

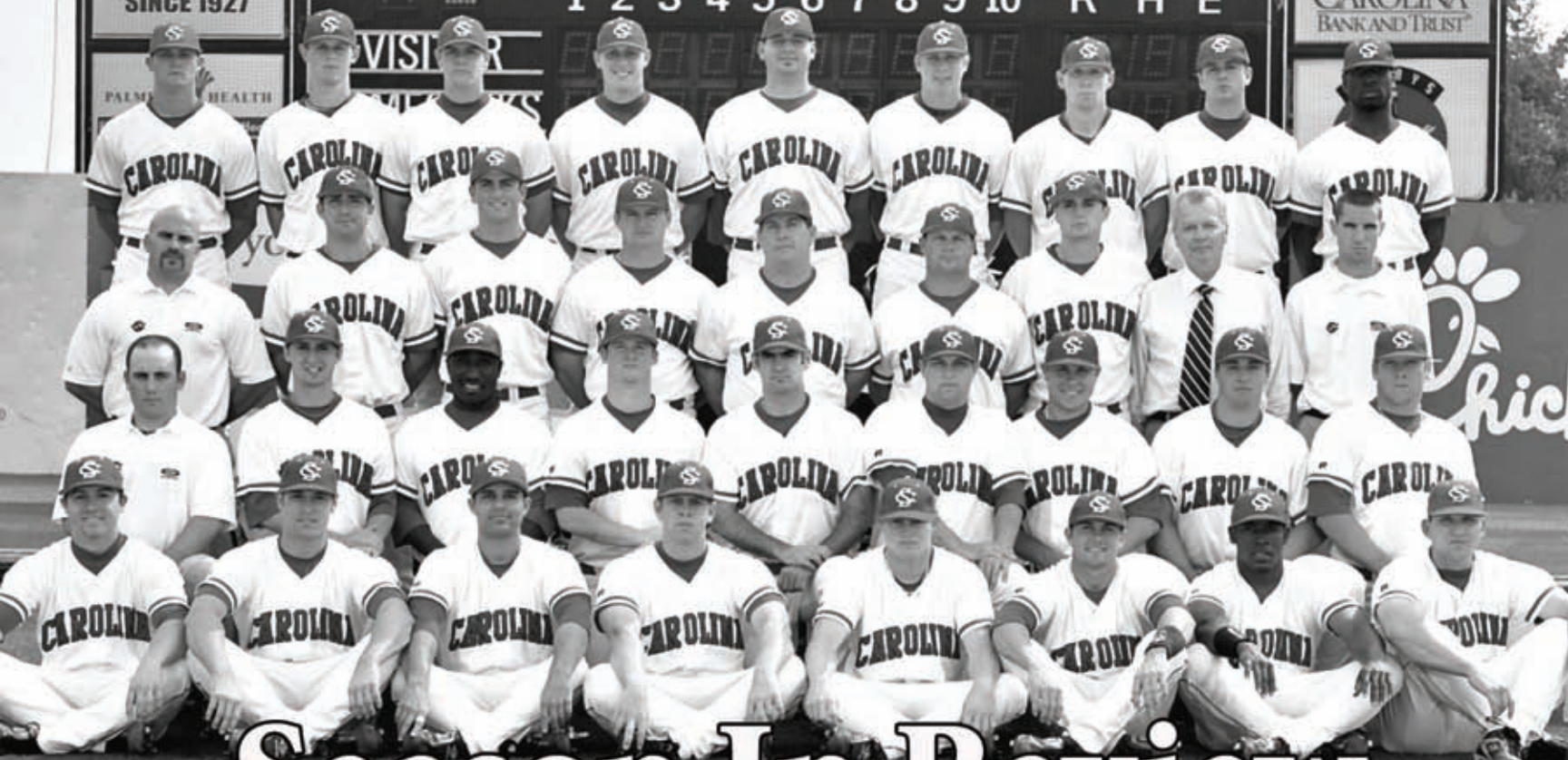

The 2007 season for South Carolina featured an eighth straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament, a spot in the NCAA Super Regional for the seventh time in the last eight years, and the Gamecocks finishing with a 46-20 record, just one win shy of reaching the College World Series.

