**BATTLE OF THE CAROLINAS:** The two flagship universities of the Carolinas - South Carolina and North Carolina - renew its rivalry on Thursday, Dec. 30, in the Duke's Mayo Bowl. This will mark the 59th meeting on the gridiron between these two bordering schools. North Carolina holds a 35-19-4 advantage in the all-time series, including a 3-1 mark when the game has been played at a neutral site. However, South Carolina has won three of the last four contests and six of the last eight overall.

**BEAMER VERSUS THE HEELS:** This will mark South Carolina head coach Shane Beamer's first meeting against the Tar Heels as a head coach.

**MACK ATTACKS THE GAMECOCKS:** North Carolina head coach Mack Brown is 2-3 against the Gamecocks, with the first four games coming during his first stint in Chapel Hill. The Gamecocks defeated the Tar Heels by scores of 31-10, 27-20 and 27-5 from 1988-90, before Brown and the Tar Heels tallied a 21-17 win during the 1991 season. Brown led UNC to a 24-20 win over Will Muschamp's Gamecocks to kick off the 2019 season in Charlotte.

**THE LAST TIME THEY MET:** True freshman quarterback Sam Howell threw for 245 yards and two touchdowns, Myles Wolford had two late fourth quarter interceptions and North Carolina battled back to defeat South Carolina 24-20 on August 31, 2019 in Charlotte. The game marked Mack Brown's return to the sideline following a five-year hiatus. Howell capped second half drives of 98 and 95 yards with a 22-yard TD strike to Dyami Brown and a 17-yard scoring toss to Beau Corrales to give Brown his first win since 2013, when he coached at Texas. South Carolina held a 20-9 advantage heading into the final period, but was unable to secure the win. Attendance was 52,183.

**THE LAST GAMECOCK WIN:** The Gamecocks and Tar Heels opened the 2015 season at Charlotte's Bank of America Stadium on Sept. 3, with South Carolina posting a 17-13 win. The Tar Heels took a 13-10 lead into intermission, but **Shon Carson** broke a 48-yard run to paydirt early in the fourth quarter for the only score in the second half, lifting the Gamecocks to victory. Linebacker **Skai Moore** intercepted a pair of passes in the end-zone, including one in the game's final minutes to preserve the win. South Carolina did most of its damage on the ground, rushing for 254 yards. The announced attendance was 51,664.

**CAROLINA ON MY MIND:** The Gamecocks have 14 players on the current roster who played their high school ball in the state of North Carolina. Four players list Charlotte as their hometown - **Eric Douglas** played at Mallard Creek, **Jovaughn Gwyn** played for Harding University, **Jake Helfrich** prepped at Providence Day and **Jaylen Nichols** went to Myers Park. Others from the Tar Heel State include: **Nick Muse** (Belmont), **Mohamed Kaba** (Clinton), **Rick Sandidge** (Concord); **Nick Barrett** (Goldsboro), **Jalen Brooks** (Harrisburg), **Traevon Kenion** (Monroe); **Spencer Eason-Riddle** (Raleigh); **Sherrod Greene** (Rocky Mount); **Mitch Jeter** (Salisbury) and **Jaylin Dickerson** (Southern Pines).

**NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS:** The Gamecocks are 35-12 in their last 47 non-conference games, with seven of the 12 losses coming against Clemson. Carolina is 3-1 in non-conference action in 2021 with wins over Eastern Illinois (46-0), East Carolina (20-17) and Troy (23-14) and a loss to Clemson.

- ◆ Improve the Gamecocks' record in bowl games to 10-14.

**YOU ARE LOOKING LIVE:** After a two-year hiatus, South Carolina Football returns to postseason action. The Gamecocks (6-6, 3-5 SEC) will square off against the North Carolina Tar Heels (6-6, 3-5 ACC) in the 2021 Duke's Mayo Bowl on Thursday, Dec. 30. Game time is set for 11:30 am ET at Bank of America Stadium (74,867) in Charlotte, N.C.

**OVER THE AIRWAVES:** ESPN has the national television broadcast with Anish Shroff and Mike Golic Jr. in the booth and Taylor McGregor on the sidelines. Bowl Season Radio has the national radio broadcast with Kershaw, S.C., native Brian Estridge handling the play-by-play and "The Punter" John Denton serving as the analyst. Molly Cotton will be the sideline reporter. Carolina Hall of Famers Todd Ellis and Tommy Suggs handle the call for the Gamecock Radio Network with Jamar Nesbit on the sidelines.

**A LITTLE HISTORY:** 2021 marks the 128th season of intercollegiate football at the University of South Carolina dating back to 1892. It is the 115th consecutive year in which South Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina owns an all-time record of 620-601-44, a .508 winning pct.

**IT JUST MEANS MORE:** The 2021 season marked South Carolina's 30th year in the Southeastern Conference. South Carolina and Arkansas joined the league prior to the 1992 campaign. The Gamecocks earned the SEC Eastern Division title in the 2010 season. The win earlier this season over Vanderbilt was South Carolina's 100th conference victory since joining the SEC. They are 102-139-1 (424) all-time in SEC regular-season play.

**GOING BOWLING:** The Gamecocks secured their sixth win of the season against Auburn, positioning themselves for their first bowl appearance since the 2018 season and their 24th overall. The Gamecocks are 9-14 all-time in bowl games, but have won nine of their last 15 after dropping their first eight bowl contests. **Shane Beamer** is the third-straight Gamecock head coach to take the team to a bowl game in his first season.

**SAY SO LONG TO THE SUPER SENIORS:** The Gamecocks have nine players who will have their eligibility expire after the bowl game. Those nine are

**Spencer Eason-Riddle, Jabari Ellis, Jaylan Foster, Nick Muse, Carlins Platel, Zeb Noland, Damani Staley, Aaron Sterling and Parker White.**

**HE GONE:** EDGE Kingsley Enagbare and running back **ZaQuandre White** have elected to forego the bowl game to prepare for the NFL Draft.

**GAMECOCKS IN THE QUEEN CITY:** The Gamecocks are no stranger to Bank of America Stadium, as this will be their sixth appearance in the Queen City since 2011. Carolina is 3-2 in those contests, with four of the games being a season opener and the other coming during the bowl season. They defeated East Carolina (2011), North Carolina (2015) and NC State (2017) in season lid-lifters, before falling to Virginia in the 2018 Belk Bowl and to the Tar Heels in the 2019 opener when they played in back-to-back games at BOA Stadium.

**BEEN HERE, DONE THAT:** The Gamecocks last bowl appearance was played at Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte in the 2018 Belk Bowl. Virginia got the better of it on that Dec. 29 afternoon, defeating the Gamecocks by a 28-0 score.

**SEASON IN REVIEW:** The Gamecocks had an up-and-down campaign in **Shane Beamer's** first year as the head coach. However, coming off a 2-8 season and with Vegas predicting just 3.5 wins, Coach Beamer's squad exceeded nearly everyone's expectations. Carolina got the season started with a pair of non-conference wins over FCS Eastern Illinois and East Carolina, then dropped their first two conference games to Georgia and Kentucky. The Gamecocks alternated wins and losses over the final eight games of the regular season, posting wins over Troy, Vanderbilt, Florida and Auburn, while suffering losses at Tennessee, at Texas A&M, at Missouri and versus Clemson.

**FIRST YEAR SUCCESS:** **Shane Beamer** had arguably the most success of any first-year head coach at the FBS level in 2021. Coming off a 2-8 campaign, Beamer led the Gamecocks to a 6-6 record for a three-game improvement. Marshall's Charles Huff and Boise State's Andy Avalos both recorded seven wins, but both of those squads actually had worse records in 2021 than in 2020. Beamer, Huff and Avalos were the only first-year head coaches to log at .500 or better regular season.

**ONE FOR THE AGES:** **Shane Beamer** turned in one of the better jobs by a first-year head coach in the SEC since the league was formed in 1933, improving the Gamecocks by three full games from 2020.

**WE'RE NOT DEAD YET:** The Gamecocks came from behind to win five games this season. Twice they rallied back from 14-0 deficits to beat East Carolina, 20-17, and Auburn, 21-17. The two 14-point come-from-behind wins ties for the seventh-best comeback wins in school history. It's the first time they've come back from two touchdown deficits to claim victory twice in the same season. Carolina has outscored its opponents by a 74-43 margin in the final period, and rallied late to defeat both East Carolina and Vanderbilt in the game's final minute.

**THAT'S OUR BALL:** The Gamecock defense has been outstanding in forcing turnovers all season. They have forced a turnover in 11 of 12 games and two or more turnovers in eight of their 12 contests, including a season-high four against Troy and three each against Georgia, Kentucky and Missouri. For the season, South Carolina has forced 24 turnovers - 15 interceptions and nine fumble recoveries, ranking first in the SEC and tied with Baylor for 12th in the NCAA in turnovers gained. The 15 interceptions have the Gamecocks tied for first in the SEC and tied for 10th in the country.

