**WHAT'S AT STAKE:** It's the annual battle for the Mayor's Cup, as the two SEC schools that call Columbia home are set to play for the silver trophy, given to the winning team.

**CAROLINA VS. MIIZOU:** Missouri has won the last two meetings to take a slim 6-5 advantage in the all-time series with South Carolina. The teams have split four games evenly at Memorial Stadium/Faurot Field in Columbia, Mo., while the Gamecocks hold a 3-2 lead at Williams-Brice Stadium. Mizzou owns a pair of neutral site bowl game wins versus Carolina.

**IT JUST MEANS MORE:** Since Mizzou joined the SEC, the Gamecocks hold a 5-4 series advantage. South Carolina won the first two SEC Eastern Division battles between the two schools, posting a 31-10 win in the Palmetto State in 2012, then pulling out an improbable 27-24 double-overtime victory in Missouri in 2013. In 2014, the Tigers overcame a 13-point deficit in the final seven minutes to squeeze out a 21-20 victory at Williams-Brice Stadium, then won by a 24-10 count at Memorial Stadium in 2015. The Gamecocks then won three-straight games from 2016-18 by scores of 31-21, 31-13 and 37-35, respectively. The Tigers have rebounded with back-to-back wins by scores of 34-14 and 17-10.

**THE LAST TIME THEY MET:** After a tumultuous week for South Carolina Football which saw them lose their head coach and four defensive players opt out, the Gamecocks dropped a hard-fought 17-10 decision to the Missouri Tigers at Williams-Brice Stadium on Nov. 21, 2020. Mizzou opened up a 17-0 halftime lead, but the Gamecocks rallied back under interim head coach Mike Bobo to make it a one score game and had the ball with a chance to tie or take the lead in the final minutes, before a late interception ended the comeback attempt. Quarterback **Luke Doty** came off the bench and gave the Carolina offense a spark. He completed 14-of-23 passes for 130 yards and also rushed 11 times for 59 yards.

**THE LAST TIME THEY MET HERE:** The Missouri defense scored twice en route to a 34-14 win in Columbia, Mo. on Sept. 21, 2019. Linebacker Cale Garrett recovered a fumble in the end zone for a touchdown and safety Ronell Perkins returned an interception 100 yards for another score. Mizzou outgained the Gamecocks, 421-271 on the day and held the ball for 37:50. **Ryan Hilinski** was just 13-for-30 for 166 yards with a touchdown and an interception. Carolina was able to muster just 16 rushing yards on 24 carries in the loss.

**THE LAST CAROLINA WIN:** In what has become known in South Carolina as the "**Michael Scarneccchia Game**," the Gamecocks' backup quarterback threw for three touchdowns in his only collegiate start and **Parker White** hit the game-winning 33-yard field goal with two seconds left to lift Carolina to a 37-35 victory over Missouri on Oct. 6, 2018 in Columbia, S.C. The Tigers had gone ahead 35-34 on Tucker McCann's career-long 57-yard field goal with 1:18 remaining, but Scarneccchia and the Gamecocks drove to the Missouri 16 where White nailed his third field goal of the game. The Gamecocks rallied from 23-14 at halftime in a game that lasted more than five hours due to rain and lightning delays. Scarneccchia completed 20-of-35 passes for 249 yards. Missouri's Drew Lock, the SEC's passing leader, was held to 204 yards.

## A South Carolina win over Missouri would...

- ◆ Bring the Mayor's Cup back to Columbia, South Carolina.
- ◆ Be the Gamecocks' sixth win of the season, their high mark since winning seven in 2018.
- ◆ Make the Gamecocks bowl-eligible.
- ◆ Snap a two-game losing streak to the Tigers and even the all-time series at six wins apiece.

**QUICKLY:** The Mayor's Cup is on the line when first-year head coach Shane Beamer takes his South Carolina Gamecocks (5-4, 2-4 SEC) to Columbia, Mo., for an SEC Eastern Division showdown with the Missouri Tigers (4-5, 1-4 SEC) on Saturday, Nov. 13. The Gamecocks' final road game of the 2021 regular season is set for a 4 pm ET (3 pm local) kick at Memorial Stadium/Faurot Field (62,621).

**OVER THE AIRWAVES:** SEC Network has the television broadcast with Dave Neal and Deuce McCallister in the booth and Andraya Carter on the sidelines. Todd Elis and Tommy Suggs handle the call for the Gamecock Radio Network with Jamar Nesbit on the sidelines.

**A LITTLE HISTORY:** 2021 marks the 128th season of intercollegiate football at the University of South Carolina dating back to 1892. It is the 115th consecutive year in which South Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina owns an all-time record of 619-599-44, a .508 winning pct.

**IT JUST MEANS MORE:** The 2021 season marks South Carolina's 30th year in the Southeastern Conference. South Carolina and Arkansas joined the league prior to the 1992 campaign. The Gamecocks earned the SEC Eastern Division title in the 2010 season. The win earlier this season over Vanderbilt marked South Carolina's 100th conference win since joining the SEC in 1992. They are 101-138-1 (.423) all-time in SEC regular-season play.

**THE LAST TIME OUT:** The Gamecocks scored on each of their five first-half possessions and added a defensive score to open up a 30-10 halftime advantage in a 40-17 rout of the Florida Gators in Columbia last Saturday night. **Jason Brown**, making his first start of the season, completed 14-of-24 passes for 175 yards with two touchdowns and no interceptions. Running backs **Kevin Harris** (128) and **ZaQuandre White** (111) both went over the century mark, as the Gamecocks rolled up 284 yards on the ground, while holding the Gators to just 82. **Josh Vann** caught a career-high seven passes for 111 yards and a score. Carolina finished with a season-high 459 yards of offense. **Parker White** added a career-high four field goals and four extra points, tallying a career-high 16 points in the contest. **Jabari Ellis** returned a fumble 18 yards for a score and **Cam Smith** notched his first interception of the season.

**GATOR CHOMPED:** The 40 points scored by Carolina last Saturday was their most points ever against Florida and the 23-point win was Carolina's largest margin of victory against the Gators.

**EARLY AND OFTEN:** In the win over Florida, the Gamecocks scored on each of their first five possessions for the first time since scoring on their first six possessions against FCS Coastal Carolina in 2013. The 30 first-half points scored against the Gators were the most since scoring 44 against FCS Charleston Southern in 2019.

**TWO FOR 100:** **Kevin Harris** (128) and **ZaQuandre White** (111) both went over the 100-yard rushing mark in the win over Florida. It was just the second- and third 100-yard rushing games for the Gamecocks this season and marked the first time Carolina had a pair of backs go over the century mark in the same game since Tavien Feaster (107) and Rico Dowdle (102) accomplished the feat against Kentucky in 2019.

**WHITE SHINES:** "Super Senior" **Parker White** connected on all eight of his kicks in last Saturday's 40-17 win over Florida. White, who was snubbed earlier in the week on the Groza Award semifinal list, set a career-high with four field goals made, hitting from 39, 35, 40 and 39 yards, while scoring a career-best 16 points. He became the first Gamecock to make four field goals in a game since 2015. White has missed just one kick all season. He was recognized as the SEC Co-Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance.

**THE BEST OFFENSE IS A GOOD DEFENSE:** The Gamecock defense has scored four times this season, three on pick-sixes and one scoop-and-score. **Jordan Burch** picked off a pass and rumbled 61 yards to paydirt in the opener against Eastern Illinois. That was Carolina's first pick-six since Israel Mukuamu went 53 yards for a score at Georgia in 2019 and the first for a Gamecock defensive lineman since Devin Taylor raced 48 yards at Arkansas in 2011. **Damani Staley** got the Gamecocks on the board with just a minute left in the first half on a 63-yard interception return at East Carolina. **David Spaulding** went 74 yards with an interception return in the final minute of the first half against Troy. **Jabari Ellis** recovered a fumble and rambled 18-yards for a score late in the first half vs. Florida.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** The Gamecocks lead the SEC and are in a four-way tie for fourth nationally with four defensive scores behind Nevada (6), Ohio State (6) and UTSA (5). The three interception returns for TDs are tied for third in the NCAA behind Ohio State (4) and Appalachian State (4) and are the most for Carolina since 2010 (5).

