STORY LINES

SERIES VS. SOUTH CAROLINA | MAYOR'S CUP TROPHY

- Missouri leads the series with South Carolina, 6-5. The Gamecocks hold a 5-4 edge since the Tigers joined the Southeastern Conference in 2012. Last time out, Mizzou took a 49-14 win in Columbia, S.C. during the 2020 season. Last time in CoMo, the Tigers won 27-0.
- Mizzou and South Carolina has developed into one of the Tigers' better rivalry games since joining the SEC. The two teams play for the Mayor's Cup Trophy as both school's home cities are Columbia.

2020: MIZZOU AT SOUTH CAROLINA

Mizzou defeated South Carolina, 17-10, on Nov. 21., to claim the Mayor's Cup Trophy for the second consecutive season. Despite being a limited roster due to COVID and injuries, Mizzou opened a 17-0 lead by the intermission and never looked back. The Tiger defense was the story Saturday, limiting the Gamecocks to just 283 yards on 11 drives, as linebacker Nick Bolton led the way with a team-high 14 tackles, two of which went for a loss.

LAST TIME OUT: MIZZOU

No. 1 Georgia used a blocked punt for a safety and a touchdown drive following the ensuing free kick during a 19-point second quarter and went on to a 43-6 victory over Missouri. With Connor Bazalak out with an injury, freshman Tyler Macon and redshirt freshman Brady Cook split Mizzou's quarterback assignment, each leading five drives. Macon completed 6-of-13 passes for 74 yards and was the Tigers' leading rusher with 42 yards on 11 carries. Cook was 14-of-19 for 78 yards and ran 10 times for 32 yards. They each led scoring drives that ended in Harrison Mevis field goals. Tyler Badie ran nine times for 41 yards and caught five passes for 10 yards. Three Tigers finished with double-digit tackles with Chad Bailey, Jaylon Carlies and Martez Manuel all making 10 stops. Carlies also snagged his fourth interception of the season.

LAST TIME OUT: SOUTH CAROLINA

South Carolina routed Florida, 40-17, on Saturday night. First-time starter Jason Brown threw for two touchdowns, Kevin Harris and ZaQuandre White each rushed for over 100 yards and South Carolina's defense held the potent Gators' attack to just 82 yards rushing. The Gators entered averaging 242 yards per game on the ground and 483 yards of total offense, third best in the SEC. But South Carolina became the first team this season to outgain them, 459-340. Parker White had a career-best four field goals and defensive tackle Jabari Ellis had an 18-yard fumble recovery touchdown to put South Carolina up 30-10 at halftime.

GIVE BADIE HIS DUE

- One of the nation's premier running backs, Tyler Badie became the fifth player in the country to eclipse 1,000 rushing yards this season. The senior ranks 10th nationally in rushing yards (1030), yards per game (114.4), 11th in total points (90) and fifth in total touchdowns (15). Each of those marks lead the SEC. Badie is also second in the SEC and fifth nationally in scoring (10.0 ppg) and 18th nationally and second in rushing touchdowns (11).
- The running back is poised to fly up the Mizzou single-season rushing list, needing just 68 yards to tie Bob Stueber's 1942 campaign for 10th in the all-time record books.
- Badie has rushed for over 200 yards on three different occasions this season (254 vs. Vanderbilt, 209 vs. North Texas, 203 vs. CMU). He is the only player in the country with three, 200-yard games this season and one of just five SEC players to complete the feat since 2000 (Leonard Fournette, Derrick Henry, Lynn Bowden Jr. and Trayveon Williams).
- His 254-yard rushing performance at Vanderbilt marked the most by a Mizzou back in the SEC era (2012-pres.) and the fifth most in program history. He is the first Tiger to rush for 200 yards three times in one season and one of just two Mizzou players to post three, 200-yard games in his career, joining Brad Smith.
- With his 17-yard reception against Tennessee, Badie became the first Mizzou Tiger in program history to reach 1,000 rushing yards and 1,000 receiving yards in his career. He became the first SEC player to reach the mark since Kentucky wide receiver Lynn Bowden, Jr., did so in 2019.

