The spring of 2021 begins a new chapter of South Carolina Football, as new head coach **Shane Beamer** takes the controls of the Gamecock fortunes.

Beamer a former Gamecock assistant coach during Steve Spurrier's regime, knows the challenges that await him, but the first-year head coach is process-driven and knows what this program can look like when it's hitting on all cylinders, as it was when he was last here. A meticulous note taker who has been fortunate to learn from several outstanding coaches and be around some great programs, Coach Beamer will take bits and pieces from each stop in putting his own stamp on the Gamecock program.

Coach Beamer has surrounded himself with a young and energetic staff that has brought a positive vibe back into the program. He was very meticulous in putting together his coaching staff, and believes he has a group that will work well together with a healthy combination of youth and experience. The 101 players on the Carolina spring roster have spent the last couple of months working in the weight room with new strength & conditioning coach **Luke Day** and his staff and are anxious to return to the practice fields. All 101 players come in with a clean slate, anxious to make a favorable first impression with their new mentors. Coach Beamer and his staff have 15 spring practices to evaluate the returning talent, seven scholarship transfer players and five newcomers from the 2021 recruiting class, install new schemes and vernacular and infuse the philosophies and principles that will define Gamecock Football for the foreseeable future.

The on-field coaches, save one, are new to being on the staff at South Carolina. The only holdover from Will Muschamp's staff is outside linebackers/defensive ends coach **Mike Peterson**. Peterson will work closely with defensive coordinator **Clayton White**, who also will coach the inside linebackers. **Jimmy Lindsey** takes over the defensive line, while **Torrian Gray** is the new defensive backs coach.

The offensive side of the ball will be directed by offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach **Marcus Satterfield**. He will be assisted by veteran offensive line coach **Greg Adkins**, running backs coach **Montario Hardesty**, wide receivers coach **Justin Stepp** and tight ends coach **Erik Kimrey**, a former Gamecock quarterback.

Pete Lembo has joined the staff as the associate head coach and is the special teams coordinator.

The new staff will have 51 returning letterwinners to work with during the spring including 24 on offense, 23 on defense and four specialists. That list includes 14 returning starters, seven on offense, five on defense and two specialists.

They key offensive returnees from last year's 2-8 squad include four starters on the offensive line - **Eric Douglas**, **Jovaughn Gwyn**, **Jakai Moore** and **Dylan Wonnum**; 1,000-yard rusher **Kevin Harris** and tight end **Nick Muse**, the top returning receiver.

A trio of players - wide receivers **Randrecous Davis** and **OrTre Smith**, along with running back **MarShawn Lloyd** - missed all of the 2020 season, but return this year and, if healthy, could play an integral role in the offense.

Key returnees on defense include All-SEC defensive end **Kingsley Enagbare** and tackles **Jabari Ellis** and **Zach Pickens**. The defense will get a lift from the return of linebackers **Sherrod Greene** and **Rosendo Louis Jr.**, both of whom missed nearly the entire 2020 season due to injury.

In addition, Coach Beamer and his staff hit the transfer portal hard and brought in seven scholarship players who are expected to provide an immediate infusion of talent to the roster. The seven include wide receiver **Ahmarean Brown** (Georgia Tech), quarterback **Jason Brown** (St. Francis, Pa.), defensive tackle **Keem Green** (Nebraska), wide receiver **E.J. Jenkins** (St. Francis, Pa.), defensive back **David Spaulding** (Georgia Southern), EDGE **Jordan Strachan** (Georgia State) and linebacker **Debo Williams** (Delaware).

Key losses from last year's squad include five players who were invited to the NFL Combine - senior offensive lineman **Sadarius Hutcherson**, senior wide receiver **Shi Smith**, junior linebacker **Ernest Jones** and junior defensive backs **Jaycee Horn** and **Israel Mukuamu**.

Strengths of the team should be found at running back and along the offensive line, as well as an improved defensive line and in the kicking game with the return of both the punter and placekicker. The coaches will use the spring to identify playmakers at the wide receiver position and reconstruct a secondary that will feature a lot of new faces.

As is the case every year, the goal for the Gamecocks is Atlanta and a spot in the SEC Championship game. And, as is the case every year, the road that winds through the SEC gauntlet is challenging, to say the least.

The Gamecocks four home conference games include visits from Kentucky, Vanderbilt, Florida and Auburn, while Carolina will travel to SEC foes Georgia, Tennessee, Texas A&M and Missouri. The non-conference slate includes home games against FCS-level Eastern Illinois, Troy and a renewal of the annual Palmetto Bowl with Clemson. In addition, the Gamecocks will travel to Greenville, N.C. for a September 11 date with the East Carolina Pirates.

New offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach **Marcus Satterfield** will be implementing a new offense this spring and will be challenged to get more production from a unit that averaged just 23.5 points per game a season ago. Maybe the most important

position battle in the spring is at quarterback where **Luke Doty** returns after gaining valuable experience as a true freshman last year. He will be challenged by transfer **Jason Brown** and true freshman **Colten Gauthier**. Whichever quarterback wins the job, he knows he has the luxury of being able to hand the ball off to a 1,000-yard rusher in **Kevin Harris**. But Harris is not the lone talented rusher in the backfield in what may be the deepest position on the squad, one that includes **MarShawn Lloyd**, **ZaQuandre White** and **Rashad Amos**. It will be interesting to watch how the wide receiver corps develops with a blend of veterans, transfers and youngsters all vying for playing time. Many eyes will be focused on transfers **Ahmarean Brown**, who immediately becomes the top deep threat, and 6-7 **E.J. Jenkins**. **Nick Muse** took advantage of the NCAA rule to return for an extra year of eligibility and figures to be the top tight end. A quartet of sophomores will push each other for playing time. The offensive line should be a strength, as it is deep, talented and experienced. The four returning starters are **Dylan Wonnum** (24 career starts), **Jovaughn Gwyn** (21), **Eric Douglas** (11) and **Jakai Moore** (8) while **Jordan Rhodes** (10), **Jaylen Nichols** (4), **Jazston Turnetine** (3), **Hank Manos** (2) and **Vershon Lee** (1) have all been starters during their Gamecock career as well.

Defensive coordinator/inside

linebackers coach **Clayton White**

will be challenged to get his unit back on track this year after the Gamecocks surrendered an average of 36.0 points per game a season ago in a season that was

plagued by injuries, opt-outs and positive COVID-19 tests. In fact, Carolina had nine defensive starters in the season opener against Tennessee who were not in the starting lineup in the regular season finale at Kentucky, and the two that were, safety **Shilo Sanders** and nickel **Jammie Robinson**, have both transferred out. The strength of the unit should be up front where **Jabari Ellis**, **Rick Sandidge** and **Zach Pickens** stack up in the middle, and off the edge where All-SEC performer **Kingsley Enagbare**, **Aaron Sterling**, **Jordan Burch** and **Tonka Hemingway** have all shined at times, along with the nation's leader in sacks in **Jordan Strachan**, a transfer from Georgia State. The linebacking corps will get a boost with the return of **Sherrod Greene** and **Rosendo Louis Jr.**, both of whom were sidelined with injuries in 2020, along with returning starter **Damani Staley**, 2020 team captain **Brad Johnson** and Freshman All-SEC performer **Mohamed Kaba**. The secondary will need to be rebuilt for the most part, with **Jaylin Dickerson**, **R.J. Roderick** and **Cam Smith** the most likely candidates to secure regular playing time, but opportunities abound for others to step up and earn a key role.

The Gamecock kicking game should be a strength for new special teams coordinator **Pete Lembo**. **Parker White** returns for his fifth season as the starting placekicker. He struggled a bit down the stretch last season, but has been nearly automatic from within 40 yards throughout

his Gamecock career and has a chance to break Elliott Fry's school record for points scored in a career. Punter **Kai Kroeger** is back for his second season after earning SEC All-Freshman team honors a year ago. The left-footed kicker looks to improve on his 43.3-yard average from 2020. Second-year player **Mitch Jeter** has a big leg and handled the kickoff duties for much of the 2020 season, but needs to gain consistency in that role. **Matthew Bailey** returns for his second season as the squad's long snapper. Several candidates could be in line for both the kickoff return and punt return duties again this year.

The Saturday, April 17, scrimmage, along with the spring game on April 24 will take place in Williams-Brice Stadium. SNEAK PEEK: Regularly-credentialed members of the media will have an opportunity to watch the team stretch along with the first three periods of practice on Saturday, March 20, Thursday, April 1, Thursday, April 15, and Saturday, April 17. The stretch period is set to begin at 9:25 am on the 20th, 1st, and 15th, and at 8:40 am on April 17. No live streaming will be allowed. Media will be asked to stay on the south end of the practice fields, near the indoor facility. All media members must wear a mask and stay socially distanced. COMBINE INVITES: Five Gamecocks were invited to the 2021 NFL Combine. Those players include junior defensive backs **Jaycee Horn** and **Israel Mu-kuamu**, senior offensive lineman **Sadarius Hutcherson**, junior linebacker **Ernest Jones** and senior wide receiver **Shi Smith**.

CAROLINA CALLS: Todd Ellis will host "Carolina Calls with Shane Beamer" on Wednesday, April 21. The hour-long show airs live from Home Team BBQ in Five Points on the flagship station of the Gamecocks, WNKT-FM (107.5) and over the internet at GamecocksOnline.com, beginning at 7 pm.

THE HISTORY: 2021 will mark the 128th season of intercollegiate football at the University of South Carolina, dating back to 1892. It is the 115th-consecutive year in which South Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina owns an all-time record of 614-595-44, a .508 winning percentage.

IT JUST MEANS MORE: The 2021 season will mark South Carolina's 30th year in the Southeastern Conference. South Carolina and Arkansas joined the league prior to the 1992 campaign. The Gamecocks earned the SEC Eastern Division title in the 2010 season. The Gamecocks are 99-134-1 (.425) all-time in SEC regular-season play, but posted a 42-38 (.525) record in conference action from 2010-19.

2020 IN REVIEW: South Carolina concluded its 127th season of intercollegiate football in 2020 with a record of 2-8, in a scheduled that included only SEC contests, due to COVID-19. The highlight of the season was a 30-22 win over No.15/14 Auburn on Oct. 17. Three of the Gamecocks' eight losses were to teams that finished the season in the top-15 in the A.P.'s final poll, including No. 4 Texas A&M, No. 7 Georgia and No. 13 Florida.

