**CAROLINA VS. TROY:** This is the fourth meeting between the Gamecocks and Trojans in a series that dates back to 2004. Carolina leads the all-time series 3-0, with all three games being contested in Columbia. The teams met in 2004, 2005 and 2010, with Carolina winning by scores of 17-7, 45-20 and 69-24, respectively.

**THE LAST TIME THEY MET:** Marcus Lattimore had three touchdowns and 102 yards rushing by half-time to lead the 17th-ranked Gamecocks to a 69-24 victory over Troy on Nov. 20, 2010, its biggest point total under Steve Spurrier and the most it has scored in 15 years. Lattimore and the Gamecocks ended any doubts early as he scored on runs of 17-, eight- and five-yards for a 21-0 lead less than seven minutes into the contest. Troy had five turnovers, all which led to touchdowns. **Stephen Garcia** threw two touchdowns and ran for a third. The defense chipped in with safety **D.J. Swearingner** and defensive end **Chaz Sutton** both returning interceptions for touchdowns.

**POINTS GALORE:** The scoreboard operator was busy when the Gamecocks and Trojans met on Nov. 20, 2010. The 69 points scored by Carolina ranks as the seventh-highest mark in school history, while the 93 combined points is tied for the fourth-highest scoring game in Gamecock history.

**FUN IN THE SUN BELT:** The Gamecocks own a 16-2 all-time record against teams that currently comprise the Sun Belt Conference, with all 18 contests held in Columbia. The Gamecocks are 8-2 against Appalachian State (most recently 2019), 3-0 vs. Troy (2004, '05, '10), 2-0 against Coastal Carolina (2013, '18) and Louisiana-Lafayette (2003, '07), and 1-0 vs. South Alabama (2014). The Gamecocks are currently scheduled to host Sun Belt foes Georgia State in the 2022 season-opener and Appalachian State in 2027, and will travel to Boone to face the Mountaineers in 2025.

**NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS:** The Gamecocks are 34-11 in their last 45 non-conference games, with six of the 11 losses coming against Clemson. Carolina is 2-0 in non-conference action so far in 2021 with wins over both Eastern Illinois (46-0) and East Carolina (20-17). Their final non-conference game of the regular season is set for Nov. 27 when they host the Clemson Tigers.

**THE POWER OF FIVE:** Since the turn of the century, the Gamecocks have a 48-4 mark against teams not currently in a Power-5 conference. The only four losses in that stretch came to UConn in the 2010 Papajohns.com Bowl, to The Citadel in 2015, to South Florida in the 2016 Birmingham Bowl and to Appalachian State in 2019. It should be noted that UConn was in the Big East, which was a BCS automatic qualifier during the 2009 season.

**SWEET HOME ALABAMA:** The Gamecock roster features four players who hail from the state of Alabama. Those who list the Yellowhammer State as home include **Sam Reynolds** (Alabaster), **Jon-Darius Morgan** (Birmingham), **La'Dareyen Craig** (Mobile) and **Eric Shaw** (Reeltown).

## A South Carolina win over Troy would...

- ◆ Keep the Gamecocks undefeated in four tries all-time against the Trojans.
- ◆ Give the Gamecocks their third win of the season, one more than their win total from 2020.
- ◆ Improve the Gamecocks to 49-4 against teams not currently in a Power-5 conference since the turn of the century.
- ◆ Be the Gamecocks' 17 win in 19 contests against teams that currently make up the Sun Belt.

**QUICKLY:** First-year head coach Shane Beamer and the South Carolina Gamecocks (2-2, 0-2 SEC) step away from SEC action this week to host the Troy Trojans (2-2, 0-1 Sun Belt) out of the Sun Belt Conference in a 3:30 pm ET contest on Saturday, Oct. 2, at Williams-Brice Stadium (77,559) in Columbia. The non-conference tilt will be televised on SEC Network.

**OVER THE AIRWAVES:** Taylor Zazour will call the action for SEC Network. He will be joined in the booth by Matt Stinchcomb. Carolina grad Alyssa Lang will patrol the sidelines. The familiar voices of Carolina Hall of Famers Todd Ellis and Tommy Suggs handle the call for the Gamecock Radio Network with Jamar Nesbit on the sidelines.

**A LITTLE HISTORY:** 2021 marks the 128th season of intercollegiate football at the University of South Carolina dating back to 1892. It is the 115th consecutive year in which South Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina owns an all-time record of 616-597-44, a .508 winning pct.

**IT JUST MEANS MORE:** The 2021 season marks South Carolina's 30th year in the Southeastern Conference. South Carolina and Arkansas joined the league prior to the 1992 campaign. The Gamecocks earned the SEC Eastern Division title in the 2010 season. The Gamecocks are 99-136-1 (.422) all-time in SEC regular-season play.

**ABOUT LAST WEEK:** South Carolina won the turnover battle 3-0, but were held to just 12 first downs and 216 yards of offense, as the Kentucky Wildcats (4-0, 2-0 SEC) remained undefeated with a 16-10 win over the Gamecocks at a sold-out Williams-Brice Stadium last Saturday night. The game turned into a defensive slugfest, but Kentucky, behind the 26-carry, 144-yard rushing performance from Chris Rodriguez Jr., was able to do just enough to escape with the win. **Luke Doty**, making his first start of the season, completed 17-of-25 passes for 158 yards and a touchdown for the Gamecocks, who were held to just 58 yards rushing.

**FROM WAY DOWNTOWN, BANG:** **Parker White** drilled a 54-yard field late in the game against Kentucky. It was the longest of White's career, surpassing his previous long of 50 yards, set against Appalachian State in 2019. The 54-yard field goal matched the fourth-longest in school history.

