## ABOUT THIS GAME

- South Carolina is back home after a five-game road stint, the longest such stretch since five road/neutral games early in the 2015-16 season.
- The series is tied 2-2 after the Gamecocks' double-overtime win at Purdue last season.
- This is Purdue's first trip to Columbia for women's basketball.
- Today's game features four of the most experienced players in NCAA Div. I South Carolina's Tyasha Harris (116 games, 8th) and Mikiah Herbert Harrigan (113 games, 12th), Purdue's Ae'Rianna Harris (113 games, 12th) and Dominique Oden (113 games, 12th). Only three other teams (Louisville, Oregon, TCU) have multiple entries in the active top 12 of career
- Prior today's game, the Gamecocks will present Tyasha Harris a special ball to commemorate her 1,000th career point, which she scored against USC Upstate (Nov. 21).

## GAMECOCK NOTABLES

- · During the long five-game road swing, which included two ranked opponents and their in-state rivalry game, it was the team's veterans who dominated offensively. Seniors Mikiah Herbert Harrigan and Tyasha Harris were two of the team's top three scorers with 14.8 and 13.0 points per game, respectively. Sophomore Destanni Henderson came in fourth in scoring at 8.2 points per game.
- Ranked fourth in the nation in rebounds per game (47.0) and 33rd in rebounding margin (+9.1), the Gamecocks have been out-rebounded just once this season (at Temple, -4, Dec. 7).
- South Carolina is among the nation's top five in two other stats blocks per game (8.9, 1st) and field goal percentage defense (.298, 3rd).
- The Gamecocks have scored 16.9 fast break points per game while allowing opponents just 5.1 points per game in transition.
- Senior Mikiah Herbert Harrigan moved into the team lead in scoring at 13.9 points per game (13th in the SEC) behind seven straight games of 13 or more points, including two 20-point
- Freshman Aliyah Boston has scored in double figures every game this season, including four games in which she played less than 20 minutes. Her four double-doubles have come in just 23.3 minutes per game in those outings.

Tyasha Harris' 12 points in the fourth quarter at Temple were the most by a Gamecock in a single quarter this season.

14.1 made free throws this season. Their 214 free throw attempts ranks 14th in the nation.

South Carolina has scored 20.2 points per game off turnovers this season.

Aliyah Boston has scored (field goal or free throw) off 52.7 percent of her offensive rebounds.





## **Five-Second Count**

South Carolina women's basketball is in the midst of its most successful era, claiming at least 20 wins for the last eight seasons. The Gamecocks have played in the NCAA Elite Eight three times in the last four seasons, including winning the 2017 National Championship, and have been ranked in the AP Top 25 for 137 consecutive weeks, the fourth-longest active streak in the nation. Staley has led the Gamecocks to four SEC regular-season titles and four straight SEC Tournament Championships, making South Carolina the first program to win four consecutive tournament crowns in league history.

Under Staley's leadership, five Gamecocks have earned All-America status, two have earned SEC Player of the Year honors and 15 have picked up All-SEC recognition. Six Gamecocks have been selected in the WNBA Draft in the last four years, including 2018 No. 1 overall pick A'ja Wilson, who went onto become the Gamecocks' second-straight WNBA Rookie of the Year.

## **Purdue Series Notes**

The series with Purdue is tied 2-2 with both of the Gamecocks' wins coming in West Lafayette and Purdue's two victories coming at neutral sites.

Last season's 82-73 double-overtime win was the most dramatic contest of the series as then-No. 25/- South Carolina had to battle back twice to get to the decisive final overtime period. Purdue looked to have the game in hand in the final minute of the first overtime with a four-point lead. A pair of free throws by Tyasha Harris cut the Gamecocks' deficit in half with 31 seconds to go, then Karissa McLaughlin hit just one of her two free throw attempts to leave the door open with 24 seconds to play. Harris' 3-pointer missed, but Mikiah Herbert Harrigan came up with the offensive rebound and kicked it out to Bianca Jackson with three seconds on the clock. Purdue's Tamara Farquhar closed out a little too aggressively, sending Jackson to the free throw line where she sank all three to send the game to another OT. The teams traded points early in the period before the Gamecocks went on a 7-0 run then held on for the final 94 seconds.

## **Home Sweet Home**

The Gamecocks are 458-164 (.736) all-time in home games, including a 146-33 mark under head coach Dawn Staley. Staley's .816 winning percentage at home is second among the program's seven all-time head coaches.