CHANGE AT THE TOP: On Nov. 15, 2020, Athletics Director Ray Tanner informed **Will Muschamp** that he was being relieved of his head coaching duties. Offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach

Mike Bobo was named the interim head coach for the remainder of the season. Muschamp compiled a 28-30 mark in five seasons at Carolina and an overall mark of 56-51 in nine seasons as a head coach. Bobo went 0-3 as the interim head coach.

2021 AND BEYOND: On Dec. 6, 2020, Athletics Director announced the hiring of **Shane Beamer** as the 36th head football coach in Carolina history. Beamer, who served on Steve Spurrier's staff in Columbia from 2007-10, most recently was the assistant head coach for offense, tight ends and H-backs coach at the University of Oklahoma. This will mark Coach Beamer's first head coaching assignment. He has been an assistant coach at seven FBS schools for 21 seasons. During his career, he has coached in 17 bowl games, including a College Football Playoff National Championship Game, has posted 18 non-losing seasons, six of those with double-digit victories, and his teams have won 62.9 percent of its games. He is the son of Hall of Fame coach Frank Beamer.

THE ASSISTANT COACHES: Nine of the 10 on-field assistant coaches are first-time members of the South Carolina Football staff. On the offensive side of the ball, Coach Beamer selected **Marcus Satterfield** to serve as the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach. **Greg Adkins** is the offensive line coach, **Montario Hardesty** in the running back coach, **Erik Kimrey** will serve as the tight ends coach and **Justin Stepp** will oversee the wide receivers. On the defensive side of the ball, **Clayton White** takes over as the defensive coordinator/inside linebackers coach. He will be assisted by defensive line coach **Jimmy Lindsey** and defensive backs coach **Torrian Gray**. **Mike Peterson** is the lone holder from the previous staff. He will be in charge of the outside linebackers and defensive ends. In addition, **Pete Lembo** has been hired as associate head coach/special teams coordinator.

THEY DO THE HEAVY LIFTING: The entire strength and conditioning staff has been overhauled for a second-straight year, with **Luke Day** now in charge. Joining Day on the strength staff are **Byron Jerideau**, **Chip Morton**, **Mitch Okey** and **Nate Sederger**.

ANALYZE THIS: Coach Beamer has hired five analysts to the staff. The quintet includes **Nick Coleman** and **Lonnie Teasley** on the offensive side, **Ahmad Smith** and **Shaq Wilson** on defense, and **Stanton Weber** as the special teams analyst.

IT'S PERSONNEL: **Taylor Edwards** has been hired as the Director of Player Personnel. He will be assisted by **Drew Hixson**. **Jessica Jackson** returns as the Director of On-Campus Recruiting.

THE GRADUATE ASSISTANTS: **Danny Gordon** and **Kiel Pollard** will serve as graduate assistants on the offensive side of the ball while **Donnie Both** and **Joe Bowen** work as GAs for the defense.

MOORE HELP FOR SHAW: **Derrick Moore** was hired as the program's Executive Director of Character and Player Development. Moore brings his leadership, passion, energy, experience and 24 years of inspiring student-athletes, coaches, and administrators to the University South Carolina and Gamecock Football. He will work closely with Gamecock Great **Connor Shaw**, who was named Director of Football Relations. With his expanded responsibilities, Shaw will assume more of a football/recruiting emphasis within the NCAA rules, as well as serving as a liaison with former Gamecock players.

BREAKING IT DOWN: The 101-man spring roster consists of 30 seniors, 15 juniors, 27 sophomores, 24 redshirt freshmen and five true freshmen.

CLASS DISTINCTION: The SEC student-athlete classification subgroup recommended that schools advance student-athletes forward on their rosters as usual, adding a year on at the end of their eligibility. This more closely mirrors academic progress and is also consistent with criteria for a number of awards. Advancing a student-athlete also includes advancing him to the designation of redshirt freshman redshirt sophomore, etc.

THEY'RE BACK: The Gamecocks welcome 51 returning letterwinners to begin the 2021 spring session. The lettermen consist of 24 offensive players, 23 on defense and four special teams players.

RETURNING STARTERS: The Gamecocks list 14 returning starters from the 2020 squad, seven on offense, five on defense and both specialists. The returning offensive starters are OC **Eric Douglas**, RG **Jovaughn Gwyn**, RB **Kevin Harris**, WR **Xavier Legette**, LT **Jakai Moore**, TE **Nick Muse** and RT **Dylan Wonnum**. The returning defensive starters are DT **Jabari Ellis**, DE **Kingsley Enagbare**, DT **Zacch Pickens**, S **RJ. Roderick** and LB **Damani Staley**. The specialists are P **Kai Kroeger** and PK **Parker White**.

GONE BUT NOT FORGOTTEN: The Gamecocks said good-bye to 18 letterwinners including 10 starters off last year's team, four on offense and six on defense. The departed starters include QB **Collin Hill**, LG **Sadarius Hutcherson**, FB **Adam Prentice**, and WR **Shi Smith** on the offensive side of the ball, and CB **John Dixon**, CB **Jaycee Horn**, LB **Ernest Jones**, DB **Israel Mukuamu**, N **Jammie Robinson** and DE **Keir Thomas** on defense.

EVERY TIME OUT: The Gamecocks had seven players start all 10 games in 2020 including OC **Eric Douglas**, G **Jovaughn Gwyn**, RB **Kevin Harris**, LG **Sadarius Hutcherson**, TE **Nick Muse**, RT **Dylan Wonnum** and N **Jammie Robinson**. Gwyn (21-consecutive starts), Wonnum (13), Douglas (10), Harris (10) and Muse (10) return in 2021.

IT'S A NUMBERS GAME: Carolina returns 86 percent of its rushing yards, 23 percent of its passing yards and 60 percent of its receiving yards from 2019. **Kevin Harris** (1,139 yards) and **Rashad Amos** (99 yards) are the top returning rushers, while **Nick Muse** (425 yards) and **Kevin Harris** (159 yards) are the top returning receivers. The Gamecocks top returning passer is **Luke Doty** (405 yards). Three of the squad's top eight tacklers return for the 2021 season, including **Damani Staley** (51 tackles), **Jaylan Foster** (43) and **Zacch Pickens** (35 tackles). **Kingsley Enagbare** returns after leading the team in tackles for loss (7.0) and sacks (6.0), while **Cam Smith** was one of three Gamecocks to log two interceptions.

SUPER SENIORS: The Gamecocks list seven players whose eligibility would have expired had not the NCAA allowed the 2020 season to be a "free" year. Those "super" seniors are LB **Spencer Eason-Riddle**, DT **Jabari Ellis**, DB **Jaylan Foster**, TE **Nick Muse**, LB **Damani Staley**, EDGE **Aaron Sterling** and PK **Parker White**.

ONE FOR THE THUMB: With the NCAA rule allowing for an extra year, three Gamecocks - LB **Damani Staley**, EDGE **Aaron Sterling** and PK **Parker White** - can become the first players in school history to letter five times in their career.

UTILIZING THE PORTAL: The Gamecocks' spring roster features seven scholarship transfers who enrolled at Carolina in January. The list includes WR **Ahmarean Brown** (Georgia Tech), QB **Jason Brown** (St. Francis, Pa.), DT **Jahkeem Green** (Nebraska), WR **E.J. Jenkins** (St. Francis, Pa.), DB **David Spaulding** (Georgia Southern), EDGE **Jordan Strachan** (Georgia State) and LB **Debo Williams** (Delaware).

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS: The Gamecocks are 32-11 in their last 43 non-conference games, with six of the 11 losses in that stretch coming against Clemson.

SHANE BEAMER

Head Coach

First Year as H.C. at South Carolina/5th overall

Shane Beamer, considered to be one of the rising stars among coaches in college football, was named the University of South Carolina's 36th head football coach on Dec. 6, 2020.

Beamer, 43, has been an assistant coach at seven Football Bowl Subdivision schools for 21 seasons. During his career, he has coached in 17 bowl games, including a College Football Playoff National Championship Game, has posted 18 non-losing seasons, six of those with double-digit victories and his teams have won 62.9 percent of its games.

Beamer has been a part of building programs throughout his career. He has been a part of three coaching staffs, where the head coach was in his first or second season at the school. He joined Lincoln Riley's unit at Oklahoma in his second season, Kirby Smart's program at Georgia in his first season and Sylvester Croom's staff at Mississippi State in his first season.

He comes to Carolina from Oklahoma, where he has served as the assistant head coach for offense, coaching tight ends and H-backs, for the last three seasons. In 2020, Oklahoma ranked sixth in the country in scoring (43.0), 11th in total offense (494.7) and 14th in passing offense (315.0). The Sooners led the nation in yards per play (8.0) and ranked third in total offense (537.6) and fourth in passing efficiency rating (187.0) in 2019. Oklahoma led the nation in total offense (570.3), scoring offense (48.4) and yards per play (FBS-record 8.6), and ranked second in passing efficiency rating (194.9) in 2018.

The Charleston, S.C. native, returns to one of his previous coaching stops, having been with the Gamecocks for four seasons (2007-10). In 2007, he served as the outside linebackers coach and co-special teams coordinator. He mentored the cornerbacks in 2008, then coached the Spurs and strong safeties and was both the special teams coordinator and recruiting coordinator in 2009 and 2010.

In 2009 at South Carolina, Beamer was nominated for the Frank Broyles Award, which goes annually to the nation's top assistant coach. His special teams' units recorded five blocked kicks that season, tying for the SEC lead and tying for the eighth-highest total in the nation. He also helped coach a defensive unit that ranked third in the SEC and 15th in the country in total defense, and second in the league and eighth in the country in passing defense.

As the Gamecocks' recruiting coordinator, his 2009 class was ranked 12th-best by both Rivals and Scout, and the 2010 and 2011 classes were ranked in the Top 25.

During Beamer's tenure as recruiting coordinator at Carolina, nine of his signees were selected in the NFL draft. Those include first round selection Stephen Gilmore (Buffalo Bills) and second round selections Alshon Jeffery (Chicago Bears) and D.J. Swearinger (Houston Texans).