**THE BEST OFFENSE IS A GOOD DEFENSE:** The Gamecock defense has scored four times this season, three on pick-sixes and one scoop-and-score. **Jordan Burch** picked off a pass and rumbled 61 yards to paydirt in the opener against Eastern Illinois. That was Carolina's first pick-six since Israel Mukuamu went 53 yards for a score at Georgia in 2019 and the first for a Gamecock defensive lineman since Devin Taylor raced 48 yards at Arkansas in 2011. **Damani Staley** got the Gamecocks on the board with just a minute left in the first half on a 63-yard interception return at East Carolina. **David Spaulding** went 74 yards with an interception return in the final minute of the first half against Troy. **Jabari Ellis** recovered a fumble and rambled 18-yards for a score late in the first half vs. Florida. Carolina is 4-0 in games with a defensive score. The four defensive scores lead the SEC and ranks in a tie for sixth in the country.

**WE'RE GOING THE OTHER WAY:** Carolina has logged 297 interception return yards this season on 14 picks, just 47 yards off the record of 344 return yards, set in 1984 when the squad intercepted 23 passes. The 297 interception return yards is tied for the fifth-most in the NCAA this season.

**NO PASSING ZONE:** The Carolina pass defense was solid all season. In addition to the 15 interceptions, the Gamecocks surrendered an average of just 178.8 yards through the air, ranking second in the SEC and ninth in the country. The Gamecocks rank 28th in the country in pass efficiency defense.

**FOR STARTERS:** The Gamecocks have had 39 players make starts this season. Nine have started all 12 games, including **Eric Douglas**, **Jovaughn Gwyn**, and **Nick Muse** on offense, and **Jabari Ellis**, **Kingsley Enagbare**, **Jaylan Foster**, **Brad Johnson**, **Zach Pickens** and **Aaron Sterling** on defense.

**YOU GET A WIN AND YOU GET A WIN AND YOU GET A WIN:** The Gamecocks are the only FBS team in the country that can boast three starting quarterbacks with two wins under their belts this season. **Luke Doty** (2-2), **Zeb Noland** (2-2) and **Jason Brown** (2-2) each have two wins as a starter.

**TAKING AIM ON A SCHOOL RECORD:** Placekicker Parker White has a chance to break a few school

records in his final contest. White needs three points to tie Elliott Fry's record of 359 points scored. He needs two field goal attempts to match Collin Mackie's school mark of 98. He also needs three field goals made to tie Mackie's record of 72.

**HE ALREADY HAS ONE RECORD:** **Parker White** is the school's all-time leader in games played with 59, surpassing the previous mark of 57, set by linebacker Rodney Paulk (2006-11). White played in every game since the start of the 2017 season until the 2021 regular season finale against Clemson, in which he did not appear.

**THE ALL-AMERICAN:** Senior safety **Jaylan Foster** was named a Walter Camp second-team All-American and a Phil Steele third-team All-American after tying for the NCAA lead with five interceptions and leading the Gamecocks in tackles.

**ALL-SEC:** **Jaylan Foster** was recognized as a first-team All-SEC selection by the AP, the league's 14 coaches USA TODAY and Phil Steele. **Cam Smith** earned second team All-SEC honors from the AP and ProFootballFocus and was a fourth-teamer from Steele. **Kingsley Enagbare** was first-team All-SEC according to PFF and second-team by Phil Steele. **Juju McDowell** was a fourth-team selection by Steele as a kick returner. **Jaheim Bell** made PFF's All-SEC second team unit. **Parker White** was a second-teamer according to Steele and a third-team pick by PFF. **Josh Vann** earned honorable mention All-SEC honors from PFF.

**FRESH FROSH:** The Gamecocks had three representatives and four spots accounted for on the SEC Coaches' All-Freshman squad. Redshirt freshman **Tyshawn Wannamaker** and redshirt freshman **Alex Huntley** earned spots on the offensive and defensive line, respectively, while true freshman **Juju McDowell** was a Freshman All-SEC selection at both all-purpose back and return specialist.

## Offense

**SATT ATTACK:** The Gamecock offense is under the direction of offensive coordinator **Marcus Satterfield**. Satterfield most recently was part of Matt Rhule's staff with the Carolina Panthers. He and Coach Beamer first met each other as graduate assistants at Tennessee under head coach Phillip Fulmer. Offensive line coach **Greg Adkins** was on that staff as well.

**FO, FO FO:** Moses Malone made that saying famous in the 1983 NBA Championship series, and it reappeared in 2021 with the South Carolina quarterback situation, where **Luke Doty**, **Zeb Noland** and **Jason Brown** have each made four starts. All three own 2-2 records as a starter this season. The last time Carolina started three different signal-callers in one year was in 2016 when Perry Orth (3 starts), Brandon McIlwain (3 starts) and Jake Bentley (7 starts) all took a game's first snap. The only other years since the turn of the century that Carolina used three starting quarterbacks in a season came in 2008 (Tommy Beecher-1, Chris Smelliey-9 and Stephen Garcia-3) and in 2015 (Connor Mitch-2, Perry Orth-8 and Lorenzo Nunez-2).

**LUKE, I WAS YOUR STARTER:** Sophomore **Luke Doty** came out of the spring as the projected starter at quarterback and did nothing to change that early in fall camp. However, he suffered a mid-foot

sprain in his left foot on August 13 and was sidelined for the first two games. He made his 2021 debut at Georgia in relief of an injured Zeb Noland and was the starter for the next four weeks, posting a 2-2 record with wins over Troy and Vanderbilt. He re-injured the foot in the win over Vanderbilt and underwent season-ending surgery on Oct. 21. For the season, he was 86-for-143 (60.1 pct.) for 975 yards with five TDs and three interceptions.

**THE MOVIE RIGHTS ARE UP FOR GRABS:** In what could be taken straight from a Hollywood script, **Zeb Noland** transitioned from graduate assistant to active player during preseason camp following a foot injury to Luke Doty, and started each of the first three games, winning two. Noland, who began his career at Iowa State, then transferred to North Dakota State where he played behind his best friend, Trey Lance, joined the Carolina staff as a G.A. in late May with one year of eligibility left. When Doty was first injured in August, the wheels were put into motion to get Noland back on the field for one final season. His first practice came on Aug. 17, one day after his 24th birthday. He made his fourth start of the season at Texas A&M, but suffered a meniscus tear in his right knee and underwent a minor surgical procedure on Oct. 26.

**THE LONG AND WINDING ROAD:** **Zeb Noland** began his career at Iowa State. In two seasons in Ames (2017-18), he completed 106-of-176 passes (60.2 pct.) for 1,255 yards with six touchdowns and two picks in nine contests. His best performance came against Oklahoma on Sept. 15, 2018, when he completed 25-of-36 passes for 360 yards with two touchdowns. He played in seven games in the spring of 2021 for the North Dakota State Bison, completing 51-of-100 passes for 721 yards with five touchdowns and six interceptions.

**COLONEL ZEBULIAH:** **Zeb Noland** is 2-2 as the Gamecock starting quarterback with wins over Eastern Illinois and East Carolina. He became the first signal-caller to post victories in each of his first two starts since Jake Bentley in 2016. He is 50-for-89 (56.2 pct.) for 608 yards with six touchdowns and one interception in a Gamecock uniform. He threw four touchdown passes in his Gamecock debut against Eastern Illinois, the most for a Carolina QB since Bentley threw for five TDs at Clemson in 2018. He completed a 61-yard pass to Josh Vann on the first offensive series at Georgia, but cut his finger when had his hand stepped on early in the contest and was unable to continue in that game. He did not play again until replacing Luke Doty for the final drive against Vanderbilt and added another chapter to the fairy tale story.

**ZEB TO THE RESCUE:** Backup quarterback **Zeb Noland** was on the field for just 59 seconds of the Gamecocks' 21-20 win over Vanderbilt, but he made every second count. He completed 5-of-8 passes for 75 yards, including a 9-yarder to **Xavier Legette** with 37 seconds remaining for the game-winner. It was Noland's first action since leaving the Georgia game in week 3 with a hand injury.

**THE UNSINKABLE JASON BROWN:** **Jason Brown**, a transfer from FCS-level St. Francis (Pa.), joined the squad in the spring to compete in the quarterback room. He began the season as the third-string signal-caller, but following a season-ending injury to **Luke Doty** and with **Zeb Noland** out following minor knee surgery, Brown was elevated to QB1 and made his first FBS start against Florida and his first overall since 2019. He started the final four games, posting wins over Florida and Auburn.

**WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?:** A redshirt senior with one year of eligibility remaining, **Jason Brown** played in 18 games including a dozen starts for the St. Francis (Pa.) Red Flash in 2018-19, completing 253-of-411 passes (61.6 pct.) for 3,124 yards with 28 TDs and just six INTs. Prior to his first start against Florida, he saw limited duty this sea-

son, getting in second-half action in the season opener against Eastern Illinois (4-of-5, 45 yards), for one snap at Georgia, then seeing his most extensive duty at Texas A&M (8-of-14, 84 yards, 1 TD, 2 INT). For the season, he was 60-of-108 (55.6 pct.) for 721 yards with eight touchdowns and six picks. He threw a season-high three touchdowns versus Auburn. Brown has elected to try the transfer portal again and will not play in the bowl game.

**BACKFIELD IN MOTION:** First-year running backs coach **Montario Hardesty** inherited a talented room that includes **Kevin Harris**, **MarShawn Lloyd**, **Juju McDowell** and **ZaQuandre White**, four viable options to carry the pigskin. All have had their opportunities this season, with the carries ranging from a team-high 121 for Harris to 88 for White, 64 for Lloyd and 47 for McDowell. White has started six times this season while Harris has five starts and McDowell has two. White has led the team in rushing in six games, while Harris has led in four and McDowell in one. The Gamecocks logged three of their four longest runs of the year against Florida with White (54), Lloyd (40) and Harris (39) all breaking off explosive plays.

**Z IS THE X-FACTOR:** **ZaQuandre White**, who began his career at Florida State, has a team-leading 583 rushing yards on 88 carries, an impressive 6.6-yard average. After rushing for 128 yards in the season opener against Eastern Illinois, he had 10 carries for 39 yards over the next two contests, then did not have a carry in three-straight games before leading the team with a 12-carry, 65-yard performance against Vandy and an eight-carry, 59-yard effort at Texas A&M. He notched his second career 100-yard day with a 13-carry, 111-yard effort against Florida and led the team with 99 yards on 16 carries versus Auburn. He is fifth on the squad with 19 pass receptions for 202 yards as well. White has elected to forego the bowl game in order to prepare for the NFL Draft.

**HARRIS HAS MADE HISTORY:** Junior **Kevin Harris** burst onto the scene a year ago, rushing for 1,138 yards in just 10 games, earning first-team All-SEC accolades while leading the conference in rushing. He entered the season as the school's career leader in rushing average per carry at 6.4 for those backs with at least 1,000 career rushing yards. Harris was slowed in fall camp after have a minor procedure on his back over the summer, was not dressed for the opener due to illness and has been slowed by an ankle injury. He had just 237 yards rushing on 70 carries, 3.4 yards per tote, through eight games. The bye week did him well, as he looked like the Harris of 2020 against Florida, rushing 16 times for 128 yards, an average of 8.0 yards per carry. Harris leads the team with 121 carries, rushing for 477 yards. He ranks 23rd in school history with 1,794 career rushing yards. Rob DeBoer is 22nd with 1,810. He is tied for eighth on the school's all-time list with 22 rushing touchdowns.

**HARRIS FINDS THE END ZONE:** After scoring 15 rushing touchdowns a season ago, **Kevin Harris** reached the end zone twice at Tennessee, and added his third of the season at Missouri. Harris ranks tied for eighth on Carolina's all-time rushing touchdowns list with 22.

**THAT WILL DO 'ER, LLOYD:** Gamecock fans waited patiently for the debut of **MarShawn Lloyd**, who suffered a knee injury on the second day of fall camp in 2020. Lloyd was a highly-regarded talent when he joined the squad. He responded with a team-high 14 carries for 55 yards in his debut against Eastern Illinois. He had a career-best 40-yard burst against Florida and has 64 carries for 228 yards this season with one touchdown.

**JUUU ON THAT BEAT:** Freshman running back **Juju McDowell** brings a different dimension to the attack with his quickness and toughness despite his small stature. He had his best game at East Carolina when he rushed for a game-high 71 yards on 11 carries, including 46 yards on seven totes in the deciding fourth quarter. He also logged a 63-yard kickoff return, setting up the game-tying score. That kick return was the longest for a Gamecock since Deebo Samuel raced 90 yards to paydirt on the opening kick against Ole Miss in 2018. For the

season, he has rushed 47 times for 196 yards. He also leads the team with 15 kickoff returns for 394 yards, a 26.3-yard average. McDowell was named to the SEC All-Freshman team by the league's coaches as both an all-purpose back and as a return specialist.

**JUST GIVE ME THE BALL:** With the clock winding down in the first half and the Gamecocks on the doorstep to tie the Auburn game, they turned to converted offensive lineman **Trai Jones**. Jones, a 6-3, 305-pounder who wears number 44 when he lines up at fullback, caught a three-yard pass from Jason Brown to knot the score heading into intermission. It was the first time that Jones had touched the ball in a game situation since he was a pre-teen. He was recognized as the SEC Freshman of the Week for his performance.

**SPREADING THE WEALTH:** The Gamecocks have seven receivers who have reached double-figures in pass receptions this season. **Josh Vann** leads the way with 43 catches, but **Jaheim Bell** (25), **Dakereon Joyner** (24), **Nick Muse** (20), **ZaQuandre White** (19), **Jalen Brooks** (14) and **Kevin Harris** (11) are also in double digits. In total, 18 players have caught a pass in 2021.

**LIVIN' DOWN BY THE RIVER:** Senior **Josh Vann** has developed into the top wide receiver under first-year wide receivers coach Justin Stepp, coming out from the shadows of current NFL standouts **Deebo Samuel**, **Bryan Edwards** and **Shi Smith**. Vann, who earned fourth-team All-SEC honors from Phil Steele leads the team with 43 receptions for a team-high 679 yards, an average of 15.8-yards per catch, including a team-leading five touchdowns. He has 90 career receptions, which also leads the team and ranks in a tie for 25th in school history with Jim Mitchell and Ira Hillary.

**REMEMBERING DEEBO:** **Josh Vann** has a trio of 100-yard receiving games this season. With back-to-back games of 127 receiving yards at East Carolina and 128 at Georgia, he became the first Gamecock to record consecutive 100-yard receiving games since **Deebo Samuel** went for 112 vs Chattanooga and 210 at Clemson in 2018. He added a career-best seven-catch, 111-yard performance against Florida.

**DK IS OK:** Junior **Dakereon Joyner**, who began his Gamecock career at quarterback, is third on the squad with 24 receptions overall. He also sees some action at the wildcat quarterback position and has carried the ball eight times for 13 yards. He caught five passes in the win at East Carolina, including a touchdown grab on a 13-yard reception that tied the game late in the third quarter.

**GETTING THE BAND BACK TOGETHER:** With **Jason Brown** taking over the quarterback duties late in the season, his long-time pass-catching partner **E.J. Jenkins** saw his playing time increase. Jenkins, who made his first start against Florida, has seven catches for 110 yards and a touchdown. He had a 30-yard reception in the last game against Clemson. Brown and Jenkins played together at Chancellor High School in Fredericksburg, Va. and at FCS St. Francis (Pa.) before the pair transferred to Carolina in the spring.

**NICK'S MUSINGS:** **Nick Muse** was a preseason All-SEC tight end candidate who began his career at William & Mary. Muse caught 30 passes a sea-

son ago, most among the returning players. His best performance came in the Georgia game last year when he caught eight passes for 131 yards. In 2021 he has 20 catches for 222 yards and two TDs, including a season-long 29-yard reception in the game-winning drive against Vanderbilt. Muse has accepted an invitation to play in the 2022 East-West Shrine game following the season.

**IT TOLLS FOR THEE:** Regarded as a "Swiss Army Knife," sophomore **Jaheim Bell** has lined up just about everywhere, including the deep man on kick returns. A second-team All-SEC performer; according to PFF, he had the biggest game for a tight end in school history in the win over Vanderbilt, catching six passes for 136 yards with a touchdown. The 136 receiving yards for a tight end surpassed the previous mark of 134, set by Danny Smith in 1985. His score came from 82-yards out, tying for the 10th-longest reception in school history and was the longest since Jake Bentley hit Deebo Samuel on an 89-yarder at Florida in 2018. He caught a touchdown pass in the opener against Eastern Illinois and added a 48-yard reception in the win at East Carolina. For the season he is second on the squad with 25 catches for 338 yards, a 13.5-yard average with three scores.

**LEFT SIDE, STRONG SIDE:** Carolina has had eight different starters and six different starting offensive lines this season. The left side of the line has been more in flux with **Jazston Turnetine** (7 starts), **Jakai Moore** (3 starts) and **Jaylen Nichols** (2 starts) sharing duties at left tackle, while **Ver-shon Lee** (8 starts) and **Nichols** (4 starts) and have split the reps at left guard. The right side has been more stable with center **Eric Douglas** and right guard **Jovaughn Gwyn** both starting every game, while right tackle **Dylan Wonnung** started the first six contests before being sidelined with a back injury, giving way to **Tyshawn Wannamaker** (6 starts). Gwyn, a co-SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week last week, leads the squad with 33 career starts. Wannamaker was a Freshman All-SEC selection by the league's 14 coaches.