**FOSTER JUBILEE:** Sixth-year senior safety **Jaylan Foster** intercepted a pass against Kentucky for his fourth interception of the season and third in the last two games. Foster is tied with Oregon's Verone McKinley III for the NCAA lead with four interceptions. The Gamecocks have not had an individual intercept more than four passes in a season since Ko Simpson logged six picks in 2004.

**FORCING TURNOVERS:** The Gamecock defense has been opportunistic in forcing turnovers. They won the turnover battle 3-0 against Kentucky, collecting a pair of fumbles along with an interception. For the season, South Carolina has forced 10 turnovers - seven interceptions and three fumbles, an average of 2.5 turnovers per game. Here are the NCAA leaders in turnovers forced:

**PICK PARTY:** The Gamecocks intercepted two passes in each of the first three games, including a pair of pick-sixes by **Jordan Burch** and **Damani Staley**, and got a seventh interception, the fourth of the season, by **Jaylan Foster** against Kentucky. The Gamecocks rank in a tie for fifth in the nation in pass interceptions. The seven interceptions through four games is the team's most since they had eight in the first four games of the 2000 campaign. South Carolina recorded eight INTs in 10 games last year. **STRONG CASE FOR THE DEFENSE:** The Carolina defense under new defensive coordinator **Clayton White** has been a right spot so far in 2021. The Gamecocks have surrendered 17 or fewer points in three of their four games, including a shutout of Eastern Illinois in the season opener. Overall, the Gamecocks rank 34th in the nation, allowing 18.2 points per game in 2021. Last season, South Carolina gave up an average of 36.0 points per game and held just two of their 10 opponents to 17 points or less. They ranked 105th in the country in scoring defense a year ago when they had three starters (**Jaycee Horn**, **Ernest Jones** and **Israel Mukuamu**) who are now playing in the NFL.

## Offense

**SATT ATTACK:** The Gamecock offense is under the direction of **Marcus Satterfield**. Satterfield most recently was part of Matt Rhule's staff with the Carolina Panthers. He and Coach Beamer first knew each other as graduate assistants at Tennessee.

**DOTY IS QB1:** Sophomore **Luke Doty** came out of the spring as the projected starter at quarterback and did nothing to change that early in fall camp. However, he suffered a mid-foot sprain in his left foot on August 13 and was sidelined for the first two games. He made his 2021 debut at Georgia in relief of an injured Zeb Noland and went the distance in his first start the following week against Kentucky. For the season, he is 30-for-51 (58.8 pct.) for 311 yards with two touchdowns and one interception.

**LUKE, I AM YOUR STARTER:** **Luke Doty** has made three career starts - the final two games of the 2020 season vs. Georgia and at Kentucky as a true freshman, along with last week's game against Kentucky. He is 0-3 as a starter, completing 46-of-72 passes (63.9 pct.) for 433 yards with three touchdowns and two interceptions. He has thrown a touchdown pass in each of his three starts.

**STORY WORTHY OF THE BIG SCREEN:** In what could be taken straight from a Hollywood script, **Zeb Noland** transitioned from graduate assistant to active player during preseason camp following a foot injury to Luke Doty, and started each of the first three games, winning two. Noland, who began his career at Iowa State, then transferred to North Dakota State where he played behind his best friend, Trey Lance, joined the Carolina staff as a G.A. in late May with one year of eligibility left. When Doty was injured, the wheels were put into motion to get Noland back on the field for one final season. His first practice came on Aug. 17, one day after his 24th birthday.

**IN A PREVIOUS LIFE:** **Zeb Noland** began his career at Iowa State. In two seasons in Ames (2017-18), he completed 106-of-176 passes (60.2 pct.) for 1,255 yards with six touchdowns and two picks in nine contests. His best performance came against Oklahoma on Sept. 15, 2018, when he completed 25-of-36 passes for 360 yards with two touchdowns. He played in seven games in the spring of 2021 for the North Dakota State Bison, completing 51-of-100 passes for 721 yards with five touchdowns and six interceptions.

**COLONEL ZEBULIAH:** **Zeb Noland** is 2-1 as the Gamecock starting quarterback. He became the first signal-caller to post victories in each of his first two starts since Jake Bentley in 2016. He is 27-for-47 (57.4 pct.) for 406 yards with five touchdowns and one interception in a Gamecock uniform. He threw four touchdown passes in his Gamecock debut against Eastern Illinois, the most for a Carolina QB since Bentley threw for five TDs at Clemson in 2018. He completed a 61-yard pass to Josh Vann on the first offensive series at Georgia, but cut his finger when had his hand stepped on early in the contest and was unable to continue.

**WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?:** **Jason Brown**, a transfer from FCS-level St. Francis (Pa.), joined the squad in the spring to compete in the quarterback

room. He played in 18 games, making a dozen starts for the Red Flash, completing 253-of-411 passes (61.6 pct.) for 3,124 yards with 28 touchdowns and just six interceptions. He was QB2 in the season opener and saw second-half action, completing 4-of-5 passes for 45 yards. He also got in one snap, throwing an incomplete pass, at Georgia.

**BACKFIELD IN MOTION:** New running backs coach **Montario Hardesty** inherited a talented room that includes **Kevin Harris**, **MarShawn Lloyd**, **Juju McDowell** and **ZaQuandre White**, four viable options to carry the pigskin. All have had their opportunities this season, with the carries ranging from a team-high 34 for Harris to 22 for White who, despite the fewest carries of the four, leads the team with 167 rushing yards.