The Gamecocks all-time winningest quarterback, Connor Shaw, and rushing touchdown leader, Marcus Lattimore, were also in the 2010 class.

In between stops in Columbia and Norman, Beamer spent two seasons on the staff at Georgia as tight ends coach and special team's coordinator. The Bulldogs posted a 21-7 combined record with Beamer on staff. In 2017, the Bulldogs won the SEC Championship and finished second in the nation, falling in the CFP title game to Alabama in overtime. His special teams ranked eighth nationally in net punting (41.7), and 20th in kickoff returns (23.5) while blocking four kicks.

The son of Hall of Fame coach, Frank Beamer, he worked with his father as the associate head coach and running backs coach at Virginia Tech from 2011-14. In his first year, he coached David Wilson, who broke the Tech single-season rushing record and was named All-American and ACC Player of the Year and went on to become a first-round NFL draft selection by the New York Giants. Shane served as the Hokies' acting head coach in the 2014 Military Bowl win while his father watched from the press box following throat surgery.

Beamer's first full-time coaching position was at Mississippi State, joining the Bulldogs in 2004 as cornerbacks coach and recruiting coordinator. In his first two seasons at State, he guided three defensive backs to SEC All-Freshman Team accolades. He maintained the recruiting coordinator title but made the move to running backs coach in the spring of 2006 where he tutored running back Anthony Dixon to SEC All-Freshman honors.

Beamer spent three seasons (2001-03) as a graduate assistant at Tennessee, helping with the cornerbacks, coaching the placekickers, punters, and long snappers, and assisting in all special teams areas. He also oversaw game opponent scouting while earning a master's degree in sport management in December 2003.

Before joining the staff at Tennessee, he worked one season (2000) as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech, helping with the Yellow Jacket quarterbacks and wide receivers.

A 2000 graduate of Virginia Tech, Beamer was a member of five bowl teams (1995-99 seasons) and three Big East Conference championship squads on the Hokie football team as a long snapper and wide receiver. He was a long snapper on the 1999 Tech team that played for the BCS National Championship.

Beamer and his wife, Emily, are the parents of three children - two daughters, Sutton and Olivia, both born in Columbia, and a son, Hunter, born in Blacksburg, Va.





GREG ADKINS

Offensive Line Coach
First Year at South Carolina

Greg Adkins was named the Gamecocks' offensive line coach on Jan. xx, 2021.

Adkins comes to Carolina after having spent the past three seasons as the offensive line coach and recruiting coordinator at Marshall University, working under head coach Doc Holliday. Marshall posted a 24-12 record from 2018-20 in what was his second tour of duty with the Thundering Herd.

In 2020, the Thundering Herd surrendered 12 sacks in 10 games, ranking 13th in the country, while allowing just 3.5 tackles for loss per game, the nation's fourth-best mark. Right guard Cain Madden earned second team All-America honors from both the Associated Press and Walter Camp. Madden and fellow offensive lineman Josh Ball were named first-team All-Conference USA, while Alex Mollette was a second-team selection.

Under Adkins' tutelage, offensive linemen Levi Brown was a first-team All-Conference USA center in both 2018 and 2019, while Madden earned second team honors in 2019.

Adkins began his coaching career at his alma mater, mentoring the defensive line, tight ends and offensive line at Marshall for five seasons from 1991-95. He was on the staff that won the 1992 Division I-AA national championship and appeared in three other I-AA national title games (1991, '93 and '95).

Between his two tours of duty at Marshall, Adkins coached the offensive line at six schools, including four Power-5 schools, two of which are in the SEC. His resume includes stints at Georgia (1996-2000), Troy (2001-02), Tennessee (2003-08), Syracuse (2009-12), Oklahoma State (2015-17) and Charlotte (2018). He also handled recruiting duties at Syracuse, Tennessee and Troy; coached tight ends and defensive line at Georgia; mentored the tight ends at Tennessee; and served as Charlotte's run game coordinator and interim offensive coordinator.

Adkins also has NFL experience, having a two-year stint in Buffalo as the Bills' tight ends coach from 2013-14.

Born March 25, 1968, Adkins is a native of Cross Lanes, West Virginia. He played four seasons as an offensive lineman at Marshall, graduating in 1990.



TORRIAN GRAY

Defensive Backs Coach
First Year at South Carolina

Torrian Gray was named the Gamecocks' defensive backs coach on Jan. 15, 2021.

Gray, 46, has coached the secondary for 21 years, including 17 at the collegiate level and four in the NFL. He has developed a number of NFL defensive backs, including Brandon Flowers, Kam Chancellor, Kyle Fuller and Kendall Fuller at Virginia Tech and Teez Tabor, Marcus Maye, Quincy Wilson, Duke Dawson and C.J. Henderson at Florida.

Gray has spent the past two seasons coaching the cornerbacks at the University of Florida, his second stint with the Gators. In his first year back in Gainesville in 2019, the Gators tied for ninth in the FBS with 16 interceptions on the season. Under Gray's guidance, UF was one of only two FBS teams (FAU) to feature four players with at least three interceptions each. Additionally, Gray guided cornerbacks CJ Henderson (First Team) and Kaiir Elam (Freshmen Team) to All-SEC honors by the league's coaches. Henderson later went on to be the ninth overall selection in the 2020 NFL Draft. In 2020, Elam earned first-team All-SEC honors.

Prior to his stint with the Gators, Gray worked with the defensive backs for the Washington franchise in the NFL. In 2017, his first season in Washington, Gray's defensive backs helped produce the team's strongest season against the pass in nearly a decade. The unit ranked third in the NFL in completion percentage allowed (57.6 percent), the team's best ranking since leading the NFL in the category in 2005 (54.4), while finishing ninth in passing yards allowed per game (213.8, the team's lowest since 2009) and 10th in opponent passer rating (81.0, lowest since 2008). One of his standout performers was former Gamecock D.J. Swearingen.

In 2016, Gray served as the defensive backs coach at Florida. Under Gray's guidance, cornerback Teez Tabor earned first-team All-SEC honors from both the Associated Press and the league's coaches while also garnering second-team All-American honors from numerous outlets. Gray also helped guide defensive back Quincy Wilson to second-team All-SEC honors.

Prior to his arrival in Gainesville, Gray spent a decade at his alma mater, Virginia Tech, leading some of the nation's best defensive backfields. In his 10 seasons coaching the secondary in Blacksburg under head coach Frank Beamer, his unit allowed just 185.0 passing yards per game and a 106.5 opponent passer rating – both ranked second in the nation over that span. Opposing quarterbacks completed just 50.4 percent of their passes in those 10 seasons, the lowest percentage of any defense in the nation. The Virginia Tech secondary ranked in the top 15 nationally in opponent passer rating eight times in Gray's 10 seasons leading the unit, including three top-five finishes.

During Gray's tenure, a total of 11 Hokie defensive backs were selected in the NFL Draft.

In 2014, the Hokies had the fourth-best pass defense (189.2 ypg) in the Atlantic Coast Conference despite losing All-American Kendall Fuller early in the season due to injury. His unit allowed opponents to complete just 49.6 percent of their passes, second-best in the conference.

In 2006, his first year leading the group, they ranked first in the country in passing yards allowed per game (128.2) and second in opponent passer rating (91.3).

Before returning to Virginia Tech, Gray spent two seasons in the NFL as assistant defensive backs coach for the Chicago Bears from 2004-05. In 2005, Gray's unit helped the Bears rank fifth in the NFL in passing defense and finished tied for second in interceptions (24) as defensive backs Nathan Vasher and Mike Brown both earned Pro Bowl selections.

Gray began his coaching career at the University of Maine, serving as defensive backs coach for two seasons from 2000-01. He then spent the 2002-03 seasons as defensive backs coach at the University of Connecticut. During his time with the Huskies, he coached cornerback Justin Perkins, helping him to two all-conference selections and 12 career interceptions.

Following a standout career at Kathleen High School in Lakeland, Fla., Gray played collegiately at Virginia Tech and became a three-time all-conference selection. He helped lead the Hokies to a pair of conference titles and was drafted by the Minnesota Vikings in the second round (49th overall) of the 1997 NFL Draft. He spent three seasons with the Vikings before retiring after a career-ending knee injury in the spring of 2000.

A native of Lakeland, Fla., Gray has two daughters, Tori and Lexi.



MONTARIO HARDESTY

Running Backs Coach
First Year at South Carolina

Montario Hardesty joined the staff as the Gamecocks' running backs coach in February, 2021.

A former NFL player, Hardesty comes to Columbia after spending the past two seasons as part of the Charlotte football coaching staff, working under head coach Will Healy as the 49ers' wide receivers coach.

In his first season with the 49ers, he helped Charlotte to an historic season that included school records for wins (7), C-USA wins (5) and winning streak (5 games) and included a trip to the program's first bowl game, the Makers Wanted Bahamas Bowl.

Charlotte set a school record for passing TDs (24) and a school FBS record for passing yards (2,749), thanks to a receiving corps that included honorable mention all-C-USA choice Victor Tucker. Tucker had five 100-yard receiving games and ranked sixth in the league in receiving yards per game and second in receiving touchdowns.

Hardesty spent the 2018 season as an offensive quality control coach at his alma mater, Tennessee. In 2017, Hardesty was an assistant strength and conditioning coach at Florida Atlantic, working for his former college coach, Lane Kiffin. He also spent two years as running backs coach and special teams coordinator at Norfolk State (2015-16).

Hardesty got his coaching start at Chowan University, where he served as an intern in 2014 under the NFL Players Association internship program before joining the staff at Norfolk State.

Hardesty played running back while earning his bachelor's degree in sports management from Tennessee, graduating in 2009. He earned second team all-SEC honors as a senior when he ranked fourth in the league in rushing with 1,345, the fourth-most in school history, and scored 14 touchdowns. He rushed for 2,391 yards, ninth in Vols' history, and scored 27 touchdowns during his career on Rocky Top.

Hardesty was a second-round pick by the Cleveland Browns in the 2010 NFL Draft. In his first preseason game, he suffered a torn ACL and was sidelined the entire season. He played in 23 games with the Browns during the 2011 and 2012 seasons, totaling 153 carries for 537 yards with one touchdown, and 16 receptions for 138 yards. He was placed on injured reserve in 2013 following arthroscopic knee surgery, and was released later that year.