**THAT'S OUR BALL:** The Gamecock defense has been outstanding in forcing turnovers this season. They forced a season-high four turnovers against Troy, and have forced at least two turnovers in seven of their nine games (EIU-2; ECU-2; UGA-3; UK-3; Troy-4; UT-0; VU-2; A&M-1; UF-2). For the season, South Carolina has forced 19 turnovers - 12 interceptions and seven fumbles, ranking first in the SEC and in a five-way tie for seventh in the NCAA in turnovers gained. The 12 interceptions have the Gamecocks ranked tied for first in the SEC and in a seven-way tie for eighth in the country.

**WE'RE GOING THE OTHER WAY:** The Gamecocks have logged 281 interception return yards this season on 12 picks, just 63 yards off the record of 344 return yards, set in 1984 when the squad intercepted 23 passes. The 281 interception return yards is the second-most in the NCAA this season, behind only Ohio State's total of 286.

**SO YOU'RE SAYIN' THERE'S A CHANCE:** The Gamecocks have been very good in the fourth quarter, outscoring their opponents by a 60-26 margin in the final period. They rallied late to defeat both East Carolina and Vanderbilt in the final minute.

## Offense

**SATT ATTACK:** The Gamecock offense is under the direction of **Marcus Satterfield**. Satterfield most recently was part of Matt Rhule's staff with the Carolina Panthers. He and Coach Beamer first met each other as graduate assistants at Tennessee under head coach Phillip Fulmer. Offensive line coach **Greg Adkins** was on that staff as well.

**THE UNSINKABLE JASON BROWN:** **Jason Brown**, a transfer from FCS-level St. Francis (Pa.), joined the squad in the spring to compete in the quarterback room. He began the season as the third-string signal-caller, but following a season-ending injury to **Luke Doty** and with **Zeb Noland** out following minor knee surgery, Brown was elevated to QB1 last week and made his first FBS start against Florida. It was his first start since 2019 at St. Francis. He responded by completing 14-of-24 passes for 175 yards with two touchdowns and no turnovers.

**SECOND CHANCE TO MAKE A FIRST IMPRESSION:** **Jason Brown** has responded when making his first start. In 2019, he was named the NEC Offensive Player of the Week after completing 22-of-37 passes for 293 yards and two touchdowns in his first collegiate start, a 14-13 win over Lehigh.

**WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?:** A redshirt senior who still has one year of eligibility remaining, **Jason Brown** played in 18 games including a dozen starts for the St. Francis (Pa.) Red Flash in 2018-19, completing 253-of-411 passes (61.6 pct.) for 3,124 yards with 28 touchdowns and just six interceptions. Prior to his start last week against Florida, he saw limited duty this season, getting in second-half action in the season opener against Eastern Illinois (4-of-5 for 45 yards), for one snap at Georgia (0-for-1), then seeing his most extensive duty at Texas A&M (8-of-14 for 84 yards with a touchdown and two interceptions). For the season, he is 26-of-44 for 304 yards with three TDs and two picks.

**ADDING BROWN TO THE QB WHEEL:** When **Jason Brown** made the start against the Gators, he became the Gamecocks' third starting quarterback this season, following **Zeb Noland** and **Luke Doty**. The last time Carolina started three different signal-callers in the same season was in 2016 when Perry Orth (3 starts), Brandon McIlwain (3 starts) and Jake Bentley (7 starts) all took a game's first snap. The only other years since the turn of the century that Carolina used three different starting quarterbacks in a season came in 2008 (Tommy Beecher-1, Chris Smelley-9 and Stephen Garcia-3) and in 2015 (Connor Mitch-2, Perry Orth-8 and Lorenzo Nunez-2).

**THE MOVIE RIGHTS ARE UP FOR GRABS:** In what could be taken straight from a Hollywood script, **Zeb Noland** transitioned from graduate assistant to active player during preseason camp following a foot injury to Luke Doty, and started each of the first three games, winning two. Noland, who began his career at Iowa State, then transferred to North Dakota State where he played behind his best friend, Trey Lance, joined the Carolina staff as

a G.A. in late May with one year of eligibility left. When Doty was first injured in August, the wheels were put into motion to get Noland back on the field for one final season. His first practice came on Aug. 17, one day after his 24th birthday. He made his fourth start of the season at Texas A&M, but suffered a meniscus tear in his right knee and underwent a minor surgical procedure on Oct. 26.

**THE LONG AND WINDING ROAD:** **Zeb Noland** began his career at Iowa State. In two seasons in Ames (2017-18), he completed 106-of-176 passes (60.2 pct.) for 1,255 yards with six touchdowns and two picks in nine contests. His best performance came against Oklahoma on Sept. 15, 2018, when he completed 25-of-36 passes for 360 yards with two touchdowns. He played in seven games in the spring of 2021 for the North Dakota State Bison, completing 51-of-100 passes for 721 yards with five touchdowns and six interceptions.

**COLONEL ZEBULIAH:** **Zeb Noland** is 2-2 as the Gamecock starting quarterback. He became the first signal-caller to post victories in each of his first two starts since Jake Bentley in 2016. He is 39-for-67 (58.2 pct.) for 512 yards with six touchdowns and one interception in a Gamecock uniform. He threw four touchdown passes in his Gamecock debut against Eastern Illinois, the most for a Carolina QB since Bentley threw for five TDs at Clemson in 2018. He completed a 61-yard pass to Josh Vann on the first offensive series at Georgia, but cut his finger when had his hand stepped on early in the contest and was unable to continue in that game. He did not play again until replacing Luke Doty for the final drive against Vanderbilt and added another chapter to the fairy tale story.

**ZEB TO THE RESCUE:** Backup quarterback **Zeb Noland** was on the field for just 59 seconds of the Gamecocks' 21-20 win over Vanderbilt, but he made every second count. He completed 5-of-8 passes for 75 yards, including a 9-yarder to **Xavier Legette** with 37 seconds remaining for the game-winner. It was Noland's first game action since leaving the Georgia game in week 3 with a hand injury.

**LUKE, I WAS YOUR STARTER:** Sophomore **Luke Doty** came out of the spring as the projected starter at quarterback and did nothing to change that early in fall camp. However, he suffered a mid-foot sprain in his left foot on August 13 and was sidelined for the first two games. He made his 2021 debut at Georgia in relief of an injured Zeb Noland and was the starter for the next four weeks, posting a 2-2 record. He re-injured the foot in the win over Vanderbilt and underwent season-ending surgery on Oct. 21. For the season, he was 86-for-143 (60.1 pct.) for 975 yards with five touchdowns and three interceptions.

**BACKFIELD IN MOTION:** New running backs coach **Montario Hardesty** inherited a talented room that includes **Kevin Harris**, **MarShawn Lloyd**, **Juju McDowell** and **ZaQuandre White**, four viable options to carry the pigskin. All have had their opportunities this season, with the carries ranging from a team-high 86 for Harris to 56 for Lloyd, 55 for White and 46 for McDowell. Harris (4 times), White (3) and McDowell (1) have all led the team in rushing in a game this season. The Gamecocks logged three of their four longest runs of the year against Florida with White (54), Lloyd (40) and Harris (39) all breaking off explosive plays.

**HARRIS HAS MADE HISTORY:** Junior Kevin Harris burst onto the scene a year ago, rushing for 1,138 yards in just 10 games, earning first-team All-SEC accolades while leading the conference in rushing. He entered the season as the school's career leader in rushing average per carry at 6.4 for those backs with at least 1,000 career rushing yards. Harris was slowed in fall camp after having a minor procedure on his back over the summer, was not dressed for the opener due to illness and has been

dealing with an ankle injury. He had just 237 yards rushing on 70 carries, 3.4 yards per tote, through eight games. The bye week did him well, as he looked like the Harris of 2020 last week against Florida, rushing 16 times for 128 yards, an average of 8.0 yards per carry. Harris leads the team with 86 carries, rushing for 365 yards. He ranks 24th in school history with 1,682 career rushing yards. Connor Shaw is 23rd with 1,683. He is 10th on the school's all-time list with 21 rushing touchdowns.