**HARRIS HAS MADE HISTORY:** Junior **Kevin Harris** burst onto the scene a year ago, rushing for 1,138 yards in just 10 games, earning first-team All-SEC accolades while leading the conference in rushing. He entered the season as the school's career leader in rushing average per carry at 6.4 for those backs with at least 1,000 career rushing yards. Harris was slowed in fall camp after having a minor procedure on his back over the summer and was not dressed for the opener due to illness. He has started the last two games and leads the team with 34 carries for 85 yards. He is tied for 10th on the school's all-time list with 19 rushing touchdowns. He ranks 29th in school history with 1,402 career rushing yards. Alex Hawkins is 28th with 1,490.

**JUJU ON THAT BEAT:** One of the favorites among his teammates and quickly becoming a fan favorite is freshman running back **Juju McDowell**. McDowell brings a different dimension to the attack with his quickness and toughness despite his small stature. He had his best game at East Carolina when he rushed for a game-high 71 yards on 11 carries, including 46 yards on seven totes in the deciding fourth quarter. He also logged a 63-yard kickoff return, setting up the game-tying score. That kick return was the longest for a Gamecock since Deebo Samuel raced 90 yards to paydirt on the opening kick against Ole Miss in 2018. For the season, he has rushed 28 times for 126 yards and has a pair of kickoff returns for 82 yards.

**THAT WILL DO 'ER, LLOYD:** Gamecock fans waited patiently for the debut of **MarShawn Lloyd**, who suffered a knee injury on the second day of fall camp in 2020. Lloyd was a highly-regarded talent when he joined the squad. He responded with a team-high 14 carries for 55 yards in his debut against Eastern Illinois. He has 27 carries for 98 yards this season.

**WHITE DOES NOT MEAN INVISIBLE:** **ZaQuandre White** was not talked about by the media over the summer as they focused on the "Thunder and Lightning" of Kevin Harris and MarShawn Lloyd. But White has done nothing but impress the new coaches since they've come aboard with his enthusiasm and competitive nature. A running back who started his career at Florida State, White carried just 16 times a year ago for 59 yards, but leads the team through four games with 167 rushing yards on 22 carries, an average of 7.6 yards per carry. He has scored the team's lone rushing TD.

**MORE ON QUAN:** **ZaQuandre White** started the first two games in 2021. In the season opener

against Eastern Illinois, he turned in the best game of his career, rushing 12 times for a career-high 128 yards, including a 63-yard touchdown burst up the middle early in the fourth quarter. He was also the team's top receiver with four catches for 39 yards, accounting for 167 all-purpose yards.

**OPENING DAY BESTS:** Here are the top opening day rushing performances in Carolina history:

**THE LEADER OF THE PACK:** Senior **Josh Vann** has become the go-to receiver under new wide receivers coach Justin Stepp, coming out from the shadows of **Deebo Samuel, Bryan Edwards** and **Shi Smith**. Through four games, Vann leads the team with 13 receptions for a team-high 297 receiving yards, an average of 22.8-yards per catch, including a pair of scores. He has 60 career receptions, which also leads the team.

**REMEMBERING DEEBO:** With back-to-back games of 127 receiving yards at East Carolina and 128 at Georgia, **Josh Vann** became the first Gamecock to record consecutive 100-yard receiving games since **Deebo Samuel** went for 112 vs Chattanooga and 210 at Clemson at the end of the 2018 regular season.

**VANN IS THE MAN:** **Josh Vann** ranks seventh in the SEC in receiving yards per game at 74.2. His 22.8-yards per reception is easily the best among the top-10 players ranked in receiving yards per game. No one else is over the 20.0-yard mark.

**BROOKS IS NOT DONE:** **Jalen Brooks** is in his second year at Carolina. His journey started at Wingate, then he spent a semester at Tarleton State before joining the Gamecocks. He did not gain NCAA eligibility until the fifth game of the 2020 season and ended that season with 11 receptions. A deep play threat, Brooks showed his ability with a highlight-reel one-handed catch at Georgia. He has set career-highs in receiving yards in each of the last two games, going for 54 yards on three receptions at Georgia before logging 63 yards on four catches against Kentucky. For the season, he has eight receptions for 135 yards, 16.9-yards per catch.

**DK IS BETTER THAN OK:** Junior **Dakereon Joyner**, who began his Gamecock career at quarterback, continues to make strides at wide receiver. He was the co-Offensive Player of the Spring and can make plays with the ball in his hand. The Gamecocks He caught five passes in the win at East Carolina, including a touchdown grab on a 13-yard reception that tied the game late in the third quarter. He is second on the squad with 10 receptions overall.

**GO DEEP YOUNG MAN:** Georgia Tech transfer **Ahmarean Brown** brings the ability to stretch the field. In two seasons in the ACC, Brown averaged 18.1 yards per catch with eight touchdowns. He tied Calvin Johnson's mark for most receiving TDs by a freshman at Tech with seven in 2019. He has three receptions this season for 21 yards.

**THE PIZZA MAN DELIVERS:** **Trey Adkins**, who was delivering pizzas to help pay for his tuition as a walk-on wide receiver, was placed on scholarship for the 2021 season in June. Adkins, who was sidelined with a knee sprain for much of fall camp, caught a 19-yard pass in the season opener. He has caught six career passes for 97 yards, a 16.2-yard average.

**AN ORTRE SIGHTING:** **OrTre Smith** is back and could be a "wild card" in the receiving corps. He caught 30 passes as a freshman in 2017, but has just 12 catches since, as injuries have taken a toll. He caught a 15-yarder in the season opening win over Eastern Illinois.

**NICK'S MUSINGS:** "Super Senior" **Nick Muse** is back for another campaign. A preseason All-SEC tight end candidate who began his career at Wil-

liam & Mary, Muse caught 30 passes a season ago, most among the returning players. His best performance came in the Georgia game last year when he caught eight passes for 131 yards. He caught a touchdown and added the two-point conversion in the season-opening win over Eastern Illinois. For the season he has six catches for 51 yards, including a season-high 25-yard reception against Kentucky.

