**THE SERIES:** This is the eighth gridiron meeting between South Carolina and Texas A&M. The Gamecocks are still looking for their first win over their "permanent" SEC Western Division rival from College Station. The two schools met for the first time in 2014 in Columbia, with A&M posting a 52-28 win in the season opener for both teams. The Aggies own a 4-0 record in Columbia and are 3-0 against the Gamecocks in College Station. Three of the seven games have been decided by seven points or less.

**THE BONHAM TROPHY:** Amateur historian Richard Peterson, a USC Broadcasting Journalism graduate and previous resident of Alamo Heights in San Antonio, Texas, recommended "The Governor's Trophy" to be named after James Butler Bonham, Hero of the Alamo and himself an Alum of The University of South Carolina. Peterson and Katon Dawson took the idea to then Texas Gov. Rick Perry and Gov. Nikki Haley of South Carolina and a new tradition was born. "The Bonham Trophy" is exchanged between the Governors of South Carolina and Texas with the winner taking possession of the Bonham Trophy of "Western Artwork," created by renowned Texas sculptor Jeff Gottfried, and displayed at the victorious State Capital, University or any location the Governor may choose. Two weeks after the Game, The Bonham Trophy is returned for permanent display at The Alamo until the next South Carolina - Texas A&M football game.



**THE LAST TIME THEY MET:** No. 7 Texas A&M rolled to a 48-3 win over South Carolina in Columbia on Nov. 7, 2020. The Aggies scored touchdowns on seven of 10 possessions, while holding a 530-150 advantage in yards and a 38:21-21:39 lead in time of possession.

**THE LAST TIME THEY MET HERE:** Texas A&M scored 17 points in the first nine minutes of the fourth quarter to break open a close contest in a 30-6 win over South Carolina on Nov. 16, 2019 in College Station. Kellen Mond threw for 221 yards and a touchdown and ran for a second score in the win. A&M rolled up 540 yards compared to just 260 for the Gamecocks, including a 319-45 advantage on the ground, as the Aggies controlled the time of possession, 41:39-18:21.

**FACING TEAMS FROM THE LONE STAR STATE:** Carolina is 3-11 all-time against teams from the Lone Star State, going 1-0 against Texas, 1-2 versus both Baylor and Houston, and 0-7 against Texas A&M. This will mark the Gamecocks fourth trip to College Station in the last seven years. Prior to the 2015 meeting, South Carolina had not ventured into the state of Texas since dropping an 18-17 decision to Baylor in Waco on Oct. 2, 1976.

**DEEP IN THE HEART OF:** The Gamecocks own a 1-6 record when playing in Texas. Their only win came 64 years ago, Oct. 5, 1957, when they ventured into Austin and defeated the 20th-ranked Texas Longhorns by a 27-21 score. Carolina has lost three times at A&M, (2015, '17 and '19) twice at Baylor (1949 and '76) and at Houston (1973 - the night after the Riggs-King Battle of the Sexes tennis match in the Astrodome).

**PLAYING A RANKED OPPONENT:** The Aggies come into this week's contest ranked 17th in both the A.P. and Coaches' polls. Texas A&M is the second ranked opponent Carolina will face this season. The Gamecocks dropped a 40-13 decision at Georgia earlier this season when the Bulldogs were ranked second in both polls. The Gamecocks last win over a ranked opponent came last year when they topped No. 15/14 Auburn in Columbia by a 30-22 score. Carolina's last road win over a ranked opponent came in 2019 when the Gamecocks went into Athens and knocked off the third-ranked Georgia Bulldogs 20-17 in double overtime.

## A South Carolina win over Texas A&M would...

- ◆ Be the Gamecocks' first win in eight tries against their "permanent" SEC Western Division opponent from College Station.
- ◆ Be the Gamecocks' first win in the state of Texas since 1957. The Gamecocks have dropped each of their last five contests played in the Lone Star State.
- ◆ Give the Gamecocks their second SEC win of the season, matching their SEC win total from 2020.

**QUICKLY:** First-year head coach Shane Beamer and the South Carolina Gamecocks (4-3, 1-3 SEC) travel to College Station, Texas this week for an SEC showdown with the No. 17/17 Texas A&M Aggies (5-2, 2-2 SEC). The annual battle for the Bonham Trophy will take place at 7:30 pm ET (6:30 pm CT) on Saturday, Oct. 23 at Kyle Field (102,733).

**OVER THE AIRWAVES:** SEC Network has the television broadcast with Tom Hart and Jordan Rodgers in the booth and Cole Cubelic on the sidelines. Kate Scott and Mike Golic have the national radio call for Learfield College Football Saturday Night. Todd Elis and Tommy Suggs handle the call for the Gamecock Radio Network with Jamar Nesbit on the sidelines.

**A LITTLE HISTORY:** 2021 marks the 128th season of intercollegiate football at the University of South Carolina dating back to 1892. It is the 115th-consecutive year in which South Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina owns an all-time record of 618-598-44, a .508 winning pct.

**IT JUST MEANS MORE:** The 2021 season marks South Carolina's 30th year in the Southeastern Conference. South Carolina and Arkansas joined the league prior to the 1992 campaign. The Gamecocks earned the SEC Eastern Division title in the 2010 season. The Gamecocks are 100-137-1 (.422) all-time in SEC regular-season play.

**ABOUT LAST WEEK:** Back-up quarterback **Zeb Noland** led the Gamecocks on an 8-play, 75-yard drive in 59 seconds with no timeouts, connecting with **Xavier Legette** on a 9-yard touchdown pass with 37 seconds remaining to lift South Carolina to a 21-20 win over Vanderbilt last Saturday in Columbia. The Gamecocks scored on each of their first two possessions to open up a 14-3 lead, but four turnovers and 10 penalties kept Carolina from scoring again until the final possession. The Gamecocks had 434 yards of offense, including 317 through the air, to just 312 for Vandy.

**A MILESTONE WIN:** The win over Vanderbilt marked South Carolina's 100th conference win since joining the SEC in 1992. It also was the Gamecocks' 13th-straight win over Vanderbilt.

**ZEB TO THE RESCUE:** Backup quarterback **Zeb Noland** played for just 59 seconds of the Gamecocks' 21-20 win over Vanderbilt, but he made every second count. He completed 5-of-8 passes for 75 yards, including a 9-yarder to **Xavier Legette** with 37 seconds remaining for the game-winner. It was Noland's first game action since leaving the Georgia game in week 3 with a hand injury.

**THE BELL COW:** **Jaheim Bell** had the biggest game for a tight end in school history in the win over Vanderbilt, catching six passes for 136 yards with a touchdown. The 136 receiving yards for a tight end surpassed the previous mark of 134, set by Danny Smith in 1985. His score came from 82-yards out,

tying for the 10th-longest reception in school history and was the longest since Jake Bentley hit Deebo Samuel on an 89-yarder at Florida in 2018.

**WE'RE GOING THE OTHER WAY:** **Jordan Strachan** picked off a pass and returned it 44 yards against Vanderbilt. That gave the Gamecocks 281 interception return yards this season on 10 picks, just 63 yards off the record of 344 return yards, set in 1984 when the squad intercepted 23 passes.

**BOMBS AWAY:** Carolina punter **Kai Kroeger** had a big day against Vanderbilt, earning SEC Special Teams Player of the Week and Ray Guy national Punter of the Week accolades. He had four punts for 227 yards, a 56.8-yard average with all four going for 50-plus yards (54, 70, 53 and 50). Three of the four punts were placed inside the 20. He boomed a career-long 70-yard punt, the longest for a Gamecock since Joseph Charlton had a 73-yarder in 2017. Vandy had no return yards, so the Gamecocks had a net of 56.8 yards per punt.

