ABOUT THIS WEEKEND'S GAMES

- The Gamecocks have just a single game of history against the tournament field. South Carolina topped then-No. 25/21 South Dakota 73-60 on Dec. 22, 2019, at Colonial Life Arena.
- South Carolina has played in Sioux Falls once before this weekend, an upset 80-72 loss to then-No. 14 Syracuse in the 2016 NCAA Sweet 16 (Mar. 25, 2016).
- South Carolina has played in 11 regular-season tournament during head coach Dawn Staley's first 12 seasons at the helm. The Gamecocks enter this weekend with a 23-7 record in those tournaments, including a 2-1 record that delivered the Reef Division title in the 2019 Paradise Jam.

GAMECOCK NOTABLES

- After finishing last season with a school-record 82.0 scoring average, the Gamecocks opened this season with the second-most points in program history. South Carolina's 119 points against College of Charleston (Nov. 25) were the most since scoring 124 against Notre Dame on Jan. 31, 1981.
- South Carolina continues to dominate the paint on both ends of the floor, out-scoring College of Charleston (Nov. 25) 74-18 in that space. Like last season, as much of that offense comes from the guards as the forwards. In the season opener, the Gamecock guards out-scored the forwards in the paint 44-30.
- After posting 10 games of double-digit blocked shots last season, including six against SEC foes, South Carolina opened this season with 13 against College of Charleston. Seven different Gamecocks got in on the action, led by Victoria Saxton's five, which tied her career high.
- Sophomore Aliyah Boston opened her second season with a double-double she needed just 22 minutes to achieve. The Gamecocks' first ever National Freshman of the Year, is a unanimous AP Preseason All-America selection this season and is on the watch lists for the Naismith and Wade Trophies and the Lisa Leslie Award.
- Last season's two super-subs – juniors Victoria Saxton and Destanni Henderson – moved into opening day starting roles this season, and delivered on their expectations. Saxton led the team with 19 points and 12 rebounds for her second career double-double, while Henderson found great balance in her starting point guard role with 11 points, five assists and four steals in just 19 minutes on the court.
- Among the most dynamic guards in the country, sophomore Zia Cooke opened the season with solid shooting and a good all-around game against College of Charleston. The Naismith and Wade Trophy watch list selection opened with 18 points on 6-of-11 shooting, including 2-of-3 from 3-point range, and three assists and three steals in just 20 minutes.
- Sophomore Laeticia Amihere was another Gamecock fans were anxious to see this season, and she lived up to the preseason hype. Shedding the knee brace that limited her aggression and mobility, Amihere posted her first career double-double with 11 points and 11 rebounds against College of Charleston.
- Senior LeLe Grissett, who has proven she can score and rebound from her guard position, and Staley would like to see her add point guard duties off the bench this season. In the opener, Grissett looked solid, adding three assists and two blocks to her 13-point, 10-rebound double-double.

Five-Second Count

South Carolina women's basketball is in the midst of its most successful era, claiming at least 20 wins for the last nine seasons, including four 30-win seasons in the last six campaigns. The Gamecocks have played in the NCAA Elite Eight three times in the last five NCAA Tournaments, including winning the 2017 National Championship, and have been ranked in the AP Top 25 for 151 consecutive weeks. Staley led the Gamecocks to their on No. 1 rankings in program history (12 weeks in 2014-15, 10 weeks in 2019-20, 1 week in 2020-21), five SEC regular-season titles and five SEC Tournament championships.

Under Staley's leadership, six Gamecocks have earned All-America status, two have earned SEC Player of the Year honors and 19 have picked up All-SEC recognition at least once. Eight Gamecocks have been selected in the WNBA Draft in the last five years, including 2018 No. 1 overall pick A'ja Wilson, who went on to become the Gamecocks' second-straight WNBA Rookie of the Year (2018) and the program's first WNBA MVP (2020).

South Dakota Series Notes

South Carolina won the only previous meeting between the two teams in a 73-60 decision on Dec. 22, 2019, at Colonial Life Arena. The then-No. 5/6 Gamecocks took a 25-13 lead after the first quarter, allowing the then-No. 25/21 Coyotes to shoot just 5-of-7 (.294) compared to Carolina's 9-of-16 (.563) accuracy, which included 3-of-5 shooting from 3-point range.

Senior LeLe Grissett led the offense with 17 points and grabbed five of her six rebounds on the offensive end.

Neutral Stance

The Gamecocks are 135-93 (.592) all-time on a neutral court, including a 72-48 mark in regular-season contests. South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley is 52-25 in games played at neutral sites, including a 21-10 slate in the regular season and a 31-14 mark in postseason action.

Ranking Review

The Gamecocks open the season at the top of both the AP Preseason Top 25 and USA Today Preseason Coaches' Poll for the first time in program history.

South Carolina has been ranked No. 1 in the last 11 AP Polls released, and their 23 weeks at No. 1 since the start of the 2013-14 season are third-most in the stretch.

