### **Quick Hits**

- Mark Berson is the winningest active NCAA Division I men's soccer coach. and he ranks fourth on the all-time NCAA D1 wins list in his 42nd season leading South Carolina men's soccer
- He tallied his 500th career win at UAB (11/4/17) in the regular season finale in 2017, 1-0, to became just the fourth coach ever in NCAA DI men's soccer to tally 500 career wins
- Berson ranks second amongst active NCAA D1 coaches with 22 NCAA Tournament appearances
- South Carolina welcomes 12 newcomers to this season's roster with 16 returners to take the roster to 28
- Speaking of returners, the Gamecocks bring back players with 12 of the team's 20 goals in 2018 (60%) as well as their top three scorers (Mayr, Monheimer and Myers)
- 2018 was the year of quick starts for Carolina as it outscored opponents 8-6 in the first period and outshot them 111-68
- Four teams on South Carolina's 2019 schedule played in the 2018 NCAA Tournament
- South Carolina entered the 2019 season as the 13th best program in the country all-time according to winning percentage (.760). Berson ranks first for active coaches according to victories (507) and is fourth all-time.
- Berson is just 10 wins away from moving up to third all-time for victories and 34 away from tying the all-time wins record.
- Luca Mayr was named a preseason all-conference selection for the secondconsecutive year in 2019.
- This was the first time since 2011 Carolina opened the regular season on the road when it lost 2-3 to College of Charleston.



#### **The Cook File**

Head coach Mark Berson announced on March 27, 2017, the hiring of Justin Cook as an assistant coach for the men's soccer program at the University of South Carolina. Cook joins the Gamecocks after 10 seasons (2007-16) as an assistant coach at Tulsa.

"Justin joins us from the University of Tulsa where he has consistently brought in outstanding recruiting classes and assisted in helping TU put an outstanding team on the field each year," said Berson, "He has an outstanding pedigree as a player at Ohio State, where he was one of only two players in history to earn both Big Ten freshman of the year honors and then Big Ten player of the Year honors as a senior."

Cook most recently served as an assistant coach and the recruiting coordinator for the Golden Hurricane. While with Tulsa, he was a part of eight NCAA Tournament teams, three American Athletic Conference Tournament Championships (2014-16), four C-USA Tournament Championships (2007-09) and three C-USA Regular Season Championships. In their eight NCAA berths with Cook, the Golden Hurricane advanced to the second round four times (2007-08, 10, 15), the third round once (2012) and the NCAA Quarterfinals once (2009). In 2010, the program received a school-best No. 2 national ranking. The program compiled a 117-60-25 (.683 pct) record overall during Cook's time there.

While with Tulsa, Cook recruited three MAC Hermann Trophy candidates, three All-Americans, five academic All-Americans, three C-USA Players of the Year, two C-USA Defensive Players of the Year, 28 all-conference selections and one member of the 2008 Beijing Olympic Men's Soccer Team.

Cook had a highly decorated career as a player as well. He was inducted into the 2015 Ohio State University Athletics Hall of Fame after earning Big Ten All-Conference honors four times. He was named Big Ten Freshman of the Year in 2000 and the Big Ten Player of the Year in 2004. He was selected 51st overall in the 2005 Major League Soccer SuperDraft. Cook is a native of Orlando, Fla. He and his wife Stefanie have two daughters, Piper and Elizabeth.

#### The Kettering File


Head coach Mark Berson announced on March 27, 2017, the hiring of Tyler Kettering as an assistant coach for the men's soccer program at the University of South Carolina. Kettering joins the Gamecocks after one season as an assistant at Dayton (2016) and seven as associate head coach at Gardner Webb (2009-16).

"Tyler has extensive experience as a player and coach, having competed in the MLS, and the USL as a goalkeeper," said Berson, "As a goalkeeper at Gardner Webb University, he led the nation in saves for two seasons. As associate head coach at Gardner Webb, he was responsible for bringing in outstanding recruiting classes and helping develop the Gardner Webb program."

In his lone season with the Flyers, Kettering helped develop A-10 Defender of the Year Lalas Abubakar, who was selected No. 5 overall in the 2017 MLS SuperDraft by the Columbus Crew. A native of Xenia, Ohio, Kettering came to Dayton after seven years as the Associate Head Coach for Gardner-Webb University. In his time at Gardner-Webb, Kettering served as the recruiting coordinator, ran day-to-day team operations, as well as developing and implementing practice sessions and overseeing the goalkeeper training throughout the season.

Kettering played his college soccer at Gardner-Webb as well where he had a standout career as a keeper for the Bulldogs. He led the nation in saves twice (2004, 2006), set school and conference records for career saves (446), and earned Atlantic Sun All-Conference honors twice. He finished second in school history with 15 career shutouts and earned A-Sun All-Freshman Team accolades in 2003.

After college he went on to play one season in the USL for the Wilmington Hammerheads (2006-07) and one season in the MLS for the Chicago Fire (2008-09). Kettering and his wife Ali have three children, Logan, Karis, and Charlie.



#### **Stone Stadium**

Before Stone Stadium became part of the Gamecock Athletics' landscape, the South Carolina men's soccer team played on the same site, affectionately referred to as "The Graveyard" for the first 18 years of the site's existence.

Bleachers lined the east side of the field, with a seating capacity of 2,000 listed throughout its time. However, many times crowds well over that cap came to watch the Gamecocks play, including over 6,000 for the 1990 matchup against archrival Clemson.

"The Graveyard" stood as the place where opponents dreams of a road win died, as South Carolina captured 84 percent of the contests played on the site (177-30-9) in 18 years. Twice, the homefield advantage launched a Mark Berson-led Gamecock team to the NCAA College Cup in 1988 and 1993.

The Stadium, which debuted in 1996, was made possible by a \$1 million gift given by the late Eugene E. Stone III, who passed away in 1997.

Fans have flocked to the men's matches since the new setup was established, with two record-setting crowds coming during the past eight years. Ten NCAA Tournament matches have been played by Berson's Gamecocks in Stone Stadium.

Stone Stadium officially sits 5,000. The South Carolina men's soccer attendance record is 6,892, a mark achieved on Aug. 26, 2016, against Clemson. Carolina has had 15 seasons since 1985 (year attendance numbers start in the record book) with 20,000+ fans for a season with an additional two years with 30.000+.

The surface of Stone Stadium was completely replaced during the summer of 2009 and a state-of-the-art irrigation system was installed, along with new sod for the entire field surface.

Alongside the stadium, you will notice the Gamecock Soccer Complex. Completed in summer 2016, its an 11,000-square-foot facility that houses individual team locker rooms, lounges and study rooms, athletic training therapy tubs, a 3,000 square-foot weight room, a cleat room and a film room.

When planning to visit stone stadium, it is advised to park in the Heyward Street parking garage on levels three, four and five. Parking in the garage is free. Free parking is limited, but available on the surrounding streets.




