johnson scored six points, grabbed four rebounds, blocked a shot and had an assist. The Barnwell native finished with her third double-double of the year, posting team-high totals of 17 points and 13 boards in the game.
Ole Miss star Armintie Price scored 16 points and grab 10 rebounds to lead the Lady Rebels, with Carla Bartee chipping in with 14 points and Ashley Johnson adding 13 points of her own

Though Ole Miss' quick hands and pesky defense on the perimeter resulted in 25 Carolina turnovers, the Gamecocks were able to make a living inside, converting on 51.8 percent from the field on 29 of 56 shooting. Carolina finished the game with a 42-18 advantage over Ole Miss in points in the paint.

After opening up a 59-47 lead after a jumper by Brionna Dickerson with $7: 43$ remaining, it appeared as if the Gamecocks had the contest in hand, but the Lady Rebels scrapped back and drew to within five points at $63-59$ with under four minutes left. A clutch three-pointer from the corner by Shannel Harris followed by a defensive stand and a fast-break layup by Lakesha Tolliver expanded the Carolina lead to 68-59 with 2:41 remaining.

With point guard Lea Fabbri saddled with foul trouble and eventually fouling out of the game, junior Stacy Booker assumed point guard duties and finished with a season-high six assists. Tolliver added a career-high 16 points to further the Gamecocks' cause.

After a slow start on the offensive end of the court, Carolina's defense kept the Gamecocks in it, as Carolina held Ole Miss to 4-of-18 shooting from the field to start the game ( 22.2 percent). The Gamecocks took a $29-25$ lead into the locker room at halftime. Carolina drained 13 of its 26 attempts from the field ( 50.0 percent) in comparison to the Lady Rebels' 9 -for- 33 effort (27.3 percent) in the first half. Part of the Gamecocks' first-half success was a result of limiting Price to five points on only four field goal attempts. Price entered the game averaging 16.5 points per game.

The South Carolina women's basketball team is one step closer to the NCAA Tournament after picking up a 99-48 win over Longwood University Tuesday at the Colonial Center. With the win, the Gamecocks improved to 16-9 overall, with the Lancers dipping to 9-18 overall. Tuesday's game put a cap on the non-conference portion of Carolina's schedule, with the Gamecocks compiling a 10-3 record during the non-league slate
With a pair of regular-season games remaining against Mississippi State and at Vanderbilt, South Carolina's NCAA hopes are still very much alive, as the Gamecocks can still finish as high as fifth in the final SEC regular season standings and could finish the regular season with as many as 18 wins. Besides their win total, Carolina is also enjoying a very strong finish, as the Gamecocks currently own the SEC's longest winning streak with four victories in a row and have been triumphant in six of their last seven games, including Tuesday's win over Longwood.

Including Tuesday's win, the Gamecocks have won eight more games this season than they did all of last year, marking the largest improvement among all schools in the six power conferences (SEC, ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-10, Big East).

Tuesday's game was never in doubt, as the Gamecocks rolled up 64 points in the first half en route to taking a 64-28 lead into the locker room at halftime. Carolina gashed Longwood inside, scoring 48 points in the paint in the first half alone and finishing with 66 points in the paint. Clearly the most dominant player in the game, Lakesha Tolliver turned in a career performance for the Gamecocks, scoring 19 points and grabbing eight rebounds. Demetress Adams scored 15 points and collected seven boards.

There were several statistical categories in which Carolina held lopsided advantages over Longwood and there were a host of season and career highs met or passed by Gamecock players, but the overriding theme of the game was the fact that Carolina consistently forced Longwood into turnovers that resulted in the Gamecocks holding a 45-6 advantage in points off turnovers and a $28-2$ advantage in fast break points.

In its final home game of the regular season, the South Carolina women's basketball team romped to a $75-47$ win over Mississippi State Thursday night at the Colonial Center. The Gamecocks (17-9, 7-6 SEC) have won five straight games and seven of their last eight heading into Sunday's regular season finale at Vanderbilt. Mississippi State fell to 6-20 overall and 1-12 in Southeastern Conference play.