**IT TOLLS FOR THEE:** Regarded as a "Swiss Army Knife," sophomore **Jaheim Bell** could lineup just about anywhere on offense. Listed as a tight end, Bell showed he could also run the ball effectively in the spring game. He caught a touchdown pass in the opener against Eastern Illinois and also had a 65-yard TD run called back. He caught a 48-yard pass in the win at East Carolina. For the season he has four receptions for 61 yards and two rushes for 16 yards.

**EXPERIENCED O-LINE:** New offensive line coach **Greg Adkins** has experience to work with, as eight of his linemen have made starts for the Gamecocks. The probable starting five of LT **Jakai Moore** (10 starts), LG **Jaylen Nichols** (8), OC **Eric Douglas** (15), RT **Jovaughn Gwyn** (25) and RT **Dylan Wonnum** (28) have combined for 86 starts. **Jazton Turnetine** (5 starts), **Hank Manos** (2) and **Vershon Lee** (1) have also earned a starting assignment. Only nine schools have more offensive linemen who had started games entering the 2021 season than the Gamecocks' eight. Gwyn and Wonnum have both received some preseason All-SEC recognition.

## Defense

**4-2-5 IS RIGHT WITH WHITE:** New defensive coordinator **Clayton White** brought a 4-2-5 scheme to Columbia. A three-time nominee for the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach, White most recently served as the defensive coordinator at Western Kentucky. He has the Gamecocks ranked sixth in the nation in turnovers gained, 18th in pass defense, 24th in pass efficiency defense, 29th in total defense and 34th in scoring defense. Three of the four opponents have been held to 17 points or less, including an opening game shutout of Eastern Illinois.

**FORCING THE FUMBLE:** The Gamecocks forced four fumbles against Kentucky, including two by **Carlins Platel**, and recovered two. It was the most fumbles Carolina has caused in a game since forcing four against Akron on Dec. 1, 2018.

**PICK-SIX DEJA VU:** The Gamecock defense scored on a pick-six in each of the first two games. In the opener against Eastern Illinois, it was defensive end **Jordan Burch** who picked off a pass and rumbled 61 yards to payday. That was Carolina's first pick-six since Israel Mukuamu went 53 yards for a score at Georgia in 2019 and the first for a Gamecock defensive lineman since Devin Taylor raced 48 yards at Arkansas in 2011. Linebacker **Damani Staley** got the Gamecocks on the scoreboard with just a minute left in the first half on a 63-yard interception return against East Carolina. The Gamecocks are tied for fourth in the country with two defensive touchdowns. Iowa, Ohio State and Wyoming lead the nation with three. The two interception returns for touchdowns is the most for Carolina in a season since 2017.



**JUST THE SACKS, MA'AM:** South Carolina has recorded eight sacks this season, including a season-high five against East Carolina. That was the most sacks in a game for the Gamecocks since they notched five against Akron on Dec. 1, 2018.

**GETTING IN THE SACK:** The Gamecocks have an aggressive defense that is able to cause havoc in the backfield. EDGE rusher **Kingsley Enagbare** is a returning All-SEC selection, and the Gamecocks added the nation's sack leader from a season ago in **Jordan Strachan**. Enagbare led the Gamecocks with 6.0 sacks, ranking second in the SEC with 0.75 sacks per game a year ago. Strachan had a Georgia State school record 10.5 sacks, tying for first in the FBS.

**THREE IN DOUBLE FIGURES:** The Gamecocks have three players who have recorded double-digits in career sacks with **Kingsley Enagbare** (13.5), **Jordan Strachan** (11.5) and **Aaron Sterling** (11.0) all in double figures. South Carolina and Colorado were the only two FBS schools that came into the season boasting three players with 10-or-more career sacks.

**MEET YOU AT THE QB:** The Gamecocks have eight sacks this season, notching two in the season opener against Eastern Illinois, then recording five at East Carolina and one at Georgia. **Kingsley Enagbare** (2.5) and **Brad Johnson** (2.0) lead the way. Here are the career sack numbers:

**LONG LIVE THE KING:** Senior EDGE **Kingsley (JJ) Enagbare** gained most of the off-season attention, and rightly so. A 2020 first-team All-SEC selection, Enagbare has not rested on his laurels, but was named the 2021 Rex Enright Defensive Player of the Spring for Carolina Football. With 20.0 career tackles for loss including 13.0 sacks, he is just two sacks shy of moving into a five-way tie for ninth on the school's all-time career sacks list. Enagbare has put himself in position to possibly become the third Gamecock defensive player in as many years to be an NFL first-round draft pick, following in the shoes of Javon Kinlaw (49ers) and Jaycee Horn (Panthers).

**WHY JJ?:** **Kingsley Enagbare** was tagged with the nickname "JJ" as a youngster in deference to the children's television series Jay Jay the Jet Plane.

**BRAD IS A BAD MAN:** Fifth-year senior linebacker **Brad Johnson** is off to a big start this season. He had a nice performance in the opener against EIU, collecting a pair of tackles for loss including a sack. He followed that up with a game-high nine tackles at East Carolina, including his second sack of the season. He had a career-high 11 stops against Kentucky and recovered a fumble. He is second on the squad with 24 tackles and leads the team with 3.5 tackles for loss.

**GONE GREENE:** Fifth-year senior **Sherrod Greene**, the Gamecocks' top linebacker, suffered a serious lower leg injury on the second play from scrimmage in the loss at Georgia and will be out for an extended period of time after undergoing surgery. It's the second-straight year that the season ended very early on for Greene, as he suffered a fracture in his hip in the 2020 season opener against Tennessee and missed the remainder of the season.