A native of New Bern, N.C., Hardesty was born Feb. 1, 1987. As a senior at New Bern High School in 2004, he rushed for 2,002 yards and had 19 rushing touchdowns.



ERIK KIMREY

Tight Ends Coach
First Year at South Carolina

Former Gamecock quarterback Erik Kimrey was named the Gamecocks' tight ends coach on Dec. 27, 2021.

Kimrey, a highly-successful high school coach, returns to his alma mater for his first stint as a collegiate coach. He has spent the past 17 seasons as the head coach at Hammond School in Columbia, where he guided the SkyHawks to 12 SCISA state titles, more than any coach in South Carolina history, while compiling an overall record of 194-20. He was the youngest and fastest coach to reach 100 victories in South Carolina history and the only coach to have won six consecutive state championships. Among the players who played for Kimrey at Hammond include current Gamecocks Jordan Burch, Alex Huntley, Bradley Dunn and Fabian Goodman. He taught Philosophy of Religion and physical education at Hammond.

Kimrey graduated from Dutch Fork High School in Columbia where he played quarterback for his father, Bill Kimrey, who was a head high school coach in South Carolina for 34 years. He set five state passing records as a senior and was the state's Offensive Player of the Year. Kimrey was a backup quarterback and three-time letterwinner at South Carolina from 1998-2002. He is best remembered for coming off the bench to replace an injured Phil Petty and completing a fourth-down fade route pass to Jermaine Kelly to lift the Gamecocks to an upset win over Mississippi State during the 2000 season.

After earning his bachelor's degree in mathematics, Kimrey spent two years as an offensive graduate assistant on Lou Holtz's staff at South Carolina, coaching tight ends and studying offensive line and tight end play under Coach Dave DeGuglielmo.

Kimrey is a third generation Gamecock. His grandmother, father, mother, brothers and wife all attended the University of South Carolina. He is married to his high school sweetheart, Erica Russell and they have three children - Kaitlyn Dean, Karis and Ty.



PETE LEMBO

Associate HC/Special Teams

First Year at South Carolina

Pete Lembo was named the Gamecocks' Associate Head Coach and Special Teams Coordinator on Dec. 27, 2020.

Lembo comes to Carolina after two seasons as the assistant head coach and special teams coordinator at Memphis. Nominated for the Broyles Award, the 2019 Tigers special teams ranked in the top-10 in six NCAA/FBS statistical categories: kick-return yards (2nd), kick-return TD (2nd), blocked kicks (6th), blocked punts (6th), kickoff touchbacks (6th) and kick returns (9th). He also was one of three finalists for FootballScoop.com's Special Teams Coordinator of the Year honor.

Before arriving in the Bluff City, Lembo's special teams were ranked among the nation's best at Rice (2018) and Maryland (2016-17). At Maryland, he also served as the assistant head coach and tight ends coach.

His 2018 Rice special teams ranked fifth in the FBS with just 16.12 kickoff return yards allowed and 15th with 24.41 kickoff return yards per game. As a unit, Rice's special teams ranked 17th in the country in the ESPN Team Efficiency Rankings (60.8 percent), after coming in at 114th the season before Lembo's arrival.

In his time at Maryland, Lembo's special teams ranked as some of the best in the country. In two seasons the Terps tied for fifth nationally with nine blocked kicks.

Lembo spent five seasons as the head coach at Ball State (2011-15). During his tenure, the Cardinals set more than 60 school records, including season marks for points (501), total offense (6,199 yards), passing yards (4,214), TD passes (35) and total TD (64) in 2013.

His Ball State special teams also ranked among the top of the Mid-American Conference (MAC) in each of his five seasons. Kicker Steve Schott was a Lou Groza Award semifinalist, and punter Scott Kovanda was a 2012 Ray Guy Award finalist. In 2014, kicker Scott Secor was named the MAC Special Teams Player of the Year.

In five seasons, Lembo posted a mark of 33-29, improving his career coaching mark to 112-65 in 15 seasons. He was the first head coach in Ball State history to win at least 30 games in his first four seasons. Lembo guided the Cardinals to a 9-4 record and an appearance in the 2012 Beef O'Brady's Bowl and a 10-3 mark and a 2013 GoDaddy Bowl appearance. It was just the second time in the Cardinals' 91-year history the program went to bowl games in consecutive seasons.

He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Albany (1992-93), and then spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Dartmouth (1994-96) and a season at Hampden-Sydney (1997) before joining the staff at Lehigh in 1998. There, Lembo started as an assistant coach before being named the head coach in 2001. In five seasons at the helm, he posted a 44-14 mark, leading Lehigh to the 2001 and 2004 Patriot League crowns and FCS playoff berths. His .759 overall winning percentage and .778 league winning percentage are the second-highest in Patriot League history. He was named the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year and Patriot League Coach of the Year in 2001 when his team finished 11-1 and ranked fifth in both NCAA Division I-AA polls.

In 2006, Lembo took over the Elon program. Over the next five years, Lembo led the Phoenix to 35 wins, more than doubling their win total from the previous five years (14). Lembo's Elon teams broke 124 NCAA, Southern Conference (SoCon) and school records and sported a 24-14 record in SoCon play. He was named the SoCon Coach of the Year in 2007.

Lembo, a 1992 graduate of Georgetown University, was a four-year starter on the Hoyas' offensive line and served as team captain in 1991. A native of Staten Island, N.Y., Lembo is married to the former Jenifer Kochis. The couple has three children: Sophia, A.J. and Victoria.



JIMMY LINDSEY

Defensive Line Coach

First Year at South Carolina

Jimmy Lindsey was named as the Gamecocks' defensive line coach on Jan. 17, 2021.

Lindsey, 43, a native of Cheraw, S.C., who lists Morven, N.C. as his hometown, spent the 2020 season on Lovie Smith's staff at the University of Illinois, coaching defensive ends. He served as the defensive coordinator in the Illini's season finale at Penn State after Smith was relieved of his coaching duties. Under Lindsey's tutelage, Owen Carney Jr. earned second-team All-Big Ten honors after collecting 28 tackles, 7.0 tackles for loss and 5.0 sacks in eight games.

Lindsey came to Illinois after three seasons at Western Kentucky where he worked with current Gamecock defensive coordinator Clayton White. Lindsey was the Hilltoppers' defensive line coach in 2017, before coaching the defensive ends and serving as the recruiting coordinator in 2018 and 2019.

Lindsey's coaching career began at his alma mater, Chattanooga, where he was an assistant in 2001 and '01 while finishing up his degree. Following graduation, he was named the Mocs' linebackers coach in 2002.

He then spent four seasons (2003-06) at Gardner-Webb, where he coached the defensive line, linebackers, special teams and was also the recruiting coordinator. Under Lindsey's guidance, Harold Wells, was named the 2004 I-AA Football Gazette National Defensive Lineman of the Year, and defensive end Brian Johnson was drafted by the Kansas City Chiefs in 2008.

Lindsey then spent two seasons (2007-08) at Miami (Ohio), serving as the defensive ends coach and co-special teams coordinator, then one year at Tennessee-Martin as the defensive line coach before returning to Chattanooga for two seasons (2010-11) as the defensive line coach and special teams coordinator. In 2011, four of Lindsey's defensive linemen earned All-SoCon honors including first-teamer Josh Williams.

Lindsey then spent four years in the Palmetto State, working at Furman University from 2012-15. He was the Paladins' defensive line coach for three seasons before adding the title of Assistant Head Coach in his final season in Greenville. He mentored defensive end Gary Wilkins to All-America honors in 2014 and a contract with the Oakland Raiders. Lindsey also helped Furman win a Southern Conference championship in 2013.

Lindsey spent the 2016 season at Georgia Southern, working as the defensive line coach, before moving on to Western Kentucky.

Lindsey also has had the opportunity to work with four NFL teams (Cleveland – 2006; Detroit – 2008; Denver – 2010; San Diego – 2013) in the Minority Coaching Internship program.

Lindsey was a linebacker at Chattanooga from 1996-99, serving as a team captain in his senior season and was the recipient of UTC's Marco Sheppard Mr. Hustle Award. He graduated in 2001 with a degree in sports administration.

Born Aug. 22, 1977, Lindsey is married to the former Lauren Thomas. He has one daughter, Kiara.



MIKE PETERSON

Defensive Ends/OLB Coach
Sixth Year at South Carolina

Mike Peterson begins his sixth season in Columbia after being named to head coach Will Muschamp's first staff at Carolina. He worked as the Gamecocks' outside linebackers coach over the last five seasons, and now has the title of defensive ends/outside linebackers coach under Shane Beamer. He and running backs coach Deshaun Watson were the only two holdovers on the staff.

In 2020, Peterson coached Kingsley Enagbare, who was a first-team All-SEC selection after ranking among the SEC leaders in both sacks and forced fumbles.

While under Peterson's tutelage, D.J. Wonnum wrapped up his Gamecock career ranked ninth with 29.5 tackles for loss. He was a second-team All-SEC selection in 2019.

Peterson is credited with the development of Bryson Allen-Williams, who logged 10 tackles for loss in 2018 despite playing in just nine games, and finished his career 10th on the school's all-time list with 27.5 tackles for loss.

In 2017, Peterson was instrumental in the development of Wonnum, who was twice named SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week and ranked tied for seventh in the SEC in tackles for loss with 13.0, while leading the team with 6.0 sacks.

With Peterson's mentoring, senior Darius English turned in his finest season for the Garnet & Black in 2016, garnering 9.0 sacks to move him into both the single-season and career (15.0) sacks top-10 lists in school history while earning second-team All-SEC accolades.

After retiring from a 14-year NFL playing career, Peterson returned to his alma mater at the University of Florida in 2013 where he finished his degree while working as an undergraduate assistant coach on the Gators' strength & conditioning staff. Upon his graduation, he was named to a full-time position as a strength & conditioning coordinator.

Peterson played linebacker on head coach Steve Spurrier's Florida Gators from 1995-98. He was a member of the 1996 Gators team that finished 12-1 and won the college football national championship. As a senior in 1998, he served as a team captain, earned first-team All-SEC and All-America honors and was selected as the Gators' most valuable player by his teammates. He was inducted into the University of Florida Athletic Hall of Fame as a "Gator Great" in 2011.