South Carolina broke out of the gates early in the first portion of the schedule with a 15-2 record out of conference before the start of league play. For the first time in school history, the Gamecocks opened up the regular season with six consecutive games on the road in a pair of tournaments held at UNC Wilmington and The Citadel.

Carolina opened the year by winning the Hughes Brothers Challenge in Wilmington, N.C. with a 13-2 win over Oklahoma, 12-0 shutout of Western Kentucky and a 9-8 11-inning thriller with the host Seahawks. Carolina's season-opening win over the Sonners was a 14-hit performance from the offense that included eight of nine Gamecock starters with at least one hit and all nine reaching base at least once in the game. Opening day starter Harris Honeycutt allowed just one run on three hits in six innings to pick up the victory. The offense would continue its onslaught the next day against Western Kentucky in a 12-0 win that featured four home runs. The Gamecocks would need all the offense on day three against a scrappy UNC Wilmington squad that rallied to tie the game in the late innings after being five runs down to send the game into extra innings. Andrew Crisp tallied a career-high five hits including a game-winning RBI single in the 11th inning to help the Gamecocks upend the Seahawks and win the tournament.

Carolina's offense would continue to do damage the next week in Charleston, S.C. at the Crab House Shoot-out. James Darnell and Phil Disher each homered in a 10-2 win over Liberty with Honeycutt picking up his second win of the year. Darnell would homer for a second consecutive day against Richmond and Disher would add three RBI as Carolina remained undefeated with a 9-2 win over the Spiders. Despite three home runs in Sunday's game vs. The Citadel, the Bulldogs would rally late to defeat Carolina 7-6 to give the Gamecocks the first loss of the season.

The friendly confines of Sarge Frye Field would be a welcome sight for the Gamecock Baseball team as Carolina swept its first home series of the year vs. Eastern Michigan. The weekend series was not without excitement though as Phil Disher launched a grand slam walk-off home run in the bottom of the ninth inning as Carolina put together a rally of its own to defeat Eastern Michigan 8-5 in the first game of a doubleheader.

With an 8-1 record, Carolina took the bus ride north to the Upstate and a Top-5 showdown between the Gamecocks and Clemson Tigers. In one of the most impressive, complete performances by a South Carolina team in recent history, Disher and Darnell each belted three-run home runs and Harris Honeycutt allowed just two hits over 7.0 innings to lead the fourth ranked Gamecocks to a 12-0 rout over the second-ranked Tigers at Doug Kingsmore Stadium. The victory was Carolina's first shutout of the Tigers since 1986 and the first Gamecocks shutout at Doug Kingsmore Stadium since 1974.

The rivalry headed back to Columbia and Sarge Frye Field for the second part of the showdown, this time at Sarge Frye Field. With 5,913 fans in attendance at Sarge Frye Field, both teams battled it out in a tight game that saw the teams tied 2-2 in the ninth inning. Darnell would lead off with a walk and reach second base on a sacrifice bunt by Steven Reinhold. With one out and first base open, the Tigers elected to intentionally walk Jon Willard bringing Trent Kline up to bat with two runners on and just one out. Kline drilled a hard 3-1 pitch from Clemson reliever Daniel Moskos that got by shortstop Taylor Harbin for a single and scored Darnell with the game-winning run.

After an extra inning loss at the College of Charleston, the Gamecocks would run off five straight wins over Brown and Appalachian State and would head into the first conference series of the year at home vs. the LSU Tigers.

The conference opener saw Honeycutt and Curtis Johnson combine for a three-hit shutout to lead Carolina to a 5-0 win over LSU. Harley Lail homered and the Gamecocks struck with four runs in the seventh inning as Carolina pulled out a victory over the Tigers. After a tight 6-5 loss to LSU the next day, South Carolina would take the rubber game of the series 9-5 behind a career-high four hits from Trent Kline, including a homer and two doubles, along with 5.2 scoreless innings from freshman starter Blake Cooper.