**STALEY STEPS UP:** With the loss of Sherrod Greene, **Damani Staley** has stepped up. The Super Senior, who is the son of former Gamecock and NFL running back Duce Staley, is tied for second on the team with 24 tackles, including a career-high nine stops against Kentucky.

**REVAMPED SECONDARY:** The defensive secondary took the biggest hit in the offseason, as Jaycee Horn and Israel Mukuamu both gave up their eligibility to turn pro while Jammie Robinson, John Dixon and Shilo Sanders all elected to transfer. The Carolina coaches hit the transfer portal hard and brought in several players who could contribute immediately, including **B.J. Gibson** (Navy) **Carlins Platel** (Assumption), **Tyrese Ross** (Washington State), and **David Spaulding** (Georgia Southern). Platel, Ross and Spaulding are all listed on the two-deep and see regular playing time.

**TOP COVER CORNER:** **Cam Smith** is considered the Gamecocks' top cover corner. Despite missing much of camp with an injury, Smith has acquitted himself nicely in the first four games, collecting 13 tackles and a team-leading four pass breakups.

**FOSTER HAS BEEN BANANAS:** "Super Senior" **Jaylan Foster** is off to an outstanding campaign. The former walk-on who began his career at Gardner-Webb, leads the team with 28 tackles from his safety position, including a career-high 12 stops against Kentucky, and is tied for the NCAA lead with four interceptions. He is ranked 11th in the SEC with 7.0 tackles per game.

**PICK THIS:** The Gamecocks have intercepted two passes in each of the first three games, including a pair of pick-sixes by **Jordan Burch** and **Damani Staley**, and have seven on the season, led by **Jaylan Foster's** four. Here are the career numbers:

## Special Teams

**BEAMER BALL 2.0:** "Beamer Ball" is alive and well in Columbia, as the Gamecocks blocked not one but two Eastern Illinois punts in the season opener, both credited to **Debo Williams**, who was making his collegiate debut and was named the SEC Co-Freshman of the Week for his efforts. Williams, a 6-1, 235-pounder from Smyrna, Del., became the first SEC player to record two blocked punts in a game since Florida's Chris Rainey accomplished the feat in 2010. The Gamecocks had not blocked a punt since the 2014 season. With two blocked punts, the Gamecocks are tied for fourth in the NCAA lead in that category.

**WHITE ON THE MONEY:** **Parker White** is the first four-year returning starter in school history. He took advantage of the NCAA ruling to allow him to return for a sixth year and fifth season. White is on a quest to become the school's all-time leading scorer. With 315 points, he needs 45 more to surpass Elliott Fry's school record of 359 points scored. He has converted 40-of-45 (88.9 pct.) field goal attempts from inside 40 yards and owns a career long of 54 yards. He is tied for third among active kickers with 62 career field goals. White owns six fourth-quarter or overtime game-winning field goals in his career, providing the deciding points in wins over Louisiana Tech (2017), Tennessee (2017), Missouri (2018), Tennessee (2018), Georgia (2019) and East Carolina (2021).

**PARKER'S BEEN PERFECT:** **Parker White** has been perfect so far this season, connecting on all six field goal attempts and all seven of his extra point attempts. He is the Gamecocks' leading scorer with 25 points. His career-long 54-yard field goal versus Kentucky ties for the sixth-longest in the country this season and tied for the fourth-longest in school history. It was his second career field goal of 50-plus yards.

**HIGH PRAISE:** Parker White was recognized as the SEC Co-Special Teams Player of the Week following his performance at East Carolina. He connected on a 39-yard game-tying field goal with 6:46 remaining in the contest, then converted a 36-yard field goal as time expired to lift the Gamecocks to the win. Carolina had trailed the entire game until White's game-winner. It marked the second time that White has been recognized by the SEC. He was also named the Co-SEC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance in the 2018 win over Missouri when he hit on all three of his field goal attempts on a soggy field, including a 33-yard game-winner with two second remaining.

**KROEGER KICKS IT:** Sophomore Kai Kroeger handles the punting chores. The second-year punter was named to the SEC Coaches' all-Freshman

team in 2020. So far this season, Kroeger has punted 20 times for a 41.7-yard average with a long of 56 yards against Kentucky. He's had five punts of 50-plus yards with six inside the 20 and just one touchback. He was named to the "Ray's 8" list by the Ray Guy Award for his efforts against the Wildcats when he placed four of five punts inside the 20. Kroeger also handles the holder duties on placements with short snapper **Matthew Bailey** and placekicker **Parker White**. He is considered one of the top holders in the country.

**GIVE SOME RESPECT TO JETER:** Mitch Jeter handles the kickoffs for the Gamecocks. He has boomed 11 of his 16 kicks for touchbacks.

**BIG RETURNS:** The Gamecocks got a big 63-yard kickoff return from **Juju McDowell** to set up the game-tying field goal midway through the fourth quarter in the win at East Carolina. The return was the longest for a Gamecock since Deebo Samuel raced 90 yards to paydirt on the opening kick against Ole Miss in 2018. The Gamecocks rank 30th in the country in kickoff return average at 24.2 yards per return after ranking 73rd a year ago with a 19.7-yard average.

**Miscellaneous**

**RING THE BELL:** Shane Beamer got off to a 2-0 start as the South Carolina head coach. He became the first coach to win his first two games since Richard Bell got off to a 2-0 start in 1982. The last head coach to win his first three games at South Carolina was Billy Laval in 1928.

**BIG SCORE:** The Gamecocks lit up the scoreboard for 46 points against the outmanned EIU Panthers in the season opener. It was the most points scored by Carolina since they tallied 72 in a 72-10 rout of Charleston Southern on Sept. 7, 2019.

