Head coach Dawn Staley showed no fear in her scheduling this season, especially in early games. South Carolina will face a ranked opponent in two of its first five games with a third, South Dakota, just

outside the top 25 in both polls. Four of those five games are on the road or at a neutral site. Returning all 11 players from last season's NCAA Final

Four team, South Carolina's defensive effort in the season opener Tuesday night was no surprise. The Gamecocks held #5/4 NC State to just 57 points after opponents averaged just 58.1 points against them last season. The Wolfpack shot 27.3 percent in the second quarter to score just eight points in the period.

- The Gamecocks' annual block party started right away this season with Aliyah Boston blocking just the second shot attempt from NC State. Her five blocks against the Wolfpack led a nine-block effort. Last season, South Carolina's 7.0 blocks per game ranked second in the nation, and the Gamecocks added the ACC's top shot blocker in transfer Kamilla Cardoso.
- Junior Zia Cooke continued the offensive consistency that she found at the end of last season's NCAA Tournament. The preseason All-American shot 6-of-13 (.462) at NC State after closing last season with a threegame 23-of-51 (.451) shooting stretch.
- Senior point guard Destanni Henderson will be looking to reclaim the Sanford Pentagon magic that led her to be named the MVP of the Bad Boy Mowers Crossover Classic last season. Over those two games, she poured in 21.0 points per game on 14-of-24 (.583) shooting and grabbed 6.0 rebounds per game.
- Senior Destiny Littleton made an early pitch to increase her playing time this season with a solid second quarter off the bench at NC State as she scored seven of the team's nine points in the period and grabbed four rebounds.

Five-Second Count

South Carolina women's basketball is in the midst of its most successful era, claiming at least 20 wins for the last 10 seasons, including four 30-win seasons in the last seven campaigns. The Gamecocks have played in the NCAA Final Four three times in the last six NCAA Tournaments, including winning the 2017 National Championship, and have been ranked in the AP Top 25 for 169 consecutive weeks, including 38 straight weeks in the top 10. Staley has led the Gamecocks to their only No. 1 rankings in program history (12 weeks in 2014-15, 10 weeks in 2019-20, 3 weeks in 2020-21, 1 week in 2021-22), five SEC regular-season titles and six SEC Tournament championships.

Under Staley's leadership, seven Gamecocks have earned All-America status, two have earned SEC Player of the Year honors and 16 have picked up All-SEC recognition at least once. Eight Gamecocks have been selected in the WNBA Draft in the last six years, including 2018 No. 1 overall pick A'ja Wilson, who went on to become the Gamecocks' second-straight WNBA Rookie of the Year (2018) and the program's first WNBA MVP (2020).

Neutral Stance

The Gamecocks are 144-94 (605) all-time on a neutral court. South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley is 61-26 in games played at neutral sites, including a 23-11 mark in regular-season games.

Schedule Strength

South Carolina's 10 games against teams in either the AP or USA Today/WBCA Preseason Top 25 rank are the third-most in the nation, trailing just Stanford (12) and Maryland (11). Michigan, Tennessee and Texas also have nine confirmed such games on their schedule. The Gamecocks have a chance to add two more games based on results in the Battle 4 Atlantis (Nov. 20-22).

The Gamecocks are the only team to face each of the other four teams in the preseason top five of both polls, giving them the lowest non-conference opponent ranking average in the country.

Ranking Review

The Gamecocks open the season atop both primary national polls for the second time in as many seasons.

In the AP Poll, the Gamecocks have appeared in each of the last 169 weeks, giving them the fourth-longest active streak in the nation, which dates back to Dec. 10, 2021. They have spent the last 38 of those weeks ranked in the top 10 and have been No. 1 in the poll 16

In the USA Today/WBCA Coaches' Poll, South Carolina has been in the top 10 since claiming the No. 10 spot in the 2019-20 preseason poll. It has been No. 1 in this poll 12 times in the last eight seasons.

Staley's Stand

In October, the University of South Carolina awarded head coach Dawn Staley a seven-year contract totaling \$22.4 million. With a guaranteed \$2.9 million this season, the move made Staley the highest paid women's basketball coach at a public institution (matching Geno Auriemma at UConn) and the highest paid Black coach in her sport.

Ever the trailblazer, Staley emphasized that her negotiations were about more than her contract. They were founded in her desire to make a point about the inequality in salaries for women, and Black women in particular, throughout her sport and across all professions.

TEAM THEME: NETWORTH

South Carolina's 2021-22 season theme "Net Worth" taps into the universal symbol of success in basketball – cutting down the nets. Each member of the team, the program and the fan base plays a role in the march toward achieving that level of success.

Every role is not the same, but every person has a "Net Worth" – an added value necessary for the team to achieve its goals.

Head coach Dawn Staley's program develops a different theme each season to amplify the team's goals and mindset for the season ahead.

