


The Gamecocks

2019 SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll

Walk-on who adds quality depth to the wide receiver corps... gained valuable experience late in the 2019 campaign when injuries mounted to the receiving corps... has three career receptions for 58 yards in four contests.

Redshirt freshman who saw action in four games, including each of the last three contests... caught three passes for 58 yards... made his collegiate debut in the win over Charleston Southern... had two receptions for 33 yards against Appalachian State, including a 29-yard catch... also had a 25-yard reception at Texas A&M... named to the SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll.


HIGH SCHOOL




Wide receiver prospect who begins his first season with the Gamecocks... long athlete who can run and jump... will have an opportunity to work his way into the rotation as a true freshman.

Redshirt sophomore safety who had hip surgery in June after a bone growth on the top of his femur protruded into the labrum... missed the entire 2019 campaign.

<u>2018</u>

Redshirt freshman who appeared in 10 games making 13 tackles... used primarily on special teams early in the season as he was continuing to work his way back from shoulder surgery... forced into a more significant role at safety in the Ole Miss game... played most of the second half and recorded a thencareer-high four tackles... was a key contributor in the Florida game, tallying six tackles before leaving with a hamstring injury... missed the final three regular season games due to the injury, but returned to action in the Belk Bowl... did not participate in spring drills after undergoing shoulder surgery in August of 2017.