**HARRIS FINDS THE END ZONE:** Kevin Harris reached the end zone twice at Tennessee, his only two rushing touchdowns of the season. Harris has sole possession of 10th place on Carolina's all-time rushing touchdowns list with 21.

**Z IS AN X-FACTOR:** ZaQuandre White, who began his career at Florida State, has a team-leading 402 rushing yards on 55 carries, an impressive 7.3 yards per carry. After rushing for 128 yards in the season opener against Eastern Illinois, he had 10 carries for 39 yards over the next two contests, then did not have a carry in three-straight games before leading the team with a 12-carry, 65-yard performance against Vandy and an eight-carry, 59-yard effort at Texas A&M. He notched his second career 100-yard day with a 13-carry, 111-yard effort against Florida.

**THAT WILL DO 'ER, LLOYD:** Gamecock fans waited patiently for the debut of MarShawn Lloyd, who suffered a knee injury on the second day of fall camp in 2020. Lloyd was a highly-regarded talent when he joined the squad. He responded with a team-high 14 carries for 55 yards in his debut against Eastern Illinois. He had a career-best 40-yard burst against Florida and has 56 carries for 217 yards this season.

**JUJU ON THAT BEAT:** Freshman running back Juju McDowell brings a different dimension to the attack with his quickness and toughness despite his small stature. He had his best game at East Carolina when he rushed for a game-high 71 yards on 11 carries, including 46 yards on seven totes in the deciding fourth quarter. He also logged a 63-yard kickoff return, setting up the game-tying score. That kick return was the longest for a Gamecock since Deebo Samuel raced 90 yards to paydirt on the opening kick against Ole Miss in 2018. For the season, he has rushed 46 times for 197 yards. He also leads the team with nine kickoff returns for 272 yards, a 30.2-yard average.

**NOW THAT'S A FULL BACK:** Redshirt freshman offensive lineman Trai Jones dons number 44 and has appeared at fullback at Tennessee and again versus Florida. Jones stands 6-3 and weighs 305 pounds.

**SPREADING THE WEALTH:** The Gamecocks have seven different receivers who have reached double-figures in pass receptions this season. Josh Vann leads the way with 31 catches, but Dakereon

on Joyner (19), Jaheim Bell (19), Nick Muse (16), Jalen Brooks (14), ZaQuandre White (10) and Kevin Harris (10) are also in double digits. In total, 17 different players have caught a pass in 2021.

**THE LEADER OF THE PACK:** Senior Josh Vann has become the top wide receiver under new wide receivers coach Justin Stepp, coming out from the shadows of current NFL standouts **Deebo Samuel, Bryan Edwards** and **Shi Smith**. Vann leads the team with 31 receptions for a team-high 542 receiving yards, an average of 17.5-yards per catch, including a team-leading three touchdowns. He is 10th in the SEC in receiving yards per game at 60.2. He has 78 career receptions, which also leads the team. The senior has easily surpassed his career receiving yards (377) entering the 2021 season.

**REMEMBERING DEEBO:** Josh Vann has a trio of 100-yard receiving games this season. With back-to-back games of 127 receiving yards at East Carolina and 128 at Georgia, he became the first Gamecock to record consecutive 100-yard receiving games since **Deebo Samuel** went for 112 vs Chattanooga and 210 at Clemson in 2018. He added a career-best seven-catch, 111-yard performance against Florida.

**DK IS OK:** Junior Dakereon Joyner, who began his Gamecock career at quarterback, continues to make strides at wide receiver. He caught five passes in the win at East Carolina, including a touchdown grab on a 13-yard reception that tied the game late in the third quarter. He is tied for second on the squad with 19 receptions overall.

**GETTING THE BAND BACK TOGETHER:** With Jason Brown taking over the quarterback duties, don't be surprised if he seeks out his long-time pass-catching partner in **E.J. Jenkins**. Jenkins, who has seen his playing time increase recently including his first start against Florida, has five catches for 70 yards and a touchdown. Brown and Jenkins played together at Chancellor High School in Fredericksburg, Va. and at FCS St. Francis (Pa.) before the pair transferred to Carolina in the spring.

**NICK'S MUSINGS:** "Super Senior" Nick Muse was a preseason All-SEC tight end candidate who began his career at William & Mary. Muse caught 30 passes a season ago, most among the returning players. His best performance came in the Georgia game last year when he caught eight passes for 131 yards. For the season he has 16 catches for 171 yards and two touchdowns, including a season-long 29-yard reception in the final game-winning drive against Vanderbilt.

**IT TOLLS FOR THEE:** Regarded as a "Swiss Army Knife," sophomore **Jaheim Bell** could lineup just about anywhere, including the deep man on kick return. He had the biggest game for a tight end in school history in the win over Vanderbilt, catching six passes for 136 yards with a touchdown. The 136 receiving yards for a tight end surpassed the previous mark of 134, set by Danny Smith in 1985. His score came from 82-yards out, tying for the 10th-longest reception in school history and was the longest since Jake Bentley hit Deebo Samuel on an 89-yarder at Florida in 2018. He caught a touchdown pass in the opener against Eastern Illinois and added a 48-yard reception in the win at East Carolina. For the season he has 19 receptions for 286 yards, a 15.1-yard average with three scores, tying for the team lead.



**LEFT SIDE, STRONG SIDE:** Offensive line coach **Greg Adkins** has experience to work with, as eight of his linemen have made starts for the Gamecocks. The left side of the line has been more in flux this season with **Jazston Turnetine** (6 starts) and **Jakai Moore** (3 starts) sharing duties at left tackle, while **Jaylen Nichols** (4 starts) and **Ver-shon Lee** (5 starts) have split the reps at left guard. The right side has been more stable with center **Eric Douglas** and right guard **Jovaughn Gwyn** both starting every game, while right tackle **Dylan Wonnum** started the first six contests before being sidelined for the last three with an injury, giving way to **Tyshawn Wannamaker**. Wonnum and Gwyn have both make 30 career starts and received some preseason All-SEC recognition.

## Defense

**4-2-5 IS RIGHT WITH WHITE:** New defensive coordinator **Clayton White** brought a 4-2-5 scheme to Columbia. A three-time nominee for the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach, White most recently served as the DC at Western Kentucky. He has the Gamecocks ranked seventh in the nation in turnovers gained, 17th in pass defense, 36th in pass efficiency defense, 38th in total defense and 54th in scoring defense.

**A VAST IMPROVEMENT:** The Carolina defense ranks 54th in the nation in scoring defense, allowing 23.7 points per game, with five of its nine op-

ponents scoring 17 points or less, including a shutout of Eastern Illinois. Last season, Carolina gave up 36.0 points per game and held just two of their 10 opponents to 17 points or less. They ranked 105th in the country in scoring defense when they had three starters (Jaycee Horn, Ernest Jones and Israel Mukamu) who are now playing in the NFL.

**JUST THE SACKS, MA'AM:** EDGE rusher **Kingsley Enagbare** is a returning All-SEC selection, and the Gamecocks added the nation's sack leader from a season ago in **Jordan Strachan**. Enagbare led the Gamecocks with 6.0 sacks, ranking second in the SEC with 0.75 sacks per game a year ago. Strachan had a Georgia State school record 10.5 sacks, tying for first in the FBS. South Carolina has recorded 20 sacks this season, including a season-high six at Tennessee. That was the most sacks in a game for the Gamecocks since they notched seven against the Vols in 2017.