PRESS BOX

- The Memorial Stadium / Faurot Field press box (6th floor, west side) will open to working media 90 minutes prior to kick off. The space is accessible using the elevator at Gate 5W.
- The north and south seating areas of the press box will be utilized to accommodate for social distancing.
- Everyone entering and working in the press box must wear a mask covering nose and mouth, regardless of vaccination status.

STORY LINES

- Another first, Badie is the lone Tiger to score a combination of 15 rushing scores and 10 receiving TDs.
- Badie is the first Tiger since Jeremy Maclin in 2007 to record four rushing and receiving touchdowns in a season.
- His 203-yard performance in the season opener was the first by a Tiger since Larry Rountree went for 204 in Dec. 2018 against Oklahoma State. The 203 rushing yards were the 15th most in Mizzou history.
- At Kentucky, Badie hauled in a career-best 10 receptions for 88 yards. He became the first Tiger to catch 10 passes in a game since Emanuel Hall did so against Wyoming in 2018.
- Badie is one of five Tigers to accumulate 500 yards on the ground and receiving alongside:

BAILEY BRINGING THE BOOM

- Redshirt junior linebacker Chad Bailey has made the most of his opportunity to step into the starting lineup this season, racking up 23 of his 31 tackles in his five starts.
- Bailey produced a career day at No. 1 Georgia, making 10 tackles to help the Mizzou rush defense to its best performance of the season.
- At Vanderbilt, Bailey made two tackles for loss and recorded his first career sack in a six tackle effort.

IN THE ZONE

- Mizzou sits second in the SEC in red zone efficiency, scoring on 26-of-28 trips this season.
- The Tigers have scored touchdowns on 75 percent of their trips to the red zone.
- Mizzou has 12 rushing touchdowns and nine passing touchdowns inside the 20 this season.

FOLLOW THE MANUEL

- Mizzou safety Martez Manuel leads the Tigers with 59 tackles this season, including a team-leading 45 solo stops.
- Manuel needs just five tackles to match his 2020 campaign which marks his career best with 64 tackles on the season.
- The junior earned his first interception at Vanderbilt, icing the game with a pick of Mike Wright with 1:31 on the clock in the fourth quarter.
- The junior's six tackles for loss are one off his single-season best set last year in 2020.
- His 2.5 sacks match his single-season best set in 2020.
- He had a career-high 10 solo stops against Tennessee while matching his personal best of 11 total tackles.
- The versatile Manuel is tied for the team lead with a pair of quarterback pressures as well.

KAD ALL THE WAY

- Kris Abrams-Draine produced a 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown against Tennessee. It was the first kickoff return touchdown for Mizzou since 2014 when Marcus Murphy housed a 96-yard return at Florida.
- The 100-yard return was just the fifth 100-yarder in program history and the first of its kind since Oct. 30, 1976 when receiver Joe Stewart went endzone-to-endzone against Oklahoma State.

- Abrams-Draine is one of 27 players to take a kickoff back for a touchdown this season.

GOOD ON THIRD

- Mizzou ranks 18th in the country on third downs, converting 47 percent of the time.
- The Tigers' conversion rate ranks fourth in the SEC through nine games on the season.

HOLD ON TO THAT FOOTBALL

- Mizzou is only team in the country which has yet to lose a fumble this season. The Tigers have ran 574 offensive plays thus far.
- The Tigers have put the ball on the ground just twice all season, but recovered one while the other bounced out of bounds.

MEVIS MAGIC

- Sophomore kicker Harrison Mevis - the SEC Special teams Player of the Week for Oct. 30 - saw his consecutive made field goals streak end at 20 last week. The streak was the longest in the nation.
- Still, the "Thicker Kicker" is 13-for-14 this season including 3-for-3 from beyond 50 yards and 7-for-8 from 40-49.
- Mevis started his season with a bang, drilling a 53-yard field goal in the waning seconds of the first half to give Mizzou a lead over Central Michigan. The kick was a then-career-long from Mevis and had plenty of leg to spare.
- He was equally impressive at Boston College, hitting a career-long 56-yard boot to send the game to overtime.
- Mevis is now 7-for-8 in his career from beyond 50 yards.
- He is one of just two Tigers in program history to make five or more kicks of 50+ yards, joining Tom Whelihan (6, 1984-87).