**FINISH STRONG:** The Gamecocks have been very good in the fourth quarter, outscoring its opponents by a 46-16 margin in the final period. Carolina has been outscored in each of the first three quarters, 59-38 in the first quarter, 46-42 in the second stanza and 31-27 in the third quarter, but the big fourth quarter advantage gives the Gamecocks a slim 153-152 overall scoring advantage.

**THAT'S OUR BALL:** The Gamecock defense has been outstanding in forcing turnovers this season. They forced a season-high four turnovers against Troy, collecting a pair of fumbles along with two interceptions, and have forced at least two turnovers in six of their seven games (EIU-2; ECU-2; UGA-3; UK-3; Troy-4; UT-0; VU-2). For the season, South Carolina has forced 16 turnovers - 10 interceptions and six fumbles, ranking in a six-way tie for third in the NCAA, behind only Iowa (20) and Middle Tennessee (18).

**PICK PARTY:** The Gamecocks have 10 interceptions this season, ranking in a five-way tie for fifth in the NCAA behind only Iowa (16), Troy (12), Kent State (12) and Cincinnati (11). Included are a trio of pick-sixes by **Jordan Burch**, **Damani Staley** and **David Spaulding**. **Jaylan Foster** leads the way individually with four, which puts him in a six-way tie for the NCAA lead. South Carolina recorded just eight INTs in 10 games last year.

**THREE TO THE HOUSE:** The Gamecock defense has scored three times this season on pick-sixes. In the opener against Eastern Illinois, it was defensive end **Jordan Burch** who picked off a pass and rumbled 61 yards to paydirt. That was Carolina's first pick-six since Israel Mukuamu went 53 yards for a score at Georgia in 2019 and the first for a Gamecock defensive lineman since Devin Taylor raced 48 yards at Arkansas in 2011. Linebacker **Damani Staley** got the Gamecocks on the scoreboard with just a minute left in the first half on a 63-yard interception return against East Carolina.

**David Spaulding** went 74 yards with an interception return in the final minute of the first half against Troy. The Gamecocks are in a four-way tie for third in the NCAA behind only Ohio State (5) and UTSA (4) with three defensive touchdowns. The three interception returns for touchdowns is the most for Carolina in a season since 2010 (5).

## Offense

**SATT ATTACK:** The Gamecock offense is under the direction of **Marcus Satterfield**. Satterfield most recently was part of Matt Rhule's staff with the Carolina Panthers. He and Coach Beamer first met each other as graduate assistants at Tennessee under head coach Phillip Fulmer. Offensive line coach **Greg Adkins** was on that staff as well.

**STORY WORTHY OF THE BIG SCREEN:** In what could be taken straight from a Hollywood script, **Zeb Noland** transitioned from graduate assistant to active player during preseason camp following a foot injury to Luke Doty, and started each of the first three games, winning two. Noland, who began his career at Iowa State, then transferred to North Dakota State where he played behind his best friend, Trey Lance, joined the Carolina staff as a G.A. in late May with one year of eligibility left. When Doty was injured, the wheels were put into motion to get Noland back on the field for one final season. His first practice came on Aug. 17, one day after his 24th birthday. He is the probable starter at quarterback this week at Texas A&M.

**IN A PREVIOUS LIFE:** **Zeb Noland** began his career at Iowa State. In two seasons in Ames (2017-18), he completed 106-of-176 passes (60.2 pct.) for 1,255 yards with six touchdowns and two picks in nine contests. His best performance came against Oklahoma on Sept. 15, 2018, when he completed 25-of-36 passes for 360 yards with two touchdowns. He played in seven games in the spring of 2021 for the North Dakota State Bison, completing 51-of-100 passes for 721 yards with five touchdowns and six interceptions.

**COLONEL ZEBULIAH:** **Zeb Noland** is 2-1 as the Gamecock starting quarterback. He became the first signal-caller to post victories in each of his first two starts since Jake Bentley in 2016. He is 32-for-55 (58.2 pct.) for 482 yards with six touchdowns and one interception in a Gamecock uniform. He threw four touchdown passes in his Gamecock debut against Eastern Illinois, the most for a Carolina QB since Bentley threw for five TDs at Clemson in 2018. He completed a 61-yard pass to Josh Vann on the first offensive series at Georgia, but cut his finger when he stepped on early in the contest and was unable to continue in that game. He had not played again until replacing Doty for the final drive against Vanderbilt and added another chapter to the Cinderella story, leading the Gamecocks on a game-winning 8-play, 75-yard scoring drive with no timeouts in 59 seconds, leaving just 37 seconds on the clock.

**DOTY HAS BEEN QB1:** Sophomore **Luke Doty** came out of the spring as the projected starter at quarterback and did nothing to change that early in fall camp. However, he suffered a mid-foot sprain in his left foot on August 13 and was sidelined for the first two games. He made his 2021 debut at Georgia in relief of an injured Zeb Noland and went the distance in his first start the following week against Kentucky. He earned his first win

as a starter against Troy. For the season, he is 86-for-143 (60.1 pct.) for 975 yards with five touchdowns and three interceptions.

**LUKE, I AM YOUR STARTER:** **Luke Doty** has made six career starts - the final two games of the 2020 season vs. Georgia and at Kentucky as a true freshman, along with the last four weeks against Kentucky, Troy, Tennessee and Vanderbilt. He is 2-4 as a starter, completing 102-of-164 passes (62.2 pct.) for 1,097 yards with six touchdowns and four interceptions. He has thrown a touchdown pass in five of his six career starts. He had the biggest passing game of his career in the win over Troy. He set career-highs in completions (20), attempts (34) and yards passing (255) against the Trojans. It was his first collegiate victory as a starting QB.

**WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?:** **Jason Brown**, a transfer from FCS-level St. Francis (Pa.), joined the squad in the spring to compete in the quarterback room. He played in 18 games, making a dozen starts for the Red Flash, completing 253-of-411 passes (61.6 pct.) for 3,124 yards with 28 touchdowns and just six interceptions. He was QB2 in the season opener and saw second-half action, completing 4-of-5 passes for 45 yards. He also got in one snap, throwing an incomplete pass, at Georgia.

**BACKFIELD IN MOTION:** New running backs coach **Montario Hardesty** inherited a talented room that includes **Kevin Harris**, **MarShawn Lloyd**, **Juju McDowell** and **ZaQuandre White**, four viable options to carry the pigskin. All have had their opportunities this season, with the carries ranging from a team-high 68 for Harris to 34 for White.

**HARRIS HAS MADE HISTORY:** Junior **Kevin Harris** burst onto the scene a year ago, rushing for 1,138 yards in just 10 games, earning first-team All-SEC accolades while leading the conference in rushing. He entered the season as the school's career leader in rushing average per carry at 6.4 for those backs with at least 1,000 career rushing yards. Harris was slowed in fall camp after having a minor procedure on his back over the summer and was not dressed for the opener due to illness. He has started the last five games and leads the team with 68 carries for 237 yards. He is 10th on the school's all-time list with 21 rushing touchdowns. He ranks 28th in school history with 1,554 career rushing yards. Jeff Grantz is 27th with 1,577.