At Colonial Life Arena, which opened for the 2002-

03 season, South Carolina is 209-66 (.760) all-time with Staley boasting a 143-33 (.813) mark.

So far this season, the Gamecocks are 3-0 at home.

## Staley's 20th

Celebrating her 20th season as a head coach this season, Dawn Staley has averaged 23.4 wins through her first 19 seasons. With a .718 (454-178) winning percentage in that time, she is 18th among active NCAA Div. I head coaches with at least 10 years of experience.

In her 12th season at South Carolina, she is the program's all-time winningest coach (281) with a program-record nine postseason appearances (8 NCAA/1 WNIT). She accounts for both of the Gamecocks' Final Four appearances (2015, 2017) and the first national championship in program history.

Staley has won 122 SEC games to rank second among active league coaches and eighth all-time. Her 11.1 SEC wins per season is the best all-time among coaches with at least 10 seasons in the league, and her .701 winning percentage is second only to Tennessee's Pat Summitt in league history.

## **Ranking Review**

The Gamecocks are ranked No. 5 in this week's AP Poll, marking their 97th top-10 entry under head coach Dawn Staley.

South Carolina has appeared in the AP Poll for 137 consecutive weeks, the fourth-longest active streak in the nation. Under Staley, the Gamecocks have appeared in 142 AP polls, including 66 in the top five and 12 at No. 1.

The Gamecocks are No. 6 in this week's USA Today/WBCA Poll.

## **Schedule Strength**

The Gamecocks' schedule includes 12 games against teams ranked in at least one of this week's polls.

Five of the top-25 games are out of conference, including at then-#4/5 Maryland (Nov. 10), vs. then-#17/23 Indiana (Nov. 28) and vs. then-#2/2 Baylor (Nov. 30). Still ahead on the non-conference schedule are #2/2 UConn (Feb. 10) and #-/21 South Dakota (Dec. 22).

Five SEC teams were ranked this week with South Carolina facing two of those – #14/11 Kentucky and #21/20 Arkansas – twice this season. Other league foes ranked this week are #11/13 Texas A&M,#15/14 Mississippi State and #23/24 Tennessee.

## Ranked Readings

South Carolina is 65-61 against nationally ranked opponents under head coach Dawn Staley, although that record is skewed by the early seasons of her tenure. The Gamecocks are 50-22 versus ranked foes since the start of the 2014-15 campaign, including a 20-16 mark against top-10 opponents during that time

This season, South Carolina is 2-1 against ranked teams, including a win over then-#2/2 Baylor to match the highest ranked win in program history.

## **SEC Status**

SEC coaches and media were split on who will win the 2020 SEC regular season, but the agree that the Gamecocks will be in the mix.

SEC media members selected the Gamecocks to return to the throne ahead of Texas A&M and Mississippi State. SEC coaches reversed the top two positions. Both groups tapped Tyasha Harris for First-Team All-SEC and Mikiah Herbert Harrigan for a spot on the All-SEC Second

## Oh Captain, My Captain

South Carolina named two team captains this season – Tyasha Harris and Victaria Saxton. This is Harris' third season as a team captain.

## 5 = 1

The Gamecocks' five freshmen – Laeticia Amihere, Brea Bea, Aliyah Boston, Zia Cooke and Olivia Thompson – make up the No. 1 recruiting class in the nation, which includes four of the top 11 signees in the Class of 2019.

Expectations are high outside the program, and they don't dip much from those who have watched the class' progression through the preseason. Turning heads in the weight room and on the court, all five have come to the program eager to learn and thrive.

## Veteran Vibes

While the No. 1 freshman class is the new, shiny part of the Gamecocks' program, the two seniors at the top of the experience ladder have impressive credentials of their own, including a glut of big-game experience.

Tyasha Harris and Mikiah Herbert Harrigan were part of the Gamecocks' 2017 NCAA National Championship and have led teams that have never been ranked outside the top 25, including all three seasons with a final ranking in the top 16.

The duo was part of two of the Gamecocks' four straight SEC Tournament titles, They opened their careers with an SEC regular-season crown and have never finished lower than second in the league.

In 44 career games against ranked opponents, during which the Gamecocks went 27-17, Harris averaged 9.5 points and 4.4 assists. Herbert Harrigan's 44 career games against ranked opponents has her at 7.4 points and 1.3 blocks per game. Those numbers rise sharply since she became a regular starter in 2018-19 to 11.2 points and 2.0 blocks per game.