**PITCHING A SHUTOUT:** The Gamecocks recorded their first shutout in the opener against EIU since August 28, 2008, a 34-0 win over NC State. The Gamecocks were one of five FBS teams to pitch a shutout in its opener, joining Boston College, NC State, UAB and Virginia.

**BEST MARKS SINCE:** The 109 yards of offense allowed in the opener against Eastern Illinois was the best since holding Kentucky to 96 in 2011. The 31 yards rushing was the low mark since UCF ran for just 26 in 2015. The 78 yards passing was the lowest since Vanderbilt had just 76 in 2019.

**NEVER SAY NEVER:** The Gamecocks overcame a 14-0 deficit to defeat East Carolina, 20-17. The 14-point deficit was the largest that resulted in victory for the Gamecocks since they trailed Michigan by 16 points, 19-3, in the third quarter of the 2018 Outback Bowl before storming back for a 26-19 win.

**FINISH STRONG:** The Gamecocks have been very good in the fourth quarter of their games this season. Carolina has outscored its opponents by a 30-6 margin in the final period through three contests. The Gamecocks have been outscored by a combined score of 67-59 over the first three quarters of their games so far in 2021.

**YOUR MONEY'S NO GOOD HERE:** Head coach Shane Beamer placed both linebacker **Darryle Ware** and deep snapper **Matthew Bailey** on scholarship on Sept 21 and 22, respectively. Bailey became the first recipient of the scholarship named in memory of Jake Panus.

**SUPER SENIORS:** The Gamecocks list eight players whose eligibility would have expired had not the NCAA allowed the 2020 season to be a "free" year. Those "super" seniors are LB **Spencer Eason-Riddle**, DT **Jabari Ellis**, DB **Jaylan Foster**, TE **Nick Muse**, QB **Zeb Noland**, LB **Damani Staley**, EDGE **Aaron Sterling** and PK **Parker White**.

**UTILIZING THE PORTAL:** The Gamecocks' roster features 10 scholarship transfers, including seven who enrolled at Carolina in January. The list includes WR **Ahmarean Brown** (Georgia Tech), QB **Jason Brown** (St. Francis, Pa.), DT **Keem Green** (Nebraska), WR **E.J. Jenkins** (St. Francis, Pa.), DB **David Spaulding** (Georgia Southern), EDGE **Jordan Strachan** (Georgia State) and LB **Debo Williams** (Delaware). QB **Zeb Noland** (North Dakota State), DB **Carlins Platel** (Assumption) and DB **Tyrese Ross** (Washington State) joined the roster in the fall.

**ONE FOR THE THUMB:** With the NCAA rule allowing for an extra year, three Gamecocks - LB **Damani Staley**, EDGE **Aaron Sterling** and PK **Parker White** - can become the first players in school history to letter five times in their career.

**COACH SPEAK:** The SEC Coaches tabbed EDGE **Kingsley Enagbare** to their preseason All-SEC first-team unit. RB **Kevin Harris** was a second-team selection, while TE **Nick Muse** and DL **Zach Pickens** were selected to the preseason third-team unit by the league's 14 coaches.

**WEARING THE PATCH:** Nineteen Gamecocks, have their undergraduate degrees in hand. The list includes: **Wyatt Campbell**, **Devontae Davis**, **Eric Douglas**, **Jabari Ellis**, **Kingsley Enagbare**, **Jaylan Foster**, **Spencer Eason-Riddle**, **Sherrod Greene**, **Tyreek Johnson**, **Hank Manos**, **Sean McGonigal**, **Zeb, Noland**, **Carlins Platel**, **Darius Rush**, **OrTre Smith**, **Damani Staley**, **M.J. Webb**, **Parker White** and **Dylan Wonnum**. Eason-Riddle has both a bachelor's and master's degree.

**NFL TIES:** **Dylan Wonnum** is the younger brother of former Gamecock, D.J. Wonnum, who is with the Minnesota Vikings. **Damani Staley** is the son of former South Carolina and NFL standout **Duce Staley**. Duce is currently the assistant head coach/running backs coach for the Detroit Lions. **Landon Grier's** father, Chris, is the general manager of the Miami Dolphins.

**FAMILY TIES:** Walk-on running back **Bruce Staley** is the first-cousin of **Duce Staley**, **Damani Staley's** father.

# SHANE BEAMER



Shane Beamer, considered to be one of the rising stars among coaches in college football, was named the University of South Carolina's 36th head football coach on Dec. 6, 2020.

Beamer, 44, has been an assistant coach at seven Football Bowl Sub-division schools for 21 seasons. During his career, he has coached in 17 bowl games, including a College Football Playoff National Championship Game, has posted 18 non-losing seasons, six of those with double-digit victories and his teams have won 63.0 percent of its games.

Beamer has been a part of building programs throughout his career. He has been a part of three coaching staffs, where the head coach was in his first or second season at the school. He joined Sylvester Croom's staff at Mississippi State in his first season, Kirby Smart's program at Georgia in his first season, and Lincoln Riley's unit at Oklahoma in his second season.

He comes to Carolina from Oklahoma, where he has served as the assistant head coach for offense, coaching tight ends and H-backs, for the last three seasons. In 2020, Oklahoma ranked sixth in the country in scoring (43.0), 11th in total offense (494.7) and 14th in passing offense (315.0). The Sooners led the nation in yards per play (8.0) and ranked third in total offense (537.6) and fourth in passing efficiency rating (187.0) in 2019. Oklahoma led the nation in total offense (570.3), scoring offense (48.4) and yards per play (FBS-record 8.6), and ranked second in passing efficiency rating (194.9) in 2018.

The Charleston, S.C. native, returns to one of his previous coaching stops, having been with the Gamecocks for four seasons (2007-10). In 2007, he served as the outside linebackers coach and co-special teams coordinator. He mentored the cornerbacks in 2008, then coached the Spurs and strong safeties and was both the special teams coordinator and recruiting coordinator in 2009 and 2010 under Steve Spurrier.