**HARRIS FINDS THE END ZONE:** **Kevin Harris** reached the end zone twice at Tennessee, his first two rushing touchdowns of the season. Harris moved into sole possession of 10th place on Carolina's all-time rushing touchdowns list with 21.

high 71 yards on 11 carries, including 46 yards on seven totes in the deciding fourth quarter. He also logged a 63-yard kickoff return, setting up the game-tying score. That kick return was the longest for a Gamecock since Deebo Samuel raced 90 yards to paydirt on the opening kick against Ole Miss in 2018. For the season, he has rushed 41 times for 187 yards, has seven receptions for 41 yards and has six kickoff returns for 191 yards, a 31.8-yard average, as the coaches look to get the ball in his hands.

**THAT WILL DO 'ER, LLOYD:** Gamecock fans waited patiently for the debut of **MarShawn Lloyd**, who suffered a knee injury on the second day of fall camp in 2020. Lloyd was a highly-regarded talent when he joined the squad. He responded with a team-high 14 carries for 55 yards in his debut against Eastern Illinois. He has 42 carries for 146 yards this season.

**WHITE READY WHEN CALLED ON:** **ZaQuandre White**, who began his career at Florida State, carried just 16 times a year ago for 59 yards, but has 232 rushing yards on 34 carries, an average of 6.8 yards per carry. After rushing for 128 yards in the season opener against Eastern Illinois, he had 10 carries for 39 yards over the next two contests, then did not have a carry in three-straight games before bouncing back with a team-leading 12-carry, 65-yard performance last week against Vandy.

**THAT'S A FULL BACK:** Redshirt freshman offensive lineman **Trai Jones** wore number 44 and played fullback for the first time this season at Tennessee. Jones stands 6-3 and weighs 305 pounds,

**SPREADING THE WEALTH:** The Gamecocks have six different receivers who have reached double-figures in pass receptions this season. **Josh Vann** leads the way with 22 catches, but **Dakereon Joyner** (18), **Jaheim Bell** (16), **Jalen Brooks** (14), **Nick Muse** (12) and **Kevin Harris** (10) are also in double digits. In total, 17 different players have caught a pass this season.

**THE LEADER OF THE PACK:** Senior **Josh Vann** has become the go-to receiver under new wide receivers coach Justin Stepp, coming out from the shadows of **Deebo Samuel**, **Bryan Edwards** and **Shi Smith**. Vann leads the team with 22 receptions for a team-high 399 receiving yards, an average of 18.1-yards per catch, including a pair of scores. He has 69 career receptions, which also leads the team. The senior has already surpassed his career receiving yards (377) entering the 2021 season.

**REMEMBERING DEEBO:** With back-to-back games of 127 receiving yards at East Carolina and 128 at Georgia, **Josh Vann** became the first Gamecock to record consecutive 100-yard receiving games since **Deebo Samuel** went for 112 vs Chattanooga and 210 at Clemson in 2018.

**BROOKS IS NOT DONE:** **Jalen Brooks** is in his second year at Carolina. His journey started at Wingate, then he spent a semester at Tarleton State before joining the Gamecocks. He did not gain NCAA eligibility until the fifth game of the 2020 season and ended that season with 11 receptions. A deep play threat, Brooks showed his ability with a highlight-reel one-handed catch at Georgia. He set career-highs in receiving yards in back-to-back games, going for 54 yards on three receptions at Georgia before logging 63 yards on four catches against Kentucky. For the season, he has 14 receptions for 181 yards, 12.9-yards per catch.

**DK JOINS IN:** Junior **Dakereon Joyner**, who began his Gamecock career at quarterback, continues to make strides at wide receiver. He was the co-Offensive Player of the Spring and can make plays with the ball in his hand. He caught five passes in the win at East Carolina, including a touchdown grab on a 13-yard reception that tied the game late in the third quarter. He is second on the squad with 18 receptions overall.

**THE X FACTOR:** Not much had been heard from **Xavier Legette** this season, but he made his presence felt against Vanderbilt with Jaylen Brooks unavailable. Legette, who missed a couple of games earlier in the season following a motorcycle accident, had his first four catches of the season for 31 yards against the Commodores, including the game-winner from nine-yards out with just 37 seconds remaining in the contest.

**TARGETING THE TIGHT END:** The trio of tight ends - **Nick Muse**, **Jaheim Bell** and **Traevon Kenion** - have been targeted 23 times in the last two games. They were targeted 12 times at Tennessee, with seven receptions for 78 yards. Against Vanderbilt they were targeted 11 times with eight receptions for 167 yards.

**NICK'S MUSINGS:** "Super Senior" **Nick Muse** is a preseason All-SEC tight end candidate who began his career at William & Mary. Muse caught 30 passes a season ago, most among the returning players. His best performance came in the Georgia game last year when he caught eight passes for 131 yards. For the season he has 12 catches for 133 yards and two touchdowns, including a season-high 29-yard reception in the final game-winning drive against Vanderbilt.

**IT TOLLS FOR THEE:** Regarded as a "Swiss Army Knife," sophomore **Jaheim Bell** could lineup just about anywhere, including the deep man on kick return. He had the biggest game for a tight end in school history in the win over Vanderbilt, catching six passes for 136 yards with a touchdown. The 136 receiving yards for a tight end surpassed the previous mark of 134, set by Danny Smith in 1985. His score came from 82-yards out, tying for the 10th-longest reception in school history and was the longest since Jake Bentley hit Deebo Samuel on an 89-yarder at Florida in 2018. He caught a touchdown pass in the opener against Eastern Illinois and also had a 65-yard TD run called back. He added a 48-yard reception in the win at East Carolina. For the season he has 16 receptions for 281 yards, a 17.6-yard average with a pair of scores. He has also rushed three times for 16 yards and has a 22-yard kickoff return.

**LEFT SIDE, STRONG SIDE:** New offensive line coach **Greg Adkins** has experience to work with, as eight of his linemen have made starts for the Gamecocks. The left side of the line has been more in flux this season with **Jazston Turnetine** (4 starts) and **Jakai Moore** (3 starts) sharing duties at left tackle, while **Jaylen Nichols** (4 starts) and **Vershon Lee** (3 starts) have split the reps at left guard. The right side has been more stable with center **Eric Douglas** and right guard **Jovaughn Gwyn** both starting every game, while right tackle **Dylan Wonnum** has started all but once this season. Wonnum (a team-high 30 career starts) and Gwyn (28) received some preseason All-SEC recognition.

## Defense

**4-2-5 IS RIGHT WITH WHITE:** New defensive coordinator **Clayton White** brought a 4-2-5 scheme to Columbia. A three-time nominee for the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach, White most recently served as the DC at Western Kentucky. He has the Gamecocks ranked third in the nation in turnovers gained, 17th in pass defense, 35th in pass efficiency defense, 35th in total defense and 45th in scoring defense.



**A VAST IMPROVEMENT:** The Carolina defense ranks 45th in the nation in scoring defense, allowing 21.7 points per game, with four of its seven opponents being held to 17 points or less, including an opening game shutout of Eastern Illinois. Last season, South Carolina gave up an average of 36.0 points per game and held just two of their 10 opponents to 17 points or less. They ranked 105th in the country in scoring defense a year ago when they had three starters (Jaycee Horn, Ernest Jones and Israel Mukuamu) who are now playing in the NFL.

**JUST THE SACKS, MA'AM:** EDGE rusher **Kingsley Enagbare** is a returning All-SEC selection, and the Gamecocks added the nation's sack leader from a season ago in **Jordan Strachan**. Enagbare led the Gamecocks with 6.0 sacks, ranking second in the SEC with 0.75 sacks per game a year ago. Strachan had a Georgia State school record 10.5 sacks, tying for first in the FBS. South Carolina has recorded 18 sacks this season, including a season-high six at Tennessee. That was the most sacks in a game for the Gamecocks since they notched seven against the Vols in 2017.