In the Gamecocks' two top-five games this season, the two seniors made their presence known when it came time to win

At #4/5 Maryland (Nov. 10), Harris and Herbert Harrigan accounted for the team's final seven points after the Terrapins cut the margin to eight with 2:10 left to play.

Against #2/2 Baylor (Nov. 30), either Harris or Herbert Harrigan had a hand in every fourth-quarter play after the Lady Bears drew within two points. Harris set up the assist to double the Gamecocks' lead to 54-50, then hit a pair of free throws 70 seconds later to again push out a four-point lead. Herbert Harrigan delivered a layup to answer a Baylor three with 5:37 to play. She went on to add an assist and another rebound in the Gamecocks' 13-2 run that closed the game. Overall in the game, Harris had her hands on 47.3 percent of the offense with her 20 points and seven assists leading to another 15 of the Gamecocks' 74 points.

## **Paint Ball**

While the Gamecocks did take a preseason teambonding trip to play traditional paint ball, now that the season has started, they're in more of a basketball mind about that phrase now – and not just the forwards.

South Carolina has scored 41.8 of its 80.6 points per game in the paint, which equates to 51.9 percent of the offense and 68.5 percent of made field goals. At least half the team's points have come from the paint every game this season, including eight games with at least 2/3 of the points coming inside.

The Gamecocks' aggressive guard lineup accounts for 43.1 percent of those paint field goals (18.0 points per game), compared to 56.9 percent of paint field goals from the forwards (23.8 ppg).

## **Block Party**

The Gamecocks have been busy in the paint on the defensive end as well, blocking 8.9 shots per game to lead the nation. Kansas State is a distant second at 6.8.

South Carolina opened the season by tying the school record for blocked shots in a game (16 vs. Alabama State, Nov. 5) then broke that record three games later with 17 against Appalachian State (Nov. 17).

The Gamecocks' top shot blocker, Aliyah Boston, is 11th in the country with 3.1 blocks per game – fifth in total blocks with 31. She has blocked three ore more shots in five of her 10 career games.

Boston is not alone in her swat status, though. Three Gamecocks are among the SEC's top 15 shot blockers, and nine of the 11 active Gamecocks have blocked at least one shot this season.

Senior Mikiah Herbert Harrigan continues her prowess in the category, ranking sixth in the SEC and 33rd in the NCAA with her 2.1 average. Sophomore Victaria Saxton's 0.9 blocks per game are 14th in the conference.

## Free for All

Yet again, South Carolina is among the nation's best at getting to the free throw line, and it is a full team effort.

The Gamecocks are 14th in the country with 214 free throw attempts and 23rd in free throws made (141).

The attempts are distributed relatively evenly across the team with seven Gamecocks averaging at least two per game this season, led by Mikiah Herbert Harrigan's 33 attempts. Her 24 made free throw lead three Gamecocks making at least two per game – Aliyah Boston and Tyasha Harris have 21 makes so far.

## First Things First

The Gamecocks have been locked in from the opening tip this season, out-scoring opponents in the first quarter by and average of 11.9 points. Through 10 games, South Carolina averages 23.6 points on 51.7 percent shooting in the opening 10 minutes – the best numbers of any quarter. The third quarter has been the next most productive with a +8.5 scoring margin.

That said, South Carolina's best two shooting individual quarters this season have both come in the fourth quarter – 66.7 percent (10-of-15) against Alabama State (Nov. 5) and the same percentage (8-of-12) against then-#2/2 Baylor (Nov. 30).

Individually, five Gamecocks have scored in double figures in a single quarter this season, led by Tyasha Harris' 12 in the final period at Temple (Dec. 7) to deliver the victory.

#### Sixth Woman

The high-octane Gamecock offense has been fueled by selflessness. Four games this season have seen six Gamecocks score in double figures. That number already tops the 2014-15 season (3) for the most by South

Carolina in the Dawn Staley era.

At least five Gamecocks have scored in double figures five times this season, topping last season's three games of five double-digit scorers.

## **Hitting 1,000**

Senior point guard Tyasha Harris scored her 1,000th career point in the third quarter against USC Upstate (Nov. 21) in her highest scoring game of the season to date. The Noblesville, Ind., became just the fourth Gamecock all-time to post both 1,000 points and 500 assists in her career. Only two Gamecocks have scored 1,000 points and handed out 600 assists, which is a mark that Harris could reach later this season.