**Defense**

**4-2-5 IS RIGHT WITH WHITE:** First-year defensive coordinator **Clayton White** brought a 4-2-5 scheme to Columbia. A four-time nominee for the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach including this season, White most recently served as the DC at Western Kentucky. He has the Gamecocks ranked 12th in the nation in turnovers gained, ninth in pass defense, 28th in pass efficiency defense, 44th in total defense and 48th in scoring defense.

**A VAST IMPROVEMENT:** The Carolina defense ranks 48th in the nation in scoring defense, allowing 24.2 points per game, with six of its 12 opponents scoring 17 points or less, including a shutout of Eastern Illinois. Last season, Carolina gave up 36.0 points per game and held just two of their 10 opponents to 17 points or less. They ranked 105th in the country in scoring defense when they had three starters (Jaycee Horn, Ernest Jones and Israel Mukuamu) who are now playing in the NFL.

**JUST THE SACKS, MA'AM:** EDGE rusher **Kingsley Enagbare** is a returning All-SEC selection, and the Gamecocks added the nation's sack leader from a season ago in **Jordan Strachan**. Enagbare led the

**LONG LIVE THE KING:** Senior EDGE **Kingsley (JJ) Enagbare** was named a semifinalist for the Bednarik Award and is a first-team All-SEC selection according to PFF. He has been invited to play in the 2022 Reese's Senior Bowl and has opted out of the Duke's Mayo Bowl. With 24.0 career tackles for loss including 15.0 sacks, he moved into a five-way tie for ninth on the school's all-time career sacks list. Enagbare has put himself in position to potentially become the third Gamecock defensive player in as many years to be an NFL first-round draft pick, following in the footsteps of Javon Kinlaw (49ers) and Jaycee Horn (Panthers).

**WHY JJ?:** **Kingsley Enagbare** was tagged with the nickname "JJ" as a youngster in deference to the children's television series Jay Jay the Jet Plane.

**UNDER PRESSURE:** In addition to his team-leading 7.0 tackles for loss and his team-best 4.5 sacks this season, **JJ Enagbare** has been credited with 11 of Carolina's 34 quarterback hurries.

**BRAD IS A BAD MAN:** Fifth-year senior **Brad Johnson** made a successful transition from defensive end to linebacker this season. He is second on the squad with 70 tackles, including 4.0 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks. He posted a game-high nine tackles at East Carolina, then had a career-high 11 stops against Kentucky along with a fumble recovery. He also led the team with nine stops against Auburn. He intercepted the first pass of his career at Missouri and has a fumble recovery.

**GONE GREENE:** Fifth-year senior **Sherrod Greene**, the Gamecocks' top linebacker, suffered a serious lower leg injury on the second play from scrimmage at Georgia and missed the rest of the season after undergoing surgery. It's the second-straight year that the season ended prematurely for Greene, as he suffered a season-ending fracture in his hip in the 2020 opener against Tennessee.

**STALEY STEPS UP:** With the loss of Sherrod Greene, **Damani Staley** stepped up. The Super Senior, who is the son of former Gamecock and NFL running back Duce Staley, is third on the team with 62 tackles, including a career-high nine stops against Kentucky and Clemson. He also has a pair of INTs, including a pick-six at East Carolina, and a fumble recovery. He gained his first career sack at Mizzou.

**CLASS ACT:** Linebacker **Spencer Eason-Riddle** was one of 30 candidates for the prestigious Senior CLASS Award. He was also a semifinalist for the Campbell Trophy and was nominated for the Wuerffel Trophy. Eason-Riddle owns two degrees, graduating in May 2019 with a bachelor's degree in public health and in May 2021 with a master's degree in health services policy and management. He has been a regular at the Dorn VA Medical Center and the oncology center of the Prisma Health Children's Hospital among other community service endeavors. He founded and developed the "Sandstorm Buddies Program" which matches student-athletes with cancer patients and their families, where they can serve in a mentor capacity. He also spearheaded a shoe drive in 2021, asking fellow student-athletes and staff to donate lightly worn shoes and cleats to the Boys and Girls Clubs of the Midlands so they can be used by area middle or high school students.

**TOP COVER CORNER:** Cam Smith is considered the Gamecocks' top cover corner. Despite working through some injuries, both preseason and in-season, Smith earned second-team All-SEC honors according to both the AP and PFF, after collecting 41 tackles, including a career-high 10 at Missouri, and 11 pass breakups. He had three interceptions this season, and has five in his career. He ranks second in the SEC with 14 passes defended.

**FOSTER HAS BEEN GOING BANANAS:** "Super Senior" Jaylan Foster had an All-America campaign. A second-team Walter Camp All-American, has been named first-team All-SEC by the Associated Press, the league's coaches, Phil Steele and by USA TODAY. The former walk-on who began his career at Gardner-Webb, leads the team with 91 tackles, including a career-high 13 stops against Tennessee, and is tied for the NCAA lead with five interceptions. It's the most INTs by a Gamecock since Ko Simpson picked off six passes in 2004. He is 12th in the SEC in tackles per game. He forced a pair of fumbles in the win over Troy, both coming in the fourth quarter with the Trojans in Carolina territory, helping preserve the win. Foster was named a Sporting News Midseason All-American and was a semifinalist for the Jim Thorpe Award, which recognizes the nation's top defensive back.

**PICK THIS:** The Gamecocks are tied for 10th in the nation with 15 interceptions, including five by Jaylan Foster, three by Cam Smith and a trio of pick-sixes by Jordan Burch, Damani Staley and David Spaulding.

**BEAMER BALL 2.0:** The Gamecocks have blocked three punts and a field goal this season. They blocked two punts in the season opener against Eastern Illinois, both by Debo Williams, then got another from Jahmar Brown in the win over Troy. Williams, who was named the SEC Freshman of the Week for his efforts, became the first SEC player to record two blocked punts in a game since Florida's Chris Rainey in 2010. Prior to the three this season, the Gamecocks had not blocked a punt since 2014. M.J. Webb blocked a field goal attempt at Texas A&M. The school single-season record for blocked kicks is eight, set in 1994. The three blocked punts are a high since blocking three in 2000. With four blocked kicks and three blocked punts, the Gamecocks are tied for the SEC lead in both categories and tied for ninth- and seventh-nationally in blocked kicks and blocked punts, respectively.

**SPECIAL TEAMS SCORE:** Carolina got a touchdown from its special teams when punter Kai Kroeger connected with Payton Mangrum on a 44-yard pass on a fake punt at Tennessee. Carolina has five non-offensive TDs this season.

**WHITE ON THE MONEY:** Parker White is the first four-year returning starter in school history. With 356 career points, he needs three to tie and four to surpass Elliott Fry's school record of 359 points scored. He has converted 45-of-51 (88.2 pct.) field goal attempts from inside 40 yards and owns a career long of 54 yards. He is tied for fourth among active kickers with 69 career field goals. White owns six fourth-quarter or overtime game-winning field goals in his career.

**PARKER'S BEEN NEARLY PERFECT:** Parker White has been nearly perfect this season, connecting on 13-of-14 field goal attempts and all 27 of his extra point attempts. He is the Gamecocks' leading scorer with 66 points. His career-long 54-yard field goal versus Kentucky ties for the 15th-longest in the country this season and tied for the fourth-longest in school history.

**SEC ACCOLADES:** Parker White has been recognized as the SEC Co-Special Teams Player of the Week twice this season - at East Carolina and versus Florida. He connected on a 39-yard game-tying field goal with 6:46 remaining at ECU, then converted a 36-yard field goal as time expired to lift Carolina to the win. He earned the distinction again after the win over Florida when he hit on a career-high four field goals and scored a career-high 16 points. He became the first Gamecock to make four field goals in a game since 2015. He was also named the Co-SEC Special Teams Player of the Week for his efforts in the 2018 win over Missouri when he hit on all three of his field goal tries on a soggy field, including a 33-yard game-winner in the final seconds.

**KAI KROEGER CAN KICK:** Second-year punter Kai Kroeger was named to the SEC Coaches' all-Freshman team in 2020. In 2021, Kroeger has punted 57 times for a 43.0-yard average with a long of 73 yards at Texas A&M, the longest in the SEC this season and tied for the 20th-longest punt in the country in 2021. He's had 14 punts of 50-plus yards with 21 inside the 20 and just two touchbacks. He was named to the "Ray's 8" list by the Ray Guy Award for his efforts against Kentucky when he placed four of five punts inside the 20. He averaged 56.8 yards on four punts vs. Vanderbilt, earning SEC Special Teams Player of the Week and Ray Guy National Punter of the Week honors. Kroeger who is also considered one of the top holders in the country, threw a 44-yard touchdown pass on a fake punt at Tennessee.

**CHARLOTTE N.C. (AP)** — True freshman quarterback Sam Howell threw for 245 yards and two touchdowns, Myles Wolfork had two late fourth quarter interceptions and North Carolina battled back to beat South Carolina 24-20 on Saturday in Mack Brown's return to the sideline following a five-year hiatus.