In 2009 at South Carolina, Beamer was nominated for the Frank Broyles Award, which goes annually to the nation's top assistant coach. His special teams' units recorded five blocked kicks that season, tying for the SEC lead and tying for the eighth-highest total in the nation. He also helped coach a defensive unit that ranked third in the SEC and 15th in

the country in total defense, and second in the league and eighth in the country in passing defense.

As the Gamecocks' recruiting coordinator, his 2009 class was ranked 12th-best by both Rivals and Scout, and the 2010 and 2011 classes were ranked in the Top 25.

During Beamer's tenure as recruiting coordinator at Carolina, nine of his signees were selected in the NFL draft. Those include first round selection Stephen Gilmore (Buffalo Bills) and second round selections Alshon Jeffery (Chicago Bears) and D.J. Swearinger (Houston Texans).

The Gamecocks all-time winningest quarterback, Connor Shaw, and rushing touchdown leader, Marcus Lattimore, were also in the 2010 class.

Prior to his arrival in Norman, Beamer spent two seasons on the staff at Georgia as tight ends coach and special teams coordinator under Kirby Smart. The Bulldogs posted a 21-7 combined record with Beamer on staff. In 2017, the Bulldogs won the SEC Championship and finished second in the nation, falling in the CFP title game to Alabama in overtime. His special teams ranked eighth nationally in net punting (41.7), and 20th in kickoff returns (23.5) while blocking four kicks.

The son of Hall of Fame coach, Frank Beamer, he worked with his father as the associate head coach and running backs coach at Virginia Tech from 2011-15. In his first year, he coached David Wilson, who broke the Tech single-season rushing record and was named All-American and ACC Player of the Year and went on to become a first-round NFL draft selection by the New York Giants. Shane served as the Hokies' acting head coach in the 2014 Military Bowl win while his father watched from the press box following throat surgery.

Beamer's first full-time coaching position was at Mississippi State, joining the Bulldogs in 2004 as cornerbacks coach and recruiting coordinator. In his first two seasons at State, he guided three defensive backs to SEC All-Freshman Team accolades. He maintained the recruiting coordinator title but made the move to running backs coach in the spring of 2006 where he tutored running back Anthony Dixon to SEC All-Freshman honors.

Beamer spent three seasons (2001-03) as a graduate assistant at Tennessee, helping with the cornerbacks, coaching the placekickers, punters, and long snappers, and assisting in all special teams areas. He also oversaw game opponent scouting while earning a master's degree in sport management in December 2003.

Before joining the staff at Tennessee, he worked one season (2000) as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech, helping with the Yellow Jacket quarterbacks and wide receivers.

A 2000 graduate of Virginia Tech, Beamer was a member of five bowl teams (1995-99 seasons) and three Big East Conference championship squads on the Hokie football team as a long snapper and wide receiver. He was a long snapper on the 1999 Tech team that played for the BCS National Championship.

Beamer and his wife, Emily, are the parents of three children - two daughters, Sutton and Olivia, both born in Columbia, and a son, Hunter, born in Blacksburg, Va.

**COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)** — South Carolina coach turned quarterback Zeb Noland threw for four touchdowns on 13 completions as the Gamecocks beat Eastern Illinois 46-0 on Saturday night.

It was the debut for South Carolina coach Shane Beamer. He promised “Beamer Ball” just like his dad Frank Beamer played at Virginia Tech and his team delivered, holding the Panthers (0-2) to 109 yards and getting its first shutout in 13 years.

The Gamecocks version of Beamer Ball blocked two punts, picked off two passes with one going back for a 61-yard touchdown, ran a successful two-point trick play with the kicking team on the field after their first touchdown, converted all three fourth downs it tried including a fourth-and-goal from the 3, had two sacks and hit hard.

“People talk about Beamer Ball — that’s what it was. You have the ability to score on offense, defense or special teams no matter who is on the field. We want to have that mentality,” Shane Beamer said.

Beamer, 44, brought joy and enthusiasm to a team that had lost six in a row and 11 of its past 14 games — at least for a night and against a Football Championship Subdivision opponent.

Beamer won his opener with an unusual quarterback. Noland came to Columbia this spring to be a graduate assistant after playing seven games for North Dakota State in a season delayed to spring 2021 because of COVID-19.

Chris Katrenick was 13-for-22 for 78 yards and Tyler Hamilton caught five passes for 32 yards for Eastern Illinois.

**GAME CHANGER**

Jaheim Bell caught a 3-yard pass from Zeb Noland with 5:04 left in the first, giving Carolina a 15-0 lead on its way to the shutout of the Panthers. It was Bell’s first career touchdown.

**GREENVILLE, N.C. (AP)** — Parker White kicked a 36-yard field goal as time expired as South Carolina rallied from 14 down to beat East Carolina 20-17 on Saturday, earning its first road win under first-year coach Shane Beamer.

Damani Staley had a 63-yard interception return for a touchdown just before halftime to give the Gamecocks a needed spark after trailing 14-0 in a mistake-filled opening half. Former graduate assistant Zeb Noland also had a game-tying touchdown pass to Dakereon Joyner in the back of the end zone late in the third quarter.

In the end, the Gamecocks (2-0) did enough to give themselves a shot, then rode the legs of Juju McDowell - who gained 45 yards on six carries on South Carolina's final 10-play drive - to set up White's winner that had the Gamecocks spilling onto the field from the sideline to celebrate.

South Carolina won despite committing three turnovers in its first five drives, including a goal-line fumble that went through the end zone for a turnover in the first half.