**LONG LIVE THE KING:** Senior EDGE **Kingsley (JJ) Enagbare** gained most of the off-season attention, and rightly so. A 2020 first-team All-SEC selection, Enagbare has not rested on his laurels, but was named the 2021 Rex Enright Defensive Player of the Spring. With 22.0 career tackles for loss includ-

ing 15.0 sacks, he has moved into a five-way tie for ninth on the school's all-time career sacks list. Enagbare has put himself in position to possibly become the third Gamecock defensive player in as many years to be an NFL first-round draft pick, following in the shoes of Javon Kinlaw (49ers) and Jaycee Horn (Panthers).

**UNDER PRESSURE:** In addition to his team-leading 4.5 sacks this season, **Kingsley Enagbare** has been credited with eight of the Gamecocks' 19 quarterback hurries.

**WHY JJ?:** **Kingsley Enagbare** was tagged with the nickname "JJ" as a youngster in deference to the children's television series Jay Jay the Jet Plane.

**THREE IN DOUBLE FIGURES:** The Gamecocks have three players who have recorded double-digits in career sacks with **Kingsley Enagbare** (15.0), **Aaron Sterling** (12.0) and **Jordan Strachan** (11.5) all in double figures. Here are the career sack numbers:

**BRAD IS A BAD MAN:** Fifth-year senior **Brad Johnson** has made a smooth transition to the linebacker position. He had a solid performance in the opener against Eastern Illinois, collecting a pair of tackles for loss including a sack. He followed that up with a game-high nine tackles at East Carolina, including his second sack of the season. He had a career-high 11 stops against Kentucky along with a fumble recovery. He is second on the squad with 41 tackles, including 3.5 tackles for loss.

**GONE GREENE:** Fifth-year senior **Sherrod Greene**, the Gamecocks' top linebacker, suffered a serious lower leg injury on the second play from scrimmage in the loss at Georgia and will be out for an extended period of time after undergoing surgery. It's the second-straight year that the season ended very early on for Greene, as he suffered a fracture in his hip in the 2020 season opener against Tennessee and missed the remainder of the season.

**STALEY STEPS UP:** With the loss of Sherrod Greene, **Damani Staley** has stepped up. The Super Senior, who is the son of former Gamecock and NFL run-

ning back Duce Staley, is third on the team with 36 tackles, including a career-high nine stops against Kentucky. He also has a pair of INTs, including a pick-six at East Carolina, and a fumble recovery.

**CLASS ACT:** Linebacker **Spencer Eason-Riddle** has been named one of 30 candidates for the prestigious Senior CLASS Award. He is also a semifinalist for the Campbell Trophy and is on the Wuerffel Trophy Watch List. Eason-Riddle owns two degrees, graduating in May 2019 with a bachelor's degree in public health and in May 2021 with a master's degree in health services policy and management. He has been a regular at the Dorn VA Medical Center and the oncology center of the Prisma Health Children's Hospital among other community service endeavors. He founded and developed the "Sandstorm Buddies Program" which matches student-athletes with cancer patients and their families, where they can serve in a mentor capacity. He also spearheaded a shoe drive in 2021, asking fellow student-athletes and staff to donate lightly worn shoes and cleats to the Boys and Girls Clubs of the Midlands so they can be used by area middle or high school students.

**REVAMPED SECONDARY:** The defensive secondary took the biggest hit in the offseason, as Jaycee Horn and Israel Mukuamu both gave up their eligibility to turn pro while Jammie Robinson (Florida State), John Dixon (Penn State) and Shilo Sanders (Jackson State) all elected to transfer. The Carolina coaches brought in among others **David Spaulding** (Georgia Southern) and **Carlins Platel** (Assumption), who have seen regular action.

**TOP COVER CORNER:** **Cam Smith** is considered the Gamecocks' top cover corner. Despite missing much of camp with an injury, Smith has acquitted himself nicely, collecting 20 tackles and a team-leading seven pass breakups.

**FOSTER HAS BEEN BANANAS:** "Super Senior" **Jaylan Foster** is having an All-America campaign. The former walk-on who began his career at Gardner-Webb, leads the team with 58 tackles from his safety position, including a career-high 13 stops against Tennessee, and is tied for the NCAA lead with four interceptions. He is tied for fourth in the SEC with 8.3 tackles per game. In addition, he forced a pair of fumbles in the win over Troy, both of which came in the fourth quarter with the Trojans in Carolina territory, helping preserve the win.

**FOSTER JUBILEE:** Sixth-year senior safety **Jaylan Foster** is in a six-way tie for the NCAA lead with four interceptions. The Gamecocks have not had an individual intercept more than four passes in a season since Ko Simpson logged six picks in 2004.

**PICK THIS:** The Gamecocks are tied for fifth in the nation with nine interceptions, including four by Jaylan Foster and a trio of pick-sixes by **Jordan Burch**, **Damani Staley** and **David Spaulding**. Here are the career numbers:

**BEAMER BALL 2.0:** The Gamecocks have blocked three punts. They blocked two in the season opener against Eastern Illinois, both credited to **Debo Williams**, then got another from **Jahmar Brown** in the win over Troy. Williams, who was named the SEC Freshman of the Week for his efforts, became the first SEC player to record two blocked punts in a game since Florida's Chris Rainey accomplished the feat in 2010. Prior to the three this season, the Gamecocks had not blocked a punt since 2014. With three blocked punts, the Gamecocks are in a six-way tie for second in the NCAA in that category behind only Old Dominion (4).

**SPECIAL TEAMS SCORE:** The Gamecocks got a touchdown from their special teams when punter **Kai Kroeger** connected with **Payton Mangrum** on a 44-yard pass on a fake punt in the third quarter at Tennessee. It was Kroeger's second career completion in as many attempts, as he connected with **Dakereon Joyner** at Kentucky last season. It was Carolina's fourth non-offensive TD of the year.

**WHITE ON THE MONEY:** **Parker White** is the first four-year returning starter in school history. He took advantage of the NCAA ruling to allow him to return for a sixth year and fifth season. White is on a quest to become the school's all-time leading scorer. With 331 points, he needs 29 more to surpass Elliott Fry's school record of 359 points scored. He has converted 42-of-48 (87.5 pct.) field goal attempts from inside 40 yards and owns a career long of 54 yards. He is tied for third among active kickers with 65 career field goals. White owns six fourth-quarter or overtime game-winning field goals in his career, providing the deciding points in wins over Louisiana Tech (2017), Tennessee (2017), Missouri (2018), Tennessee (2018), Georgia (2019) and East Carolina (2021).

**PARKER'S BEEN NEARLY PERFECT:** Parker White has been nearly perfect so far this season, connecting on 9-of-10 field goal attempts and all 14 of his extra point attempts. He is the Gamecocks' leading scorer with 41 points. His career-long 54-yard field goal versus Kentucky ties for the sixth-longest in the country this season and tied for the fourth-longest in school history. It was his second career field goal of 50-plus yards.

**HIGH PRAISE:** Parker White was recognized as the SEC Co-Special Teams Player of the Week following his performance at East Carolina. He connected on a 39-yard game-tying field goal with 6:46 remaining in the contest, then converted a 36-yard field goal as time expired to lift the Gamecocks to the win. Carolina had trailed the entire game until White's game-winner. It marked the second time that White has been recognized by the SEC. He was also named the Co-SEC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance in the 2018 win over Missouri when he hit on all three of his field goal attempts on a soggy field, including a 33-yard game-winner with two second remaining.