Senior forward Mikiah Herbert Harrigan also has a chance to reach the classic basketball benchmark. She is currently at 898 career points. Only five Gamecocks have ever posted at least 1,000 points and 100 blocks in their careers.

## Freshman Phenoms

Three of South Carolina's freshmen have hit notable marks early in the season, living up to their billing as part of the best signing class in recent college women's basketball history.

The headline of the trio's early-season exploits is Aliyah Boston's season-opening triple-double – the first in a college debut in NCAA Div. I women's basketball history. It was just the seventh triple-double in Gamecock history and the first by a freshman.

Two games later, Brea Beal and Zia Cooke joined Boston with elite Gamecock freshman outings.

Cooke poured in 27 points at Dayton (Nov. 13), the most by a Gamecock freshman since Kelsey Bone scored 27 against North Carolina on Dec. 20, 2009. It was the first 20-point freshman outing since Bianca Jackson netted 20 against UConn on Feb. 1, 2018. Cooke's scoring included five 3-pointers, the most by a Gamecock freshman since Tina Roy hit five against Presbyterian on Nov. 27, 2011.

## Woman Up!

South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley picked "Woman Up!" as this season's theme to recognize how inspired her team is to work hard toward its goals and how they inspire her, each other and the community at large to pursue something greater.

The theme reminds the team to compete relentlessly, stay disciplined to it goals and lift each other up as they pursue their dreams.

As always, Staley invites fans of the program to do the same in their lives and in their support of the team – commit to your goals, support others and dream big.

To launch the theme, each Gamecock told her Woman Up! story for a video series. Visit GamecocksOnline.com/WomanUp to watch all 13 short videos in the series.

Beal followed up her 10-rebound performance at #4/5 Maryland (Nov. 10) with another 10 rebounds at Dayton (Nov. 13), becoming the first Gamecock freshman with back-to-back double-digit rebounding games since A'ja Wilson pulled down 10 against Liberty (Dec. 21, 2014), 10 against Auburn (Jan. 2, 2015) and 13 at LSU (Jan. 4, 2015).

## Milestone March

Seniors Tyasha Harris and Mikiah Herbert Harrigan are moving quickly up several career charts in their final season with the Garnet and Black.

Harris is third in the program's all-time career assists chart with 564 so far. She is 31 behind Mindy Ballou's 595 in second place. The program record of 615 is held by Cristina Ciocan (2001-04).

As a regular starter each of the last three seasons, Harris could make the top-10 of four other lists – steals, minutes played, games played and games started – by the end of the season.

## We Jammin'

The Gamecocks joined seven other teams in St. Thomas, U.S.V.I., in one of the most stacked Thanksgiving tournaments this season and came out as the Reef Division champs.

South Carolina went 2-1 at the event, highlighted by a smothering defensive effort that held then-#2/2 Baylor to its lowest scoring mark since the end of the 2015-16 season and secured a 15-point victory.

Freshman Aliyah Boston, playing in her hometown, was named MVP of the division, averaging 15.0 points and 7.7 rebounds in just 22.3 minutes per game at the event. Senior Mikiah Herbert Harrigan, another island product (Anguilla), made the All-Tournament team after leading the Gamecocks with 15.3 points per game and averaging 6.7 rebounds. Senior Tyasha Harris joined the duo in averaging double-figure points at the tournament with her 10.7 that went with 5.0 assists per game.

## **Historic Boston**

Freshman forward Aliyah Boston opened her college career with a bang, recording an historic triple-double against Alabama State (Nov. 5).

It marked the first triple-double in a college debut in NCAA Div. I women's basketball history. Prior to Boston's mark, the last NCAA Div. I freshman to post a triple-double was Nebraska's Kate Cain against Florida Atlantic on Dec. 19, 2017.

It was just the seventh triple-double in South Carolina history, and the first by a freshman. That last Gamecock triple-double was by then-junior Alaina Coates, who posted 29 points, 16 rebounds and 10 blocks against Winthrop on Dec. 13, 2015.

Boston's 10 blocks tied Coates' school record.

#### U-S-A, U-S-A

Since the arrival of Staley in the 2008-09 season, South Carolina has solidified its relationship with USA Basketball. At least one Gamecock has donned the red, white and blue in each of the last six summers, and the group of nine Gamecocks, including four on the current roster, has helped 13 U.S. teams to gold medals, three more to silver and another to bronze.