The Staley File

In 21 seasons as a head coach, Dawn Staley has a .734 (504-183) winning percentage, which ranks 12th in the nation among active head coaches with at least 10 seasons of experience (seventh among Power 5 conference coaches). The unanimous 2020 National Coach of the Year, she became the first person to win both a Naismith Player of the Year Trophy and a Naismith Coach of the Year Trophy.

In her 14th season leading the Gamecocks, Staley is the program's all-time winningest coach (331) with a program-record 10 postseason appearances (9 NCAA/1 WNIT). She accounts for all three of the Gamecocks' Final Four appearances (2015, 2017, 2021) and the first national championship in program history (2017).

After winning five SEC regular-season titles, Staley has won 152 SEC games to rank second among active league coaches (Gary Blair, Texas A&M, 154) and fourth all-time. Her 11.7 SEC wins average is the best in league history, and her .738 SEC winning percentage (152-54) is second only to Tennessee's Pat Summitt (.874) in league history.

Oh Captain, My Captain

For the second time in as many seasons, senior Victaria Saxton and junior Aliyah Boston will serve as team captains. It is Saxton's third season in that position.

All-Everything Aliyah Boston

From her career debut triple-double to becoming the only 2021 finalist for both the Naismith Trophy and Naismith Defensive Player of the Year, junior Aliyah Boston has spent two seasons on the national stage. In her third campaign, she is poised to rise to the top step.

Boston enters her third season as a two-time All-

American and two-time Lisa Leslie Center Award winner. She averages a double-double for her career (13.1 ppg/10.4 rpg) while her 30 career double-doubles leads all active SEC players and ranks eighth in program history. In 29 career games against ranked opponents, her averages rise to 13.5 ppg and 11.3 rpg.

Boston is USA Today's Preseason Player of the Year and a unanimous First-Team All-American. Dropping 23 pounds since the start of her sophomore season, Boston was all about basketball this summer, helping the U.S. to gold at the FIBA AmeriCup and spending time training with NBA legend Tim Duncan.

Glass Ceiling

Since the start of the 2019-20 season, the Gamecocks dominated on the glass, ranking among the NCAA's top five in rebounds per game and rebounding margin every season and sixth in offensive rebounds per game each of the last two full seasons. In the last 65 games played, South Carolina has been out-rebounded just three times, still winning all three games.

Block Party

South Carolina annually ranks among the best shot blocking teams in the country and finished the 2020-21 season second in the nation with 7.0 blocks per game, including 7.6 in SEC play. The Gamecocks opened 2021-22 on the same path with nine blocks at #5/4 NC State (Nov. 9).

With all three primary shot blockers in Aliyah Boston, Victaria Saxton and Laeticia Amihere back, the Gamecocks added another layer this season with the addition of transfer Kamilla Cardoso, who led the ACC

Senior Destanni Henderson made her debut on the national stage with a Preseason Second-Team All-America nod from USA Today. She was a Preseason All-SEC Second Team selection and was named to the Nancy Lieberman Point Guard watch list.

Sophomore Kamilla Cardoso and freshman Sania Fegain got in on the positional award recognition. Cardoso joined Boston on the Lisa Leslie Award list, which Feagin made the Katrina McClain Power Forward Award watch list.

Tonight's game is the third between South Carolina and South Dakota in the last three seasons while it is the second straight here in the Sanford Pentagon.

The Gamecocks opened the 2020 Bad Boy Mowers Crossover Classic against South Dakota with a 81-71 victory. After going into the half tied, the Gamecocks used a 10-2 run to open the third quarter behind solid rebounding and an aggressive offense that delivered 3-of-4 shooting and forced the Coyotes into four fouls in the opening three minutes. Destanni Henderson scored 10 of her game-high 19 points in that decisive quarter.

South Carolina's 68-42 lead held up in a fourth quarter that saw the South Dakota shoot 64.3 percent from the field to outscore the Gamecocks 23-13.

The state of South Carolina has rallied around head coach Dawn Staley's program in unprecedented numbers as the Gamecocks have led the nation in average attendance in each of the last six seasons. The Gamecocks were one of a few programs to finish the season averaging over 10,000 fans and boast five sellouts (18,000) in the last five seasons of full capacity arenas.

Colonial Life Arena is more than just the home of South Carolina men's and women's basketball, though. It is also a thriving entertainment venue that the city of Columbia and its surrounding metropolitan area are able to enjoy throughout the year.

Colonial Life Arena is the largest arena in the state of South Carolina with 18,000 seats, and the 10th-largest on-campus basketball facility in the nation. Located on the beautiful University of South Carolina campus, this one-of-a-kind facility features 41 suites, four entertainment suites, and the Frank McGuire Club, a full-service hospitality room that has a capacity of 300. The state-of-the-art facility also features plush seating, a technologically advanced sound system and a one-of-a-kind selection of unique concession foods that will delight fans of all ages.