**LONG LIVE THE KING:** Senior EDGE **Kingsley (JJ) Enagbare** gained most of the off-season attention, and rightly so. A 2020 first-team All-SEC selection, Enagbare has not rested on his laurels, recently being named a semifinalist for the Bednarik Award, which recognizes the nation's top defensive player. With 23.0 career tackles for loss including 15.0 sacks, he has moved into a five-way tie for ninth on the school's all-time career sacks list. Enagbare has put himself in position to potentially become the third Gamecock defensive player in as many years to be an NFL first-round draft pick, following in the shoes of Javon Kinlaw (49ers) and Jaycee Horn (Panthers).

**UNDER PRESSURE:** In addition to his team-leading 4.5 sacks this season, **JJ Enagbare** has been credited with 10 of Carolina's 29 quarterback hurries.

**THREE IN DOUBLE FIGURES:** The Gamecocks have three players who have recorded double-digits in career sacks with **Kingsley Enagbare** (15.0), **Aaron Sterling** (12.0) and **Jordan Strachan** (11.5) all in double figures. Here are the career sack numbers:

**WHY JJ?** Kingsley Enagbare was tagged with the nickname "JJ" as a youngster in deference to the children's television series Jay Jay the Jet Plane.

**BRAD IS A BAD MAN:** Fifth-year senior **Brad Johnson** has made the transition from defensive end to linebacker this season. He posted a game-high nine tackles at East Carolina, then had a career-high 11 stops against Kentucky along with a fumble recovery. He is second on the squad with 50 tackles, including 3.5 tackles for loss and a pair of sacks.

**GONE GREENE:** Fifth-year senior **Sherrod Greene**, the Gamecocks' top linebacker, suffered a serious lower leg injury on the second play from scrimmage in the loss at Georgia and is out for the season after undergoing surgery. It's the second-straight year that the season ended very early on for Greene, as he suffered a fracture in his hip in the 2020 season opener against Tennessee and missed the remainder of the season.

**STALEY STEPS UP:** With the loss of Sherrod Greene, **Damani Staley** has stepped up. The Super Senior, who is the son of former Gamecock and NFL running back Duce Staley, is third on the team with 44 tackles, including a career-high nine stops against Kentucky. He also has a pair of INTs, including a pick-six at East Carolina, and a fumble recovery.

**CLASS ACT:** Linebacker **Spencer Eason-Riddle** was one of 30 candidates for the prestigious Senior CLASS Award. He was also a semifinalist for the Campbell Trophy and was nominated for the Wuerffel Trophy. Eason-Riddle owns two degrees, graduating in May 2019 with a bachelor's degree in public health and in May 2021 with a master's degree in health services policy and management. He has been a regular at the Dorn VA Medical Center and the oncology center of the Prisma Health Children's Hospital among other community service endeavors. He founded and developed the "Sandstorm Buddies Program" which matches student-athletes with cancer patients and their families, where they can serve in a mentor capacity. He also spearheaded a shoe drive in 2021, asking fellow student-athletes and staff to donate lightly worn shoes and cleats to the Boys and Girls Clubs of the Midlands so they can be used by area middle or high school students.

**REVAMPED SECONDARY:** The defensive secondary took the biggest hit in the offseason, as Jaycee Horn and Israel Mukamu both gave up their eligibility to turn pro while Jammie Robinson (Florida State), John Dixon (Penn State) and Shilo Sanders (Jackson State) all elected to transfer. The Carolina coaches brought in among others **David Spaulding** (Georgia Southern) and **Carlins Platel** (Assumption), who have seen regular action.

**TOP COVER CORNER:** **Cam Smith** is considered the Gamecocks' top cover corner. Despite working through some injuries, both preseason and in-season, Smith has acquitted himself nicely, collecting 26 tackles and nine pass breakups. He notched his first interception of the season and third career pick against Florida. He is tied for the SEC lead and tied for 13th in the country in passes defensed with 1.2 per game.

**FOSTER HAS BEEN GOING BANANAS:** "Super Senior" **Jaylan Foster** is having an All-America campaign. The former walk-on who began his career

Senior Bowl Watch List

at Gardner-Webb, leads the team with 74 tackles from his safety position, including a career-high 13 stops against Tennessee, and is second in the country with five interceptions. It's the most interceptions in a season by a Gamecock since Ko Simpson picked off six passes in 2004. He is sixth in the SEC with 8.1 tackles per game. In addition, he forced a pair of fumbles in the win over Troy, both coming in the fourth quarter with the Trojans in Carolina territory, helping preserve the win. Foster was named a Sporting News Midseason All-American and is one of 12 semifinalists for the Jim Thorpe Award, which recognizes the nation's top defensive back.

## Special Teams

**BEAMER BALL 2.0:** The Gamecocks have blocked three punts and a field goal this season. They blocked two punts in the season opener against Eastern Illinois, both credited to **Debo Williams**, then got another from **Jahmar Brown** in the win over Troy. Williams, who was named the SEC Freshman of the Week for his efforts, became the

first SEC player to record two blocked punts in a game since Florida's Chris Rainey accomplished the feat in 2010. Prior to the three this season, the Gamecocks had not blocked a punt since 2014. **M.J. Webb** blocked a field goal attempt at Texas A&M. The school single-season record for blocked kicks is eight, set in 1994. The three blocked punts are a high since blocking three in 2000. With four blocked kicks, the Gamecocks lead the SEC and are in a nine-way tie for third in the NCAA behind only Old Dominion (5) and Coastal Carolina (5). With three blocked punts, the Gamecocks lead the SEC and are in an eight-way tie for third in the NCAA behind only ODU (4) and Coastal Carolina (4).

**SPECIAL TEAMS SCORE:** Carolina got a touchdown from its special teams when punter **Kai Kroeger** connected with **Payton Mangrum** on a 44-yard pass on a fake punt at Tennessee. Carolina has five non-offensive TDs this season.

**WHITE ON THE MONEY:** **Parker White** is the first four-year returning starter in school history. He is on a quest to become the school's all-time leading scorer. With 349 points, he needs 11 to surpass Elliott Fry's school record of 359 points scored. He has converted 45-of-51 (88.2 pct.) field goal attempts from inside 40 yards and owns a career long of 54 yards. He is third among active kickers with 69 career field goals. White owns six fourth-quarter or overtime game-winning field goals in his career.

**PARKER'S BEEN NEARLY PERFECT:** Parker White has been nearly perfect this season, connecting on 13-of-14 field goal attempts and all 20 of his extra point attempts. He is the Gamecocks' leading scorer with 59 points. His career-long 54-yard field goal versus Kentucky ties for the ninth-longest in the country this season and tied for the fourth-longest in school history.

**SEC ACCOLADES:** Parker White has been recognized as the SEC Co-Special Teams Player of the Week twice this season - at East Carolina and versus Florida. He connected on a 39-yard game-tying field goal with 6:46 remaining at ECU, then converted a 36-yard field goal as time expired to lift Carolina to the win. He earned the distinction again after the win over Florida when he hit on a career-high four field goals and scored a career-high 16 points. He was also named the Co-SEC Special Teams Player of the Week for his efforts in the 2018 win over Missouri when he hit on all three of his field goal tries on a soggy field, including a 33-yard game-winner in the final seconds.

**FROM WAY DOWNTOWN, BANG:** Parker White drilled a 54-yard field late in the game against Kentucky. It was the longest of White's career, surpassing his previous long of 50 yards, set against Appalachian State in 2019. The 54-yard field goal matched the fourth-longest in school history.

**KAI KROEGER CAN KICK:** Second-year punter Kai Kroeger was named to the SEC Coaches' all-Freshman team in 2020. In 2021, Kroeger has punted 41 times for a 43.9-yard average with a long of 73 yards at Texas A&M, the longest in the SEC this season. He's had 12 punts of 50-plus yards with 15 inside the 20 and just one touchback. He was named to the "Ray's 8" list by the Ray Guy Award for his efforts against Kentucky when he placed four of five punts inside the 20. He averaged 56.8 yards on four punts vs. Vanderbilt, earning SEC Special Teams Player of the Week and Ray Guy National Punter of the Week honors. Kroeger also is considered one of the top holders in the country. He also threw a 44-yard touchdown pass on a fake punt at Tennessee.

**COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)** — Missouri coach Eli Drinkwitz was proud his team wouldn't let the obstacles they've faced this season keep them from success.

And he happily congratulated them, COVID-19 worries and all, after the Tigers' 17-10 victory over South Carolina on Saturday night.

Coronavirus has severely impacted the Tigers this year: they had just 52 scholarship players available this week and defensive coordinator Ryan Walters remained at home because of contact tracing concerns.

Still, Missouri and quarterback Connor Bazelak opened a 17-0 lead in the first half and defense held on to defeat the Gamecocks 17-10 on Saturday night.

The Tigers hadn't played since Oct. 31 because of a bye week and a postponement of their game last week with Georgia. Drinkwitz wasn't sure he'd get this one either with his dwindling roster.

Instead, they played like a winning SEC team as Bazelak threw for 203 yards and a touchdown and the defense, under substitute coordinator David Gibbs, choked off the Gaemcocks when it mattered most.

Larry Rountree III rushed for a score and became the Tigers all-time time rushing leader among running backs for the Tigers (3-3 Southeastern Conference).

It was the fourth straight loss for South Carolina (2-6), which fired coach Will Muschamp last Sunday and took a half to get itself going.

Bazelak and the Missouri offense weren't crisp. Then again, they didn't have to be as the Tigers opened up a 17-0 lead by halftime and kept the Gamecocks off balance much of the way.

South Carolina managed just 68 yards and five first downs in the opening half, punting five times and failing to convert a fourth down in six series before halftime.

The Tigers essentially put the game out of reach on Bazelak's pretty 20-yard TD throw to Tauskie Dove midway through the opening quarter.

Rountree's 1-yard burst made it 14-0 and Missouri ended the half with Harrison Mevis' 20-yard field goal to head to the locker room up 17-0.

Rountree finished with 58 yards, giving the senior 3,238 for his career and moving him past Zack Abron who played from 2000-03. Only quarterback Brad Smith is ahead of Rountree's school career rushing total with 4,289 yards.

Carolina freshman quarterback Luke Doty provided a second-half spark in place of season-long starter Collin Hill, rallying the team to within a touchdown after Deshaun Fenwick's 1-yard TD run made it 17-10.

The Gamecocks had one last drive, but Doty was intercepted by Devin Nicholson and Missouri held on for the win.

Mike Bobo, the first-year offensive coordinator elevated to interim coach, talked this week of settling nerves and restoring effort for a fragile group of players. But during the week, several players opted out of the season including starting cornerbacks — and likely NFL draft picks — Jaycee Horn and Israel Mukuamu.

In addition, Bobo said two defensive line starters in Aaron Sterling and Brad Johnson were lost for the year with injuries.

That opened things up for the Tigers and Bazelak, who completed 13 of 21 passes for 140 yards the first 30 minutes.

**GAME CHANGER**

South Carolina scored 10 second half points and had the ball on its 1-yard line with 2:37 left. The offense drove to its 36 before an interception with 53 seconds left gave the Tigers the seven-point win.

189 — Freshman Luke Doty combined for 189 yards (130 passing, 59 rushing) as he had a couple plays in the first half, then played all of the second half on offense.

**COLUMBIA, MO. (AP)** — Missouri's defense scored the easy way and the hard way as the Tigers beat South Carolina 34-14 on Saturday.

Linebacker Cale Garrett recovered a fumble in the end zone for a touchdown and safety Ronnell Perkins returned an interception 100 yards for another score for the Tigers (3-1, 1-0 Southeastern Conference). South Carolina (1-3, 0-2 SEC) managed just 16 rushing yards and freshman quarterback Ryan Hilinski committed two costly turnovers.

Missouri quarterback Kelly Bryant completed 19 of 33 passes for 227 yards and two touchdowns. He rushed 17 times for 77 yards.

The Tigers began the scoring in the first quarter with a bizarre play. Hilinski's pass was batted back to him by Missouri defensive end Chris Turner. Hilinski grabbed the ball and spiked it at his own 1-yard line. Although the officials initially ruled the second throw an incomplete - and illegal - forward pass, Garrett scooped up the ball in the end zone. After a video review showed Hilinski's spike went backward, the original call was reversed, it was ruled a fumble and the Tigers were awarded a touchdown.

The Gamecocks got back into the game in the second quarter when D.J. Wonnum intercepted a Bryant pass in the flat and rumbled 21 yards to Missouri's 1-yard line. Rico Dowdle pounded in a touchdown run to cut South Carolina's deficit to 10-7. Missouri answered with Bryant's 3-yard touchdown pass to Albert Okwuegbunam, and the Tigers led 17-7 at halftime.


After throwing for only 3 yards in the first half, Hilinski threw a perimeter screen to wide receiver Bryan Edwards on the first play of the second half, and Edwards weaved 75 yards for a touchdown. Hilinski guided the Gamecocks down the field on the ensuing drive by converting two third-down passes and one fourth-down pass. But on third-and-goal from Missouri's 3-yard line, Hilinski threw it right to Missouri's Perkins in the end zone, and he returned it 100 yards to give the Tigers a 31-14 lead.

**GAME CHANGER**

With the Gamecocks trailing 24-14 and the ball on the Missouri 3-yard line, Ryan Hilinski's pass was intercepted by Ronnell Perkins in the end zone and returned for a 100-yard touchdown, giving the Tigers the 31-14 lead.

# SHANE BEAMER



Shane Beamer, considered to be one of the rising stars among coaches in college football, was named the University of South Carolina's 36th head football coach on Dec. 6, 2020.

Beamer, 44, has been an assistant coach at seven Football Bowl Subdivision schools for 21 seasons. During his career, he has coached in 17 bowl games, including a College Football Playoff National Championship Game, has posted 18 non-losing seasons, six of those with double-digit victories and his teams have won 63.0 percent of its games.

Beamer has been a part of building programs throughout his career. He has been a part of three coaching staffs, where the head coach was in his first or second season at the school. He joined Sylvester Croom's staff at Mississippi State in his first season, Kirby Smart's program at Georgia in his first season, and Lincoln Riley's unit at Oklahoma in his second season.

He comes to Carolina from Oklahoma, where he has served as the assistant head coach for offense, coaching tight ends and H-backs, for the last three seasons. In 2020, Oklahoma ranked sixth in the country in scoring (43.0), 11th in total offense (494.7) and 14th in passing offense (315.0). The Sooners led the nation in yards per play (8.0) and ranked third in total offense (537.6) and fourth in passing efficiency rating (187.0) in 2019. Oklahoma led the nation in total offense (570.3), scoring offense (48.4) and yards per play (FBS-record 8.6), and ranked second in passing efficiency rating (194.9) in 2018.

The Charleston, S.C. native, returns to one of his previous coaching stops, having been with the Gamecocks for four seasons (2007-10). In 2007, he served as the outside linebackers coach and co-special teams coordinator. He mentored the cornerbacks in 2008, then coached the Spurs and strong safeties and was both the special teams coordinator and recruiting coordinator in 2009 and 2010 under Steve Spurrier.

In 2009 at South Carolina, Beamer was nominated for the Frank Broyles Award, which goes annually to the nation's top assistant coach. His special teams' units recorded five blocked kicks that season, tying for the SEC lead and tying for the eighth-highest total in the nation. He also helped coach a defensive unit that ranked third in the SEC and 15th in

the country in total defense, and second in the league and eighth in the country in passing defense.

As the Gamecocks' recruiting coordinator, his 2009 class was ranked 12th-best by both Rivals and Scout, and the 2010 and 2011 classes were ranked in the Top 25.

During Beamer's tenure as recruiting coordinator at Carolina, nine of his signees were selected in the NFL draft. Those include first round selection Stephen Gilmore (Buffalo Bills) and second round selections Alshon Jeffery (Chicago Bears) and D.J. Swearinger (Houston Texans).

The Gamecocks all-time winningest quarterback, Connor Shaw, and rushing touchdown leader, Marcus Lattimore, were also in the 2010 class.