**FROM WAY DOWNTOWN, BANG:** Parker White drilled a 54-yard field late in the game against Kentucky. It was the longest of White's career, surpassing his previous long of 50 yards, set against Appalachian State in 2019. The 54-yard field goal matched the fourth-longest in school history.

**KROEGER KICKS IT:** Second-year punter Kai Kroeger was named to the SEC Coaches' all-Freshman team in 2020. In 2021, Kroeger has punted 31 times for a 44.0-yard average with a long of 70 yards against Vanderbilt. He's had 11 punts of 50-plus yards with 12 inside the 20 and just one touchback. He was named to the "Ray's 8" list by the Ray Guy Award for his efforts against Kentucky when he placed four of five punts inside the 20. He averaged 56.8 yards on four punts vs. Vanderbilt, earning SEC Special Teams Player of the Week and Ray Guy National Punter of the Week honors. Kroeger also handles the holder duties on placements with short snapper **Matthew Bailey** and placekicker **Parker White**. He is considered one of the top holders in the country. He also threw a 44-yard touchdown pass on a fake punt at Tennessee.

## Miscellaneous

**RING THE BELL:** Shane Beamer got off to a 2-0 start as the South Carolina head coach. He became the first coach to win his first two games since Richard Bell got off to a 2-0 start in 1982.

**PITCHING A SHUTOUT:** The Gamecocks recorded their first shutout in the opener against EIU since August 28, 2008, a 34-0 win over NC State.

**NEVER SAY NEVER:** The Gamecocks overcame a 14-0 deficit to defeat East Carolina, 20-17. The 14-point deficit was the largest that resulted in victory for the Gamecocks since they trailed Michigan by 16 points, 19-3, in the third quarter of the 2018 Outback Bowl before storming back for a 26-19 win.

**YOUR MONEY'S NO GOOD HERE:** Head coach Shane Beamer placed both linebacker **Darryle Ware** and deep snapper **Matthew Bailey** on scholarship on Sept 21 and 22, respectively. Bailey became the first recipient of the scholarship named in memory of Jake Panus.

**SUPER SENIORS:** The Gamecocks list eight players whose eligibility would have expired had not the NCAA allowed the 2020 season to be a "free" year. Those "super" seniors are LB **Spencer Eason-Riddle**, DT **Jabari Ellis**, DB **Jaylan Foster**, TE **Nick Muse**, QB **Zeb Noland**, LB **Damani Staley**, EDGE **Aaron Sterling** and PK **Parker White**.

**UTILIZING THE PORTAL:** The Gamecocks' roster features 10 scholarship transfers, including seven who enrolled at Carolina in January. The list includes WR **Ahmarean Brown** (Georgia Tech), QB **Jason Brown** (St. Francis, Pa.), DT **Keem Green** (Nebraska), WR **E.J. Jenkins** (St. Francis, Pa.), DB **David Spaulding** (Georgia Southern), EDGE **Jordan Strachan** (Georgia State) and LB **Debo Williams** (Delaware). QB **Zeb Noland** (North Dakota State), DB **Carlins Platel** (Assumption) and DB **Tyrese Ross** (Washington State) joined the roster in the fall.

**ONE FOR THE THUMB:** With the NCAA rule allowing for an extra year, three Gamecocks - LB **Damani Staley**, EDGE **Aaron Sterling** and PK **Parker White** - can become the first players in school history to letter five times in their career.

**WEARING THE PATCH:** Nineteen Gamecocks, have their undergraduate degrees in hand. The list includes: **Wyatt Campbell**, **Devontae Davis**, **Eric Douglas**, **Jabari Ellis**, **Kingsley Enagbare**, **Jaylan Foster**, **Spencer Eason-Riddle**, **Sherrod Greene**, **Tyreek Johnson**, **Hank Manos**, **Sean McGonigal**, **Zeb, Noland**, **Carlins Platel**, **Darius Rush**, **OrTre Smith**, **Damani Staley**, **M.J. Duce is currently the assistant head coach/running backs coach for the Detroit Lions. **Landon Grier's** father, Chris, is the general manager of the Miami Dolphins.

**COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)** — Kellen Mond threw four touchdown passes to become the school's career leader, Isaiah Spiller ran for 131 yards and the Aggies routed South Carolina 48-3 on Saturday night.

"We're turning heads and doing a lot of things that people didn't think we were going to do," Aggies defensive tackle Bobby Brown III said. "We're going to keep turning heads, proving people wrong."

Just maybe all the way to a playoff berth. They certainly look the part against the Gamecocks.

"You always think you can be dominant," Texas A&M coach Jimbo Fisher said. "The experience has helped on each side of the ball. Learning to win each play and, in turn, the bigger picture is coming together."

Especially when Mond, Spiller and the Aggies defense play like this.

Mond set the school mark with the 68th touchdown pass of his career, a 52-yarder to Devon Achane in the third quarter with the game long decided.

Mond also ran for a score to help Texas A&M improve to 5-1 — all in the Southeastern Conference — for its best start since opening 6-0 in 2016. The Aggies are 7-0 against the Gamecocks.

Mond and Spiller helped the Aggies open a 21-0 halftime lead and cruise to their fourth consecutive victory since a loss at Alabama last month.

Spiller had two short pickups for first downs — one on a fourth-and-1 with Texas A&M in chip-shot field goal range — before Mond flipped a 4-yard TD pass to Ainius Smith.

Mond found tight end Jalen Wydermyer for two first-half scores. Wydermyer was left all alone and walked into the end zone on a 15-yard scoring grab. Right before half, Mond hit Wydermyer on a crossing route near the goal line to go up three scores.

South Carolina (2-4), coming off an off week, had no answer.

Quarterback Collin Hill was 8 of 21 for 66 yards and two interceptions before getting lifted in the fourth quarter for last year's starter and current backup, Ryan Hilinski.

Kevin Harris, the SEC's second-leading rusher coming in, was limited to 39 yards on 13 carries.

Mond had a 15-yard scoring run to start the third quarter before his long TD pass to Achane gave him his latest school record. Mond already holds career Aggies marks for completions, passing yards and total offense — probably with more on the way as his senior season continues.

He finished 16 of 26 for 224 yards.

Spiller also had two catches for 46 yards before limping off the field in the third quarter. The tailback went into the Aggies' medical tent and came out running on the sidelines. But with Texas A&M's big lead, he was not needed in the second half.

South Carolina has surrendered 1,071 yards and 100 points in losses to LSU and the Aggies its past two games.

The Gamecocks avoided their first shutout since 2018 on Parker White's 48-yard field goal with less than six minutes left.

**GAME CHANGER**

Texas A&M started the scoring with a 12-play, 52-yard drive, capped by a three-yard pass from Kellen Mond to Ainius Smith with 4:40 left in the first quarter. Jalen Wydermyer and Devon Achane each had a pair of touchdowns for the Aggies' offense.

**KEY STAT**

530 — The Aggies had a balanced attack of 264 rushing and 266 passing yards in the win as Isaiah Spiller ran 18 times for 131 yards and Kellen Mond was 16-for-26 for 244 yards and four touchdowns.

— Kellen Mond threw for 221 yards and a touchdown and ran for a second score as Texas A&M extended its winning streak to four games with a 30-6 win over South Carolina on Saturday night.

Cordarrian Richardson ran for 130 yards, including a 75-yard touchdown, and added a TD reception to help the Aggies to the victory on a night they piled up 319 yards rushing.

With just four wins and one game left the loss guarantees that the Gamecocks (4-7, 3-5 Southeastern Conference) won't make a bowl game for the first time in four seasons.

South Carolina fell to 0-6 all-time against Texas A&M and lost its second straight game this season after falling to Appalachian State last week.