Peterson started 24 of 42 games in which he played, posted 249 tackles, three forced fumbles, 13 tackles for a loss and 8.5 sacks.

Peterson was a second-round pick (36th pick overall) of the Indianapolis Colts in the 1999 NFL Draft and played professional for the Colts (1999-2002), Jacksonville Jaguars (2003-08) and Atlanta Falcons (2009-12). He earned second-team All-Pro honors in 2005.

During his NFL career, Peterson logged 883 tackles in 196 games with 21.5 sacks and 19 interceptions.

Born June 17, 1976 in Gainesville, Fla., Peterson is the older brother of former Chicago Bears running back Adrian Peterson.

Porter Michael Peterson and his wife, Chantal, have two sons, Mike Jr. and Gavin. His father was a long-time coach in the Gainesville area. He attended Santa Fe High School in nearby Alachua, Fla.

Peterson and his wife established the Mike Peterson Foundation in 2004. The foundation was constituted in an attempt to support and benefit under-served youth and socio-economically challenged families in Peterson's hometown of Alachua, Fla., and his NFL cities of Jacksonville and Atlanta. Since its inception, the Mike Peterson Foundation has already served over 50,000 youth and families through several community events and programs, most notably the Top Dog Readers Club literacy program at the Grove Park Elementary School in Atlanta.



MARCUS SATTERFIELD

Offensive Coord./QB Coach
First Year at South Carolina

Marcus Satterfield was named as the Gamecocks' offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach on Jan. 10, 2021.

Satterfield comes to Columbia with over 20 years of coaching experience in the college ranks, including two years as a head coach at Tennessee Tech. He has spent the past three years working under the tutelage of Matt Rhule, first as the director of recruiting at Baylor in 2018, then as the Bears' tight ends coach in 2019 before spending the 2020 season as the assistant offensive line coach for the Carolina Panthers.

Satterfield had a brief stint in 2018 at East Tennessee State where he served as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, before joining Baylor.

Prior to his appointment at ETSU, he served as head coach at Tennessee Tech from 2016-17. In 2016, Satterfield led the Golden Eagles to their first winning conference season since 2011 as Tennessee Tech went 5-3 in the Ohio Valley Conference.

From 2013-15, Satterfield was the offensive coordinator at Temple where he helped guide the Owls to historic marks. In his first year at Temple, Satterfield's offense averaged nearly 400 yards per game, which was the most by an Owl team since 1979. Temple earned the 2015 American Athletic Conference east division title and posted a 10-win season.

Satterfield also held offensive coordinator roles at Chattanooga (2009-12) and UT Martin (2006-07). In 2010, Satterfield's Chattanooga offense averaged 430 yards and scored 49 touchdowns, which ranked 11th nationally. During his time at UT Martin, the Skyhawks led the OVC in scoring offense in 2007 and 2008, while also leading the league in total offense in 2007.

Satterfield began his coaching career at Chattanooga in 1999, before becoming a graduate assistant under Coach Phillip Fulmer at Tennessee from 2002-03. Coach Beamer was a G.A. at Tennessee at that same time. He also had stops as wide receivers coach at Richmond (2004) and Western Carolina (2005).

Satterfield played wide receiver and punter at East Tennessee State University from 1995-98, helping the Bucs to the I-AA playoffs in 1996. He finished his career at ETSU with 124 catches and 11 touchdowns. He graduated from ETSU in 1999 with a bachelor's degree in history.

A native of Greenback, Tenn., the 44-year old Satterfield is married to the former Sarah Houser. The couple has a daughter, Harper.



JUSTIN STEPP

Wide Receivers Coach
First Year at South Carolina

Columbia native Justin Stepp joined the University of South Carolina football staff as the wide receivers coach on Jan. 4, 2021.

Stepp, who was born in Columbia and graduated from nearby Pelion High School, has spent the past three seasons as the wide receivers coach at the University of Arkansas. During his time in Fayetteville, he had five players combine for six 400-yard seasons and 26 touchdowns. In 2020, sophomore Treyton Burks became the first Arkansas wide receiver to earn All-SEC recognition since 2015 after hauling in 51 catches for 820 yards and seven touchdowns. In 2019, Burks and Trey Knox were one of the top freshmen receiving tandems in the nation, combining for 57 catches and 860 yards, most among SEC freshman duos.

Off the field, Stepp was named as one of the nation's Top-25 recruiters by Rivals thanks to the addition of four four-star receivers. The Razorbacks were the only team in the nation to sign four four-star wide receivers in the 2019 class. In Stepp's four recruiting classes on the Hill, he's brought in seven 4-stars recruits. In addition, Stepp was selected to participate in the 2018 AFCA 35 Under 35 Coaches Leadership Institute, a prestigious program aimed at identifying and developing premier, future leaders in the football coaching profession. He was also named a finalist for the 2017 FootballScoop Wide Receivers Coach of the Year award.

Prior to his arrival in Fayetteville, Stepp spent three seasons (2015-17) as the wide receivers coach at SMU under head coach Chad Morris. Stepp's protégés Courtland Sutton and Trey Quinn were two of the most dynamic wide receivers in college football in 2017 and each went on to be selected in the 2018 NFL Draft. The Mustangs boasted one of the most prolific passing attacks in the nation with All-Americans Sutton and Quinn each posting 1,000-yard receiving seasons. SMU was one of only two schools with multiple 1,000-yard receivers in 2017. In addition, Sutton and Quinn were the only pair of teammates to rank in the top-10 in touchdown receptions and combined for a dozen 100-yard receiving games.

In 2016, Sutton led the SMU offense for the second-straight season, hauling in 76 passes for 1,246 yards and 10 TDs to become SMU's first 1,000-yard receiver since 2013. In addition, James Proche, caught 57 passes for 709 yards and six scores on his way to Freshman All-America honors.

Stepp's first season at SMU saw him develop Sutton into a Freshman All-American in 2015 after leading all FBS freshmen with nine receiving touchdowns. He set an SMU freshman record for receiving yards with 862 and tied for the most touchdowns by a freshman.

Stepp's first full-time collegiate role came as the wide receivers coach at Appalachian State University from 2012-14. While at App State he coached three players who combined to earn five All-Southern Conference honors, including All-American Sean Price who set NCAA Division I FCS freshman records with 81 receptions and 1,196 receiving yards in 2012.

Stepp starred at Pelion High School, helping the Panthers to an unbeaten regular season in 2000, before becoming a standout wide receiver and punt returner at Furman from 2003-06. He earned All-SoCon recognition as a junior and senior and finished his playing career with 1,568 yards, 10 touchdown catches and 118 receptions, good for No. 4 on the school's career list at the time.

Stepp's professional career began as wide receivers and strength coach at Fort Mill (S.C.) High School in 2007 before becoming the wide receivers coach and recruiting coordinator at NCAA Division II North Greenville in 2008. He worked as a graduate assistant at Clemson from 2009-11.

Born July 5, 1983, Stepp and his wife, Brooke, have a son, Courtland Spencer, and a daughter, Allison Blair. His twin brother, Josh, is an assistant football coach at Georgia State.



CLAYTON WHITE

Defensive Coord./ILB Coach
First Year at South Carolina

Clayton White was named the Gamecocks' defensive coordinator on Jan. 10, 2021. In addition, White will coach the inside linebackers.

White, 43, is a three-time Frank Broyles Award nominee for the nation's top assistant coach (2017, 2019 and 2020) and an 18-year coaching veteran. He has spent the past four seasons as the defensive coordinator and cornerbacks coach at Western Kentucky University.

In 2020, the Hilltoppers ranked 28th in total defense, including eighth in the nation in passing defense, allowing just 177.3 yards per game though the air. WKU was third in the nation with 68 passes defended and the defense scored three touchdowns.

In 2019, WKU produced a top 25 overall defense in the third season of White's Multiple 4-2-5 scheme. WKU allowed only 20.1 total points per game, which was the lowest mark for the program since 2004 and ranked No. 22 in FBS. Junior defensive end DeAngelo Malone was voted 2019 Conference USA Defensive Player of the Year after producing 99 total tackles – including 21 for loss – with 11.5 sacks and 16 quarterback hurries.

WKU held opponents to a 29.7 percent rate (51-of-172) on 3rd-down attempts, which ranked sixth in FBS and was the lowest mark for the program since 1987. The Hilltoppers ranked third in FBS with only 82 missed tackles all season long. Only Michigan (74) and Air Force (81) had better such numbers.

The Hilltoppers were one of the nation's stingiest inside the red zone in 2018. WKU allowed just a 103.41 passer rating with their backs against the wall, good for the sixth-best mark nationally. Even better, the Hilltoppers allowed opposing quarterbacks to complete passes at just a 32.7 percent clip, the best mark in the nation.

During White's first campaign as the defensive playcaller in 2017, the Hilltoppers enjoyed a historic stretch, holding opponents to their fewest point totals through the season's first seven games in 15 years and a record over that span in the FBS era.

The pass defense was also one of the nation's stingiest in allowing passing touchdowns, as opposing teams found the end zone just 11 times through the air all season against the Hilltoppers, a mark which ranked No. 5 nationally. The Hilltoppers ranked No. 40 nationally in pass defense – an improvement of 79 spots from the previous season.

Prior to his arrival in Bowling Green, White spent four seasons as the Co-Special Teams Coordinator/Safeties Coach at NC State (2013-16). The Wolfpack ranked in the top-30 in total defense in both 2015 and 2016. In 2015, NC State was one of only two schools in the FBS to finish in the Top 20 in both Kickoff Return and Punt Return. Defensive back Dontae Johnson, a White disciple, was selected in the fourth round of the NFL Draft by the 49ers.

White served as the Special Teams Coordinator/Running Backs Coach at UConn from 2011-12. While in Storrs, the Huskies tied for the national lead with three punt returns for touchdowns and led the Big East with a 12.5 punt return average, good for No. 18 nationally. Running back Lyle McCombs was named an FWAA Freshman All-American, becoming just the second Husky to rush for more than 1,000 yards in his freshman campaign.

White spent one season in Bowling Green on Willie Taggart's first staff in 2010 and helped to build the WKU program during the FCS-to-FBS transition. He served as the Co-Special Teams Coordinator and Defensive Backs Coach.