The participation streak is guaranteed to continue

through 2020 as Staley was named Senior National Team Head Coach through the Tokyo Olympics. The Gamecocks' head coach led the U.S. to gold in the 2018 FIBA World Cup and earned her second USA Basketball National Coach of the Year award for the effort.

Junior Tyasha Harris is responsible for one of those gold medals (2016 FIBA U18 Americas Cup) as well as two silvers (2019 Pan Am Games, 2017 FIBA U19 World Cup). The point guard also trained with Staley's National Team when it was in Columbia for training camp prior to the 2018 FIBA World Cup.

Aliyah Boston and Zia Cooke were part of two gold-medal winning teams – 2018 FIBA U17 World Cup, 2017 FIBA U16 Americas Cup. Boston also picked up gold in the 2018 Youth Olympics 3x3 and the 2019 FIBA U19 World Cup.

## **Great Gamecock Fans**

After winning the title for the last five seasons, South Carolina continues to lead the nation in average attendance this season with 10,379 and is the only program drawing 10,000+ fans per game.

This season's three home games are among the eight in NCAA Div. I this season that have had at least 10,000 in attendance. The Gamecocks have drawn at least 10,000

fans in 70 straight regular-season home games.

South Carolina's last regular-season game with fewer than 10,000 in attendance was on Dec. 14, 2014, when 9,605 were on-hand to see the Gamecocks defeat Savannah State. The last game at Colonial Life Arena with an attendance below 10,000 was in the 2017 NCAA Tournament when the Gamecocks' second-round game against Arizona State drew 8,276, making the overall streak of 10,000 or more fans 35 games.

## One More Ty-me

Senior Tyasha Harris has been among the top point guards in the nation over the last few seasons as her assist average and assist-to-turnover numbers have been routinely among the best in the country. She entered her senior season on the watch list of all four national player of the year awards as well as the Nancy Lieberman Award Watch List, which recognizes the top point guard in the country.

This season, the 5-foot-10 guard leads the SEC with 5.1 assists per game and is scoring a career-best 12.2 points per outing, hitting double figures in seven games so far. For the second straight season, Harris has her hands on at least 25.0 percent of the Gamecocks' offense between her assists and points as her assists have

led to 11.7 points per game. Combined with her scoring average, she touches 23.9 of the Gamecocks' 80.6 points per game (29.7 percent).

Since the start of her sophomore season (her first in the full-time starting lineup), Harris has handed out 5.7 assists per game with a 2.6 assist-to-turnover ratio. In that time, she has also averaged 10.8 points per game.

Harris is far and away the SEC's active leader in career assists (564) and is fourth in the nation among active players across all divisions in that category (third in Div. I). She is also the SEC's active career steals leader (191) and is fifth in scoring (1066).

## H2-O (And D)

Senior forward Mikiah Herbert Harrigan has long been a shot-blocking menace to opponents, and she unleashed a lethal offensive game last season continues to grow in her final college season.

Herbert Harrigan is the Gamecocks' leading scorer with her career-best 13.9 points per game coming in 13th in the SEC. She is shooting 51.4 percent from the field to go with a career-best 6.3 rebound per game. In three games against ranked opponents, the lithe 6-foot-2 forward has grabbed a team-best 7.7 rebounds per game.

Defensively, Herbert Harrigan hasn't lost a step, blocking 2.1 shots per game to rank sixth in the SEC and 33rd in the nation.

Fourth in program history in career blocked shots (173), she is second among active SEC players in that category as well.

## **Henny-thing Goes**

Sophomore guard Destanni Henderson is a dynamic athlete whose versatile offensive game makes her a weapon at any spot on the floor. The SEC All-Freshman Team selection has seen her minutes explode to 25.1 per game (from 15.6 last season).

With four games of double-figure points and six games of three or more assists, Henderson continues to develop her command of the team from the point guard spot, She averages 2.6 assists with 2.0 steals and 8.9 points per game and is the team's most accurate outside shooter, hitting 44.1 percent (15-of-34) from 3-point range.

## LA Style

Redshirt-freshman forward Laeticia Amihere was the No. 10 recruit in the 2019 class and is rediscovering her feel for the game after injury plagued her final two seasons of high school. Her length and agility will prove to be a problem for opponents whenever she is on the court, especially as she reclaims the bounce that led her to become the first Canadian woman to dunk in a game.