In Summer 2017, a 12-display center-hung video board and ribbon boards were added to the arena bowl at a cost of 4.2 million. The center-hung board features four convex-curved main displays that measure approximately $12' \times 20'$ and can show any combination of live video, instant replays, statistics and game information, graphics and animations, and sponsorship messages.

The Arena has hosted numerous sold out shows, including Barnum and Bailey Circus, Paul McCartney, country superstars Kenny Chesney and Taylor Swift, WWE Wrestling, Kanye West and numerous other acts.

The largest building ever constructed at the University of South Carolina at 342,000 square feet, the Arena has an intimate double-deck design that puts every seat close to the action. The cantilever of the upper deck over the lower deck extends further than any other arena of its size with great sight lines.

Two spacious locker rooms for Gamecock men's and women's basketball include team meeting rooms, recruiting rooms, coaches locker rooms and an athletic training room.

14th Season at South Carolina

Catapulting South Carolina into the national spotlight, Dawn Staley has made the Gamecocks a mainstay in the battle for SEC and national championships. Under her leadership, the Gamecocks have reached many firsts – National Championship, NCAA Final Fours, No. 1 rankings, SEC regular-season and tournament titles, SEC Player of the Year, National Player of the Year, WNBA No. 1 Draft pick and No. 1 recruiting classes – to name the most notable.

Staley's 13 seasons at the helm of the Gamecocks include:

- 2017 NCAA National Championship
- Three NCAA Final Fours in the last six tournaments (2015, 2017, 2021)
- Ranking in the AP Top 25 every week since Dec. 10, 2012, including 96 weeks in the top five
- 26 weeks ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll, including the first-ever final No. 1 ranking in program history (2019-20)
- Nine 25-win seasons, including four 30-win campaigns led by a school-record 34 victories in 2014-15
- Five SEC regular-season championships (2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2020)
- Six SEC Tournament titles (2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2020, 2021)
- Three top-two recruiting classes (#1 in 2021, #1 in 2019, #2 in 2014)
- Seven NCAA Attendance titles (2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021)

While her coaching career is in full bloom, Staley is still recognized for her body of work as a one of the most decorated participants in United States women's basketball history. The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame solidified that legacy with her enshrinement as part of the Class of 2013. The Phoenix Club of Philadelphia established the Dawn Staley Award recognizing the nation's top guard in women's Division I basketball in 2013 as well. Staley was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2012 and was one of the final nominees for induction to the U.S. Olympic Hall of Fame the same year. In the summer of 2011, the WNBA recognized her as one of the league's "Top 15," honoring the most influential players in the league's history.

In 21 seasons as a head coach, Staley has led her college teams to 1125-win seasons, a total of 17 postseason appearances (two WNIT) and 128 weeks in the Associated Press top 10, including 25 in the No. 1 spot.

Also a force in USA Basketball, Staley was named the U.S. Women's National Team head coach for 2017-21, leading the U.S. to 2018 FIBA World Cup gold to earn USAB National Coach of the Year honors that year, adding gold medals at the 2019 and 2021 FIBA AmeriCups and stretching the U.S. Olympic gold medal streak to seven straight at the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games. Prior to that appointment, Staley led three other U.S. teams to gold medals – 2015 FIBA U19 World Championships, 2014 FIBA U18 Americas Championship, 2007 Pan Am Games – and served as an assistant on the Senior National Team 2006-08 and again 2014-16, during which the U.S. claimed gold in the 2014 FIBA World Championship and the 2008 and 2016 Olympics.

At the helm of the Gamecocks over the last 13 seasons, Staley has twice been named National Coach of the Year (2014, 2020) with her 2020 unanimous selection making her the first former Naismith Player of the Year to earn the Naismith Coach of the Year award. She is a four-time SEC Coach of the Year and was the 2012 BCA Female Coach of the Year. She is the only Gamecock basketball coach – men's or women's – to amass 300 victories at South Carolina and became the fastest coach to 200 wins in program history, needing just 277 games at South Carolina to reach the plateau.

Staley has coached a National Player of the Year (A'ja Wilson, 2018) and a National Freshman of the Year (Aliyah Boston, 2020). Under her leadership, seven Gamecocks have collected 17 All-America selections, two have picked up five SEC Player of the Year honors, three have earned SEC Defensive Player of the Year recognition a total of five times, one has been the SEC 6th Player of the Year and six were named SEC Freshman of the Year. She has coached 16 Gamecocks to All-SEC honors a combined 31 times, including 16 first-team selections, and eight Gamecocks have been selected in the WNBA Draft in the last five seasons, including 2018 No. 1 pick A'ja Wilson who went on to earn WNBA Rookie of the Year honors a year after Allisha Gray became the first Gamecock to capture the honor in 2017. Two other Gamecock draftees have earned WNBA All-Rookie Team honors as well.