Howell capped second half drives of 98 and 95 yards with a 22-yard TD strike to Dyami Brown and a 17-yard scoring toss to Beau Corrales to give Brown his first win since 2013, when he coached at Texas.

Brown was holding back tears as he was interviewed leaving the field after singing the school fight song with fans and raising his hands to them in victory.

"I don't usually (do that) but I thought I should because they stayed, they were loud," Brown said. ... I wanted to tell them thank you."

Later, Brown danced in the Tar Heels locker room.

The Tar Heels' defense was strong in the second half, and Wolfork sealed the win by intercepting Jake Bentley twice on South Carolina's final three possessions helping North Carolina register its first win over a power-conference opponent in a season opener since topping Indiana in 1997, Brown's final season in his first stint at the school.

The Tar Heels were remarkably conservative on offense in crucial situations in the first half, not wanting to put Howell in difficult situations. North Carolina ran 12 plays inside the South Carolina 25-yard line in the first half and 11 were runs. The only pass attempt resulted in a sack.

But as the game progressed, the Tar Heels began to take the handcuffs off Howell and he responded with two big TD passes and no major mistakes.

"We were very conservative with Sam Howell around the goal line early," Brown said. "And we felt like at halftime, he's a quarterback. We want to turn him loose. And he played a tremendous second half."

North Carolina did most of its damage on the ground though, rushing for 238 yards on 52 carries. Javonte Williams led the way with 102 yards on 18 carries.

"They are patient in their runs and we cut back and over-pursued," said South Carolina coach Will Muschamp.

Clemson graduate transfer Tavien Feaster, who won two national championship rings with the Tigers and ran for 1,109 yards and 13 touchdowns over the past two seasons, ran for 72 yards and a touchdown for the Gamecocks.

Bentley was limited to 142 yards passing.

**GAME CHANGER**

North Carolina scored on drives of 98 and 95 yards in the fourth quarter to overcome a 20-9 deficit for a 24-20 victory. The Tar Heels scored on passes of 22 and 17 yards, part of Sam Howell's 245 passing yards.

**KEY STAT**

483 — The Tar Heels gained 483 of total offense, compared to 270 for the Gamecocks. Javonte Williams had 102 rushing yards while Dazz Newsome had 74 yards receiving. North Carolina also has 33:42 time of possession.

# SHANE BEAMER



Shane Beamer, considered to be one of the rising stars among coaches in college football, was named the University of South Carolina's 36th head football coach on Dec. 6, 2020.

Beamer, 44, has been an assistant coach at seven Football Bowl Sub-division schools for 21 seasons. During his career, he has coached in 17 bowl games, including a College Football Playoff National Championship Game, has posted 18 non-losing seasons, six of those with double-digit victories and his teams have won 63.0 percent of its games.

Beamer has been a part of building programs throughout his career. He has been a part of three coaching staffs, where the head coach was in his first or second season at the school. He joined Sylvester Croom's staff at Mississippi State in his first season, Kirby Smart's program at Georgia in his first season, and Lincoln Riley's unit at Oklahoma in his second season.

He comes to Carolina from Oklahoma, where he has served as the assistant head coach for offense, coaching tight ends and H-backs, for the last three seasons. In 2020, Oklahoma ranked sixth in the country in scoring (43.0), 11th in total offense (494.7) and 14th in passing offense (315.0). The Sooners led the nation in yards per play (8.0) and ranked third in total offense (537.6) and fourth in passing efficiency rating (187.0) in 2019. Oklahoma led the nation in total offense (570.3), scoring offense (48.4) and yards per play (FBS-record 8.6), and ranked second in passing efficiency rating (194.9) in 2018.

The Charleston, S.C. native, returns to one of his previous coaching stops, having been with the Gamecocks for four seasons (2007-10). In 2007, he served as the outside linebackers coach and co-special teams coordinator. He mentored the cornerbacks in 2008, then coached the Spurs and strong safeties and was both the special teams coordinator and recruiting coordinator in 2009 and 2010 under Steve Spurrier.

In 2009 at South Carolina, Beamer was nominated for the Frank Broyles Award, which goes annually to the nation's top assistant coach. His special teams' units recorded five blocked kicks that season, tying for the SEC lead and tying for the eighth-highest total in the nation. He also helped coach a defensive unit that ranked third in the SEC and 15th in

the country in total defense, and second in the league and eighth in the country in passing defense.

As the Gamecocks' recruiting coordinator, his 2009 class was ranked 12th-best by both Rivals and Scout, and the 2010 and 2011 classes were ranked in the Top 25.

During Beamer's tenure as recruiting coordinator at Carolina, nine of his signees were selected in the NFL draft. Those include first round selection Stephen Gilmore (Buffalo Bills) and second round selections Alshon Jeffery (Chicago Bears) and D.J. Swearinger (Houston Texans).

The Gamecocks all-time winningest quarterback, Connor Shaw, and rushing touchdown leader, Marcus Lattimore, were also in the 2010 class.

Prior to his arrival in Norman, Beamer spent two seasons on the staff at Georgia as tight ends coach and special teams coordinator under Kirby Smart. The Bulldogs posted a 21-7 combined record with Beamer on staff. In 2017, the Bulldogs won the SEC Championship and finished second in the nation, falling in the CFP title game to Alabama in overtime. His special teams ranked eighth nationally in net punting (41.7), and 20th in kickoff returns (23.5) while blocking four kicks.

The son of Hall of Fame coach, Frank Beamer, he worked with his father as the associate head coach and running backs coach at Virginia Tech from 2011-15. In his first year, he coached David Wilson, who broke the Tech single-season rushing record and was named All-American and ACC Player of the Year and went on to become a first-round NFL draft selection by the New York Giants. Shane served as the Hokies' acting head coach in the 2014 Military Bowl win while his father watched from the press box following throat surgery.

Beamer's first full-time coaching position was at Mississippi State, joining the Bulldogs in 2004 as cornerbacks coach and recruiting coordinator. In his first two seasons at State, he guided three defensive backs to SEC All-Freshman Team accolades. He maintained the recruiting coordinator title but made the move to running backs coach in the spring of 2006 where he tutored running back Anthony Dixon to SEC All-Freshman honors.

Beamer spent three seasons (2001-03) as a graduate assistant at Tennessee, helping with the cornerbacks, coaching the placekickers, punters, and long snappers, and assisting in all special teams areas. He also oversaw game opponent scouting while earning a master's degree in sport management in December 2003.

Before joining the staff at Tennessee, he worked one season (2000) as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech, helping with the Yellow Jacket quarterbacks and wide receivers.

A 2000 graduate of Virginia Tech, Beamer was a member of five bowl teams (1995-99 seasons) and three Big East Conference championship squads on the Hokie football team as a long snapper and wide receiver. He was a long snapper on the 1999 Tech team that played for the BCS National Championship.

Beamer and his wife, Emily, are the parents of three children - two daughters, Sutton and Olivia, both born in Columbia, and a son, Hunter, born in Blacksburg, Va.

**COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)** — South Carolina coach turned quarterback Zeb Noland threw for four touchdowns on 13 completions as the Gamecocks beat Eastern Illinois 46-0 on Saturday night.

It was the debut for South Carolina coach Shane Beamer. He promised “Beamer Ball” just like his dad Frank Beamer played at Virginia Tech and his team delivered, holding the Panthers (0-2) to 109 yards and getting its first shutout in 13 years.

The Gamecocks version of Beamer Ball blocked two punts, picked off two passes with one going back for a 61-yard touchdown, ran a successful two-point trick play with the kicking team on the field after their first touchdown, converted all three fourth downs it tried including a fourth-and-goal from the 3, had two sacks and hit hard.

“People talk about Beamer Ball — that’s what it was. You have the ability to score on offense, defense or special teams no matter who is on the field. We want to have that mentality,” Shane Beamer said.

Beamer, 44, brought joy and enthusiasm to a team that had lost six in a row and 11 of its past 14 games — at least for a night and against a Football Championship Subdivision opponent.

Beamer won his opener with an unusual quarterback. Noland came to Columbia this spring to be a graduate assistant after playing seven games for North Dakota State in a season delayed to spring 2021 because of COVID-19.

Chris Katrenick was 13-for-22 for 78 yards and Tyler Hamilton caught five passes for 32 yards for Eastern Illinois.

**GAME CHANGER**

Jaheim Bell caught a 3-yard pass from Zeb Noland with 5:04 left in the first, giving Carolina a 15-0 lead on its way to the shutout of the Panthers. It was Bell’s first career touchdown.

**KEY STAT**

129 – ZaQuandre White led the Gamecocks with 129 yards rushing and a touchdown, including a 63-yard touchdown run with 10:24 left in the game. White also had 39 yards receiving, leading the Gamecocks in that category as well.