A three-year run at Stanford (2007-09) preceded his first stint on The Hill where he coached the Cardinal defensive backs, including future NFL Pro Bowler Richard Sherman, and future NFL players Michael Thomas, Johnson Bademosi and Delano Howell. The Cardinal rose to as high as No. 14 in the polls in 2009 and reached a bowl game for the first time since 2001 that year.

White's first coaching stop came as a defensive backs coach at Sanderson (N.C.) High School in 2003. He also had stints at Western Carolina (2004-05) and Western Michigan (2006).

White was a three-year letterman at linebacker at NC State (1997-2000), ending his career in the Wolfpack record book in several categories including career tackles for loss (33), single-season tackles for loss (16) and tackles in a single game (23). He had a three-year NFL career with the New York Giants (2001-02) and Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2003).

Originally from Dunn, N.C., and a 2001 graduate with a degree in sport management from NC State, White and his wife Kelly have two children, Chase and Macy.



LUKE DAY

Strength & Conditioning Coach
First Year at South Carolina

University of South Carolina head football coach Shane Beamer tabbed Luke Day to lead the Gamecocks' strength and conditioning program, it was announced on Jan. 10, 2021.

Day, who has experience at both the collegiate and professional levels, comes to Carolina after spending the 2020 season as the head strength & conditioning coach at Marshall University, his second stint with the Thundering Herd. Day worked on the staff at the University of Colorado in 2019.

Day initially joined the Herd as the head strength and conditioning coach in January of 2016, a position he held for three seasons. He was recommended by Scott Sinclair, Day's predecessor, who in three years transformed the Herd strength and conditioning philosophy during a run of three-straight seasons of 10 or more wins by Coach Doc Holliday's team. Day and Sinclair – who moved from MU to the strength and conditioning director's role at Georgia – previously worked together at UCF under veteran strength coach Ed Ellis.

Prior to his arrival in Huntington, Day spent one year as an assistant on the Cincinnati Bengals' strength and conditioning staff.

Day is a native of Hamilton, Ohio, where he was significantly involved with inner-city ministry for the Hamilton Dream Center. Prior to his year with the Bengals, he spent two years as an assistant in strength and conditioning at UCF, following stints at USF (2012) and Cincinnati (2011-12). He also served as a summer volunteer in strength and conditioning with the New Orleans Saints in 2010.

Day graduated from Hamilton High School in 2006 and went to Morehead State, where he played defensive line for two years. He transferred "back home" to Miami (Ohio) and started working as a strength room intern and graduated with a degree in physical education.

His first job was designing, developing and implementing a weight room and strength program at Mount Healthy High School in Cincinnati, and through that work he made connections to the University of Cincinnati, where he spent 14 months on the strength and conditioning staff.

Day and his wife, Trisha, have a son, Jay and a daughter, Norah.



CLINT HAGGARD

Head FB Athletic Trainer
13th Year at South Carolina

Clint Haggard is in his 13th season at the University of South Carolina. He was named head football athletic trainer on July 22, 2009.

Prior to his arrival in Columbia, Haggard served as the Assistant Athletics Director for medical services/head athletic trainer at Rice University, a position he held from 2006-09.

Haggard began his professional career as a graduate assistant athletic trainer at Alabama for two years, before working as an assistant football athletic trainer for the Crimson Tide for two years. While at Alabama, he developed and implemented the Alabama Sports Medicine Workshop that provided learning opportunities for high school athletic trainers across the Southeast.

In the fall of 2001, Haggard served as coordinator of medical services for the Georgia State Flag Football Championships, providing medical coverage for more than 700 athletes. He also served internships for the Indianapolis Colts and the Cincinnati Reds.

Haggard received his bachelor's degree in exercise and sport science for the University of Georgia in 2002 and his master's degree in health sciences from Alabama in 2003.

In addition to his duties with Carolina Football, Haggard serves as an adjunct instructor in the Athletic Training Education Program and serves on the program committee for the South Carolina Athletic Trainers Association. He has been a speaker at numerous conferences around the country, has published many articles and has successfully procured several athletic training-related grants. He also serves as the coordinator of the SEC officials physicals and is President of the SEC Sports Medicine Committee.

Haggard is certified by the National Athletic Trainers Association and is certified as an emergency medical technician-basic. He holds memberships with numerous national, state and district athletic training associations.

Haggard and his wife, Erin, have a daughter, Reagan, and a son, Brewer.

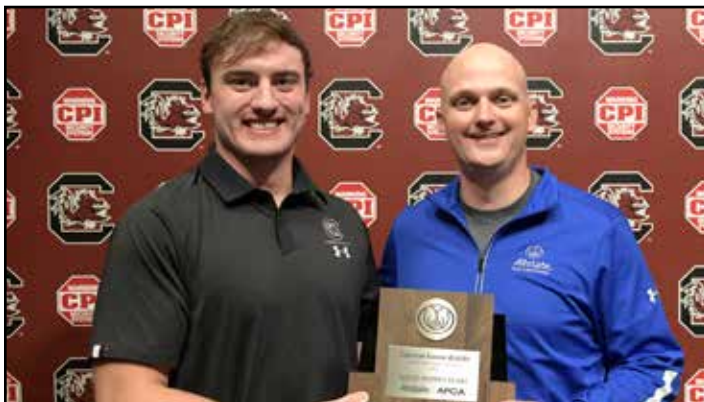

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Tennessee quarterback Jarrett Guarantano expected a difficult time at South Carolina. He also expected the 16th-ranked Vols to come out on top, no matter how hard things got.

The Vols squandered a two-touchdown lead in the second half and held on to defeat the Gamecocks 31-27 for their seventh straight victory.

The game wasn't decided until a Tennessee punt touched South Carolina's Cam Smith and the Vols' Jimmy Holiday recovered with 1:24 to go.

"When you go on the road in the SEC, nothing comes easy," Guarantano said. "You saw some of that today."

There was also plenty of Guarantano to see, as well. The fifth-year passer threw the tie-breaking touchdown to Josh Palmer with 9:35 left in the game, then stayed poised enough down the stretch to keep South Carolina at bay.

Tennessee looked to have the Southeastern Conference and season opener in hand when they went ahead 21-7 on Eric Gray's 12-yard scoring run on their opening drive of the third quarter.

But South Carolina rallied behind first-time starter quarterback Collin Hill with two touchdowns and a field goal to tie it at 24-all in the fourth quarter.

That's when Guarantano struck with back-to-back big plays for the deciding score.

Guarantano was heavily pressured when he got the ball to an all-alone Brandon Johnson for 33 yards inside South Carolina territory. The next play, Guarantano threw a picture perfect pass to Palmer for a 32-yard touchdown.

Palmer was grateful Guarantano trusted him with the play. "But it was just a traditional go route, beat the defender and caught it over the shoulder," he said.

South Carolina looked like it had a final chance when it forced a Tennessee punt with 90 seconds left. But the punt touched Cam Smith after it hit the ground, Holiday recovered and the Vols ran out the clock for the win.

Guarantano finished 19 of 31 for 259 yards. He also rushed for Tennessee's first touchdown.

South Carolina, with a new offensive coordinator in ex-Colorado State coach Mike Bobo and new quarterback in grad transfer Hill, showed some spark as it took the opening drive 75 yards for a touchdown on Kevin Harris' 3-yard run.

Linebacker Henry To'o To'o had a 32-yard interception return for a touchdown, catching the ball after it bounced off receiver Shi Smith's hands and tip-toeing down the sideline for the score.

Hill finished 25 of 39 passing for 290 yards and a touchdown. Smith had 10 catches for 140 yards for the Gamecocks.

Hill blamed himself for the interception, throwing the ball behind Smith where To'o To'o could make the defensive play.

"The play that sticks out to me is the pick six," Hill said. "You just can't turn the ball over."

GAME CHANGER

South Carolina was looking to get the ball back with a chance to win the game with a successful two-minute drill, but a fumble on a punt return gave the Volunteers the ball and clinched a 31-27 victory over the Gamecocks in both team's season opener.

KEY STAT

140 — Shi Smith had his second consecutive 100-yard game in a contest against Tennessee as he caught 10 passes for 140 yards and a touchdown in the 31-27 loss. Smith had 156 yards receiving against Tennessee last year, which is a career high.

GAINESVILLE, FLA. (AP) — Kyle Trask and Kyle Pitts hooked up for two more touchdowns, continuing their hot start and leading No. 3 Florida to a 38-24 victory over South Carolina on Saturday.

Trask completed 21 of 29 passes for 268 yards, with four touchdowns and an interception. His second-quarter fumble kept the Gamecocks (0-2) in the game early.

Pitts finished with four receptions for 57 yards, commanding extra attention and beating South Carolina's top defenders. He nearly made a one-handed catch in the third quarter, but the ball slipped off his left fingertips.

The K2K connection now has six touchdowns in two games, one more than it notched in 2019. The next performance comes at Kyle Field, where Texas A&M will try to become the first Southeastern Conference opponent to slow down Trask and Pitts in 2020.

Some thought former Florida coach Will Muschamp and his Gamecocks would find a way. But the Gators (2-0) had their way with South Carolina for three quarters in front of 15,120 socially distant fans in the Swamp. They finished with 347 yards and punted twice.

Kadarius Toney put an exclamation point on the victory with a 57-yard touchdown catch late in the third. He somehow broke through three defenders, turning a 7-yard catch into Florida's biggest gain.

He ended with six receptions for 86 yards and a touchdown to go along with 42 yards on two punt returns.

Kevin Harris was one of the few bright spots for South Carolina, which flubbed a chance to make it a one-score game in the final minute. The sophomore ran 22 times for 100 yards and a score.

Collin Hill completed 28 of 47 passes for 212 yards and two touchdowns. He was sacked four times. He threw behind Shi Smith in the end zone on Carolina's final play, which ended an 18-play, 7-plus minute drive without any points.

GAME CHANGER

Kyle Trask connected with Kadarius Toney for a 57-yard touchdown reception that gave Florida a 38-14 lead with 4:44 left in the third quarter. The Gamecocks scored the final 10 points and had an 18-play drive on their final possession but did not score to fall by a pair of touchdowns.