HAIL KEKE

- Senior wideout Keke Chism turned the momentum when he hauled in a first-half ending Hail Mary to give Mizzou a 17-14 lead at Vanderbilt.
- The 45-yard snag among seven Commodore defenders in the endzone was Chism's second TD of the year and second-longest catch of the season.
- Both of Chism's TD grabs have come late in the first half, with the other coming with four seconds left on the clock at Kentucky.

BENSON BLOCKS IT

- Walk-on Stephen Benson produced Mizzou's first blocked punt of the season at Vanderbilt.
- The blocked punt was Mizzou's first since the 2020 game against Georgia.
- Benson transferred in to Mizzou from NAIA Culver-Stockton College in Canton, Mo.

BAZELAK CREATES COMPLETIONS

- Redshirt sophomore Connor Bazalak has already produced a career-best 13 touchdown passes through seven games on the season. The QB is completing 68.2 percent of his passes in 2021, good for fourth in the SEC and 21st nationally.
- Bazalak has thrown for over 200 yards in six games this season, including three, 300-yard performances.
- The QB is seventh nationally and second in the SEC in completions per game at 25.8.



STORY LINES

- The redshirt sophomore has thrown a touchdown pass in six-of-eight games this season.
- At Kentucky, Bazalak matched his career high by slinging four touchdown passes. He finished the day 34-for-51 for 294 yards in the air. The 34 completions mark a career high for the Tiger QB.
- During the Kentucky game, Bazalak passed the 3,000 career passing yards mark in his 15th game played.

SCORE ON D

- Mizzou produced its first defensive score of the season against North Texas, as Trajan Jeffcoat deflected a pass which was intercepted by freshman defensive lineman Mekhi Wingo and returned 40 yards for a touchdown.
- The interception was the first of Wingo's career and marked the first time a Mizzou defensive lineman has scored since Akial Byers in 2018.
- The INT return for TD was part of a three-turnover performance for the Tigers' defense. Kris Abrams-Draine picked off a pass to setup Mizzou's first score of the day and later recovered a fumble forced by corner Akayleb Evans.
- Evans forced two fumbles on the day, the first two FF of his career.
- Mizzou scored 14 points off the three turnovers.

SPREADING THE LOVE

- Nine different Tigers have already hauled in a touchdown reception this season. The nine players with a TD grab are the most since 2018 at Mizzou when nine Tigers also made TD catches that season.
- Five Tigers have multiple TD receptions, led by Tyler Badie with four.
- This season, 16 different Tigers have caught a pass through four games. Five Tigers have made their first career TD grabs.

TAKE YOUR PICK

- Mizzou's secondary has snagged an interception in eight of the nine contests played this season.
- The Tigers have a total of 10 interceptions, ranking 23rd nationally.
- Six different Tigers have an interception this season, as Martez Manuel joined the INT crew with his first career pick at Vanderbilt.
- Jaylon Carlies leads the way with four INTs, Kris Abrams-Draine has two, while Manuel, Akayleb Evans, Shawn Robinson and Mekhi Wingo have one each.

LONG-RANGE TIGERS

- Mizzou's offense set a historic mark against SEMO, scoring from beyond 45-yards on five occasions. The five touchdowns of 45+ yards mark the most in a single-game in Mizzou history.
- The previous high was four touchdowns of 45+ yards, set against Iowa State in 1942.
- This was the second time under coach Drinkwitz the Tigers had at least four touchdowns of 20+ yards, a feat the squad accomplished against LSU in 2020.
- Mizzou's five TDs of 45+ yards against SEMO were a 49-yard run by Tyler Badie, 55-yard run by Michael Cox, 46-yard catch by Boo Smith from Connor Bazalak, 52-yard reception by Chance Luper from Bazalak and 65-yard pass from Tyler Macon to JJ Hester.