Tyler Snead hit on a 75-yard trick-play touchdown pass to Jsi Hatfield on the game's first offensive snap for the Pirates (0-2), while Holton Ahlers also ran for a short touchdown for the 14-0 lead. But East Carolina struggled to generate consistent offense, with Ahlers completing 11 of 24 passes for just 77 yards and two interceptions.

The Pirates were hosting a Southeastern Conference team for the first time since South Carolina's last visit here in 1997.

The Gamecock defense stopped East Carolina on a 3rd-and-5 to force a punt, giving the Gamecocks the ball for its game-winning drive. Jaylan Foster and David Spaulding made the tackle to hold ECU's Tyler Snead to just a one-yard gain.

**ATHENS, GA. (AP)** — JT Daniels returned to the lineup with three touchdown passes, Georgia's fearsome defense nearly made it three-straight games without allowing a TD and the No. 2 Bulldogs romped to a 40-13 victory over South Carolina on Saturday night.

Daniels completed 23-of-31 for 303 yards, including scoring throws of 43 yards to Jermaine Burton, 38 yards to freshman Adonai Mitchell and 4 yards to James Cook.

Georgia (3-0, 1-0 Southeastern Conference) finally gave up a touchdown while on defense when Luke Doty, getting the ball on the Bulldogs' side of the field after a fumble, connected with Josh Vann on a 36-yard touchdown pass with 10:55 remaining.

To that point, the only touchdown against Georgia this season had come on an interception return.

With Doty playing for the first time this season, South Carolina (2-1, 0-1) gave up three sacks and a safety, along with two turnovers that led to Georgia touchdowns.

Daniels sat out a 56-7 victory over UAB with an oblique injury, watching as backup Stetson Bennett tied a school record with five touchdown passes.

Daniels wasted no time re-establishing his hold on the No. 1 spot, completing a 21-yard pass to Brock Bowers on his very first snap and guiding the Bulldogs to the end zone on their first two possessions.

Bennett got a shot the third time the Bulldogs had the ball. He promptly threw an interception that was returned to the Georgia 12, setting up a field goal.

Daniels returned to the game and didn't leave until early in the fourth quarter with the outcome no longer in doubt.

After punting the ball away in the closing seconds of the first half and content to settle for a 21-6 lead, Georgia wound up scoring five more points.

Backed up on their own 1, the Gamecocks explicitly attempted to throw out of the end zone. Doty was sacked by Jordan Davis and Nolan Smith for a safety.

Then, after receiving the free kick, Daniels completed three passes for 39 yards to set up Jack Podlesny's 36-yard field goal as time expired, sending Georgia to the locker room up 26-6.

Georgia put it away in opening minute of the second half, again sparked by a huge defensive play.

Doty's pass was picked off by Derion Kendrick, who returned it to the South Carolina 20. Zamir White ripped off a 15-yard run, then took it in from the 5 to pad the lead to 33-6.

Cook had two touchdowns, also scoring on a 23-yard run.

**GAME CHANGER**

Jaylan Foster picked off a JT Daniels pass at the Georgia 47 and returned it 35 yards to the Bulldog 12. Carolina was not able to punch it in the end zone, as Parker White's 27-yard field goal made it 14-6 Georgia with 1:34 left in the first quarter. The Bulldogs responded with a second quarter touchdown drive, a safety and a field goal as the Gamecocks did not get any closer in their first loss of 2021.

**COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)** — Matt Ruffolo made three field goals to help Kentucky beat South Carolina 16-10 on Saturday night.

Despite its three turnovers, Kentucky (4-0, 2-0 Southeastern Conference) beat South Carolina (2-2, 1-1) for the seventh time in eight years, and set up a collision course toward next week's matchup at home against No. 11 Florida.

"We just have to worry about ourselves. We got to prove to each other and the team that we can go out there and compete with anybody who steps on the field," said Kentucky linebacker DeAndre Square, who led the Wildcats with eight tackles. "It's not about anybody else, it's about us."

Chris Rodriguez Jr. ran for 144 yards on 26 carries for the Wildcats. Will Levis was 15-of-22 passing for 102 yards and threw an interception.

Kavosiey Smoke scored on 15-yard touchdown run on the first series of the game, capping a 12-play, 75-yard drive for Kentucky. Ruffolo's 41-yard field goal to end the second quarter gave the Wildcats a 10-0 lead.

Luke Doty threw a 5-yard touchdown pass to Jalen Brooks early in the third quarter for South Carolina. Ruffolo made field goals from 21 and 27 yards before Parker White's 54-yard field goal capped the scoring with 2:31 remaining.

Doty was 17-of-25 passing for 158 yards. Kevin Harris was held to just 38 yards rushing on 12 carries.

South Carolina recovered fumbles on back-to-back Kentucky possessions but couldn't get any points despite going for it twice on fourth down. Each time, a dropped pass ended the drive.

"If you just look at some things, our turning the ball over, there's no excuse for it. The ball bouncing to the other team sometimes, there's no controlling that," Kentucky coach Bob Stoops said. "When I first got here, we couldn't play a lick of defense, but we led the country in fumbles. With some of those fumbles (this year), we just can't do it."

The Gamecocks' defense has recovered multiple takeaways in every game but the offense hasn't been able to take advantage. After scoring 46 points over hapless Eastern Illinois in its opener, South Carolina has a mere 43 points since.

"I don't know. There's a lot. We ran the ball 26 times for 58 yards. Not good enough," South Carolina coach Shane Beamer said. "Each week's different, and right now, it ain't good enough."

**GAME CHANGER**

Kentucky had three field goals on the night, the final one with 4:26 left in the game that gave the Wildcats a 16-7 lead. Carolina answered with a field goal of its own, a career-high 54-yard field goal from Parker White, but the Wildcats were able to salt the clock and earn the six-point win.