KEY STAT

100 — Kevin Harris had 100 yards on the ground on 22 carries for the Gamecocks, his second 100-yard rushing performance in his career. He had a touchdown on the ground and in the air as his nine-yard touchdown pass from Collin Hill in the fourth quarter made it 38-24.

NASHVILLE, TENN. (AP) — The South Carolina Gamecocks ran the ball so well on a rainy, sloppy day that quarterback Collin Hill would not have minded if he never threw the ball.

Hill ran for two touchdowns and Kevin Harris ran for two TDs and a career-high 171 yards as the South Carolina Gamecocks beat Vanderbilt 41-7 Saturday for their first victory of the season.

"I just like winning," Hill said.

The Gamecocks (1-2, 1-2 SEC) won their 12th straight in this series by dominating Vanderbilt 486-249 in total offense and three sacks on a rainy day. South Carolina had more yards rushing (290) than the Commodores had total yards.

Harris, the sophomore running back limited last season by an injured groin, had himself a day. He ran for a 25-yard TD early in the third, and he added a career-long 88-yarder early in the fourth. South Carolina coach Will Muschamp said Harris gets better as the game goes on.

"You get tired of hitting him, and there's nothing really soft on his body," Muschamp said. "He's got a short stature but he's a very muscular guy. He runs with high knees, he gets behind his pads and when you take him on there's nothing there that's soft to hit. He's a guy that wears on people as the game continues to go."

Vanderbilt (0-3, 0-3) remains winless after having 56 scholarship players available for this game, just three above the limit set by the Southeastern Conference for a team to play a game. The Commodores already had six players opt out of this season.

Vanderbilt coach Derek Mason said he learned Thursday that his numbers would be limited by injuries and contact tracing during a pandemic.

"These are challenging times, and I think in challenging times what you've got to do is just take it one day at a time ..." Mason said.

Parker White kicked a pair of field goals, including a 43-yarder that gave the Gamecocks the lead for good in the first quarter.

Vanderbilt had its chances early to either tie or take a lead. Pierson Cooke missed a 29-yard field goal wide right for Vanderbilt and is now 1 of 4 this season.

In the second quarter, the Commodores went for it on fourth-and-2 at the South Carolina 3. Freshman Ken Seals rolled right and wound up being tackled, missing the chance to throw to a receiver in the end zone when open or run himself.

"We had a chip on our shoulder because we were 0-2," Gamecocks linebacker Ernest Jones said.

Hill hit Nick Muse with a 32-yard pass, starting a 12-play, 96-yard drive that the South Carolina quarterback capped himself for a 14-point swing. Hill went over the top for a 1-yard touchdown and a 10-0 lead with 2:09 left in the first half.

South Carolina scored the final 24 points. Hill ran for a 10-yard TD in the third, and Harris broke loose for his 88-yarder and Dakereon Joyner had a 47-yard TD, both in the fourth.

GAME CHANGER

Carolina scored the final 24 points of the game, starting with a 10-yard Collin Hill touchdown run with 4:22 left in the third quarter. Kevin Harris sealed the win with an 88-yard touchdown run with 13:07 left in the fourth, the longest run by a Carolina back since 2006.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — South Carolina's Jaycee Horn was tired of hearing he didn't have the ball skills to be a truly exceptional cornerback.

His play against No. 15 Auburn proved he did — and led the Gamecocks to a breakthrough win over the Tigers on Saturday.

Horn had the first two interceptions of his career and his pass break up led to a third — all which South Carolina turned into touchdowns — for a 30-22 victory that was its first win over Auburn in 87 years.

Horn is a junior who's been a lockdown corner most of his career.

"If a team throws at him like that every game, he'll have a game like that every game," Gamecocks receiver Shi Smith said of Horn.

Horn was assigned to Auburn receiver Seth Williams, one of the best receivers in the Southeastern Conference, averaging 18 yards a catch. Williams finished with four catches for 74 yards, but no scores.

"I heard a lot of people saying I (don't) have any ball skills, which is crazy to me," Horn said. "I just knew the day would come when I'd have a lot of opportunities to make plays."

South Carolina made plenty of them throughout to beat Auburn for the first time in 87 years.

Kevin Harris ran for two touchdowns, Smith added a 10-yard TD catch and Horn and the defense did enough to stop Bo Nix and the Tigers' attack.

Auburn (2-2) had won eight straight in the series and jumped out to a 9-0 lead in the opening 10 minutes. But Nix, the sophomore quarterback, threw three picks and the Gamecocks (2-2) cashed in each time to win consecutive games for the first time in more than a year.

Smith had eight catches including his score midway through the third quarter that put South Carolina ahead for good, 20-19.

Auburn was driving on its following series when Nix threw his third interception — and second to c Horn who brought the ball down the left sidelines to the Tigers' 8. Harris was in the end zone a play later for a 27-19 lead and Auburn could not recover.

The Tigers closed to 30-22 on Anders Carlson's 22 yard field goal with 6:39 left. Auburn got the ball back once more with 2:15 left and drove to the South Carolina 13. Nix, though, was called for intentional grounding trying to avoid a sack and the Gamecocks held on to beat the Tigers for the first time since 1933.

Auburn coach Gus Malzahn said his team will have to get past this quickly. "We're just going to have to be big boys and we're going to have to man up and put it behind us and go into next week and find a way to win," he said.

South Carolina had not won back-to-back games since defeating Kentucky and then-No. 3 Georgia last season. That win over the Bulldogs was the last time the Gamecocks had beaten a ranked opponent.

Auburn's offense looked unstoppable the first half and doubled up South Carolina in yardage (243-119) the first 30 minutes — except when Nix put the ball in danger.

Nix had 272 yards passing and was sacked three times.

Bigsby, the Auburn freshman, had 111 yards rushing and went past the century mark for a second straight game.

GAME CHANGER

Leading 30-22 with 2:15 left in the contest, Auburn took the ball and its own 32 and ran 11 plays to the 12-yard line with nine seconds left. Bo Nix tried to rush for the touchdown but Ernest Jones tackled him at the nine. Auburn had a hands to the face penalty on the play, ending the game.

BATON ROUGE, LA. (AP) — LSU freshman TJ Finley passed for 265 yards and two touchdowns in his college debut. Trey Palmer scored on a 95-yard, sideline-to-sideline kickoff return and the Tigers defeated South Carolina 52-24 on Saturday night.

Filling in for injured starter Myles Brennan, Finley completed his first three passes and capped his first series with a 1-yard keeper for a touchdown. It was an auspicious start to a game in which Finley — who was highly recruited out of Ponchatoula, Louisiana — delighted the Death Valley crowd of 21,855 by completing 17 of 21 passes, including touchdowns of 7 and 51 yards to Terrace Marshall Jr.

Marshall continued his torrid start to this season. He finished with receptions six for 88 yards and now has 27 catches for 532 yards and nine touchdowns through four games this season.

South Carolina was unable to maintain its form from a week earlier, when the Gamecocks beat Auburn for the first time since 1933. Collin Hill was 12 of 22 for 234 yards and one touchdown, but also was intercepted by Eli Ricks, who returned the ball 45 yards for the first of LSU's two non-offensive touchdowns during the game.

Running back Kevin Harris largely carried the Gamecocks' offensive with 126 yards and two TDs on 12 carries.

LSU's much maligned defense gave up several more big plays, but largely redeemed itself with numerous drive-stalling sacks and held South Carolina to a field goal after Finley's lone interception gave the Gamecocks the ball inside the LSU 40. South Carolina settled for field goal tries on four promising drives, and kicker Parker White missed three from 54, 34 and 40 yards.

Palmer's kickoff return for a touchdown was the first by LSU in Tiger Stadium since Eric Martin did it in 1981. The return hardly looked promising when Palmer mishandled the kickoff and had to stop and bend over to pick it up at his own 5 as South Carolina's kickoff unit converged. But Palmer was able to side-step a couple tacklers, made his way across the width of the field and outran remaining pursuers down the opposite sideline from which he started.

LSU also looked determined to show it could run the ball after struggling to do so in a 45-41 loss in Missouri on Oct. 10 in which the Tigers failed to take a final-minute lead despite having first-and-goal from the 1. LSU rushers combined for 276 yards against the Gamecocks, with running backs John Emery and Tyrion Davis-Price each scoring from inside the 5. Davis-Price led LSU with 135 yards rushing.

GAME CHANGER

LSU took a 31-10 lead with 2:43 before halftime as Eli Ricks returned an interception 45 yards for a touchdown to give the Tigers a three-score lead before halftime.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Kellen Mond threw four touchdown passes to become the school's career leader, Isaiah Spiller ran for 131 yards and the Aggies routed South Carolina 48-3 on Saturday night.

"We're turning heads and doing a lot of things that people didn't think we were going to do," Aggies defensive tackle Bobby Brown III said. "We're going to keep turning heads, proving people wrong."

Just maybe all the way to a playoff berth. They certainly look the part against the Gamecocks.

"You always think you can be dominant," Texas A&M coach Jimbo Fisher said. "The experience has helped on each side of the ball. Learning to win each play and, in turn, the bigger picture is coming together."

Especially when Mond, Spiller and the Aggies defense play like this.

Mond set the school mark with the 68th touchdown pass of his career, a 52-yarder to Devon Achane in the third quarter with the game long decided.

Mond also ran for a score to help Texas A&M improve to 5-1 — all in the Southeastern Conference — for its best start since opening 6-0 in 2016. The Aggies are 7-0 against the Gamecocks.

Mond and Spiller helped the Aggies open a 21-0 halftime lead and cruise to their fourth consecutive victory since a loss at Alabama last month.

Spiller had two short pickups for first downs — one on a fourth-and-1 with Texas A&M in chip-shot field goal range — before Mond flipped a 4-yard TD pass to Ainius Smith.

Mond found tight end Jalen Wydermyer for two first-half scores. Wydermyer was left all alone and walked into the end zone on a 15-yard scoring grab. Right before half, Mond hit Wydermyer on a crossing route near the goal line to go up three scores.

South Carolina (2-4), coming off an off week, had no answer.

Quarterback Collin Hill was 8 of 21 for 66 yards and two interceptions before getting lifted in the fourth quarter for last year's starter and current backup, Ryan Hilinski.

Kevin Harris, the SEC's second-leading rusher coming in, was limited to 39 yards on 13 carries.