**GREENVILLE, N.C. (AP)** — Parker White kicked a 36-yard field goal as time expired as South Carolina rallied from 14 down to beat East Carolina 20-17 on Saturday, earning its first road win under first-year coach Shane Beamer.

Damani Staley had a 63-yard interception return for a touchdown just before halftime to give the Gamecocks a needed spark after trailing 14-0 in a mistake-filled opening half. Former graduate assistant Zeb Noland also had a game-tying touchdown pass to Dakereon Joyner in the back of the end zone late in the third quarter.

In the end, the Gamecocks (2-0) did enough to give themselves a shot, then rode the legs of Juju McDowell - who gained 45 yards on six carries on South Carolina's final 10-play drive - to set up White's winner that had the Gamecocks spilling onto the field from the sideline to celebrate.

South Carolina won despite committing three turnovers in its first five drives, including a goal-line fumble that went through the end zone for a turnover in the first half.

Tyler Snead hit on a 75-yard trick-play touchdown pass to Jsi Hatfield on the game's first offensive snap for the Pirates (0-2), while Holton Ahlers also ran for a short touchdown for the 14-0 lead. But East Carolina struggled to generate consistent offense, with Ahlers completing 11 of 24 passes for just 77 yards and two interceptions.

The Pirates were hosting a Southeastern Conference team for the first time since South Carolina's last visit here in 1997.

The Gamecock defense stopped East Carolina on a 3rd-and-5 to force a punt, giving the Gamecocks the ball for its game-winning drive. Jaylan Foster and David Spaulding made the tackle to hold ECU's Tyler Snead to just a one-yard gain.

**ATHENS, GA. (AP)** — JT Daniels returned to the lineup with three touchdown passes, Georgia's fearsome defense nearly made it three-straight games without allowing a TD and the No. 2 Bulldogs romped to a 40-13 victory over South Carolina on Saturday night.

Daniels completed 23-of-31 for 303 yards, including scoring throws of 43 yards to Jermaine Burton, 38 yards to freshman Adonai Mitchell and 4 yards to James Cook.

Georgia (3-0, 1-0 Southeastern Conference) finally gave up a touchdown while on defense when Luke Doty, getting the ball on the Bulldogs' side of the field after a fumble, connected with Josh Vann on a 36-yard touchdown pass with 10:55 remaining.

To that point, the only touchdown against Georgia this season had come on an interception return.

With Doty playing for the first time this season, South Carolina (2-1, 0-1) gave up three sacks and a safety, along with two turnovers that led to Georgia touchdowns.

Daniels sat out a 56-7 victory over UAB with an oblique injury, watching as backup Stetson Bennett tied a school record with five touchdown passes.

Daniels wasted no time re-establishing his hold on the No. 1 spot, completing a 21-yard pass to Brock Bowers on his very first snap and guiding the Bulldogs to the end zone on their first two possessions.

Bennett got a shot the third time the Bulldogs had the ball. He promptly threw an interception that was returned to the Georgia 12, setting up a field goal.

Daniels returned to the game and didn't leave until early in the fourth quarter with the outcome no longer in doubt.

After punting the ball away in the closing seconds of the first half and content to settle for a 21-6 lead, Georgia wound up scoring five more points.

Backed up on their own 1, the Gamecocks explicitly attempted to throw out of the end zone. Doty was sacked by Jordan Davis and Nolan Smith for a safety.

Then, after receiving the free kick, Daniels completed three passes for 39 yards to set up Jack Podlesny's 36-yard field goal as time expired, sending Georgia to the locker room up 26-6.

Georgia put it away in opening minute of the second half, again sparked by a huge defensive play.

Doty's pass was picked off by Derion Kendrick, who returned it to the South Carolina 20. Zamir White ripped off a 15-yard run, then took it in from the 5 to pad the lead to 33-6.

Cook had two touchdowns, also scoring on a 23-yard run.

**GAME CHANGER**

Jaylan Foster picked off a JT Daniels pass at the Georgia 47 and returned it 35 yards to the Bulldog 12. Carolina was not able to punch it in the end zone, as Parker White's 27-yard field goal made it 14-6 Georgia with 1:34 left in the first quarter. The Bulldogs responded with a second quarter touchdown drive, a safety and a field goal as the Gamecocks did not get any closer in their first loss of 2021.

**COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)** — Matt Ruffolo made three field goals to help Kentucky beat South Carolina 16-10 on Saturday night.

Despite its three turnovers, Kentucky (4-0, 2-0 Southeastern Conference) beat South Carolina (2-2, 1-1) for the seventh time in eight years, and set up a collision course toward next week's matchup at home against No. 11 Florida.

"We just have to worry about ourselves. We got to prove to each other and the team that we can go out there and compete with anybody who steps on the field," said Kentucky linebacker DeAndre Square, who led the Wildcats with eight tackles. "It's not about anybody else, it's about us."

Chris Rodriguez Jr. ran for 144 yards on 26 carries for the Wildcats. Will Levis was 15-of-22 passing for 102 yards and threw an interception.

Kavosiey Smoke scored on 15-yard touchdown run on the first series of the game, capping a 12-play, 75-yard drive for Kentucky. Ruffolo's 41-yard field goal to end the second quarter gave the Wildcats a 10-0 lead.

Luke Doty threw a 5-yard touchdown pass to Jalen Brooks early in the third quarter for South Carolina. Ruffalo made field goals from 21 and 27 yards before Parker White's 54-yard field goal capped the scoring with 2:31 remaining.

Doty was 17-of-25 passing for 158 yards. Kevin Harris was held to just 38 yards rushing on 12 carries.

South Carolina recovered fumbles on back-to-back Kentucky possessions but couldn't get any points despite going for it twice on fourth down. Each time, a dropped pass ended the drive.

"If you just look at some things, our turning the ball over, there's no excuse for it. The ball bouncing to the other team sometimes, there's no controlling that," Kentucky coach Bob Stoops said. "When I first got here, we couldn't play a lick of defense, but we led the country in fumbles. With some of those fumbles (this year), we just can't do it."

The Gamecocks' defense has recovered multiple takeaways in every game but the offense hasn't been able to take advantage. After scoring 46 points over hapless Eastern Illinois in its opener, South Carolina has a mere 43 points since.

"I don't know. There's a lot. We ran the ball 26 times for 58 yards. Not good enough," South Carolina coach Shane Beamer said. "Each week's different, and right now, it ain't good enough."

**GAME CHANGER**

Kentucky had three field goals on the night, the final one with 4:26 left in the game that gave the Wildcats a 16-7 lead. Carolina answered with a field goal of its own, a career-high 54-yard field goal from Parker White, but the Wildcats were able to salt the clock and earn the six-point win.

**COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)** — South Carolina's offensive consternation still isn't cured. The Gamecocks have scored one rushing touchdown in five games.

But as long as the Gamecocks' defense can pick up the slack, as they did with their third touchdown of the year against Troy, they can continue to work on it without feeling too bad.

David Spaulding returned an interception 74 yards for a touchdown, Parker White kicked three field goals and South Carolina overcame several mistakes in the second half to hold off the Trojans 23-14 on Saturday.

White booted a 37-yard field goal in the fourth quarter with just over two minutes left to make it a two-possession lead and Damani Staley intercepted Taylor Powell with less than 30 seconds to play.

"I don't know about you guys, I feel like I aged about 40 years during that game," said South Carolina coach Shane Beamer, who saw his Gamecocks score one defensive TD and should have scored another. "We talk about playing smart football. We didn't do a great job of that today."

The Gamecocks (3-2) led 17-7 at halftime after Spaulding's return. Yet the Trojans (2-3) wouldn't go away and South Carolina's inability to take advantage of its numerous chances to score helped Troy stay in it.

"The key to the game, obviously, the turnovers. Seemed to be the difference," Troy coach Chip Lindsey said. "We matched their intensity, we matched their physicality, I thought. At the end of the day, we can't put the ball on the ground."

The Gamecocks still haven't found a solution for their sputtering running game, but quarterback Luke Doty completed 20 of 34 passes for 255 yards and a touchdown with no interceptions and one fumble.

The Gamecocks blocked a Troy punt in the third quarter but only got a field goal out of a possession starting at the Trojans' 23-yard line. Then after an interception by South Carolina's Jahmar Brown was wiped by a booth review, the nuttiness began.

The Gamecocks forced a punt but Ahmearan Brown muffed the catch. Troy set up for a third-and-9 on the next possession. The Gamecocks' Jaylan Foster sacked Powell on a safety blitz and the ball squirted loose. Staley retrieved it and tried to run, but was tripped.

The ball again tumbled to the turf and Brown picked it up and began running. He easily out-paced the rest of the field for a touchdown, except Brown flipped the ball to the referee a split-second before he crossed the goal line and it rolled out of bounds.

Touchback. Not touchdown.

South Carolina held again, forced a punt, and again tried to drive for the game-clinching score. Doty had the ball knocked out of his hand and the Trojans recovered.