KAD GETS HIS INT

- Sophomore defensive back Kris Abrams-Draine has

quite the journey through his first two seasons at Mizzou. After playing receiver in 2020, he made the switch to DB for his second season.

- Abrams-Draine has been a regular in the defensive backfield, making starts in two of the three games so far this season. He's recorded six total tackles and three pass breakups.
- Against SEMO, KAD notched another milestone with his first interception on a leaping grab over the receiver. The play led to a Mizzou TD on the ensuing drive.
- Abrams-Draine made his second INT on North Texas' first drive of the game, setting up a Mizzou touchdown drive.

CARLIES CREATING HAVOC

- Sophomore safety Jaylon Carlies has been a force at the back of Mizzou's defense, creating five turnovers for the Tigers.
- The safety picked up his fourth INT of the season at Georgia, tying Carlies for fourth nationally and second in the SEC this season.
- Carlies recorded his first collegiate interception in the season opener against Central Michigan. He made it two-straight games with an INT by pulling in a deflected pass from Kentucky QB Will Levis in week two.
- The back-to-back INTs made Carlies the first Mizzou player to pick off a pass in consecutive games since Adam Sparks accomplished the feat against Vanderbilt and Arkansas in 2017.
- The safety also made one of the biggest plays of the game, forcing a UK fumble late in the first half which was recovered by the Tigers in the end zone. The play led to a Mizzou touchdown with four seconds to play in the half, pull the Black & Gold within seven at the break.

kickoff and three that finished at No. 1 (Alabama), No. 7 (Florida) and No. 8 (Georgia) in the final College Football Playoff ranking, while a fourth loss came in week two at then-No. 21 Tennessee. Mizzou's five SEC wins are the second-most ever behind its 7-1 mark that it posted en route to winning back-to-back SEC East crowns in 2013 and 2014.

Despite playing with less than 60 scholarship players for more than half of their games in 2020 and having just three games played on their original dates, the Tigers overcame an 0-2 start to win five of their final eight games down the stretch, a run that included:

- A goal-line stand in the closing minute to hold off defending National Champion LSU, 45-41.
- Snapping Kentucky's five-game series win streak with a 20-10 victory that wasn't nearly as close as the final score indicated.
- Mizzou's first win in Columbia East since 2014, a 17-10 decision at South Carolina and a thrilling come-from-behind 50-48 walk-off victory over Arkansas, its fifth-straight in the series.
- An appearance at No. 25 in the College Football Playoff rankings Dec. 7, only the third season the program has appeared in the CFP's seven-year run.

Of the SEC's four new head coaches to begin work in the nation's toughest conference in 2020, Drinkwitz's 5-5 regular-season record was the league's best, ahead of Ole Miss' Lane Kiffin (4-5), Mississippi State's Mike Leach (3-7) and Arkansas' Sam Pittman (3-7). In addition, Drinkwitz and his staff signed a top-25 recruiting class currently ranked No. 20 by Rivals.com (highest ranking in program history) to help secure a promising future for the storied Mizzou program.

Drinkwitz's offensive acumen has been a key element in his team's winning five conference championships while compiling a perfect 8-0 bowl game record in 11 seasons at the FBS level. The combined record of his teams from 2010-20 is 103-39 overall (.725), including a 62-27 conference mark (.687).

The 2019 campaign saw Drinkwitz turn in one of the most impressive FBS head coaching debut seasons ever. His Mountaineers set a Sun Belt record with their 12 wins, and also set the mark for the best regular season in conference history (11-1). They claimed the Sun Belt Championship with a 45-38 win against Louisiana on Dec. 7.

Also in 2019, App State became the first-ever Sun Belt program to earn a top 20 ranking in the Associated Press poll, while also becoming the first team in league history to receive an in-season ranking in the College Football Playoff poll. Drinkwitz's team also made history in 2019 with a pair of Power 5 road wins (at bowl-eligible North Carolina, and later at South Carolina) — making it the first-ever Sun Belt team to register two Power 5 wins in a season. In all, the Mountaineers claimed an FBS-best six road wins en route to becoming the first-ever 12-win team among North Carolina's FBS members.