Mond had a 15-yard scoring run to start the third quarter before his long TD pass to Achane gave him his latest school record. Mond already holds career Aggies marks for completions, passing yards and total offense — probably with more on the way as his senior season continues.

He finished 16 of 26 for 224 yards.

Spiller also had two catches for 46 yards before limping off the field in the third quarter. The tailback went into the Aggies' medical tent and came out running on the sidelines. But with Texas A&M's big lead, he was not needed in the second half.

South Carolina has surrendered 1,071 yards and 100 points in losses to LSU and the Aggies its past two games.

The Gamecocks avoided their first shutout since 2018 on Parker White's 48-yard field goal with less than six minutes left.

GAME CHANGER

Texas A&M started the scoring with a 12-play, 52-yard drive, capped by a three-yard pass from Kellen Mond to Ainius Smith with 4:40 left in the first quarter. Jalen Wydermyer and Devon Achane each had a pair of touchdowns for the Aggies' offense.

OXFORD, MISS. (AP) — Matt Corral accounted for five touchdowns, including a go-ahead 91-yard touchdown strike to Elijah Moore in the fourth quarter, as Mississippi rallied to defeat South Carolina 59-42 on Saturday night.

Trailing 42-38, Corral found a wide-open Moore waiting in the middle of the field at the South Carolina 45-yard line. Moore then turned and raced into the end zone to put Ole Miss ahead to stay, 45-42 with 12:02 remaining.

During the play, Ole Miss coach Lane Kiffin tossed his clipboard 20 yards in the air at the catch and raced up the sidelines 30 yards before stopping to celebrate with a fist pump as Moore completed the game's decisive play.

Ole Miss (3-4, 3-4 Southeastern Conference) finished with 708 yards of offense, the most in school history in an SEC game. Corral finished 28 of 32 for 513 yards passing, a school record, including four touchdowns. Corral added a 3-yard touchdown run, while Jerrion Ealy rushed for 84 yards on 17 carries with touchdown runs of 12 and 5 yards.

Moore had 13 receptions for 225 yards, including touchdown catches of 91 and 25 yards, both during the fourth-quarter surge. Lakin Henry had 10 tackles and A.J. Finley had an interception as Ole Miss stopped the final three South Carolina offensive series.

Kevin Harris led South Carolina (2-5, 2-5) with 243 yards rushing on 25 carries, including a school-record five touchdown runs of 46, 11, 44 and 12 yards. The Gamecocks rallied from a 31-21 deficit early in the third quarter to take a 42-38 lead early in the fourth.

Collin Hill was 17 of 28 for 230 yards passing with an 11-yard touchdown pass to Shi Smith, who finished with 10 receptions for 117 yards. South Carolina had 548 yards of total offense and linebacker Ernest Jones had a game-high 18 tackles.

GAME CHANGER

Ole Miss' defense forced Carolina to punt with 9:17 left in the game with a 45-42 lead. The Rebels took advantage with an eight-play, 80-yard drive that ended with a 5-yard touchdown run by Jerrion Ealy with 6:09 left to give the Rebels the two-score lead on their way to a victory.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Missouri coach Eli Drinkwitz was proud his team wouldn't let the obstacles they've faced this season keep them from success.

And he happily congratulated them, COVID-19 worries and all, after the Tigers' 17-10 victory over South Carolina on Saturday night.

Coronavirus has severely impacted the Tigers this year: they had just 52 scholarship players available this week and defensive coordinator Ryan Walters remained at home because of contact tracing concerns.

Still, Missouri and quarterback Connor Bazelak opened a 17-0 lead in the first half and defense held on to defeat the Gamecocks 17-10 on Saturday night.

The Tigers hadn't played since Oct. 31 because of a bye week and a postponement of their game last week with Georgia. Drinkwitz wasn't sure he'd get this one either with his dwindling roster.

Instead, they played like a winning SEC team as Bazelak threw for 203 yards and a touchdown and the defense, under substitute coordinator David Gibbs, choked off the Gamecocks when it mattered most.

Larry Rountree III rushed for a score and became the Tigers all-time time rushing leader among running backs for the Tigers (3-3 Southeastern Conference).

It was the fourth straight loss for South Carolina (2-6), which fired coach Will Muschamp last Sunday and took a half to get itself going.

Bazelak and the Missouri offense weren't crisp. Then again, they didn't have to be as the Tigers opened up a 17-0 lead by halftime and kept the Gamecocks off balance much of the way.

South Carolina managed just 68 yards and five first downs in the opening half, punting five times and failing to convert a fourth down in six series before halftime.

The Tigers essentially put the game out of reach on Bazelak's pretty 20-yard TD throw to Tauskie Dove midway through the opening quarter.

Rountree's 1-yard burst made it 14-0 and Missouri ended the half with Harrison Mevis' 20-yard field goal to head to the locker room up 17-0.

Rountree finished with 58 yards, giving the senior 3,238 for his career and moving him past Zack Abrom who played from 2000-03. Only quarterback Brad Smith is ahead of Rountree's school career rushing total with 4,289 yards.

Carolina freshman quarterback Luke Doty provided a second-half spark in place of season-long starter Collin Hill, rallying the team to within a touchdown after Deshaun Fenwick's 1-yard TD run made it 17-10.

The Gamecocks had one last drive, but Doty was intercepted by Devin Nicholson and Missouri held on for the win.

Mike Bobo, the first-year offensive coordinator elevated to interim coach, talked this week of settling nerves and restoring effort for a fragile group of players. But during the week, several players opted out of the season including starting cornerbacks — and likely NFL draft picks — Jaycee Horn and Israel Mukuamu.

In addition, Bobo said two defensive line starters in Aaron Sterling and Brad Johnson were lost for the year with injuries.

That opened things up for the Tigers and Bazelak, who completed 13 of 21 passes for 140 yards the first 30 minutes.

GAME CHANGER

South Carolina scored 10 second half points and had the ball on its 1-yard line with 2:37 left. The offense drove to its 36 before an interception with 53 seconds left gave the Tigers the seven-point win.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — No. 13 Georgia's 45-16 win over South Carolina was the Bulldogs' biggest victory of this strange season on the scoreboard.

But Georgia coach Kirby Smart wasn't sure had its best game Saturday night, with the Gamecocks missing more than two dozen players and offering little resistance.

"It's hard to say that because of the quality of the competition," Smart said.

James Cook ran for 104 yards on just six carries and three other Georgia backs had at least 77 yards. It was barely a game from the start. Georgia (6-2) led 21-0 after three possessions and South Carolina (2-7) had yet to get a first down.

The Gamecocks can barely field a team. Nearly 20 players couldn't play because of injuries or COVID-19 issues. Another seven players have opted out, several since the school fired coach Will Muschamp two weeks ago.

Still, Smart said he was happy for the fast start and the 332 yards his team gained on the ground.

"They didn't play down to that level," Smart said. "They knocked people off the ball."

After throwing for 401 yards in his first start last week, Southern California transfer JT Daniels was 10 for 16 for 139 yards with two touchdowns and an interception.

Daniels overthrew a few open receivers and took two sacks, but Smart said he thought the sophomore did fine, making sure he only made a few mistakes.

"He took the things the defense gave to him," Smart said.

Zamir White ran 13 times for 84 yards, Kenny McIntosh had 79 yards on nine carries, and Daijun Edwards ran 14 times for 77 yards. The Bulldogs didn't attempt a pass after Daniels' 31-yard touchdown strike to Arian Smith on the first play of the fourth quarter gave them a 45-10 lead.

Georgia got the ball back with 9:27 left and ran 12 straight times, taking a knee at first-and-goal at the 1 to mercifully end it. The Bulldogs averaged 8 yards a run when Daniels sacks were removed from their total.

South Carolina interim coach Mike Bobo said he was proud that the players he had fought hard and didn't give up even as Georgia tried to score in the closing moments.

"Part of being a man is you don't make excuses and you don't let people make excuses for you," said Bobo, whose South Carolina team was without leading receiver Shi Smith and SEC sack leader Kingsley Enagbare.

South Carolina has lost five in a row, allowing at least 45 points in four of the defeats.

GAME CHANGER

South Carolina chipped away at the early Georgia lead, cutting the Bulldog advantage to 21-10 after a 1-yard Kevin Harris touchdown run and a Parker White 39-yard field goal with 8:23 left in the first half, but a 29-yard James Cook touchdown run with 4:31 left put UGA up, 28-10, going into the locker room.

LEXINGTON, KY. (AP) — Chris Rodriguez Jr. rushed for three touchdowns, Terry Wilson and A.J. Rose each rushed for one, and Kentucky rolled South Carolina 41-18 Saturday night in the regular season finale for both schools.

Looking to halt a two-game slide and remain in consideration for the postseason, the Wildcats (4-6, 4-6 Southeastern Conference) scored on five of their first seven possessions to lead 27-3 at halftime. Their highest first-half output this season was aided by 10 points off two of their three takeaways, including two fumble recoveries by Jordan Wright.

Rodriguez returned from a two-game absence to rush for first-half TDs of 1 and 2 yards around Rose's 8-yard score before sealing the rout with a 79-yard burst down the left side with 4:56 remaining. Wilson added a 1-yard TD run early in the third quarter as the Wildcats outgained the Gamecocks (2-8, 2-8) 492-404.

Wilson, the senior quarterback, finished 17 of 26 passing for 201 yards and rushed for 46 to break 1,000 career. Rodriguez had 139 yards on 14 carries and Rose 101 on 14 carries as Kentucky dealt South Carolina its sixth consecutive loss.

Kevin Harris rushed for 210 yards and a touchdown on 21 carries to become the 11th Gamecock with 1,000 in a season. Luke Doty's 30-yard TD pass to Dakereon Joyner and two-point conversion to Nick Muse with 5:12 left made it 34-18 before Rodriguez's big TD run.

GAME CHANGER

South Carolina looked to get on the board on its first possession, but a holding call negated the score and led to a missed field goal. Kentucky had a field goal on its first possession, scored 10 points in the first frame and had 27 in the first half on its way to victory.

KEY STAT

1,138 — Kevin Harris became the ninth Gamecock to reach 1,000 yards in a season as the Hinesville, Ga., native rushed for 210 yards on 21 carries in the Kentucky game.