Mid-week wins vs. UNC Asheville and Wofford kept the Gamecocks on track heading to Starkville, Miss. for a three-game series with the Mississippi State Bulldogs. Carolina's offense again was showcased as the team belted out a season-high 25 hits on its way to a 20-3 win over the Bulldogs. Reese Havens tallied a career-high five hits including three doubles and James Darnell, Trent Kline and Phil Disher homered in the victory. The victory also featured a superb relief performance by sophomore lefty Alex Farotto, who recorded all of the final seven outs of the game by strikeout.

Despite a 6-5 loss in 12 innings the next day vs. MSU, the Gamecocks would bounce back and take the series with an 8-3 win on Sunday. Justin Smoak was 4-for-5 with a homer and reliever Jeff Jeffords struck out six batters in 3.2 innings to earn the victory.

Sarge Frye Field would again be site for one of the nation's top college baseball series as top ranked Carolina would host third-ranked Vanderbilt. The two teams would not disappoint on Friday night in front of a season-high 6,039 fans.

The much heralded pitching match-up of Gamecock starter Harris Honeycutt and Vanderbilt starter David Price lived up to the hype as both pitchers working into the late innings and allowing three runs apiece. The Commodores went ahead 3-2 in the seventh inning. Alex Feinberg walked on four pitches followed up a single from designated hitter Andrew Giobbi. Both would be sacrificed to second and third base on a bunt from Brad French.

With one out and an 0-1 count against reliever Curtis Johnson, VU center fielder David Macias laid down a suicide squeeze bunt to score Feinberg and give Vanderbilt a one-run lead. After nearly tying the game in the seventh inning, the Gamecocks rallied to tie in the eighth inning against Price. Lail drew a leadoff walk that was followed up by a one hit single from Kline and a RBI base hit courtesy of Smoak, his second of the game.

It was an epic game as both teams saw several chances fall by the wayside until the 12th inning when Vanderbilt struck with the winning run. The inning opened with David Macias reaching base on an infield single, just beating out a throw by second baseman Travis Jones on a close play. Pedro Alvarez walked with one out to give the Commodores two runners on base. Carolina reliever Will Atwood got Ryan Flaherty to line out to center field for the second out of the frame. The Gamecocks then went to the bullpen to bring in reliever Jeff Jeffords with Vanderbilt countering with Alex Davis to pinch hit. Davis knocked a 3-2 pitch from Jeffords up the middle to score Macias for the game-winning run. The Gamecocks would look to rally in the bottom half of the inning but Trent Kline lined into a double play with Harley Lail getting doubled up at first base to end the game and preserve a victory for the Commodores.

Carolina suffered a second consecutive loss to Vanderbilt but bounced back to defeat the Commodores in an 8-2 win in the final game of the series. Freshman righty Blake Cooper again came up big for the Gamecocks as he did not allow a run until the eighth inning and was supported early by home runs from Darnell and Disher.

South Carolina would then head to Gainesville, Fla. for a three-game series vs. the Gators. The series would be a showcase for junior infielder Travis Jones, who would earn National Player of the Week honors from Collegiate Baseball. Jones went 9-for-12 in the series vs. the Gators including five home runs and 11 RBI as South Carolina defeated the Gators in two of three games. His last home run, a three-run blast in the top of the ninth inning in Sunday's game helped Carolina rally to an 11-inning 8-6 come-from-behind win over Florida on Eastern Sunday in front of a nationally televised audience on ESPN.

South Carolina continued to hit the ball back at home at Sarge Frye Field in 10-1 and 18-4 wins vs. Auburn. The 10-1 win also featured junior left-hander Arik Hempy, who earned SEC Pitcher of the Week honors. In his first start against an SEC team in the year, he limited the Tigers to two hits in 6.2 innings of work with five strikeouts.