Carolina put on a stellar shooting performance. The Gamecocks created quality looks at the basket and hit 56 percent (28-of-50) from the field. USC converted 17-of-23 free throws, and owned the glass, out-rebounding the Lady Bulldogs, 42-26.

South Carolina blew the game wide open in the middle of the sec ond half on the strength of a 17-3 run that extended the Gamecocks lead from 45-32 to 62-35.
A foursome of Gamecock players reached doubles figures in scoring. Melanie Johnson poured in a game-high 16 points and added five rebounds, three steals and a block. Lakesha Tolliver continued her recent scoring surge with 11 points, the third straight game she has reached double-digits in scoring. Tolliver also dished out a ca-reer-high four assists and matched a career-best with three steals. Freshman Demetress Adams knocked down 10 points and grabbed four boards. Iva Sliskovic was impressive as well, finishing with 10 points on 4-of-5 shooting and a game-high seven rebounds.

The Gamecocks were able to overcome 28 turnovers through their offensive effort and by shutting down MSU. The Lady Bulldogs were limited to just 29.6 percent shooting.

South Carolina pushed its lead to eight, 25-17, after a pair of jumpers from Stacy Booker and a three-point play by Johnson at the 7:59 mark, but failed to score for the next five minutes. The drought did not hurt the Gamecocks, as they held the Lady Bulldogs scoreless for the final 7:14 of the first half.

USC made a living at the free throw line during the closing minutes of the first half, hitting 6-0f-7 charity tosses in the final $2: 30$ to build a 15-point lead, 35-20, at intermission.

The Gamecocks shot better than 52 percent from the field in the first half and hit 11-of-13 free throws, while Mississippi State shot just 29.6 percent from the field and made of 1-of-2 free throws.

Carolina's Ione senior Olga Gritsaeva was honored prior to the start of the game.

The South Carolina women's basketball team saw its five-game losing streak come to an end Sunday, as No. 24 Vanderbilt handed the Gamecocks an 88-71 defeat at Memorial Gymnasium. Even in defeat Sunday, Carolina finished the regular season with wins in seven of its last nine games.

With the loss, the Gamecocks finished the regular season with a 17-10 overall record and a 7-7 mark in Southeastern Conference play. The Commodores improved to 19-9 overall and 8-6 in the SEC.

Key players getting into foul trouble plagued both teams early on, as Carolina's Demetress Adams went to the bench with her second foul at the 16:46 mark of the first half, with Lakesha Tolliver picking up a pair of quick offensive fouls shortly after entering the game. For Vanderbilt, both Nicole Jules and Carla Thomas were on the bench with foul trouble seven minutes into the contest. Both Adams and Tolliver picked up a third foul prior to halttime and neither player was able to get into any kind of rhythm during the opening stanza. Tolliver eventually fouled out of the game with $4: 58$ remaining, with Melanie Johnson fouling out as well. As a team, South Carolina was whistled for 12 fouls during the first half and 27 fouls in the game.

Vanderbilt's defense shut down Carolina's offense midway through the first half, holding the Gamecocks scoreless for a span of five minutes and 49 seconds. During that timeframe, the Commodores went on a 10-0 run to turn a 22-17 advantage into a 32-17 cushion. That stretch of time allowed Vanderbilt to build a lead that Carolina would not be able to overcome. The two teams basically traded baskets for the remainder of the half, with Commodore forward Rachel Brockman scoring from underneath with time expiring to give Vanderbilt a 38-24 halftime advantage. Vanderbilt forced South Carolina into committing 16 turnovers in the first half.

Carolina shaved the deficit to single digits after Melanie Johnson scored on a put-back at the 11:51 mark to cut Vanderbilt's lead to 55-47, but the Commodores were able to keep the Gamecocks at arm's length for the remainder of the game to seal the victory.

Iva Sliskovic led the way for South Carolina, matching a career high with 20 points and grabbing six rebounds. Melanie Johnson posted her fourth double-double of the year with 17 points and 10 rebounds. Dee Davis led the way for Vanderbilt with 14 points and 10 assists.

Sunday's game was a rematch of a Jan. 15 game played at the Colonial Center that saw Vanderbilt claim a 67-59 win.