Amihere posted her first double-figure scoring game

with 10 against USC Upstate (Nov. 21), shooting 4-of-7 from the field, including a 3-pointer. She gave Temple (Dec. 7) fits with her activity around the basket, grabbing three offensive rebounds and drawing fouls to hit 3-of-4 from the free throw line.

The 6-foot-3 forward is part of the Canadian National Team as well. She missed the Appalachian State (Nov. 17) game with the Gamecocks to be with her national team, which was playing in the FIBA Women's Olympic Pre-Qualifying Americas Tournament in Edmonton (Nov. 14-17).

#### Life's a Brea-ze

Freshman guard Brea Beal was the No. 11 player in the 2019 class, and her upside is even higher than that. Already drawing comparisons to former Gamecock and 2017 WNBA Rookie of the Year Allisha Gray, Beal has the ability to play and create mismatches at positions 1-4 on the court.

Beal drew the comparisons because of her competitiveness and focus on contributing beyond scoring as she struggled shooting early in the season. Her back-to-back 10-rebound outings at #4/5 Maryland and Dayton were the first by a freshman since A'ja Wilson (2014-15). She is third on the team in rebounding (6.1 per game) and fourth in assists (1.9 per game).

In the meantime, Beal's shooting has lined up over the last five games, hitting 50.0 percent (15-of-30) from the field to average 7.8 points during the stretch after netting just 5.8 points per game prior to it.

## From A to B

The No. 3 player in the 2019 class, freshman forward Aliyah Boston brings a dominant physical presence back to the Gamecock frontcourt. The 6-foot-5 Virgin Islands native thrives on contact and has been a handful for opposing frontlines right away.

Boston wasted little time serving notice to the SEC and the country with her opening-week performances that yielded 13.0 points, 9.5 rebounds and 7.5 blocks per game. The effort landed her SEC Freshman of the Week honors on Nov. 12. She has since earned the award two other times and picked up USBWA National Freshman of the Week honors following her Paradise Jam Reef Division MVP performance.

Boston is among the SEC's top 15 in six categories – 15th in scoring (13.7 ppg), 11th in rebounding (7.6), third in field goal percentage (.714), first in blocked shots per game (3.1), second in double-doubles (4) and fourth in offensive rebounds (3.7).

Boston's blocked shots total (31) is fifth in the country, and her blocked shots average is 11th. Her 71.4 percent field goal shooting is 11th in the country.

In the season opener, Boston delivered the first triple-double in a college debut in NCAA Div. I women's basketball history. The 12-point, 12-rebound, 10-block effort came in just 21 minutes on the court for the seventh triple-double in Gamecock history and the first by a freshman.

In the biggest games of her career, Boston has remained undaunted. In three games against ranked opponents, she is the team's top scorer (14.7 ppg) and second in rebounding (7.3) rpg), shooting 71.4 percent from the field. Against then #2/2 Baylor (Nov. 30), she scored 10 of her 20 points in the fourth quarter as the Gamecocks pulled away for the 15-point victory.

## Cooke Charisma

Freshman guard Zia Cooke was the No. 4 entry in the 2019 class and spent her final high school season putting together highlight reels that made her a finalist for Naismith High School Player of the Year and wowed fans on social media. Under Staley, she is dialing in her point guard leadership, meshing it with her scorer's mentality and overall becoming a threat on both sides of the ball.

Her offensive game is as dynamic and athletic as advertised, and she averages 9.6 points and has shot 36.7 percent (11-of-30) from 3-point range. She has scored in double figures in five times this season, headlined by 27 points in a return to her homestate at Dayton (Nov. 13). It was the most points by a Gamecock freshman since Kelsey Bone's 27 against North Carolina on Dec. 9, 2009. The effort was fueled by five 3s, the most by a Gamecock freshman since Tina Roy hit five against Presbyterian on Nov. 27, 2011.

Since that scoring explosion, Cooke's assists have dominated her statline, handing out 2.7 per game over the last six outings.



In women's basketball, Colonial Life Arena has become one of the most feared places to play as enormous crowds fill the building with passion for the Gamecocks.

The state of South Carolina has rallied around head coach Dawn Staley's program in unprecedented numbers as the Gamecocks have led the nation in average attendance in each of the last five seasons. The Gamecocks were one of a few programs to finish the season averaging over 10,000 fans and boast four sellouts (18,000) in the last four seasons.