The Aggies led by 10 at halftime and neither team could get anything going after the break, combining for six punts in the third quarter. South Carolina went three-and-out twice and the Aggies punted after just three plays once.

Texas A&M (7-3, 4-2) was finally able to sustain a drive when it capped a 14-play drive with a 40-yard field goal which extended the lead to 16-3 early in the fourth quarter.

The Aggies forced a fourth straight punt by South Carolina after that and Mond made it 22-3 with a 1-yard TD dive with about 10 minutes left. Richardson set up that score when he scampered 31 yards a play earlier.

South Carolina went for it on fourth-and-8 on its next drive and couldn't convert. Richardson's long touchdown run came two plays later to pad the lead.

Ryan Hilinski threw for 175 yards for South Carolina in a game where the Aggies held the Gamecocks to just 45 yards rushing.

Isaiah Spiller added 129 yards rushing for Texas A&M.

The game was tied early in the second quarter after both teams scored a field goal in the first quarter when Mond found Richardson wide open for a 17-yard touchdown reception to give A&M a 10-3 lead.

Seth Small missed a 42-yard field goal on Texas A&M's next possession, but made one from 30 yards with less than a minute left in the second quarter to leave the Aggies up 13-3 at halftime.

GAME CHANGER

Texas A&M made it 10-3 with 11:35 left in the second quarter on a 17-yard pass from Kellen Mond to Cordarrian Richardson, completing an eight-play, 75-yard drive. The Aggies then scored 17 points in the second quarter on its way to the win over the Gamecocks.

KEY STAT

260 – The Gamecocks had just 260 yards of offense in the game against the Aggies, completing 15 first downs and converting a pair of field goals on Saturday night. Carolina also had the ball for just 18:21.

# SHANE BEAMER



Shane Beamer, considered to be one of the rising stars among coaches in college football, was named the University of South Carolina's 36th head football coach on Dec. 6, 2020.

Beamer, 44, has been an assistant coach at seven Football Bowl Sub-division schools for 21 seasons. During his career, he has coached in 17 bowl games, including a College Football Playoff National Championship Game, has posted 18 non-losing seasons, six of those with double-digit victories and his teams have won 63.0 percent of its games.

Beamer has been a part of building programs throughout his career. He has been a part of three coaching staffs, where the head coach was in his first or second season at the school. He joined Sylvester Croom's staff at Mississippi State in his first season, Kirby Smart's program at Georgia in his first season, and Lincoln Riley's unit at Oklahoma in his second season.

He comes to Carolina from Oklahoma, where he has served as the assistant head coach for offense, coaching tight ends and H-backs, for the last three seasons. In 2020, Oklahoma ranked sixth in the country in scoring (43.0), 11th in total offense (494.7) and 14th in passing offense (315.0). The Sooners led the nation in yards per play (8.0) and ranked third in total offense (537.6) and fourth in passing efficiency rating (187.0) in 2019. Oklahoma led the nation in total offense (570.3), scoring offense (48.4) and yards per play (FBS-record 8.6), and ranked second in passing efficiency rating (194.9) in 2018.

The Charleston, S.C. native, returns to one of his previous coaching stops, having been with the Gamecocks for four seasons (2007-10). In 2007, he served as the outside linebackers coach and co-special teams coordinator. He mentored the cornerbacks in 2008, then coached the Spurs and strong safeties and was both the special teams coordinator and recruiting coordinator in 2009 and 2010 under Steve Spurrier.

In 2009 at South Carolina, Beamer was nominated for the Frank Broyles Award, which goes annually to the nation's top assistant coach. His special teams' units recorded five blocked kicks that season, tying for the SEC lead and tying for the eighth-highest total in the nation. He also helped coach a defensive unit that ranked third in the SEC and 15th in

the country in total defense, and second in the league and eighth in the country in passing defense.

As the Gamecocks' recruiting coordinator, his 2009 class was ranked 12th-best by both Rivals and Scout, and the 2010 and 2011 classes were ranked in the Top 25.

During Beamer's tenure as recruiting coordinator at Carolina, nine of his signees were selected in the NFL draft. Those include first round selection Stephen Gilmore (Buffalo Bills) and second round selections Alshon Jeffery (Chicago Bears) and D.J. Swearinger (Houston Texans).

The Gamecocks all-time winningest quarterback, Connor Shaw, and rushing touchdown leader, Marcus Lattimore, were also in the 2010 class.

Prior to his arrival in Norman, Beamer spent two seasons on the staff at Georgia as tight ends coach and special teams coordinator under Kirby Smart. The Bulldogs posted a 21-7 combined record with Beamer on staff. In 2017, the Bulldogs won the SEC Championship and finished second in the nation, falling in the CFP title game to Alabama in overtime. His special teams ranked eighth nationally in net punting (41.7), and 20th in kickoff returns (23.5) while blocking four kicks.

The son of Hall of Fame coach, Frank Beamer, he worked with his father as the associate head coach and running backs coach at Virginia Tech from 2011-15. In his first year, he coached David Wilson, who broke the Tech single-season rushing record and was named All-American and ACC Player of the Year and went on to become a first-round NFL draft selection by the New York Giants. Shane served as the Hokies' acting head coach in the 2014 Military Bowl win while his father watched from the press box following throat surgery.

Beamer's first full-time coaching position was at Mississippi State, joining the Bulldogs in 2004 as cornerbacks coach and recruiting coordinator. In his first two seasons at State, he guided three defensive backs to SEC All-Freshman Team accolades. He maintained the recruiting coordinator title but made the move to running backs coach in the spring of 2006 where he tutored running back Anthony Dixon to SEC All-Freshman honors.

Beamer spent three seasons (2001-03) as a graduate assistant at Tennessee, helping with the cornerbacks, coaching the placekickers, punters, and long snappers, and assisting in all special teams areas. He also oversaw game opponent scouting while earning a master's degree in sport management in December 2003.

Before joining the staff at Tennessee, he worked one season (2000) as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech, helping with the Yellow Jacket quarterbacks and wide receivers.

A 2000 graduate of Virginia Tech, Beamer was a member of five bowl teams (1995-99 seasons) and three Big East Conference championship squads on the Hokie football team as a long snapper and wide receiver. He was a long snapper on the 1999 Tech team that played for the BCS National Championship.

Beamer and his wife, Emily, are the parents of three children - two daughters, Sutton and Olivia, both born in Columbia, and a son, Hunter, born in Blacksburg, Va.

**COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)** — South Carolina coach turned quarterback Zeb Noland threw for four touchdowns on 13 completions as the Gamecocks beat Eastern Illinois 46-0 on Saturday night.

It was the debut for South Carolina coach Shane Beamer. He promised “Beamer Ball” just like his dad Frank Beamer played at Virginia Tech and his team delivered, holding the Panthers (0-2) to 109 yards and getting its first shutout in 13 years.

The Gamecocks version of Beamer Ball blocked two punts, picked off two passes with one going back for a 61-yard touchdown, ran a successful two-point trick play with the kicking team on the field after their first touchdown, converted all three fourth downs it tried including a fourth-and-goal from the 3, had two sacks and hit hard.

“People talk about Beamer Ball — that’s what it was. You have the ability to score on offense, defense or special teams no matter who is on the field. We want to have that mentality,” Shane Beamer said.

Beamer, 44, brought joy and enthusiasm to a team that had lost six in a row and 11 of its past 14 games — at least for a night and against a Football Championship Subdivision opponent.

Beamer won his opener with an unusual quarterback. Noland came to Columbia this spring to be a graduate assistant after playing seven games for North Dakota State in a season delayed to spring 2021 because of COVID-19.

