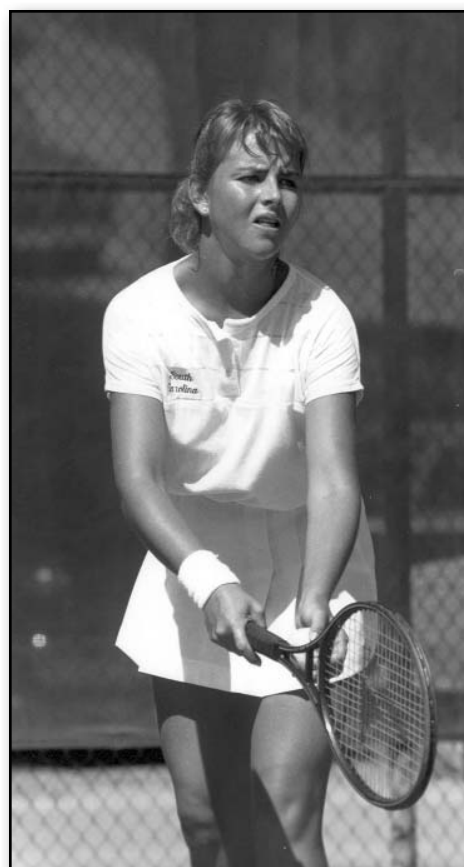

NOTES ON CONFERENCE STANDINGS

- From 1990 to 1998, the SEC Champion was determined by total aggregate points accumulated at the conclusion of the conference tournament: one full point was awarded for each regular-season conference win, one-half point for wins in the first two rounds of the conference tournament, one-half point for receiving a first-round bye in the conference tournament and one full point for a win in the conference tournament semifinals and final.
- For the 1999 season, the same points system was in place with a couple of changes: one full point for a first-round bye in the conference tournament and one full point for a win in any round of the conference tournament.
- In 2000, the SEC changed the determination of its tennis champion to the team with the best winning percentage in conference regular-season dual matches (11 matches).