Prior to his arrival in Norman, Beamer spent two seasons on the staff at Georgia as tight ends coach and special teams coordinator under Kirby Smart. The Bulldogs posted a 21-7 combined record with Beamer on staff. In 2017, the Bulldogs won the SEC Championship and finished second in the nation, falling in the CFP title game to Alabama in overtime. His special teams ranked eighth nationally in net punting (41.7), and 20th in kickoff returns (23.5) while blocking four kicks.

The son of Hall of Fame coach, Frank Beamer, he worked with his father as the associate head coach and running backs coach at Virginia Tech from 2011-15. In his first year, he coached David Wilson, who broke the Tech single-season rushing record and was named All-American and ACC Player of the Year and went on to become a first-round NFL draft selection by the New York Giants. Shane served as the Hokies' acting head coach in the 2014 Military Bowl win while his father watched from the press box following throat surgery.

Beamer's first full-time coaching position was at Mississippi State, joining the Bulldogs in 2004 as cornerbacks coach and recruiting coordinator. In his first two seasons at State, he guided three defensive backs to SEC All-Freshman Team accolades. He maintained the recruiting coordinator title but made the move to running backs coach in the spring of 2006 where he tutored running back Anthony Dixon to SEC All-Freshman honors.

Beamer spent three seasons (2001-03) as a graduate assistant at Tennessee, helping with the cornerbacks, coaching the placekickers, punters, and long snappers, and assisting in all special teams areas. He also oversaw game opponent scouting while earning a master's degree in sport management in December 2003.

Before joining the staff at Tennessee, he worked one season (2000) as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech, helping with the Yellow Jacket quarterbacks and wide receivers.

A 2000 graduate of Virginia Tech, Beamer was a member of five bowl teams (1995-99 seasons) and three Big East Conference championship squads on the Hokie football team as a long snapper and wide receiver. He was a long snapper on the 1999 Tech team that played for the BCS National Championship.

Beamer and his wife, Emily, are the parents of three children - two daughters, Sutton and Olivia, both born in Columbia, and a son, Hunter, born in Blacksburg, Va.

**COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)** — South Carolina coach turned quarterback Zeb Noland threw for four touchdowns on 13 completions as the Gamecocks beat Eastern Illinois 46-0 on Saturday night.

It was the debut for South Carolina coach Shane Beamer. He promised “Beamer Ball” just like his dad Frank Beamer played at Virginia Tech and his team delivered, holding the Panthers (0-2) to 109 yards and getting its first shutout in 13 years.

The Gamecocks version of Beamer Ball blocked two punts, picked off two passes with one going back for a 61-yard touchdown, ran a successful two-point trick play with the kicking team on the field after their first touchdown, converted all three fourth downs it tried including a fourth-and-goal from the 3, had two sacks and hit hard.

“People talk about Beamer Ball — that’s what it was. You have the ability to score on offense, defense or special teams no matter who is on the field. We want to have that mentality,” Shane Beamer said.

Beamer, 44, brought joy and enthusiasm to a team that had lost six in a row and 11 of its past 14 games — at least for a night and against a Football Championship Subdivision opponent.

Beamer won his opener with an unusual quarterback. Noland came to Columbia this spring to be a graduate assistant after playing seven games for North Dakota State in a season delayed to spring 2021 because of COVID-19.

Chris Katrencik was 13-for-22 for 78 yards and Tyler Hamilton caught five passes for 32 yards for Eastern Illinois.

**GAME CHANGER**

Jaheim Bell caught a 3-yard pass from Zeb Noland with 5:04 left in the first, giving Carolina a 15-0 lead on its way to the shutout of the Panthers. It was Bell’s first career touchdown.

**GREENVILLE, N.C. (AP)** — Parker White kicked a 36-yard field goal as time expired as South Carolina rallied from 14 down to beat East Carolina 20-17 on Saturday, earning its first road win under first-year coach Shane Beamer.

Damani Staley had a 63-yard interception return for a touchdown just before halftime to give the Gamecocks a needed spark after trailing 14-0 in a mistake-filled opening half. Former graduate assistant Zeb Noland also had a game-tying touchdown pass to Dakereon Joyner in the back of the end zone late in the third quarter.

In the end, the Gamecocks (2-0) did enough to give themselves a shot, then rode the legs of Juju McDowell - who gained 45 yards on six carries on South Carolina's final 10-play drive - to set up White's winner that had the Gamecocks spilling onto the field from the sideline to celebrate.

South Carolina won despite committing three turnovers in its first five drives, including a goal-line fumble that went through the end zone for a turnover in the first half.

Tyler Snead hit on a 75-yard trick-play touchdown pass to Jsi Hatfield on the game's first offensive snap for the Pirates (0-2), while Holton Ahlers also ran for a short touchdown for the 14-0 lead. But East Carolina struggled to generate consistent offense, with Ahlers completing 11 of 24 passes for just 77 yards and two interceptions.

The Pirates were hosting a Southeastern Conference team for the first time since South Carolina's last visit here in 1997.

The Gamecock defense stopped East Carolina on a 3rd-and-5 to force a punt, giving the Gamecocks the ball for its game-winning drive. Jaylan Foster and David Spaulding made the tackle to hold ECU's Tyler Snead to just a one-yard gain.

**ATHENS, GA. (AP)** — JT Daniels returned to the lineup with three touchdown passes, Georgia's fearsome defense nearly made it three-straight games without allowing a TD and the No. 2 Bulldogs romped to a 40-13 victory over South Carolina on Saturday night.

Daniels completed 23-of-31 for 303 yards, including scoring throws of 43 yards to Jermaine Burton, 38 yards to freshman Adonai Mitchell and 4 yards to James Cook.

Georgia (3-0, 1-0 Southeastern Conference) finally gave up a touchdown while on defense when Luke Doty, getting the ball on the Bulldogs' side of the field after a fumble, connected with Josh Vann on a 36-yard touchdown pass with 10:55 remaining.

To that point, the only touchdown against Georgia this season had come on an interception return.

With Doty playing for the first time this season, South Carolina (2-1, 0-1) gave up three sacks and a safety, along with two turnovers that led to Georgia touchdowns.

Daniels sat out a 56-7 victory over UAB with an oblique injury, watching as backup Stetson Bennett tied a school record with five touchdown passes.

Daniels wasted no time re-establishing his hold on the No. 1 spot, completing a 21-yard pass to Brock Bowers on his very first snap and guiding the Bulldogs to the end zone on their first two possessions.

Bennett got a shot the third time the Bulldogs had the ball. He promptly threw an interception that was returned to the Georgia 12, setting up a field goal.

Daniels returned to the game and didn't leave until early in the fourth quarter with the outcome no longer in doubt.

After punting the ball away in the closing seconds of the first half and content to settle for a 21-6 lead, Georgia wound up scoring five more points.

Backed up on their own 1, the Gamecocks inexplicably attempted to throw out of the end zone. Doty was sacked by Jordan Davis and Nolan Smith for a safety.

Then, after receiving the free kick, Daniels completed three passes for 39 yards to set up Jack Podlesny's 36-yard field goal as time expired, sending Georgia to the locker room up 26-6.

Georgia put it away in opening minute of the second half, again sparked by a huge defensive play.

Doty's pass was picked off by Derion Kendrick, who returned it to the South Carolina 20. Zamir White ripped off a 15-yard run, then took it in from the 5 to pad the lead to 33-6.

Cook had two touchdowns, also scoring on a 23-yard run.

**GAME CHANGER**

Jaylan Foster picked off a JT Daniels pass at the Georgia 47 and returned it 35 yards to the Bulldog 12. Carolina was not able to punch it in the end zone, as Parker White's 27-yard field goal made it 14-6 Georgia with 1:34 left in the first quarter. The Bulldogs responded with a second quarter touchdown drive, a safety and a field goal as the Gamecocks did not get any closer in their first loss of 2021.

**COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)** — Matt Ruffolo made three field goals to help Kentucky beat South Carolina 16-10 on Saturday night.

Despite its three turnovers, Kentucky (4-0, 2-0 Southeastern Conference) beat South Carolina (2-2, 1-1) for the seventh time in eight years, and set up a collision course toward next week's matchup at home against No. 11 Florida.

"We just have to worry about ourselves. We got to prove to each other and the team that we can go out there and compete with anybody who steps on the field," said Kentucky linebacker DeAndre Square, who led the Wildcats with eight tackles. "It's not about anybody else, it's about us."

Chris Rodriguez Jr. ran for 144 yards on 26 carries for the Wildcats. Will Levis was 15-of-22 passing for 102 yards and threw an interception.

Kavosley Smoke scored on 15-yard touchdown run on the first series of the game, capping a 12-play, 75-yard drive for Kentucky. Ruffolo's 41-yard field goal to end the second quarter gave the Wildcats a 10-0 lead.

Luke Doty threw a 5-yard touchdown pass to Jalen Brooks early in the third quarter for South Carolina. Ruffalo made field goals from 21 and 27 yards before Parker White's 54-yard field goal capped the scoring with 2:31 remaining.

Doty was 17-of-25 passing for 158 yards. Kevin Harris was held to just 38 yards rushing on 12 carries.

South Carolina recovered fumbles on back-to-back Kentucky possessions but couldn't get any points despite going for it twice on fourth down. Each time, a dropped pass ended the drive.

"If you just look at some things, our turning the ball over, there's no excuse for it. The ball bouncing to the other team sometimes, there's no controlling that," Kentucky coach Bob Stoops said. "When I first got here, we couldn't play a lick of defense, but we led the country in fumbles. With some of those fumbles (this year), we just can't do it."

The Gamecocks' defense has recovered multiple takeaways in every game but the offense hasn't been able to take advantage. After scoring 46 points over hapless Eastern Illinois in its opener, South Carolina has a mere 43 points since.

"I don't know. There's a lot. We ran the ball 26 times for 58 yards. Not good enough," South Carolina coach Shane Beamer said. "Each week's different, and right now, it ain't good enough."

Kentucky had three field goals on the night, the final one with 4:26 left in the game that gave the Wildcats a 16-7 lead. Carolina answered with a field goal of its own, a career-high 54-yard field goal from Parker White, but the Wildcats were able to salt the clock and earn the six-point win.

**COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)** — South Carolina's offensive consternation still isn't cured. The Gamecocks have scored one rushing touchdown in five games.

But as long as the Gamecocks' defense can pick up the slack, as they did with their third touchdown of the year against Troy, they can continue to work on it without feeling too bad.

David Spaulding returned an interception 74 yards for a touchdown, Parker White kicked three field goals and South Carolina overcame several mistakes in the second half to hold off the Trojans 23-14 on Saturday.

White booted a 37-yard field goal in the fourth quarter with just over two minutes left to make it a two-possession lead and Damani Staley intercepted Taylor Powell with less than 30 seconds to play.

"I don't know about you guys, I feel like I aged about 40 years during that game," said South Carolina coach Shane Beamer, who saw his Gamecocks score one defensive TD and should have scored another. "We talk about playing smart football. We didn't do a great job of that today."

The Gamecocks (3-2) led 17-7 at halftime after Spaulding's return. Yet the Trojans (2-3) wouldn't go away and South Carolina's inability to take advantage of its numerous chances to score helped Troy stay in it.

"The key to the game, obviously, the turnovers. Seemed to be the difference," Troy coach Chip Lindsey said. "We matched their intensity, we matched their physicality, I thought. At the end of the day, we can't put the ball on the ground."

The Gamecocks still haven't found a solution for their sputtering running game, but quarterback Luke Doty completed 20 of 34 passes for 255 yards and a touchdown with no interceptions and one fumble.

The Gamecocks blocked a Troy punt in the third quarter but only got a field goal out of a possession starting at the Trojans' 23-yard line. Then after an interception by South Carolina's Jahmar Brown was wiped by a booth review, the nuttiness began.

The Gamecocks forced a punt but Ahmearan Brown muffed the catch. Troy set up for a third-and-9 on the next possession. The Gamecocks' Jaylan Foster sacked Powell on a safety blitz and the ball squirted loose. Staley retrieved it and tried to run, but was tripped.

The ball again tumbled to the turf and Brown picked it up and began running. He easily out-paced the rest of the field for a touchdown, except Brown flipped the ball to the referee a split-second before he crossed the goal line and it rolled out of bounds.

Touchback. Not touchdown.

South Carolina held again, forced a punt, and again tried to drive for the game-clinching score. Doty had the ball knocked out of his hand and the Trojans recovered.

The Gamecocks got it right back after Foster forced a fumble and Zach Pickens recovered.

South Carolina managed to hold onto the ball and drove 53 yards in 12 plays for White's last field goal. The sixth-year "super senior" hasn't missed a kick all year and mentioned Samson in the post-game as he showed up with a bushy beard. He has vowed not to shave or cut his hair until he misses one.

#### GAME CHANGER

David Spaulding returned an interception 74 yards for a touchdown to give the Gamecocks a 17-7 lead heading into halftime. It is the third interception return for a touchdown by the Gamecocks this season.

**KNOXVILLE, TENN. (AP)** — Hendon Hooker threw for 225 yards and three touchdowns to lead Tennessee to a 45-20 Southeastern Conference victory over South Carolina Saturday.

The Volunteers (4-2, 2-1) led 35-0 in the second quarter before the Gamecocks (3-3, 0-3) staged a recovery.

Vols' running back Tyion Evans rushed for 119 yards and a touchdown before leaving midway through the third quarter with an injury.

South Carolina's Kevin Harris scored from a yard out to start the fourth quarter. A missed two-point conversion made the score 38-20. Tennessee's offense generated just 25 offensive yards in the third quarter. Len'Neth Whitehead, replacing the injured Evans at running back, scored Tennessee's last TD from two yards.

Trailing by 31 midway through the third quarter, South Carolina had fourth-and-9 on the Tennessee 44. Punter Kai Kroeger hit wide-open Payton Mangrum with what turned out to be a scoring pass and a 38-14 difference.

A 28-0 first-quarter lead blossomed to 38-7 by halftime. Hooker completed 15 of 20 passes for 217 yards and three scores in the first 30 minutes.

As the Vols were leading 28-0 with just under six minutes left in the first half, Evans found a seam up the middle and won the race to the end zone for a 45-yard TD and 35-0 Tennessee lead. With just over 2 minutes left in the half, South Carolina finally got on the board. Luke Doty's 24-yard pass to Dakereon Joyner was the key play in a 75-yard drive that was culminated by a 6-yard run by Harris.

Tennessee's Jalin Hyatt scored the game's first touchdown when he caught a slant from Hooker from three yards to cap a 66-yard drive. Less than three minutes later, Hooker connected with JaVonta Payton from 39 yards for a 14-0 advantage.

Before the first quarter ran out, Tennessee upped the score to 21-0. South Carolina had the ball inside the Vols' 5-yard line when receiver Jalen Brooks threw a pass that was intercepted in the end zone by Jaylen McCollough. Five plays later Hooker scored on an 11-yard run. With 12 seconds left in the first quarter, the Vols made it 28-0. Four plays after a Gamecocks fumble, Hooker hit Velus Jones for a 21-yard score.

**GAME CHANGER**

With Tennessee leading 14-0, Carolina drove down to the Volunteer one-yard line but a halfback pass from Jordan Burch was intercepted by Jaylen McCollough in the end zone. Tennessee then went 80 yards in five plays to go up 21-0.

**COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)** — Zeb Noland's played more than enough football to be ready when called on and cherish the moments of success. The former graduate assistant did both to rally South Carolina to its first Southeastern Conference win in more than year.

Noland entered on the Gamecocks' final drive and led a 75-yard touchdown drive, connecting with Xavier Legette on a 9-yard scoring pass with 37 seconds left for a 21-20 win over Vanderbilt on Saturday night.