Chris Katrenick was 13-for-22 for 78 yards and Tyler Hamilton caught five passes for 32 yards for Eastern Illinois.

**GAME CHANGER**

Jaheim Bell caught a 3-yard pass from Zeb Noland with 5:04 left in the first, giving Carolina a 15-0 lead on its way to the shutout of the Panthers. It was Bell’s first career touchdown.

**KEY STAT**

129 – ZaQuandre White led the Gamecocks with 129 yards rushing and a touchdown, including a 63-yard touchdown run with 10:24 left in the game. White also had 39 yards receiving, leading the Gamecocks in that category as well.

**GREENVILLE, N.C. (AP)** — Parker White kicked a 36-yard field goal as time expired as South Carolina rallied from 14 down to beat East Carolina 20-17 on Saturday, earning its first road win under first-year coach Shane Beamer.

Damani Staley had a 63-yard interception return for a touchdown just before halftime to give the Gamecocks a needed spark after trailing 14-0 in a mistake-filled opening half. Former graduate assistant Zeb Noland also had a game-tying touchdown pass to Dakereon Joyner in the back of the end zone late in the third quarter.

In the end, the Gamecocks (2-0) did enough to give themselves a shot, then rode the legs of Juju McDowell - who gained 45 yards on six carries on South Carolina's final 10-play drive - to set up White's winner that had the Gamecocks spilling onto the field from the sideline to celebrate.

South Carolina won despite committing three turnovers in its first five drives, including a goal-line fumble that went through the end zone for a turnover in the first half.

Tyler Snead hit on a 75-yard trick-play touchdown pass to Jsi Hatfield on the game's first offensive snap for the Pirates (0-2), while Holton Ahlers also ran for a short touchdown for the 14-0 lead. But East Carolina struggled to generate consistent offense, with Ahlers completing 11 of 24 passes for just 77 yards and two interceptions.

The Pirates were hosting a Southeastern Conference team for the first time since South Carolina's last visit here in 1997.

**GAME CHANGER**

The Gamecock defense stopped East Carolina on a 3rd-and-5 to force a punt, giving the Gamecocks the ball for its game-winning drive. Jaylan Foster and David Spaulding made the tackle to hold ECU's Tyler Snead to just a one-yard gain.

**ATHENS, GA. (AP)** — JT Daniels returned to the lineup with three touchdown passes, Georgia's fearsome defense nearly made it three-straight games without allowing a TD and the No. 2 Bulldogs romped to a 40-13 victory over South Carolina on Saturday night.

Daniels completed 23-of-31 for 303 yards, including scoring throws of 43 yards to Jermaine Burton, 38 yards to freshman Adonai Mitchell and 4 yards to James Cook.

Georgia (3-0, 1-0 Southeastern Conference) finally gave up a touchdown while on defense when Luke Doty, getting the ball on the Bulldogs' side of the field after a fumble, connected with Josh Vann on a 36-yard touchdown pass with 10:55 remaining.

To that point, the only touchdown against Georgia this season had come on an interception return.

With Doty playing for the first time this season, South Carolina (2-1, 0-1) gave up three sacks and a safety, along with two turnovers that led to Georgia touchdowns.

Daniels sat out a 56-7 victory over UAB with an oblique injury, watching as backup Stetson Bennett tied a school record with five touchdown passes.

Daniels wasted no time re-establishing his hold on the No. 1 spot, completing a 21-yard pass to Brock Bowers on his very first snap and guiding the Bulldogs to the end zone on their first two possessions.

Bennett got a shot the third time the Bulldogs had the ball. He promptly threw an interception that was returned to the Georgia 12, setting up a field goal.

Daniels returned to the game and didn't leave until early in the fourth quarter with the outcome no longer in doubt.

After punting the ball away in the closing seconds of the first half and content to settle for a 21-6 lead, Georgia wound up scoring five more points.

Backed up on their own 1, the Gamecocks explicitly attempted to throw out of the end zone. Doty was sacked by Jordan Davis and Nolan Smith for a safety.

Then, after receiving the free kick, Daniels completed three passes for 39 yards to set up Jack Podlesny's 36-yard field goal as time expired, sending Georgia to the locker room up 26-6.

Georgia put it away in opening minute of the second half, again sparked by a huge defensive play.

Doty's pass was picked off by Derion Kendrick, who returned it to the South Carolina 20. Zamir White ripped off a 15-yard run, then took it in from the 5 to pad the lead to 33-6.

Cook had two touchdowns, also scoring on a 23-yard run.

**GAME CHANGER**

Jaylan Foster picked off a JT Daniels pass at the Georgia 47 and returned it 35 yards to the Bulldog 12. Carolina was not able to punch it in the end zone, as Parker White's 27-yard field goal made it 14-6 Georgia with 1:34 left in the first quarter. The Bulldogs responded with a second quarter touchdown drive, a safety and a field goal as the Gamecocks did not get any closer in their first loss of 2021.

**COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)** — Matt Ruffolo made three field goals to help Kentucky beat South Carolina 16-10 on Saturday night.

Despite its three turnovers, Kentucky (4-0, 2-0 Southeastern Conference) beat South Carolina (2-2, 1-1) for the seventh time in eight years, and set up a collision course toward next week's matchup at home against No. 11 Florida.

"We just have to worry about ourselves. We got to prove to each other and the team that we can go out there and compete with anybody who steps on the field," said Kentucky linebacker DeAndre Square, who led the Wildcats with eight tackles. "It's not about anybody else, it's about us."

Chris Rodriguez Jr. ran for 144 yards on 26 carries for the Wildcats. Will Levis was 15-of-22 passing for 102 yards and threw an interception.

Kavosiey Smoke scored on 15-yard touchdown run on the first series of the game, capping a 12-play, 75-yard drive for Kentucky. Ruffolo's 41-yard field goal to end the second quarter gave the Wildcats a 10-0 lead.

Luke Doty threw a 5-yard touchdown pass to Jalen Brooks early in the third quarter for South Carolina. Ruffolo made field goals from 21 and 27 yards before Parker White's 54-yard field goal capped the scoring with 2:31 remaining.

Doty was 17-of-25 passing for 158 yards. Kevin Harris was held to just 38 yards rushing on 12 carries.

South Carolina recovered fumbles on back-to-back Kentucky possessions but couldn't get any points despite going for it twice on fourth down. Each time, a dropped pass ended the drive.

"If you just look at some things, our turning the ball over, there's no excuse for it. The ball bouncing to the other team sometimes, there's no controlling that," Kentucky coach Bob Stoops said. "When I first got here, we couldn't play a lick of defense, but we led the country in fumbles. With some of those fumbles (this year), we just can't do it."

The Gamecocks' defense has recovered multiple takeaways in every game but the offense hasn't been able to take advantage. After scoring 46 points over hapless Eastern Illinois in its opener, South Carolina has a mere 43 points since.

"I don't know. There's a lot. We ran the ball 26 times for 58 yards. Not good enough," South Carolina coach Shane Beamer said. "Each week's different, and right now, it ain't good enough."

### GAME CHANGER

Kentucky had three field goals on the night, the final one with 4:26 left in the game that gave the Wildcats a 16-7 lead. Carolina answered with a field goal of its own, a career-high 54-yard field goal from Parker White, but the Wildcats were able to salt the clock and earn the six-point win.

### KEY STAT

144 – Kentucky's Chris Rodriguez had 26 carries for 144 yards on the night as the Wildcat offense accounted for 230 rushing yards in the win. Rodriguez averaged 5.5 yards per carry.

**COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)** — South Carolina's offensive consternation still isn't cured. The Gamecocks have scored one rushing touchdown in five games.

But as long as the Gamecocks' defense can pick up the slack, as they did with their third touchdown of the year against Troy, they can continue to work on it without feeling too bad.

David Spaulding returned an interception 74 yards for a touchdown, Parker White kicked three field goals and South Carolina overcame several mistakes in the second half to hold off the Trojans 23-14 on Saturday.

White booted a 37-yard field goal in the fourth quarter with just over two minutes left to make it a two-possession lead and Damani Staley intercepted Taylor Powell with less than 30 seconds to play.

"I don't know about you guys, I feel like I aged about 40 years during that game," said South Carolina coach Shane Beamer, who saw his Gamecocks score one defensive TD and should have scored another. "We talk about playing smart football. We didn't do a great job of that today."

The Gamecocks (3-2) led 17-7 at halftime after Spaulding's return. Yet the Trojans (2-3) wouldn't go away and South Carolina's inability to take advantage of its numerous chances to score helped Troy stay in it.

"The key to the game, obviously, the turnovers. Seemed to be the difference," Troy coach Chip Lindsey said. "We matched their intensity, we matched their physicality, I thought. At the end of the day, we can't put the ball on the ground."

The Gamecocks still haven't found a solution for their sputtering running game, but quarterback Luke Doty completed 20 of 34 passes for 255 yards and a touchdown with no interceptions and one fumble.

The Gamecocks blocked a Troy punt in the third quarter but only got a field goal out of a possession starting at the Trojans' 23-yard line. Then after an interception by South Carolina's Jahmar Brown was wiped by a booth review, the nuttiness began.

The Gamecocks forced a punt but Ahmearan Brown muffed the catch. Troy set up for a third-and-9 on the next possession. The Gamecocks' Jaylan Foster sacked Powell on a safety blitz and the ball squirted loose. Staley retrieved it and tried to run, but was tripped.

The ball again tumbled to the turf and Brown picked it up and began running. He easily out-paced the rest of the field for a touchdown, except Brown flipped the ball to the referee a split-second before he crossed the goal line and it rolled out of bounds.

Touchback. Not touchdown.

South Carolina held again, forced a punt, and again tried to drive for the game-clinching score. Doty had the ball knocked out of his hand and the Trojans recovered.

The Gamecocks got it right back after Foster forced a fumble and Zacch Pickens recovered.

**KNOXVILLE, TENN. (AP)** — Hendon Hooker threw for 225 yards and three touchdowns to lead Tennessee to a 45-20 Southeastern Conference victory over South Carolina Saturday.

The Volunteers (4-2, 2-1) led 35-0 in the second quarter before the Gamecocks (3-3, 0-3) staged a recovery

Vols' running back Tiyon Evans rushed for 119 yards and a touchdown before leaving midway through the third quarter with an injury.

South Carolina's Kevin Harris scored from a yard out to start the fourth quarter. A missed two-point conversion made the score 38-20. Tennessee's offense generated just 25 offensive yards in the third quarter. Len'Neth Whitehead, replacing the injured Evans at running back, scored Tennessee's last TD from two yards.

Trailing by 31 midway through the third quarter, South Carolina had fourth-and-9 on the Tennessee 44. Punter Kai Kroeger hit wide-open Payton Mangrum with what turned out to be a scoring pass and a 38-14 difference.

A 28-0 first-quarter lead blossomed to 38-7 by halftime. Hooker completed 15 of 20 passes for 217 yards and three scores in the first 30 minutes.

As the Vols were leading 28-0 with just under six minutes left in the first half, Evans found a seam up the middle and won the race to the end zone for a 45-yard TD and 35-0 Tennessee lead. With just over 2 minutes left in the half, South Carolina finally got on the board. Luke Doty's 24-yard pass to Dakereon Joyner was the key play in a 75-yard drive that was culminated by a 6-yard run by Harris.

Tennessee's Jalin Hyatt scored the game's first touchdown when he caught a slant from Hooker from three yards to cap a 66-yard drive. Less than three minutes later, Hooker connected with JaVonta Payton from 39 yards for a 14-0 advantage.

Before the first quarter ran out, Tennessee upped the score to 21-0. South Carolina had the ball inside the Vols' 5-yard line when receiver Jalen Brooks threw a pass that was intercepted in the end zone by Jaylen McCollough. Five plays later Hooker scored on an 11-yard run. With 12 seconds left in the first quarter, the Vols made it 28-0. Four plays after a Gamecocks fumble, Hooker hit Velus Jones for a 21-yard score.

**GAME CHANGER**

With Tennessee leading 14-0, Carolina drove down to the Volunteer one-yard line but a halfback pass from Jordan Burch was intercepted by Jaylen McCollough in the end zone. Tennessee then went 80 yards in five plays to go up 21-0.

**COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)** — Zeb Noland's played more than enough football to be ready when called on and cherish the moments of success. The former graduate assistant did both to rally South Carolina to its first Southeastern Conference win in more than year.

Noland entered on the Gamecocks' final drive and led a 75-yard touchdown drive, connecting with Xavier Legette on a 9-yard scoring pass with 37 seconds left for a 21-20 win over Vanderbilt on Saturday night.

But there was Noland, calm and confident, leading South Carolina (4-3, 1-3 SEC) to snap its nine-game losing streak against conference opponents.

Gamecocks coach Shane Beamer said Noland came in when Luke Doty was feeling some soreness in a foot injury he sustained this summer at practice. Noland started the first three games before Doty took over in the middle of a 40-13 loss to Georgia last month. Noland hadn't played since then.

Noland's message in the huddle was simple: "Keep me clean. I got you. That's what I said, and let's roll."

Noland got the Gamecocks rolling with a 29-yard pass to tight end Nick Muse to get into Vanderbilt territory.

He had completions of 15 yards to Josh Vann and 21 yards to Dakereon Joyner to the Commodores' 9. On Noland's winning throw, Legette ran to the back of the end zone and got open for the winning score.

Parker White made the extra point to send Vanderbilt, which held a 20-14 lead with less than two minutes left, to its 16th straight loss against SEC opponents.

Noland is not worried about when he'll play again, just about making sure he does what he can to be a good team and prepare Doty or anyone in the quarterback room for the next game.

Noland began his college career at Iowa State, moving on to North Dakota State where he was a teammate of San Francisco 49ers passer Trey Lance before accepting Beamer's offer to join the staff here.

Noland was convinced to put the pads back on when Doty hurt his foot this past August.

It looked like the Commodores would be the ones celebrating after Joseph Bulovas hit a 28-yard field goal with 1:36 to go for a 20-14 lead. Vanderbilt's defense had held South Carolina scoreless for nearly 49 minutes.

But Noland gave South Carolina the winning spark and Beamer his first SEC victory since taking over the program last December.

Vanderbilt quarterback Mike Wright threw for 206 yards including a 52-yard touchdown pass to Will Sheppard for a 17-14 lead in the third quarter that held up until the final seconds.

Vanderbilt broke its season-long scoring drought against the SEC with Bulovas' 42-yard field goal in the opening quarter. The Commodores added their first TD in league play when Rocko Griffin Jr. ran in from a yard out to take advantage of a South Carolina fumble and cut the lead to 14-10.

**GAME CHANGER**

Carolina's defense forced Vanderbilt into two turnovers and just 312 yards of total offense in the game. The Gamecocks capped off the game with a sack fumble from Kingsley Enagbare and a recovery from Jabari Ellis at the Vanderbilt 4-yard line.

**KEY STAT**