In the mid-week, Carolina would host Clemson in the third of the four-game series on Wednesday night and the Gamecocks would not disappoint the home fans as four solo home runs from Travis Jones, Harley Lail, James Darnell and Justin Smoak helped lead Carolina to a 4-2 win over the Tigers.

After series setbacks at Ole Miss and Alabama, the Gamecocks would get a much needed series victory at home vs. Kentucky in the start of May to stay among the top three teams in the SEC. Jones would tie his season-high with four hits including a home run and Smoak would add a home run in the 8-1 win over Kentucky to open the series. Carolina won the series on Sunday then in a 13-6 win over the Wildcats that featured home runs from Darnell, Jones and Cheyne Hurst. South Carolina would continue its success vs. the SEC East with series wins at Tennessee and Georgia to close out the regular season at 17-13 and clinch the Gamecocks the third seed at the SEC Tournament. The final regular season game of the year featured a historic rally from the Gamecocks, as the Gamecocks rallied from an 11-run deficit highlighted by a nine-run eighth inning to earn a 14-13 win over Georgia.

South Carolina started things off in the nine-run eighth inning against Georgia reliever Iain Sebastian with Crisp doubling to right field and advancing to third base on right fielder Blake Cannady's fielding error. The first run would then score on a RBI single by Cheyne Hurst, who also advanced to second base on the second fielding error by Cannady in right field. Pinch hitter Robbie Grinestaff continued things with a single to left field that gave the Gamecocks runners on the corners. After a walk issued to Travis Jones loaded the bases, the Bulldogs went to reliever Ryan Woolley, who walked James Darnell to score Hurst and cut the Georgia lead to six runs. Georgia went to the bullpen a third time with Justin Earls and the Gamecocks greeted him with consecutive two-run doubles from Justin Smoak and Phil Disher that brought Carolina within two runs at 13-11. With still no outs and Disher on second base, Carolina closed the gap to within a run as Enders doubled down the left field line to score Disher. The Gamecocks tied the game then on a botched play by Georgia as Harley Lail set down a sacrifice bunt but on the play saw first baseman Rich Poythress drop the ball to allow Enders to score from second base and tie the match-up. Lail stole second base with one out and scored the game-winning run on a double to left center by Hurst off of Georgia closer Joshua Fields.

After a pair of wins vs. the Florida Gators at the SEC Tournament, the Gamecocks would be awarded a NCAA Regional host site for the 2007 NCAA Division I Baseball Tournament. South Carolina would go 3-0 to win the NCAA Regional in Columbia, S.C. at Sarge Frye Field. Carolina opened the weekend with a 9-1 win over Wofford that featured a multi-home run game from Justin Smoak as well as seven innings of work from right-handed pitcher Harris Honeycutt, who allowed just one run in the ballgame. After a washout of action on day two, the Gamecocks put themselves in the driver's seat with a 12-8 win over Charlotte on Sunday. Carolina erupted for the 12 runs in the first five innings that featured home runs from Smoak, Trent Kline and Andrew Crisp and a solid start by junior left-hander Arik Hempy, who went 5.1 innings to pick up the win. South Carolina met the 49ers one more time and closed out the Regional with an 11-6 victory that saw designated hitter Phil Disher connect with a grand slam and 4.2 quality innings out of the bullpen by reliever Curtis Johnson.

The victory at home would send Carolina to Chapel for a three-game NCAA Super Regional with the North Carolina Tar Heels. In primetime on the ESPN Family of Networks, the Gamecocks and Tar Heels played three dramatic games that saw North Carolina advance to the College World Series. South Carolina was able to force a rubber game in the NCAA Super Regional after winning an elimination game 8-6 vs. UNC, but the Tar Heels would rally late in game three. The Gamecocks held a 4-1 edge before the Tar Heels ran off eight unanswered runs to defeat South Carolina 9-4 and clinch a spot in Omaha.