The Gamecocks got it right back after Foster forced a fumble and Zacch Pickens recovered.

South Carolina managed to hold onto the ball and drove 53 yards in 12 plays for White's last field goal. The sixth-year "super senior" hasn't missed a kick all year and mentioned Samson in the post-game as he showed up with a bushy beard. He has vowed not to shave or cut his hair until he misses one.

**KNOXVILLE, TENN. (AP)** — Hendon Hooker threw for 225 yards and three touchdowns to lead Tennessee to a 45-20 Southeastern Conference victory over South Carolina Saturday.

The Volunteers (4-2, 2-1) led 35-0 in the second quarter before the Gamecocks (3-3, 0-3) staged a recovery

Vols' running back Tiyon Evans rushed for 119 yards and a touchdown before leaving midway through the third quarter with an injury.

South Carolina's Kevin Harris scored from a yard out to start the fourth quarter. A missed two-point conversion made the score 38-20. Tennessee's offense generated just 25 offensive yards in the third quarter. Len'Neth Whitehead, replacing the injured Evans at running back, scored Tennessee's last TD from two yards.

Trailing by 31 midway through the third quarter, South Carolina had fourth-and-9 on the Tennessee 44. Punter Kai Kroeger hit wide-open Payton Mangrum with what turned out to be a scoring pass and a 38-14 difference.

A 28-0 first-quarter lead blossomed to 38-7 by halftime. Hooker completed 15 of 20 passes for 217 yards and three scores in the first 30 minutes.

As the Vols were leading 28-0 with just under six minutes left in the first half, Evans found a seam up the middle and won the race to the end zone for a 45-yard TD and 35-0 Tennessee lead. With just over 2 minutes left in the half, South Carolina finally got on the board. Luke Doty's 24-yard pass to Dakereon Joyner was the key play in a 75-yard drive that was culminated by a 6-yard run by Harris.

Tennessee's Jalin Hyatt scored the game's first touchdown when he caught a slant from Hooker from three yards to cap a 66-yard drive. Less than three minutes later, Hooker connected with JaVonta Payton from 39 yards for a 14-0 advantage.

Before the first quarter ran out, Tennessee upped the score to 21-0. South Carolina had the ball inside the Vols' 5-yard line when receiver Jalen Brooks threw a pass that was intercepted in the end zone by Jaylen McCollough. Five plays later Hooker scored on an 11-yard run. With 12 seconds left in the first quarter, the Vols made it 28-0. Four plays after a Gamecocks fumble, Hooker hit Velus Jones for a 21-yard score.

**GAME CHANGER**

With Tennessee leading 14-0, Carolina drove down to the Volunteer one-yard line but a halfback pass from Jordan Burch was intercepted by Jaylen McCollough in the end zone. Tennessee then went 80 yards in five plays to go up 21-0.

**COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)** — Zeb Noland's played more than enough football to be ready when called on and cherish the moments of success. The former graduate assistant did both to rally South Carolina to its first Southeastern Conference win in more than year.

Noland entered on the Gamecocks' final drive and led a 75-yard touchdown drive, connecting with Xavier Legette on a 9-yard scoring pass with 37 seconds left for a 21-20 win over Vanderbilt on Saturday night.

But there was Noland, calm and confident, leading South Carolina (4-3, 1-3 SEC) to snap its nine-game losing streak against conference opponents.

Gamecocks coach Shane Beamer said Noland came in when Luke Doty was feeling some soreness in a foot injury he sustained this summer at practice. Noland started the first three games before Doty took over in the middle of a 40-13 loss to Georgia last month. Noland hadn't played since then.

Noland's message in the huddle was simple: "Keep me clean. I got you. That's what I said, and let's roll."

Noland got the Gamecocks rolling with a 29-yard pass to tight end Nick Muse to get into Vanderbilt territory.

He had completions of 15 yards to Josh Vann and 21 yards to Dakereon Joyner to the Commodores' 9. On Noland's winning throw, Legette ran to the back of the end zone and got open for the winning score.

Parker White made the extra point to send Vanderbilt, which held a 20-14 lead with less than two minutes left, to its 16th straight loss against SEC opponents.

Noland is not worried about when he'll play again, just about making sure he does what he can to be a good team and prepare Doty or anyone in the quarterback room for the next game.

Noland began his college career at Iowa State, moving on to North Dakota State where he was a teammate of San Francisco 49ers passer Trey Lance before accepting Beamer's offer to join the staff here.

Noland was convinced to put the pads back on when Doty hurt his foot this past August.

It looked like the Commodores would be the ones celebrating after Joseph Bulovas hit a 28-yard field goal with 1:36 to go for a 20-14 lead. Vanderbilt's defense had held South Carolina scoreless for nearly 49 minutes.

But Noland gave South Carolina the winning spark and Beamer his first SEC victory since taking over the program last December.

Vanderbilt quarterback Mike Wright threw for 206 yards including a 52-yard touchdown pass to Will Sheppard for a 17-14 lead in the third quarter that held up until the final seconds.

Vanderbilt broke its season-long scoring drought against the SEC with Bulovas' 42-yard field goal in the opening quarter. The Commodores added their first TD in league play when Rocko Griffin Jr. ran in from a yard out to take advantage of a South Carolina fumble and cut the lead to 14-10.

**GAME CHANGER**

Carolina's defense forced Vanderbilt into two turnovers and just 312 yards of total offense in the game. The Gamecocks capped off the game with a sack fumble from Kingsley Enagbare and a recovery from Jabari Ellis at the Vanderbilt 4-yard line.

**BRYAN-COLLEGE STATION, TEXAS (AP)** — Ainius Smith had a 95-yard punt return for a touchdown and Jalen Wydermyer added two TD catches as No. 17 Texas A&M built a huge first-half lead and coasted to a 44-14 rout of South Carolina Saturday night.

The star rushing duo of Isaiah Spiller and Devone Achane continued to do damage for the Aggies. They combined for 256 yards and two touchdowns a week after rushing for 292 yards and three touchdowns.

Texas A&M (6-2, 3-2 SEC) raced to a 31-0 lead by halftime, and Achane's 35-yard touchdown run made it 41-0 late in the third. It was the third straight victory for Texas A&M, which knocked off top-ranked Alabama two weeks ago before beating Missouri last week.

Zach Calzada had 187 yards passing with two touchdowns for the Aggies.

South Carolina graduate assistant-turned-quarterback Zeb Noland had a tough night before he was benched for Jason Brown early in the fourth quarter. Noland managed just 30 yards passing and had a snap fly over his head that the Aggies recovered and turned into a touchdown in the second quarter.

Noland started the first three games but was hurt Sept. 18 against Georgia and didn't play again until leading a game-winning drive in the last minute against Vanderbilt last Saturday. Luke Doty was injured against the Commodores and is out for the season after having foot surgery this week.

Brown led the Gamecocks (4-4, 1-4) on two touchdown drives after replacing Noland, but also threw an interception in the end zone.

Smith gave A&M an early lead with his punt return TD in the first quarter. It was the longest punt return for a touchdown in the FBS this season and the longest for the Aggies since Dustin Harris had a 96-yard return for a TD in 2012 against South Carolina State.

Jaylan Foster grabbed his NCAA-leading fifth interception later in the first, but the Gamecocks couldn't move the ball after the turnover and had to punt.

The Aggies extended the lead to 14-0 when Wydermyer grabbed a 25-yard touchdown reception on their next possession.

Wydermyer made it 21-0 when he grabbed a short pass and barreled through several defenders for a 28-yard score with about 10 1/2 minutes left in the first half.

He had 75 yards receiving to give him 1,306 in his career, passing Martellus Bennett (1,246) for most by a tight end in school history.

It looked like Noland had his coaching hat back on three plays after Wydermyer's second TD when he was so preoccupied yelling and gesturing at his teammates to get set that he didn't realize the ball had been snapped and it sailed over his head.

The ball rolled all the way to the South Carolina 6 - a loss of 19 yards - before Aaron Hansford pounced on it to give A&M the ball. The Aggies cashed in on the mistake three plays later on a 1-yard TD run by Spiller that made it 28-0.

**GAME CHANGER**

Carolina fumbled on a bad snap to Texas A&M's six-yard line, where the Aggies recovered. Isaiah Spiller scored on a one-yard rushing touchdown as the Aggies took a 28-0 lead.

**COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)** — When Shane Beamer accepted the South Carolina job last December, he recalled his days as Steve Spurrier's assistant and the big wins and raucous atmosphere when the Gamecocks were rolling.

The first-year coach got his first true taste of that with Spurrier in the building as the Gamecocks routed Florida 40-17 on Saturday night.

First-time starter Jason Brown threw for two touchdowns, Kevin Harris and ZaQuandre White each rushed for over 100 yards and South Carolina's defense held the potent Gators' attack to just 82 yards rushing.