For his efforts, Drinkwitz was named a finalist for the 2019 Eddie Robinson Award, a prestigious award which goes annually to the nation's top coach. He was also named the North Carolina Coach of the Year by the North State Journal.

App State proved to be one of the nation's most balanced teams in 2019, thanks in large part to an efficient offense that ranked ninth nationally in scoring (39.4 points per game), coupled with a stingy defense that ranked 22nd nationally in points allowed (20.2 ppg). The Mountaineers also excelled in the critical turnover category, ranking eighth nationally in 2019 with a plus-12 turnover margin. App State junior running back Darrynton Evans was named the Sun Belt Offensive Player of the Year, after rushing for 1,323 yards and 17 touchdowns.

Prior to App State, Drinkwitz spent three years as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for record-setting NC State teams (2016-18), after excelling in a similar role at Boise State for two years (2014-15), where the Broncos won the Mountain West title in 2014 and finished 12-2 and ranked 16th nationally. In 2015, Drinkwitz was promoted to offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, and he helped the Bronco offense rank in the top 15 nationally in points (39.1) and yards (501.3) per game.

Before Boise, Drinkwitz was a key figure in back-to-back Sun Belt Championships in 2012-13 as running backs coach and co-offensive coordinator at Arkansas State. He got his first taste at the FBS level in the Southeastern Conference, as he served as a quality control assistant at Auburn for the 2010-11 seasons. The Tigers won the SEC in 2010, and went on to the BCS Championship that season with a perfect 14-0 record.

Following a 7-6 season in 2016 at NC State, Drinkwitz helped the Wolfpack to consecutive nine-win seasons (2017-18) for the first time since 1991-92. With an average of 35.6 points per game under his direction in 2018, NC State had a 1,000-yard rusher for the third-straight year, two 1,000-yard receivers and a quarterback with nearly 4,000 passing yards. The Wolfpack made a steady rise from 63rd nationally in total offense in his first season in 2016 to 25th in 2017 and 16th in 2018. He was a Broyles Award nominee as one of the nation's top assistant coaches in his final year with the Wolfpack.

The Wolfpack offense had six players selected in the 2018 and 2019 NFL Drafts combined, including record-setting quarterback Ryan Finley, who was a fourth-round selection in 2019 by the Cincinnati Bengals.

In his six seasons as an offensive coordinator and head coach, Drinkwitz has produced five 1,000-yard rushers, four 3,000-yard passers and four 1,000-yard receivers. Three of those years (2015, 2017, 2018) his offenses produced at least one in each category.

Drinkwitz, 38, graduated magna cum laude and was the student body president at Arkansas Tech (bachelor's, education) before beginning his coaching career at the prep level in his hometown of Alma, Ark., in 2005. He and his wife, Lindsey (Sivils), have four daughters: Addison, Emerson, Ella and Parker Lynn.

A winner at every stage of his coaching career, Eliah Drinkwitz — considered one of college football's top offensive minds — was introduced as Mizzou's 33rd head football coach in December of 2019, and despite all the challenges presented by the COVID-19 pandemic, led his 2020 Tigers to a 5-5 record against an All-SEC slate.

Drinkwitz, who took over the Tiger program following an impressive 2019 season at Appalachian State that saw the 20th-ranked Mountaineers win the Sun Belt Conference title en route to a 12-1 record, joined Warren Powers as the only head coaches in Mizzou history to earn a bowl bid in their first season patrolling the sidelines in Columbia. Drinkwitz joins Frank Broyles, Dan Devine and Powers as the only first-year Mizzou head coaches to reach five victories in year one of their Tiger tenures.

Picked to finish sixth in the SEC East Division by many preseason pundits and projected to win only two or three games at most against the All-SEC schedule, the Tigers split their 10-game league slate at 5-5 to finish third in the SEC East, with four of the losses coming at the hands of teams that were ranked at