Colonial Life Arena is more than just the home of South Carolina men's and women's basketball, though. It is also a thriving entertainment venue that the city of Columbia and its surrounding metropolitan area are able to enjoy throughout the year.

Colonial Life Arena is the largest arena in the state of South Carolina with 18,000 seats, and the 10th-largest on-campus basketball facility in the nation. Located on the beautiful University of South Carolina campus, this one-of-a-kind facility features 41 suites, four entertainment suites, and the Frank McGuire Club, a full-service hospitality room that has a capacity of 300. The state-of-the-art facility also features plush seating, a technologically advanced sound system and a one-of-a-kind selection of unique concession foods that will delight fans of all ages.

In Summer 2017, a 12-display centerhung video board and ribbon boards were added to the arena bowl at a cost of \$4.2 million. The centerhung board features four convex-curved main displays that measure approximately 12' x 20' and can show any combination of live video, instant replays, statistics and game information, graphics and animations, and sponsorship messages.

The Arena has hosted numerous sold out shows, including Barnum and Bailey Circus, Paul McCartney, country superstars Kenny Chesney and Taylor Swift, WWE Wrestling, Kanye West and numerous other acts.

The largest building ever constructed at the University of South Carolina at 342,000 square feet, the Arena has an intimate double-deck design that puts every seat close to the action. The cantilever of the upper deck over the lower deck extends further than any other arena of its size with great sight lines.

Two spacious locker rooms for Gamecock men's and women's basketball include team meeting rooms, recruiting rooms, coaches locker rooms and an athletic training room.

# Head Coach 12th Season at South Carolina Virginia, 1992



Catapulting South Carolina into the national spotlight, Dawn Staley has made the Gamecocks a mainstay in the battle for SEC and national championships. In 2017-18, she capped her first decade in Garnet and Black by leading her team to its fourth-straight SEC Tournament title, the first four-peat champion in league history, and celebrating the program's first National Player of the Year and No. 1 WNBA Draft pick in A'ja Wilson. The Gamecocks went on to sign the first No. 1 recruiting class in program history, landing four of the nation's top 11 prospects in the Class of 2019.

Staley's first 11 seasons at the helm of the Gamecocks include:

While her coaching career is in full bloom, Staley is still recognized for her body of work as a one of the most decorated participants in United States women's basketball history. The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame solidified that legacy with her enshrinement as part of the Class of 2013. The Phoenix Club of Philadelphia established the Dawn Staley Award recognizing the nation's top guard in women's Division I basketball in 2013 as well. Staley was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2012 and was one of the final nominees for induction to the U.S. Olympic Hall of Fame the same year. In the summer of 2011, the WNBA recognized her as one of the league's "Top 15," honoring the most influential players in the league's history.

At the helm of the Gamecocks over the last 11 seasons, Staley has been named National Coach of the Year (2014, Basketball Times), a Naismith National Coach of the Year Finalist (2014, 2015, 2016), SEC Coach of the Year (2014, Coaches and AP; 2015, Coaches; 2016, Coaches and AP) and BCA Female Coach of the Year (2012). She became the fastest coach to 200 wins in program history, needing just 277 games at South Carolina to reach the plateau.

Under Staley's leadership, five Gamecocks have collected 10 All-America selections, two have picked up five SEC Player of the Year honors, two have earned SEC Defensive Player of the Year recognition a total of three times, one has been the SEC 6th Player of the Year and five were named SEC Freshman of the Year. She has coached 15 Gamecocks to All-SEC honors a combined 29 times, including 12 first-team selections, and six Gamecocks have been selected in the WNBA Draft, including 2018 No. 1 pick A'ja Wilson who went on to earn WNBA Rookie of the Year honors a year after Allisha Gray became the first Gamecock to capture the honor in 2017. Two other Gamecocks have also earned WNBA All-Rookie honors.

On Staley's watch, the Gamecocks are enjoying the most sustained success in program history. After posting back-to-back 25-win seasons in 2011-12 and 2012-13 for the first time in more than 30 years, the 2014-15 team broke the school record with 34 wins. South Carolina won more SEC games than the season before in each of her first seven seasons, culminating in the 2015-16 team recording just the second 16-0 conference record in league history. Staley's 122 SEC wins account for 65.6 percent of the program's total 186 wins over its 27 seasons in the league. She has delivered the only SEC championships in program history, and she has helped the Gamecocks to eight of the program's nine top-four finishes in the SEC.