"I remember days and nights like this," when he was here from 2007-2010 as the Gamecocks won their only SEC Eastern Division in that final season, Beamer said.

"We're not there yet," Beamer cautioned. "We're still a work in progress, but we took a big step tonight."

A step that few expected out of South Carolina (5-4, 2-4 Southeastern Conference). The Gamecocks were routed at Texas A&M 44-14 two weeks ago and saw its starting quarterback Zeb Noland undergo knee surgery.

The Gators (4-5, 2-5) entered averaging 242 yards a game on the ground and 483 yards of total offense, third best in the SEC. But South Carolina became the first team this season to outgain them, 459-340.

Parker White had a career-best four field goals and defensive tackle Jabari Ellis had an 18-yard fumble recovery touchdown to put South Carolina up 30-10 at halftime.

"The fair just left town and I still feel like I'm on a rollercoaster," Ellis said of following the A&M loss with the biggest win of the season.

Brown became the Gamecocks' third starting passer this season and the FCS transfer made his first Southeastern Conference start an eye-opening one.

"He's always prepared himself for the moment," Gamecocks' receiver Josh Vann said.

Brown, who last played at St. Francis, steadily led South Carolina on five first-half scoring drives for a 30-10 lead at the break.

Brown looked like an SEC veteran as he filled in after grad-assistant coach turned quarterback Noland continued his recovery from knee surgery last week. It's probably not Brown's last start at South Carolina after what he showed in this one.

"Just like that, I was the next guy up," Brown said. "At this level, there's no excuses, you've got to be ready to play."

Emory Jones completed 17 of 30 passes for 258 yards and two touchdowns. He also threw an interception and the fumble that went for a score.

Harris, a 1,000-yard rusher last season, finished with 128 yards while White had 111.

Florida coach Dan Mullen said his team has struggled, losing four of the past five and three straight for the first time since 2017.

"You go look throughout the season, there's a lot of little things that have gone wrong," Mullen said. "We're not doing things that you play winning football at."

Aaron Sterling forced a fumble at the Florida 20 and Jabari Ellis returned it 18 yards for a touchdown to give Carolina a 30-10 lead on Florida with 1:13 left in the first half. The Gamecocks scored 30 in the first half, the most in a half since the second half of the Vanderbilt game in 2020.

**COLUMBIA, MO. (AP)** — Tyler Badie rushed 34 times for 209 yards and a touchdown and Missouri held off South Carolina's fourth-quarter charge to defeat the Gamecocks 31-28 on Saturday.

The Tigers (5-5, 2-4 Southeastern Conference) built a 17-point lead when Badie scored on a 19-yard run with 12:31 left in the game. That's when the opportunistic Gamecocks (5-5, 2-5 SEC) made things interesting by converting two Missouri turnovers into touchdowns and slicing the deficit to three points with 4:32 left. But they never saw the ball again, thanks to Badie, who rushed for 63 yards on the final drive.

The game turned late in the third quarter when blitzing safety Martez Manuel jarred the ball from South Carolina quarterback Jason Brown and defensive end Trajan Jeffcoat recovered in the end zone to give the Tigers a 10-point lead. Missouri's Connor Bazelak completed 15 of 23 passes for 180 yards and two touchdowns. Mookie Cooper had three catches for 72 yards and a touchdown.

Brown, who was making his second start of the year, completed 16 of 30 passes for 193 yards, with two touchdowns and two interceptions. Josh Vann had five catches for 62 yards and a touchdown. But the Gamecocks rushed for just 57 yards against a defense that entered the game allowing 270 yards per game on the ground.

**GAME CHANGER**

Missouri recovered a fumble in the end zone with 4:28 left in the third quarter as Trajan Jeffcoat picked up the Jason Brown fumble to give Missouri a 24-14 lead. Carolina scored 14 straight points in the fourth quarter to cut the lead to three, but Missouri ran out the clock on its last drive to pick up the win.

**COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)** — It's not his ultimate goal at South Carolina, but first-year coach Shane Beamer couldn't hold back the tears after his Gamecocks became bowl eligible with a 21-17 win over Auburn on Saturday night.

Beamer said at practice this week, he got sad watching the first team he's even been in charge of, afraid they might lose their last two and have just a week-and-a-half left together.

"Thank God that's not the case," Beamer said getting emotional again in his postgame news conference. "I'm so happy."

The Gamecocks (6-5, 3-5 Southeastern Conference) fought back in this one. For the second week in a row, Auburn (6-5, 3-4) dominated early and jumped out to a big lead - this time 14-0 - but saw it evaporate as their defense suddenly lost its edge.

"We've got to show up in games and play four quarters," said Auburn coach Bryan Harsin, whose team blew a 28-3 lead to Mississippi State last week.

Zaquandre White, who finished the game with 99 yards running had just three yards on the ground when Auburn led by 14

But the Gamecocks scored touchdowns on their next two drives with White running for 37 yards and popping uncovered out of the backfield for a 28-yard TD on a 4th-and-3 that turned the momentum of the game around.

It was nothing fancy, Beamer said.

"We talked about this being big boy SEC football," Beamer said. "We literally lined up in the second half and ran the same two plays over and over and over and over and over again."

Auburn appeared to have one last chance, but a review of several minutes determined a South Carolina punt barley brushed Jaylon Simpson's leg with 2:11 to go and the Gamecocks ran the clock out

Auburn lost its third game in a row even though Tank Bigsby ran for a season best 164 yards on 22 carries. LSU transfer T.J. Finley made his first start for his new team, going 17-for-32 passing for 188 yards after Bo Nix was lost for the season with a broken ankle.

South Carolina made a bowl last season with a 2-8 record, but it was canceled because of COVID-19.

"This is just the start," Beamer said. "Our goal isn't to just win six games and go to a bowl."

**GAME CHANGER**

Auburn led 14-7 in the second quarter and had fourth and 1 at its 35-yard line. The Tigers went for it and failed on the fourth down and the Gamecocks responded with a six-play, 35-yard touchdown drive that ended with a 1-yard pass from Jason Brown to Trai Jones.

**COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)** — Will Shipley ran for 128 yards and a touchdown and Clemson's defense smothered South Carolina for its seventh-straight win in the Palmetto State rivalry 30-0 on Saturday night.

The Tigers (9-3; No. 23 CFP) won their fifth straight this season and matched the longest win streak in the series that they set from 1934-40.

Clemson's defense limited South Carolina (6-6) to 206 yards, its second lowest output this season. It was the Tigers' first rivalry shutout since a 45-0 win in 1989 and its first time holding an opponent scoreless since a 49-0 win over The Citadel in 2020.

The Tigers outrushed the Gamecocks 265 to 43. "There's nothing more demoralizing than to have the ball run on you," Clemson offensive coordinator Tony Elliott said.

The lone drama at the end was whether South Carolina could put points on the board. With five seconds left, quarterback Zeb Noland ran 12 yards to the Clemson 3 before getting tackled by Jeremiah Trotter Jr.

Clemson's bench jumped from the sidelines to celebrate the shutout and the landmark win in a game that's the most anticipated sporting event in South Carolina each year.

"I want to apologize to our fans for that performance," first-year South Carolina coach Shane Beamer said after the program was shutout for the first time since a 28-0 loss to Virginia in the Belk Bowl three seasons ago. "It starts with me as head coach."

Shipley went past 100 yards for a second straight game and third time this season, the most by a Tigers freshman since his position coach, C.J. Spiller, had five such games in 2006.

Clemson had seen its chance at a seventh straight appearance in the Atlantic Coast Conference title game end with No. 24 North Carolina State's win over North Carolina on Friday night. The Tigers made sure they wouldn't lose their grip on the state against the Gamecocks.

D.J. Uiagalelei ran for 22 yards on third down to keep the Tigers' first drive going before Shipley broke free for a 29-yard touchdown run.

In the second quarter up 10-0, Clemson again called on its revived rushing attack - the Tigers ran for a season-best 333 yards a week ago in a 48-27 win over No. 21 Wake Forest - to wear down South Carolina.

Kobe Pace shot through the line for a twisting, 34-yard run to the end zone to extend the lead.

Uiagalelei struggled passing against South Carolina's defense as he went 9 of 19 for 99 yards with an interception. It was Uiagalelei's lowest passing output this season.

Clemson's defense, as it had done much of the year, guaranteed the offensive output would hold up.

South Carolina, which had beaten Florida and Auburn earlier this month, managed just 75 yards in the opening half. Quarterback Jason Brown threw for only 53 yards and was intercepted twice, both by cornerback Andrew Booth Jr.

Brown finished 8-of-19 passing for 67 yards and was replaced by Noland, the grad assistant coach turned quarterback, in the fourth quarter.

**GAME CHANGER**

Kobe Pace gave Clemson a 17-0 lead with 12:10 left in the first half on a 34-yard touchdown run. It was a seven-play, 79-yard drive that lasted 3:08. Pace had 58 of Clemson's 265 rushing yards on the night.