Ranked in the AP Top 25 for the last 151 consecutive weeks, South Carolina has the fourth-longest active streak in the nation.

Schedule Strength

The Gamecocks' 24-game schedule includes nine games against teams ranked in both the AP Top 25 and USA Today Coaches' Poll in the preseason.

Four of those opponents are non-conference foes – No. 21 Gonzaga (Nov. 30), No. 9 NC State (Dec. 3), No. 15 Iowa State (Dec. 6) and No. 3 UConn (Feb. 8).

Four SEC teams are ranked in the preseason – No. 11 Kentucky (Jan. 10, Feb. 21), No. 14 Arkansas (Jan. 18), No. 6 Mississippi State (Jan. 28) and No. 13 Texas A&M (Feb. 28).

Staley's Stand

In her 21st season as a head coach, Dawn Staley has a .729 (478-178) winning percentage, which ranks 13th in the nation among active head coaches with at least 10 seasons of experience. The unanimous 2020 National Coach of the Year, she became the first person to win both a Naismith Player of the Year Trophy and a Naismith Coach of the Year Trophy.

Leading the Gamecocks for the 13th season, Staley is the program's all-time winningest coach (306) with a program-record nine postseason appearances (8 NCAA/1 WNIT). She accounts for both of the Gamecocks' Final Four appearances (2015, 2017) and the first national championship in program history.

After winning five SEC regular-season titles, Staley has won 138 SEC games to rank second among active league coaches (Gary Blair, Texas A&M, 141) and sixth all-time. Her 11.5 SEC wins average is the best all-time among coaches with at least 10 seasons in the league, and her .726 SEC winning percentage (138-52) is second only to Tennessee's Pat Summitt (.874) in league history.

Preseason Props

A trio of Gamecocks have collected preseason honors from league and national affiliations.

Sophomore Aliyah Boston leads the way as an AP Preseason All-American, Naismith and Wade Trophy Watch Lists member, All-SEC First-Team selection by both

the coaches and media and recognition on the Lisa Leslie Award watch list.

Sophomore Zia Cooke has received similar national recognition, earning spots on the watch lists for the Naismith and Wade Trophies and the Ann Meyers Drysdale Award. She was an All-SEC Preseason Second-Team selection by the league's coaches.

Sophomore Brea Beal broke through on the national scene as a member of the Cheryl Miller Small Forward of the Year Award watch list.

Oh Captain, My Captain

South Carolina named two team captains this season – Aliyah Boston and Victoria Saxton. It is the second season that Saxton has been a team captain.

Depth Squad

The power of the 2019-20 Gamecock team was its depth and the diversity of ways it could win games. It appears the 2020-21 squad shares that trait.

All nine returning Gamecocks this season scored in double figures at least once last season, including four who hit the mark at least four times.

Six returners played in every game in 2019-20, including three who started every game, and each averaged at least 5.4 points. Laetitia Amihere played in every game for which she was available as she missed four games while helping Team Canada qualify for the Tokyo Olympics.

This season, a school-record seven Gamecocks scored in double figures, including a school-record four who posted a double-double, against College of Charleston (Nov. 25). All 11 Gamecocks on the roster played with none on the court for more than 23 minutes.

Sixth Woman

In 2019-20, South Carolina set a program record with seven games of six double-digit scorers. Prior to that

season, there had only been six games total of six double-digit scorers in program history.

This season, the unselfish Gamecocks picked up right where they left off. In the season opener against College of Charleston (Nov. 25), a program-record seven Gamecocks finished in double-figure points.

Five or more Gamecocks scored in double figures 17 times last season, which nearly tripled the previous program record of six set by the 2017-18 and 2016-17 teams.

U-S-A, U-S-A

Since the arrival of Staley in the 2008-09 season, South Carolina has solidified its relationship with USA Basketball. At least one Gamecock has donned the red, white and blue in each of the last six years of international competition (no events in 2020), and the group of nine Gamecocks, including three currently in the program, has helped 14 U.S. teams to gold medals, three more to silvers and another to bronze.

The participation streak is guaranteed to continue through 2021 as Staley was named Senior National Team Head Coach through the delayed Tokyo Olympics. The Gamecocks' head coach has led the U.S. to gold in the 2018 FIBA World Cup, earning her second USA Basketball

Great Gamecock Fans

South Carolina has led the nation in attendance for the last six seasons, averaging at least 11,000 fans in each of those campaigns.

While the 2020-21 season will see far fewer fans in the stands around the nation due to restrictions in place to mitigate the COVID-19 pandemic, the Gamecocks still expect to be among the nation's leaders in attendance based on the fact that Colonial Life Arena is among the largest arenas in women's college basketball.

The Gamecocks signed the No. 1 recruiting class in the country in November as Staley and her staff added four signees from the Class of 2021. All four are ranked among the top 14 players in the class, including the Nos. 2, 3 and 4 entries.