But there was Noland, calm and confident, leading South Carolina (4-3, 1-3 SEC) to snap its nine-game losing streak against conference opponents.

Gamecocks coach Shane Beamer said Noland came in when Luke Doty was feeling some soreness in a foot injury he sustained this summer at practice. Noland started the first three games before Doty took over in the middle of a 40-13 loss to Georgia last month. Noland hadn't played since then.

Noland's message in the huddle was simple: "Keep me clean. I got you. That's what I said, and let's roll."

Noland got the Gamecocks rolling with a 29-yard pass to tight end Nick Muse to get into Vanderbilt territory.

He had completions of 15 yards to Josh Vann and 21 yards to Dakereon Joyner to the Commodores' 9. On Noland's winning throw, Legette ran to the back of the end zone and got open for the winning score.

Parker White made the extra point to send Vanderbilt, which held a 20-14 lead with less than two minutes left, to its 16th straight loss against SEC opponents.

Noland is not worried about when he'll play again, just about making sure he does what he can to be a good team and prepare Doty or anyone in the quarterback room for the next game.

Noland began his college career at Iowa State, moving on to North Dakota State where he was a teammate of San Francisco 49ers passer Trey Lance before accepting Beamer's offer to join the staff here.

Noland was convinced to put the pads back on when Doty hurt his foot this past August.

It looked like the Commodores would be the ones celebrating after Joseph Bulovas hit a 28-yard field goal with 1:36 to go for a 20-14 lead. Vanderbilt's defense had held South Carolina scoreless for nearly 49 minutes.

But Noland gave South Carolina the winning spark and Beamer his first SEC victory since taking over the program last December.

Vanderbilt quarterback Mike Wright threw for 206 yards including a 52-yard touchdown pass to Will Sheppard for a 17-14 lead in the third quarter that held up until the final seconds.

Vanderbilt broke its season-long scoring drought against the SEC with Bulovas' 42-yard field goal in the opening quarter. The Commodores added their first TD in league play when Rocko Griffin Jr. ran in from a yard out to take advantage of a South Carolina fumble and cut the lead to 14-10.

#### GAME CHANGER

Carolina's defense forced Vanderbilt into two turnovers and just 312 yards of total offense in the game. The Gamecocks capped off the game with a sack fumble from Kingsley Enagbare and a recovery from Jabari Ellis at the Vanderbilt 4-yard line.

**BRYAN-COLLEGE STATION, TEXAS. (AP)** — Ainias Smith had a 95-yard punt return for a touchdown and Jalen Wydermyer added two TD catches as No. 17 Texas A&M built a huge first-half lead and coasted to a 44-14 rout of South Carolina Saturday night.

The star rushing duo of Isaiah Spiller and Devone Achane continued to do damage for the Aggies. They combined for 256 yards and two touchdowns a week after rushing for 292 yards and three touchdowns.

Texas A&M (6-2, 3-2 SEC) raced to a 31-0 lead by halftime, and Achane's 35-yard touchdown run made it 41-0 late in the third. It was the third straight victory for Texas A&M, which knocked off top-ranked Alabama two weeks ago before beating Missouri last week.

Zach Calzada had 187 yards passing with two touchdowns for the Aggies.

South Carolina graduate assistant-turned-quarterback Zeb Noland had a tough night before he was benched for Jason Brown early in the fourth quarter. Noland managed just 30 yards passing and had a snap fly over his head that the Aggies recovered and turned into a touchdown in the second quarter.

Noland started the first three games but was hurt Sept. 18 against Georgia and didn't play again until leading a game-winning drive in the last minute against Vanderbilt last Saturday. Luke Doty was injured against the Commodores and is out for the season after having foot surgery this week.

Brown led the Gamecocks (4-4, 1-4) on two touchdown drives after replacing Noland, but also threw an interception in the end zone.

Smith gave A&M an early lead with his punt return TD in the first quarter. It was the longest punt return for a touchdown in the FBS this season and the longest for the Aggies since Dustin Harris had a 96-yard return for a TD in 2012 against South Carolina State.

Jaylan Foster grabbed his NCAA-leading fifth interception later in the first, but the Gamecocks couldn't move the ball after the turnover and had to punt.

The Aggies extended the lead to 14-0 when Wydermyer grabbed a 25-yard touchdown reception on their next possession.

Wydermyer made it 21-0 when he grabbed a short pass and barreled through several defenders for a 28-yard score with about 10 1/2 minutes left in the first half.

He had 75 yards receiving to give him 1,306 in his career, passing Marcellus Bennett (1,246) for most by a tight end in school history.

It looked like Noland had his coaching hat back on three plays after Wydermyer's second TD when he was so preoccupied yelling and gesturing at his teammates to get set that he didn't realize the ball had been snapped and it sailed over his head.

The ball rolled all the way to the South Carolina 6 - a loss of 19 yards - before Aaron Hansford pounced on it to give A&M the ball. The Aggies cashed in on the mistake three plays later on a 1-yard TD run by Spiller that made it 28-0.

Carolina fumbled on a bad snap to Texas A&M's six-yard line, where the Aggies recovered. Isaiah Spiller scored on a one-yard rushing touchdown as the Aggies took a 28-0 lead.



**COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)** — When Shane Beamer accepted the South Carolina job last December, he recalled his days as Steve Spurrier's assistant and the big wins and raucous atmosphere when the Gamecocks were rolling.

The first-year coach got his first true taste of that with Spurrier in the building as the Gamecocks routed Florida 40-17 on Saturday night.

First-time starter Jason Brown threw for two touchdowns, Kevin Harris and ZaQuandre White each rushed for over 100 yards and South Carolina's defense held the potent Gators' attack to just 82 yards rushing.

"I remember days and nights like this," when he was here from 2007-2010 as the Gamecocks won their only SEC Eastern Division in that final season, Beamer said.

"We're not there yet," Beamer cautioned. "We're still a work in progress, but we took a big step tonight."

A step that few expected out of South Carolina (5-4, 2-4 Southeastern Conference). The Gamecocks were routed at Texas A&M 44-14 two weeks ago and saw its starting quarterback Zeb Noland undergo knee surgery.

The Gators (4-5, 2-5) entered averaging 242 yards a game on the ground and 483 yards of total offense, third best in the SEC. But South Carolina became the first team this season to outgain them, 459-340.

Parker White had a career-best four field goals and defensive tackle Jabari Ellis had an 18-yard fumble recovery touchdown to put South Carolina up 30-10 at halftime.

"The fair just left town and I still feel like I'm on a rollercoaster," Ellis said of following the A&M loss with the biggest win of the season.

Brown became the Gamecocks' third starting passer this season and the FCS transfer made his first Southeastern Conference start an eye-opening one.

"He's always prepared himself for the moment," Gamecocks' receiver Josh Vann said.

Brown, who last played at St. Francis, steadily led South Carolina on five first-half scoring drives for a 30-10 lead at the break.

Brown looked like an SEC veteran as he filled in after grad-assistant coach turned quarterback Noland continued his recovery from knee surgery last week. It's probably not Brown's last start at South Carolina after what he showed in this one.

"Just like that, I was the next guy up," Brown said. "At this level, there's no excuses, you've got to be ready to play."

Emory Jones completed 17 of 30 passes for 258 yards and two touchdowns. He also threw an interception and the fumble that went for a score.

Harris, a 1,000-yard rusher last season, finished with 128 yards while White had 111.

Florida coach Dan Mullen said his team has struggled, losing four of the past five and three straight for the first time since 2017.

"You go look throughout the season, there's a lot of little things that have gone wrong," Mullen said. "We're not doing things that you play winning football at."

**GAME CHANGER**

Aaron Sterling forced a fumble at the Florida 20 and Jabari Ellis returned it 18 yards for a touchdown to give Carolina a 30-10 lead on Florida with 1:13 left in the first half. The Gamecocks scored 30 in the first half, the most in a half since the second half of the Vanderbilt game in 2020.


